NEXT UP

- ▶ With a 2-0 record, LSU travels to take on Mississippi State in its first Southeastern Conference game of the year at 6 p.m. CT Saturday. The game will be televised on ESPN.
- ▶ The Tigers are coming off of a 45-10 victory over Chattanooga on Saturday night in Tiger Stadium.
- ▶ With the win, LSU extended its streak of nonconference victories at home to 48. LSU has not lost at home since 2000. It also marked the 90th win a home opener inside Tiger Stadium.
- ▶ The LSU offense combined to rush for 222 yards. It marked the 12th-straight game in which an LSU player has rushed for more than 100 yards against a non-conference opponent.
- ▶ LSU's offense totaled 454 yards with 10 Tigers combining to rush for 222 yards.
- LSU's defense limited the Mocs to 242 total yards and with 68 coming on the ground.

- ▶ RB Derrius Guice totaled 102 yards on the ground with two touchdowns on 15 carries. Guice became the 16th player in school history to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards.
- > QB Danny Etling was 8-for-14 for 227 yard and one touchdown. Etling completed five passes of 20 or more yards, including a long of 48 yards.
- WR DJ Chark had three catches for a careerhigh 103 yards. Chark surpassed the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career. The senior also returned his first punt for a touchdown in just his fifth career return.
- > LB Devin White led the Tigers in tackles for a second-straight week after totaling nine against Chattanooga. LB Donnie Alexander finished second with eight tackles to tie his career high.
- > Freshmen Andraez "Greedy" Williams and Kary Vincent Jr. each ended the night with an interception. Williams was the second of the season and it was the first of Vincent's career.

LSU Record: 8-2 (Second year)

Ed Orgeron, who led the Tigers to a 5-2 mark as interim coach over the final two months of the 2016 season was named LSU's permanent head football coach on Nov. 26, 2016, two days after the Tigers defeated Texas A&M, 54-39 to finish the regular season with a 7-4 mark.

Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, is LSU's 33rd head football coach, and the first Louisiana native to serve as head coach of the Tigers since West Monroe native Jerry Stovall held the position for four seasons in the early 1980s.

Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 12-4 in his past 16 games as a head coach. Overall, Orgeron has a 22-29 overall mark as a collegiate head coach, which includes a 6-2 record at LSU and a 6-2 mark as Southern Cal's interim coach in 2013. Of Orgeron's six wins in his LSU debut season, four came against Southeastern Conference foes and all were by double-digits.

In his first game as LSU's permanent head coach, Orgeron guided the Tigers to a 29-9 win over No. 13 Louisville and its Heisman Trophy quarterback Lamar Jackson in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl.

The win over Louisville capped a remarkable turnaround for the Tigers under Orgeron, who assumed the role as interim coach of the Tigers a day after a disappointing 18-13 setback at Auburn.

Orgeron wasted little time in getting the attention of the Tigers as he immediately instilled energy and enthusiasm into the program, shortened practices with crisp, high intensity workouts, kept the players fresh with more time in the meeting room and held the players accountable for all areas of the program.

With the "One Team. One Heartbeat" motto, the Tigers seemingly became a different team overnight and the results that LSU sought soon followed. As the head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron said he was going to "flip the script" and he assigned a theme for the daily practices.

LSU's practices have a descriptive name for each day of the week, one of the ways that Orgeron and his staff hold the players accountable and focused both prior to and during the workout. The daily practice nicknames are as follows: **Tell the Truth Monday, Competition Tuesday**, T**urnover Wednesday**, **No Repeat Thursday** and **Focus Friday**.

Orgeron's first duty as interim head coach was to appoint veteran assistant and former LSU quarterback Steve Ensminger from tight ends coach to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The move paid immediate dividends as Ensminger injected life into the Tiger's offense by diversifying the play calling and bringing a culture of inclusion to the offensive staff room.

In eight games under Orgeron, LSU set offensive records for most yards in an SEC game (634 vs. Missouri), longest scoring play from scrimmage (Derrius Guice 96-yard TD run vs. Arkansas), and twice set the school single-game rushing record (Leonard Fournette 284 yards vs. Ole Miss, Derrius Guice 285 yards vs. Texas A&M).

Defensively, LSU held opponents scoreless for 15 of 32 quarters under Orgeron and limited the opposition to an average of 15.3 points per game over the eight contests. In 12 games, LSU allowed only 16 touchdowns all season, which led the nation. The Tigers also gave up just 1.3 TDs a contest, also first nationally.

Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 mark over that span.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojans' defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. Orgeron coached under Paul Hackett at USC for three years from 1998 to 2000 and was one of just a handful of coaches retained by Pete Carroll when he took over as the Trojans' head coach in 2001.

He added the title of recruiting coordinator for USC in 2001 and helped the Trojans to top

five signing classes for three straight years from 2002-04. Rivals.com and Sporting News named him the 2004 National Recruiter of the Year.

On the field, Orgeron was part of a Southern Cal staff that led the Trojans to a 12-1 mark and an AP National Championship in 2003 and a 13-0 record and another national title in 2004.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005–07.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988–92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line. During his tenure, the Hurricanes won the national championship twice (1989 and 1991), finished second in the AP poll once (1988) and third twice (1990 and 1992) while appearing in five New Year's Day bowls (1989 Orange, 1990 Sugar, 1991 Cotton, 1992 Orange, 1993 Sugar).

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87).

As a player, Orgeron was a four-year starter on the defensive line for Northwestern State, captaining the Demons as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Northwestern State in 1984.

He starred in football, basketball and track at South Lafourche High in Galliano, La. On the big screen, Orgeron played himself in the 2009 Oscar-nominated movie, "The Blind Side."

Born July 27, 1961, he and his wife, Kelly, have three sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody. Tyler is a member of the LSU football support staff, while twins Parker and Cody are entering their second season as part of the McNeese State football team.

- LSU is 51-28-5 all-time in Southeastern Conference opening games, winning nine of the last 10 overall
- ▶ LSU has opened SEC play with the Bulldogs 14 times and is 12-1-1 all-time.

Guice Surpasses 2,000 Career Yards, Nearing Top-10 List

- RB Derrius Guice surpassed the 2,000 career rushing yard mark in LSU's win over Chattanooga. The Baton Rouge native became the 16th player in LSU history to rush for 2,000 or more yards in a career.
- Guice passed Leonard Fournette as the most efficient rusher to surpass 2,000 yards as he needed 271 attempts, 32 fewer than Forunette's 302. Guice is 170 yards away from moving into the top-10 of LSU's career rushing yard list.
- A year ago, Guice became the fastest player to reach 1,000 yards.

True Freshmen Continue to Play Big Roles at LSU

- So far this season, 20 true freshmen have played for the Tigers, which is the most in the nation after two weeks of the season.
- Against BYU, seventeen true freshmen saw action for the most by an LSU team in a season opener since at least 1995.
- LSU tied Georgia and Miami for the most true freshmen to play in a season opener in the nation. - With Charles' start against BYU, he became the first true freshman to start a season opener on the offensive line since at least World War II.

Chark Returns TD, Sets Career High

- Senior WR DJ Chark returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown against Chattanooga for his first career special teams touchdown.
- The punt return was the first since DB Tre'Davious White returned a 60-yard punt against Jacksonville State on Sept. 10, 2016.
- Chark also totaled three catches for a career-high 103 yards. The Alexandria, Louisiana native surpassed 100 receiving yards for the first time in his career.

Offense, Defense Winning Turnover Battle

- The LSU offense is just one of 11 teams without a turnover this season and one of eight teams without a turnover in two games.
- The defense has given LSU a +3 turnover margin with interceptions by Andraez "Greedy" Williams and true freshman Kary Vincent Jr. Williams has two interceptions through the first two games and Vincent Jr. intercepted his first ball against Chattanooga on a one-handed catch.

Louisiana's Own Takes the Field as Head Coach of the Tigers

- **Coach Orgeron** became the first Louisiana native to take the field as the head coach of the Tigers in a season-opener since 1983 when West Monroe native Jerry Stovall coached the Tigers. Stovall and the Tigers lost to Florida State, 40-35, to open the 1983 season.
- Prior to Stovall, the last time LSU was coached by a Louisiana native came from 1948-54 when Homer native Gaynell Tinsley was coach of the Tigers.
- Orgeron, Stovall and Tinsley are the only Louisiana natives to serve as head coach of the Tigers in the SEC era.

Etling is Tigers' Starting Quarterback

- When senior **Danny Etling** took the first snap against BYU, he became the most veteran LSU quarterback in terms of collegiate starts since Herb Tyler in 1998.
- Etling owns 24 career starts (12 at LSU, 12 at Purdue)
- Etling is 9-3 as LSU's starting quarterback. The LSU graduate has guided the Tigers to wins over Jacksonville State, Missouri, Southern Miss, Ole Miss, Arkansas, Texas A&M, Louisville in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl, BYU and Chattanooga.

LSU Has Fifth-Longest Non-Conference Home Winning Streak Of All-Time

- With 48 consecutive wins over non-conference opponents at home in Tiger Stadium, the LSU football team can lay claim to having the longest among current teams and the fifth-longest ever in college football.
- The last loss at home to a non-SEC opponent came in 2000 against UAB, but since 2001 LSU has gone unblemished when playing in front of their home fans. The only other team to have a longer streak in the modern era was Miami from 1985-94 with 48, putting LSU within striking distance just two away.

Dominant Defense Shuts Out BYU

- The LSU defense allowed just 97 total yards in the season opener and -5 yards on the ground. The 97 yards were the fewest since limiting ULM to 93 in 2014. The rushing yards were the fewest allowed since Ole Miss had -50 yards on Oct. 3, 1982.
- The BYU offense's average start was its own 19-yard line. The LSU defense did not allow BYU to cross the 50-yard line. LSU became the fifth FBS team in the last 10 seasons to now allow its FBS opponent to cross midfield. The following are the times a defense has not allowed its opponent to cross midfield: BYU vs LSU (Saturday); FIU vs Louisville (2013); UMASS vs Uconn (2012); New Mexico St vs Ohio St (2009); Washington St vs USC (2008).

- Brumfield played 70 offensive snaps at left guard, leading the Tigers with 12 knockdown blocks in the win over the Cougars.
- It marked Brumfield's first honor and the first individual award for the Tigers in 2017.

Weather Impacted Games for LSU Football

- LSU played a weather-impacted game for the fourth time in three years against BYU. Following the devastating rain from Hurricane Harvey in Houston, the season opener was moved to New Orleans and the Mercedes Benz Superdome.
- Last year, LSU's game against Florida was relocated to Baton Rouge and moved to Nov. 19 following Hurricane Matthew. In 2015, LSU's home opener against McNeese State was canceled due to a nearly four-hour lightning delay. Then, in week five, horrific flooding in the state of South Caroline forced LSU to host the Gamecocks in tiger Stadium.

- > Senior defensive lineman Christian LaCouture was awarded the prestigious No. 18 during the spring after electing to return to Baton Rouge for a fifth season.
- LaCouture began a new tradition of two No. 18s as senior John David Moore was selected to wear the number on the offensive side. It marked the first time since the tradition began in 2003 that two players have worn the number.
- > The prestigious No. 18 began when, in 2003, guarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success – both on and off the field - as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football plaver.

Guice Joins Elite SEC Company With Two 250-Yard Rushing Games in 2016

- ▶ With a pair of 250-yard rushing games in 2016, RB Derrius Guice joined elite SEC company as he along with Moe Williams of Kentucky are the only two players in league history to have two 250-yard rushing games in the same season. Williams did it in 1995 with 299 yards vs. South Carolina and 272 vs. Cincinnati.
- ▶ Guice had 252 yards vs. Arkansas in week 9 and then followed that with a record-setting day of 285 yards vs. Texas A&M in week 11.
- Guice joins Williams are joined by Auburn's Bo Jackson and Georgia's Herschel Walker as the only four players in SEC history with two 250-yard games to their credit in a career.

Guice Breaks Single-Game Rushing Mark, Becomes First LSU Player With Two 250-Plus **Yard Rushing Games in Same Season**

- ▶ In the regular season finale against Texas A&M, running back **Derrius Guice** broke Leonard Fournette's LSU single-game rushing record by a yard with 285 and four touchdowns in LSU's 54-39 win over the Aggies.
- ▶ Guice carried the ball 37 times in the victory and out-rushed the entire Texas A&M unit by himself as he became the first LSU player in program history to have two games of 250 yards or more when coupled with his 252 against Arkansas just two weeks prior.
- In SEC history, he is only the fourth player ever to do so joining the likes of Herschel Walker, Bo Jackson and Moe Williams.

LSU is DBU

- ▶ With two first team All-America defensive backs in 2016, LSU can easily back up its claim as being "DBU". With the addition of Tre'Davious White and Jamal Adams, LSU has now produced 10 first team All-American defensive backs since 2003.
- > Overall, LSU claims 14 first team All-America defensive backs, including three-time selection Tommy Casanova (1969, 1970, 1971) and two-time pick Corey Webster (2003, 2004).
- In terms of the NFL, since 2007 LSU has had more defensive backs selected in the NFL Draft (17) than any other team in the nation. Of LSU's 17 NFL Draft picks since 2007, six have been first round picks and five came in either the second or third round.

LSU Welcomes Mike VII to Start Season

- ▶ LSU introduced the former Harvey as Mike VII on the first day of the fall semester, August 21, after a 10-month search for a new Tiger.
- ▶ Mike VII is a Siiberian-Bengal male Tiger and was donated to LSU from a sanctuary in Okeechobee, Fla., called "Wild at Heart Wildlife Center."
- Mikes IV, V and VI were also donated to LSU from rescue facilities. LSU has not purchased a tiger since Mike III in 1958, and LSU does not support the for-profit breeding of tigers.

True Freshmen Play Big Roles at LSU

LSU recently has never shied away from playing true freshmen. In the last 12 years, a total of 145 true freshmen have seen action for LSU, including 17 just one week into 2017. Of the 145 true freshmen who have played, 50 have started at least once during their freshman season.

Aranda Returns as Nation's Elite Coordinator

- ▶ LSU's defense under coordinator **Dave Aranda** allowed the fewest touchdowns (16) and fewest touchdowns per game (1.3) in college football in 2016.
- The Tigers' defense finished ranked No. 5 in points per game and No. 10 in total yards. In 2016, LSU held six of its 12 opponents to fewer than 300 total yards.
- LSU's most dominant performance came against Louisville and the Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson in the bowl game. Aranda's defense held Louisville to season lows for points and rushing yards as the Tigers recorded eight sacks, just one shy of tying the school record.

LSU Defense Has Allowed TDs on Consecutive Possessions Just Twice

- Under defensive coordinator **Dave Aranda**, LSU has allowed touchdowns on consecutive possessions just twice, against Mississippi State in week 3 and Texas A&M in week 13 of the 2016 season.
- In 169 possessions by the opponent, LSU's defense has yielded just 17 TDs and 25 field goals under Aranda

The Aussie Punting Connection

- Since the 2011 season, LSU has had the unique connection of having an Australian native punter. Brad Wing, a native of Melbourne, was a 2011 first-team All-American and served as the Tigers' punter in 2012 as well.
- Jamie Keehn took over punting duties in 2013 and finished his career with the fourth-best punting average for a career last year as a senior while being a permanent team captain and was named to the 2015 SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- > Sophomore Josh Growden has been the Tigers' punter over the last two seasons. Growden was selected to the All-SEC Freshman team after averaging 41.4 yards on 57 punts.

Aranda's LSU Defense Allowed Just 2 First Half Touchdowns In Final Five Games

- Dating back to the start of last year's Alabama game, LSU's defense, under the direction of Dave Aranda, limited opponents to only two touchdowns in the first half of the final five games of the season and thru week one of 2017
- Arkansas and Texas A&M were the only teams to score first half TDs against the Tigers over the final five games last year.
- In the first half of the last five games of the 2016 season, LSU allowed a total of 23 points (Alabama 0, Arkansas 7, Florida 3, Texas A&M 7, and Louisville 6). On the other hand, LSU's offense racked up 64 points during that span.

This Day vs. Night Thing in Tiger Stadium

- The facts indicate that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The numbers show that since 1960, LSU is 246-65-4 at night under the lights compared to a 34-26-3 mark in Tiger Stadium during the day.
- > Since 2000, LSU is 104-17 overall at home, which includes a 80-10 mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 24-7 record during the day.
- ▶ Prior to 2000, LSU had only won 10 games at home during the day in 32 tries.
- From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted a 10-19-3 (.359) record at home during the day. The following is a breakdown of LSU's night record, day record and overall record in Tiger Stadium since 1960:

Gold-Clad LSU Holds off State

Leonard Fournette had 147 rushing yards and scored twice and first-time starting quarterback Danny Etling threw for 215 yards, as LSU built a 20-point lead before holding off a rally by Mississippi State, 23-20. LSU led 23-3 after dominating the first 30 minutes of play. The Tigers held a 282-80 advantage in total offense in the first half. Mississippi State used an onside kick recovery to score twice in 40 seconds late in the fourth quarter. However, LSU linebacker Arden Key came up with LSU's fifth sack of the night and forced a fumble to seal the victory. Etling completed 19-of-30 passes for 215 yards with a touchdown. He became the 13th-straight Tiger quarterback to win his first start in Tiger Stadium. Fournette ran 28 times for 17 yards with touchdown runs of 5 and 25 yards in the first half. LSU outgained Mississippi State, 392-270, while converting 7-of-16 third downs. The Bulldogs managed only 1-of-14 third-down conversions. On the ground, LSU out gained the Bulldogs, 177-56. LSU grabbed a 7-0 lead at the 9:28 mark of the first quarter when Etling hit wide receiver DJ Chark on a 37-vard touchdown connection in the back of the north endzone. The aerial culminated a seven-play, 64-yard drive and marked Chark's first career TD reception. Fournette dashed 25 yards for a touchdown with 8:25 remaining in the second quarter to give the Tigers a 20-0 lead after Colby Delahoussaye's PAT attempt was blocked. Delahoussaye booted a 27-yard field goal in the second quarter to lift LSU to 23-3. The Bulldogs recovered an onside kick and needed only two plays to pull within a field goal in the fourth quarter. Damian Williams completed passes of 25 and seven yards to Fred Ross, who leaped into the endzone with 3:30 to play. The Tigers defense came to life on the final series, forcing Williams into consecutive incomplete passes before Key came up with a game-clinching sack on fourth down with 42 seconds to play.





LSU Dominates BYU in Superdome Opener, 27-0

After the 2017 Advocare Texas Kickoff was relocated to the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in New Orleans due to Hurricane Harvey, LSU dominated BYU in all phases of the game to open the season with a 27-0 win. Following a scoreless first quarter, running back Derrius Guice ran the ball 10 times on a 13-play scoring drive and ended with a four-yard touchdown run. On the next play from scrimmage cornerback Andraez Williams intercepted BYU's Tanner Mangum to set up the next Tiger touchdown. A 52-yard hook-up from quarterback Danny Etling to wide receiver DJ Chark setup Guice's second touchdown of the game from 1 yard. LSU extended its advantage with a pair of field goals by placekicker **Jack Gonsoulin** from 23 and 29 yards in the third quarter. The Tigers took advantage of a failed fake punt to score the game's final touchdown, a one-yard run by running back **Darrel Williams**. Guice ran for 122 yards with two touchdowns, and Williams added 92 yards on 15 carries with a touchdown. Etling was nearly flawless, as the senior completed 14-of-17 passes for 171 yards. Gonsoulin connected on two-of-three field goals, missing a 34-yard attempt and made three extra point attempts. In his return to the field for the first time since 2015, Corey Thompson led the Tiger defense with two sacks, and linebacker Devin White recorded a team-best five tackles. The Tigers held the ball for more than two-thirds of the contest (41:54), committed no turnovers and did not allow a sack. The Tigers defense which started three true freshmen allowed only 97 yards of total offense including minus-5 rushing--the fewest by an opponent since 1982. BYU never crossed midfield in the contest, reaching its 47-yardline once. LSU (1-0) outgained BYU (1-1), 479-97, and earned its fourth shutout away from Tiger Stadium since 1987.

No. 12 LSU Football Runs Past Mocs, 45-10

The 12th-ranked LSU Football team used a balanced attack to amass 454 yards of total offense in a 45-10 victory against Chattanooga in Death Valley. LSU (2-0) had 222 yards and 232 passing yards, as the Tigers won a home opener for the 70th time in Tiger Stadium (since 1925). Derrius Guice led LSU in rushing with 102 yards on 15 attempts, as the junior running back became the 16th Tiger to surpass 2,000 career yards and now sits at 15th overall, passing Justin Vincent with 2,047 yards. Nick Brossette added 63 yards on a career-high 11 carries in relief of Guice, whose night was complete after the first drive of the second half. Quarterback **Danny Etling** used five passes of more than 25 yards to finish 8-of-14 passing for 227 yards with a touchdown. DJ Chark, who scored on a 65-yard punt return, caught three passes for a career-high 103 yards including receptions of 46 and 48 yards. Chattanooga (0-2) had 122 of its 242 yards of total offense in the fourth quarter, as the Mocs ended LSU's streak of not allowing a touchdown at 12. LSU, which forced two turnovers on interceptions by Andraez Williams and a one-hander by Kary Vincent Jr., did not committ a turnover for the second-straight game to start the season. The Tigers were plagued by penalties early on, committing 10 of its 11 before halftime. In the first quarter, Etling conected with sophomore WR Drake Davis for a 36-yard touchdown pass, marking the sophomore's second career reception, first touchdown and longest grab On the defensive side, OLB K'Lavon Chiasson recorded two sacks and 2.5 tackles for loss. For the second straight week, LB Devin White led the team in tackles and recorded a career-best of nine. MLB Donnie Alexander also tied his career-best with eight tackles.
