10 KEY THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING VANDERBILT

- Mississippi State has won eight of the last 12 in this series, including eight in a row in Starkville and 10 out of the last 11. Vanderbilt last won in Starkville in 1993, 80-39.
- ▼ The Commodores mark the first ranked team MSU has played this season. Last year, the Bulldogs were 2-4 against ranked opponents. Thursday marks the sixth time under Rick Stansbury MSU has faced a ranked Vanderbilt team, with the 'Dores winning three of those outings.
- Rick Stansbury-coached teams are 35-38 all-time against teams from the Eastern Division in the regular season and 45-46 overall. In the last four years, MSU is 16-10 versus the East, including action in the SEC Tournament.
- Against Georgia, MSU was out-rebounded 48-23, marking the largest margin on the boards since being out-rebounded by Kentucky last February at the Hump, 52-35.
- The 23 rebounds tied for the fewest in SEC play with Rick Stansbury at the helm. Last year against Florida in the SEC Tournament, MSU also had 23. However, the two of fensive boards marked the fewest for MSU under Stansbury, while the fewest total rebounds came in the 2002 NCAA Tournament against Texas, 22.
- → MSU has reached eight losses in 18 games for the first time under Rick Stansbury.
- With 13 points against Georgia, senior guard Ravern Johnson continues to rank 17th all-time in school history with 1,277 points, 23 behind Timmy Bowers for 16th most.
- Junior guard Dee Bost is now 72 points shy of becoming the 33rd player in school history to score 1,000 for a career. He also has 370 assists, the 6th most in school history.
- Georgia's 57.9 percent (11 of 19) accuracy from 3-point range was the highest vs. MSU this year.
- MSU's 15.1 fouls a game ranks as the 10th fewest in the country.

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this season's 8-6 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 142-49 (.744) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 132-39 (.772) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 208-34 (6-3) when leading at halftime; 150-34 (5-1) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 223-69 (9-2 this year) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 208-75 (8-2) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 160-30 (7-2) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

JANUARY RECORD UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 4-3 mark, coupled with this year's 2-2 record, the Bulldogs are 51-44 (.537) in the month of January since **Rick Stansbury** was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 94-84 (.528) in January.

Against Ole Miss, the Bulldogs snapped a three-game losing skid in the month of January, dating back to last season.

JANUARY SEC ROAD RECORD UNDER STANSBURY

Last year in January, the Bulldogs' posted a 1-2 record on the road in SEC play, defeating Ole Miss before losing at Alabama and Arkansas. This year, MSU is 1-1 with the win at Ole Miss and loss at Georgia.

In the 13 years with Rick Stansbury at the helm, his teams have compiled a 16-30 (1-1 this year) ledger in January on the road in league play.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In 18 games this year, the Bulldogs are nearly on the same pace, having drained 134 of their 401 attempts for an 7.4 average.

Last year, **Ravern Johnson** led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 in 2008-09, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

Johnson is nearly on the same pace from a year ago. Through 17 games, he is 49 of 135 beyond the arc.

1.000 POINT CLUB WELCOMES NEWEST MEMBER

It didn't take **Ravern Johnson** long to reach one of the biggest milestones in his career — becoming the 32nd member of the 1,000-point club.

In the season opener against Tennessee State, the senior from Lyon, Miss., scored 32 points to give him exactly 1,000 for his career. Following his 13-point effort against Georgia, he now has 1,277 for his career to rank 17th all-time, as he passed Jack Bouldin (1970-72) against Auburn on Jan. 16.

Ahead of him in 16th place is Timmy Bowers (2001-04) with 1,300 points, while Rich Knarr (1973-76) is 15th with 1,305 points.

NUMBERS TELL THE STORY FOR JOHNSON

 A month ago, senior guard Ravern Johnson led the SEC with 3-pointers made and percentage.

But after going 15-for-63 shooting in the last ninegames, he now ranks in the No. 15 in accuracy. However, he's second in 3-pointers made (2.9).

SEEING PLENTY OF GAME ACTION

Logging minutes isn't an issue for MSU players.

The Bulldogs and Kentucky are the only SEC teams with two starters averaging more than 32.0 minutes an outing.

Ravern Johnson leads the SEC with his 35.9 minutes, while **Riley Benock** is fifth at 33.5.

Kodi Augustus is close to cracking the Top 10 with his 30.5 average.

19 AND COUNTING FOR JOHNSON

 During his career, Ravern Johnson has made four or more 3-pointers in a game 21 times, including the five he made against Nicholls State on Dec. 13.

His best outing came last November against Troy, when he hit seven to spark a come-from-behind win in OT despite traily by as many as 11 points in the second half.

MEET THE HEAD COACH



onsistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 13-year coaching record of 265-148 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons an another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 13-4 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's first 12 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 156-40 (.796) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 72-26 (.735) SEC mark and a 84-14 (.857) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 362-138 (.724) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

BULLDOGS TAKE ADVANTAGE OF EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

STARKVILLE, Miss. - Mississippi State's 2010-11 signing class got off to a resounding start with the signing of wings Rodney Hood and D.J. Gardner and point guard Deville Smith.

All three were named to the Clarion Ledger's prestigious Dandy Dozen, and all three are considered Top 100 players overall nationally.

The 6-foot-8, 180-pound Hood, a two-time Mississippi player of the year, averaged 22.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists last year as a junior and scored a record 34 points in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game. He led the Wildcats to a 26-7 record en route to advancing to the Class 6A championship game.

Listed as a five-start recruit, Rivals.com rates him as the 21st best player overall nationally, while ESPN has him at No. 30, followed by Scout.com at No. 49.

Joining Hood is his AAU teammate, Smith, a 5-11, 160-pound guard out of Callaway.

As a junior, Smith led his team to a secondstraight Class 5A crown and averaged 22.4 points, 4.0 steals and 3.5 assists. He hit the game-winning shot against Provine at the buzzer to win the championship, while scoring a career-high 48 points against New Hope in the North 5A finals.

Rated as a 4-star recruit, he's listed as the 40th best overall player in the country by ESPN and 63rd best by Rivals.com.

Rounding out the early signing period class is Okolona's D.J. Gardner, who is noted for his long-range shooting

The 6-7, 195-pound standout totaled 24.2 points, 11.1 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.4 steals a contest as the Chieftains posted a 25-6 ledger and advanced to the North 1A semifinals. His season-high of 40 points came against Ingomar. They finished the season ranked No. 5 in the Class 1A rankings.


