### WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Ole Miss holds a 63-46-6 advantage in the series dating back to 1901.
- The original record is 63-48-6 in favor of Ole Miss ... The Rebels had wins in 2012 & 2014 vacated due to NCAA ruling, while Mississippi State forfeited wins in 1976 & 1977.
- This game will be the 94th "Battle of the Golden Egg," as the two schools started playing for the trophy in 1927 ... Ole Miss holds a 57-29-5 advantage in the "Egg Bowl".
- According to Ole Miss records, this will be the 30th time the series has been played on Thanksgiving Day ... Ole Miss holds a 15-13-1 advantage in Thanksgiving games, including an 8-5 mark in games played in Starkville.
- The Rebels are one of just five teams in the nation with at least five wins vs. bowl eligible opponents.
- Ole Miss ranks as the fourth most-improved defense in the FBS, allowing 12.9 less points this season compared to 2020.
- Ole Miss has forced a turnover in 20 of the 21 games during the **Lane Kiffin** era.
- Ole Miss is the only team in the nation with four players with 500 or more rushing yards this season.
- The Rebels are second in the FBS in fourth down attempts (39) and are third in conversions (25).
- QB **Matt Corral** is one of only three FBS QBs with more than 15 passing touchdowns and at least 10 rushing TDs.
- Corral ranks ninth in the FBS in total offense (332.5 ypg).
- WR **Braylon Sanders** leads the SEC and ranks fourth nationally in yards per reception (22.1).
- DL **Sam Williams** has a school record 10.5 sacks on the season ... He's ranked sixth in the FBS in sacks.
- LB **Chance Campbell** is fourth in the SEC with 8.1 tackles per game.
- K **Caden Costa's** 14 field goals are tied for the most in program history by a true freshman (Joshua Shene, 2006).

**PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS:** Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will be first, followed by head football coach Lane Kiffin at noon. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+ (ESPN App). Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (noon). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change and some press conferences will be offered via Zoom (listen only).

**SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE:** Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference weekly teleconference every Wednesday, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season (noon). The number is available through the SEC office at 205-348-3000.

**PRACTICES:** Practice footage is available periodically on the Ole Miss FTP site. At open practices, video is permitted for stretch only, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Photographers must use tight shots and no formations.

**WORKING CREDENTIALS:** To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: [www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss](http://www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss). Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 2) daily newspapers; 3) network affiliate television stations; 4) magazines, non-broadcast radio stations and weekly newspapers.

**PARKING:** Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to the SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested during credential application process.

**MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL:** Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS:** All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current studentathletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

**SIDELINE ACCESS:** Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/ videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

**VIDEO CONTENT:** Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: [www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos](http://www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos). Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions. **RECRUITS:** Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

**RADIO RIGHTS:** The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by IMG College in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/ Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. ### LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST MISSISSIPPI STATE

#### Nov. 28, 2020 • Oxford, Miss. • Ole Miss 31, Miss. State 24:

Ole Miss started fast and did just enough defensively to top Mississippi State and bring the Golden Egg back to Oxford after a two-year drought. Matt Corral threw for 385 yards, 139 to Elijah Moore, as Ole Miss claimed an early lead and held on for four hard-fought quarters. Trailing by a touchdown, the Bulldogs drove into Rebel territory on the final drive but ran out of time.

#### Nov. 28, 2019 • Starkville, Miss. • Miss. State 21, Ole Miss 20:

In one of the most dramatic finishes in Egg Bowl history, Ole Miss came up just one point shy of a win in Starkville. The Rebels twice came from behind in the game as Matt Corral came off the bench to find Elijah Moore for a touchdown with just four seconds on the clock, but an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty after the TD pushed back the PAT attempt, resulting in a miss as the Bulldogs escaped with a one-point victory.

#### Nov. 22, 2018 • Oxford, Miss. • #18 Miss. State 35, Ole Miss 3:

Junior receiver A.J. Brown broke the Ole Miss single-season record for

receptions on Thanksgiving night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, but little else went the way of the Rebels in a 35-3 defeat to No. 18 Mississippi State. The Bulldogs jumped out to a 14-0 lead before Ole Miss answered with a field goal, but that was the only noise the Rebel offense made all night in the rivalry defeat.

#### Nov. 23, 2017 • Starkville, Miss. • Ole Miss 31, #14 Miss. State 28:

The underdog Ole Miss Rebels jumped out to a 10-0 lead over No. 14 Mississippi State and never looked back en route to the Egg Bowl win. It took just 39 seconds for RB Jordan Wilkins to punch in the first of his two touchdowns on the day to give Ole Miss an early lead. The Rebels also used a 77-yard TD reception by Starkville native A.J. Brown and a 63-yard scoring catch by Oxonian D.K. Metcalf to establish a 24-6 lead in the third.

#### Nov. 26, 2016 • Oxford, Miss. • Miss. State 55, Ole Miss 20:

Freshman quarterback Shea Patterson threw for 320 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while senior running back Akeem Judd added 107 yards on the ground in front of 66,038 fans in Vaught Hemingway Stadium.

### OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

**Lane Kiffin** (Fresno State, 1998) is in his second season at Ole Miss and helped lead the Rebels to four wins in their final five games in 2020, including a 26-20 victory over No. 7 Indiana in the Outback Bowl. Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine last season. Ole Miss ranked top-20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Kiffin is in his 10th year at the NCAA level and has posted an all-time record of 75-41. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as a graduate assistant.

### MISSISSIPPI STATE HEAD COACH MIKE LEACH

Mike Leach is in his second season at Mississippi State after leading the Bulldogs to back-to-back victories to end the 2020 season, including the program's first win over a ranked team in a bowl game since 1941. In his 20 years as a head coach, Leach has compiled a 150-101 (.598) record while guiding his squads to 17 bowl games. Leach arrived in Starkville after eight seasons at the helm of the Washington State program and 10 seasons as head coach at Texas Tech (2000-09). A two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year (2015, 2018), Leach spearheaded WSU to a school-record six bowl appearances and became the first coach in school history to lead the Cougars to five consecutive bowl games. In Lubbock, Leach's squads produced bowl appearances all 10 years, including a program record with 11 regular-season wins in 2008. The mastermind behind the NCAA record-setting "Air Raid," Leach's passing attack led the FBS — six at Texas Tech and four at Washington State. Leach also made stops as an offensive coordinator in Norman (1999), Kentucky (1997-98), Valdosta State (1992-96) and Iowa Wesleyan College (1989-91).

### BULLDOG SCOUTING REPORT

Heading into the Egg Bowl, Mississippi State boasts a 7-4 record and checks in at No. 25 in the College Football Playoff Rankings. This season the Bulldogs are 3-1 against Top-25 opponents, with the lone loss coming to Alabama. Mike Leach and quarterback Will Rogers lead an explosive passing attack that ranks second in the nation at 390.2 yards per game. Rogers is completing an FBS-best 76 percent of his passes and has thrown for 4,113 yards and 34 touchdowns. Makai Polk has been Rogers' go-to target this season, with 88 receptions for 891 yards and nine scores. Wideouts Jaden Walley and Austin Williams each have over 500 receiving yards on the season too. On the ground, the Bulldogs have only rushed for 889 yards through 11 games, with Dillon Johnson and Jo'quavious Marks splitting the workload. Defensively, State is holding its opponents to 325.7 total yards per game. Linebacker Jett Johnson paces the team with 74 total tackles, while Tyrus Wheat has a team-high 7.0 sacks. The Bulldog defense has also forced at least one takeaway in 42 of their last 50 games.

### MISSISSIPPI STATE SERIES HISTORY

- This game will be the 118th meeting of one of the nation's most-played rivalries.
- Ole Miss holds a 63-46-6 advantage in the series dating back to 1901, including a 22-15-3 mark in Starkville.
- The original record is 63-48-6 in favor of Ole Miss ... The Rebels had wins in 2012 & 2014 vacated due to NCAA ruling, while Mississippi State forfeited wins in 1976 & 1977.
- This game will be the 94th "Battle of the Golden Egg," as the two schools started playing for the trophy in 1927 ... Ole Miss holds a 57-29-5 advantage in the "Egg Bowl".
- It is the first meeting in the series with both programs ranked since 2015 when Ole Miss was No. 18 and MSU was No. 21 in the CFP poll.
- The Rebels own the four longest separate winning streaks in the series (nine, six, six and five games).
- Including a pair of forfeited victories, Ole Miss posted a 38-7-2 record versus MSU from 1944-1990.
- From 1947-1963, the Rebels posted a 15-0-2 mark against MSU ... That means a child born in December 1946 was a senior in high school before they saw Ole Miss lose to the Bulldogs.
- From 2004-2014, the home team won all but two games ... Since then, the road team has won four of the last six.

## THE START OF THE GOLDEN EGG

The Golden Egg was first proposed by members of Sigma Iota, an Ole Miss honorary society in 1927. Sigma Iota proposed that a trophy be awarded in a dignified ceremony designed to calm excited fans, after Ole Miss fans stormed the field at Starkville's Scott Field following the Rebels' 7-6 win in the 1926 contest. The 1926 win snapped a 13-game losing streak to then-Mississippi A&M, and was just Ole Miss' fifth win in 23 tries. Following the game, Ole Miss fans made a dash for the goal posts, while Aggie fans took after them with cane bottom chairs and fights broke out. The mayhem continued until most of the chairs were splintered. After Sigma Iota made its proposal, Mississippi A&M approved the suggestion, and Ole Miss, two weeks before the game, officially added its approval. The trophy, to be called "The Golden Egg," would be a regulation-size gold-plated football mounted on a pedestal. The cost of the \$250 trophy was split between both schools. On Thanksgiving Day, 1927, the first "Battle of the Golden Egg" was waged before a crowd of 14,000 in Oxford. The Rebels won 20-12 and the symbol of supremacy in the series was born.

## ORIGINS OF THE NAME

The term "Egg Bowl" can be traced back to 1978, when Executive Sports Editor of The Clarion-Ledger Tom Patterson decided to spice up the 1978 meeting. A year earlier, the Clarion-Ledger headline on game day had been "Egg Bowl Is Up For Scramble." With the Rebels and the Bulldogs 6-4 and both apparently out of the bowl picture heading into the 1978 game, Patterson instructed his staff to follow the "Egg Bowl" theme throughout the week. The result was a special section on Sunday, which recounted in great detail the Rebels' stunning 27-7 victory. While the game is still officially the "Battle of the Golden Egg," most members of the media now refer to the annual game simply as the "Egg Bowl."

## A SPECIAL FRESHMAN

Kicker **Caden Costa**, a true freshman from Mandeville, Louisiana, is 14-for-17 on field goal attempts, including a 50-yarder vs. Arkansas. Costa is a perfect 9-for-9 on field goals less than 40 yards. His 14 field goals on the season are tied for the most by a true freshman in program history. (Joshua Shene, 2006). Costa is the first Rebel to connect on a 50-yard field goal since Andrew Ritter made a 50-yarder against Idaho in 2013.

Injuries to some of its top receivers have forced Ole Miss to call on a bevy of different names and the wide receiving corps depth has shown through. The Rebels are the only team in the country with six different players who have registered at least one 100-yard receiving game this season.

Ole Miss finished the 2021 campaign with a perfect 7-0 home record, its first undefeated season at home (on the field) since 1992 when the Rebels finished 6-0 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. ### PICK YOUR POISON

Ole Miss is the only team in the nation with four players with 500 or more rushing yards this season (Jerrion Ealy [643yds], Snoop Conner [556yds]), Matt Corral [552yds] and Henry Parrish Jr. [537yds]. The foursome has combined for seven 100-yard rushing performances this season.

### SHOUTOUT TO SHUTOUTS

The Ole Miss defense has tallied four shutout halves this year (Louisville [first half], Tulane [second half], Liberty [first half] and Texas A&M [first half]). Prior to this season, Ole Miss had only played three shutout halves in the previous five seasons, spanning 58 games. The four shutouts are the most in a single season since the Rebels tallied five such occurrences in 2014.

### LEAVING HIS MARK

**Mark Robinson** transferred to Ole Miss as a walk-on running back from Southeast Missouri, but the Leesburg, Georgia, native made the switch to the defensive side of the ball at the end of fall camp last season. Robinson, who sat out last year due to NCAA transfer rules, ranks fourth on the team and No. 18 in the SEC with 7.1 tackles per game. Robinson has tallied at least eight total tackles in five of the games this season. He set career highs in total tackles (14), solo stops (12), tackles for loss (5) and sacks (2) in Ole Miss' win at Tennessee. Robinson's 5.0 tackles for loss against the Vols were the most by a Rebel since Kendrick Clancy had 6.0 against Auburn in 1999.

### SACK YOU VERY MUCH

While the Rebel offense gets much of the praise from week-to-week, the Ole Miss defense has proven very capable of gaining some attention of their own. Ole Miss ranks eighth in the FBS with 36 team sacks. With one regular season contest and a bowl game left to go, the 36 sacks are already the fifth-most in program history.

## NO HUDDLE, NO PROBLEM

The Ole Miss offense has been moving the ball up and down the field at an unbelievably fast pace under head coach **Lane Kiffin** and offensive coordinator **Jeff Leiby**. The Rebels rank fifth in the FBS in number of plays per game (77.4), averaging a play every 20.7 seconds. Ole Miss ran a school record 101 plays on offense in its win at Tennessee. The previous mark was 100 plays in 2004 against Wyoming. The 101 plays run were tied for the ninth-most in SEC history and the most since 2018 when Texas A&M ran 107 in a seven overtime loss to LSU.

## MUCH OF THE SAM

DL **Sam Williams** has been a consistent force on the Ole Miss defensive line this season. Williams ranks sixth in the FBS with 10.5 sacks this year. He already owns the Ole Miss modern-day school record for sacks in a season. Williams has at least one sack in eight of the 11 games this season.

## TWO-HEADED MONSTER

RB **Snoop Conner** ranks third in the SEC with 11 rushing touchdowns, while QB **Matt Corral** is fifth at 10 TDs. They are the first Rebel teammates ever to tally 10 or more rushing touchdowns in the same season. The 10 rushing TDs are the third-most ever by a Rebel quarterback in a single season. Conner currently ranks fourth on Ole Miss' career charts with 24 career rushing touchdowns.

## REBS IN THE POLLS

- Ole Miss ranks No. 8 in both the the Associated Press Poll and the Coaches Poll headed into the regular season finale vs. MSU.
- The No. 8 spot in the polls are the Rebels' best ranking since starting the 2015 season ranked No. 3.
- Ole Miss has been ranked in the top 25 all 13 weeks this season, which is its longest streak since being ranked for the entirety of the 2015 season.
- The Rebels are the highest ranked two-loss team in the polls.
- The SEC boasts six different teams ranked in the top 25, including top-ranked Georgia.

## FOURTH AND GOING FOR IT

Ole Miss is second in the country in fourth down attempts (39) and third in conversions (25). **Lane Kiffin** and the Rebels have gone for it on fourth down at least three times in nine of Ole Miss' 11 games this season. The Rebels have been perfect on fourth down attempts against Louisville (3-for-3), Tulane (5-for-5) and LSU (3-for-3).

## RUNNIN' WILD

Ole Miss leads the SEC and ranks No. 6 in FBS with 230.6 rushing yards per game. **Lane Kiffin's** offense has tallied 250 or more yards on the ground in four out of the last seven contests. **Matt Corral**, who came into the season with seven career TD runs over the course of 24 games, is fourth amongst FBS quarterbacks with 10 rushing touchdowns. **Snoop Conner** ranks third in the SEC in rushing TDs with 11, while Corral is fifth at 10 rushing TDs.

## MAC BROWN RAISES OVER 145K FOR ALS RESEARCH

When he was in seventh grade, Ole Miss punter **Mac Brown** had a modest goal of raising \$500 for a childhood friend's dad who had been diagnosed with ALS. Along with a group of neighborhood friends, Brown started a lemonade stand, Awesome Lemonade Stand, in Eden Prairie, Minnesota, to help his friend's family. Ten years later, that \$500 goal has ballooned to over \$145,000 raised by Brown and his friends for ALS research. Brown was recently one of 22 collegiate football players named to the 2021 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.

## FEED SNOOP

When the Rebels are nearing the goal line trying to find the end zone, chances are very good that Ole Miss will look **Snoop Conner's** way. Seventeen of Conner's 24 career rushing touchdowns have been from five yards or less, including 12 one-yard TD runs. Conner currently ranks third in the SEC with 11 rushing TDs on the season.

## KEIDRON SMITH TO WEAR CHUCKY MULLINS PATCH

Ole Miss senior defensive back **Keidron Smith** was named the winner of the 2021 Chucky Mullins Courage Award earlier in the fall. The award, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 season when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. Smith is the 31st recipient in the 32-year history of the award and wears a 38 patch on his No. 20 jersey rather than switch numbers.

### GET YOU A QUARTERBACK THAT CAN DO BOTH

Quarterback **Matt Corral** is not only a threat to burn you with his arm, but as teams are quickly finding out, the junior signal-caller can also beat you with his feet. Corral has thrown for 3,105 yards and 19 touchdowns, while running for 50.2 yards per game and 10 rushing TDs. He's one of just three FBS quarterbacks with at least 15 passing TDs and 10 touchdowns on the ground. Prior to this season, Corral had just seven career rushing TDs in three seasons for the Rebels. Against Tennessee, Corral became the first Rebel to run 30 times in a game since 2007 when BenJarvus Green-Ellis ran 33 times vs. Missouri. Corral finished with a career high in both rushing yards (195) and attempts (30) vs. the Vols.

## HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin is in his second season in Oxford after leading the Rebels to a 5-5 record and a Outback Bowl victory over No. 7 Indiana in 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game.

The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set during the Tigers' run to a national title in 2019.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

Kiffin has more than 11 years of head coaching experience, including 10 years at the NCAA level where he has posted an all-time record of 74-41.

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures.

Kiffin came to Tennessee from the Oakland Raiders, where he served as head coach from 2007-08. At 31, he was the youngest head coach in the NFL's modern era. Oakland's offense significantly improved in his first year, up 7.2 points per game and 48.6 yards per game from 2006.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). During his first tenure with the Trojans, USC captured two national championships and compiled a 65-12 record. Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as a graduate assistant. He spent the 2000 season as defensive quality control assistant with the Jacksonville Jaguars under Tom Coughlin.

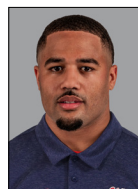

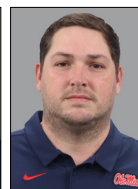

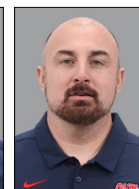

### GAME ONE #25 OLE MISS 43, LOUISVILLE 24

ATLANTA — The Rebels dominated on offense, defense and special teams en route to a season opening 43-24 victory over Louisville in the 2021 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game on Labor Day.

Matt Corral once again put up big numbers through the air, going 22-for-32 for 381 yards and a touchdown pass to Dontario Drummond, who had 177 yards on nine catches. Corral also added 55 yards and a score while Snoop Conner rushed for 60 yards and two scores to lead the team. Defensively, Otis Reese, AJ Finley, Tysheem Johnson and Ashanti Cistrunk each recorded eight tackles while the unit combined for seven tackles for loss and two turnovers.

It was all Ole Miss early, as the Rebels wasted little time getting on the scoreboard first, going 95 yards in 11 plays and capping it all off with a Jerriion Ealy goal line touchdown. Two drives later, true freshman Caden Costa delivered on his first career attempt to give his team a 9-0 lead with 2:25 left in the first quarter.

Corral found the end zone for the first time in 2021, utilizing his legs on a six-yard touchdown run to give Ole Miss a 16-0 lead for the third score of their first four possessions. Defensively, the Rebels continued their hot first half start, as Deantre Prince intercepted Cunningham over the middle. Three plays later, the Rebels extended their lead with a Snoop Conner goal line score. Ole Miss once again took advantage of a Louisville turnover, recovering a fumble on fourth down in the red zone and drove 77-yards in 44 seconds to kick a 22-yard field goal as the half expired. The Rebels went into the locker room with a dominant 26-0 lead.

The Cardinals responded with a 38-yard field goal to open up the third quarter, but the Rebels again drove down the field and answered with another Costa field goal. Louisville finally broke through with 1:58 left in the third quarter, finding the end zone on a four yard pass. The Rebels answered with a seven-play, 75-yard drive of their own that ended with Conner's second touchdown of the game from 11 yards out. Cunningham scored two late touchdowns on the ground, but it was too little, too late. Corral connected with Drummond for his first passing touchdown of the season, icing the 43-24 victory.

OXFORD, Miss. — In Saturday's Military Appreciation game, the No. 20 Ole Miss football team took care of business early and cruised to a 54-17 victory over Austin Peay at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Matt Corral completed 21-of-33 passes for 281 yards and threw five touchdown passes. Dontario Drummond and Jonathan Mingo each caught a career-high two touchdowns each, with Drummond recording a third-straight 100-plus yard receiving game. Braylon Sanders and Snoop Conner each added a score through the air and ground, respectively.

Defensively, Ashanti Cistrunk led the Rebels with six tackles, while Sam Williams had two sacks and a 33-yard scoop-and-score in the first half.

For the second consecutive week, the Rebels scored on their opening possession. Matt Corral capped off a 10-play, 80-yard drive by rolling out and finding Dontario Drummond for the goal line score. After the offense punted, Sam Williams sacked Ellis coming off the edge, jarring the ball loose and taking it 33 yards the other way for six to put Ole Miss up 14-0.

Going into the second quarter, Corral and company marched 66 yards down the field in two minutes, connecting with Jonathan Mingo for a 15-yard touchdown strike. Shortly after, the Rebels added two more points after a punting gaff resulted in a safety. Four plays after the ensuing kickoff, Drummond scored his second touchdown catch of the night on a 49-yard toss from Corral and some dazzling footwork along the left sideline. It wouldn't take long for Sam Williams to get his second strip sack of the game, and it eventually resulted in Corral's fourth touchdown pass to Braylon Sanders. Austin Peay finally broke through late in the half, but Ole Miss held a 37-7 lead going into the locker room.

In the second half, Corral threw his fifth touchdown pass of the game to Mingo from 40 yards, Snoop Conner plunged into the end zone and Caden Costa connected on a 26-yard field goal to cap off the scoring efforts. The Governors added a field goal and a late score by CJ Evans Jr., but the Rebels had things well in their hands, advancing to 2-0 on the year at the final score of 54-17.

OXFORD, Miss. — A near two hour weather delay couldn't stop Matt Corral and the No. 16 Ole Miss football team from lighting up the scoreboard on Saturday.

The Rebels tied the SEC record with 41 first downs, while Corral accounted for seven scores, tying a school record. Corral completed 23-of-31 passes for 335 yards and rushed for four TDs. Jerrion Ealy led the Rebels on the ground with 103 yards, while Jonathan Mingo had a career high six catches for 136 yards and a score through the air. Defensively, Chance Campbell led the Rebels with eight tackles and a sack. After giving up 226 yards of total offense in the first half, the Rebels pitched a second half shutout while the offense continued its record setting day.

Right out of the gate, the Rebels came away with touchdowns on their first two drives with ease. Henry Parrish Jr. scored the first and Corral called his own number to go up 13-0. Tulane caught a break, recovering a fumble in Ole Miss territory and cashed in with a goal line score. Ole Miss responded with another Corral rushing touchdown to close out the quarter. After a missed Tulane field goal, Ole Miss went 80 yards in eight plays, capping it off with a 12-yard pass to Dontario Drummond. The Green Wave drove back down the field and answered, scoring a touchdown. After a surprise onside kick recovered at midfield, Corral threw another touchdown pass to Jonathan Mingo on the first play of the drive to make it 33-14 Rebels. They would tack on another score following another three-and-out, with Drummond finding the end zone on an 11-yard sweep. Tulane cut the lead to 40-21 going into the locker room.

Tulane received the second half kickoff, but came off the field empty handed after a turnover on downs near midfield. Five plays later, Corral had his third rushing score of the game. On the ensuing kickoff, Kentrel Bullock knocked the ball loose and the Rebels recovered. Corral added a fourth rushing touchdown two plays later to give the Rebels a 54-21 lead, but he wasn't done racking up touchdowns. Following a punt, the Rebel signal caller found Braylon Sanders for a 45-yard touchdown pass, allowing Ole Miss to crack 60 points for the first time since 2018 against ULM. The Rebels cruised through the remainder of the contest to remain unbeaten.

Corral put up another gaudy first half, going 18-for-24 for 239 yards through the air and rushing for 40 yards while accounting for four scores total. Mingo had 136 of those yards through the air on six catches, which set a career high.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The top-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide held a white-hot Ole Miss offense in check, handing the No. 12 Rebels their first loss of the season, 42-21.

Matt Corral completed 22 of 30 passes for 213 yards with a touchdown on the ground and through the air to Chase Rogers, who had a team-high 53 yards on three catches. Henry Parrish Jr. led the way on the ground with 47 yards on 11 carries. Snoop Conner also added a touchdown run. Defensively, Otis Reese led the Rebels with a career-high 11 tackles, followed by Chance Campbell's career-high 10 tackles, including 1.5 for a loss. Keidron Smith came away with the team's only turnover, recording a second-half interception.

For the first time all season, the Rebels left the field empty handed on their first possession as Alabama stuffed Jerrion Ealy on 4th-and-1 and took over on their own six-yard line. The Tide took advantage, driving 94 yards down field and finishing it with a touchdown pass from Bryce Young to John Metchie. Alabama had better field position on their next drive after snuffing out another fourth down attempt at the Ole Miss 47-yard line. Going into the second quarter, the Crimson Tide executed a fourth-down attempt of their own near the goal line, with Brian Robinson finding the end zone. After both teams traded punts, Young threw his second touchdown pass of the game to put Alabama up 21-0. It would get even worse for the Rebels as Corral's first fumble of the season led to another Robinson touchdown, giving the Tide a commanding 28-0 lead.

Things didn't get any better for the Rebels coming out of halftime as Alabama went down the field and scored once again. Ole Miss finally broke through in the third quarter with Corral calling his own number for a 10-yard touchdown run. It looked as if Alabama would tack on more points on their next drive, but an end-zone interception by Smith erased those plans. However, Robinson later added his fourth touchdown to make it a 42-7 game. Ole Miss showed no quit, driving for consecutive touchdowns. Corral hit Rogers for a 42-yard gain to eventually set up a one-yard Conner rushing score. The Rebel defense then stonewalled Robinson on fourth down of the ensuing drive, setting the stage for Rogers' first career score.

### GAME FIVE #17 OLE MISS 52, #13 ARKANSAS 51

OXFORD, Miss. — The No. 17 Ole Miss Rebels made a final stand when it mattered most, holding firm on a final two-point conversion to stave off No. 13 Arkansas, 52-51, with no time left on the clock. The game featured a combined 103 points and 1,287 yards of total offense, but the Rebels emerged victorious on that final two-point try after Sam Williams and Tavius Robinson got in the face of Arkansas quarterback KJ Jefferson, who overthrew his target amid the pressure.

Matt Corral completed 14-of-21 passes for 287 yards and two touchdowns while also rushing for 94 yards and two scores on the ground. Henry Parrish Jr. (18 attempts, 111 yards) and Snoop Conner (12 attempts, 110 yards, three TD) combined for 221 yards rushing — with Conner setting a career high with his three scores. Nine different Rebels caught a pass with five hauling in two, and leading the way were Braylon Sanders (two receptions, 127 yards, one TD) and Dontario Drummond (two receptions, 78 yards, one TD). Defensively, Otis Reese led the Rebels with 11 tackles while Keidron Smith and AJ Finley each had 10. Chance Campbell had the only sack of the day, and both he and Smith each had a turnover to their names.

Both teams went back-and-forth all game trading scores. Ole Miss took a 21-14 lead at the half and would lead by as many as 10 in the contest before Arkansas closed the gap late in the third quarter. After Arkansas tied things up at 45 with 1:22 left to play in the ballgame, the Rebel offense took the field and only needed two plays to score the go-ahead touchdown. Corral found Sanders all alone on the right side and he scored from 68 yards out, giving Arkansas just over a minute to score. The Razorbacks drove down to the Ole Miss nine-yard line and with one second left, Jefferson connected with Thompson in the back of the end zone. On the two-point conversion, though, Williams and Robinson caused havoc in the backfield as Jefferson overthrew his receiver and the Rebels prevailed in a thriller.

### GAME SIX #13 OLE MISS 31, TENNESSEE 26

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Matt Corral completed 21 of 38 passes for 231 yards and threw two touchdown passes, but the story of the night is what he did with his legs. Corral had a career-high 195 yards on the ground as Ole Miss silenced a hostile Tennessee crowd and left town with a wild 31-26 victory over the Volunteers.

In total, Corral made up 426 of 510 total yards for the Rebels. Henry Parrish Jr. also helped the cause with 41 rushing yards on 10 carries while Snoop Conner had two rushing touchdowns. Through the air, Dontario Drummond led Ole Miss with 66 receiving yards on just two catches. Drummond and Dannis Jackson each caught a touchdown from Corral, with Jackson's being the first of his Rebel career. Defensively, Mark Robinson put together his best performances in a Rebel uniform, finishing with 14 tackles, five tackles for loss with two sacks. In his first game back from injury, Jake Springer had 11 tackles with a sack while Sam Williams made an impact with seven tackles, 2.5 for loss and 1.5 sacks. As a unit, they kept a high-powered Tennessee offense in check for the first half and again made big stops down the stretch to finish what was a wild meeting on Rocky Top.

After a back-and-forth first quarter, the Rebels went on to score 17 unanswered points. Caden Costa connected on a 30-yard field goal, Corral found Dannis Jackson on a 33-yard pump-and-go route for six and Conner scored his second goal-line TD of the game. In the final minute of the first half, Hooker led the Vols on a late charge down field, ultimately resulting in a 39-yard field goal by Chase McGrath going into the locker room. At the break, Corral had more offensive yards (261) than Tennessee's entire team, who finished with 141.

Tennessee's momentum carried over into the second half with their best drive of the night to make it a one score game. Both teams would then trade missed field goal opportunities before Corral continued his dominant night on the ground and capped off an eight-play, 65-yard drive with a 16-yard touchdown pass to Drummond. The Volunteers wouldn't go away quietly, as Hooker used his legs to get Tennessee back within one score. With time winding down in the fourth quarter, the Rebels were forced to punt the ball away after their defense forced a turnover on downs. It gave the Vols a chance with 27 seconds left, but for the second consecutive week, the Ole Miss defense held its own and made a game-winning stand to cap off the 31-26 victory.

OXFORD, Miss. — On a day when his iconic number 10 was retired, legendary Ole Miss quarterback Eli Manning was honored in a big way Saturday as the Rebels put together a dominant 31-17 Magnolia Bowl victory over the LSU Tigers in front of 64,523 fans, the sixth largest crowd in Vaught-Hemingway Stadium history.

Ole Miss finished with a balanced 470 yards of total offense. Matt Corral completed 18 of 23 passes for 185 yards through the air and threw his only touchdown pass to Casey Kelly. On the ground, Snoop Conner led the Rebels with 117 yards on 14 carries while Corral, Henry Parrish Jr. and Jerriion Ealy each scored a rushing touchdown. Dontario Drummond led Ole Miss in receiving with 93 yards on eight catches. Defensively, Ole Miss forced three turnovers and came up with five sacks between five different Rebels. Mark Robinson once again led the Rebels with 12 tackles, followed by Chance Campbell's 10 tackles. In total, Ole Miss surrendered a season-low 77 yards on the ground.

LSU scored first after the Rebels punted their opening possession away. Another Ole Miss three-and-out gave the Tigers the ball back and they moved the ball down the field once again, but left empty handed as Tysheem Johnson recorded his first career interception on a fourth down play, giving Ole Miss the ball at their own one-yard line. The Rebels drove down the field and settled for a 43-yard field goal from Caden Costa. With less than 10 minutes to play in the first half, Corral found Casey Kelly on the goal line for six. The Rebels then forced a quick three-and-out and scored again as Corral used his legs to find the end zone just before halftime.

The Rebel defense continued their hot streak and forced a three-and-out coming out of the locker room. Their offense continued to remain hot as well, scoring points on their fourth straight possession as Parrish Jr. gave the Rebels a 24-7. Defensively, the Rebels continued to create havoc as Cedric Johnson jarred the ball from Johnson and Jake Springer recovered the loose ball. The Rebels would score on their next drive after Ealy broke a tackle and raced 36 yards for the score, giving Ole Miss a commanding lead. The Landshark defense continued to swarm forcing their third turnover of the game after a Sam Williams strip sack. LSU would tack on a late field goal and touchdown in the fourth quarter, but it was far too late as the Rebels went on to record their third straight victory.

AUBURN, Ala. — The Ole Miss football team showed heart, but was unable to come back from a first half deficit and it cost them in a 31-20 defeat at No. 18 Auburn in primetime at Jordan-Hare Stadium on Saturday night.

Ole Miss and Auburn were nearly even on the stat sheet, with the Tigers holding a slight 483-464 edge in total offense, but the game was won in the second half, as Ole Miss held Auburn to three second half points, but the Rebels were also only able to muster a second half field goal themselves while going 4-for-8 in the red zone on the night. Matt Corral fought through an early injury but returned, ending the day 21-of-37 for 289 yards through the air while tallying 45 yards and a score on 10 rushes. Jahcour Pearson and Casey Kelly each had career nights, with both hauling in seven passes for 135 and 81 yards, respectively. On the ground, Henry Parrish Jr. had 57 yards on 12 carries while Snoop Conner had one of two Rebel touchdowns on the night. Defensively, AJ Finley led the Rebels with 10 tackles, followed by Mark Robinson's nine. Sam Williams and Tylan Knight each had a sack while the defense forced two turnovers.

Auburn's offense jumped out to a quick 14-3 lead after scoring on its first two drives of the game. Not long after, the Rebels suffered another setback as Corral left the game with a foot injury, forcing the Rebels to punt the ball away down two scores. Luke Altmeyer took over the reigns for a drive, throwing his first collegiate completion to John Rhys Plumlee and going 5-of-5 before Corral came out of the locker room and re-entered at QB. After converting on fourth down, Conner scored a 13-yard touchdown, cutting the Auburn lead to 14-10. Auburn continued its success on offense, as Nix found the end zone again from seven yards out on the ensuing drive. Corral continued to show grit, capping off a 10 play drive with an 11-yard TD run. However, Nix responded again, leading a scoring drive to put the Tigers up 28-17 at the half.

Ole Miss settled in on defense in the second half, but the Rebels came up short in the red zone after Knight pounced on a muffed punt. Halfway through the third quarter, Costa drilled a 49-yard field goal to make it a one score game, although it would be the final Rebel points scored in the game. Going into the final quarter of play, Auburn extended its lead to 31-30 with a field goal. The Rebels had a few more opportunities, but a rare Corral interception in the end zone and turnover on downs in the red zone proved costly.

### GAME NINE #15 OLE MISS 27, LIBERTY 14

Nov. 6, 2021

Attendance: 53,235 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — The Ole Miss defense recorded a season-high nine sacks, seven in the first half, and allowed the Rebel offense to dig an early hole for the opposition. In the end, the Rebels did enough to knock off the Liberty Flames 27-14 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday.

Matt Corral completed 20-of-27 passes for 324 yards and threw his only touchdown pass to Dannis Jackson, who had a career-high 126 yards on six catches. John Rhys Plumlee also had a career-high 110 yards on seven catches through the air. Jerrion Ealy had a season-high 115 yards rushing on 10 carries to go along with his two rushing scores. Defensively, the Rebels pitched a first-half shutout for the second time this season and were active in the Liberty backfield the majority of the contest. AJ Finley led the Ole Miss defense with a season-high 12 tackles and had two interceptions. Jaylon Jones also recorded an interception, the first of his long Rebel career. The three team interceptions were the most for Ole Miss since 2019. Chance Campbell and Sam Williams finished with two sacks apiece, with the latter pushing his sack total to 10.5, a single-season school record in the modern era.

It only took Ole Miss two plays to get on the board first. Ealy found an open hole left side and hit it for a 70-yard touchdown run just over 30 seconds into the ball game. After the Flames punted on their opening drive, they were able to move the ball deep into Rebel territory on their next possession, but, but a few shaky plays and a sack by Campbell forced a 38-yard field goal attempt that sailed wide left. Ole Miss would later capitalize as Corral hit Jackson for a big 50-yard reception, setting up a 43-yard Caden Costa field goal to give the Rebels a 10-0 lead in the opening quarter. Following a three-and-out on defense, Corral and company used four plays to score again. Helped by a 44-yard reception by Braylon Sanders, Ealy scored his second rushing touchdown of the game from four yards out. The Rebels went on to pick off Willis on each of Liberty's next two drives and cashed in seven points off the turnovers thanks to a 40-yard touchdown strike from Corral to Jackson.

Liberty finally broke through on the opening drive of the second half with Shedro Lewis capped barreling his way into the end zone from 28 yards out. Ole Miss responded with a 38-yard Costa field goal to go up 27-7 with 6:49 left in the third quarter. The Flames cut the deficit even closer as Willis led a 73-yard drive and capped it off with a three-yard touchdown run. Going into the final quarter of play the defense came up clutch. Keidron Smith broke up a pass on 4th-and-4, sacks by Williams and Cedric Johnson forced the Flames to punt and another interception by Finley in the end zone sealed the victory.

OXFORD, Miss. — With ESPN's College GameDay in town, Ole Miss put on a show, using two late turnovers to pull away with a 29-19 win over No. 11 Texas A&M at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday.

The Rebels finished with 504 yards of total offense, 257 coming on the ground, the largest rushing total given up by the Aggies this season. Jerrion Ealy carried the ball 24 times for 152 yards, putting him over 2,000 rushing yards for his career. Matt Corral completed 24-of-37 passes for 247 yards and a touchdown pass to Dontario Drummond, who had 49 yards on six catches. Defensively, Deane Leonard led Ole Miss with nine tackles while AJ Finley, Otis Reese and Sam Williams combined for 21 tackles.

Ole Miss came out of the tunnel firing on all cylinders on both sides of the ball. The opening drive resulted in a 33-yard Caden Costa field goal, while Drummond capped off a 14-play, 94-yard drive with a 2-yard touchdown catch on 4th-and-goal. In the blink of an eye, Ole Miss had a 10-0 lead with 6:55 left in the opening quarter. Ole Miss proceeded to find the Aggie red zone once again, tacking on a 33-yard field goal. After forcing a three-and-out, Texas A&M held firm in a goal-line stand, forcing a Rebel turnover on downs. However, the Ole Miss would get points a play later as Chance Campbell and Mark Robinson tackled Isaiah Spiller in the end zone for a safety. Both defenses kept the score 15-0 going into the locker room.

Coming out of halftime, Zach Calzada got the Texas A&M passing game going. The Aggies scored 13 unanswered on their first four drives in the second half, using two field goals and a 24-yard touchdown run by Devon Achane to cut the lead to 15-13 with 10 minutes remaining. Two plays after forcing a Rebel punt, Ashanti Cistrunk came away with Ole Miss' first turnover of the night, intercepting Calzada, and set his offense up with a golden opportunity to pull away. Snoop Conner ran straight ahead for a 13-yard score, extending Ole Miss' lead to 22-13. The Rebel defense made another big play on Texas A&M's ensuing drive, this time icing the game for good. On 3rd-and-10, Finley jumped a route, picking off Calzada and running the ball 52-yards the other way for an Ole Miss touchdown. The Aggies scored one more touchdown on the night, but the Rebels held on the rest of the way to remain unbeaten at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in 2021.

OXFORD, Miss. — Matt Corral completed 27 of 36 passes for 326 yards and threw two touchdown passes in his final game at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium as the Ole Miss football team knocked off Vanderbilt 31-17 in SEC play. The Rebels finish the 2021 season a perfect 7-0 at home, the first undefeated mark on campus since 1992.

In total, Ole Miss had 470 yards of total offense. Jahcour Pearson led the Rebels with 101 yards on four catches, while Dontario Drummond and Jerriion Ealy each had a touchdown catch. Ealy led the Rebels in rushing with 55 yards followed by Snoop Conner's 52 yards. Al Finley and Chance Campbell each had eight tackles defensively while the unit allowed just a single touchdown on the night.

Right out of the gate, Corral went 5-for-5 and capped off the opening drive with an eight-yard touchdown pass to Ealy. After forcing a three-and-out defensively, Ole Miss drove down field again, but had to settle for a 28-yard field goal by Caden Costa. Vanderbilt proceeded to move the ball into Ole Miss territory, but the drive would stall nearing the red zone. The Commodores happily took points as Joseph Bulovas connected on a 49-yard field goal. Going into the second quarter, Ole Miss used a balanced 10 play, 80-yard drive to extend its lead. Corral found Drummond in the flat and he made a man miss on his way into the end zone from 10 yards out. Vanderbilt responded with another long drive that eventually made its way to the red zone where Bulovas hit another field goal. Late in the first half, Drummond returned a punt to the Vanderbilt 18-yard line and three plays later, Ealy scored a rushing touchdown from four yards out. The Commodores made one final push before going into the locker room and it ended with a third field goal by Bulovas to make it a 24-9 game at the half.

After a quiet third quarter from both sides, Ole Miss tacked on another touchdown early in the fourth. A few plays after a 26-yard reception by Drummond, Henry Parrish Jr. scored from eight yards out and made it a 31-9 Ole Miss lead with 12:50 left to play. The Commodores finally found the end zone midway through the fourth. Wright led Vanderbilt down field, converting twice on third down before Griffin scored on the goal line. Following a successful two-point conversion, the Rebel lead was trimmed to 14 points. The Commodores came away with a red zone interception almost three minutes later, but couldn't capitalize after turning the ball over on downs with 3:17 left to play. Deantre Prince denied a final Vanderbilt attempt to score with a toe-tap interception to seal an Ole Miss victory.

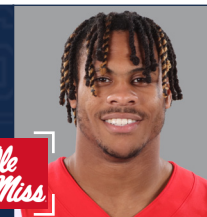

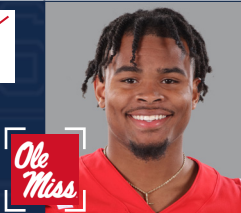
