WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS TEXAS A&M . . .

- ✓ Wednesday is just the fourth meeting between the two schools, the first as SEC foes.
- ✓ MSU has won the last two in the series, with the Aggies last win coming in 1964.
- ✓ Both teams are looking to snap season-long, four-game losing streaks.
- ✓ The Bulldogs are looking to avoid a 2-5 SEC start for the first time since starting 2-5 in 2007.
- ✓ Against Florida, the 35-point loss was the second-highest margin in Humphrey Coliseum history, with the 41-point setback (80-39, 1993) to Vanderbilt being the largest. The win for Florida was also its largest in Starkville.
- ✓ Overall, the 35-point loss to Florida tied for the 19th largest in school history.
- ✓ Mississippi State has now dropped back-to-back games at Humphrey Coliseum by 30-plus points for the first time (Florida 35 and Alabama 32) since the doors opened in 1975.
- ✓ On the year, MSU is now 0-10 when trailing at the half and 0-8 when opponents shoot 45 percent or better from the floor.
- ✓ After committing a season-high 29 turnovers at Arkansas, MSU had a season-low 10 against Florida.
- ✓ Freshman guard **Fred Thomas** had seven steals vs. Florida, which tied with three other players for the second most in school history. Twice Garry Hooker had 8 in the 1975-76 season.
- ✓ In the MSU freshman record books, **Fred Thomas'** 29 made 3-pointers are tied for 7th most, while **Craig Sword's** 35 steals are tied for 6th most and **Thomas'** 34 steals are tied for 7th most.
- ✓ Of the 10 players that have seen action this year, nine have started at least four games.
- ✓ Due to injuries, MSU has lost freshmen **Andre Applewhite** (ACL) and **Jacoby Davis** (ACL) for the year. Senior forward **Wendell Lewis** is out indefinitely with a fractured right patella.

Wednesday marks just the fourth meeting between Mississippi State and Texas A&M, with the Bulldogs holding a 2-1 advantage.

The Aggies lone win came in 1964, while MSU claimed a 69-60 win last year in New York at the 2K Classic.

JANUARY RECORD LAST 25 YEARS

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 101-92 (.523) in January. Last year, MSU was 4-3 in January.

SCOUTING TEXAS A&M

Texas A&M fell to 12-7 on the year and dropped its fourth-straight game with a 59-52 home loss to Georgia

At the half, the Aggies trailed 27-23.

On the night, TAMU was 17-49 shooting, 6-16 beyond the arc.

Defensively, the Aggies saw Georgia make 19 of its 44 shots and make 8 of its 18 attempts from 3-point range. The Bulldogs also won the battle of the boards, 32-31.

Elston Turner totaled a team-high 19 points, while Rabyon Harris added 13.

On the boards, Kourtney Roberson had 6 points.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MSU . . .

Mississippi State dropped its fourth-straight league game with an 82-47 setback against No. 7 Florida at Humphrey Coliseum.

Down 41-19 at the break, the Bulldogs trailed by as many as 36 points in the second half.

MSU was 17-52 shooting and 10-15 at the foul line.

The Gators, on the other hand, were 31-56 shooting and 14-31 beyond the arc.

Florida also won the battle of the boards, 44-20.

Fred Thomas paced MSU with a career-high 19 points, while Gavin Ware and Colin Borchert each added 10.

Thomas also had a career-best 7 steals, the second most by any MSU player in a single game. Craig Sword, who had three assists, collected 5 steals.

LACK OF INEXPERIENCE SEEN IN MINUTES

Back from last year's squad is a total of four players that combined to average 46.9 minutes. Included in that mix are Jalen Steele (24.5 minutes) and Wendell Lewis (19.4).

Steele missed eight games due to injury, while Lewis is now out indefinitely with a fractured right patella.

RECENT REBOUNDING WOES AT THE HUMP

In its last two games at Humphrey Coliseum, the Bulldogs have managed just 43 rebounds, including the 20 they hauled in against Florida to mark the lowest output and the largest margin (minus-24) of the season.

It's the fewest rebounds MSU has hauled since grabbing 22 against East Tennessee State in a 63-62 loss on Dec. 11, 2010, and the largest margin since LSU outrebounded the Bulldogs 44-24 (minus-20) in a 81-57 loss on Jan. 21, 2009. The last time MSU had just 20 rebounds was at Vanderbilt on Jan. 17, 1998, in a 77-73 loss.

2012-13 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

INJURY BUG HAS SHOWN NO MERCY, WITH LEWIS BEING THE LATEST VICTIM

■ On Dec. 12, senior forward Wendell Lewis suffered a fractured right patella, an injury that will sideline him indefinitely following surgery back in December.

In his last two games, the Selma, Ala., native was averaging 18 points and had a career-high 20 points against Texas-San Antonio.

It was a continuation of a rash of injuries that started back in July.

Incoming freshmen guards Jacoby Davis and DeAndre Applewhite are out for the entire season after tearing their ACLs.

Applewhite's setback, which also includes a torn meniscus, happened in early November, while Davis' injury occurred back in July.

Davis was Rick Ray's first signee and he came to MSU after averaging 21 points and 5 assists at St. John's Military Academy in Wisconsin. Applewhite came to MSU following a stellar career in Memphis.

The good news is Jalen Steele returned to action against Alabama A&M after fracturing his wrist in the second game against Florida Atlantic and responded with 10 points.

BIG NIGHT ON THE BOARDS VS. ASU

■ Against Alcorn State on Nov. 27, MSU held a plus-30 rebounding margin (50-20).

That was the highest margin since being plus-32 (55-23) against Arkansas-Little Rock on Dec. 11, 2004.

JOHNSON'S DEFENSIVE INTENSITY

■ Sophomore forward Roquez Johnson had one of the best defensive efforts by any MSU player for several years against Texas in the Maui Invitational.

The Montgomery, Ala., native collected a game-high 6 steals and became the first Bulldog player to have that many since Phil Turner had the same against South Carolina on Feb. 18, 2009.

Against Florida, Fred Thomas surpassed that total with 7 steals.

BULLDOGS FINISH 0-3 IN MAUI

■ Thanksgiving week, Mississippi State traveled across the Pacific to play in the prestigious Maui Invitational where it went 0-3 with losses to perennial powers North Carolina, Marquette and Texas.

In the three contests, the Bulldogs were 54-

163 shooting from the floor and 11-40 beyond the arc. In addition, opponents won the battle of the boards, 126-108.

State also had 61 turnovers and forced 48. The Bulldogs were credited with 22 steals.

Roquez Johnson led MSU with 15.3 points while Fred Thomas averaged 11.3.

LEWIS, WARE NEARLY PERFECT

■ Against Texas-San Antonio, Wendell Lewis connected on 8 of his 9 field goals (.889), the best shooting percentage since Rodney Hood was 8 of 9 last year against UT-Martin.

Prior to that, the highest percentage (with 8 minimum attempts) was Jarvis Varnado's 8-of-8 outing in the season opener against Rider on 11-13-09.

Then against Central Arkansas, Gavin Ware matched those numbers with his own 8-9 outing en route to a career-high 22 points.

BULLDOGS OPENED TROY'S NEW ARENA

■ The season opener between Mississippi State and Troy on Nov. 9 marked the grand opening of Trojan Arena, Troy's new \$40 million basketball facility.

Historical matchups such as these are not uncommon for MSU.

While they weren't debuts, MSU has been a part of two games that closed out arenas.

The first came in 1976, when the Bulldogs lost 94-93 in overtime to Kentucky at Memorial Coliseum. Then in 2002, MSU defeated South Carolina 64-57 in the final game at Carolina Coliseum.

FREE THROW STREAK ENDS FOR STEELE

■ After making 30-straight free throws dating back to last season, the streak ended Jan. 12 at Georgia.

After making his first of two free throws with 54 seconds left, he missed his second.

His last miss came with 5:13 to play against Northwestern State on Dec. 22, 2011.

BULLDOGS 2012-13 ROSTER**FEATURES A LOT OF NEW FACES**

■ The Bulldogs opened the regular season at Troy with seven new players.

Only five players return from last year's squad that posted 21 wins, a total that includes walk-ons Baxter Price and Tyson Cunningham. The other three returnees are Wendell Lewis, Roquez Johnson and Jalen Steele.

Of the seven newcomers this season, five are freshmen.

LONG-TIME TEAMMATES

■ Craig Sword and Roquez Johnson are more than just college teammates. The two prepped together at G.W. Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala., as well.

In back-to-back seasons, they advanced to the semifinals and championship games of the state playoffs.

NBA DRAFT TAKES ARNETT MOULTRIE

■ This past June, Arnett Moultrie became the second MSU player to be drafted in the NBA in the last three years.

Moultrie, an All-SEC standout who played at Mississippi State just one season after transferring from UTEP, was the 27th overall pick by the Miami Heat. However, moments after the selection, the Heat traded the Memphis native to Philadelphia.

Moultrie was the first MSU player taken in the first round since 1996, when Erick Dampier (Indiana, 10th) and Dontae' Jones (New York, 21st) were both drafted.

STREAK ENDS AT 262

■ Mississippi State's streak of 262-consecutive games with a made 3-pointer ended on Jan. 9 against South Carolina.

The Bulldogs were 0-10 beyond the arc.

Prior to then, the last time MSU failed to connect from long range was Jan. 18, 2005, at Alabama in a 98-49 setback.

SIGNING DAY/MSU BY THE NUMBERS

Bulldogs Land Three Standouts In Early Signing Period

STARKVILLE, Miss. – First year Mississippi State coach Rick Ray took advantage of the early signing period and landed three outstanding players who are expected to contribute immediately next season — Imara “I.J.” Ready, Travis Daniels and Fallou Ndoye.

Ready is a 5-foot-11 guard out of Little Rock whose high school coach Al Flanigan is the father of MSU assistant Wes Flanigan, while Daniels is a forward at Shelton State. Ndoye, a native of Senegal, is a 6-11 forward currently at Findley College Prep School in Las Vegas.

“First of all, I want to commend my staff for putting together a terrific recruiting class,” Ray said. “Wes, George (Brooks), and Chris (Hollender) all played significant roles in us recruiting and landing these outstanding student-athletes. It is rare in this business that you identify your top targets and are able to recruit and sign those same top targets, and my staff was successful in getting it done.”

IMARA READY

Ready has led Parkview Magnet High School to back-to-back Arkansas 6A State Championship titles the last two years. In the 2012 title game, he paced Parkview with 21 points, five assists and four steals in a 69-65 double-overtime victory.

As a junior, Ready averaged 20.1 points, 5.2 assists and four steals. A year earlier, Ready registered 17 points, seven assists and five rebounds a contest as a sophomore.

During the summer of 2012, Ready played for coach Billy Ingram’s Arkansas Hawks AAU program. The Hawks claimed runner-up honors at the prestigious Adidas Fab 48 in Las Vegas, while Ready averaged 25 points and seven assists during the summer.

Ready also held offers from Alabama, Nebraska, Oregon, Texas Tech

and Arkansas-Little Rock.

“He’s just a flat out winner,” Ray said. “I.J. has a competitive fire and spirit that will really help our team next year and for years to come. I am excited about the talent and intangibles he will provide for us. Our team will love playing with him because he is a consummate play maker.”

TRAVIS DANIELS

Daniels will add much needed experience to the young Bulldog squad.

During his freshman campaign at Shelton State, Daniels led coach Barry Mohun’s Buccaneers to a 28-4 record and a runner-up finish in the Alabama Community College Conference Tournament.

The 6-8 forward prepped at Russellville High School where he averaged a double-double his senior year. As a junior, he played at Woodrow Wilson High School, leading the team in points per game (18.8) and rebounds per game (3.0).

The Russellville, Ala., native selected the Bulldogs over Southern Miss, Western Kentucky and Wichita State.

“Travis is a young man that can dribble, pass, and shoot,” Ray said. “It seems simple but not many players at his size can do all three equally well. He is a jack of all trades that can play multiple positions and affect the game in many ways.”

FALLOU NDOYE

Ndoye is in his first year at Findley after spending last season at Faith Baptist in Brandon, Fla.

Through the first seven games, he’s averaged 7 points and 7 rebounds for a team that uses an 11-man rotation.

“Fallou was our No. 1 target in filling our frontcourt needs,” Ray said. “He has a long, big, active body that will continue to get better because he plays and works hard”

- ▶ On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- ▶ On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament — Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- ▶ As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- ▶ During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- ▶ All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- ▶ The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- ▶ While at Purdue, Ray was an assistant with second-year Tennessee coach Cuonzo Martin.
- ▶ The 2007 Purdue recruiting class was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- ▶ Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- ▶ In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20-plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ In 2000, ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger.
- ▶ In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006).
- ▶ Ray's first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- ▶ Ray and his wife, Breyana, have a son, Deacon and a daughter, Katriece.

Ray continued to look at different rotations in the game's final half. The Maroon and White scored the second half's first five points to grab a 46-36 lead with 18:11 remaining.

Carey remained patient on offense and eventually fought its way back into the contest. The Crusaders closed within three at 54-51 and later forced a tie at 63. Steele quickly answered with a 3-point basket and the Bulldogs were not headed after that.

Mississippi State couldn't overcome Tennessee's inside presence and the Volunteers took advantage as it claimed a 72-57 win.

Tennessee sprinted to an early 8-2 lead less than four minutes into the contest. A Jalen Steele 3-point basket capped five straight points for the Bulldogs to tie the contest at 11. MSU would take its only lead at 14-13 on a Gavin Ware dunk with 11:38 left in the half.

Ware held his own against Tennessee's ferocious inside game, as he pulled down nine rebounds – his most in a SEC game.

MSU's lead was short lived as Tennessee rolled out to 25-18 advantage on a Jordan McRae layup with 7:32 left in the half.

The Bulldogs did close back within four before trailing 37-29 at the intermission.

The Bulldogs were back with in four at 39:35 on a Craig Sword jumper with 17:29 left. The Volunteers scored the game's next seven points. Still, MSU hung tough and was still within single digits as late as the 4:14 mark in the contest.

Tennessee held a 37-32 rebounding advantage.

Steele paced the Bulldogs with 15 points, including 13 points in the first half. Fred Thomas added 14 points, while Sword added 10 points. Jaylen Boyd led Tennessee with 18 points.
