WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS LSU ...

- ✓ At 205 games, LSU is Mississippi State's second-most common foe. Ole Miss is first at 251. Those are the only teams MSU has faced 200 or more times.
- LSU has won the last four games in this series by a total of just 26 points. The Tigers haven't won five in a row since winning six straight from 1985-87.
- → The two teams have split the last 10 meetings at Humphrey Coliseum.
- ✓ Against Ole Miss, the Bulldogs lost for the first time in eight games when shooting 45 percent or better from the floor. They also lost for the first time in seven games when having more assists.
- ✓ Four times this year, MSU has shot 55 percent or better from the floor. At Ole Miss, the Bulldogs. were 30-54 (.556).
- ✓ In the setback to Ole Miss, sophomore guard I.J. Ready surpassed 300 points for his career, while senior forward Roquez Johnson surpassed 400 career rebounds.
- → MSU's 13-point lead against Ole Miss was the largest in a loss this season.
- ✓ Junior guard Craig Sword scored a season-high 27 points against the Rebels and made a careerbest five 3-pointers. It's the seventh time he has scored 20-plus points, and in those outings the Bulldogs are 3-4.
- ✓ In the first 15 games Craig Sword played this year, he made five 3-pointers. He matched that total against the Rebels.
- → MSU's opponents are averaging just 30.7 rebounds, which ties for the fewest in the SEC.
- ✓ In his first three games against LSU, Craig Sword has averaged 23.0 points. His career high of 33 came last year in Baton Rouge in a 92-81 setback.
- ✓ On the year, I.J. Ready has proven to be clutch in the final five minutes of all games. During that stretch, he's 16-of-32 shooting, 10-19 beyond the arc. At the foul line, he's 15-16.

NOTES

JOHNSON WITH CAREER NIGHT

Despite the setback to Georgia a week ago, senior forward Roquez Johnson had a career night.

He finished with career highs in points (25) and rebounds (11).

It was the fifth time in his career he totaled 20-plus points.

WARE DOMINANT ON THE BOARDS

After hauling in a season-best 13 rebounds in the win against Vanderbilt, junior forward Gavin Ware responded with a career-high 17 in the win at Auburn.

He's currently 6th in the SEC with his 7.2 average.

OVERCOMING DEFICITS

In their last two wins, Mississippi State has overcome deficits en route to victory.

Against Vanderbilt, the Bulldogs rallied from 12 points before overcoming a 7-point deficit at Auburn.

The 12-point deficit against Vanderbilt was the most since coming from 13 down to beat Vanderbilt in 2012.

LONG-RANGE SUCCESS

Against Texas A&M, MSU drained a season-high 10 3-pointers. That was the most since having 10 last year at Missouri. The last time the Bulldogs had more than 10 was 11 against New Orleans in January of 2013.

WARE CLIMBING REBOUNDING RECORD BOOK

In the win against Florida State, junior forward Gavin Ware had 8 rebounds en route to reaching 500 for his career.

He now has 571 and needs just 21 more to move into the Top 20 in MSU history.

TOUGH DAY ON THE BOARDS

Against Tennessee in the SEC opener, the Bulldogs were out-rebounded 44-28.

That was the most rebounds MSU has allowed this season, while the deficit was also the largest.

47 POINTS A SEASON LOW

Three times this year, Mississippi State has managed just 47 points – McNeese and the first two SEC games against Tennessee and Florida.

On the year, the Bulldogs are averaging 61.1 points, the fewest in the SEC and the 308th fewest in the nation.

LIVING/DYING AT THE FOUL LINE

Against Tennessee, the Bulldogs struggled greatly at the charity stripe, making just 24 of their 44 attempts.

That was quite the contrast from the Florida State outing, where they were 12-13 and made all six attempts in the closing 37 seconds to ensure the victory.

On the year, MSU is 7th in the SEC at .702 (290-413).

LARGEST NON-SEC LOSS AT THE HUMP

Mississippi State's 66-47 loss to McNeese State back in December was the largest margin of defeat to a non-SEC team in Humphrey Coliseum history.

The largest setback ever at the Hump for MSU was in 2013 to Missouri by 42 points, 78-36.

MAN OF STEAL

In his three seasons, Craig Sword has collected 129 steals, including the 60 he had a year ago.

He needs just 10 more to crack the Top 10 in the MSU record books. Ray White (1976-79) is the record holder with 217.

He had three steals at Auburn and then two against Georgia.

1,000 POINT CLUB

MSU has two players looking to join the 1,000-point club — juniors Craig Sword and Gavin Ware.

Sword needs just 117 more points after he totaled 437 last year. Ware is 226 points shy.

GEORGIA MAKES IT THREE-STRAIGHT AT THE HUMP

With last week's 72-66 win, Georgia has now won three-straight games at Humphrey Coliseum.

The Bulldogs have now achieved that feat twice, with the only other time happening between 1989-91.

LARGEST LEAD GIVEN UP IN A LOSS

Entering the game against Ole Miss, the biggest lead MSU had in a loss was eight points against Georgia.

That changed on Wednesday when Ole Miss rallied from a 13-point deficit in the second half en route to a 79-73 victory.

11 AND COUNTING

Against Auburn, junior forward Gavin Ware recorded his 11th-career double-double with 16 points and a career-high 17 rebounds.

He's currently 6th in the SEC in rebounding (7.2).

400th WIN

On Dec. 1, 1975, the doors of Humphrey Coliseum officially opened with an 85-82 win against Indiana State.

Against Western Carolina in the season opener, MSU collected win No. 400 with the 66-56 victory.

RARE TYPE OF WIN

In his first two seasons at helm, Rick Ray's teams were just 2-37 when having fewer assists than opponents.

This year alone, the Bulldogs have won three games when that stat unfolds — Western Carolina in the season opener and then against Florida State. Now, MSU is 5-47 in that category.

WIN THE REBOUNDING BATTLE, WIN THE GAME

A big key to MSU's success this season is rebounding. And when the Bulldogs win the battle of the boards, they are 8-3, losing only to USC Upstate, Texas A&M and Georgia in that category.

MSU is 1-7 when being out-rebounded.

FIRST TECHNICAL

In his 76th game as a head coach, Rick Ray was issued his first technical in the win against Jacksonville.

The call came with 12:08 to play in the game with the Bulldogs leading 45-33.

LARGEST MARGIN THIS YEAR

The 23-point win (70-47) against the Dolphins was the largest this year at Humphrey Coliseum for MSU.

Overall, it was the second-largest margin of victory as the Bulldogs beat St. Louis by 25 points (75-50) in Corpus Christi, Texas.

EARNING FIRST STARTS

Against USC Upstate, freshman forward Fallou Ndoye drew his first-career start and responded with 11 points and 3 rebounds.

Then against Jacksonville, Oliver Black was in the starting lineup for the first time. Both are now reserves.

SEASON LOW IN FIRST HALF POINTS

In the 53-51 loss to USC Upstate in Jackson, Mississippi State managed just 15 points in the first half.

That was the fewest points of any half this season and the least since having 14 vs. Vanderbilt on 2-23-13 in a 72-31 setback.

BUTLER AWARDED SCHOLARSHIP

Mississippi State senior guard walk-on Isaiah Butler was awarded a scholarship earlier this month. The first-year player was a member of the practice squad last season.

The Brandon, Miss., native has appeared in five games this year, grabbing 1 rebound and dishing out 1 assists in 14 minutes of action.

STREAK IN JACKSON SNAPPED

In the loss to USC Upstate in Jackson, MSU's 12-game winning streak at Mississippi Coliseum was snapped.

The Bulldogs are now 16-6 all-time in the venue.

2014-15 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

SEASON HIGH BEYOND THE ARC

■ Against Oregon State, Mississippi State managed just 49 points.

Yet, the Bulldogs attempted a season-high 23 3-pointers, making six. MSU also attempted 23 at Texas A&M, connecting on 10. On the year, MSU is averaging an SEC low 4.3 made treys (81).

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

■ Although Mississippi State lost in the finals of the Corpus Christi Coastal Classic, Gavin Ware and Fred Thomas were selected to the All-Tournament team.

Thomas averaged 14 points, Ware 13.5.

CAREER NIGHT

■ Against St. Louis, Travis Daniels scored a career-high 21 points.

The junior guard drained 8 of his 11 shots and was 4 of 5 beyond the arc.

He also had a career night on the boards at Tulane, hauling in 9.

D-E-F-E-N-S-E

■ MSU allowed just 46 points versus Clayton State earlier this year. It was the fewest points given up since limiting New Orleans to 46 on Jan. 3 2013

On the year, the Bulldogs are fourth in points allowed in the SEC at 61.8.

HIGH STEAL COUNT

■ Also against Clayton State, the Bulldogs collected a season-high 11 steals.

It was the most steals since also having 11 against Auburn on Feb. 15 last year.

Against Jacksonville, Florida State, Tennessee and Auburn, MSU nearly matched that total with 10.

LOW ASSISTS COUNT

■ Four times this season, Mississippi State has been credited with 5 or fewer assists.

Against Clayton State, the Bulldogs had just 5. Then against TCU, they were credited with 3. That was the fewest since also having 3 against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2013. Against both Arkansas State and Tennessee, they had 4.

CLEANING THE GLASS

■ Against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 17, Mississippi State easily won the battle of the boards. 47-25.

It was the largest margin since being plus-20 against LSU on Jan. 25, 2012.

ALABAMA FLAVOR

■ A quick glance at Mississippi State's roster reveals one very strong common thread — the state of Alabama.

Player wise, the roster features five players from Alabama — Travis Daniels, Demetrius Houston, Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and De'Runnya Wilson.

In addition, the coaching staff has two ties in Wes Flanigan and George Brooks.

Flanigan was an All-SEC standout at Auburn from 1993-97, while Brooks is a native of Lafayette, Ala.

7 PLAYERS SEE FIRST-TIME ACTION

■ This season, Mississippi State has had seven players see action for the first time playing in the Maroon & White.

In the season opener against Western Carolina, Maurice Dunlap, Demetrius Houston, Fallou Ndoye and Oliver Black logged their first minutes.

Then against Mississippi Valley State, Isaiah Butler and Jeffery Johnson made their debuts.

BULLDOGS INVITED TO PUERTO RICO

■ In November, MSU learned it will be playing in the 2015 Puerto Rico Classic.

The field features Butler, Miami, Minnesota, Missouri State, Temple, Texas Tech and Utah.

BULLDOGS SIGN THREE

■ In mid-November, Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period by inking Quinndary Weatherspoon, Tookie Brown and Joe Strugg.

Brown is a 5-11, 170-pound guard out of Morgan County High School in Madison, Ga., while Strugg is a 6-8, 200-pound forward from G.W. Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala.

Weatherspoon, rated as the No. 2 overall player in Mississippi and 78th nationally, is a 6-4, 175-pound guard out of Velma Jackson. Recently, the Clinton, Miss., native was named to the Clarion Ledger's Dandy Dozen team.

Strugg is the fourth MSU signee out of Carver the last four years, along with Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and Demetrius Houston.

HOME LOSING SKID SNAPPED

■ Not only did Mississippi State open the year on a positive note, it snapped a six-game losing skid at Humphrey Coliseum.

Prior to the Bulldogs' 66-56 win against Western Carolina, their last win at the Hump came on Jan. 22, 2014, against Auburn 82-74.

Against Arkansas State on Dec. 17, it's fourgame winning streak was snapped.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

■ For the third-consecutive year, Rick Ray's staff remained intact during the offseason.

Back for their third year is Chris Hollender, George Brooks, Wes Flanigan, Adam Gordon and Adam Bauman.

ANOTHER CLEMSON CONNECTION

■ In his first year as a graduate assistant is Tanner Smith, a four-year player at Clemson when Rick Ray was an assistant.

Smith's duties include assisting with on-court workouts, video scouting, academic monitoring and on-campus recruiting.

He comes to MSU after spending the last two years overseas playing professionally.

At Clemson, he scored 986 points, grabbed 459 rebounds, dished out 320 assists and collected 159 steals en route to playing in three NCAA Tournaments.

HUTTON NAMED 2015 SEC LEGEND

■ Doug Hutton has been named the 2015 SEC Legend.

Hutton, a native of Clinton, Miss., played for •

the Bulldogs from 1961-64 and led MSU to the historic 1963 NCAA Tournament against Loyola-Chicago.

The All-SEC standout was voted team captain his senior year and averaged 14.8 points.

He'll be recognized at the SEC Tournament next March in Nashville.



- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State his-
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team -Gavin Ware and Craig



- In his third season, he is 33-51 in the rebuilding process.
- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament -Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- ▶ The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- ► The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2000, ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger.
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006), while his first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.

MSU pushed its lead to double digits for the first time at 57-47 thanks to a pair of free throws from Johnson. WCU would cut it as close as six in the final moments of the game, but clutch free throw shooting by the Bulldogs would seal the contest.

A tough offensive night led to a disappointing outcome Mississippi State as it lost its SEC opener against Tennessee, 61-47.

After erasing a 12-point first-half deficit, the Bulldogs could not overcome 30.6 percent shooting and 20 missed free throws.

Tennessee scored the game's first 12 points. MSU scored the game's next 12 points and finally evened the game with 6:07 left in the half. The Volunteers went a stretch of 12 minutes, 20 seconds without a field goal.

Tennessee broke back on top at 14-12 with a pair of free throws. MSU then grabbed a 17-14 lead with a Trivante Bloodman basket and free throw.

MSU closed back within eight points on two free throws by Trivante Bloodman with 2:20 left but got no closer.

Tennessee held a 44-28 rebounding advantage.

Ware led MSU with 12 points.

Craig Sword scored a season-high 27 points and drained a career-best five 3-pointers, but it wasn't enough as Ole Miss rallied to beat Mississippi State, 79-73.

MSU shot 55.6 percent from the field – its first game above 50 percent in league play and fourth overall.

Gavin Ware overcame early foul trouble to add 12 points for the Bulldogs, while I.J. Ready was also in double figures with 10 points.

MSU started strong and built a 16-4 lead. Ole Miss responded with a 17-2 run to take a brief first-half lead. MSU surged back ahead to carry a 32-28 lead into the locker room at half-time.

The Bulldogs again started strong in the second half and stretched the lead to a gamebest advantage of 45-32 with 16:29 left in the contest. Ole Miss still trailed by nine points at 54-45 before putting together a game-changing run. The teams were tied at 60 before Ole Miss took the lead for good at 64-62 after two free throws by Jarvis Summers.

The game's critical play took place minutes later when Summers drew a foul on a made 3-point shot attempt. The four-point play pushed the UM lead to 71-65 with 3:15 left to play.

MSU held a 34-31 rebounding advantage. The Maroon and White have now out-rebounded five straight conference opponents. The Bulldogs had 15 assists and 16 turnovers.
