GAME OF STEALS

Saturday's showdown features two of the SEC's best teams when it comes to steals.

Mississippi State leads the league with its 9.5 steals per game and is 10th nationally. Ole Miss is fifth at 7.5.

Craig Sword ranks 5th at 1.9 after he collected three at Kentucky on Wednesday.

SCORER'S HIGHLIGHTED TOO

This rivalry matchup also features two of the league's Top 15 scorers. Jarvis Summers is 8th at 17.5, while MSU's **Craig Sword** is 11th at 4.6.

Marshall Henderson is 4th at 18.8, but the senior guard is suspended for the game.

TAIL OF TWO GAMES

Against Maryland Eastern Shore, Mississippi State was whistled for a season low seven fouls and had no one to foul out.

But against Kentucky, it was a different story.

The Bulldogs had 22 fouls, the second highest of the year, with senior forward **Colin Borchert** fouling out.

IMPROVED FREE THROW SHOOTING

In its first 11 games of the season, Mississippi State was shooting just 63.0 percent at the foul line. But in the last three games, the Bulldogs have improved drastically, connecting on 75.0 percent of their attempts.

YEAR TWO MORE SMOOTH FOR SWORD

Through the first 14 games, sophomore guard Craig Sword has established himself as one of the top players in the SEC.

He's 11th in the SEC in scoring (14.6) and fifth in steals (1.9). He's also third in the league with his .558 shooting percentage.

SCOUTING OLE MISS

The Rebels come to Starkville sporting a 10-4 record after opening SEC play on Thursday with a 65-62 home win against Auburn.

The game featured 10 ties and 11 lead changes.

Derrick Millinghaus paced Ole Miss, which led 31-28 at the break, with 16 points, while Jarvis Summers totaled 14 points and dished out 3 assists

The Rebels were 23-of-53 shooting and collected 10 steals.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES

On the year, MSU has totaled seven double-doubles, led by **Gavin Ware** with five. Last year, the Bulldogs had just four.

2013-14 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

JOHNSON DRAWS FIRST START

■ Junior forward Roquez Johnson earned his first start of the season against Southeastern Louisiana, but was limited to just 10 minutes after straining his knee if the first half. He finished with 6 points and 3 boards.

He saw limited time vs. Florida A&M off the bench (4 minutes) and had two rebounds.

Against Florida Gulf Coast, though he totaled 24 minutes off the bench and finished with 10 points and eight rebounds.

MSU IMPRESSIVE AT FREE THROW LINE

■ Against Florida A&M earlier this year, Mississippi State drained 33 of its 45 free throw attempts.

The 45 attempts were the most since attempting 45 vs. Arkansas on Feb. 27, 2002, while the 33 made shots were the most since connecting on 33 against Arkansas State on Dec. 8, 2001.

Because of the many free throw attempts, the 20 made field goals tied for the fewest this year (Jackson State).

TWO TOTAL 20 IN ONE GAME, AGAIN

■ Against Maryland Easteron Shore, Colin Borchert scored 22 points while Gavin Ware added 21. It was the second time this seson MSU had two players score 20-plus points.

Against Loyola, **Craig Sword** had 24 points while **Roquez Johnson** finished with 20.

Prior to this year, the last time MSU had two players score 20-plus points in the same game was at Vanderbilt on Jan. 21, 2012, when Dee Bost had 24 points and Arnett Moultrie totaled 21

SWORD HONORED AGAIN

■ Back in December **Craig Sword** was the Co-SEC Player of the Week, marking the third time in his career he has been honored by the SEC. Last year, the Montgomery, Ala., native was named the SEC Freshman of the Week twice.

SWORD, JOHNSON REPRESENTING

■ First, Craig Sword and Roquez Johnson were teammates at Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala., where they won a state championship together.

Now, the two are in the Top 5 at MSU in scoring as Sword is tops 14.6 points and Johnson fourth at 9.2.

Sword had a season-high 24 points against Loyola and TCU, while Johnson has scored in double-digits eight of State's 14 games. Against Loyola, he had career highs in points (20) and rebounds (11).

OVERTIME AFFAIRS

■ The Loyola game marked the 104th in MSU history and the Bulldogs are 57-47 and 2-1 under Rick Ray, MSU is 2-1.

The team the Bulldogs have played the most is Alabama at 12 (6-6).

SECOND-HALF SCORING UP

■ In nine of Mississippi State's 14 games this season, it has scored more points in the second half

In the first half, the Dogs are averaging 32.6 points, compared to 37.7 in the second half.

POINT PRODUCTION HIGH VS MVSU

■ The 94 points scored against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 19 were the second most in the Rick Ray era.

The most came against New Orleans a year ago when the Bulldogs totaled 97.

BULLDOGS ANNOUNCE NEW SIGNEES

■ In November, Rick Ray announced the signing of three future Bulldogs – Demetrius Hous-

ton, Oliver Black, and Maurice Dunlap II.

Houston is a 6-foot-7 forward out of Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala., the same high school that produced current Bulldogs **Craig Sword** and **Roquez Johnson**. Black is a power forward from Jackson who is currently at IMG Academy in Florida, while Dunlap is a guard from Amanda Elzy High in Greenwood.

BULLDOGS 2013-14 ROSTER FEATURES FEW NEW FACES

■ The Bulldogs roster features just one new scholarship player eligible for this season - freshman point guard I.J. Ready.

The Bulldogs also signed Fallou Ndoye, but he is redshirting this season.

Back from injury, though, are redshirt freshman Dre Applewhite and Jacoby Davis, who missed all of last year due to injuries.

BULLDOGS IN THE NBA

■ MSU currently has one player on an NBA roster — Arnett Moultrie.

Moultrie is with the Philadelphia 76ers but is out with an ankle injury until January.

Jarvis Varnado, who was with the Miami Heat during their championship run last year, is with the lowa Energy of the NBADL.

APPLEWHITE DECIDES TO TRANSER

■ On Monday, Mississippi State coach Rick Ray announced that redshirt freshman guard Dre Applewhite has decided to transfer.

The Memphis native appeared in all 12 games for MSU, drawing six starts

He averaged 5.5 points and 3.9 rebounds.

Head Coach Rick Ray

- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team — Gavin Ware and Craig Sword



- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament – Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- While at Purdue, Ray was an assistant with second-year Tennessee coach Cuonzo Martin.
- The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.





Mississippi State played one of its best first halves of the season but it was not enough to lift the Bulldogs past No. 14 Kentucky, which claimed an 85-63 win.

MSU scored the game's first five points and quickly built a 12-2 lead with less than five minutes played. Overplaying the passing lanes and forcing turnovers, the Bulldogs played spirited.

Kentucky was still down 10 at 18-8 before fighting back with 14-2 run for its first lead at 22-20 on two free throws by Dominique Hawkins with 7:25 left in the half.

Not deterred, the Bulldogs quickly fought back and took a six point lead by scoring six points on one possession. Roquez Johnson dunked and drew a flagrant foul. Playing for Johnson, Colin Borchert hit both free throws. Jacoby Davis followed with a layup for a 34-28 lead with 3:12 left in the half.

Trivante Bloodman scored as the half expired to push the MSU advantage to 40-37 at half-time.

In the second half, MSU trailed 54-51 with 13:11 left to play after a basket by Johnson. The Bulldogs then missed seven straight shots from the field as the Wildcats seized control with a game-changing 20-2 run.

Craig Sword led MSU with 19 points, while Bloodman had 13 points and Johnson had 12 points. Ware pulled down 10 rebounds in 24 minutes of action.
