Coverage of football practice stipulates consent with restrictions on reporting formations, strategies, special personnel shifts or injuries without prior questions directed to and answered by head coach **Mark Whipple**. Photography and videography will only be allowed during the first 20 minutes of practice on selected days. Live reporting on team practices, including discussion on formations, plays and injuries via social media channels or any other outlet is not allowed at any time. Parties breaking the above media restrictions are subject to credential revocation for the 2017 season.

Usage of imagery, audio and video taken at University of Massachusetts Athletics events is restricted to editorial purposes. These guidelines are covered in materials issued to reporters, editors and photographers upon receipt of credentials and/or access. UMASS FOOTBALL GAMES NOTES • OFFENSE

YOUNG IS RESTLESS IN THE BACKFIELD

In the last two games, Marquis Young recorded 233 rushing yards over 28 carries (8.3 ypc), including three for touchdowns, during wins over Georgia Southern (10/21) and Appalachian State (10/28). He had at least 100 rushing yards in each contest, his first two games with 100+ on the season and his ninth and 10th career outings in triple digits.

He had 101 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries against Georgia Southern before he posted 132 yards and two scores over 15 carries against Appalachian State.

OFFENSE DOES NUMBERS

The Massachusetts offense is averaging 46.0 points per game over the last three contests, with 50 against Ohio, 58 versus Georgia Southern and 30 in the win over Appalachian State. The 50 points against Ohio were the most of the FBS era for the team until UMass posted 58 in their next time on the field.

In that span, the run game averaged 224.7 yards per game, led by 96.3 by **Marquis Young** and 66.0 from **Bilal Ally**. Both have three touchdowns and average more than 5.0 yards per rush (Young: 6.9; Ally, 5.7). **Andrew Ford** and **Ross Comis** are a combined 74-for-118 (.627) with nine touchdowns against two interceptions. Five receivers have more than 125 receiving yards in that span as well, led by **Adam Breneman's** 236 on 23 receptions.

OVERTIME MINUTEMEN

Massachusetts played the first overtime game of the team's FBS era against Appalachian State and walked off of the McGuirk Alumni Stadium field winners, 30-27, in double overtime. It was the first overtime game since Nov. 3, 2007 (L, 12-6 at Rhode Island [OT]).

The win over Appalachian State marked the team's 11th overtime game in program history, including the FCS era. UMass is now 5-6 all-time in overtime games and 2-3 when playing multiple overtime periods.

RECORD-SETTING HOMECOMING WIN

Massachusetts football put up the most offensive yards in a single game in team history with 670 yards, split between 350 through the air and 320 on the ground. It bested the previous program mark by 32 yards (638, vs. Bowling Green, 9/27/14) and it was the first game with 300 or more rushing yards since Nov. 14, 2015 (330, at Eastern Michigan).

The Minutemen also posted 33 first downs during the victory (15 passing, 13 rushing, 5 penalty), the second consecutive game with 30 or more first downs. The last game with more than 33 first downs was against Eastern Michigan (34, Dec. 18, 2014).

BILLY TOUCHDOWNS

Sophomore running back **Bilal Ally** made his first collegiate start memorable with career highs of 16 carries, 116 rushing yards and three touchdowns. The game also included a career-long run of 57 yards (fourth quarter touchdown) and was the first for a UMass running back with three or more touchdowns since **Marquis Young** had as many at Buffalo on Nov. 27, 2015. It accounted for the first three touchdowns of Ally's collegiate career.

YOU GET A TOUCHDOWN!!! AND YOU GET A TOUCHDOWN!!!

EVERYBODY GETS TOUCHDOWNS!!!

UMass scored an FBS-best 55 points in the win over Georgia Southern via eight touchdowns: three by **Bilal Ally** (RB) and one each by **Adam Breneman** (TE), **Jessie Britt** (WR), **Brennon Dingle** (WR), **Andy Isabella** (WR) and **Marquis Young** (WR). The previous most for points in game during the FBS era was 50 against Ohio on Sept. 30, 2017 - the prior game for the Minutemen.

The last time Massachusetts had 55 or more points in a single game was during 62-20 victory over Connecticut on Nov. 20, 1999.

WELCOME TO THE TOUCHDOWN CREW, OREKOYA

Sophomore running back **Nick Orokoya** recorded the first points of the eventual 30-27 double-overtime victory over Appalachian State with a one-yard touchdown plunge. It marked his first collegiate rushing touchdown and second-ever score (receiving TD at Temple). He is also the fourth Minuteman with a rushing touchdown in the last four games (**Bilal Ally**, 3; **Marquis Young**, 3; **Ross Comis**, 1; Orokoya 1).

ISABELLA GOES RIGHT TO... LUDICROUS SPEED!

Over his last 20 games played, **Andy Isabella** has 1,332 of his 1,339 career receiving yards and 98 of his 100 career receptions playing mainly as a starter at wide receiver. The 5-foot-10, 195-pound Isabella posted 75 or more receiving yards in nine of those 20 games, with 100 or more in four contests. He is tied for the team lead with 11 touchdown receptions in that span with **Adam Breneman**.

RECEIVERS KEEP IT 100

Three UMass football receivers have games with 100 or more receiving yards in 2017, including tight end **Adam Breneman** and wide receivers **Andy Isabella** and **Sadiq Palmer**. Breneman has three games each with 100 or more yards, against Hawai'i (179), at Coastal Carolina (126) and versus Ohio (131). Isabella eclipsed 100 yards at Coastal Carolina (101) and against Old Dominion (105). Palmer did so at Temple (117).

OUTRUNNING THE EAGLES

Five UMass ball carries combined and amassed 320 rushing yards over 44 carries (7.3 ypc) during the rout of Georgia Southern, led by 100-yard games from **Bilal Ally** (16-116-7.2) and **Marquis Young** (13-101-7.8). In addition to the 100-yard rushers, **Nick Orokoya** posted 49 yards on nine carries (5.4) while **Ross Comis** added 46 over five attempts (9.2) and **Andy Isabella** had eight on one attempt.

CURRENT LOCATION: AN ENDZONE NEAR YOU

Three Minutemen approach the career top 10 at UMass in rushing touchdowns or touchdown receptions, including **Adam Breneman** (TE), **Andy Isabella** (WR) and **Marquis Young** (RB). Breneman and Isabella each enter the game at Mississippi State with 11 career touchdown receptions, two away from tying **Kerry Taylor** (1995-98) for 10th all-time. Young enters the weekend with 18 career rushing scores, two away from evening with **Frank Alessio** (1993-96), **Jerome Bledsoe** (1988-91) and **Paul Metallo** (1971-72) in 10th place.

BOMBS AWAY VS. THE BOBCATS

Massachusetts put up rare passing numbers against the Ohio Bobcats, completing the game with 403 yards through the air (33-of-58 passing). It is the first instance of 400 passing yards in one game for the Minutemen since the team put up 486 at Bowling Green on Oct. 10, 2015. **Andrew Ford** had 390 - a career high - of those 403 yards while **Ross Comis** had the remaining 13.

BRENNAN STARTS 2017 WITH A BANG

Second-year graduate student tight end **Adam Breneman** began the 2017 season with 47 receptions covering 605 yards, an average of 12.9 gained per catch. Twenty-six of his receptions went for first downs, while nine of them covered 20 or more yards. The 179 receiving yards versus Hawai'i went as the third-most by a tight end in program history (**Jean Sifrin**, 185 vs. Toledo, Oct. 25, 2014; **Milt Morin**, 181 vs. Vermont, Oct. 30, 1965).

MR. MOVE THE CHAINS

Of his 117 career receptions as a Minuteman, **Adam Breneman** earned UMass football a new set of downs on 70 of those catches. He opened 2017 with seven first down receptions among nine total grabs covering a career-best 179 receiving yards. He added six first down grabs in nine total receptions during his 126-yard outing at Coastal Carolina and had five over a career-best 12 catches against Ohio.

In total, Breneman has eight career games with six or more first down receptions.

UMASS FOOTBALL GAMES NOTES • OFFENSE

THE CEDAR CLIFF CONNECTION

UMass quarterback **Andrew Ford** and tight end **Adam Breneman** played together previously as members of the Cedar Cliff High School football program in Camp Hill, Pennsylvania. Both emerged as offensive standouts for the Minutemen during the 2016 season.

Breneman is the all-time leading receiver in Cedar Cliff history and all-time leading tight end in Pennsylvania high school history in all receiving categories.

Ford was the 2013 Gatorade Player of the Year, football's Mr. Pennsylvania and an Elite 11 QB as a senior. He set Cedar Cliff records in passing yards, touchdowns thrown and completion percentage.

The Ford-to-Breneman duo is one of 11 in FBS featuring a quarterback and receiver who played together in high school.

SPEEDSTER DOWN THE SIDELINE

Wide receiver **Andy Isabella** established himself as an explosive threat at wide receiver with 801 yards on 62 receptions, including seven for touchdowns, during his true-sophomore season in 2016. The breakout year came after Isabella totaled only seven yards over two receptions as a freshman in 2015.

Isabella picked up where he left off at the end of his sophomore year, as he had 531 receiving yards on 36 catches (14.8 per reception), with four touchdowns, including one each against the Hawai'i, Coastal Carolina, Old Dominion and Georgia Southern defenses.

The Mayfield, Ohio, native used a 60-yard touchdown reception against Old Dominion to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards.

BIG PLAY ANDY

Junior wide receiver **Andy Isabella** was a part of eight of UMass football's 21 plays from scrimmage of 30 or more yards over the opening eight games. Among his biggest plays, Isabella caught a 68-yard touchdown pass from Ross Comis against Georgia Southern, a 60-yard score from **Andrew Ford** against Old Dominion, returned a kick 44 yards against Hawai'i, rushed for a 42-yard gain at Tennessee.

Initially listed as a running back during his freshman season (2015), Isabella moved to wide receiver before the 2016 campaign. His eight plays of 30 or more yards break down to five receptions, two kick returns and one rush.

THE SECURITY BLANKET

Tight end **Adam Breneman** caught 12 passes for 131 receiving yards and two touchdowns against the Ohio defense - his most receptions, tied for his most touchdowns and the third-greatest yardage total on his college career.

His 12 receptions rank as the most by a Minuteman tight end in the history of the program and tied for the ninth-most by one player in a game in the UMass record book.

Breneman ranks as the nation's leading tight end in terms of receiving yards per game and second among tight ends in receptions per game on the season, supported by three 100+ yard outings.

AIR ATTACK ON DISPLAY AGAINST OHIO

Quarterback **Andrew Ford** etched his name into the UMass record book for single game touchdowns, completions and attempts against Ohio with his 32-of-54 and five TD performance.

Ford tied the program record with five touchdowns, an accomplishment previously achieved eight times, including last by **Blake Frohnapfel** at Toledo on Sat., Oct. 25, 2014. His 32 completions are tied for the fifth-most all-time while his 54 attempts are the eighth-most in the record book.

BRENEMAN LEAVING LASTING MARK AT TIGHT END

Midway through his second season in Western Massachusetts, tight end **Adam Breneman** ranks as one of the all-time most productive members of his position group across team history. In only 19 games with the program, Breneman has 117 receptions, 1,413 receiving yards and 11 touchdowns.

Thanks to his 2016 efforts, Breneman is first all-time among UMass tight ends for touchdown receptions in a single-season (8). Breneman's 2016 numbers also rank second for receptions and receiving yards behind only **Kerry Taylor's** 74 grabs and 854 yards in 1998.

SADIQ IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Wide receiver **Sadiq Palmer** posted his first collegiate 100-yard outing with seven receptions for 117 yards at Temple. The sophomore from New Jersey became the third Minuteman receiving target with a 100-yard game on the season, joining **Adam Breneman** (3) and **Andy Isabella** (2).

The seven receptions and 117 receiving yards represent single-game career bests for Palmer and nearly matched his season totals entering the Temple game (10 receptions, 122 yards).

QB'S BEST FRIEND AT TIGHT END

In 2016, **Adam Breneman** broke out against the Boston College defense with 69 receiving yards and a touchdown on three catches in only his second game as a Minuteman. He produced a 58-yard catch-and-run TD reception in the first quarter - the longest by a tight end since **Jean Sifrin** rumbled for a 76-yard score against Toledo on Oct. 25, 2014.

Since then, Breneman emerged as one of the top tight ends playing collegiate football as he owns 1,413 receiving yards and 11 touchdowns over 117 receptions as a Minuteman. Breneman improved his numbers over his last 13 games (last six of 2016, all seven appearances of 2017). In that span, he has 90 catches (6.9 per game), 1,036 receiving yards (79.7) and nine touchdowns.

He entered his first season with the Minutemen with 186 career receiving yards on 15 receptions (three touchdowns) as a member of the Penn State football program from 2013-15. Including his six appearances in 2017, Breneman owns 1,607 receiving yards and 14 touchdowns for his collegiate career.

THE FASTEST TO FOUR DIGITS

Marquis Young reached 1,000 career rushing yards in only 13 games played, which ranks Young among the quickest Minutemen to 1,000 yards in recent team history. The last to reach the plateau faster was **Steve Baylark**, who did it in 11 games as a freshman in 2003. **RJ Cobbs** (2001-05) also accomplished it in 11 games, as did **Rene Ingoglia** (1992-95).

Seven games into his junior season, Young now has 2,448 career rushing yards over 465 carries, including 18 for touchdowns. He surpassed 2,000 career rushing yards during the game against Old Dominion. He jumped into the seventh-place spot on the UMass career rushing yards list during the game against Georgia Southern, surpassing Jerome Bledsoe (2,216; 1988-91) and **Kevin Smellie** (2,228; 1985-88).

ON THE GROUND OR IN THE AIR, ISABELLA DON'T CARE

Junior wide receiver **Andy Isabella** opened 2017 with a pair of touchdowns against Hawai'i, one on a six-yard end-around run and another via a two-yard reception with two seconds left in the first half. It marked Isabella's first collegiate rushing touchdown and his eighth receiving score. He has since added three more receiving touchdowns to give him 11 on his career, tied with **Adam Breneman** for the most among active Minutemen.

Entering the ninth game of 2017, the dynamic playmaker owns 1,339 receiving yards, 422 kickoff return yards and 233 rushing yards for a total of 1,994 all-purpose yards.

TIPPING THE SCALES

The projected UMass starting offensive line of **Ray Thomas-Ishman, Sr.**, (LT), **Jake Largay** (LG), **Derek Dumais** (C), **Lukas Kolter** (RG) and **Jack Driscoll** (RT) average 324.0 pounds per lineman (1,620 pounds total). All five stand at least 6-foot-4 and weigh at least 315 pounds individually. None are entering their final year of eligibility.

UMASS FOOTBALL GAMES NOTES • OFFENSE

YOUNG GETS PURPOSEFUL

Running back **Marquis Young** eclipsed 1,000 all-purpose yards for the second consecutive season in 2016 with a team-leading 1,045 on the season via 898 rushing yards and 147 receiving yards. He owns 2,989 all-purpose yards for his career as he posted 1,031 as a freshman in 2015 and began 2017 with 913 over the opening eight games of the year (114.1 per game).

GIGANTICALLY SLIM AND TRIM

Ray Thomas-Ishman, Sr., stands 6-foot-5, 350 pounds entering his sophomore season. One year ago, as a true-freshman starter, Thomas weighed in at 392 pounds while holding down the left guard spot for 11 of his 12 appearances. Thomas started at left tackle in one appearance during 2016, at Old Dominion, his slated full-time placement on the line in 2017. Despite losing 42 pounds, Thomas is still the largest offensive lineman on the team by 20 pounds (**Derek Dumais**).

SWITCHING SIDES

Tyshaun Ingram will line up on the offensive side of the ball in 2017 as a new member of the running back corps. In his first season at UMass, Ingram dressed as a safety and tallied 11 tackles, including 1.0 TFLs, and a fumble recovery. Ingram, now a sophomore, added 17 pounds to his frame for his new role as a running back. He has been limited due to injury, with appearances on special teams in two games (Ohio, Appalachian State).

FORD FROM THE START

Below are **Andrew Ford's** numbers as a starter for the Minutemen, including his nine starts in 2016 and all six games of the 2017 season.

In 2016, he also appeared but did not attempt a pass at No. 25 Florida (Sept. 3) and went 11-of-21 for 189 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions in relief of an injured **Ross Comis** at Old Dominion (Oct. 7).

In 2017, he did not start against Georgia Southern due to an injury sustained during game week practice but saw time as a reserve and was 9-of-12 for 157 yards and a touchdown.

MOONLIGHTING AT HIS ORIGINAL POSITION

After being listed as a running back during his true-freshman season in 2015, during which he did not carry the ball, **Andy Isabella** converted to wide receiver for the 2016 season. Isabella has since carried the ball 25 times for 233 yards, an average of 9.3 yards per carry.

Three of his career carries went for 20 or more yards, including a 42-yarder at Tennessee.

Known for his speed, while in high school Isabella posted the top 60-yard dash time in the nation according to MileSplit.com, finishing in 6.72 seconds at a Northeast Ohio Indoor Track Conference event at Spire Institute on Jan. 28, 2015.

YOUNG BREAKS OFF BIG RUNS

Marquis Young tallied three of the team's longest runs from scrimmage during his opening three years competing at UMass, including a scamper of 95 yards and a pair of 83-yard rushing plays. His 95-yard touchdown against Appalachian State (10/28/17) ranks tied for second on the all-time list with Fred Ellert (95 vs. Tufts; Nov. 27, 1928). Young also had a pair of 83-yard bursts, one each at Notre Dame (Sept. 26, 2015) and against Mississippi State (Sept. 24, 2016). The only run longer than Young and Ellert's 95-yarders was Jim Pizano's 96 yard run against Rhode Island on Oct. 5, 1996.

BRENEMAN, THE ALL-AMERICAN

Adam Breneman appeared on three national preseason all-America listings. He earned USA Today Preseason All-America Second Team, Athlon Sports Preseason All-America Third Team and Bleacher Report Preseason All-America. Since the beginning of the year, Breneman added midseason all-America from CBS Sports, Pro Football Focus and Athlon Sports.

Breneman currently ranks 18th overall across FBS and second among tight ends in receptions per game (6.7) and 29th overall and first among tight ends for receiving yards per game (86.4).

FORD'S FIRST-YEAR SUCCESS

In his first season as a Minuteman, **Andrew Ford** stepped into the starting quarterback role and wrote his name into the team's record book in 11 single-season categories, including pass completions, passing yards, passing touchdowns and completion percentage.

BRENEMAN'S 2016 BY-THE-NUMBERS

Adam Breneman emerged as one of the top tight ends in FBS during 2016 to the tune of team-leading spots for receptions (70), receiving yards (808) and touchdown catches (8).

In the final six weeks of the year, Breneman pulled in 42 receptions (7.0 per game) for 512 yards (85.3) and six touchdowns during play vs. Louisiana Tech (7-94-0), South Carolina (9-94-2), Wagner (8-138-2), Troy (6-77-1), BYU (8-79-0) and Hawai'i (4-30-1).

He finished the year ranking among the top two tight ends in the nations in a multitude of categories, including receptions (1st; 70), receptions per game (2nd; 5.8), receiving yards (2nd; 808), receiving yards per game (2nd; 67.3), touchdown receptions (2nd; 8).

UMASS FOOTBALL GAMES NOTES • DEFENSE

FINDING GAPS

The Massachusetts defense has 46.0 TFLs over the last five games (11.0 at Temple, a single-game season high of 12.0 at Tennessee, 6.0 against Ohio, 9.0 vs. Georgia Southern, 8.0 vs. Appalachian State). Prior to the four most recent contests, the UMass defense had 11.0 TFLs total over the opening three games (5.0 vs. Hawai'i, 2.0 at Coastal Carolina, 3.0 vs. Old Dominion).

During the last five games, 17 different Minutemen recorded at least an assisted-TFL, while **Da'Sean Downey** (9.0-39) and **Sha-Ki Holines** (5.0-16) have at least assisted on a TFL in each game. Downey's 13.0 TFLs in that span leads the team, followed by Holines' 5.0 TFLs.

TAKING THE LONG ROUTE

Edge-rusher **Da'Sean Downey** ranks among the nation's leaders in tackles for loss, standing third for TFLs per game (1.9) and total TFLs (15.5). He is also tied for 39th nationally in sacks (5.0) and tied for 45th in sacks per game (0.63).

Downey posted a career-high 4.0 TFLs and tied his personal best with 2.0 sacks in the 55-20 win over Georgia Southern (10/21). The 4.0 TFLs against the Eagles' offensive line marked the ninth-most in a single game across FBS this season and it is one of only 26 individual performances all season with 4.0 TFLs or more. He immediately followed with another 4.0 TFL game against Appalachian State, which made him one of only two players in the nation with multiple games of 4.0 TFLs or more (Brian Womac, Rice).

ADDO-ING UP SOME BIG TACKLE NUMBERS

First-year linebacker **Jarell Addo** has 4.5 TFLs among 39 total tackles over his first eight games started at outside linebacker. Addo, a redshirt-sophomore, moved to linebacker and redshirted in 2016 after he played 2015 as a defensive back. All 4.5 of his TFLs came during the previous six games. In that same span, Addo had 36 of his 39 tackles, including a career-high nine at Tennessee.

BARR WINS GOLD HELMET AWARD

Middle linebacker **Bryton Barr** collected a New England Football Writers Association (NEFWA) Gold Helmet award on Wed., Sept. 27 following his 12-tackle effort in the near-upset at Tennessee. Among his 12 tackles, Barr accrued 1.5 TFLs for five yards lost. He had at least two tackles in each quarter and split his dozen evenly between the first and second halves. It is Barr's first honor from the NEFWA. He currently leads the team with 75 tackles in the opening seven games while his 9.4 tackles per game average ranks Barr tied for 24th in the nation.

SAFETY PLAY AT THE LINE

Starting safety **Jesse Monteiro** had 4.0 TFLs over the last four games. They represent 4.0 of his 4.5 TFLs on the season, with the remaining assisted stop coming on a sack against Hawai'i during the season-opener. His 4.5 TFLs are more than the rest of the secondary combined (4.0; 2.0 by **Tyler Hayes**, 1.0 by Lee Moses, 1.0 by **Isaiah Rodgers**).

UMass football recorded its first safety as an FBS program against Ohio on Sept. 30. In the third quarter, a bad snap by the Bobcats landed in the endzone, which Ohio recovered for the safety. The last time UMass had a safety was against Central Connecticut on Oct. 8, 2011.

CLOGGING UP THE MIDDLE

Nose tackle **Ali Ali-Musa** totaled 15 tackles against Old Dominion, a career high and the most since **Steve Casali** had 15 against Tulane on Oct. 1, 2016. Ali-Musa's day began with a combined sack of quarterback Blake LaRussa with **Da'Sean Downey** on the first play from scrimmage of the game. It also included a fourth-and-goal stuff of running back Jeremy Cox from the UMass one yard line during the fourth quarter.

GIVING THEM THE BYCZ-NESS

Freshman **Jake Byczko** posted a career-high 10 tackles during extended time on the defensive line against Old Dominion. He was active throughout the game, with two tackles each in the first, second and third quarters before he had four in the fourth. The Massachusetts native entered the game with two total tackles in his prior two appearances.

GET IT BACK FOR THE O

After only forcing one turnover in the opening four games (**Isaiah Rodgers**, interception, vs. Hawai'i) and going 15 full quarters without one, Massachusetts has eight in the last four games (six fumble recoveries, two interceptions).

Tennessee: 1 (FR)

Georgia Southern: 4 (3 FR, 1 INT)

Appalachian State: 3 (2 FR, 1 INT)

In that span, **Lee Moses** has both picks while six different Minutemen have one fumble recovery apiece, including **Jarell Addo**, **Bryton Barr**, **Steve Casali**, **Jake Froehlich**, **Tyler Hayes** and **Rodgers**.

ACTIVE HANDS

The defensive line posted nine of the team's 32 pass breakups through the opening eight games, with two each by **Jake Byczko**, **Da'Sean Downey** and **Mario Patton** and one more from **Jarell Addo**, **Ali Ali-Musa** and **Leon Flanagan, Jr.** Cornerback **Isaiah Rodgers** leads the team with nine.

SETTING THE BARR HIGH

In his first eight games as a Minuteman, starting middle linebacker **Bryton Barr** led the team with 75 total tackles, including 5.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks. It is 24 more than the next Minuteman (**Steve Casali**, 51). He had 13 tackles against Hawai'i - tied for the game-high - and added double-digit outing at Coastal Carolina (11), at Tennessee (12) and against Appalachian State (15).

Currently, Barr's 75 total tackles and 9.4 tackles per game rank among the nation's leaders. He is tied for 24th in FBS for tackles per game and tied for 28th in total tackles.

Prior to his arrival at UMass, Barr was a five-year member of the Towson football program, where he totaled 142 tackles, including 13.0 TFLs from 2012-16.

STOPS IN THE MIDDLE

Then-redshirt junior inside linebacker **Steve Casali** led the Minutemen with 105 tackles during the 2016 season, split between 47 solo and 58 assisted tackles. His breakout 2016 season came after Casali totaled 40 tackles over the 2013-15 seasons. He posted 32 tackles more than the next Minuteman (**Jesse Monteiro**; 73).

Casali, who also had eight pass breakups, 6.0 TFLs, three fumble recoveries and one forced fumble, earned recognition of his 2016 season with a spot on the 2017 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List.

He is the leading active tackler on the team with 196, including 13.0 TFLs and 4.5 sacks, and has four career fumble recoveries along with a pair of forced fumbles.

TOPPING 10 TACKLES A GAME

Four Minutemen posted 10 or more tackles in a single game during the 2016 season, led by four from **Steve Casali**. A pair of players added two games with 10 or more tackles in **Colbert Calhoun** and **Jesse Monteiro** while **Da'Sean Downey** eclipsed 10 tackles on one occasion.

Bryton Barr added his name to the category with a quartet of 10+ tackle games in 2017. **Ali Ali-Musa** (15) and **Jake Byczko** (10) made it seven Minutemen with their performances against Old Dominion. Below is a list of all the games with 10 or more tackles in 2017.

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, SON AND HOLINES

Redshirt senior defensive lineman **Sha-Ki Holines** second among active Minutemen in tackles for loss behind only defensive line mate **Da'Sean Downey**. Five appearances into his 2017 season, Holines has 24.0 TFLs, including 6.0 sacks, over 39 games played.

Holines posted 3.0 as a freshman, 9.0 for 30 yards lost as a sophomore and 7.0 covering 31 yards as a junior. His 2.5 sacks for 21 yards lost as a junior ranked as his single-season most. He missed the opening three games of 2017 due to injury, but followed with an average of 1.0 TFLs per game since his return. He is the only Minuteman with 3.0 or more TFLs in each of the last four seasons.

UMASS FOOTBALL GAMES NOTES • DEFENSE/SPEC. TEAMS

MR. RODGERS' NEIGHBORHOOD

Isaiah Rodgers picked off Hawai'i quarterback Dru Brown on a jump-ball intended for Ammon Barker during the first play of the Rainbow Warriors' third drive of the season-opener. It was one of two passes Rodgers defended during the game, as he broke up another Brown attempt at the end of the first quarter. Rodgers' three career interceptions are the most by an active Minuteman.

He leads the lead in passes defended this season (9) and, despite only being a sophomore, has the most among active Minutemen with 18.

FIRST YEAR NUMBERS

UMass football had nine players contribute to the young defensive unit in 2016. All nine return for the 2017 season. It includes:

NCAA GRANTS BARR TWO ADDITIONAL YEARS OF ELIGIBILITY

Graduate student linebacker **Bryton Barr** was granted two additional seasons of eligibility by the NCAA prior to his transfer to the University of Massachusetts. Barr previously played at Towson University from 2012-16, but missed the entirety of 2014 and 2015 while he only played in two games during 2013 due to injury.

Barr returned to the field full-time in 2016 and tallied 58 tackles (6.5 TFLs/3.0 sacks), one forced fumble and one pass breakup. He also ranked second on the team in tackles as a true freshman in 2012 with 74 takedowns (5.0 TFLs/2.0 sacks), two pass breakups, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble.

Barr lines up as an inside linebacker during 2017 and opened the year with a team-high 13 tackles, including 1.5 TFLs for nine yards lost against Hawai'i. He leads the team with 75 total tackles through eight games.

HUBER HAS TO HANG UP HIS CLEATS

Redshirt senior linebacker **Shane Huber** was forced to medically retire from the game of football prior to the start of the 2017 season due to concerns over recurring knee injuries. Huber finishes his UMass playing career with 126 career tackles, 5.5 TFLs, two passes defended, a pair of forced fumbles and one interception over 24 appearances. He missed time in 2013 and 2016 and red-shirted all of 2014 due to injury. He will continue to serve as a team captain in 2017 while he fills a sideline role as a team assistant.

LAURENT KICKS, BACKFLIPS INTO RECORD BOOKS

Logan Laurent gave the Minutemen their first FBS overtime victory with a pair of clutch field goal conversions. Laurent hit from 45 yards away with only five seconds left in the fourth quarter to tie the game at 20-20 and force overtime. He ended it, and celebrated with a perfectly executed backflip, with a 36-yard conversion from the right hash mark in double overtime.

LAURENT PUTS UP THE POINTS

In his first complete game back in his role as the field goal and extra point kicker, **Logan Laurent** totaled a personal-best 11 points against Ohio via a pair of made field goals and five extra points. Laurent opened scoring in the first and second quarters with field goals of 24 and 35 yards, respectively. He hit all five of his extra points, one in the first quarter, two in the second and three in the fourth.

Laurent bested his 11-point outing against Ohio with an even dozen scored in the double-overtime win against Appalachian State, during which he hit all three field goal attempts and pushed through each of his three extra point tries.

LAURENT SURPASSED TRIPLE DIGITS IN POINTS

During his 11-point outing against Ohio, **Logan Laurent** surpassed 100 career points. Entering the game with 95 as a Minuteman, Laurent went over 100 with his second field goal of the game and ended the day with 106 via 21 made field goals and 43 extra point conversions. He now owns 125 following the wins over Georgia Southern and Appalachian State (24 FGs, 53 XPs).

STARTING IN THE ENDZONE

Running back **Marquis Young** added kick return duties to his list of responsibilities during the game against Ohio and broke off four returns for 129 yards, including an 81-yard burner down the UMass sideline that set up **Adam Breneman's** second quarter touchdown reception. It was his first game with a kickoff return at the collegiate level. He added two returns for 37 yards against Appalachian State for 166 kick return yards on six attempts this season (27.7 per return).

HEIGHT ADVANTAGE

Logan Laurent, a Ray Guy Award Watch List candidate for the second consecutive season, ranks among the tallest kickers and punters in NCAA Division I during 2017. At 6-foot-4, Laurent is tied for the third-tallest kicker and tied for the 12th-tallest punter. He is one of only three student-athletes listed at punter and kicker to stand 6-foot-4 or taller, joined by Brad Davis (Old Dominion; 6-foot-7) and Rhett Almond (BYU; 6-foot-4).

DEPLOYING THE FOURTH DOWN FOOTBALL MORTAR

Through 32 games as the primary punter, **Logan Laurent** ranks among the best performing specialists in UMass football history with the career punt average and single-game punt yard records.

Over 169 career punts, Laurent averages 41.88 yards per attempt (7,078 total yards). Brett Arnold ranks second at 41.35 yards per attempt (97-4270; 2007-08).

Laurent's most active day came in the 2016 #BattleoftheBayState against Boston College with 12 punts covering a program-record 547 yards (45.6 per attempt). Laurent dropped four of his punts inside the Eagles' 20-yard line while four traveled at least 50 yards.

Laurent has 34 career punts of 50 or more yards and dropped 44 inside the 20-yard line.

LAURENT PULLS DOUBLE-DUTY

Logan Laurent served as the sole punter for the team over the last two seasons while simultaneously seeing extended time as the team's field goal kicker. His efforts rank Laurent among the top kickers and punters in UMass history.

As a kicker, Laurent stands third in field goal percentage (.750) and seventh in field goals made (24) and attempted (32). As a punter, Laurent stands first all-time in yards per punt (41.88) and fifth in punt yards (7,078) and total punt attempts (169).

Laurent is the only player in the history of the program to rank in the top 10 statistically as a punter and kicker. He is currently listed as splitting the No. 1 place kicker responsibilities on the depth chart alongside redshirt freshman **Michael Schreiner**.

LAURENT DIALS IN DOWN THE STRETCH

Logan Laurent made his final six field goal attempts of the 2016 season after he started 1-for-3 in the category. Laurent converted two each against Hawai'i and Wagner while he had one each at Troy and at BYU. Four of those six conversions were from distances of 30 or more yards, including a 44-yard field goal at BYU.

Laurent picked up in 2017 where he left off in 2016 as he made both his attempts against Ohio and all three tries against Appalachian State. He currently has 24 made field goals in 32 attempts (.750) - the second-best field goal percentage in team history.

RODGERS RUNS IT OUT

Isaiah Rodgers finished his true freshman season in 2016 with the fifth-most kick return yards in one campaign in program history, with 733 over 31 returns (23.6). Rodgers set the team record for kick returns in one game with nine against Mississippi State on Sept. 24, 2016. He also etched his name in the record book for the fifth-most returns and ninth-highest yards per return average in a single-season in program history. Six games into his sophomore season, Rodgers is already 11th on the all-time list for total kick return yards by a Minuteman.

UMASS ONE OF FEW TEAMS WITH FEMALE ATHLETIC TRAINER

University of Massachusetts football is one of nine programs across FBS with a female primary athletic trainer. Associate athletic trainer **Jennifer Brodeur** is in her 12th year with the department and 10th working with the football program. In recognition of her success, Brodeur was named the Assistant Athletic Trainer of the Year by the National Athletic Trainers Association in June, 2013. The award is only given to one individual per year and is voted on by the College/University Athletic Trainers Committee. She was promoted to Head Athletic Trainer in August, 2017, which made Brodeur only the sixth female in her position as the leader of the sports medicine office and the football team's primary athletic trainer.

UMASS ATHLETICS MOURNS LOSS OF DICK MACPHERSON

UMass football mourns the loss of former head coach **Dick MacPherson**, who passed away at the age of 86 on Tues., Aug. 8. MacPherson, a 2009 College Football Hall of Fame inductee, spent seven seasons on the sidelines at UMass and led the program to four Yankee Conference Championships.

MacPherson guided UMass from 1971-77 and won Yankee Conference Championships in 1971, '72, '74 and '77. Among his multitude of career highlights, MacPherson coached Massachusetts to a 35-14 victory over California-Davis in the 1972 Boardwalk Bowl. His UMass squads dominated the Yankee Conference and posted a 28-8-1 mark in league action, while he finished his time in Amherst with a 45-27-1 overall ledger (.623). He was inducted in the UMass Hall of Fame in 2004.

After leaving UMass, MacPherson went on to a successful tour as the head coach of Syracuse football (1981-90), during which he guided the Orange to five postseason bowls, including his undefeated 1987 squad's Sugar Bowl appearance. He also had a two-year stint as head coach of the New England Patriots (1991-1992). Following the completion of his coaching career, MacPherson served as a color commentator on television and radio broadcasts for Syracuse football.

COACHING AT THE ALMA MATER

University of Massachusetts football employs three alumni in full-time coaching roles in 2017, including **Steve Costello** (cornerbacks), **Charles Walker** (recruiting coordinator and linebackers) and **Dave Wissman** (defensive line). Costello and Walker were both letterman for the Minutemen. Wissman played at New Hampshire before he finished his degree at UMass. Alumnus **Scott Woodward** also serves on the staff as an offensive analyst.

DEGREES IN-HAND

Seven Minutemen enter the 2017 season with their undergraduate degree requirements completed, including **Bryton Barr**, **Nick Berus**, **Adam Breneman**, **Steve Casali**, **Connor Lemieux**, **Jesse Monteiro** and **Matt Tuleja**. It puts the Minutemen among the schools with the most undergraduate degrees earned entering the 2017 season. Barr (Towson) and Breneman (Penn State) earned their degrees prior to transferring to Massachusetts as graduate students.

WEARING MULTIPLE COACHING HATS

Mark Whipple is one of only seven head coaches in the nation who doubles as an offensive or defensive coordinator. He is joined by Doug Beaty (Kansas; defensive), Paul Johnson (Georgia Tech; offensive), Mike Leach (Washington State; offensive), Rocky Long (San Diego State; offensive), Doug Martin (New Mexico State; offensive) and Derek Mason (Vanderbilt; defensive).

THE QUARTERBACK GURU

Two of the most successful quarterbacks in program history played for **Mark Whipple** during his first tenure at UMass (**Todd Bankhead** & **Jeff Krohn**) while two highly successful NFL QBs received guidance from him during his time with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Philadelphia Eagles as Whipple worked with **Ben Roethlisberger** and **Donovan McNabb**.

Bankhead took snaps for the Minutemen from 1998-99 and finished his career with 7,018 passing yards, the second-most for a career in program history. **Jeff Krohn** suited up for Whipple from 2002-03 when he threw for 4,993 yards. Bankhead had 51 career touchdowns, while Krohn produced 44, which rank second and third on the program's all-time top 10 list, respectively. **Blake Frohnappfel** added his name to the list of successful QBs coached by Whipple as he notched 6,264 passing yards and 39 touchdowns in only 22 appearances with the Minutemen.

WHIPPLE APPROACHES ALL-TIME WINS RECORD

Mark Whipple is one win away from moving into first all-time in UMass history for career victories. Whipple owns 59 triumphs over his two tenures as head coach (1998-2003; '14-present).

Whipple is currently tied with **Vic Fusia** (1961-70) for first in UMass football history with 59 victories. Whipple is one of five coaches in team history with at least five winning seasons. Fusia leads the way with eight while **Don Brown** (2004-08), **Harold "Kid" Gore** (1919-27), **Mel Taube** (1931-35) and Whipple each have five.

LET'S GET THE BAND BACK TOGETHER!

Mark Whipple is flanked by former Minutemen on the sideline in 2017. Included on his staff are two recent program alumni in **Steve Costello** (tight ends) and **Charles Walker** (recruiting coordinator and outside linebackers). Whipple also employs former UMass quarterback **Scott Woodward** as an offensive analyst after he completed two years as a graduate assistant in 2015 and 2016.

In addition, Whipple's son, **Spencer Whipple**, is now coaching the wide receivers alongside his duties as the passing game coordinator after he suited up for the Maroon and White in 2008 before transferring to play for his dad at Miami (Fla.). Additionally, special teams coordinator **Mark Michaels** coached alongside Whipple during Whipple's first tenure as the UMass head coach.

IT'S GOOD TO BE BACK

UMass football played five contests on campus at McGuirk Alumni Stadium this season. In 2017, the Minutemen host Hawai'i (Aug. 26), Old Dominion (Sept. 9), Ohio (Sept. 30), Georgia State (Oct. 21) and Appalachian State (Oct. 28). After playing all or part of each season since 2012 at Gillette Stadium, it marked the most games on campus at McGuirk Alumni Stadium of the NCAA Division I FBS era. One additional home game will be played across the Commonwealth at Fenway Park in Boston, Mass., as part of the Fenway Gridiron Series on Nov. 11 against Maine.

NICE TO MEET YOU...

UMass football played two first-time opponents in 2017, including Coastal Carolina and Tennessee. A third game was scheduled, at USF, but was postponed to a future season due to Hurricane Irma-related scheduling changes. Coincidentally, all three games would have been played on the road, in Conway, S.C., Tampa, Fla., and Knoxville, Tenn.

...WE'VE ALREADY MET

The 10 remaining UMass opponents are repeat foes from a combination of the Division I-AA/FCS and I-A/FBS eras: Appalachian State, BYU, Georgia Southern, FIU, Hawai'i, Maine, Mississippi State, Ohio, Old Dominion and Temple. 2017 marked the first time UMass faces Appalachian State or Georgia Southern as an FBS program.

MINUTEMAN HOMECOMINGS

University of Massachusetts football travels to six states for the six road games in 2017, including Florida, Mississippi, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee and Utah. Two of those road trips combine to bring 20 Minutemen to their home states: 12 from Florida and eight from Pennsylvania.

Pennsylvania: **Bryton Barr** (Camp Hill, Pa.), **Nick Berus** (Bakerstown), **Adam Breneman** (Mechanicsburg), **Andrew Ford** (Camp Hill), **Victor Santiago** (Bethlehem), **Charan Singh** (Murrysville), **Ray Thomas-Ishman, Sr.** (Philadelphia) and **Charly Timite** (Philadelphia). Thomas-Ishman, Sr., and Timite played together and were in the same graduating class at Simon Gratz High School. Breneman and Ford plated together at Cedar Cliff.

Florida: **Bilal Ally** (Jacksonville), **James Bowe, Jr.** (Miami), **Jessie Britt** (Lake Alfred), **Cycoby Burch** (Orlando), **Claudin Cherrelus** (Naples), **Zeke Edmonds** (West Palm Beach), **Bakhari Goodson** (Orlando), **Tyshaun Ingram** (Orlando), **Brian Roberts, Jr.** (Jacksonville), **Isaiah Rodgers** (Tampa), **Patrick Volcy** (Naples) and **Caeleb Washington** (Melbourne). Cherrelus and Volcy played together and were in the same graduating class at Golden Gate High School.

RETURNING FOR ANOTHER ROUND

UMass ranks tied for the 10th-most returning starters in nation, with eight on the defensive side of the ball and seven on the offensive end.

On the offensive side of the ball, the UMass returning starters include **Adam Breneman** (TE), **Jack Driscoll** (RT), **Andrew Ford** (QB), **Andy Isabella** (WR), **Travis Reynolds** (TE), **Ray Thomas-Ishman, Sr.** (LG) and **Marquis Young** (RB).

On the defensive side of the ball, the UMass returning starters include **Ali Ali-Musa** (DT), **Colbert Calhoun** (LB), **Steve Casali** (LB), **Da'Sean Downey** (LB/DL), **Sha-Ki Holines** (DE), **Tedrick Lowery** (LB), **Lee Moses** (SS) and **Isaiah Rodgers** (CB).

WHAT'S IN THE WATER NEAR CAMP HILL, PENNSYLVANIA?

Three UMass football Minutemen hail from Camp Hill, Pa., and Mechanicsburg, Pa., towns of approximately 8,000-9,000 people, including **Bryton Barr**, **Adam Breneman** and **Andrew Ford**. All three are starters, Barr at middle linebacker, Breneman at tight end and Ford as the quarterback.

Barr had 13 tackles, 1.5 TFLs and 1.0 sacks in his UMass debut and owns a team-best four games with 10 or more stops this season. He also paces the team in unassisted (33), assisted (42) and total (75) tackles. He previously was a member of the Towson football team for five seasons and was granted eligibility for 2016 and 2017 from the NCAA due to medical hardship.

Breneman, whose name appears on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List and John Mackey Award Watch List, has 1,413 receiving yards and 11 touchdown receptions in only 19 career games with the Minutemen. He was a three-year member of the Penn State football team prior to his graduation and transfer to UMass ahead of the 2016 season.

In 19 career games played, Ford has tossed 39 touchdowns and thrown for 4,655 career yards while completing 62.2 percent of his attempts (373-of-600). In his first year as a starter for the Minutemen in 2016, Ford placed his name among the top-10 in program history in 11 categories, including the second-best completion percentage in team history (60.8) and tied for the fourth-most passing touchdowns (26).

UMASS ANNOUNCES 2017, FUTURE SCHEDULE CHANGES

University of Massachusetts football agreed Thurs., Sept. 14, to accommodate a Hurricane Irma-related scheduling change request made by the American Athletic Conference (AAC) and the University of South Florida (USF) and postponed the teams' planned meeting at USF in Tampa, Florida, on Sat., Oct. 14, 2017. Additionally, UMass and Florida International University (FIU) have agreed to play a game at FIU in Miami, Florida, on Sat., Dec. 2, 2017.

UMass and USF will complete the postponed contest at USF on a to-be-determined date during the 2022 or 2023 seasons. The UMass-USF game in Massachusetts slated for the 2018 season remains unaffected by these scheduling changes.

The UMass-FIU contest on Dec. 2, 2017 will be the 12th for both teams, as FIU previously cancelled its game against Indiana, originally slated for Sat., Sept. 16, 2017. FIU will return to UMass during the 2020 season on Oct. 24. Should FIU qualify for the C-USA Championship Game on Sat., Dec. 2, the 2017 UMass-FIU meeting will not be played. In this scenario, the 2020 UMass-FIU game is unaffected and UMass will travel to FIU during a future season following the 2020 meeting.

With these adjustments, the 2017 Massachusetts football schedule now features back-to-back bye weeks (Sat., Oct. 7 and Sat., Oct. 14). The updated slate gives the Minutemen three consecutive home games spanning the two-week break (Sat., Sept. 30 vs. Ohio; Sat., Oct. 21 vs. Georgia Southern and Sat., Oct. 28 vs. Appalachian State). The addition of the Sat., Dec. 2 game at FIU also creates a third bye week in the season as Massachusetts has a one-week break between the Sat., Nov. 18 game at BYU and traveling to FIU for Sat., Dec. 2.

LOS QUATRO CAPITANES

UMass features three permanent captains and one individual-game captain in 2017. The three permanent team captains are **Adam Breneman**, **Steve Casali** and **Shane Huber**. **Da'Sean Downey** served as the rotating fourth team captain in all but two games, during which **Jesse Monteiro** (at Coastal Carolina) and **Ray Thomas-Ishman, Sr.** (at Temple) filled the role.

10TH SEASON AT MASSACHUSETTS // 20TH AS COLLEGIATE HEAD COACH // BROWN, 1979

Mark Whipple, the architect of one of the University of Massachusetts football program's most successful eras, was named the team's head coach on Jan. 14, 2014. He was previously at the helm of the Minuteman program from 1998-2003 when he led the Minutemen to the NCAA I-AA National Championship in his first year while making two more postseason appearances in the following five years.

Whipple enters his 10th season at the helm of the program in 2017 and 20th year overall as a collegiate head coach. He begins the year three victories shy of becoming the all-time winningest head coach in UMass football history.

Whipple is the second head coach of the program during the Football Bowl Subdivision at UMass. He is the fourth of the Minutemen's 29 all-time coaches to serve multiple tenures.

A 30-year coaching veteran of the collegiate and professional levels, Whipple is widely regarded for his prowess as an offensive coordinator and his ability to develop quarterbacks. He helped Ben Roethlisberger of the NFL's Pittsburgh Steelers win a Super Bowl in his second year, built the University of Miami's 2009 and 2010 offenses into two of its best all-time and his teams set 40 offensive records while at UMass.

"Sometimes, you need to go away to find out where your home is and I have found it," said Whipple during his introductory press conference. "I can make a bigger impact than I have ever made in my life with people young, old and in between at the University of Massachusetts and that's what I am really excited about. I believe in this place and it hit me after the interview when I drove around campus and then got out and walked. This is a special place and I will represent this University better than I ever have. I am trying to do it better than anyone ever has. People ask me, 'Why would you leave the NFL?' They haven't been to UMass. They haven't been to the University of Massachusetts."

Whipple wealth of experience as a head coach helped him to a 129-87 overall record, including a 57-54 mark at UMass. His coaching resume includes a National Coach of the Year award (1998), Division I-AA National Championship (1998), a Brown Athletic Hall of Fame induction (1996), an NFL Super Bowl Championship (2006) and a pair of collegiate bowl game appearances (2009, 2010).

"We are thrilled to welcome back one of the greatest coaches in the 135-year history of UMass football," said UMass Amherst Chancellor Kumble R. Subbaswamy. "Coach Whipple is committed to fostering a positive environment in which our student-athletes will thrive both athletically and academically. His passion for the flagship campus and his drive for excellence have already earned the support of alumni, faculty, students and fans. I am confident that, under Coach Whipple's leadership, Minuteman football will continue to improve and will excel at the FBS level."

Whipple coached with the Cleveland Browns from 2011-12, where he served as the team's quarterbacks coach. He worked with second-year quarterback Colt McCoy (2011) and rookie Brandon Weeden (2012) within the Browns' West Coast offensive scheme.

His most recent collegiate stop was at the University of Miami as the assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2009 and 2010 seasons. During his time in Coral Gables, he guided the explosive Hurricane offense during two of the best statistical seasons in program history. Both years featured total yardage in excess of 5,000 yards with 2010's total of 5,483 standing as the third-most in program history.

In 2009, Whipple led Miami to its best offensive season since the national-title contending 2002 team. The Hurricanes put up 5,199 yards of offense becoming just the eighth team in school history to eclipse the 5,000-yard mark in total yards gained. Under Whipple's tutelage, quarterback Jacory Harris totaled the second-most pass completions (249), fourth-most passing yards (3,352) and sixth-most touchdowns (24) in a single season at Miami.

The 2010 Miami squad posted the fourth-best total rushing yardage in program history with 2,372 on the ground. Damien Berry led a stable of tailbacks with 899 yards and five touchdowns. The group overall averaged 182.5 yards on the ground per game with an average of 4.8 per carry.

Whipple spent the 2008 season as an offensive assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles, helping the team to an appearance in the NFC Championship game. Before joining the Eagles, he served as the quarterbacks coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers from 2004-06 where he was instrumental in the development of Roethlisberger, who became the youngest starting quarterback to win a Super Bowl as a rookie. In 2004, Roethlisberger became the first NFL quarterback to finish a season undefeated with a 13-0 record in games he started.

Prior to his move to the NFL, Whipple spent 16 years as a collegiate head coach. In addition to his time at UMass, Whipple also led the Brown and New Haven programs.

At every stop in his college coaching career, the trademark of a Whipple team was a high-powered offense. His UMass teams rewrote the program's record book, setting more than 40 team records. In 1998, his national championship team posted school records in points scored (524), touchdowns (73), total yards (7,074), passing yards (4,050), completions (306) and first downs (354).

During his first tenure at UMass, Whipple posted a 49-26 (.653) record in six years (1998-2003), leading the Minutemen to a Division I-AA National Championship in his first season with the team in 1998. He also won three Atlantic 10 Conference Championships. He was named the American Football Coaches Association's GTE Division I-AA National Coach of the Year, while also receiving National Coach of the Year honors from Don Hansen's Football Gazette and finished runner-up for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented by The Sports Network.

In addition, Whipple was named the Scotty Whitelaw Division I-AA Coach of the Year by the New York Metropolitan Football Writers Association, and earned AFCA/GTE Region I Coach of the Year honors. In 2003, he earned Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors. He was selected as the New England Coach of the Year by the New England Football Writers and the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston in both 1998 and 2003. He posted five winning seasons in only six years as head coach with 17 different players earning all-America honors.

Whipple took over a program which finished 2-9 in 1997 and had won just 19 games in the previous four seasons combined before his arrival. He immediately brought unparalleled success to the Minutemen under his leadership, with a national title, three conference championships, consecutive NCAA I-AA playoff appearances for the first time ever and three NCAA berths overall in his six seasons on the sideline.

Introduced as the 26th coach in UMass history by then-athletic director Bob Marcum on Dec. 16, 1997, Whipple-coached teams posted a .500-or-better record 14 times. No UMass football coach reached the 20-win plateau faster than Whipple, who also owns five of the school's 11 all-time postseason victories.

In Whipple's rookie season at UMass, the Minutemen won a then school-record 12 games (broken by the 2006 NCAA national runner-up team) en route to the 1998 NCAA Division I-AA championship. UMass posted a record six victories over ranked opponents in 1998, including a 55-43 triumph over top-ranked and previously unbeaten Georgia Southern in the 1998 NCAA Championship game.

The Minutemen followed up Whipple's first campaign with another outstanding season in 1999. Armed with a lofty preseason ranking, UMass rebounded from a 1-3 start, posted a 9-4 record and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA playoffs.
