

### SHOOTING FREE THROWS

Mississippi State's aggressiveness on offense and ability to drive to the basket against Ole Miss gave the Bulldogs ample opportunities at the free throw line.

MSU connected on 28 of its 42 attempts. It was the second most in both categories this year, as it was 33 of 45 against Florida A&M.

The Bulldogs had 30 more attempts than Ole Miss, also the secondlargest margin this season (33 vs. the Rattlers).

### IMPROVED FREE THROW SHOOTING TOO

In its first 11 games of the season, Mississippi State was shooting just 63.0 percent at the foul line. But in the last three games, the Bulldogs have improved drastically, connecting on 70.5 percent of their attempts.

### YEAR TWO MORE SMOOTH FOR SWORD

Through the first 15 games, sophomore guard Craig Sword has established himself as one of the top players in the SEC.

He's 11th in the SEC in scoring (14.7) and fifth in steals (2.3). He's also fourth in the league with his .531 shooting percentage.

### SCOUTING ALABAMA

Alabama welcomes MSU with a 7-8 record and 1-1 mark in SEC play after losing at Georgia on Saturday, 66-58.

The game featured five ties and three lead changes.

Trevor Releford paced the Tide, which trailed 34-23 at the break, with 17 points, while Rodney Cooper totaled 15 points and dished out 3 assists to go along with his 3 steals.

Bama was 19-of-52 shooting and lost the battle of the boards, 41-32.

### 2013-14 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

### **JOHNSON DRAWS FIRST START**

■ Junior forward Roquez Johnson earned his first start of the season against Southeastern Louisiana, but was limited to just 10 minutes after straining his knee if the first half. He finished : with 6 points and 3 boards.

He saw limited time vs. Florida A&M off the bench (4 minutes) and had two rebounds.

Against Florida Gulf Coast, though he totaled 24 minutes off the bench and finished with 10 points and eight rebounds.

### MSU IMPRESSIVE AT FREE THROW LINE

■ Against Florida A&M earlier this year, Mississippi State drained 33 of its 45 free throw attempts.

The 45 attempts were the most since attempting 45 vs. Arkansas on Feb. 27, 2002, while the 33 made shots were the most since connecting on 33 against Arkansas State on Dec. 8, 2001.

Because of the many free throw attempts, the 20 made field goals tied for the fewest this year (Jackson State).

#### TWO TOTAL 20 IN ONE GAME, AGAIN

■ Against Maryland Eastern Shore, Colin Borchert scored 22 points while Gavin Ware added 21. It was the second time this season MSU had two players score 20-plus points.

Against Loyola, Craig Sword had 24 points while Roquez Johnson finished with 20.

Prior to this year, the last time MSU had two players score 20-plus points in the same game was at Vanderbilt on Jan. 21, 2012, when Dee Bost had 24 points and Arnett Moultrie totaled

### **SWORD HONORED AGAIN**

■ Back in December Craig Sword was the Co-SEC Player of the Week, marking the third time in his career he has been honored by the SEC.

Last year, the Montgomery, Ala., native was named the SEC Freshman of the Week twice.

### SWORD, JOHNSON REPRESENTING

■ First, Craig Sword and Roquez Johnson were teammates at Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala., where they won a state championship together.

Now, the two are in the Top 5 at MSU in scoring as Sword is tops 14.7 points and Johnson fourth at 9.9.

Sword had a season-high 24 points against Loyola and TCU, while Johnson has scored in double-digits nine of State's 14 games. Against Ole Miss on Saturday, he tied his career-high with 20 points.

#### **OVERTIME AFFAIRS**

■ The Loyola game marked the 104th in MSU history and the Bulldogs are 57-47 and 2-1 under Rick Ray, MSU is 2-1.

The team the Bulldogs have played the most is Alabama at 12 (6-6).

#### SECOND-HALF SCORING UP

■ In nine of Mississippi State's 15 games this season, it has scored more points in the second

In the first half, the Dogs are averaging 33.3 points, compared to 37.4 in the second half.

### POINT PRODUCTION HIGH VS MVSU

■ The 94 points scored against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 19 were the second most in the Rick Ray era.

The most came against New Orleans a year ago when the Bulldogs totaled 97.

### **BULLDOGS ANNOUNCE NEW SIGNEES**

■ In November, Rick Ray announced the signing of three future Bulldogs - Demetrius Houston, Oliver Black, and Maurice Dunlap II.

Houston is a 6-foot-7 forward out of Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala., the same high school that produced current Bulldogs Craig Sword and Roquez Johnson. Black is a power forward from Jackson who is currently at IMG Academy in Florida, while Dunlap is a guard from Amanda Elzy High in Greenwood.

#### **BULLDOGS 2013-14 ROSTER FEATURES FEW NEW FACES**

■ The Bulldogs roster features just one new scholarship player eligible for this season freshman point guard I.J. Ready.

The Bulldogs also signed Fallou Ndoye and Travis (joined MSU in December) last spring, but both are redshirting this season.

Back from injury, though, is redshirt freshman Jacoby Davis, who missed all of last year due to injuries.

#### **BULLDOGS IN THE NBA**

■ MSU currently has one player on an NBA roster - Arnett Moultrie.

Moultrie is with the Philadelphia 76ers but is out with an ankle injury until January.





MSU scored the game's first five points and never trailed in the contest. The Bulldogs shot 51.7 percent from the floor and used its significant height advantage to post plus-11 rebounding advantage against the Division II

In his MSU point guard debut, I.J. Ready had a solid start. In 22 minutes of play, Ready scored only two points but was credited with four assists and two steals, with only one turn-

For the contest, the Bulldogs shot better than 50 percent each half and hit 42.9 percent from 3-point range. Borchert led the offensive attack with an 8-for-9 night from the field and a 5-of-6 night from the free throw line.

Ware, a sophomore from Starkville, scored 10 points and collected a game-high 12 rebounds for the double-double.

The Bulldogs used defensive pressure to key a 12-2 run early. A free throw by Ware capped the run and pushed the MSU advantage to 21-10 with 8:49 left in the half. AUM hit a couple of 3-point baskets to fight back within 12.

Leading 33-19, MSU ended the half with an 11-3 run for a 44-22 halftime advantage.

The Bulldogs continued the strong offensive play to start the second half, as the lead was quickly pushed out to 56-24 at the first media timeout of the second half.

MSU held a 42-31 rebounding advantage.

Leading 62-55, the Bulldogs followed a timeout with three straight defensive turnovers and three baskets on the other end for a gameclinching 7-0 run.

MSU scored the game's first five points and held a sizeable lead throughout the contest. A layup by Johnson capped an 11-2 run and extended the lead to 18-9. Prairie View closed within five at 22-17 only to see more full-court pressure lead to a 7-1 run and a 29-18 lead for the Bulldoas.

That last spurt helped push MSU to a 38-28 lead at the intermission.

MSU extended the lead to 45-29 on an oldfashioned 3-point play by Ware. Still, the Panthers had a couple of strong offensive possessions where they beat the Bulldogs back down the court to stay in the contest.

A 3-point basket by Montrael Scott whittled the lead to 62-55 before the game-decisive run. That run included a layup by Trivante Bloodman, a 3-pointer by Ready and a layup by Colin Borchert.

MSU held a 51-27 rebounding advantage.

The Bulldogs stretched the first-half lead to as many as 10 and led 29-20 at the intermission

In the first half, MSU held a plus-eight rebounding advantage and only committed three fouls. MSU only shot 39.4 percent from the field but took advantage of its size and offensive productivity to build the lead.

In the second half, a 9-0 run by MSU stretched the lead to 45-27. A 3-point basket by Thomas capped that run with 14:48 left in the contest.

The Bulldogs led by 19 a couple of minutes later. UMES cut the lead to 10 with seven straight points and later got within nine twice after a flurry of late 3-point baskets.

MSU held a 43-29 rebounding advantage.
