TALKING POINTS

- MSU is meeting a ranked Texas A&M team for the fourth time since the Aggies joined the SEC. The Bulldogs are 2-1 in such games with upsets over then-No. 16 Texas A&M in 2018 and the then-No. 7 Aggies in 2016, both at Davis Wade Stadium.
- **Mike Leach** holds a 7-4 all-time record against Texas A&M, including 47-48 upset of the then-No. 23 Aggies in overtime in 2002.
- Through its first four games, MSU has completed 169 passes, which trails only **Mike Leach's** 2007 Texas Tech team (178) for the most through four games since 2000.
- MSU is on pace to reach 200 completions in its fifth game. The fastest team on record to reach 200 completions is the 2020 squad, which did so in six games, but prior to Leach's arrival, the quickest was the 2015 team that did so in nine games.
- QB **Will Rogers** has completed 169 passes in the first four games. That is the most by any NCAA passer in his team's first four games since 2000.
- Rogers is one of just 12 quarterbacks since 2000 to have completed 50 passes in a game. Of those 12, five were coached by Leach.
- MSU has recorded a takeaway in six straight games with 13 (10 INT, 3 FR) in that span.



Will Rogers is the only Power 5 quarterback with 1,400+ passing yards, 10+ passing touchdowns and two or fewer interceptions this season.

PROVEN WINNER

One of the most successful coaches in the history of college football, **Mike Leach's** 145 career wins are the second-most among active SEC coaches and sixth-most among active Power 5 coaches.

TALKING POINTS CONTINUED

- MSU boasts three players that are averaging more than seven yards after catch this season: WR **Lideatrick Griffin** (8.1), WR **Rara Thomas** (7.5) and RB **Dillon Johnson** (7.4).
- WR **Makai Polk** has totaled 304 receiving yards already this season, which trails only Justin Jenkins (458) for the most by a Bulldog in the team's first four games since 2000.
- State is one of the SEC's most inexperienced squads with only two players, DT **Jaden Crumedy** (22) and CB **Martin Emerson** (20), who can boast 20 or more career starts. That is the lowest total of any SEC team.
- With the exception of LT **Charles Cross**, the Bulldogs' remaining four starting offensive linemen entered the 2021 season with just 53 combined career snaps at their current positions, including two who had never taken a snap at their respective 2021 positions.
- Since he arrived in 2020, defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett's** defense ranks No. 13 among Power Five programs with 25 turnovers forced. Only Alabama (29) and LSU (28) have more in the SEC in that span.
- The Bulldogs' run defense is one of the best in the nation. MSU has held seven of its 14 opponents since the start of 2020 to 100 yards or fewer on the ground. State has held three straight opponents below the 100-yard mark, and allowed just 101 yards in the season opener against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4).
- CB **Emmanuel Forbes** is the SEC's active career leader in interceptions (7), which is tied for 15th in the FBS. He leads the FBS in picks since the start of his freshman season in 2020.
- A two-time national coach of the year, **Mike Leach** has won 145 games in 19-plus seasons as a head coach highlighted by two 11-win seasons, five 9-win seasons, and five 8-win seasons. He's the only active Power 5 head coach to produce an 11-win season at two different programs since 2008.
- **Mike Leach's** program returns 15 of 22 starters from last season (eight on offense and seven on defense). One of the youngest teams in college football last year, 26 Bulldogs made their first career start, tied for the FBS lead. Just over 50 percent of State's snaps were taken by first-time starters last season.
- The 2020 season saw MSU claim victories over multiple AP-ranked opponents away from home for the first time since 1980. State defeated No. 6 LSU, 44-34, in Baton Rouge to open the season and No. 22 Tulsa, 28-26, in a neutral matchup at the Armed Forces Bowl. In 1980, the Bulldogs toppled No. 18 Miami (Fla.) on the road, 34-31, before defeating No. 1 Alabama, 6-3, on a neutral field.

YEAR 2 OF LEACH ERA BEGINS

- **Mike Leach** was hired as the 34th head coach in program history on Jan. 9, 2020. He previously spent eight seasons at Washington State where he was twice named Pac-12 Coach of the Year. In 2018, he was tabbed the AFCA National Coach of the Year for the second time in his career. Prior to his stint with the Cougars, Leach took Texas Tech to a bowl game in 10 consecutive seasons, setting a program record with 84 victories in his tenure.
- **Mike Leach** is the only active Power Five head coach to produce an 11-win season at two different programs since 2008 and one of two active FBS head coaches to win 50-plus games at multiple Power Five programs. He currently, ranks seventh among active Power 5 head coaches in career wins (143).

THE AIR RAID IN YEAR 2

► In **Mike Leach's** first two coaching stops, the Air Raid offense has made significant strides from Year 1 to Year 2. At both Washington State and Texas Tech, Leach's second team improved by more than 35 passing yards per game while seeing significant increases to their touchdowns, completion percentage and passing efficiency.

EYEING THE RECORD BOOK

► Mike Leach's Air Raid offense has broken records at every school he's coached at over a 30-plus-year career. In just 22 games as the offensive coordinator at Kentucky, his offense broke 116 school records. Under his guidance, Washington State set or tied 42 school, Pac-12 or NCAA records in 2014 alone.

► 21 MSU passing and receiving records were broken by the Bulldogs in **Mike Leach's** first year.

50 BURGER

► With its 51-32 victory against Missouri on Dec. 19, Mississippi State has now scored 50+ points in at least one game in 10 consecutive seasons. The 51 points were MSU's most in a game since the Bulldogs' 54-24 victory at Arkansas on Nov. 2, 2019.

► State has put up 50+ points five times since 2018, tied for the fourth-most in the SEC during that span. The Bulldogs are one of four SEC teams to log at least three 50+ point games against SEC opponents during that stretch. MSU has scored 50+ points 18 times over the last 15 seasons and is 18-0 in those games.

RECORD RALLIES

► **Mike Leach** has led record-setting comebacks at Texas Tech, Washington State and now Mississippi State.

► Leach's Texas Tech team overcame a 31-point deficit in the 2006 Insight Bowl, which is tied for the largest comeback in a bowl game in FBS history.

► WR **Jamire Calvin** played in the record-setting comebacks under Leach at both Mississippi State and Washington State.

CHUNK PLAYS

- ▶ The Bulldogs lead the SEC with 51 passes of 10 or more yards this year. Fifteen of those have gone for 20 yards or more.
- ▶ State threw for more than 15 yards a dozen times in the season opener against Louisiana Tech. WR **Jaden Walley** made five catches in the game, all for 15 yards or more.
- ▶ Defensively, MSU has allowed just nine runs to go for more than 10 yards this season, which is tied for second in the SEC and tied for 14th in the FBS.

MAKING THE GRADES

- ▶ The Bulldogs have received high marks in the PFF's season grades. State has the FBS' No. 8 passing grade (89.1) as a team.
- ▶ State posted season-high passing (87.3) and pass blocking (82.9) grades in Week 4 against LSU per PFF.
- ▶ RB **Jo'quavious Marks** leads all FBS running backs in hands/drop grade (89.8) and ranks third overall. He is tied for the third-highest receiving grade (89.6) among FBS running backs.
- ▶ WR **Lideatrick Griffin** is the nation's second-highest-graded kick returner, boasting a 89.9 return grade.
- ▶ QB **Will Rogers** is tied for fourth among Power Five quarterbacks with nine "Big Time Throws," which PFF defines as a pass with excellent ball location and timing, generally thrown further down the field and/or into a tighter window. He is No. 10 in passing grade (89.1) among Power Five passers.
- ▶ S **Collin Duncan** ranks sixth nationally in coverage grade (76.6) among cornerbacks per PFF with at least 150 coverage snaps this season.

RECEIVERS SHINE IN DAWG DEBUTS

- ▶ WR **Jamire Calvin**, WR **Makai Polk** and WR **Rara Thomas** were given starting nods in their MSU debut against Louisiana Tech. The trio combined for 179 receiving yards on 16 catches.
- ▶ Calvin led the team with 67 yards in his first game for the Maroon and White. His 40-yard reception in the fourth quarter stands as State's longest play from scrimmage this year and led to a 5-yard rushing touchdown on the next snap.
- ▶ The graduate transfer who spent four years in **Mike Leach's** system while at Washington State leads MSU with 40 yards after catch and averaged 10.0 yards after catch per reception. He also registered a 20-yard touchdown.
- ▶ Polk, a transfer from California, led the team with 10 receptions for 57 yards. He currently leads the SEC in receptions (33).
- ▶ Thomas caught his first career target for a 21-yard gain and his second for a 25-yard haul.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

► Mississippi State is one of the most inexperienced teams in the SEC. Only two Bulldogs have started 20 or more games in their careers, **DT Jaden Crumedy** (22) and CB **Martin Emerson** (20), which is the fewest total in the SEC.

► Freshmen and sophomores have scored nine of State's 15 touchdowns. When including QB **Will Rogers**' passing scores, underclassmen have been responsible for 19 touchdowns.

► True freshmen were responsible for 76 percent of the Bulldogs' touchdowns (22 of 29) in 2020, scoring 14 in 2020. Freshmen scored all of State's touchdowns at Georgia (Nov. 28 - 3) and vs. Tulsa (Dec. 31 - 4).

► 15 Bulldogs have made their MSU debuts in 2021 (WR **Jamire Calvin**, DE **Randy Charlton**, LS **Colby Cox**, S **Jalen Green**, LS **Hayes Hammond**, WR **Rufus Harvey**, RB **J.J. ON THE LINE

► MSU's offensive line has shuffled this year, with almost every lineman playing a new position.

► LT **Charles Cross** is the only lineman returning to the same position he played previously. He played 738 snaps at left tackle last year and has already played 314 snaps there this year.

► Not including Cross, the remaining four linemen entered 2021 with a combined total of 53 snaps played at their current positions.

► The starting five on the O-line have played a total of 1,510 snaps this year after playing a total of 2,289 snaps across all positions in their careers prior to this season.

THE AIR RAID THROUGH FOUR GAMES

► MSU's passing game has been one of the best on record by any team through its first four games of the season since 2000. Mike Leach-coached teams have posted eight of the top 10 four-game completion totals on record.

► The Bulldogs have completed the second-highest volume of passes (169) in a team's first four games, trailing only Mike Leach's 2007 Texas Tech team (178).

► QB **Will Rogers** has completed 169 passes in the first four games of the year, the most by any quarterback in his team's first four games since at least 2000 (Previous: 166 by Graham Harrell, Texas Tech, 2007).

EARLY RETURNS ON ROGERS

► Through just 13 games and 10 starts, QB **Will Rogers** has moved to the top of State's career leaderboard in total offense. His 259.8 yards per game currently leads all Bulldogs.

► Bulldog legend Dak Prescott held the record previously, averaging 242.8 yards per game of total offense (11,897 yards in 47 games), but Prescott recorded more than half of his career yardage in his senior season. With his senior year removed, Prescott averaged 155.1 yards per game (5,583 yards in 36 games).

► In his first nine starts, Rogers is 360-for-501 with 21 TDs and 5 INTs.

► Rogers' five interceptions are the fewest by any quarterback in his first 10 starts in Leach's system, and his .719 completion percentage leads all Leach passers.

AIRING IT OUT

- QB **Will Rogers** completed a school-record and SEC-record 50 passes at Memphis (Sept. 18) and completed 47 against LSU (Sept. 25), which ranks second in SEC history. Rogers holds five of the top six single-game marks in program history.
- Rogers is 12th passer nationwide with 50 completions in a game since 2000, and **Mike Leach** has coached five of the 12.
- The 50 completions at Memphis are tied for the sixth-most by any team under **Mike Leach** in his 20-year career.
- MSU passed for 419 yards against Memphis, which ranks eighth in program history and is the third-highest Bulldog total under Leach.
- MSU surpassed the 1,000 yards passing milestone after just three games, which is tied with the 2020 season for the fewest games needed to reach 1,000 yards through the air in school history.
- State's 67 passing attempts against the Tigers trail only its 70 attempts at Kentucky last year and LSU's 69 attempts against Auburn in 1999 for the most in a single game in SEC history.

RECORDS FOR ROGERS

- QB **Will Rogers** broke nearly every freshman passing record last year despite starting just six games.
- Currently MSU's career leader in completion percentage: 71.4 percent (408-of-571). Career No. 2: 64.1 percent by K.J. Costello (134-of-209; 2020) Career No. 3: 62.8 percent by Dak Prescott (734-of-1169; 2012-15).
- Tied the MSU single-game record for consecutive completions with 12 against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4) in the 2021 season opener.
- Broke his own MSU single-game-record with 50 completions at Memphis, which stands as the SEC record (Previous MSU: 45 by Rogers, at Ole Miss, 2020; Previous SEC: 47 by Tim Couch, Kentucky, vs. Arkansas, 1998).
- Holds the MSU freshman record with 1,976 yards, breaking Wayne Madkin's 1998 mark of 1,532 and ranking ninth in MSU single-season history.
- Holds MSU freshman record with 239 completions in 2020, which ranks third in MSU single-season history.
- Broke the single-season completion percentage record with a 69.1 percent mark (239-of-346), surpassing Dak Prescott's 66.2 percent mark in 2015 (316-of-477). Completion percentage ranked 10th nationally and led all freshmen passers in the FBS.

- Threw for an MSU freshman-single-game record 440 yards at Ole Miss (Nov. 28, 2020).
- Became the first Bulldog quarterback to complete 30 or more passes in four consecutive games in 2020 and is now riding another four-game streak.
- Eight career 30-completion games is an MSU career record (Previous: 5 by Dak Prescott, 2012-15). Had four as a freshman.
- Only MSU freshman to throw for 300-plus yards in multiple games. Now boasts five career 300-yard passing games, which ranks second in MSU career history trailing only Dak Prescott (9, 2012-15).

TRUE FRESHMAN STARTING AT QB

- Prior to QB **Will Rogers** in 2020, head coach **Mike Leach** had never started a true freshman at quarterback during his coaching career. Rogers became just the seventh true freshman to start at quarterback for the Bulldogs since the NCAA began allowing freshmen to compete in 1972.
- Rogers threw for 226 yards, the most by a Bulldog true freshman in his first career start. He joined Todd Jordan as the only MSU true freshman quarterbacks to throw a touchdown in their first career start. He completed 35 passes, the most by a freshman in school history. MSU has won all seven games when a true freshman quarterback is making his first career start with four of those victories coming against SEC opponents. Below is a look at how all seven true freshmen passers fared in their first career start:

"TULU" TAKES IT BACK

- WR **Lideatrick Griffin** returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against NC State (Sept. 11). It was the fifth 100-yard kick return in program history and the first 100-yard return since Brandon Holloway did so against Southern Miss (Sept. 5, 2015).
- Griffin's kick return was the first time MSU had scored on its first kickoff return of a game since Jameon Lewis returned the second kickoff of the game 100 yards against Ole Miss on Nov. 24, 2012 following the Rebels' game-opening scoring drive.
- It was the first opening kickoff return for a touchdown since Kevin Prentiss returned the opening kick 91 yards at South Carolina on Sept. 26, 1998.
- The sophomore leads the nation in yards per return (48.8) and is No. 10 in the FBS in combined kick returns (244). He is one of 17 players to return a kick for a touchdown this year.
- Griffin posted a career-best 144 kick return yards against Louisiana Tech along with a then-career-long 70-yard return.

- Boasts three 100-yard kick return games and is one of five Bulldogs since 1992 with three or more 100-yard kick return games in their careers trailing Leon Berry, Fred Reid, Derek Pegues and Pig Prather, who all have four.
- Is the first Bulldog with 100+ kick return yards since Keith Mixon (106 yards, 5 returns) vs. Arkansas on Nov. 19, 2016.
- Tied for fourth in the SEC with three all-purpose plays of 30 or more yards. One of two SEC players and nine players nationally with multiple all-purpose plays of 70 or more yards.
- Provided 261 of State's 393 yards on kick returns in 2020 and now has five career returns of 40+ yards.

MAKING HIS MARKS

- RB **Jo'quavious Marks** posted his first career multi-touchdown game (2 rush, 1 rec) against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4), including his first career receiving score.
- Marks is second on the team with 31 receptions, which leads all FBS running backs and ranks eighth overall. His 89.8 hands/drop grade leads all FBS running backs and ranks second overall.
- Carried a career-high 13 times against LSU (Sept. 25) for 46 yards. Also caught nine passes for a career-high 67 yards and a touchdown.
- In 2020, Marks broke MSU's single-season records for receptions by both freshmen and running backs. MSU's overall school record is 88 catches set by Fred Ross in 2015, and Marks finished the season with 60 catches which was tied for ninth in program history.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Mississippi State was the only program in the country to boast four players with 40 or more receptions in 2020. Auburn and No. 2 Clemson were the only programs with three such receivers.
- RB **Jo'quavious Marks** (60), WR **Jaden Walley** (52), WR **Osirus Mitchell** (47) and WR **Austin Williams** (43) were State's 40-catch receivers.
- The Bulldogs were one of six teams that saw multiple players catch at least 50 passes, and it marked just the third time in MSU history that two Bulldogs reached the mark in the same year (2015 - Fred Ross and De'Runnya Wilson, 1969 - Sammy Milner and David Smith).

STAYIN' FRESH

- MSU's true freshmen combined for 158 catches in 2020, the most by any true freshman group in the NCAA.
- RB **Jo'quavious Marks** was tied for the national lead among freshmen with 60 total receptions, which ranked fourth overall in the SEC.
- WR **Jaden Walley** ranked third among FBS freshmen with 52 catches, which trailed only Marks among SEC freshmen and ranked ninth in the league overall. Walley finished second among SEC freshmen with 65.3 receiving yards per game and fourth in yards per catch (13.8).

BULLDOGS' YAC ATTACK

- The Bulldogs continue to be one of the most dangerous receiving teams in the nation after making the catch. State leads the SEC and ranks second in the FBS in yards after catch in 2021.
- Three players are aveargeing more than seven yards after the catch this season: WR **Lideatrick Griffin** (8.1), WR **Rara Thomas** (7.5) and RB **Dillon Johnson** (7.4).
- Mississippi State was one of eight Power Five teams in the nation with more than 1,500 yards after catch in 2020. The Bulldogs ranked second in the SEC in yards after catch and third nationally.

RELIABLE RECEIVERS

- Five Bulldogs boast streaks of 10 or more consecutive games with a reception.
- RB **Jo'quavious Marks** has the longest active streak at 15 games, which includes every game of his collegiate career. WR **Malik Heath**, WR **Makai Polk**, WR **Jaden Walley** and WR **Austin Williams** all have catches in 13 straight contests.

POINTS ON POLK

- WR **Makai Polk** has had one of the best starts to a season on record. Since 2000, only one Bulldog has recorded more receiving yards through the first four games of the year: 458 by Justin Jenkins, 2003.
- He caught a career-high 11 passes to lead the team at Memphis (Sept. 18) while recording a career-high 136 receiving yards for his second career 100-yard game.
- Polk has made 10 or more catches in two of four games this year. A Bulldog has caught 10 or more passes just 18 times in school history, and Polk's 11 receptions at Memphis (Sept. 18), are tied for seventh in MSU single-game history.
- Polk is one of four Bulldogs ever to record multiple double-digit reception games in his career and the first with multiple in the same season since Fred Ross posted a school-record four double-digit reception games in 2015.
- Against Memphis, he caught a 41-yard pass that stands as State's longest play from scrimmage this year and added a 36-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter. The plays were his eighth and ninth career catches for 20-plus yards.
- Polk leads the SEC and ranks fourth in the FBS in receptions per game (8.2).

WALLEY WATCH

- WR **Jaden Walley** posted breakout performances down the stretch in 2020, leading MSU in both receptions and yards at No. 13 Georgia (Nov. 21), at Ole Miss (Nov. 28) and against Auburn (Dec. 12) and Missouri (Dec. 19).
- Turned in four consecutive 100-yard receiving games and became the second freshman in MSU history with multiple 100-yard receiving games in the same year (Mardye McDole, 2 games, 1977). Averaged 130.0 receiving yards and 7.25 catches per game over the four-game span.
- The last Bulldog with four consecutive 100-yard receiving games was Fred Ross in 2015 (Four straight: at Missouri, Alabama, at Arkansas, Ole Miss).
- Led MSU with 718 receiving yards, which ranked third nationally among freshmen and became the first freshman to lead State in receiving yardage since Chad Bumphis (375) in 2009.

- Broke Mardye McDole's freshman record of 510 yards set in 1977 and became just the second MSU freshman with a 500-yard season.
- Just the sixth true freshman with a 100-yard receiving game in program history.
- Had a career-high nine catches and 176 receiving yards at Ole Miss, breaking the MSU freshman record for receiving yards in a game (Previous: 148 - Mardye McDole at Auburn, Nov. 5, 1977).
- Posted then-career highs in receptions (7) and receiving yards (115) at Georgia, becoming the first true freshman to reach the century mark since Chad Bumphis (123) against Georgia Tech in 2009.
- Made a career-long 51-yard reception for his first career touchdown at Georgia, which was MSU's second-longest passing play of the 2020 season.

MR. RELIABLE

- WR **Austin Williams** hauled in a career-long 34-yard reception against NC State (Sept. 11).
- Williams also made a 30-yard reception against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4), which was his longest catch since his previous career-long of 33 yards on a touchdown against Arkansas (Nov. 17, 2018).
- Of his 84 career receptions, 56.0 percent have led to a touchdown or first down. Williams caught 43 passes in 2020, which was a single-season career-high.
- Williams boasts the No. 7 hands grade in the Power Five (85.9) per PFF. He has caught 20 of his 21 targets (95.2 percent), which leads all Power Five players with at least 15 targets.

DAWG DEFENSE QUICK HITS

- Mississippi State has held opponents to 71.3 rushing yards per game which ranks eighth in the FBS.
- State's defense held Memphis, which entered the matchup as the nation's leader in total offense (633.5 yards per game), to just 246 total yards. MSU allowed just 12 first downs, which is tied for the seventh-fewest allowed by any **Mike Leach**-coached team.
- DE **Randy Charlton** leads the team with 15 total pressures, which is tied No. 22 in the FBS and for fifth in the SEC.
- DT **Cameron Young** has posted the No. 8 run defense grade in the SEC.
- The Bulldogs have already forced seven turnovers this season (1.75 per game) after recording 18 takeaways (1.64 per game) last year, which was tied for fourth in the SEC.

- ▶ MSU is holding opponents to a 66.7 percent conversion rate in the red zone (4-for-6), which is tied for No. 10 among Power Five programs and is second in the SEC.

ANALYZING ARNETT'S DEFENSE

- ▶ Since his arrival in 2020, defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett's** defense has been one of the best in the country.
- ▶ The Bulldogs rank No. 26 in turnovers forced (25) since the start of 2020 and are No. 13 among Power Five programs. Only Alabama (29) and LSU (28) have more in the SEC.
- ▶ State is tied for seventh among Power Five teams with just 12 rushing touchdowns allowed since 2020.

STATE HAS A TAKEAWAY IN 38 OF ITS LAST 43 GAMES

- ▶ The Bulldogs have collected at least one takeaway in 38 of their last 43 games dating back to the 2017 season at Arkansas on Nov. 18. State has compiled 75 takeaways over the 43-game stretch and forced three or more turnovers 10 times in that span.
- ▶ In that span, the Bulldogs had a takeaway streak of 22 straight games (Nov. 18, 2017-Oct. 12, 2019) and a streak of nine games (Nov. 23, 2019-Nov. 7, 2020).
- ▶ MSU has now recorded a takeaway in six straight games with 13 (10 INT, 3 FR) in that span.
- ▶ MSU has forced multiple turnovers in 14 games since the start of 2019.

MSU HAS AN INTERCEPTION IN 27 OF ITS LAST 40 GAMES

- ▶ State has collected an interception in 28 of its last 41 games dating back to Nov. 17, 2019 and has 38 total interceptions during that stretch. Eight active players have collected 20 total interceptions in their career.

ABOUT THAT BLOCK...

- ▶ Mississippi State completed its comeback against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4) by blocking a game-winning field goal attempt on the final snap. DT **Jaden Crumedy** was credited with the block.
- ▶ It was the first blocked field goal for the Bulldogs since Nelson Adams did so in the St. Petersburg Bowl against Miami (Ohio) on Dec. 26, 2016.
- ▶ The last time MSU met Louisiana Tech in 2017, the teams combined for one blocked punt and three blocked extra points. MSU's Jeffery Simmons blocked the punt and one of the extra points.
- ▶ The one-point victory (35-34) was MSU's narrowest margin of victory since the 2019 Egg Bowl win on a missed field goal against Ole Miss. The Bulldogs have now won at least one game by three points or less in each of the last three seasons.

HOLDING TEAMS TO FEWER THAN 200 YARDS RUSHING

- ▶ Since the start of the 2018 season, MSU has held 36 of its 41 opponents below the 200-yard rushing mark, which is the third most in the SEC during that stretch. 26 of those 36 games holding teams below 200 yards have been SEC games.
- ▶ In 2020, MSU held four opponents to fewer than 100 yards on the ground. MSU held opponents to 126.4 rushing yards per game, which was fourth in the SEC. Just 41 of opponents' 391 rushing attempts went for 12 or more yards in 2020.
- ▶ The Bulldogs have already held three opponents to fewer than 100 yards on the ground in 2021.
- ▶ Only two teams rushed for 200+ yards on the Bulldogs in 2020 - Alabama (208) and Auburn (218).

HOLDING TEAMS TO FEWER THAN 100 YARDS RUSHING

- ▶ The Bulldogs have held seven opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in 14 games under defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett**, which is the third-most games in the SEC since he arrived behind Georgia's 11 and Alabama's nine.
- ▶ MSU held NC State to just 34 yards rushing, marking the second-lowest total under Arnett trailing an eight-yard performance at then-No. 13 Georgia on Nov. 21, 2020. Most recently, MSU held LSU to just 63 yards on the ground.
- ▶ State has held three straight opponents to fewer than 100 yards on the ground, and allowed just 101 yards in the season opener against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4).
- ▶ MSU held four opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards in 2020 including each of its first three games. Since 1976, MSU has now held opponents under 100 yards rushing in at least three straight games on four occasions. The last time State held three straight opponents under 100 yards rushing came during the 2000 season when the Dawgs held five straight opponents under the 100-yard mark (at Memphis: 81 yards; at BYU: 74 yards; at South Carolina: 30 yards; Florida: -78 yards; Auburn: 18 yards).
- ▶ MSU also owns a string of six straight games (1999) and three straight games (1981). The last time MSU held four conference opponents below the century mark on the ground was the 2018 season. State finished that year with seven games of less than 100 rushing yards allowed. (Auburn: 90 yards; Texas A&M: 61 yards; Arkansas: 69 yards; at Ole Miss: 37 yards).

GREEN'S GREAT DAY

- S **Jalen Green** had a career day against NC State (Sept. 11). The transfer from Texas picked up his first takeaways in the Maroon and White and matched his career high with two pass breakups.
- Green made his first MSU interception in the end zone to save a touchdown against the Wolfpack. It was his second career pick following one while playing for Texas on Oct. 31, 2020, at Oklahoma State.
- He also recovered a fumble for the first time in his career.
- Became the third Bulldog in as many years with multiple takeaways in a game joining DB **Emmanuel Forbes** (2 INT) against Missouri on Dec. 19, 2020, and Leo Lewis (2 FR) at Auburn on Sept. 28, 2019.
- Green is tied for fifth in the SEC with five passes defended this year.

NO FLY FORBES

- DB **Emmanuel Forbes** is the nation's active career leader (FBS only) in interception return touchdowns (3) and the SEC's active career leader in defensive scores.
- SEC's active career leader with seven interceptions, which is tied for 15th in the FBS. Seven interceptions leads the FBS since the start of the 2020 season. Sixth in the FBS in career interception return yards (194).
- Tied for the team lead with 15 solo tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss in 2021 and ranks fourth on the team in total tackles (21). Leads the team and ranks fourth in the SEC with 15 "stops" per PFF, which are tackles that constitute a "failure" for the offense.
- Made a career-high 11 tackles against NC State (Sept. 11) along with a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss and his first career sack.
- Forbes was named a Freshman All-American in 2020 after leading the nation in interception touchdowns (3) and leading the SEC in total interceptions (5). His five interceptions led all true freshmen nationally and were tied for third overall.
- Tied for third among FBS freshmen with 11 total pass defenses in 2020 and was 12th overall.
- First Bulldog with five or more interceptions in a season since Mark McLaurin tied the school record with six in 2017, and he is tied for eighth in MSU single-season history.
- Tied for the MSU career record for interception return touchdowns (3) with Johnthan Banks (2009-12), Corey Broomfield (2009-12) and Derek Pegues (2005-08).
- Took an interception back 90 yards against Tulsa, setting an Armed Forces Bowl record and matching the sixth-longest interception return in school history (Anthony Derricks vs. Auburn on Nov. 1, 1997).
- Picked off two passes against Missouri, returning one 29 yards for his second touchdown. First Bulldog with multiple interceptions in a game since the 2017 TaxSlayer Bowl win against Louisville (Mark McLaurin, 3).

EMERSON ONE OF SEC'S TOP CORNERS

- DB **Martin Emerson** was named a Pro Football Focus All-American in 2020 after leading the SEC with 11 pass breakups, which was also tied for fourth in the FBS.
- Has only been targeted on 23 of 153 snaps in coverage (15.0 percent) this year and was only targeted on 59 of his 388 snaps in coverage (15.2 percent) in 2020.
- Ranked eighth among Power Five cornerbacks and third in the SEC at the position in coverage grade (82.9) (min. 200 snaps) in 2020.
- One of 16 SEC cornerbacks in 2020 with one or fewer TDs allowed in coverage per PFF (min. 200 coverage snaps).

TURN ON THE JETTS

- LB **Jett Johnson** leads the team with 29 total tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss.
- He posted a breakout game against NC State (Sept. 11) when he recorded a career-high nine tackles, more than any of his previous season totals. He entered 2021 with five career tackles and made five solo stops against the Wolfpack.
- Johnson also forced his first career fumble and added a pass breakup in that game.

CREME BRULE

- LB **Aaron Brule** is second on the team with 10 total pressures in 2021 per PFF, which ranks second among SEC linebackers. He led the Bulldogs with 40 total pressures a year ago (30 hurries, 5 hits, 5 sacks), which was third in the SEC and led all FBS linebackers.
- Earned a starting role in 2020, playing 719 of 780 defensive snaps and recorded at least 0.5 tackle for loss in eight of 11 games, including a streak of four straight.
- Led the team lead with 8.5 tackles for loss and was second on the squad with 4.0 sacks in 2020.
- Second on the team with 77 total tackles and 25 "stops" last year per PFF, which are tackles that constitute a "failure" for the offense. Also recovered a fumble and broke up three passes. Posted a career-high 12 tackles against Vanderbilt (Nov. 7).

DUNCAN'S DEVELOPMENT

- S **Collin Duncan** has allowed just seven receptions in 157 snaps in coverage this season. He ranks sixth nationally in coverage grade (76.6) among cornerbacks per PFF with at least 150 coverage snaps this season.
- After playing just 49 total snaps across State's first four games in 2020, stepped into a starting role. Had six tackles in MSU's first four games and 40 over the final seven.
- Made his first two career starts at Alabama (Oct. 31) and against Vanderbilt (Nov. 7). Intercepted the first pass of his career against Vanderbilt and returned it 28 yards on the first drive of the game. Also forced his first career fumble in the third quarter against the Commodores.

BOOKIE WATSON: THE SWISS ARMY KNIFE

- The Bulldog coaching staff has praised LB **Nathaniel Watson's** versatility with defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett** saying "Bookie" by himself makes State two-deep at almost every position.
- Learned the SAM linebacker position in the hotel parking lot the day before making his first career start at No. 13 Georgia in 2020.
- Made 40 total tackles with 3.0 for loss last season and posted a career-high and team-leading 13 tackles against Missouri (Dec. 19).

ONE OF THE YOUNGEST TEAMS IN FBS LAST YEAR

- A total of 27 players made their MSU debuts last season, including nine true freshmen. Twenty-six Bulldogs made their first career start last year, 15 on offense and 11 on defense. That was tied for the most in the FBS. MSU's first-time starters played an impressive 8,563 snaps last season after combining for just 635 career snaps entering the season with only two members of that group playing more than 100 career snaps.
- MSU totaled 1,541 plays for 16,951 total snap opportunities with 50.5 percent of snaps being taken up by first-time starters. On average, MSU had 5.6 first-time starters on the field for every play.
- The first-time starters from last season returning in 2021 are: LB **Aaron Brule**, S **London Craft**, OL **Charles Cross**, WR **Brad Cumbest**, S **Collin Duncan**, CB **Emmanuel Forbes**, CB **Esaia Furdge**, WR **Lideatrick Griffin**, S **Landon Guidry**, WR **Malik Heath**, S **Jay Jimison**, RB **Dillon Johnson**, OL **Kwatrivous Johnson**, OL **Kameron Jones**, RB **Jo'quavious Marks**, DE **Aaron Odom**, S **Fred Peters**, QB **Will Rogers**, OL **Cole Smith**, WR **Jaden Walley**, LB **Nathaniel Watson**, LB **Tyrus Wheat**.

REVIEWING 2020

- MSU played in a bowl game for a school-record 11th straight year a season ago, defeating Tulsa, 28-26, in the 2020 Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl. State is 7-4 in bowl games in that span. MSU is one of only four SEC programs to go to a bowl each of the last 11 seasons, joining Alabama, Georgia and Texas A&M.
- MSU claimed its first win over a ranked opponent in a bowl game since 1940 when State defeated then-No. 13 Georgetown, 14-7. **Mike Leach** is the first head coach in MSU history to win a bowl game in his first year leading the program.
- State's 11 opponents in 2020 combined to win 57.1 % of their games, good for the second-highest percentage in the SEC. Based on opponent's record and opponents' opponents' record, the Bulldogs played the second-strongest schedule in the SEC in 2020.
- With its 51-32 victory against Missouri on Dec. 19, Mississippi State has now scored 50+ points in at least one game in 10 consecutive seasons. The 51 points were MSU's most in a game since the Bulldogs' 54-24 victory at Arkansas on Nov. 2, 2019.

► WR **Jaden Walley** and CB **Emmanuel Forbes** marked Mississippi State's first duo in program history to earn Freshman All-American accolades in the same season.

► WR **Jaden Walley** became the first true freshman to lead MSU in receiving yardage since Chad Bumphis (375) in 2009, and his 718 yards were an MSU freshman record. He ranked third among all FBS freshmen. Walley was the only true freshman in the nation last season to record 50+ receptions and 700+ receiving yards.

► CB **Emmanuel Forbes** returned three interceptions for touchdowns in his freshman season which led the nation and is already tied for State's career record with Johnthan Banks (2009-12), Corey Broomfield (2009-12) and Derek Pegues (2005-08). Forbes led the SEC and all true freshmen nationally with five interceptions. Forbes also earned a spot on both The Associated Press and ESPN.com All-Bowl teams after delivering his fifth interception of the season and returning it 90 yards for a touchdown in last season's finale.

► For the first time in school history last season, MSU finished with four players recording 40+ catches. The Bulldogs were the only team in the nation with four players with 40+ catches in 2020. **Mike Leach** has had at least four players catch 40+ passes in each of his 19 seasons as a head coach.

► QB **Will Rogers** finished last season with a 69.1 completion percentage, the second highest by a true freshman in FBS history. RB **Jo'quavious Marks** collected 60 receptions last season, which tied for the most in the country among freshmen. SEC All-Freshman LT **Charles Cross** played 720 offensive snaps in 2020 per PFF, the most snaps in the SEC among freshman offensive linemen, and 90 more snaps than the next closest. Armed Forces Bowl MVP and WR **Lideatrick Griffin** became just the second player in the country last season with 135+ kickoff return yards and one receiving touchdown in a single game.

► RB **Jo'quavious Marks**, WR **Jaden Walley**, RB **Dillon Johnson** and WR **Lideatrick Griffin** combined for 158 receptions in 2020, the most by any true freshmen group in the nation.

► State was one of six teams in the FBS with four defensive touchdowns in 2020 (3 INT, 1 FR).

FRESHMEN FLYING HIGH

► A trio of Bulldogs were named to the SEC All-Freshman Team in 2020, with two earning Freshman All-American honors. OL **Charles Cross**, WR **Jaden Walley** and CB **Emmanuel Forbes** earned conference honors. Walley and Forbes earned All-American recognition, marking the first time in program history that multiple individuals have earned Freshman All-American accolades in the same season.

MSU and Texas A&M are meeting for the 15th time and the ninth time as both members of the SEC ... The Bulldogs lead the series, 7-6 on the field, winning three of the last five meetings ... State's last three victories were upsets of ranked Texas A&M teams by unranked Bulldog squads ... The Bulldogs have scored at least 30 points in three out of the last five meetings ... In 2018, State claimed a 28-13 victory, while holding the Aggies to just 61 rushing yards and allowing only three points in the second half ... In 2017, in College Station, MSU jumped on No. 24 Texas A&M early and often en route to a 35-14 win at Kyle Field, in what was the largest margin of victory over a ranked team on the road for the Bulldogs since 1942 ... Arguably, the most famous game between the two occurred in the 2000 Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Louisiana, during a rare snowstorm in the area ... The "Snow Bowl" saw Texas A&M build a 14-0 lead in the first quarter but MSU eventually won 43-41 ... 566 miles separate the two campuses.

No. 11 Texas A&M beats Mississippi State 28-14

Texas A&M built a 14-0 halftime lead and rode that momentum to a 28-14 victory over Mississippi State at Davis Wade Stadium. The Bulldogs got a 60-yard interception return for a score early in the third quarter to trim the Aggie lead to 14-7 but A&M responded with a 4-play, 75-yard drive and never looked back after that. State's other score in the game came when quarterback **Will Rogers** connected with **Malik Heath** on a 32-yard strike in the fourth quarter. It was the first career touchdown for both Bulldogs and the longest play of their MSU careers. Defensively, State was led by **Erroll Thompson's** 11 tackles. **Martin Emerson** added nine stops and one pass breakup. The Aggies struck first on their fourth drive of the game with a 3-yard touchdown run by Isaiah Spiller. On the Bulldogs' ensuing drive, Texas A&M blocked MSU's punt to take over on downs at the 1-yard line. Spiller again rushed across the line for six. **Emmanuel Forbes** intercepted a deflected pass in the third quarter and took it to the end zone for MSU's first points, but the Aggies immediately answered with a 51-yard touchdown pass. Texas A&M also scored on a 6-yard pass with 8:39 left in the third quarter before the Bulldog offense put up the final points of the game in the fourth quarter.

34TH HEAD FOOTBALL COACH AT MISSISSIPPI STATE 2018 & 2008 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Mike Leach, a two-time national coach of the year, three-time conference coach of the year and the mastermind behind the NCAA record-setting "Air Raid" offense, was tabbed Mississippi State's 34th head football coach on January 9, 2020.

The accomplishments for Leach in his 20th year as a head coach are long and distinguished. He has compiled a 145-99 (.594) record, guided his squads to 17 bowl games, produced seven seasons of at least nine victories, captured two division titles, become the winningest coach in Texas Tech history and set school records for bowl appearances at both Texas Tech (10) and Washington State (6). During 10 of those 19 seasons, Leach's passing attack led the FBS – six at Texas Tech and four at Washington State.

Of the 50 most productive passing yardage seasons in FBS history, 11 came from quarterbacks coached by Leach since his hiring as head coach at Texas Tech in 2000. That includes three seasons by Graham Harrell (2006-08), two by Luke Falk (2015-16), one by Gardner Mishew II (2018) and one by Anthony Gordon (2019).

Leach, 59, arrived in Starkville after eight seasons at the helm at Washington State where he compiled a 55-47 (.539) record and was named the 2018 American Football Coaches Association National Coach of the Year and two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year (2015, 2018). Leach spearheaded WSU to a school-record six bowl appearances and became the first coach in school history to lead the Cougars to five consecutive bowl games. They also led the nation in passing offense in four out of his last six seasons in charge.

The 2018 campaign saw Leach produce one of the finest coaching performances as WSU posted its first 11-win season in school history and a share of the Pac-12 North Division. The Cougars were ranked in the top 13 of each College Football Playoff rankings, including four consecutive weeks at No. 8. WSU capped the season with a win over Iowa State in the Alamo Bowl and finished No. 10 in the Associated Press and Coaches polls. Senior quarterback and Mississippi native Minshew captivated the nation, leading the FBS in passing yards per game (367.6).

Leach previously spent 10 seasons as head coach at Texas Tech (2000-09) where his squads produced bowl appearances all 10 years. He compiled a school-record 84 victories, a school-record five bowl wins and eight consecutive seasons of at least eight victories.

The architect of the most prolific passing offense in the country, Leach received three national coach of the year awards in 2008 – the Woody Hayes Award, Howie Long/Fieldturf Coach of the Year and George Munger Award. Leach's offense captured six NCAA passing titles and three total offense titles during his 10 seasons in Lubbock.

Leach led Texas Tech to one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2008 as the team set a program record with 11 regular-season wins en route to an 11-2 record. The win total tied the mark, set previously by the 1953 and 1973 Red Raider squads. Numerous accolades poured in from across the country as an unprecedented four players earned first-team All-America status, in addition to Leach's three coach of the year honors. Harrell, offensive tackle Rylan Reed and offensive guard Brandon Carter each garnered first-team honors, while wide receiver Michael Crabtree was honored as a unanimous All-American for the second-straight season.

A total of 18 players were drafted at Texas Tech under Leach's watch and 21 others signed free agent contracts. In the spring of 2009, four players were selected among the first four rounds of the NFL Draft, marking the most successful draft for Texas Tech in the Leach era. The program made strides academically as well under Leach. During his 10 years, Texas Tech was recognized as one of the nation's top institutions for consistently being above a 70 percent graduation rate, according to the AFCA.

Prior to coming on board at Texas Tech, Leach, in just one season at Oklahoma, directed a Sooner offense that went from 11th in the Big 12 in 1998 to first in 1999 and 101st in the nation to 11th.

Prior to joining Bob Stoops' Oklahoma staff, Leach served as offensive coordinator for Hal Mumme at the University of Kentucky and Valdosta (Ga.) State University. Under Mumme and Leach, the Kentucky offense set six NCAA records, 41 Southeastern Conference records and 116 school records in 22 games.

Leach and Mumme first teamed up at Iowa Wesleyan College in 1989 where he served as offensive coordinator and line coach until 1991. He has also made stops in Pori, Finland, where he served as a head coach in the European Football League (1989), as well as one-year stints at College of the Desert (1988) and Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo (1987).

Bulldogs Complete Largest Comeback In MSU History

Mississippi State found itself facing a 20-point deficit with just over 12 minutes remaining in its season opener against Louisiana Tech on Saturday. Undeterred, MSU finished with a flurry in all three phases to complete the largest comeback in school history. The 35-34 victory was sealed on the final play as LA Tech's 46-yard field goal fell short to send 44,669 maroon and white faithful home happy. Louisiana Tech took a 34-14 lead following a field goal early in the fourth quarter before State began mounting its comeback. The spark was started on special teams as **Lideatrick Griffin** returned the ensuing kickoff 70 yards to setup the homestanding Bulldogs at the 31-yard line. Three plays later, **Jo'quavious Marks** leapt into the end zone to start the rally with 12:01 left. MSU's defense forced a three-and-out to get the ball back quickly. The offense marched 77 yards in seven plays with quarterback **Will Rogers** completing all five of his passes on the drive to setup Marks again for a 5-yard scoring run to pull MSU within six. Another three-and-out by the defense gave State the ball back with just over six minutes remaining. Rogers was again perfect on all five throws, with the last going to **Jaden Walley** for a 15-yard touchdown to tie things at 34 before the extra point. In the fourth quarter, Rogers was a perfect 10-of-10 for 128 yards and a touchdown. Louisiana Tech still had 3:37 to make something happen and kept its hopes alive by converting a crucial 4th-and-11 from the MSU 43-yard line. Tech then ran the ball three straight plays - netting just six yards - and called timeout with two ticks remaining. Tech's 46-yard potential game-winner was blocked by **Jaden Crumedy** to give State its fifth consecutive season-opening win. The Bulldogs finished with 435 total yards, including 370 through the air.

Griffin And Defense Pave Way To Win Over NC State

Lideatrick Griffin electrified the home crowd as he returned the games' opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown to set the stage for a 24-10 victory over NC State. Griffin became only the fifth Bulldog all-time to record a 100-yard kickoff return, and in the process, he laid the foundation for a successful night across the board for the Maroon and White. The Bulldog defense was stout, holding NC State out of the end zone until late in the fourth quarter. **Emmanuel Forbes** paced Mississippi State with a career-high 11 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss. MSU finished the evening with nine total tackles for loss, including four sacks. State also forced three turnovers. **Jalen Green** recorded an interception and fumble recovery. **Jett Johnson** forced the fumble that was recovered by Green, and **Fred Peters** also recorded a pick to seal the win with only seconds to play. On the other side of the ball, **Will Rogers** completed 33 of his 49 pass attempts for 294 yards and two touchdowns. It marked the sophomore's seventh career 200-plus-yard passing game, a total that is tied for ninth in Mississippi State history. Nine different Bulldogs caught passes from Rogers with **Jo'quavious Marks** hauling in a team-high seven catches and **Dillon Johnson** pacing State with a career-high 70 receiving yards. Griffin's game-starting touchdown return had the Bulldogs off and running from the opening bell. State led 7-0 after one quarter of play. Following a 45-yard field goal from NC State in the opening moments of the second quarter, the Bulldogs increased their lead just before halftime when Rogers found **Malik Heath** for a 21-yard scoring pass that completed a 13-play, 83-yard drive. MSU rode its offensive momentum right into the second half. Following Jett Johnson's forced fumble and Green's recovery, State took advantage of a short field. With 8:59 left in the third quarter, Rogers found **Jaden Walley** on a four-yard touchdown toss to go up 21-3. The Bulldogs added to their advantage in the fourth quarter when **Nolan McCord** drilled a 32-yard field goal with 12:30 left to play to make it 24-3. NC State was able to close the gap with a touchdown with 1:06 remaining, but after the Wolfpack recovered an onside kick, Peters cemented the MSU win with his interception.

Late Surge Falls Short At Memphis

MSU scored a pair of touchdowns in the final minutes to nearly complete a late comeback, but the Bulldogs ultimately came up short and fell on the road to Memphis, 31-29. Down 28-17 with just over three minutes to play, **Will Rogers** bookended a Memphis field goal with a nine-yard touchdown pass to **Malik Heath** and a 36-yard scoring toss to **Makai Polk**. However, the Bulldogs failed on a potential game-tying two-point conversion attempt when Rogers' scramble came up about a yard short of the goal line. The State signal caller passed for 419 yards, which stands as the eighth-best single-game mark in MSU history. Rogers also threw for three touchdowns as he set new State single-game records in completions and attempts by connecting on 50 of his 67 passes. Polk set career highs in both catches and yardage, hauling in 11 passes for 136 yards. **Emmanuel Forbes** came through with his sixth career interception. **Martin Emerson** and **Jett Johnson** tied for the team lead with eight total tackles each. The Bulldogs scored 17 unanswered points following a Memphis 49-yard fumble return on State's first drive of the game. MSU first clawed into the Tiger lead by putting together its longest scoring drive of the season. **Nolan McCord** drilled a career-long 39-yard field goal to cap a 17-play series and pull State within four points at 7-3. Early in the second quarter, the Bulldogs surged ahead. Polk hauled in five receptions on MSU's go-ahead drive. With 9:58 left in the period, **Dillon Johnson's** three-yard run into the end zone put State in front 10-7. Less than five minutes of game action later, the Bulldogs added to their advantage when Rogers connected with Walley on a six-yard touchdown pass that put MSU up 17-7. The score held until the late in the third quarter. Memphis' Seth Henigan threw a pair of touchdown passes – one in the third quarter and one in the fourth – to put the Tigers up 21-17. Then, Memphis later returned a punt 94 yards for a score to go up 28-17 with only 5:36 to play. Following State's failed two-point attempt with 1:32 left, MSU's chances were ended when the Bulldogs weren't able to an onside kick.

State Drops 28-25 Decision To LSU

Mississippi State fell 28-25 to LSU at Davis Wade Stadium in the SEC opener. The Bulldogs trailed 7-3 at halftime, but the Tigers used three second half touchdowns to claim the win. MSU outgained LSU in total yardage in defeat. The Bulldogs posted 486 yards of total offense, paced by Will Rogers' 371 yards passing. The State signal caller completed 47 of 62 attempts and had three touchdown passes. Rogers has now thrown for 300 or more yards in a game five times already in his career, the second-most in school history behind only Dak Prescott. Makai Polk, Joquavius Marks and Austin Williams served as three of Rogers' favorite targets. Each caught touchdown passes as Polk finished with 78 yards, Marks tallied 67 and Williams ended with 62. On the ground, Dillon Johnson and Marks led the way for the Bulldogs, who set a new season high in team rushing yardage with 115 yards. Johnson totaled 51 rushing yards on eight attempts while Marks had 46 yards on 13 runs. Defensively, Fred Peters led MSU with nine tackles. The Bulldogs created a turnover as Emmanuel Forbes notched his seventh career pick – a total that leads all the FBS since the start of the 2020 season. LSU took a 7-0 lead less than six minutes into the game and led from that point on. State accumulated its points with a Nolan McCord 23-yard field goal in the second quarter that pulled MSU to within four at 7-3. After falling behind 21-3 in the third, State clawed closer on a 29-yard touchdown pass from Rogers to Polk. LSU went up 28-10 early in the fourth. Rogers would again narrow the margin with his two-yard scoring toss to Williams with 6:48 left and 16-yard touchdown pass to Marks with 1:53 left, but the comeback attempt fell short.
