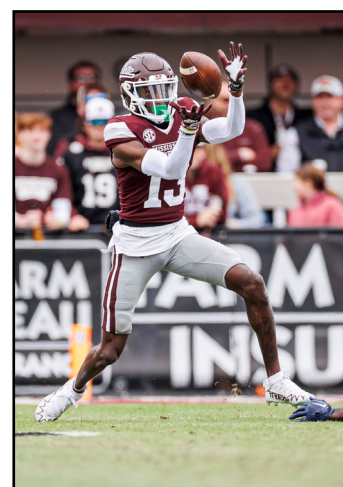

TALKING POINTS

- ▶ Mississippi State is looking for its first eight-win season since 2018. That was also the last year that the Bulldogs won the Battle for the Golden Egg in Oxford.
- ▶ MSU has already claimed its first six-win season at home since 2018. The Bulldogs have won at least six home games five times in program history (2018, 2014, 2012, 1999).
- ▶ The Battle for the Golden Egg is an even 15-15 over the last 30 meetings, dating back to 1991. However, MSU holds a 689-660 scoring advantage in that span.
- ▶ In 2022, MSU is outscoring opponents 90-21 in the first quarter. The Bulldogs are 13-4 when scoring first under **Mike Leach**.
- ▶ RB **Jo'quavious Marks** has caught a pass in 34 consecutive games, which is the longest active streak in the SEC and tied for No. 11 nationally. The MSU school record is 35 games set by Fred Ross (2013-16). Marks has at least one reception in every game of his collegiate career.
- ▶ Marks has caught 44 passes, which is tied for the SEC lead among running backs, and RB **Dillon Johnson** is tied for second among SEC backs with 40 receptions.
- ▶ The Bulldogs have collected at least one takeaway in 28 of 35 games under defensive coordinator Zach Arnett with 55 total takeaways in that span. State leads the SEC in takeaways since 2020 and its 28 games with a takeaway are second in the conference in that span.
- ▶ State leads the SEC with 14 interceptions and is fourth in the league with 51 pass defenses this season.
- ▶ MSU has an interception in 20 games under defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett** with multiple picks in 11 games for 36 total picks. The Bulldogs are 10-1 in multi-interception games. Ten active players have collected 32 total interceptions in their careers.



CB Emmanuel Forbes broke the FBS and SEC record with his sixth career pick-six against ETSU. The SEC record had stood since 1971. He leads the nation with six picks this season, including three returned for touchdowns.

PROVEN WINNER

One of the most successful coaches in the history of college football, **Mike Leach's** 157 career wins as an FBS head coach are the second-most among active SEC coaches and tied for fifth among active Power 5 coaches.

TALKING POINTS CONTINUED

► MSU is bowl eligible and will play in a postseason game for the 13th straight season, which is a program record. Only seven schools have active streaks of at least 13 seasons and only Alabama and Georgia join MSU from the SEC.

► MSU leads the FBS in points per red zone drive (5.19), red zone touchdown percentage (81.08 percent) and red zone passing touchdown percentage (59.46 percent).

► QB **Will Rogers** threw for 301 yards and five touchdowns in his last outing against ETSU (Nov. 12). It marked the fourth time this year that he has thrown at least four touchdown passes, which is tied for third in the FBS. It is also just the second season in school history that a Bulldog has passed for four or more touchdowns in four games. Rogers threw four touchdowns in four games last year.

► Rogers has thrown for 300-plus yards and at least three touchdowns in 16 of his 33 career games, which is tied for 13th in the FBS since 2000.

► Since 2020, Rogers is third nationally among active players with five career games of five or more passing touchdowns and is tied for third with 79 total passing touchdowns. He also leads the nation in passing yards (10,189).

► Rogers boasts 20 career 300-yard passing games, which is an MSU career record (Previous: 9 by Dak Prescott, 2012-15) and 24 career 30-completion games, also an MSU record (Previous: 5 by Dak Prescott, 2012-15) and tied for the third-most in the FBS since 2000.

► Rogers has also matched Prescott's school record with 29 career 200-yard passing games. Rogers needs four passing touchdowns to tie his own school record set last year (36).

► WR **Austin Williams** was named one of 12 finalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy. He is MSU's fifth finalist and the only finalist this season with a perfect 4.0 GPA every year of his career. The last Bulldog finalist was Taveze Calhoun (2015), who now serves on staff as a graduate assistant.

► Four current Bulldogs are now among the top 10 in MSU career history for total receptions: RB **Jo'quavious Marks** (2nd, 187), WR **Austin Williams** (5th, 147), RB **Dillon Johnson** (7th, 141) and WR **Jaden Walley** (10th, 131).

► Mississippi State boasts some of the best special teams return units in the nation. State's kickoff return unit leads the nation, averaging 28.2 yards per return. Both the Bulldogs' kickoff and punt return teams have broken a return for a touchdown this season, and only five teams nationally have scored on both a punt and kick return.

► The Bulldogs are tied for the national lead with a 90.5 special teams grade from PFF.

► WR **Lideatrick Griffin** leads the nation in yards per kick return (32.3), and WR **Zavion Thomas** is seventh in yards per punt return (12.9). Griffin's career average (33.3) is tops among active FBS players and would exceed the school record by 6.6 yards.

► LB **Nathaniel Watson** has led MSU in tackles in seven games and is second in the SEC with 98 stops this season, which ranks 27th nationally. He now has eight career double-digit tackle games, which is the ninth-most by a Bulldog since 1988.

► Watson is tied for fifth in the SEC with 38 "stops," which are tackles that constitute a failure for the offense per PFF.

► CB **Emmanuel Forbes** is tied for the national lead with six interceptions and tied for eighth in the FBS with 14 total passes defended. He has broken the FBS and SEC records with six pick-sixes in his career.

► S **Collin Duncan** boasts the No. 4 coverage grade (86.9) in the SEC per PFF.

► LB **Tyrus Wheat** is tied for ninth in the SEC with 5.0 sacks and now has 17.5 career sacks, which is ninth in MSU history. His 0.53 career sacks per game mark ranks 16th among active players nationally.

► Under **Mike Leach**, the Bulldogs are 14-0 when scoring at least 30 points.

ENTERING YEAR 3 UNDER LEACH

► **Mike Leach** was hired as the 34th head coach in program history on Jan. 9, 2020. He previously spent eight seasons at Washington State where he was twice named Pac-12 Coach of the Year. In 2018, he was tabbed the AFCA National Coach of the Year for the second time in his career. Prior to his stint with the Cougars, Leach took Texas Tech to a bowl game in 10 consecutive seasons, setting a program record with 84 victories in his tenure.

► One of the most successful coaches in the history of college football, Leach's 157 career wins as an FBS head coach are the second-most among active SEC coaches and the fifth-most among active Power 5 coaches. Leach is the only active Power 5 head coach to produce an 11-win season at two different programs since 2008 and one of two active FBS head coaches to win 50-plus games at multiple Power 5 programs.

50 BURGER

► With its 56-7 victory against ETSU (Nov. 19), Mississippi State has now scored 50+ points in at least one game in 12 consecutive seasons. The 56 points were MSU's most in a game since a 56-10 victory against Louisiana on Sept. 15, 2018.

► State has put up 50+ points seven times since 2018, with three of those games coming against SEC opponents. MSU has scored 50+ points 20 times over the last 17 seasons and is 20-0 in those games.

► MSU came one point shy of scoring 50 points against Memphis (Sept. 3) in its season opener, a 49-23 victory. The Bulldogs' 49 points were their highest scoring total in a season opener since a 63-6 win against Stephen F. Austin in 2018.

RECORD RALLIES

- **Mike Leach** has led record-setting comebacks at Texas Tech, Washington State and now Mississippi State.
- The Bulldogs broke the school record for the largest comeback twice in 2021. In the season-opener against Louisiana Tech, MSU trailed by 20 points in the fourth quarter before securing a one-point victory. State then scored 40 straight points to erase a 25-point deficit at No. 17 Auburn.
- Leach's Texas Tech team overcame a 31-point deficit in the 2006 Insight Bowl, which is tied for the largest comeback in a bowl game in FBS history.
- WR **Jamire Calvin** played in the record-setting comebacks under Leach at both MSU and Washington State.

RIVALING THE RANKINGS

- Last fall, MSU was the only school in the country that faced six teams ranked in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 and was one of four teams with three wins against teams ranked in the final poll. **Mike Leach** became the first MSU head coach, at least in the modern era, to beat three teams in one season who finished ranked in a final poll.
- Over the last six seasons, Leach's teams have defeated 10 opponents ranked inside the AP Top 25, which is 10th in that span. Only three current SEC head coaches have more such wins in that span. Since he arrived at MSU in 2020, Leach's six Top 25 wins are tied for fifth nationally.
- Under Leach, State has already defeated four AP-ranked opponents in road or neutral site contests with wins at then-No. 6 LSU (2020), vs. then-No. 22 Tulsa (2020), at then-No. 15 Texas A&M (2021) and at No. 16 Auburn (2021).
- Leach's six total ranked wins are the most of any Bulldog head coach in his first three years, and his four away from Starkville are tied for the most by an MSU head coach in program history.
- Leach is eighth in the nation since 2001 in wins over AP Top 25 opponents (26).

RULING THE RETURN GAME

- ▶ Mississippi State boasts some of the best special teams return units in the nation. State's kickoff return unit leads the nation, averaging 28.2 yards per return. Both the Bulldogs' kickoff and punt return teams have broken a return for a touchdown this season, and only five teams nationally have scored on both a punt and kick return.
- ▶ WR **Lideatrick Griffin** leads the nation in yards per kick return (32.3), and WR **Zavion Thomas** is seventh in yards per punt return (12.9). Griffin's career average (33.3) is tops among active FBS players and would exceed the school record by 6.6 yards.
- ▶ Griffin returned a kickoff 92 yards for a touchdown against Auburn (Nov. 5), and Thomas took a punt back 63 yards against No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 12). Thomas' punt return touchdown was MSU's first since Dedrick Thomas took one 83 yards at UMass in 2017.
- ▶ Since 2020, MSU leads the nation, averaging 27.2 yards per kickoff return. NC State is the next closest team at 25.5 yards.

BULLDOGS' YAC ATTACK

- ▶ Mississippi State has ranked among the top five Power 5 teams in the nation in yards after catch in back-to-back seasons under head coach **Mike Leach**. The Bulldogs led the nation in yards after catch in 2021, and State ranked second in the SEC and third nationally in 2020.

CHUNK PLAYS

- ▶ The Bulldogs have turned in the three longest runs of the **Mike Leach** era this season. RB **Dillon Johnson** turned in a 40-yard sprint against Bowling Green (Sept. 24). Prior to that, RB **Jo'quavious Marks** scored on a 37-yard scamper at LSU (Sept. 17), and Johnson broke free for 35 yards against the Tigers.
- ▶ QB **Will Rogers** connected with WR **Rara Thomas** for a 75-yard touchdown pass that was tied for State's longest passing play under Leach. It was tied with a 75-yard strike in Leach's first game at then-No. 6 LSU in 2020.
- ▶ Against Bowling Green (Sept. 24), the Bulldogs turned in their longest rush (40 yards), kick return (42 yards) and field goal (53 yards) of the season to that point. The Bulldogs have since posted a longer kick return (92 yards vs. Auburn, Nov. 5) and their longest punt return (63 yards vs. No. 1 Georgia, Nov. 12).

RED ALERT

- ▶ Mississippi State has scored on 34-of-37 red zone opportunities (91.9 percent) this season with 30 touchdowns. That scoring rate is third in the SEC and 12th in the FBS.
- ▶ MSU leads the FBS in points per red zone drive (5.19), red zone touchdown percentage (81.08 percent) and red zone passing touchdown percentage (59.46 percent).

ON THE LINE

- ▶ MSU's offensive line has shuffled this year, with multiple linemen playing new positions.
- ▶ C **LaQuinston Sharp** is the only lineman returning to the same position he played in 2021. Sharp snapped the ball 1,002 times last year, and is the most-veteran of the group with 1,699 snaps across the line in his career. Last season, Sharp, who was named to the Rimington Trophy watch list, earned a career-best 83.8 percent pass blocking grade from PFF. He surrendered only two sacks in 786 passing snaps.
- ▶ The offensive line entered 2022 with 5,175 career snaps, but only 1,893 (36.6 percent) of those had been taken at their current positions.
- ▶ Head coach **Mike Leach** and offensive line tutor **Mason Miller** are no strangers to development on the line, however. In fact, with the first-round selection of OT Charles Cross in the 2022 NFL Draft, Leach and Miller are one of just three coaching tandems with a first-round offensive lineman in two of the last four Drafts.
- ▶ Leach and Miller's lines since 2018 are third in the nation in lowest tackles for loss percentage allowed (7.6 percent) and are tied for sixth in sacks percentage allowed (4.2 percent).

NEW AIR

- ▶ There have been 18 games of 400-plus passing yards in Mississippi State history. Eleven of those performances occurred in the first 35 games of the **Mike Leach** era.
- ▶ MSU had thrown for 400-plus yards just seven total times in the previous 1,193 games prior to Leach's arrival in Starkville.
- ▶ State, Arizona, Tennessee and Western Kentucky are the only FBS teams with three 400-yard passing games this season.
- ▶ The Bulldogs were second in the nation with six 400-yard passing games and one of 18 schools nationally and three SEC teams with multiple such games in 2021. State was one of five teams nationally with at least 11 300-yard passing games.
- ▶ State's most recent 400-plus passing yard performance came against Arkansas (Oct. 8). QB **Will Rogers** threw for 406 yards with three touchdowns. It was his eighth career 400-yard game, which leads the nation among active players since 2020.
- ▶ Rogers is the eighth SEC quarterback to ever record a 4,000-yard passing season, ranks third in conference history and holds the MSU school record. He is the 10th different passer that Leach has coached to the 4,000-yard mark.

ROGERS FOR SIX... TIMES SIX

- ▶ QB **Will Rogers** tied his own school record with six passing touchdowns against Bowling Green (Sept. 24) while throwing for 409 yards, marking his seventh career 400-yard passing game. Rogers has since turned in his eighth 400-yard game, while no other SEC passer has had more than five 400-yard games in his career dating back to 2000.
- ▶ Since 2000, only 13 quarterbacks have had more games with six passing touchdowns than Rogers, and only one of those (C.J. Stroud, Ohio State) is active.
- ▶ Since 2020, Rogers is third nationally among active players with five career games of five or more passing touchdowns and is tied for third with 79 total passing touchdowns. He also leads the nation in passing yards (10,189).
- ▶ The game against ETSU (Nov. 19) marked the fourth time this year that Rogers has thrown at least four touchdown passes, which is tied for third in the FBS. It is also just the second year in school history that a Bulldog has passed for four or more touchdowns in four games. Rogers threw four touchdowns in four games last year, and Dak Prescott did so three times in 2015.

RETURNING TO RUSHING

- ▶ MSU posted 162 rushing yards against Arkansas (Oct. 8), which is the Bulldogs' highest total under **Mike Leach**. MSU's 36 carries were the fourth-most by a Leach team in his career.
- ▶ The Bulldogs are running the ball at their highest clip (79.3 ypg) of a Leach-coached team since the 2016 Washington State team (120.0 ypg). The current rate ranks sixth in Leach's career. State has rushed on 30 percent of their plays, the highest rate under Leach since WSU in 2017.
- ▶ State already has 28 runs of 10-plus yards after posting just 23 in last year and 20 in 2020.

RECORD WATCH

- QB **Will Rogers** broke a pair of Dak Prescott's (2012-15) MSU career records against Auburn (Nov. 5). He threw his 71st touchdown and surpassed Prescott's 9,376 passing yards. Rogers now boasts 79 touchdowns and 10,189 yards passing. Rogers has also matched Prescott's school record with 29 career 200-yard passing games.
- Rogers needs four passing touchdowns to tie his own school record set last year (36).
- Rogers broke Aaron Murray's (Georgia, 2010-13) SEC career completions record against Arkansas (Oct. 8). Murray completed 921 passes in 52 career games. Rogers surpassed that mark in just 28 games and finished the game with the Razorbacks with 947 career completions.

► Later at No. 6 Alabama (Oct. 22), Rogers became the second-fastest player in FBS history to complete 1,000 passes, needing just 30 games (Luke Falk, Washington State, 29 games). He is the 36th passer in FBS history to reach the mark.

GO DEEP

- MSU has found success with the deep ball this season. QB **Will Rogers** has thrown eight touchdowns on passes where the ball was in the air for more than 20 yards, which is second the SEC.
- Rogers' 93.0 passing grade on passes of 20-plus air yards is also fifth in the conference per PFF.
- WR **Caleb Ducking** is tied for second among SEC receivers with three touchdowns on 20-plus-yard passes, and his 94.3 receiving grade from PFF on such throws is tied for 13th in the conference.

ROGERS ON A ROLL

- QB **Will Rogers** has tossed a touchdown in 28 of his last 30 games with 78 scores in that span. Since 2020, Rogers has tossed multiple touchdowns in 19 different games, which is tied for third among active SEC quarterbacks.
- Rogers has thrown for 300-plus yards and at least three touchdowns in 16 of his 33 career games, which is tied for 11th in the FBS since 2000. The closest active players to him since 2020 is Wake Forest's Sam Hartman at 13 games.
- Rogers threw for at least 300 yards in ten straight games in 2021, while averaging 378.7 yards during the streak and completing 75.1 percent of his passes (402-of-535) with 30 touchdowns before the streak was snapped in State's bowl game.
- Since 2004, the only quarterbacks with a longer streak are Graham Harrell (16) and Gardner Minshew (11).

REVIEWING ROGERS' RUN ON THE RECORD BOOKS

- In 2021, QB **Will Rogers** – at only 20 years old – became the first MSU quarterback to lead the SEC in passing yards per game (364.5). His 4,739 passing yards were the third most in SEC single-season history (the two quarterbacks ahead of Rogers played in two more games than he did during their respective seasons).
- Rogers joined 2019 Heisman Trophy winner Joe Burrow of LSU as the only QBs in college football over the last 22 seasons to throw for 4,700+ yards and 35+ touchdowns while completing at least 73 percent of their passes.
- After breaking nearly every freshman passing mark in MSU history in 2020, Rogers broke 25 more records, including Dak Prescott's records set as a fourth-year junior and fifth-year senior for single-season total offense, passing yards and passing touchdowns.
- Rogers passed for at least 300 yards with completing 70 percent of his passes and tossing three touchdowns in eight separate games in 2021, which was three more than any other Power 5 passer.
- Rogers broke the school record with six passing touchdowns at No. 17 Auburn (Nov. 13, 2021). He's since tied that mark on Sept. 24 against Bowling Green.

- Against No. 12 Kentucky, Rogers broke MSU and SEC records for completion percentage with a 92.3 percent mark. The previous MSU record (min. 35 att.) was his 83.0 percent mark in the season opener against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4). The previous SEC mark (min. 30 comp.) was 91.2 percent by Josh Dobbs (Tennessee) vs. Vanderbilt (2016).
- Rogers stands as MSU's career leader and the second among active FBS players leader in completion percentage: 70.9 percent (1,103-of-1,556). He also leads the FBS among active players in career passes per game (47.2) and career completions per game (33.4).
- He broke his own MSU single-game record for consecutive completions twice against No. 12 Kentucky (Oct. 30, 2021) with two streaks of 15 completions. Previous: 14 at Vanderbilt (Oct. 23, 2021) and 12 vs. Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4, 2021).
- Broke his own MSU single-game-record with 50 completions at Memphis (2021), which stands as the SEC record (Previous MSU: 45 by Rogers, at Ole Miss, 2020; Previous SEC: 47 by Tim Couch, Kentucky, vs. Arkansas, 1998).
- Now boasts 20 career 300-yard passing games, which is an MSU career record (Previous: 9 by Dak Prescott, 2012-15) and 24 career 30-completion games, also an MSU record (Previous: 5 by Dak Prescott, 2012-15) and tied for the third-most in the FBS since 2000.
- Through 33 games and 30 starts, QB **Will Rogers** has moved to the top of State's career leaderboard in total offense. His 300.5 yards per game (9,918 total yards) currently leads all Bulldogs.
- Bulldog legend Dak Prescott held the record previously, averaging 242.8 yards per game of total offense (11,897 yards in 49 games), but Prescott recorded more than half of his career yardage in his senior season. With his senior year removed, Prescott averaged 155.1 yards per game (5,583 yards in 36 games).
- In 30 career starts, Rogers has thrown just 17 interceptions despite having 1,486 passing attempts (1.14 percent).

- Entering 2022, WRs **Austin Williams** (35) and **Jaden Walley** (33) were the SEC's returning leaders in receptions for a first down from a year ago. The pair are the SEC's active career leaders in first-down receptions.
- Walley (38) and RB **Dillon Johnson** (37) are the SEC's active career leaders in missed tackles forced after a reception per PFF. Meanwhile, Williams is second among active SEC players with 22 career contested catches per PFF.
- Of the Bulldogs' 255 first downs this year, 169 have come through the air, which is second in the FBS.

ROARING FOR RARA

- WR **Rara Thomas** turned in his second career multi-touchdown game against Auburn (Nov. 5) on passes of 22 and 33 yards. He now has four touchdowns of 20-plus yards this year.
- It was the sixth time this season that Thomas led MSU in receiving yards (84) and his second-highest total of the season (134 vs. Texas A&M).
- Thomas has surpassed his touchdown total from last season (6) and now has 11 career receiving scores.

DUCKING DANCING

- WR **Caleb Ducking** is one of six SEC players to turn in multiple receiving touchdowns in multiple games this season. He has caught a touchdown in six games, which is tied for 17th in the FBS.
- He caught a 22-yard and a 26-yard touchdown pass against Bowling Green (Sept. 24). Ducking also caught nine-yard and two-yard passes in the end zone at Arizona (Sept. 10).
- His eight receiving touchdowns are third in the SEC and tied for 22nd nationally this season. He has caught 42 passes, which is tied for 13th in the conference.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Five State receivers have caught at least 40 balls, which leads the SEC. No other SEC school has more than two.
- Last year, WR Makai Polk (105), RB **Jo'quavious Marks** (83), RB **Dillon Johnson** (65), WR **Jaden Walley** (55) and WR **Austin Williams** (52) gave State four 50-catch receivers in the same year for the first time in program history. The Bulldogs return four of the five.
- MSU had just four prior seasons with two 50-catch players: 2020 - Marks and Jaden Walley, 2015 - Fred Ross and De'Runnya Wilson, 1969 - Sammy Milner and David Smith.
- The Bulldogs had multiple 500-yard receivers for just the seventh time on record (since 1961) and saw three receivers reach that mark for the first time in program history: Polk, 989; Walley, 610 and Williams, 543. WR **Rara Thomas** (599) has already reached the mark this season, and WR **Caleb Ducking** is already up to 450 yards.

WILLIAMS' CAREER AT A GLANCE

- WR **Austin Williams** holds the lowest drop rate of any active SEC wide receiver with a minimum of 100 targets since 2019 (1.4 percent). His 92.3 hands grade from PFF ranked second in the FBS in 2021 and was the highest among players returning for 2022.
- Williams is in his final campaign following a career year in 2021 that saw him set new personal season highs with 52 catches for 617 yards and four touchdowns. He caught 52 of his 59 targets (88.1 percent), which ranked fifth in the nation among players with at least 40 targets.
- Of his 147 career receptions, 65.3 percent have led to a touchdown or first down. He is now tied for fourth in MSU career history with 17 receiving touchdowns.
- Williams tied the school record with three receiving touchdowns against Tennessee State (Nov. 20) last year. He caught four passes for a career-high 75 yards, including 21-yard and 30-yard scores.
- Williams has excelled in the classroom, already completing a bachelor's degree in finance and his master's in business administration. He is working on a third degree and was recently named a semifinalist for the NFF Campbell Trophy for the second straight year. This summer he became first reigning SEC H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award winner to represent his school at SEC Media Days.
- He is an outstanding example in the community, reaching the semifinalist stage for both the Wuerrfel Trophy and Witten Man of the Year Award in 2021.
- Williams was named one of 12 finalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy on Oct. 26. He is MSU's fifth finalist and the only finalist this season with a perfect 4.0 GPA every year of his career. The last Bulldog finalist was Taveze Cathoun (2015), who now serves on staff as graduate assistant.

RECEIVING LEADERS

- RB **Jo'quavious Marks** has caught 44 passes, which is tied for the SEC lead among running backs, and RB **Dillon Johnson** is tied for second among SEC backs with 40 receptions.
- WR **Rara Thomas**' six receiving touchdowns are tied for fourth in the SEC. He is 16th in the league, averaging 54.5 receiving yards per game, and 14th in total receiving yards (599), which leads the team.
- WR **Caleb Ducking**'s eight receiving touchdowns are third in the SEC and tied for 22nd in the FBS.
- State has four receivers among the SEC's top 15 in catches. WR **Rufus Harvey** is 11th with 45. Marks is 12th, and Thomas is 13th. Ducking is 14th with 42 receptions.

RELIABLE RECEIVERS

- RB **Jo'quavious Marks** has caught a pass in 34 consecutive games, which is the longest active streak in the SEC and tied for No. 11 nationally. The MSU school record is 35 games set by Fred Ross (2013-16).
- Marks has at least one reception in every game of his collegiate career.
- There are just 19 players nationally in the FBS with active streaks of 30 or more games, and Marks is the only one in the SEC.

MAKING HIS MARKS

- RB **Jo'quavious Marks** was named to the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, which recognizes the most-versatile player in college football. He has not only proven he can pick up yardage by carrying the football but can also be an effective option in the passing game as both a blocker and receiver out of the backfield.
- Marks was second on the team with 83 receptions in 2021, which led all FBS running backs and broke his own MSU record for the most catches in a season by a running back. He totaled 502 yards through the air.
- Marks' 106 rushes and six touchdowns on the ground were both team highs for the Bulldogs in 2021. He has rushed 265 times for 1,196 yards and 17 touchdowns in his career.
- His 187 career receptions are second in MSU history, and he holds the MSU career record for receptions by a running back. He ranks 19th among active players in the FBS.

ANALYZING ARNETT'S DEFENSE

- Since his arrival in 2020, defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett**'s defense has been one of the best in the country. In both 2020 and 2021 with Arnett at the helm of the defense, State finished inside the top five in the SEC in total defense, fewest first downs allowed, takeaways, rushing defense and yards allowed per rush.
- Against SEC teams, Arnett's defense ranked third in total defense (352.3) in 2021 and fourth in total defense (380.3) in 2020 after ranking 11th (419.3) in 2019 before his arrival at MSU.
- Since 2020, MSU has allowed fewer than 150 rushing yards in 21 games, which trails only Georgia (35) and Alabama (33) in the SEC during that span. MSU is holding its opponents to just 129.76 rushing yards per game, which ranks third in the SEC during that span.

DAWG DEFENSE QUICK HITS

- CB **Emmanuel Forbes** is tied for the national lead with six interceptions and tied for eighth in the FBS with 14 total passes defended. He has broken the FBS and SEC records with six pick-sixes in his career.
- LB **Tyrus Wheat** is tied for ninth in the SEC with 5.0 sacks and now has 17.5 career sacks, which is ninth in MSU history. His 0.53 career sacks per game mark ranks 16th among active players nationally.
- Wheat now has five career fumble recoveries, which is tied for eighth in MSU history.
- Wheat is also tied for eighth in the SEC per PFF with 32 total pressures, and his pass rush productivity score ranks sixth among SEC defenders with at least 150 pass rush snaps. From the left side alone, his score ranks fourth in the league.
- S **Collin Duncan** boasts the No. 4 coverage grade (86.9) in the SEC per PFF.
- LB **Nathaniel Watson** is tied for fifth in the SEC with 38 "stops," which are tackles that constitute a failure for the offense per PFF. LB **Jett Johnson** is tied for 11th with 33 "stops".
- The Bulldogs are leading the SEC with 14 interceptions and are fourth in the league with 51 pass defenses this season.

STATE HAS A TAKEAWAY IN 28 OF ITS LAST 35 GAMES

- The Bulldogs have collected at least one takeaway in 28 of 35 games under defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett** with 55 total takeaways in that span. State leads the SEC in takeaways since 2020 and its 28 games with a takeaway are second in the conference in that span.
- State has forced multiple turnovers 15 times since 2020, going 12-3 when doing so.
- Under Arnett, the Bulldogs had a takeaway streak of nine straight games (Nov. 23, 2019-Nov. 7, 2020). Since 2020, the Bulldogs longest takeaway streak is seven consecutive games twice, most recently in the first seven games of the 2022 season (also: Dec. 19, 2020-Oct. 2, 2021).
- MSU has an interception in 20 games under Arnett with multiple picks in 11 games for 36 total picks in 35 games. The Bulldogs are 10-1 in multi-interception games.
- Ten active players have collected 32 total interceptions in their careers.
- MSU's 20 turnovers forced in 2022 are second in the SEC.

HOLDING TEAMS TO FEWER THAN 200 YARDS RUSHING

- Since the start of the 2018 season, MSU has held 50 of its 61 opponents below the 200-yard rushing mark, which is the third-most in the SEC and tied for 16th in the nation during that stretch. Thirty-five of those 49 games holding teams below 200 yards have been SEC games.
- Under defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett**, MSU has held the opponent below the 200-yard rushing mark in 27 of 35 games.
- MSU held opponents to 113.4 rushing yards per game last year, which was third in the SEC. Just 48 of opponents' 406 rushing attempts went for 10 or more yards in 2021.
- Only two teams rushed for 200+ yards on the Bulldogs in 2021 - Arkansas (202) and Texas Tech (260).

HOLDING TEAMS TO FEWER THAN 100 YARDS RUSHING

- The Bulldogs have held 13 opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in 35 games under defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett** since 2020, which is tied for third in the SEC and tied for 20th in the FBS. Nine of those have come against SEC teams and seven have come on the road.
- State held No. 6 Alabama (Oct. 22) to 29 rushing yards on 27 carries (1.1 ypc). The Bulldogs are the fifth team since 2020 to hold Alabama to fewer than 100 yards on the ground and only the second to hold the Crimson Tide to fewer than 30 (LSU, 6 yards, Nov. 6, 2021).
- State held six opponents, including three SEC teams, to fewer than 100 yards on the ground in 2021, and allowed just 101 yards in the season opener against Louisiana Tech (Sept. 4).
- Since 1976, MSU has held opponents under 100 yards rushing in at least three straight games on five occasions. Prior to Arnett's arrival State had held three straight opponents under 100 yards rushing just three times - with the last coming in 2000 - and the Bulldogs have already done so twice under his leadership.

NO FLY FORBES

- CB **Emmanuel Forbes** broke the FBS and SEC record with his sixth career interception return touchdown against ETSU (Nov. 19). The SEC record had stood since 1971 (Tennessee's Jackie Walker - 5). He leads the nation with six picks this season, including three returned for touchdowns.
- He picked off two passes against No. 17 Texas A&M (Oct. 1) for his second career multi-interception game. He returned the second one 33 yards for a touchdown, breaking the MSU career pick-six record in the process. He then tied the SEC career record with his fifth pick-six at No. 22 Kentucky (Oct. 15).
- Forbes was named a midseason All-American by the Associated Press, CBS Sports and the Athletic and is one of 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award given to the nation's best defensive back.
- In addition to leading the country in interceptions, Forbes is leading the SEC and tied for eighth in the FBS in total passes defended (14).
- Forbes' six interceptions this year are tied for the MSU single-season record and the most interceptions in a season by a Bulldog since Mark McLaurin tied the school record with six in 2017.
- With 14 total picks in his career, he is the nation's active career interceptions leader and leads the nation since his career began in 2020. He is now tied for fourth in MSU history and needs just one pick to tie for third (15, Nickoe Whitley, 2010-13).
- He is the FBS active career leader in interceptions returned for a touchdown and in overall defensive touchdowns. Forbes also leads active FBS players in career interception return yards (390).
- The junior was named a Freshman All-American in 2020 after leading the nation in interception touchdowns (3) and leading the SEC in total interceptions (5). His five interceptions led all true freshmen nationally and were tied for third overall. He was also tied for third among FBS freshmen with 11 total pass defenses in 2020 and was 12th overall.

SECONDARY STRENGTH

- S **Collin Duncan** boasts an 86.9 coverage grade from PFF, which is second among SEC safeties and 24th among FBS safeties.
- CB **Emmanuel Forbes** has the No. 5 coverage grade (84.0) among SEC safeties and corners.
- Forbes has allowed a 43.3 passer rating against, which is leading the SEC lead among corners and safeties and No. 12 among Power 5 secondary players, minimum 200 coverage snaps.
- CB **Decamerion Richardson** has made 68 tackles, which is tied for sixth among SEC safeties and corners.

DAWG DEFENSE ONE OF THE MOST-EXPERIENCED

- MSU returns 79.1 percent of its defensive snaps from 2021. The Bulldogs played 807 snaps with 11 players on the field for a total of 8,877 snaps. Bulldog returners combined for 7,020 snaps last year.
- Of the 22 players on defensive side of the two-deep, 17 have been playing for the past two years under defensive coordinator **Zach Arnett**. Three more have at least played a season in Arnett's system.
- Only one starter on the depth chart was not on the roster last year, and nine of the 11 starters have been in the system since 2020.

TURN ON THE JETTS

- LB **Jett Johnson** has led MSU in tackles in five games and is second on the team with 93 stops this season, which is fourth in the SEC.
- Johnson posted a career-best 13 tackles against Memphis (Sept. 3), and he has four double-digit tackle games this season and six in his career.
- His six career double-digit tackle games are the 12th-most by any Bulldog since 1988.
- He also led State in tackles in 2021 with 87 total stops, including six tackles for loss. He had an interception and a team-high two fumble recoveries last fall.
- Johnson returned his first career interception 48 yards against No. 9 Ole Miss (Nov. 25) while making a then-career-high 11 tackles. He recovered his first fumble against No. 12 Kentucky (Oct. 30) after having a previous recovery in that game erased upon review. Also recovered a fumble against Tennessee State (Nov. 20)

BOOKIE'S BEST

- LB **Nathaniel Watson** has led MSU in tackles in seven games and is second in the SEC with 98 stops this season, which ranks 27th nationally. He now has eight career double-digit tackle games, which is the ninth-most by a Bulldog since 1988.
- Watson led the Bulldogs in tackles at No. 22 Kentucky (Oct. 15) with a career-high 17, including nine in the first half alone. That total is tied for the 14th-most tackles in a game by a Bulldog since 1988.
- It was the 31st time a Bulldog had 16 or more tackles in a game since 1988 and marked his second career 16-plus-tackle game, which trails only three other Bulldogs in that span.
- Watson collected 16 tackles against No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 12) for his third career game with 16 or more tackles. He is the Bulldogs' active career leader with 224 total tackles.
- Watson also made a then-career-high 16 tackles against No. 5 Alabama (2021). That stands as the most tackles by a Bulldog in a single game since Brandon Wilson recorded 18 vs. Louisiana Tech on Sept. 24, 2011. He had a season-high nine tackles in the first half alone and recorded his second career sack.
- Watson is second on the team with 4.0 sacks, which is tied for 13th in the SEC.
- Watson has led MSU in tackles six other times: against No. 1 Georgia (16, Nov. 12), against Auburn (10, Nov. 5), at No. 6 Alabama (10, Oct. 22), against Bowling Green (10, Sept. 24) and at LSU (11, Sept. 17). He was second on the team in total tackles (84), second in sacks (5.0) and tied for fourth in tackles for loss (6.0) last year.

STOP ON RED

- Mississippi State made two crucial stops in the red zone against Arkansas (Oct. 8), both on fourth down to result in turnovers.
- MSU stopped Arkansas on a 4th-and-1 at the MSU eight-yard line in the first quarter. The Bulldogs later held the Razorbacks at the one-yard line on three straight snaps to force a turnover on downs in the third quarter.

GROUNDING IN THE DESERT

- Mississippi State's pass defense turned in one of the best performances in school history at Arizona (Sept. 10). State's nine pass breakups were tied for the third-most in program history since 2000.
- MSU picked off three passes, marking its fourth time intercepting three or more passes under defensive coordinator Zach Arnett. The three picks are tied for the seventh-most by the Bulldogs in a game since 2000.
- The Bulldogs have 33 pass defenses (INT+PBU) this year, which is third in the SEC.

"TULU" TAKES IT BACK

- WR **Lideatrick Griffin** returned his second career kickoff for a touchdown (92 yards) against Auburn (Nov. 5). That return tied him with Leon Berry (2009-10) and Kevin Prentiss (1997-98) for the MSU career record.
- Griffin finished the game against the Tigers with a career-high 199 all-purpose yards, including a career-long 57-yard reception. He totaled 144 yards on three kick returns, giving him five career games with 100-plus kick return yards, which is also tied for an MSU career record (since 1979).
- "Tulu" has returned 19 kickoffs this season, averaging 32.3 yards, and his career average is now 33.3 yards, which is the most among active FBS players and would exceed the school record by 6.6 yards (minimum 30 attempts).
- He finished the 2021 season averaging 32.8 yards per kickoff return which tied Eric Moulds' mark in 1994 for the highest single-season average in school history and was third in the FBS last year.
- Griffin had three games with 100-plus kick return yards last season and four individual returns of 35 or more yards (100, 70, 38 and 35 yards). He has five returns of 35-plus yards this season (92, 42, 37, 37 and 35 yards) for nine total in his career.
- Through the first two games of 2021, Griffin ranked second nationally in kickoff return yardage averaging 48.8 yards on his five returns. In the remaining eight games in which Griffin played, however, he only had nine more return opportunities as teams started kicking away from him.
- In the 10 games in which he was the primary kickoff returner, the Bulldogs' offense started drives with an average field position at the 27.7 yard line and averaged beginning at the 35.1 yard line when he was the one actually returning the kickoff.
- He returned the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against NC State (Sept. 11, 2021). It was the fifth 100-yard kick return in program history and the first 100-yard return since Brandon Holloway did so against Southern Miss (Sept. 5, 2015).
- Griffin's kick return was the first time MSU had scored on its first kickoff return of a game since Jameon Lewis returned the second kickoff of the game 100 yards against Ole Miss on Nov. 24, 2012 following the Rebels' game-opening scoring drive. It was the first opening kickoff return for a touchdown since Kevin Prentiss returned the opening kick 91 yards at South Carolina on Sept. 26, 1998.

SPECIAL SPECIAL TEAMS

- The Bulldogs are tied for the national lead with a 90.5 special teams grade from PFF.
- State returned a blocked field goal for a touchdown against No. 17 Texas A&M (Oct. 1).
- Against Arkansas (Oct. 8), State downed a punt on the one, forced a punt return for a loss of three yards and trapped the Razorbacks at their own 1-yard line on a kickoff.
- Against Auburn (Nov. 5), MSU returned a kickoff for a touchdown and recovered a muffed kickoff in a tie game with 26 seconds left to give the Bulldogs a chance to win the contest before heading to overtime.
- Against No. 1 Georgia (Nov. 12), MSU returned a punt for touchdown.

BEN'S BIG BOOT

- K **Ben Raybon** made a 53-yard field goal against Bowling Green (Sept. 24) that is tied for the second-longest field goal in program history. He was one yard shy of Artie Cosby's school record from 1985 (54 yards vs. Memphis, Oct. 5).
- Raybon's kick is tied with four others, and the most-recent make of that length came on from Brent Smith against Tennessee on Nov. 16, 2002.
- The kick was State's first 50-plus-yarder since 2019 when Jace Christman made a 51-yard attempt at Tennessee (Oct. 12).
- His 53-yard make is tied for the 17th-longest made field goal in the FBS this year.

BALL HOGS

- State held the ball for 41:11 in the season opener against Memphis (Sept. 3). That was State's highest total under **Mike Leach**, surpassing last year's game against Kentucky (41:10).
- Thanks in large part to its stout defense, Mississippi State dominated time of possession last year. The Bulldogs led the SEC and ranked 10th in the FBS at 33:12 of possession per game.
- MSU's defense allowed the fewest first downs in the SEC and played the second-fewest snaps in the conference. State's offense ran 975 total plays which was third in the SEC and 13th nationally.
- The Bulldogs averaged +6:53 in time of possession differential and 12.9 more plays per game than their opponent in 2021.

TOPPLING TEXAS A&M

- MSU upset a ranked Aggie team for the fourth time in five such meetings with a 42-24 win over then-No. 17 Texas A&M (Oct. 1). The Bulldogs scored in all three phases and forced four turnovers, marking the fourth time MSU has forced four or more turnovers since 2020.
- CB **Emmanuel Forbes** blocked a field goal that was returned 50 yards by CB **Decamerion Richardson**. It was the first blocked field goal returned for a touchdown by the Bulldogs since Jay Hughes went 70 yards against Southern Miss in 2014.
- Forbes also returned an interception 33 yards for a touchdown.
- It was MSU's first game with multiple non-offensive touchdowns since Dec. 19, 2020 against Missouri (INT and FR).
- State's 42 points were the sixth-most the Bulldogs had ever scored against an AP-ranked opponent.
- The win marks just the third time that MSU has defeated the same AP-ranked opponent in back-to-back seasons along with the 1940-41 wins against Ole Miss and the 1980-81 upsets of Miami.

ADDITIONAL PERIOD AGAINST AUBURN

- ▶ MSU defeated Auburn in overtime on Nov. 5. It was the 11th overtime game in school history (6-5) and the first since a loss at BYU (21-28; 2OT) on Oct. 14, 2016.
- ▶ It was State's first overtime win since defeating Ole Miss (17-10; 1OT) on Nov. 28, 2013.
- ▶ MSU has won four of its last five overtime games.

2021 IN REVIEW

- ▶ Last fall, MSU was the only school in the country that faced six teams ranked in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 and was one of four teams with three wins against teams ranked in the final poll.
- ▶ **Mike Leach** became the first MSU head coach, at least in the modern era, to beat three teams in one season who finished ranked in a final poll.
- ▶ Over the last five seasons, **Mike Leach**'s teams have defeated nine opponents ranked inside the AP Top 25. Only two current SEC head coaches have more such wins in that span.
- ▶ The Bulldogs were one of four teams to rank inside the top 25 nationally in both total offense and total defense during the 2021 regular season, joining Alabama, Michigan and Coastal Carolina.
- ▶ Following the 2021 regular season, MSU was the third most improved scoring offense in the SEC and 10th most improved nationally at +9.5 from 2020 (21.4 ppg to 30.9 ppg).

INSIDE THE SERIES VS. OLE MISS

MSU-OLE MISS SERIES NOTABLES

- This is the 119th meeting between Mississippi State and Ole Miss.
- This is the 95th edition of the Battle for the Golden Egg.
- The Golden Egg trophy has been given to the winning team every year since 1927 as a joint agreement by the student bodies.
- Given the nickname "Egg Bowl" by Clarion-Ledger sportswriter Tom Patterson in 1979.
- Ole Miss leads the all-time on-field series 61-50-6.
- Since 2004, the home team has won every game but six.
- The visiting team won four consecutive meetings from 2015-18.
- In 2016 in Oxford, State recorded the largest margin of victory in the series since 1916 in a 55-20 win ... The 55 points were the most by MSU since 1915.
- The teams have met on Thanksgiving 26 times.
- MSU owns a 10-15-1 record on Thanksgiving vs. the Rebels and the two teams have split the last four meetings.
- It was first played on Thanksgiving in 1905, a game won by MSU 11-0.
- 96 miles separate the two campuses.
- The two teams first played in 1901 with the Bulldogs winning 17-0.
- The Egg Bowl is the 10th longest uninterrupted rivalry in college football.
- While then-Mississippi A&M began playing football in 1885, and Mississippi two years earlier, the schools did not meet until October 28, 1901.
- In 1901, the Mississippi Rebels were returning from playing Alabama in Tuscaloosa, and stopped in Starkville for a game with the A&M Aggies.
- The inaugural meeting was contested on the south end of campus, on a field used until recently for practice by the Famous Maroon Band. The Aggies, who had played only seven previous football games, scored the first points in school history that day and shut out the visitors 17-0.
- The series has been interrupted only twice, with no games from 1912-14 and in 1943.
- There were two meetings in one season, in 1918, with A&M winning both: 34-0 at Starkville and 13-0 at Oxford.
- Two of the three largest fourth-quarter comebacks in MSU history have come against Ole Miss ... Most recently, in 2007, State trailed 14-0 with 7:51 to go before it took the lead with 12 seconds left to win 17-14 ... In 1999, MSU trailed 20-6 at the 12:49 mark and came back to win 23-20.
- The Bulldogs also erased a 14-point deficit with 5:22 to go in the second quarter in 1977 and won 18-14.
- MSU has won on its last possession three times ... In 1999, Scott Westerfield kicked a 44-yard FG with 4 seconds left ... In 2007, Adam Carlson kicked a 48-yard FG with 12 seconds remaining ... In 2013, Dak Prescott scored the game winner on a 3-yard run in overtime (the only overtime game in the all-time series)
- MSU claimed the smallest margin of victory in the history of the series with its 21-20 win in 2019. The Rebels missed a game-tying extra-point with four seconds left in that game.
- State's 457 yards rushing in 2016 at Ole Miss are its most against the Rebels and its fifth-most in a single game in school history.
- The most yards the Bulldogs have ever totaled in a single game against Ole Miss also came in 2016, 566 yards.
- Nick Fitzgerald set the MSU single-game rushing record with 258 yards in 2016.
- LaDarius Perkins owns the most all-purpose yardage in a single game against Ole Miss with 319 - 140 receiving, 98 rushing, 65 kick return, 16 punt return
- Greg Favors set State's single-game sack record with 5.5 against Ole Miss in 1996.
- One Bulldog has recorded three interceptions in the same game against the Rebels three different times in school history - Jeramie Johnson in 2005, Billy Stacy in 1958 and Billy Murphy in 1946

NOTABLE GAMES IN THE SERIES

2019: With both programs needing a win to reach the postseason, the Bulldogs escaped with a one-point victory in Starkville. The 21-20 final score was the narrowest margin of victory in the series. The previous mark was a 9-7 decision on Nov. 30, 1937 in Oxford, Mississippi. State led 21-14 going into the fourth quarter, but surrendered a touchdown with four seconds left in the game. Ole Miss took an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty celebrating the score to back up the extra-point attempt. That kick missed, and State held on to win its seventh Golden Egg at its last 11 tries. With the win, State became bowl eligible for the 10th straight season.

2018: Nick Fitzgerald ran for two touchdowns and threw for another score to lead No. 22 Mississippi State over Ole Miss 35-3 on Thanksgiving night. MSU thrived in the ground game, racking up 309 yards behind 100-yard games from both Fitzgerald and Kylin Hill, who pounded out 117 and 108 yards, respectively. Through the air, State amassed 111 yards to total 420 yards of offense in the victory. Fitzgerald accounted for 228 yards and three touchdowns. Hill and Aeris

Williams each had touchdown runs in the contest and Dedrick Thomas had a scoring reception. Defensively, the Maroon and White was as dominant as ever—especially against the Rebels' running game. The Bulldogs' stout defensive unit held Ole Miss to just 189 yards of total offense and a staggering 37 on the ground.

2017: Nick Fitzgerald fractured his right ankle with MSU trailing 7-0 with 9:13 remaining in the first quarter, and five turnovers proved to be costly for the Bulldogs in a 31-28 loss to Ole Miss on a cold Thanksgiving night in Davis Wade Stadium. Fitzgerald was carted off the field and then spelled by true freshman Keytaon Thompson, who registered his first career 100-yard rushing game. Thompson ran for a score and threw for a score. MSU outgained the Rebels 501-355 on the night. The Bulldogs nearly rallied from a 31-13 fourth-quarter deficit.

2016: MSU recorded its largest Egg Bowl victory since 1916 as quarterback Nick Fitzgerald accounted for 367 yards and five touchdowns in a 55-20 romp of Ole Miss in Oxford. Fitzgerald shattered the MSU single-game record for rushing yards, carrying 14 times for 258 yards and two touchdowns to break Anthony Dixon's mark. Fitzgerald averaged a school-record 18.4 yards per carry, which was the highest by an SEC player in a conference game in league history. A home victory for the Rebels would have clinched bowl eligibility, while a win for MSU have gave the 5-7 Bulldogs a chance to play in a bowl game due to the MSU's superior Academic Progress Rate.

2014: No. 4 Mississippi State fell to No. 18 Ole Miss by a score of 31-17 on the road at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. State came in with a 10-1 overall record, 6-1 in SEC play. A win for the Bulldogs, plus a loss by Alabama in the Iron Bowl, would have given MSU the SEC West Championship and a berth in the SEC Championship Game. Ole Miss entered the game at No. 19, marking only the fifth time in the series history, and the first since 1999, that both teams entered the Egg Bowl ranked. The win was highlighted by a dominant performance from Ole Miss running back Jaylen Walton, who had a career-high with 148 yards rushing including a 91-yard touchdown.

2013: In below freezing temperatures and in front of a raucous home crowd, Mississippi State powered its way to an overtime victory against arch rival Ole Miss Thanksgiving night, winning the 110th edition of the Egg Bowl 17-10 at Davis Wade Stadium to close out the 2013 regular season. MSU's defense was key in securing an overtime victory for State, stripping the ball away from Ole Miss quarterback Bo Wallace and recovering it in the end zone to end the game. Sophomore quarterback Dak Prescott didn't make an appearance until the fourth quarter, but his late-game drive led to the tying field goal at 10-10 and then he took the ball into the end zone himself in overtime to score the winning points, before the drive on which the Rebels' Wallace fumbled. Prescott, who was not expected to play the game at all, relieved freshman Damian Williams.

2009: Chris Relf ran for a career-high 131 yards and senior running back Anthony Dixon set MSU's single-season rushing record as State (5-7,3-5 SEC) reclaimed the Golden Egg with a 41-27 win against No. 25 Ole Miss (8-4, 4-4 SEC). Relf scored on his feet and in the air, rushing for one touchdown and passing for two more as he completed three of his five attempts for 43 yards. Relf also combined with Dixon for 264 of the Bulldogs' 317 rushing yards as the pair became the first MSU duo to rush for 100 or more yards in a game since Fred Reid and Jerious Norwood each passed the century mark against Kentucky in 2004. Cornerback Corey Broomfield sealed the 41-27 win by returning an interception for a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

2007: State's offense couldn't get in sync for three-and-a-half quarters, but the Bulldogs manufactured three scores in the final 7:51 to rally and post an improbable 17-14 comeback victory in the 104th meeting between the teams at Davis Wade Stadium. The game-turning play was Derek Pegues' 75-yard punt return TD to tie the game, 14-14. Adam Carlson's 48-yard field goal with just 12 seconds to go proved to be the game-winner.

1999: In one of the most miraculous comebacks in school history and commonly known as "The Kick and the Pick," State earned a dramatic 23-20 victory over Ole Miss on Thanksgiving in Starkville. Trailing 20-6, MSU tied the game thanks to a fourth-quarter rally. With the score at 20-20 and 20 seconds remaining, instead of playing for overtime, the Rebels decided to run a play, deep in their own territory. Ole Miss QB Romero Miller tossed a deep pass, which was deflected by the hands and then the foot of MSU CB Robert Bean before being intercepted by Eugene Clinton and returned deep into the Rebels' territory. On the next play, with 8 seconds left, Bulldog kicker Scott Westerfield kicked a 44-yard game-winning field goal.

1998: The Bulldogs earned a spot in the SEC Championship Game with a 28-6 win over the Rebels in Oxford. James Johnson ran for two touchdowns in the first half as the Bulldogs won their third straight game and captured the SEC West title.

34TH HEAD FOOTBALL COACH AT MISSISSIPPI STATE 2018 & 2008 NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Mike Leach, a two-time national coach of the year, three-time conference coach of the year and the mastermind behind the NCAA record-setting "Air Raid" offense, was tabbed Mississippi State's 34th head football coach on January 9, 2020.

The accomplishments for Leach in his 21st year as a head coach are long and distinguished. He has compiled a 157-107 (.597) record, guided his squads to 18 bowl games, produced seven seasons of at least nine victories, captured two division titles, become the winningest coach in Texas Tech history and set school records for bowl appearances at both Texas Tech (10) and Washington State (6). During 10 of those 19 seasons, Leach's passing attack led the FBS – six at Texas Tech and four at Washington State.

One of the most successful coaches in the history of college football, Leach's 156 career wins as an FBS head coach are the second-most among active SEC coaches and the fifth-most among active Power 5 coaches. Leach is the only active Power 5 head coach to produce an 11-win season at two different programs since 2008 and one of two active FBS head coaches to win 50-plus games at multiple Power 5 programs.

Of the 50 most productive passing yardage seasons in FBS history, 10 have come from quarterbacks coached by Leach since his hiring as head coach at Texas Tech in 2000. That includes one season by Kliff Kingsbury, one by B.J. Symons (2003), one by Sonny Cumbie, three by Graham Harrell (2006-08), one by Connor Halliday, one by Luke Falk (2015), one by Gardner Minshew II (2018) and one by Anthony Gordon (2019).

During Leach's second season in Starkville, MSU was the only school in the country that faced six teams ranked in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 and was one of four teams with three wins against teams ranked in the final poll. Leach became the first MSU head coach, at least in the modern era, to beat three teams in one season who finished ranked in a final poll.

In 2021, quarterback Will Rogers – at only 20 years old – became the first MSU quarterback to lead the SEC in passing yards per game (364.5). His 4,739 passing yards are the third most in SEC single-season history (the two quarterbacks ahead of Rogers played in two more games than he did during their respective seasons). Rogers joined 2019 Heisman Trophy winner Joe Burrow of LSU as the only QBs in college football over the last 22 seasons to throw for 4,700+ yards and 35+ touchdowns while completing at least 73 percent of their passes. After breaking nearly every freshman passing mark in MSU history in 2020, Rogers broke 25 more records, including Dak Prescott's records set as a fourth-year junior and fifth-year senior for single-season total offense, passing yards and passing touchdowns. It was the 20th consecutive season that Leach's

offense eclipsed the 3,000-yard passing mark (every season of his head coaching career).

The Bulldogs were one of four teams to rank inside the top 25 nationally in both total offense and total defense during the 2021 regular season, joining Alabama, Michigan and Coastal Carolina.

Following the 2021 regular season, MSU was the third most improved scoring offense in the SEC and 10th most improved nationally at +9.5 from 2020 (21.4 ppg to 30.9 ppg).

Leach, 59, arrived in Starkville after eight seasons at the helm at Washington State where he compiled a 55-47 (.539) record and was named the 2018 American Football Coaches Association National Coach of the Year and two-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year (2015, 2018). Leach spearheaded WSU to a school-record six bowl appearances and became the first coach in school history to lead the Cougars to five consecutive bowl games. They also led the nation in passing offense in four out of his last six seasons in charge.

The 2018 campaign saw Leach produce one of the finest coaching performances as WSU posted its first 11-win season in school history and a share of the Pac-12 North Division. The Cougars were ranked in the top 13 of each College Football Playoff rankings, including four consecutive weeks at No. 8. WSU capped the season with a win over Iowa State in the Alamo Bowl and finished No. 10 in the Associated Press and Coaches polls. Senior quarterback and Mississippi native Minshew captivated the nation, leading the FBS in passing yards per game (367.6).

Leach previously spent 10 seasons as head coach at Texas Tech (2000-09) where his squads produced bowl appearances all 10 years. He compiled a school-record 84 victories, a school-record five bowl wins and eight consecutive seasons of at least eight victories.

The architect of the most prolific passing offense in the country, Leach received three national coach of the year awards in 2008 - the Woody Hayes Award, Howie Long/Fieldturf Coach of the Year and George Munger Award. Leach's offense captured six NCAA passing titles and three total offense titles during his 10 seasons in Lubbock.

Leach led Texas Tech to one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2008 as the team set a program record with 11 regular-season wins en route to an 11-2 record. The win total tied the mark, set previously by the 1953 and 1973 Red Raider squads. Numerous accolades poured in from across the country as an unprecedented four players earned first-team All-America status, in addition to Leach's three coach of the year honors. Harrell, offensive tackle Rylan Reed and offensive guard Brandon Carter each garnered first-team honors, while wide receiver Michael Crabtree was honored as a unanimous All-American for the second-straight season.

Veteran coach and heralded recruiter with three decades of experience in his home state of Mississippi ... Spent seven seasons (2009-15) as recruiting coordinator and safeties coach at Mississippi State prior to becoming the head coach at Jackson State University ... Boasting a reputation as being one of the top recruiters in college football, Hughes played a pivotal role in helping State land 22 signees for the 2020 class, including 11 top-30 prospects from Mississippi ... MSU Blows Out ETSU To Wrap Up Home Slate

Mississippi State scored its most points in a game in more than four years on Saturday as MSU rolled to a 56-7 victory over East Tennessee State to conclude the home portion of the 2022 schedule. Bulldog quarterback **Will Rogers** threw for 301 yards and five touchdowns to lead the State offensive attack, becoming just the 10th Southeastern Conference quarterback to eclipse 10,000 career passing yards in the process. Cornerback **Emmanuel Forbes** collected his sixth career pick-six – setting a new SEC and FBS record – to highlight a strong day for the Dawg defense. MSU racked up 418 yards of offense in mounting its highest point total since a September 15, 2018, game against Louisiana. Defensively, State held ETSU to just 154 yards, the lowest output by a Bulldog opponent all year. The seven points scored by the Buccaneers were also the fewest tallied by a Bulldog foe this season. Those points came courtesy of a blocked punt returned for a touchdown. However, that was far too little, far too late for ETSU. Mississippi State controlled the game all day long. MSU scored touchdowns on each of its first four drives, mounted a 35-0 lead by halftime and ultimately cruised to the triumph.

Bulldogs Roll To 49-23 Win Over Memphis In Opener

A dominant first half set the tone as Mississippi State rode its early success to an eventual 49-23 win over Memphis in the season opener at Davis Wade Stadium. The Bulldogs outscored the Tigers 28-3 over the first two quarters on the way to victory. About the only thing that could slow down MSU early on was the weather. Lightning in the area delayed the contest for more than two hours. MSU scored touchdowns on four of its first five drives. Quarterback **Will Rogers** threw a pair of touchdown passes in the game's opening stanza – one a 23-yarder to **Rara Thomas** and the other a nine-yard strike to **Jaden Walley**. **Jo'quavious Marks** added a couple of second-quarter rushing touchdowns to account for State's scoring before the intermission. The Bulldog defense was also impressive over the first two quarters. State limited Memphis to only 29 first-half yards and just 1.8 yards per play. The Tigers did find the end zone three times in the second half. However, MSU denied a Tiger comeback with three more touchdowns of its own. Rogers hit **Caleb Ducking**, **Rufus Harvey** and **Justin Robinson** with scoring tosses over the contest's final 30 minutes to cement the victory. Rogers went on to throw for 450 yards and five touchdowns. It was the sixth time in his State career that he's eclipsed the 400-yard mark and the five scoring passes were tied for second in MSU single-game history. A dozen different Bulldogs caught passes from Rogers, led by Thomas who accumulated 81 yards on his five catches. Seven MSU players tallied at least 30 yards receiving. **Dillon Johnson** led State with his 63 rushing yards. On defense, last season's returning tackler **Jett Johnson** carried over his 2021 success into a new year with a team-best 13 stops.

Dawgs Take 39-17 Win Over Arizona

Facing its first road test of the season, Mississippi State emerged from the desert with a 39-17 win over Arizona. Bulldog quarterback **Will Rogers** threw for 313 yards and four touchdowns and running backs **Dillon Johnson** and **Jo'quavious Marks** combined to rush for 113 yards and a score to power the MSU offensive attack. Defensively, State forced three Arizona turnovers with three different Bulldogs recording interceptions as MSU kept the Wildcats at bay. **Jalen Green**, **Emmanuel Forbes** and **Nathaniel Watson** all had picks that halted Arizona drives. Two of the three interceptions led to Bulldog touchdowns on the ensuing possessions. A pair of Mississippi State receivers had a couple of touchdown receptions as **Austin Williams** and **Caleb Ducking** had two apiece. Ducking ended the game with a team-best seven receptions. **Rara Thomas** led the way in receiving yardage with 63. In all, 10 different Bulldogs caught passes with half of them racking up more than 30 yards. State led the way for most of the evening. After Arizona found the end zone on its first possession, MSU responded with 15 unanswered first-quarter points. Marks put the Bulldogs on the board with a nine-yard rush midway through the first quarter and just over four minutes later – after Green's interception – Rogers delivered a nine-yard scoring toss to Ducking. Though MSU missed both extra point attempts on its first two scores, the Bulldogs were able to add a first-quarter field goal courtesy of **Ben Raybon**'s 39-yarder. Raybon added a 22-yarder just before halftime. It gave Mississippi State an 18-10 lead at the intermission. The Bulldogs ultimately pulled away in the second half as they outscored the Wildcats 21-7 over the final two quarters. Rogers found Williams on touchdown passes in both the third and fourth periods. Williams' first score was a five-yard catch ahead of a four-yarder in the game's final quarter that came on a possession that started via Watson's pick. Ducking put the exclamation point on the victory with a two-yard touchdown reception with just over three minutes to play.

Bulldogs Drop 31-16 Decision At LSU

Mississippi State led for most of the game, but a late LSU surge was key as the Bulldogs fell to the Tigers 31-16. LSU scored three touchdowns in the fourth quarter to turn away State after the Bulldogs led by as many as 13 points over the course of the evening. Mississippi State built a 13-0 advantage courtesy of a pair of first-half scores. **Jo'quavious Marks** had a 37-yard touchdown run in the first quarter and **Rara Thomas** made a highlight-reel catch on a 13-yard pass from **Will Rogers** in the second to give MSU early momentum. State later added a 45-yard field goal from **Ben Raybon** in the third quarter, but it wasn't enough to hold off the Tigers. Marks and **Dillon Johnson** combined for an even 100 rushing yards. Both had runs of more than 30 yards and set new career longs – Johnson with a 35-yard rush and Marks with his 37-yarder. Rogers completed 24 of his 42 passes for 214 yards and a touchdown. He completed passes to eight different receivers. Thomas led the way for Bulldog pass catchers with his 67 yards receiving. Defensively, **Decamerion Richardson** and **Nathaniel Watson** tied for the team lead with 11 tackles apiece. Watson added a sack. **Nathan Pickering** and **Tyrus Wheat** also recorded sacks for State.

Bulldogs Roll To 45 -14 Win Over Bowling Green

Mississippi State got off to a fast start and didn't let up as the Bulldogs rolled to a 45-14 victory over Bowling Green at David Wade Stadium on Saturday. MSU scored 14 points in the first four minutes of the game, led 17-0 after the first quarter and controlled things from there. Bulldog quarterback **Will Rogers** tied his own single-game school record with six touchdown passes, and five different State targets caught at least one scoring toss to pace the Bulldog offense. **Caleb Ducking** led the way for MSU receivers as he caught seven passes for 96 yards and two touchdowns. **Simeon Price**, **Lideatrick Griffin**, **Jamire Calvin** and **Jaden Walley** also found the end zone on passes from Rogers. In all, 13 different Bulldogs caught passes with eight of those racking up 20 or more yards. **Dillon Johnson** led State on the ground, rushing for 57 yards. Included in that total was a 40-yard run that stands as a career long, as well as the longest rush of the head coach **Mike Leach** era at Mississippi State. Defensively, **Nathaniel Watson** paced MSU with a team-best 10 tackles, including a sack. Overall, the Bulldog defense allowed just 251 yards of offense to the Falcons

Dawgs Dominant In 42-24 Win Over No. 17 Aggies

Mississippi State excelled on both sides of the football as the Bulldogs took down No. 17 Texas A&M by a score of 42-24 at Davis Wade Stadium. MSU racked up 473 yards of total offense and State forced four turnovers to pave the way to another upset win over the Aggies. State has played a ranked A&M team five times since the Aggies joined the Southeastern Conference in 2012 and the Bulldogs have claimed victory in four of those five meetings. State ran for 144 yards – the team's second-highest single-game rushing yardage total in the **Mike Leach** era – and **Will Rogers** had his 17th career game with 300 or more yards passing. Receiver **Rara Thomas** had a banner day catching the football, setting a new career high with 134 receiving yards, as well as hauling in a career long 75-yard touchdown pass. **Decamerion Richardson** and **Jett Johnson** tied for the team lead with nine tackles each. The Bulldogs also recorded four sacks. The State defensive effort laid the foundation for the victory. The Bulldogs held the Aggies scoreless in the first half and MSU took a 14-0 lead into the locker room at the intermission. State led by at least 11 points the rest of the way and put the game away with multiple big second-half plays including a blocked field goal returned 50 yards for a score, the 75-yard touchdown pass to Thomas and a 33-yard pick-six from **Emmanuel Forbes**, who notched two interceptions in the game.

No. 16 Bulldogs Come Up Short At No. 22 Kentucky

Despite a couple of individual career achievements, No. 16 Mississippi State fell to No. 22 Kentucky by a score of 27-17 on Saturday night at Kroger Field. Bulldog quarterback **Will Rogers** tied Dak Prescott's MSU record with the 70th touchdown pass of his career, and State cornerback **Emmanuel Forbes** tied the Southeastern Conference record with his fifth career pick-six, but it wasn't enough for the Dawgs. After the first two quarters were dominated by defense, Kentucky ultimately gained the edge in a back-and-forth second half. State and Kentucky traded field goals in the game's first 30 minutes. **Massimo Biscardi** gave the Bulldogs a second-quarter lead with his 48-yarder before the Wildcats tied things with a 28-yarder just before halftime. The Wildcats hit another field goal to take an early third-quarter lead. It didn't last long though as Rogers not only tied Prescott's career touchdown pass mark, he put the Dawgs in front on a one-yard scoring toss to **Austin Williams**. At that point, MSU held a 10-6 lead, but Kentucky scored the game's next 14 points to take control. Forbes served as a spark plug for a possible Bulldog comeback when he returned an interception 59 yards to the end zone to pull State back within three points midway through the fourth quarter. However, the MSU momentum wouldn't last. Kentucky capped the scoring with a touchdown with 5:30 left and State didn't answer.

No. 24 Bulldogs Fall At No. 6 Alabama

Mississippi State held the Alabama offense to its lowest yardage output all season long, but the No. 24 Bulldogs ultimately fell to the No. 6 Crimson Tide by a score of 30-6. State limited Alabama to just 290 yards of total offense, 84 yards less than the Crimson Tide's previous season low of 374 yards. Alabama entered the game averaging 513.3 yards per game. The Bulldog offense also outgained the Tide. Led by 231 passing yards from **Will Rogers** and 53 yards on the ground from **Jo'quavious Marks**, MSU totaled 293 yards to Alabama's 290. Marks also accounted for State's lone score as he notched a one-yard touchdown run as time expired. Alabama scored the game's first 30 points, taking a 24-0 lead by halftime and adding on a pair of fourth-quarter field goals.

MSU Gets Bowl Eligible With OT Win Over Auburn

After playing a postseason game in each of the last 12 seasons, Mississippi State is bowl eligible once again following a 39-33 overtime victory over Auburn on Saturday at Davis Wade Stadium. **Jo'quavious Marks** punched in the game-winning score for the Bulldogs with a five-yard run in the extra period. Marks' touchdown put a lid on a wild night in Starkville. Mississippi State controlled the game in its early stages. The Bulldogs built a 24-3 lead for themselves by the middle of the second quarter and were ahead 24-6 at halftime. State shined in all phases in the first half. Offensively, quarterback **Will Rogers** became the MSU career leader in both touchdown passes and passing yardage to help State pad its advantage. **Lideatrick Griffin** notched his second career kickoff return for a touchdown as MSU pulled away. However, Auburn scored 22 unanswered points and took a 25-24 lead with 6:36 left in regulation. The two teams then traded touchdowns down the stretch with the Tigers also converting a two-point conversion to go up 33-30 with 1:05 left on the clock in the fourth quarter. Mississippi State responded as the Bulldogs tied the game with one second left on a 44-yard field goal by **Massimo Biscardi**. Then in overtime, the MSU defense forced an Auburn field goal try which the Tigers missed and Marks ended the game with his touchdown run on the Bulldogs' ensuing drive.

It came in the third quarter on a six-yard pass from **Will Rogers**, who finished the evening completing 29 of his 52 passes for 263 yards.
