- ✓ Mississippi State has won 12 out of the last 13 against Arkansas at Humphrey Coliseum.
- ✓ Last year, the Razorbacks snapped a 12-game losing streak at the Hump with a 73-69 win.
- Arkansas is the first ranked team MSU has played this season and will be the first of two straight as top-ranked Kentucky visits on Wednesday.
- In the last 10 years, MSU is 8-32 against ranked teams and has lost the last eight outings dating back to 2012.
- ▼ The Bulldogs' last win against a ranked foe was against Arizona in the finals of the 2K Sports
 Classic at Madison Square Garden in November of 2011.
- Against Ole Miss, junior forward Gavin Ware grabbed 6 rebounds to move into sole possession of 18th all-time with 617. He was in a tie with his former high school coach, Greg Carter.

NOTES

ROAD WARRIORS

At Missouri, Mississippi State collected its third SEC road win of the season.

That's the most road wins since having four in 2011. It was also MSU's first win at Mizzou in four attempts.

FLIGHT SCARE

Following the win at Missouri, Mississippi State was forced into an emergency landing in St. Louis after the plane lost one of its engines 25 minutes into the flight. As a result, the team spent the night in Festus, Mo., before busing home on Sunday.

1,000 POINT CLUB

MSU has three players looking to join the 1,000-point club — juniors Craig Sword, Fred Thomas and Gavin Ware.

Sword needs just 18 more points after he totaled 437 last year. Thomas is 44 points shy, while Ware needs 158 more points.

20 TIMES TWO X TWO

Against Tennessee, junior guards Fred Thomas and Craig Sword both scored 20-plus points.

Sword finished with 26 against the Vols on 7-of-8 shooting with a 4-5 mark beyond the arc. Thomas had 20 on 5-7 shooting and was also 4-5 from 3-point range.

Then at Missouri, Sword and Roquez Johnson each had 22 points.

The last time MSU had two players score 20-plus points in the same game prior to this season was Jan, 2, 2014, when Colin Borchert and Gavin Ware had 22 and 21, respectively, against Maryland Eastern Shore.

SEASON-LOW 9 POINTS IN A HALF

In the 61-41 setback at Arkansas, Mississippi State managed just 9 first-half points.

The last time the Bulldogs totaled 10 or fewer points in a half was Feb. 13, 2013, in a home loss to Missouri, 78-36.

41 POINTS A SEASON LOW

Against Arkansas, Mississippi State managed to score just 41 points, the fewest this year.

The previous low of 47 points happened three times — McNeese and the first two SEC games against Tennessee and Florida.

On the year, the Bulldogs are averaging 61.4 points, the fewest in the SEC and the 306th fewest in the nation.

WARE DOMINANT ON THE BOARDS

After hauling in a season-best 13 rebounds in the win against Vanderbilt, junior forward Gavin Ware responded with a career-high 17 in the win at Auburn.

He's currently 5th in the SEC with his 7.3 average.

OVERCOMING DEFICITS

In its last five wins, Mississippi State has overcome deficits en route to victory.

Against Vanderbilt, the Bulldogs rallied from 12 points before overcoming a 7-point deficit at Auburn, 3 points vs. LSU, 6 at Tennessee and 5 at MIssouri.

The 12-point deficit against Vanderbilt was the most since coming from 13 down to beat Vanderbilt in 2012.

LONG-RANGE SUCCESS FOR SWORD

In his first 15 games of the year, junior guard Craig Sword made just five 3-pointers. Then against Ole Miss, he drained five en route to scoring a season-high 27 points.

On the year, he's 18 of 55 beyond the arc after going 1-5 vs. Ole Miss.

JOHNSON WITH CAREER NIGHT

Despite the setback to Georgia back in January, senior forward Roquez Johnson had a career night.

He finished with career highs in points (25) and rebounds (11).

After his 22-point performance at Missouri, he's now scored 20-plus points six times.

BETTER AT THE FOUL LINE VS. TENNESSEE

After making just 24 of their 44 attempts in the SEC opener against Tennessee, the Bulldogs were 25-35 against the Vols in Knoxville.

In the closing three minutes of the game, MSU was 7-8.

On the year, MSU is 8th in the SEC at .699 (414-592).

MAN OF STEAL

In his three seasons, Craig Sword has collected 137 steals, including the 60 he had a year ago. That's 11th most all-time at MSU.

He needs just two more to crack the Top 10 in the MSU record books. Ray White (1976-79) is the record holder with 217.

LARGEST LEAD GIVEN UP IN A LOSS

Entering the Jan. 28 game against Ole Miss, the biggest lead MSU had in a loss was eight points against Georgia.

That changed when the Rebels rallied from a 13-point deficit in the second half en route to a 79-73 victory in Oxford. Ole Miss also rallied from 10 down on Thursday to win in Starkville.

12 AND COUNTING

Against LSU, junior forward Gavin Ware recorded his 12th-career double-double with 12 points and a 10 rebounds.

He's currently 5th in the SEC in rebounding (7.3).

RARE TYPE OF WIN

In his first two seasons at helm, Rick Ray's teams were just 2-37 when having fewer assists than opponents.

This year alone, the Buildogs have won five games when that stat unfolds — the last time coming Saturday at Missouri. Now, MSU is 7-51 in that category under Ray.

WIN THE REBOUNDING BATTLE, WIN THE GAME

A big key to MSU's success this season is rebounding. And when the Bulldogs win the battle of the boards, they are 8-7 after winning the battle of the boards against Ole Miss on Thursday.

MSU is 4-7 when being out-rebounded following the Missouri game.

TOUGH DAY ON THE BOARDS

Against Tennessee in the SEC opener, the Bulldogs were out-rebounded 44-28.

That was the most rebounds MSU has allowed this season, while the deficit was also the largest.

LARGEST NON-SEC LOSS AT THE HUMP

Mississippi State's 66-47 loss to McNeese State back in December was the largest margin of defeat to a non-SEC team in Humphrey Coliseum history.

The largest setback ever at the Hump for MSU was in 2013 to Missouri by 42 points, 78-36.

LARGEST MARGIN THIS YEAR

The 23-point win (70-47) against the Dolphins was the largest this year at Humphrey Coliseum for MSU.

Overall, it was the second-largest margin of victory as the Bulldogs beat St. Louis by 25 points (75-50) in Corpus Christi, Texas.

2014-15 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

FEBRUARY SKID SNAPPED

■ The Feb. 3 win at Tennessee not only gave MSU its second SEC road win of the season, it also snapped a 16-game losing streak in the month of February.

Prior to the victory, the last February win was at South Carolina in 2012.

MILESTONES REACHED

■ In the setback at Ole Miss, sophomore guard I.J. Ready surpassed 300 points for his career.

At the same time, senior forward Roquez Johnson surpassed 400 rebounds.

At Arkansas, Johnson reached 800-career points. As a freshman, he scored just 1 point in 45 minutes of action.

SEASON HIGH BEYOND THE ARC

■ Against Oregon State, Mississippi State managed just 49 points.

Yet, the Bulldogs attempted a season-high 23 3-pointers, making six. MSU also attempted 23 at Texas A&M, connecting on 10. On the year, MSU is averaging an SEC low 4.3 made treys (107).

Twice, they failed to make a 3-pointer — Clayton State and at Arkansas.

CAREER NIGHT

■ Against St. Louis, Travis Daniels scored a career-high 21 points.

The junior guard drained 8 of his 11 shots and was 4 of 5 beyond the arc.

He also had a career night on the boards at Tulane, hauling in 9.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

■ Although Mississippi State lost in the finals of the Corpus Christi Coastal Classic, Gavin Ware and Fred Thomas were selected to the All-Tournament team.

Thomas averaged 14 points, Ware 13.5.

D-E-F-E-N-S-E

■ MSU allowed just 46 points versus Clayton State earlier this year. It was the fewest points given up since limiting New Orleans to 46 on Jan. 3. 2013.

On the year, the Bulldogs are fifth in points allowed in the SEC at 62.3.

HIGH STEAL COUNT

■ Against LSU, the Bulldogs collected a seasonhigh 12 steals, the most steals since having 11 vs. Clayton State back in November.

LOW ASSISTS COUNT

■ Five times this season, Mississippi State has been credited with 5 or fewer assists.

Against Clayton State, the Bulldogs had just 5. Then against TCU, they were credited with 3. That was the fewest since also having 3 against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2013. Against both Arkansas State and Tennessee, they had 4, while having 5 at home against Alabama.

CLEANING THE GLASS

■ Against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 17, Mississippi State easily won the battle of the boards, 47-25.

It was the largest margin since being plus-20 against LSU on Jan. 25, 2012.

ALABAMA FLAVOR

■ A quick glance at Mississippi State's roster reveals one very strong common thread — the state of Alabama.

Player wise, the roster features five players from Alabama — Travis Daniels, Demetrius Houston, Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and De'Runnya Wilson.

In addition, the coaching staff has two ties in Wes Flanigan and George Brooks.

Flanigan was an All-SEC standout at Auburn from 1993-97, while Brooks is a native of Lafayette, Ala.

7 PLAYERS SEE FIRST-TIME ACTION

■ This season, Mississippi State has had seven players see action for the first time playing in the Maroon & White.

In the season opener against Western Carolina, Maurice Dunlap, Demetrius Houston, Fallou Ndoye and Oliver Black logged their first min-

Then against Mississippi Valley State, Isaiah Butler and Jeffery Johnson made their debuts.

BULLDOGS INVITED TO PUERTO RICO

■ In November, MSU learned it will be playing in the 2015 Puerto Rico Classic.

The field features Butler, Miami, Minnesota, Missouri State, Temple, Texas Tech and Utah.

BULLDOGS SIGN THREE

■ In mid-November, Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period by inking Quinndary Weatherspoon, Tookie Brown and Joe Strugg.

Brown is a 5-11, 170-pound guard out of Morgan County High School in Madison, Ga., while Strugg is a 6-8, 200-pound forward from G.W. Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala.

Weatherspoon, rated as the No. 2 overall player in Mississippi and 78th nationally, is a 6-4, 175-pound guard out of Velma Jackson. Recently, the Clinton, Miss., native was named to the Clarion Ledger's Dandy Dozen team.

HOME LOSING SKID SNAPPED

■ Not only did Mississippi State open the year on a positive note, it snapped a six-game losing skid at Humphrey Coliseum.

Prior to the Bulldogs' 66-56 win against Western Carolina, their last win at the Hump came on Jan. 22, 2014, against Auburn 82-74.

Against Arkansas State on Dec. 17, it's fourgame winning streak was snapped.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

■ For the third-consecutive year, Rick Ray's staff remained intact during the offseason.

Back for their third year is Chris Hollender, George Brooks, Wes Flanigan, Adam Gordon and Adam Bauman.

ANOTHER CLEMSON CONNECTION

■ In his first year as a graduate assistant is Tanner Smith, a four-year player at Clemson when Rick Ray was an assistant.

Smith's duties include assisting with on-court workouts, video scouting, academic monitoring and on-campus recruiting.

He comes to MSU after spending the last two years overseas playing professionally.

At Clemson, he scored 986 points, grabbed 459 rebounds, dished out 320 assists and collected 159 steals en route to playing in three NCAA Tournaments.

■ Doug Hutton has been named the 2015 SEC Legend.

Hutton, a native of Clinton, Miss., played for the Bulldogs from 1961-64 and led MSU to the historic 1963 NCAA Tournament against Loyola-Chicago.

He'll be recognized at the SEC Tournament next March in Nashville.





- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team -Gavin Ware and Craig

- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- ▶ The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- ► The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2000, ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger.
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006), while his first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.

MSU pushed its lead to double digits for the first time at 57-47 thanks to a pair of free throws from Johnson. WCU would cut it as close as six in the final moments of the game, but clutch free throw shooting by the Bulldogs would seal the contest.

Roquez Johnson and Craig Sword led the MSU offensive attack as each scored 22 points. Johnson has had four 20-plus point games this season. Meanwhile, Sword is averaging a team-best 12.8 points in SEC play.

Missouri built an early 8-5 lead before MSU took control with seven-straight points. After Missouri trimmed it to 12-11, MSU answered with the game's next eight points. Back-to-back baskets by Johnson and Gavin Ware helped create a 20-11 lead.

A 13-2 run by MSU extended the lead to 33-16 with 7:21 left in the half. A 3-pointer by Fred Thomas capped that run.

Missouri closed within 40-29 at halftime.

In the second half, MU started strong and battled back to a 46-42 deficit with 15:07 left.

Missouri kept battling and actually surged ahead at 64-63 on a layup by Keanau Post with 4:29 remaining.

A layup by Johnson grabbed the lead right back. A steal by Travis Daniels led to a layup by Sword. From there, the Bulldogs moved to the free throw line to seal out the win.

Craig Sword totaled a team-high 19 points but it wasn't enough as Ole Miss rallied to claim a 71-65 win.

MSU held a 10-point lead at 26-16 with 8:22 left in the first half. The Bulldogs still led 32-27 at halftime. The lead switched hands several times in the second half before Ole Miss ended the game with a 10-5 run and hit four free throws in the final 14 seconds of play.

In addition to Sword's 19 points, Gavin Ware added 13 points, while Travis Daniels added 12 points. Ware and Daniels each had 6 boards.

Ole Miss received 29 points from Moody.

The Bulldogs rode the momentum of a season-best crowd of 7,873 to a fast start.

Back-to-back 3-pointers helped Ole Miss start the second half with an 8-0 run. The lead grew to eight at 44-36 on a Moody 3-pointer with 13:56 left.

Down 51-43, the Bulldogs responded with an 11-1 run to take a 54-52 lead with 6:25 left on two free throws by Ware.

Ole Miss had the answer as Moody responded with three straight 3-point baskets to put the Rebels on top 61-57 with 4:46 left.

The Bulldogs were back within one point on two more occasions.
