WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- A win over Mississippi State would make Ole Miss bowl eligible for the fifth straight season under **Hugh Freeze** ... The last time the Rebels made five straight bowl appearances was when they earned a berth in a then-national best 15 straight seasons from 1957-71.
- This game is the 113th meeting of one of the nation's most-played rivalries ... Ole Miss holds a 63-43-6 advantage in the series dating back to 1901 ... The Ole Miss-Mississippi State series is tied with the Michigan-Ohio State series for the 15th-longest in NCAA Division I history ... Saturday's game will be the 89th "Battle of the Golden Egg," as the two schools started playing for the trophy in 1927 ... Ole Miss holds a 57-26-5 advantage in the "Egg Bowl."
- Ole Miss is seeking its first three-game win streak in the series since 2002-04.
- This is the first time since 2013 that the Egg Bowl did not feature a pair of ranked teams.
- Ole Miss leads the SEC and ranks 12th nationally with 314.5 passing yards per game.
- Seven of the Rebels' first 10 opponents were ranked in the top 25.
- The Rebels have scored first in 10 of 11 games and have trailed at halftime only twice this year.
- Ole Miss is 37-5 under Freeze when allowing less than 30 points, 2-19 when opponents score 30 or more.
- Senior TE **Evan Engram** leads all TEs in the nation (and all SEC players) with 84.2 receiving ypg.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Ole Miss holds its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season at 11:15 a.m. CT in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center, which is adjacent to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Hugh Freeze at approximately 11:30 a.m., and quarterback Chad Kelly after Freeze. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone beginning at 11:30 a.m.

PRACTICES: Viewing is permitted for approved media for select portions of practice on Tuesdays during the season. If you do not regularly attend practices, please contact Media Relations prior to your visit for exact details on times and location. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until after the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and no formations. On available days, video is permitted for individual drills only, and media will be alerted which portions of practice (including stretch) are available for video. Use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. If you have not previously attended practices, please contact the Athletics Communications office for prior approval and daily alerts on practice locations and times.

AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Periscope and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Audio/video use of content from press conferences and media opportunities is limited to five minutes per individual (coach or student-athlete) per day, and use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Athletics. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of game highlights and interviews with coaches and players for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

MEDIA GATE: Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers will exchange their photo ticket for an armband at this location.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) garage adjacent to The Pavilion; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. For passed marked for the garage, each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Passes marked for Tad Smith Coliseum are for a lot located west of the old arena.

NCAA PROSPECTS: Media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect -- from when they check in until after they have checked out or concluded their visit or camp and are no longer inside our facilities. Media are also forbidden from having direct contact with the prospects' family members who are present at the visit or camp. In addition, media may not video or photograph a prospect during a visit.

SIDELINE ACCESS (NEW): Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/ videographers. Credentialed photographers/ videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted an armband for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. *During pre-game activities, media must remain in the southeast corner of the field (near the visiting team tunnel) until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.*

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS (NEW): For home games, Coach Freeze will hold a postgame press conference in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center. Following the press conference, select players and assistant coaches will be available in the same room. Visiting team media availability will take place in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. *Postgame TV stand-ups should be conducted from the navy turf on the east sideline and not on the playing field.*

OLE MISS HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE

Hugh Freeze (Southern Miss, 1992) is in his fifth season at the Ole Miss helm. He inherited a team that went 2-10 and winless in SEC games in 2011 and has led the Rebels to four straight bowl games, including back-to-back "New Year's Six" bowl berths the last two seasons. He's the first coach to lead Ole Miss to four straight bowls since John Vaught, and he's the only Rebel coach to accomplish that feat in his first four seasons at the helm. A 2014 finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and Dodd Trophy, Freeze owns a 39-24 mark in Oxford and a career record of 69-31. His .619 winning percentage at Ole Miss is the third-best of any Rebel coach in the last 100 years. He was named the University's 37th head football coach on Dec. 5, 2011, coming to Oxford after one year as head coach at Arkansas State where he led the Red Wolves to a 10-2 season and the 2011 Sun Belt Conference title and was tabbed Sun Belt Coach of the Year. It is his second stint at Ole Miss, as he was a member of the Rebel coaching staff from 2005-07, including the final two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator with two of the top classes in school history.

MISSISSIPPI STATE HEAD COACH DAN MULLEN

Dan Mullen (Ursinus College, 1996) is in his eighth year as the Mississippi State head coach. He has guided the Bulldogs to a 59-42 (.584) record and six bowl games in his tenure. After leading State to a 9-4 record and a victory in the Belk Bowl last year, he has guided them to an 4-7 record so far this season. In 2014, the Bulldogs won 10 regular-season games for the first time in school history and finished 10-3 with a loss in the Orange Bowl. Previous coaching stops for Mullen include serving as the quarterbacks coach under Urban Meyer at Bowling Green (2001-02), Utah (2003-04) and Florida (2005-08). He was also the Gators' offensive coordinator and helped lead them to the 2006 national title.

MISSISSIPPI STATE SCOUTING REPORT

Mississippi State enters the Egg Bowl with a 4-7 record, 2-5 in SEC play. The Bulldogs are not eligible for a bowl game for the first time in seven years. Depending on Saturday's outcome, they will either match or set their worst record under Dan Mullen. Sophomore QB Nick Fitzgerald has thrown for 2,178 yards and 18 TDs this season. He's also run for a conference-best 12 TDs. His favorite receiver is Fred Ross, who leads the SEC in receiving TDs (11) and ranks third in the conference with 835 receiving yards. On the other side of the ball, MSU is allowing a SEC-high 34.3 points per game.

REBEL-BULLDOG CONNECTIONS

STARKVILLE REBEL

Going high school in Starkville, **A.J. Brown** became an Under Armour All-American and one of the highest-rated wide receivers in the country. He made the move to Oxford to continue his football career, and the Ole Miss WR has made an immediate impact in his first season as a Rebel. Brown has appeared in every game, hauling in 26 catches for 371 yards and two TDs.

THE START OF THE GOLDEN EGG

The Golden Egg was first proposed by members of Sigma Iota, an Ole Miss honorary society in 1927. Sigma Iota proposed that a trophy be awarded in a dignified ceremony designed to calm excited fans, after Ole Miss fans stormed the field at Starkville's Scott Field following the Rebels' 7-6 win in the 1926 contest. The 1926 win snapped a 13-game losing streak to then-Mississippi A&M, and was just Ole Miss' fifth win in 23 tries. Following the game, Ole Miss fans made a dash for the goal posts, while Aggie fans took after them with cane bottom chairs and fights broke out. The mayhem continued until most of the chairs were splintered. After Sigma Iota made its proposal, Mississippi A&M approved the suggestion, and Ole Miss, two weeks before the game, officially added its approval. The trophy, to be called "The Golden Egg," would be a regulation-size gold-plated football mounted on a pedestal. Cost approximately \$250 would be shared by both schools. On Thanksgiving Day, 1927, the first "Battle of the Golden Egg" was waged before a crowd of 14,000 in Oxford. The Rebels won 20-12 and the symbol of supremacy in the series was born.

ORIGINS OF THE NAME

The term "Egg Bowl" can be traced back to 1978, when Executive Sports Editor of The Clarion-Ledger Tom Patterson decided to spice up the 1978 meeting. A year earlier, The Clarion-Ledger headline on game day had been "Egg Bowl Is Up For Scramble," and the following day it was "Egg Bowl '77: State 18, Ole Miss 14." With the Rebels 4-6 and the Bulldogs 6-4 and apparently out of the bowl picture heading into the 1978 game, Patterson instructed his staff to follow the "Egg Bowl" theme throughout the week. The result was an award-winning special section on Sunday, which recounted in great detail the Rebels' stunning 27-7 victory over the heavily favored Bulldogs. While the game is still officially the "Battle of the Golden Egg," most members of the media now refer to the annual game simply as the "Egg Bowl."

VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM EXPANSION AND RENOVATIONS

What was already the site of one of the best gameday atmospheres in college football, Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, has been significantly improved for the 2016 season. When the Rebels hosted Wofford on Sept. 10, they played on a natural grass field for the first time since 2002 and set a state of Mississippi record for college football attendance with 64,232 (surpassed vs. Alabama - 66,176). The capacity of 64,038 is an increase of nearly 5,000 from last year.

The north side of the stadium has been closed in to provide additional student seating and has transformed into an exciting new "front door," which will be complete with a plaza and bell tower this spring. Other enhancements include three new videoboards, a new sound system and superior stadium lights.

As part of the \$200 million Forward Together capital campaign, the south end zone was also renovated to add 30 luxury suites and 770 club level seats, and the west suites were all refinished for the 2015 season.

“EGG BOWL” FACTS

- This is the first time since 2006 that both Ole Miss and Mississippi State are not already bowl eligible heading into the Egg Bowl.
- This is the first time since 2013 that the game features a pair of unranked teams ... Both teams were ranked in 2014 and 2015 (both Ole Miss victories).
- Ole Miss is seeking its first three-game win streak in the rivalry since 2002-04.
- Since the Golden Egg trophy was first awarded in 1927, Ole Miss owns a 58-26-5 lead in the series.
- Ole Miss has an 24-10-2 record in Egg Bowls played in Oxford, winning seven of the last eight played at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.
- Since 2004, the home team has won every game but two (Mississippi State won 31-23 in Oxford in 2010, Ole Miss won 38-27 last season in Starkville).
- From 1998 through 2003, the game was played on Thanksgiving night and was televised nationally by ESPN ... The two teams split those six meetings on Thanksgiving, with the Rebels winning the last two, 24-12 in 2002 in Oxford and 31-0 in 2003 in Starkville ... The game was also played on Thanksgiving in 2013, a 17-10 overtime win by MSU ... The rivalry will return to a Thanksgiving matchup beginning next year in Starkville.
- Neither team has won more than three in a row in the series since Ole Miss reeled off four straight from 1983-86.
- Including a pair of forfeit victories, Ole Miss posted a 38-7-2 record versus MSU from 1944-1990.
- The Rebels own the four longest separate winning streaks in the series (9, 6, 6 and 5 games).
- From 1947 through 1963, the Rebels posted a 15-0-2 mark against MSU ... That means a child born in December 1946 was a senior in high school before they saw Ole Miss lose to the Bulldogs.
- The first “Battle for the Golden Egg” in 1927 marked the beginning of nine straight wins for the Rebels over MSU.

SENIOR SALUTE

With a win on Saturday, this year’s senior class will have guided the Rebels to four straight bowl games, including back-to-back New Year’s Six games after the 2014 and 2015 seasons. Their four-year win total of 29 (and counting) is the second-best of any Ole Miss class since 2003. This group boasts back-to-back wins over Alabama for the first time in school history, as well as wins at Alabama and Auburn in the same season for the first time in program history. They were part of the No. 1 scoring defense in the country in 2014 and set school records for scoring and total offense, among other records, a year ago. SEC LEGEND KRIS MANGUM TO BE HONORED DURING EGG BOWL

This year’s Ole Miss member of the SEC Legends class is TE Kris Mangum. A native of Magee, Mississippi, Mangum earned first team All-America honors in 1996 when he served as team captain for the Rebels. A two-time All-SEC selection, Mangum caught 74 passes for 729 yards and four touchdowns during his three seasons with the Rebels, averaging 9.9 yards per reception. He enjoyed a 10-year career in the NFL with the Carolina Panthers, retiring after the 2006 season as the fifth-leading receiver in franchise history with 151 catches for 1,424 yards and nine TDs and third in team history in games played with 126. He was inducted into the Ole Miss Athletics Hall of Fame in 2008.

GARY “WUNDER-KICK”

Junior K/P **Gary Wunderlich** has been nearly perfect on field goals this year and is one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, which goes to the nation’s top placekicker. The Memphis, Tennessee, native has converted 20 of 21 field goals for a FG percentage of 95.2 that leads the SEC and ranks second in the nation. His 1.82 FGs made are second among SEC kickers and tied for sixth nationally, while he is second in the SEC and 21st nationally with 9.0 points scored per outing. His only miss this year is from 55 yards. He’s 1-for-1 under 20 yards, 10-for-10 from 20-29, 6-for-6 from 30-39 and 3-for-3 from 40-49. He nailed a game-winning 39-yarder with 37 seconds left for the Rebels’ 29-28 win at No. 8 Texas A&M, garnering him SEC Special Teams Player of the Week status.

WHAT A DEBUT

True freshman QB **Shea Patterson** made his college debut at No. 8 Texas A&M, leading the Rebels to a 29-28 come-from-behind victory and setting records in the process.

- His 338 passing yards and 402 total yards are both the most by any freshman in school history.
- For his performance, he was tabbed SEC Freshman of the Week.
- He is the sixth true freshman to ever start a game at QB for Ole Miss.

A MEMORABLE COMEBACK

Trailing 21-6 entering the fourth quarter of a road game in front of 104,892 people at Kyle Field, the odds were stacked against the Rebels. However, with multiple stops by the Landshark defense and behind the arm of true freshman QB **Shea Patterson** in his college debut, Ole Miss scored 23 points in the final 15 minutes of play to upset No. 8 Texas A&M 29-28. The memorable win was the largest fourth-quarter comeback by Ole Miss since the Rebels overcame a 22-point deficit against SMU, Sept. 26, 1998. Also a road game in the state of Texas, Ole Miss trailed 41-19 before racking up 29 unanswered points. **Grant Heard**, now the Ole Miss wide receivers coach, caught a 44-yard pass from Romaro Miller with 31 seconds left in regulation to force overtime. Then, a 4-yard run by Deuce McAllister in OT capped the rally as the Rebels won by a 48-41 final tally.

CHAD KELLY ... WHAT A CAREER

After a record-setting 22 games behind center as the Ole Miss quarterback, senior **Chad Kelly's** career has come to an unfortunate end after he was diagnosed with a torn ACL and torn lateral meniscus in his right knee following the Georgia Southern game. Here are some of the top notables of Kelly's Rebel tenure:

- Threw a TD pass in all 22 games (school record), which is currently tied for the third-longest active streak in the nation (Clemson's Deshaun Watson 26, Texas Tech's Patrick Mahomes 24, Oklahoma's Baker Mayfield 22)
- Finished his career with 25 Ole Miss records and an additional two school bowl game records:
SINGLE GAME: Passing yards (465 vs. Auburn, 2016), pass attempts (59 vs. Auburn, 2016), total plays (70 vs. Auburn, 2016)
SINGLE SEASON: Passing yards (4042, 2015), passing ypg (310.9, 2015), passing TDs (31, 2015), pass efficiency (155.8, 2015), completions (298, 2015), completion percentage (65.1, 2015), yards per pass (8.8, 2015), 250-yard passing games (10, 2015), 300-yard passing games (8, 2015), consecutive games with 300 passing yards (3, 2015), total yards (4542, 2015), total ypg (349.4, 2015), total yards per play (8.04, 2015), touchdowns responsible for (41, 2015)
CAREER: Consecutive games with a TD pass (22), 300-yard passing games (12), passing ypg (309.1), pass efficiency (152.3), completion percentage (64.0), yards per pass (8.65), total ypg (346.9), total yards per play (7.84)
BOWL GAME: Total offense (375, 2016 Sugar Bowl), TD passes (4, 2016 Sugar Bowl)
- Also ranks top 10 in Ole Miss history in career passing yards (3rd, 6800), passing TDs (3rd, 50), total yards (3rd, 7632), TDs responsible for (3rd, 65), pass attempts (7th, 786) and completions (4th, 503)
- Against Auburn, broke single-game school records with 465 passing yards and 59 pass attempts ... His 505 total yards (465 passing, 40 rushing) are second-most in a game in school history.
- Threw for 3+ TDs in eight of his 22 appearances as a Rebel ... Against Alabama, he threw 3 TDs with 0 INTs for the second time this year and fifth time in his career.
- In his first year as a Rebel, Kelly led Ole Miss to a 10-3 record and its first trip to the Sugar Bowl since 1970.
- First Ole Miss QB to guide the team to wins over Alabama, Auburn and LSU in the same season and the first to lead the Rebels to five wins over ranked opponents in a single season
- Led the SEC in passing (310.9 ypg, 10th in nation), total offense (349.4 ypg, 7th in nation), passing TDs (31, 9th in nation) and points responsible for (246, 7th in nation) a season ago
- Last year, broke or tied 14 Ole Miss single-season records, including total yards (4,542), passing yards (4,042), passing TDs (31), TDs responsible for (41), completions (298), completion percentage (65.1), passing efficiency (155.9) and 300-yard passing games (8)
- His 4,542 total yards and 4,042 passing yards in 2015 were both third-most in a season in SEC history.
- Off the field, he has gone on back-to-back mission trips to Haiti with teammates during the 2015 and 2016 spring breaks and has performed speaking engagements with Ole Miss FCA ... 3.01 GPA as a general studies major.

- Six true freshmen have started a game this year, which is tied for third-most of any school in the country.
- With a start in the Egg Bowl, **Shea Patterson** would become the first true freshman QB in Ole Miss history to start three games.
- Two freshmen have started every game this year - WR **Van Jefferson** and DB **Myles Hartsfield** ... Hartsfield is the first true freshman to start every game in a season since Donte Moncrief in 2011.
- Ole Miss has lost only five fumbles this season, tied for second-fewest among SEC teams and tied for 23rd-fewest nationally.
- Ole Miss commits 5.09 penalties per game, third-fewest among SEC teams and 24th nationally.
- Opponents average 6.9 penalties against the Rebels, which ranks first among SEC teams and 24th nationally.
- Ole Miss increased its win total by one game each year in Freeze's first four years - 7 in 2012, 8 in 2013, 9 in 2014, 10 in 2015.
- Ole Miss is 31-7 under Freeze when leading at the half.
- Ole Miss is 34-4 under Freeze when it rushes for 150 or more yards, 5-20 when it rushes for less than 150 yards.
- Ole Miss is 37-5 under Freeze when giving up less than 30 points, 2-19 when opponents score 30 or more.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- After topping the SEC in scoring, total offense and passing a year ago, Ole Miss is currently fifth in the league in scoring (33.7 ppg), fifth in total offense (458.5 ypg) and first in passing (314.5 ypg).
- The Rebels' aerial attack has been diverse and dangerous, as 13 different receivers have caught a pass and nine different players have caught a TD.
- The Ole Miss offense doesn't have many negative plays ... The Rebels rank second in the SEC and ninth nationally giving up just 4.46 tackles for loss per outing ... Senior RB **Akeem Judd** has not lost yardage on any of his 145 rushing attempts this season.
- **Evan Engram** is having a monster senior season, leading all TEs in the nation with 84.2 receiving yards per outing, while ranking second with 5.9 catches/game and eight TD catches ... He leads all SEC players with 84.2 receiving ypg (27th in nation) and ranks third with 5.9 catches per game (30th in nation) ... His eight TD catches are tied for fourth

- With 65 catches and 926 receiving yards, Ingram has broken the single-season school records for a tight end in both categories ... He previously held the yards record (662 in 2014), while he broke Barney Poole's long-standing catches record (52 in 1947).
- Sophomore **Javon Patterson** is the Rebels' only offensive lineman who has started every game this season.
- **Akeem Judd** has topped 100 rushing yards in two of his last three games ... His 139 rushing yards vs. Georgia Southern were the most by a Rebel since Jordan Wilkins had 171 against Presbyterian in 2014.
- Judd has scored a TD in five of the last six outings (four rushing, one receiving).
- Against Auburn, the Rebels set a school record with 465 passing yards ... Their 570 total yards were most against an SEC foe this year.
- The Rebels' running game came alive against Memphis, as senior **Akeem Judd** and junior **Eugene Brazley** posted rushing totals of 108 and 124 yards, respectively ... It was the first time two Rebels went over 100 rushing yards since the 2014 Presbyterian game.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- The Rebels are tied for 11th nationally with three defensive touchdowns.
- Junior DE **Marquis Haynes** has wreaked havoc on opposing offensive lines again this year, leading the team with 10.0 TFLs, 6.0 sacks and three forced fumbles ... He's third at Ole Miss in career sacks (23.5) and fourth in career TFLs (35.5).
- Haynes is tied for second in the SEC with three forced fumbles, which is tied for 15th-most by any player in the nation.
- Of the Rebels' 15 turnovers this year, Haynes has been involved in seven of them (3 FF, 1 FR, 1 INT, 2 QBH).
- Among the Rebels' eight interceptions this year are two by linemen - DE **Marquis Haynes** and DT **D.J. Jones**.
- Sophomore DB **Zedrick Woods** is tied for fifth among SEC players and 49th nationally with a team-leading three interceptions.
- Junior LB **DeMarquis Gates** leads the team with 75 tackles and ranks seventh in the SEC with 7.5 tackles per game.
- Of the 13 defensive backs listed on the current depth chart, five are freshmen, including both players at Rover - No. 1 **Myles Hartsfield** and No. 2 **Deontay Anderson**.
- Against Memphis, sophomore DB **Zedrick Woods** had his first multi-interception game, including a 31-yard pick-six.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Junior K/P **Gary Wunderlich**, a Lou Groza Award semifinalist, leads the SEC and is second nationally in FG percentage (95.2) ... He's second in the SEC and sixth nationally in field goals made (1.82/game) and second in the league and 21st in the country in scoring (9.0 ppg) ... He has made 20 of 21 field goals this year, his only miss coming from 55 yards.
- Junior **Will Gleeson** ranks sixth among SEC punters with a 43.5-yard average.
- Senior **Carlos Davis** is sixth in the SEC with 23.1 yards per kick return.

- Freshman WR **D.K. Metcalf** is the son of former NFL and Ole Miss All-America OL Terrence Metcalf.
- Sophomore WR **Alex Weber** is the younger brother of Miami Dolphins and former Ole Miss OT Laremy Tunsil.

LANDSHARK

At Ole Miss, "Landshark" is a term adopted by the Rebel football team's defensive unit. As part of that identity, defensive players will celebrate big plays by putting a hand to their forehead in the shape of a shark fin. A battle cry of "fins up" also contributes to the players' persona.

With the popularity of both the players and the "Landshark" celebration, Ole Miss student-athletes from other sports have even performed the hand gesture as a tribute to their fellow Rebels on the football team.

Roots of the "Landshark" at Ole Miss date back to 2008. After four straight losing seasons, the Rebel football team returned to national prominence with a 9-4 record and a victory over 7th-ranked Texas Tech in the Cotton Bowl. Leading the charge was a defensive squad that ranked fourth in the nation in rushing defense and included All-Americans Peria Jerry and Greg Hardy and eventual All-SEC standout Jerrell Powe.

The term "Landshark" originated that season from senior linebacker Tony Fein, an Army veteran who served a one-year tour in the Iraq War before arriving in Oxford. A two-year letterman after transferring from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College, Fein was the 2008 recipient of the Pat Tillman Award by the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Fein passed away in October 2009, but his legacy at Ole Miss continues through the "Landshark."

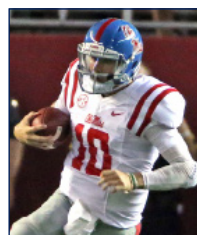

FLORIDA STATE NOTES

GENERAL: This was the second all-time meeting between Ole Miss and Florida State, and the series is now tied at one win apiece ... Attendance at Camping World Stadium was a sellout crowd of 63,042 ... Ole Miss is now 90-27-5 all-time in season openers and lost for the first time since 2011 vs. BYU ... The Rebels drop their first game against a ranked opponent since last year's Memphis game (Oct. 17) ... They are 68-150-2 all-time against ranked foes and 10-13 under **Hugh Freeze** ... Freeze has now led the team to a 3-4 record against top-five foes in his tenure ... Ole Miss falls to 27-5 under Freeze when leading at the half and 29-6 under Freeze when scoring first.

OFFENSE: Senior QB **Chad Kelly** completed 21 of 39 passes for 313 yards with four TDs and three interceptions ... Kelly has now led Ole Miss to a score on its first offensive series in eight of his 14 starts ... Kelly now has six career games with 3+ touchdown passes and nine with 300+ passing yards ... Senior TE **Evan Engram** had a career-high nine catches for 121 yards and a TD ... It was his fourth career 100-yard receiving game ... Engram moved into a tie for fourth place on the all-time list of touchdown catches by an Ole Miss tight end, with eight ... Junior WR **Damore'ea Stringfellow** had three catches for 41 yards and a touchdown, the first score of the season for the Rebels ... Redshirt-freshman WR **Van Jefferson** had two catches for 23 yards and his first career touchdown, a 20-year grab in the end zone ... True freshman WR **D.K. Metcalf** had an impressive first career touchdown, tipping the ball to himself over the defender's head for a 3-yard score ... Senior RB **Akeem Judd** rushed eight times for 44 yards, including an 11-yard TD run for his fourth career TD.

DEFENSE: Sophomore DB **Zedrick Woods** led the team in tackles with a career-high 11 ... His previous high was four at Mississippi State last year ... Senior LB **Terry Caldwell** posted a career-high 10 tackles ... Senior DB **Carlos Davis** had a career-high eight tackles ... Junior LB **DeMarquis Gates** made seven tackles and collected his first two career sacks ... Junior DE **Marquis Haynes** made six tackles with a sack, bringing his career total to 18.5 sacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Juniors **Gary Wunderlich** (3 punts) and **Will Gleeson** (1 punt) both averaged 44.0 yards on their punts.

WOFFORD NOTES

GENERAL: This was the first all-time meeting between Ole Miss and Wofford ... The Rebels have won 12 of 13 games against FCS since 2005, including six straight ... Attendance at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium was 64,232, a school record and biggest college football crowd in state of Mississippi history ... Ole Miss improves to 28-5 under **Hugh Freeze** when leading at the half and 30-6 under Freeze when scoring first ... The Rebels improve their record after a loss under Freeze to 11-7 ... Ole Miss improves to 30-3 under Freeze when it rushes for 150 or more yards in a game.

OFFENSE: Nine different Rebel receivers caught a pass in the game, and five different players scored a touchdown (four receiving, one rushing) ... Senior QB **Chad Kelly** completed 20 of 27 passes for 219 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions ... Freshman WR **D.K. SPECIAL TEAMS: Junior K/P **Gary Wunderlich** nailed a game-winning 39-yard FG, his first career game winner ... He made all three FG attempts (25, 24, 39) ... Wunderlich passed Bryson Rose and Deuce McAllister into third place in school history in career points scored (252) ... He also moved past Rose into third place on the career FGs made list with 44.

VANDERBILT NOTES

GENERAL: This was the 91st meeting between the two teams ... The Rebels now lead 50-39-2 all-time ... Vanderbilt snapped the Rebels' three-game winning streak in the series ... Attendance at Vanderbilt Stadium was 27,763 ... Six true freshmen have now started a game this year, tied for second-most of any team in the country ... This was the Rebels' first game against an unranked SEC opponent this year ... The Rebels scored first for the 10th time in 11 games ... After not trailing at the half in the first nine games of the year, Ole Miss has trailed at halftime in two straight games ... The Rebels fall to 34-10 under Freeze when they score first ... Ole Miss is now 2-19 under Freeze when its opponent scores 30 or more points.

OFFENSE: **Shea Patterson** made his second straight start to become the second true freshman QB to start multiple games in school history (Tim Ellis in 1974) ... Patterson finished 20 of 42 passes for 222 yards with two TDs and no INTs, adding 32 rushing yards on 13 attempts ... Senior TE **Evan Engram** led all players with six catches and 102 receiving yards, including a 38-yard TD ... His eight TD catches this season are tied for the most by an Ole Miss TE with Butch Veazey (1972) and Barney Poole (1947) ... This was Engram's fourth 100-yard game of the season (T-4th in school history) and seventh of his career (4th in school history) ... Engram moved past Willie Green (1986-89) into fifth place on the Ole Miss career receiving yards chart with 2,320 ... Engram moved into a tie with Mike Wallace (2005-08) into sixth place on the Ole Miss career TD catches chart with 15 ... Senior RB **Akeem Judd** had 97 all-purpose yards (63 rushing, 34 receiving) and a 21-yard TD catch, his first career score through the air and 10th overall score as a Rebel.

DEFENSE: Senior LB **Rommel Mageo** led the team with eight tackles ... Senior DE **Fadol Brown** had four tackles with 2.0 TFLs and a sack ... In the last three games he has 24 tackles, 4.0 TFLs and 1.5 sacks ... Senior DT **D.J. Jones** also added a sack, his second of the season.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Junior K/P **Gary Wunderlich** made his only FG attempt, a 23-yarder to give Ole Miss an early 3-0 lead ... His 20 FGs are tied for second-most in a season in school history ... Senior **Carlos Davis** racked up a career-high 160 all-purpose yards, returning five kickoffs for 137 yards (27-yard average) and one punt for 23 yards ... Davis also recovered a fumble on a Vanderbilt muffed punt return.

MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

@COACHHUGHFREEZE

Hugh Freeze refers to his tenure at Ole Miss as a “journey.” Suffice it to say the journey has moved at a quicker pace than even Freeze could have imagined.

A Mississippi native, inspirational leader and one of the nation's top rising coaches, Freeze was the first choice to return championships to Ole Miss Football and was introduced as the Rebels' 37th head coach on December 5, 2011.

In the time since Freeze inherited a team coming off a two-win season and 14 straight Southeastern Conference losses, the Rebels have made four straight bowl appearances and won three of them. The team's win total under Freeze has risen as consistently as possible — from seven in 2012 to eight in 2013, nine in 2014 to 10 last season.

Freeze is the first coach in school history to guide the Rebels to a bowl game in each of his first four seasons, including wins in the BBVA Compass, Music City and Sugar. Ole Miss is one of five programs in the country (along with Alabama, Florida State, Michigan State and Ohio State) to make consecutive New Year's Six bowl appearances in the first two years of the College Football Playoff system.

Freeze's 34 wins in his first four seasons at Ole Miss — which include a number of landmark victories over programs such as Alabama, LSU and Texas — are the most by a Rebel head coach in his first four seasons.

Freeze's teams have shattered most of the offensive school records and had the nation's No. 1 scoring defense in 2014. His high-flying tempo offense has helped shine the college football spotlight brightly on quarterbacks Bo Wallace and Chad Kelly and receivers Donte Moncrief, Laquon Treadwell, Evan Engram and others.

Seven Ole Miss players have been selected in the NFL Draft since Freeze arrived as head coach, including 2016 first-rounders Laremy Tunsil, Treadwell and Robert Nkemdiche.

Freeze and his staff have collected four straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 15 in the nation. The 2013 and 2016 classes were both among the top five in the country, which makes them the best two classes in recorded program history.

A total of 97 players have earned their University of Mississippi degrees since Freeze's arrival, while the 2016 spring semester saw the team earn its highest cumulative grade point average in recorded history. Freeze's staff has brought stability to the program's academic standing and has emphasized the value of good character and brotherly love throughout all aspects of the team. Many players volunteer their time to community service projects in the Oxford area, and 19 players have participated in mission trips to Panama and Haiti over the last three spring breaks.

Freeze, a noted speaker and recruiter throughout his career, has enjoyed success at nearly every coaching level over the past 20 years, from high school to NAIA to FBS, and each stop has featured a high-scoring offense and the ability to motivate young people. Before returning to Oxford, the former Ole Miss assistant experienced a record-setting run at Arkansas State. With Freeze as head coach in 2011, the Red Wolves captured the Sun Belt Conference championship and became just the third school in Sun Belt history to finish undefeated in league play with an 8-0 mark. In the best debut season ever by an A-State head coach, Freeze became just the 14th FBS first-year head coach to win 10 regular season games. The Sun Belt Coach of the Year also returned ASU to a bowl game for the first time since 2005.

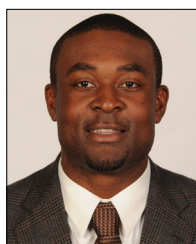

STARKVILLE, Miss. - For the first time in 12 years, Ole Miss left Starkville with a victory. Not just any win, but a statement Egg Bowl win, 38-27 over No. 21 Mississippi State at Davis Wade Stadium.

In a game in which the Rebels looked cool, calm and collected early following a 21-point first quarter, the Bulldogs didn't go away quietly. After a 28-3 halftime score, Mississippi State (8-4, 4-4 SEC) responded with 10 unanswered points. But, thanks to a responsive effort from the Landshark D and Rebel offense, No. 18 Ole Miss never lost momentum, surging to its second-straight Egg Bowl win and first in Starkville since the 2003 season.

To add to the historic night, the Ole Miss offense, which broke the single-season total offense record with 6,177 yards, scored its most points in Starkville since 1971.

Junior quarterback Chad Kelly, who broke the school record for passing yards in a season and moved into the top six in SEC history in total yards, finished the night 21-of-30 for 236 yards and two touchdowns. He also added 74 yards on the ground on 11 attempts with one score. Jaylen Walton led the squad with 93 yards on the ground off 16 attempts.

Damore'ea Stringfellow had a career night, hauling in a career-high 84 yards and two scores to lead the receiving corps, while Walton added 34 yards off five catches. As a unit the Rebels posted 479 yards with a balanced effort of 243 on the ground and 236 through the air.

Ole Miss' defense had a big night forcing two Bulldog turnovers and tallying a season-high seven sacks. The Rebels created defensive havoc and got on the board quick after DeMarquis Gates forced a Dak Prescott fumble recovered by Chief Brown. One minute after, Kelly raced in 27 yards on the ground to cap a four-play drive and give Ole Miss a 7-0 lead. The Rebels never trailed.

NASHVILLE, Tenn.--Ole Miss scored the first 10 points of the game, but the Rebels couldn't overcome 31 unanswered points by Vanderbilt, falling 38-17 Saturday night in a Southeastern Conference showdown.

Mackey Award semifinalist Evan Engram recorded his seventh career 100-yard receiving game, hauling in six catches for 102 yards and a touchdown. The senior tight end was Shea Patterson's favorite receiver on the night. In his second career start, the true freshman completed 20 of 42 for 222 with two touchdowns. Senior running back Akeem Judd totaled 97 yards of offense, rushing 10 times for 63 yards and making three receptions for 34 yards.

Ralph Webb ran for 123 yards and three touchdowns for Vanderbilt. Quarterback Kyle Shurmur added 273 yards and a pair of touchdowns through the air.

Patterson led the Rebels 75 yards down the field on the opening drive, using his feet as well as his arm. The freshman rushed three times for 19 yards, while completing a pair of passes for 22 yards. Judd contributed on the ground with a pair of carries for 34 yards. However, Vanderbilt limited Ole Miss to a field goal as Gary Wunderlich connected on a 23-yard boot.

Ole Miss increased its lead to double digits after taking advantage of a Vanderbilt miscue. After the Commodores forced a fourth down, Carlos Davis recovered a muffed punt to bring the Rebel offense back onto the field. Ole Miss took advantage of the turnover as Patterson found a wide-open Judd for a 21-yard strike. With 6:51 left in the opening quarter, Ole Miss held a 10-0 advantage.

Getting the ball to start the second half, Vanderbilt marched 90 yards down the field for a touchdown and controlled the entire third quarter. Scoring 17 points and holding the Rebel offense in check, the Commodores built its lead to three touchdowns, 31-10.

On the second play of the fourth quarter, Patterson scrambled and launched a deep ball into the end zone. Engram leaped and made an incredible catch for the 38-yard touchdown to slice

ORLANDO, Fla. — In front of a crowd of 63,042 at Camping World Stadium, No. 11 Ole Miss jumped out to a 28-6 over No. 4 Florida State, but the Seminoles took advantage of four Rebel turnovers and scored 30 unanswered points to down the Rebels 45-34.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly was 21-of-39 through the air for 313 yards, including four touchdowns and three interceptions. Classmate Evan Engram caught a career-high nine passes for 121 yards and one touchdown in the setback. Freshmen D.K. Metcalf and Van Jefferson caught touchdown passes from Kelly, the first of their respective careers. Akeem Judd led Ole Miss (0-1) in rushing, accounting for 44 yards.

Ole Miss marched straight down the field to begin the game, leaning on the strong arm of Kelly, who went 4-for-5 for 59 yards on the drive, including a 36-yard hook-up with freshman A.J. Brown on third down. Kelly found Engram twice for 20 yards on the drive before hitting Damore'ea Stringfellow on a three-yard slant for the touchdown.

Kelly accounted for 267 of the Rebels' 312 yards in the first half, throwing for 215 (14-of-23, 3 TDs) and rushing for 52. On defense, Ole Miss limited FSU to 14 yards during the opening half.

Another FSU score put the Rebels in an eight-point deficit heading into the final 15 minutes of play. Another FSU field goal pushed the margin to 11 points, but a 49-second drive put Ole Miss within single digits. Kelly threw a bomb to Engram for 42 yards to get the Rebels into Seminole territory, and a 20-yard pass to Van Jefferson resulted in a touchdown. Quickly, the Red and Blue had some life left with 12:09 left in the contest.

However, FSU continued to move the ball down the field. Aguayo added two more field goals as the Rebels were unable to complete the comeback, dropping the season opener 45-34.

OXFORD, Miss. — A school-record crowd of 64,232 showed for No. 18 Ole Miss' home opener at newly renovated Vaught-Hemingway Stadium and the Rebels certainly did not disappoint the assembled throng.

Kelly wasted little time getting the Rebels on the board after he guided Ole Miss 42 yards on the opening drive of the game and kicker Gary Wunderlich connected from 40 yards out to give the Rebels a 3-0 lead less than two minutes into the game.

After the Landshark Defense forced a Terrier three-and-out, the Rebel offense took over on their own 19-yard line. Kelly marched Ole Miss 81 yards capped by a five-yard touchdown strike to Markell Pack that gave the Rebels a 10-0 lead with 7:11 to go in the first quarter. Kelly completed 20-of-27 passes and threw no picks in three quarters of football, while Pack finished with three grabs for 46 yards and a score.

Following another Wofford punt, Kelly led the Rebels on an 11 play, 92-scoring scoring drive culminating in a 10-yard touchdown pass to freshman wideout D.K. Metcalf to put the Rebels up 17-0 in the second quarter.

Senior running back Akeem Judd led the Rebel rushing attack with 64 yards on 11 carries as Ole Miss rushed for 174 yards on the ground. Junior Damore'ea Stringfellow posted a team-high five receptions for 40 yards, while redshirt freshman receiver Van Jefferson added 4 catches for 31 yards. Nine different Ole Miss receivers recorded a reception in the game.

The Ole Miss defense limited the Terriers to just 305 yards of total offense and only 72 yards through the air. It marked the fewest passing yards the Rebels have allowed in a game since giving up 67 yards passing to Presbyterian in 2014. Senior transfer linebacker Rommel Mageo led the team with eight tackles, including three solo stops, and the Rebels posted 6.0 TFLs as a team.

Pellerin found freshman A.J. Brown in the corner of the endzone from 12-yards out with 6:16 to go in the fourth quarter. Pellerin threw for 23 yards and that score in mop up duty and added 27 yards and a TD on the ground. The Terriers added a 50-yard field goal with 2:28 left for the final score of 38-13.

OXFORD, Miss. - Senior quarterback Chad Kelly threw for a career-high 421 yards and three touchdowns, including two in the final three minutes of action, but No. 17 Ole Miss dropped its Southeastern Conference opener 48-43 to No. 1 Alabama in front of a school-record crowd of 66,176 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Trailing 48-30 with 2:59 left in regulation, Kelly found wideout Damore'ea Stringfellow in the corner of the end zone to pull Ole Miss to within 48-37. Ole Miss then recovered the outside kick and Kelly hooked up with freshman wide receiver A.J. Brown on the next play from 37 yards out for the touchdown strike. The Rebels failed on the two-point conversion, but pulled to within 48-43 with 2:51 to go. Ole Miss kicked deep on the ensuing kickoff, but Alabama converted on a 3rd-and-inches from the Ole Miss 45-yard line to hang on for the win. Kelly completed 26-of-41 attempted for a career-high 421 yards and three TDs, while adding 48 yards on the ground.

In a back-and-forth game that featured a bit of everything, the Rebels took the opening kickoff and marched 75 yards on seven plays in just under two minutes to grab a 7-0 lead. Kelly found tight end Evan Ingram for a seven-yard gain on third and long to keep the drive alive, then hooked up with Ingram again on a 25-yard pass over the middle to set Ole Miss up in Crimson Tide territory. Two plays later, senior Akeem Judd busted off a 23-yard rush up the middle for the early touchdown. Ingram tied a career-high with nine receptions for 138 yards and one score.

Alabama tied the game at 24 in the third quarter after Kelly was hit at the Ole Miss 1-yard line and fumbled the ball. Da'Ron Payne recovered for the Tide in the end zone for the score.

Wunderlich then converted his third field goal of the game, this time from 38 yards out, to pull Ole Miss within four 34-30.

OXFORD, Miss. - The Rebels scored the first 45 points of the game, as No. 21 Ole Miss dominated No. 11 Georgia 45-14 in front of 65,843 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Ole Miss (2-2, 1-1 SEC) posted 510 yards of total offense against Georgia (3-1, 1-1 SEC) and forced two Bulldogs turnovers, as the Rebels scored their most points ever against UGA. The 31-point win was also the largest margin of victory over a top-25 team since the Rebels defeated No. 3 Tennessee in 1969.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly paced the Ole Miss offense with an efficient 18 of 24 passing for 282 yards and pair of touchdowns. He also added 53 yards and a touchdown on the ground and passed Rebel legend Archie Manning for sixth place in school history with 5,901 yards of total offense. Kelly hit eight different receivers including tight end Evan Ingram, who posted six catches for 95 yards and a score.

Ole Miss was also effective in the ground attack, rolling up 180 rushing on 31 attempts led by Kelly's 53 yards. Four Rebels rushed for 30 yards or more, including Akeem Judd and D'Vaughn Pennamon, who combined for 13 carries for 78 yards and a touchdown.

Wide receiver-turned-cornerback Derrick Jones picked off UGA quarterback Jacob Eason on third down and returned it 52 yards for a touchdown to give the Rebels an early 10-0 lead. The Rebel defense limited UGA to just 4 of 16 on third downs for the game and allowed Georgia to convert only one of its first 12 third-down attempts.

Kelly broke free on a read option up the middle and raced 41 yards untouched for a touchdown that made is 45-0 with 8:34 left in the third period. The Bulldogs added two late touchdowns in the fourth quarter well after the game was decided.

OXFORD, Miss. - The Ole Miss offense is accustomed to quick starts and Saturday was no different. The Rebels (3-2, 1-1 SEC) jumped out to a 27-7 lead and cruised a 48-28 victory over Memphis (3-1, 0-0 American) in front of 65,889 fans for homecoming at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Senior signal-caller Chad Kelly completed 30 of 44 passes for 361 yards and tailbacks Eugene Brazley and Akeem Judd each rushed for over 100 yards, as the Rebels posted 624 yards of total offense. That marked the first game since 2014 Ole Miss had two 100-yard rushers and was the most yards of total offense since the Rebels recorded 655 yards against New Mexico State last season. Not to be outdone, the Landshark defense forced four Tiger turnovers and held the high-scoring Memphis offense more than 23 points below its season average. Zedrick Woods led the way for the Ole Miss defense with eight total tackles, two interceptions and 1.5 TFLs.

The Rebel defense got into the act with 58 ticks remaining in the opening quarter when Woods picked off Tiger quarterback Riley Ferguson and returned it 30 yards for a TD. Woods added another pick late in the fourth quarter to seal the game for Ole Miss. Memphis added a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter to pull within 27-21 with 3:36 left in the period, but Kelly responded for the Rebels with a seven-play, 65-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown strike to Evan Engram that gave Ole Miss a 34-21 lead heading to the fourth quarter. The TD reception was the 11th of Engram's career, tied for second among Ole Miss tight ends all-time.

Brazley added a six-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter that extended the Rebel lead back to 20 points, 41-21, with 14:53 left in the fourth. The Tigers added a touchdown with 8:41 left regulation, but Brazley added the exclamation point with a 32-yard touchdown run up the middle of the Tigers defense that put the game away.

Fayetteville, Ark. - For the second straight season, the Ole Miss football team fell in a back-and-forth battle against Arkansas. A 6-yard run by Jared Cornelius with 2:20 remaining pushed the No. 22 Razorbacks (5-2, 1-2 SEC) to a 34-30 win over the No. 12 Rebels (3-3, 1-2 SEC) at Razorback Stadium.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly accounted for 334 total yards (253 passing, 89 rushing) and three touchdowns (one passing, two rushing) in the Southeastern Conference setback. Tight end Evan Engram hauled in seven passes for 111 yards and a touchdown, all team highs. The Powder Springs, Georgia, native recorded his third 100-yard game of the season while finding the end zone for the 12th time in his career.

Ole Miss finished with 403 yards of total offense compared to 429 by Arkansas. The Razorbacks were led by running back Rawleigh Williams III, who carried the ball 27 times for 180 yards. Arkansas quarterback Austin Allen was 19 of 32 for 229 yards as well as three touchdowns and one interception.

With the Razorbacks driving into Ole Miss territory, the Landshark defense came up with a much-needed turnover to swing the momentum in favor of the Rebels. A furious pass rush by Terry Caldwell forced an errant pass by Allen as the Arkansas QB threw it right to Marquis Haynes. The defensive end returned the ball 17 yards into Razorback territory, and the offense took over from there. Kelly ran 11 yards to get the Rebels in the red zone before he kept the ball and sprinted 17 yards into the end zone. The quarterback's second rushing touchdown of the night gave Ole Miss a 30-27 lead with nine minutes to go in the game.

Arkansas took the lead for good on a late scoring drive in the fourth quarter. Using 10 plays, the Razorbacks found the end zone as Cornelius scampered six yards for the game-winning touchdown. Kelly and the Rebels tried to rally but the quarterback was stopped just short of the first down marker on fourth-and-long, causing the ball and the game to be handed to the Razorbacks.

#23 LSU 38, #22 OLE MISS 21

BATON ROUGE, La. - No. 22 Ole Miss was outscored 17-0 in the second half as No. 23 LSU handed the Rebels a 38-21 setback in the Magnolia Bowl at Tiger Stadium. After going into the half tied at 21-21, the Rebels (3-4, 1-3 SEC) could not overcome a big night by LSU running back Leonard Fournette and a Tigers (5-2, 3-1 SEC) defense that stepped up in the final 30 minutes of play.

Fournette finished the game with 284 yards on the ground, and LSU defense limited the high-powered Ole Miss offense to 325 yards. Senior quarterback Chad Kelly once again led the Rebels through the air and on the ground. The Buffalo, New York, native threw for 218 yards on 20 of 33 passing, while rushing for 56 yards on 12 carries. His favorite receivers were Damore'ea Stringfellow and Van Jefferson, who caught four passes apiece. Stringfellow totaled a game-high 92 yards receiving, and Jefferson added 43 yards and a touchdown.

For the Landshark defense, junior defensive end Marquis Haynes had another huge game that included a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. The Rebels recorded a season-high 10.0 tackles for loss, led by career highs from Temario Strong (2.5) and Detric Bing-Dukes (2.0). Bing-Dukes also posted a team-best eight tackles.

After LSU forced the Rebels to punt late in the second quarter, it looked as if the Tigers would take a lead into the locker room. However, Haynes had something to say about that. As Etling dropped back to pass on first down, the speed rusher blew past the right tackle and drilled the LSU quarterback from his blind side. The huge hit caused the ball to pop loose and freshman Jaylon Jones jumped on it to give Ole Miss the ball inside the LSU 10. On third-and-goal, Akeem Judd plunged into the end zone for a Rebel touchdown. After an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on the Tigers, Ole Miss elected to go for two to try and tie the ballgame. Kelly's decision to keep the ball on a read option proved to be a smart one as he crossed the goal line to knot the contest at 21-21. After 30 minutes of football, the game stood where it started, all tied up.

OXFORD, Miss. - Senior quarterback Chad Kelly threw for a school-record 465 yards and three touchdowns, but Ole Miss came up just short in a 40-29 loss to No. 15 Auburn in front of 65,927 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Kelly completed 36 of 59 passes and broke Archie Manning's 47-year-old Ole Miss single-game passing record with 465 yards. He threw three TDs and added 40 yards rushing to lead the game with 505 yards of total offense, which is the second-highest total in school history trailing only Manning's mark of 540 yards.

The Ole Miss offense came out firing on all cylinders after the opening kickoff as Kelly directed the Rebels 73 yards in 12 plays. He capped the drive with a 15-yard touchdown strike to tight end Evan Engram that gave Ole Miss an early 6-0 lead. It was Engram's 13th career touchdown catch, which broke Butch Veazey's previous school record. Engram finished the game with a team-high nine catches for 95 yards and broke his own school record for receiving yards in a season by a tight end set last year.

After both teams traded possessions twice to open the second half, Kelly answered back for the Rebels on the next possession as he carried the Rebels 75 in seven plays, including a 16-yard scamper on third-and-long to keep the drive alive. He found Damore'ea Stringfellow in the end zone from 10 yards out to put Ole Miss back on top 29-27 with 1:30 remaining in the third.

Carlos Davis busted off a 43-yard kickoff return to set the Rebels up near midfield. Kelly found Engram over the middle, but the senior dropped a would be touchdown and Kelly was picked off on the next play to end the Ole Miss scoring threat. Auburn returned the ball to the Ole Miss 25 and punched it in the end zone three plays later to take a 40-29 lead with 5:58 left.

OXFORD, Miss. -- Ole Miss is accustomed to hot starts, but Saturday's game against Georgia Southern went by a different script. The Rebels overcame a two-score deficit by rolling up more than 400 yards on offense to get past the Eagles, 37-27.

Senior Chad Kelly continued his stellar play by leading the Rebels on four consecutive touch-down drives before he was forced to leave the game with a leg injury. He was replaced by red-shirt-freshman Jason Pellerin, who did enough for Ole Miss to hold on for the win.

The Rebels leaned on Akeem Judd throughout the game, as he rumbled for a career-high 139 yards on 26 carries. It was the second time this season Judd eclipsed the 100-yard mark. Ole Miss opened up the scoring on its second drive of the game when Groza Award semifinalist Gary Wunderlich nailed a 35-yard field goal.

However, the remainder of the first quarter belonged to the Eagles as the Rebels struggled to slow down Georgia Southern's offensive attack. Quarterback Kevin Ellison found Myles Campbell for a 29-touchdown to give the Eagles the early 7-3 lead. After Ole Miss' following drive stalled, Georgia Southern capped off its next drive with a 9-yard touchdown run by Ellison to increase its lead to 14-3. The Rebels responded with a 71-yard touchdown drive, finished off by a 3-yard scamper by Kelly to pull the game back to within four points. The Rebels reached the red zone by way of an A.J. Brown grab that went for 29 yards. That touchdown marked the first of four consecutive touchdown drives in the second quarter for Ole Miss.

The next offensive drive resulted in the Rebels gaining a lead they would never relinquish as the Ole Miss defense began to limit the Eagles' potent ground game. Judd finished off a 60-yard with a 9-yard touchdown rush to give Ole Miss a 24-21 lead.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas -- Sometimes in sports you're just due for a win. That was the case for Ole Miss at Kyle Field, as the Rebels came from behind and stunned No. 8 Texas A&M, 29-28.

Ole Miss has been on the wrong side of games like these too often during the 2016 season where the opponent rallied from behind in the second half. This time, the Rebels were the ones celebrating as the clock hit all zeroes.

True freshman quarterback Shea Patterson had a night to remember in his collegiate debut, totaling 402 total yards and two touchdowns to lead the Rebel comeback. On the defensive side, the Rebels allowed just seven second-half points and sealed the victory off Deontay Anderson's interception with 16 seconds to go. The 15-point halftime comeback was the largest of the Hugh Freeze era.

Early on, Ole Miss (5-5, 2-4 SEC) entered the halftime break without a touchdown trailing 21-6, but held the Aggies (7-3, 4-3 SEC) scoreless in the third quarter and stormed back with 23 fourth-quarter points.

A drive that started at their own 42, the Rebels marched down field thanks to a big pass play from Patterson to Evan Ingram for nine yards, and a big 13-yard run down the far sideline setting up a first-and-10 at the Aggie 25. From there, the Rebels set up Gary Wunderlich for a 39-yard field goal to grab the lead away from the Aggies with 39 seconds left.

Ole Miss needed one more stand from the defense to close out the game, and the Rebels got just that. It was fitting that since one true freshman led the Rebels down the field for the go-ahead field goal, another true freshman sealed the deal with an interception when Anderson stepped in front of Jake Hubenak's pass.

The Rebel defense was able to limit an Aggie offense that averaged 234 yards on the ground coming into tonight to only 129 rushing yards.
