WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS ALABAMA . . .

- ✓ Alabama has won six out of the last seven games against Mississippi State, including four in a row. The Tide hasn't won five straight since winning six consecutive from 1985-87.
- ✓ The Bulldogs have won six out of the last 10 against the Crimson Tide in Starkville.
- ✓ Against Arkansas, junior forward **Gavin Ware** grabbed 9 rebounds to stand 20th all-time in the MSU record books with 598.
- ✓ With at least nine games left, junior guard **Craig Sword** is just 72 points shy of becoming the 34th player in MSU history to reach 1,000 for a career.
- ✓ Five times this year, the Bulldogs have shot 55 percent or better from the floor. In those games, MSU is 4-1.
- ✓ In the loss to Arkansas, Mississippi State scored just nine first-half points. The last time MSU managed 10 or fewer points in a half was the 10 it had in the opening frame against Missouri in 2013 in a 78-36 setback.
- ✓ The Bulldogs also failed to make a 3-pointer against the Razorbacks, missing all 10 attempts. That's the second time this year MSU misfired on all of its attempts from long range, as it was 0-7 in the win against Clayton State.
- ✓ MSU's opponents are averaging just 31.5 rebounds, the third fewest in the SEC.
- ✓ On the year, sophomore guard **I.J. Ready** has proven to be clutch in the final five minutes of all games. During that stretch, he's 17-of-35 shooting, 10-20 beyond the arc. At the foul line, he's 21-22. He also has 8 assists and 4 steals.
- ✓ In SEC play, **I.J. Ready** is a perfect 20-20 at the foul line. On the year, he's 32-35 (.914). He's made 22 straight, with his last miss coming with 16:58 left in the second half against McNeese State on Dec. 30, 2014.

NOTES

WARE CRACKS TOP 20 IN REBOUNDING RECORD BOOKS

At Arkansas, junior forward Gavin Ware grabbed 9 rebounds to give him 598 for his career, the 20th most in school history.

He moved past Terry Kusnierz, who had 592 from 1972-74

In the win against Florida State, he surpassed 500 for his career.

1,000 POINT CLUB

MSU has three players looking to join the 1,000-point club — juniors Craig Sword, Fred Thomas and Gavin Ware.

Sword needs just 72 more points after he totaled 437 last year.

Thomas is 162 points shy, while Ware needs 193 more points.

FEBRUARY SKID SNAPPED

Last Tuesday's win at Tennessee not only gave MSU its second SEC road win, it also snapped a 16-game losing streak in the month of February.

20 TIMES TWO

Against Tennessee, junior guards Fred Thomas and Craig Sword both scored 20-plus points.

Sword, who totaled 27 at Ole Miss, finished with 26 against the Vols on 7-of-8 shooting with a 4-5 mark beyond the arc. Thomas had 20 on 5-7 shooting and was also 4-5 from 3-point range.

The last time MSU had two players score 20-plus points in the same game was Jan. 2, 2014, when Colin Borchert and Gavin Ware had 22 and 21, respectively, against Maryland Eastern Shore.

RARE TYPE OF LOSS IN OXFORD

Against Ole Miss last week in Oxford, Mississippi State lost for the first time this season when shooting 45 percent or better from the floor.

On the year, the Bulldogs are now 8-1 in that category after the win at Tennessee.

WARE DOMINANT ON THE BOARDS

After hauling in a season-best 13 rebounds in the win against Vanderbilt, junior forward Gavin Ware responded with a career-high 17 in the win at Auburn. Against LSU, he had 10, while grabbing 8 at Tennessee.

He's currently 5th in the SEC with his 7.4 average.

OVERCOMING DEFICITS

In their last four wins, Mississippi State has overcome deficits en route to victory.

Against Vanderbilt, the Bulldogs rallied from 12 points before overcoming a 7-point deficit at Auburn, 3 points vs. LSU and 6 at Tennessee.

The 12-point deficit against Vanderbilt was the most since coming from 13 down to beat Vanderbilt in 2012.

LONG-RANGE SUCCESS FOR SWORD

In his first 15 games of the year, junior guard Craig Sword made just five 3-pointers. Then against Ole Miss, he drained five en route to scoring a season-high 27 points.

On the year, he's 15 of 42 beyond the arc after going 0-3 at Arkansas.

TOUGH DAY ON THE BOARDS

Against Tennessee in the SEC opener, the Bulldogs were out-rebounded 44-28.

That was the most rebounds MSU has allowed this season, while the deficit was also the largest.

JOHNSON WITH CAREER NIGHT

Despite the setback to Georgia back in January, senior forward Roquez Johnson had a career night.

He finished with career highs in points (25) and rebounds (11).

It was the fifth time in his career he totaled 20-plus points.

41 POINTS A SEASON LOW

Against Arkansas, Mississippi State managed to score just 41 points, the fewest this year.

The previous low of 47 points happened three times — McNeese and the first two SEC games against Tennessee and Florida.

On the year, the Bulldogs are averaging 61.9 points, the fewest in the SEC and the 297th fewest in the nation.

BETTER AT THE FOUL LINE VS. TENNESSEE

After making just 24 of their 44 attempts in the SEC opener against Tennessee, the Bulldogs were 25-35 against the Vols last Tuesday in Knoxville.

In the closing three minutes of the game, MSU was 7-8.

On the year, MSU is 7th in the SEC at .696 (344-494).

MAN OF STEAL

In his three seasons, Craig Sword has collected 133 steals, including the 60 he had a year ago. That's 11th most all-time at MSU.

He needs just 6 more to crack the Top 10 in the MSU record books. Ray White (1976-79) is the record holder with 217.

LARGEST LEAD GIVEN UP IN A LOSS

Entering the game against Ole Miss, the biggest lead MSU had in a loss was eight points against Georgia.

That changed when the Rebels rallied from a 13-point deficit in the second half en route to a 79-73 victory in Oxford.

12 AND COUNTING

Against LSU, junior forward Gavin Ware recorded his 12th-career double-double with 12 points and a 10 rebounds.

He's currently 5th in the SEC in rebounding (7.4).

RARE TYPE OF WIN

In his first two seasons at helm, Rick Ray's teams were just 2-37 when having fewer assists than opponents.

This year alone, the Bulldogs have won four games when that stat unfolds — the last time coming at Tennessee on Tuesday. Now, MSU is 6-48 in that category under Ray.

WIN THE REBOUNDING BATTLE, WIN THE GAME

A big key to MSU's success this season is rebounding. And when the Bulldogs win the battle of the boards, they are 8-5, losing only to USC Upstate, Texas A&M, Georgia, Ole Miss and Arkansas in that category.

MSU is 3-7 when being out-rebounded following the Tennessee game.

LARGEST NON-SEC LOSS AT THE HUMP

Mississippi State's 66-47 loss to McNeese State back in December was the largest margin of defeat to a non-SEC team in Humphrey Coliseum history.

The largest setback ever at the Hump for MSU was in 2013 to Missouri by 42 points, 78-36.

LARGEST MARGIN THIS YEAR

The 23-point win (70-47) against the Dolphins was the largest this year at Humphrey Coliseum for MSU.

Overall, it was the second-largest margin of victory as the Bulldogs beat St. Louis by 25 points (75-50) in Corpus Christi, Texas.

SEASON LOW IN FIRST HALF POINTS

In the 61-41 loss at Arkansas Saturday, Mississippi State managed just 9 points in the first half.

That was the fewest points of any half this season and the first time totaling 10 or less since having 10 in a 78-36 loss to Missouri in 2013.

2014-15 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

MILESTONES REACHED

■ In the setback to Ole Miss, sophomore guard I.J. Ready surpassed 300 points for his career.

At the same time, senior forward Roquez Johnson surpassed 400 rebounds.

SEASON HIGH BEYOND THE ARC

■ Against Oregon State, Mississippi State managed just 49 points.

Yet, the Bulldogs attempted a season-high 23 3-pointers, making six. MSU also attempted 23 at Texas A&M, connecting on 10. On the year, MSU is averaging an SEC low 4.3 made treys (100).

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

■ Although Mississippi State lost in the finals of the Corpus Christi Coastal Classic, Gavin Ware and Fred Thomas were selected to the All-Tournament team.

Thomas averaged 14 points, Ware 13.5.

CAREER NIGHT

■ Against St. Louis, Travis Daniels scored a career-high 21 points.

The junior guard drained 8 of his 11 shots and was 4 of 5 beyond the arc.

He also had a career night on the boards at Tulane, hauling in 9.

D-E-F-E-N-S-E

■ MSU allowed just 46 points versus Clayton State earlier this year. It was the fewest points given up since limiting New Orleans to 46 on Jan. 3, 2013.

On the year, the Bulldogs are fifth in points allowed in the SEC at 62.2.

HIGH STEAL COUNT

■ Against LSU, the Bulldogs collected a season-high 12 steals, the most steals since having 11 vs. Clayton State back in November.

LOW ASSISTS COUNT

■ Four times this season, Mississippi State has been credited with 5 or fewer assists.

Against Clayton State, the Bulldogs had just 5. Then against TCU, they were credited with 3. That was the fewest since also having 3 against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2013. Against both Arkansas State and Tennessee, they had 4.

CLEANING THE GLASS

■ Against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 17, Mississippi State easily won the battle of the boards, 47-25.

It was the largest margin since being plus-20 against LSU on Jan. 25, 2012.

ALABAMA FLAVOR

■ A quick glance at Mississippi State's roster reveals one very strong common thread — the state of Alabama.

Player wise, the roster features five players from Alabama — Travis Daniels, Demetrius Houston, Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and DeRunya Wilson.

In addition, the coaching staff has two ties in Wes Flanigan and George Brooks.

Flanigan was an All-SEC standout at Auburn from 1993-97, while Brooks is a native of Lafayette, Ala.

7 PLAYERS SEE FIRST-TIME ACTION

■ This season, Mississippi State has had seven players see action for the first time playing in the Maroon & White.

In the season opener against Western Carolina, Maurice Dunlap, Demetrius Houston, Fallou Ndoye and Oliver Black logged their first minutes.

Then against Mississippi Valley State, Isaiah Butler and Jeffery Johnson made their debuts.

BULLDOGS INVITED TO PUERTO RICO

■ In November, MSU learned it will be playing in the 2015 Puerto Rico Classic.

The field features Butler, Miami, Minnesota, Missouri State, Temple, Texas Tech and Utah.

BULLDOGS SIGN THREE

■ In mid-November, Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period by inking Quindary Weatherspoon, Tookie Brown and Joe Strugg.

Brown is a 5-11, 170-pound guard out of Morgan County High School in Madison, Ga., while Strugg is a 6-8, 200-pound forward from G.W. Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala.

Weatherspoon, rated as the No. 2 overall player in Mississippi and 78th nationally, is a 6-4, 175-pound guard out of Velma Jackson. Recently, the Clinton, Miss., native was named to the Clarion Ledger's Dandy Dozen team.

Strugg is the fourth MSU signee out of Carver the last four years, along with Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and Demetrius Houston.

HOME LOSING SKID SNAPPED

■ Not only did Mississippi State open the year on a positive note, it snapped a six-game losing skid at Humphrey Coliseum.

Prior to the Bulldogs' 66-56 win against Western Carolina, their last win at the Hump came on Jan. 22, 2014, against Auburn 82-74.

Against Arkansas State on Dec. 17, it's four-game winning streak was snapped.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

■ For the third-consecutive year, Rick Ray's staff remained intact during the offseason.

Back for their third year is Chris Hollender, George Brooks, Wes Flanigan, Adam Gordon and Adam Bauman.

ANOTHER CLEMSON CONNECTION

■ In his first year as a graduate assistant is Tanner Smith, a four-year player at Clemson when Rick Ray was an assistant.

Smith's duties include assisting with on-court workouts, video scouting, academic monitoring and on-campus recruiting.

He comes to MSU after spending the last two years overseas playing professionally.

At Clemson, he scored 986 points, grabbed 459 rebounds, dished out 320 assists and collected 159 steals en route to playing in three NCAA Tournaments.

BUTLER AWARDED SCHOLARSHIP

■ Mississippi State senior guard walk-on Isaiah Butler was awarded a scholarship earlier this month. The first-year player was a member of the

practice squad last season.

The Brandon, Miss., native has appeared in five games this year, grabbing 1 rebound and dishing out 1 assists in 14 minutes of action.

STREAK SNAPPED IN JACKSON

■ In the loss to USC Upstate in Jackson back in December, MSU's 12-game winning streak at Mississippi Coliseum was snapped.

The Bulldogs are now 16-6 all-time in the venue, 1-1 under Rick Ray.

THE HUMP'S 400TH WIN

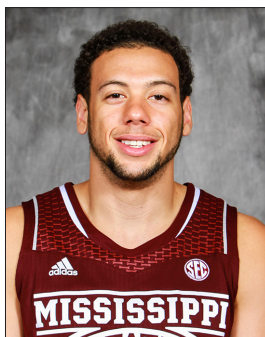

MSU COACH RICK RAY

Head Coach Rick Ray

- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team — Gavin Ware and Craig Sword.
- In his third season, he is 35-53 in the rebuilding process.
- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament — Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20-plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2000, ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger.
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006), while his first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.

Craig Sword paced the Bulldogs with 26 points, including a 7-of-8 night from the field and 4-of-5 night from 3-point range. Sword, who made his first seven shots attempts, also hit 8-of-10 free throw attempts. Thomas was equally damaging outside as he scored 20 points, including a 4-of-5 night from 3-point range.
