BULLDOGS TRAVEL TO SOUTH CAROLINA FOR SECOND STRAIGHT ROAD OUTING

Looking to protect their precarious one-game lead in the SEC's Western Division standings, the Bulldogs of Mississippi State (17-8, 8-3) travel to Columbia, S.C., to take on the South Carolina Gamecocks (12-13, 4-7) Saturday afternoon. The 19th all-time series renewal is slated for a 4 p.m. ET

Bulldogs of Mississippi State (17-8, 8-3) travel to Columbia, S.C., to take on the South Carolina Gamecocks (12-13, 4-7) Saturday afternoon. The 19th all-time series renewal is slated for a 4 p.m. ET tip-off at the 18,000-seat Colonial Center, and will be televised regionally by Raycom Sports.

One game ahead of Arkansas in the SEC West race, coach Rick Stansbury's 17-8 Bulldogs are 8-3 in conterence play after having their three-game winning streak snapped with Wednesday's 74-63 road setback to rival Mississippi. This week marks the first time this conference season in which MState has consecutive road contests in league play. It will happen again to open the month of March when the Bulldogs head to SEC East foes Florida and Vanderbilt on March 1 and 5, respectively. As a team, MSU continues to rank second nationally in both field-goal percentage defense (.369) and blocked shots (8.36 bpg), in addition to leading the conference in scoring defense (63.9 ppg) and rebounding (41.1 rpg).

Individually, the Bulldogs are powered by the all-star tandem of veterans Jamont Gordon (17.8 ppg, 6.4 rpg & 4.8 apg) and Charles Rhodes (15.2 ppg, 7.2 rpg & 1.4 bpg). A midseason Wooden Award selection and Cousy Award finalist, Gordon is coming off his 11th 20-point effort of the season with his 20-point outing at Ole Miss. With a team-high seven double-doubles on the season, Rhodes has recorded three double-double efforts over his last half-dozen outings. The rest of MState's anticipated starting-five is comprised of sophomores Barry Stewart (12.2 ppg & 45 treys), Ben Hansbrough (10.0 ppg & 42 treys) and Jarvis Varnado (7.2 ppg, 7.8 rpg & 4.8 bpg).

Guided by veteran head coach Dave Odom, South Carolina owns a 12-13 overall record and 4-7 SEC mark after dropping an 85-82 decision at Florida earlier in the week. The Gamecocks are fueled by sophomore transfer guard Devan Downey, who tops the conference in scoring (19.7 ppg) and steals (3.3 spg) while ranking second in assists (5.24 apg). The fellow Cousy Award candidate has made

- The Bulldogs enter this weekend's action having already matched last year's regular-season totals of 17 overall wins and eight SEC victories.
- Including Wednesday's 74-63 loss at Ole Miss, all five of MSU's SEC road decisions (3-2 record) this season have been decided by double digits... The average winning margin for State's five SEC road games has been 16.4 points per road outing.
- After taking on their first three SEC East opponents (Georgia, Kentucky & Tennessee) all at home this season, the Bulldogs will now be on the road for their final three regular-season meetings with SEC East foes South Carolina, Florida & Vanderbilt.
- In contrast, MSU has already completed its regular-season road slate against SEC West competition (3-2 record), with Auburn and LSU still slated to visit Humphrey Coliseum.
- Four of the prior eight MSU-USC hardwood meetings in Columbia have been decided by four points or less with the Bulldogs winning three of the four previous nail-biters (MSU, 79-75 in OT in 2003-04; USC, 68-67 in 1999-2000; MSU, 73-72 in 1993-94 & MSU, 60-57 in 1991-92).
- Already with 209 blocks as a team this season and ranked second nationally, the Bulldogs look to shatter the school's all-time, single-season standard of 222 rejects set in 35 games last year.

MSU LOOKS TO SNAP THREE-GAME SERIES LOSING SKID TO GAMECOCKS

The Mississippi State Bulldogs own a 10-8 all-time lead over the University of South Carolina in a basketball series that began when the Gamecocks joined the SEC in time for the 1991-92 season. State had prevailed in four straight series meetings (2-0 in Starkville & 2-0 in Columbia) from 2001-02 through 2004-05 prior to USC's current three-game series win streak over the Bulldogs.

Last season in Starkville (Jan. 27, 2007), the Gamecocks claimed a 66-63 road victory over MSU to mark State's second straight three-point home loss in four days after falling to No. 1 Florida, 70-67. **Tre' Kelley** paced USC with a game-high 23 points, while **Jamont Gordon** led State with 16 points.

Two years ago in Columbia (Feb. 11, 2006), the homestanding Gamecocks outscored MState, 18-2, over the final 6:35 of the first half to take a commanding 43-27 halftime advantage en route to cruising to an 83-61 triumph at the Colonial Center. USC's Kelley scored a game-high 22 points (6-9 treys) for the winners, while **Charles Rhodes** led four State players in double figures with 18 points. A month later (March 9) in the opening round of the 2006 SEC Tournament held at the Gaylord Entertainment Center in Nashville, the fifth-seeded Gamecocks claimed a 59-44 victory over fourth-seeded Mississippi State en route to advancing to the SEC Tournament championship game against Florida and eventually going on to successfully defend their NIT Championship at New York's Madison Square Garden. **Renaldo Balkman** led all scorers with a dozen points off the Carolina bench, while Gordon notched a double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds for MState.

MSU and USC have evenly split the previous eight Columbia meetings between the two teams, including the two prior games contested at the Colonial Center. In State's first-ever visit to Carolina's current 18,000-seat facility (Feb. 11, 2004) during the team's 2003-04 SEC championship season, including a 12-0 road record, the then-No. 6 Bulldogs pulled out a dramatic 79-75 overtime road triumph over the then-No. 22 Gamecocks after erasing a 12-point, second-half deficit. In that contest, MSU all-SEC senior guard **Timmy Bowers** calmly nailed a game-tying 3-pointer at the end of regulation to send the game into a low-scoring overtime period (MSU outscored USC, 8-4, in OT).

BULLDOGS RECORD THIRD WINNING SEC FIRST HALF OF STANSBURY ERA

Though missing out on becoming the first MSU team since 1960-61 to begin SEC play with a 6-0 record, the Bulldogs' 8-3 league mark (after a 5-0 start) has given them a winning record during the first half of conference competition for the third time during the **Rick Stansbury** era.

first half of conference competition for the third time during the **Rick Stansbury** era.

Prior to this year, Stansbury's 2004-05 State squad went 5-3 during the opening portion of league play to finish out with a 9-7 conference record. The year prior in 2003-04, MSU went 7-1 during both halves of the SEC slate en route to going 26-4 overall (12-0 on the road) and 14-2 in the conference to register the program's first outright SEC regular-season overall championship since 1962-63. MState was an even 4-4 through the first halves of league play during both the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons.

During the Stansbury era (since 1998-99), the Bulldogs have posted winning records during the second halves of the league slate six times previously. Also with 4-4 second-half SEC marks in 2004-05 and 2005-06, the 1999-2000 season (2-6) marks the only time MSU has not posted at least a breakeven (.500) SEC record during the second half of the conference campaign.

MSTATE STRINGS TOGETHER LONGEST WINNING STREAKS SINCE 2003-04

Mississippi State's nine-game overall winning streak earlier this season marked the team's longest such string since opening up the 2003-04 campaign with a 13-game win string on the way to posting a 26-4 overall record and 14-2 conference mark. Having opened his head coaching career at Mississippi State by directing his initial MSU club to an 8-0 overall start to tip off the 1998-99 season, 10th-year head coach **Rick Stansbury** has now guided his State squads to eight streaks of eight or more consecutive victories over the past decade, including a trio of double-digit win strings coming during successive seasons (13 games in 2003-04; 10 in 2002-03 & 11 in 2001-02).

Prior to this year's 5-0 start in league play, the Bulldogs' most recent SEC win streak of five games or more was produced by that same 2003-04 State squad, which closed out the regular season winning 12 of 13 conference games (only losing at home to Alabama, 77-73, on Feb. 21), including an eight-game league win string from Jan. 17 through Feb. 14. MSU's other five-game SEC win streak during the Stansbury era came at the end of the 2001-02 regular season, when the Bulldogs used the momentum gained by that regular season-ending, five-game win string to go on to claim the SEC Tournament title in Atlanta and earn the school's first of four straight NCAA Tournament berths.

MISSISSIPPI STATE TO TAKE PART IN 2008 SEC/BIG EAST INVITATIONAL

In an announcement made last week by ESPN Regional Television, in conjunction with the BIG EAST Conference and the Southeastern Conference, the Mississippi State Bulldogs will participate in the second annual SEC/BIG EAST Invitational next basketball season.

The 2008 SEC/BIG EAST Invitational, an ERT owned and operated event that features four games over two nights, will be played Dec. 16, 2008 at Nashville's Sommet Center and Dec. 18 at Cincinnati's U.S. Bank Arena and will be televised by ESPN and ESPN2. The annual event matches four teams from the BIG EAST Conference against four teams from the Southeastern Conference.

On Dec. 18 of this year, MState will take on the University of Cincinnati Bearcats at the U.S. Bank Arena in Cincinnati. In addition, the University of Mississippi will meet the Louisville Cardinals in Cincinnati. On Dec. 16 in Nashville, the Vanderbilt Commodores will face South Florida, while Marquette squares off with the Tennessee Volunteers.

Earlier this season during the inaugural SEC/BIG EAST Invitational, the then-No. 21 Villanova Wildcats overcame a 21-point deficit and scored 13 points in the final three minutes, including a four-point play, to claim a come-from-behind 68-67 victory over the LSU Tigers at the Wachovia Center in Philadelphia. The Gamecocks of South Carolina beat Providence by the same margin (68-67) in the opener in Philadelphia. At the BJCC Arena in Birmingham, Ala., Georgetown knocked off the Alabama Crimson Tide, 70-60, and West Virginia bested Auburn, 88-59.

MSTATE CHASES UCONN AMONG NCAA'S BLOCKED SHOT TEAM LEADERS

Having tipped off the 2008 calendar year with four consecutive games with 10 or more blocks, including 16 and 15 rejects in back-to-back outings against Georgia and Kentucky, respectively, MSU continues to rank second nationally (behind national leader Connecticut; 8.92 bpg) with an average of 8.36 blocks per game. Heading into this weekend's action, UConn has 232 blocks in 26 games, while the Bulldogs have been credited with 209 rejects in 25 contests. Having averaged 8.92 rejects over their last 12 games, including 10 blocks against Tennessee on Feb. 2 and 10 swats earlier in the year during back-to-back games against Lafayette and LSU, the Bulldogs have now reached double digits in blocks nine times this season. A year ago with 222 blocks as a team in 35 games, the Bulldogs topped the Southeastern Conference and ranked eighth nationally in blocks (6.34 bpg), while also shattering the previous single-season school standard of 175 rejects set by the Erick Dampier-led 1995-96 Final Four squad.

Individually this season, sophomore center **Jarvis Varnado** maintains his position as the nation's No. 1 shot-blocker (4.80 bpg) ahead of Alabama A&M's **Mickell Gladness** (4.50 bpg). Varnado has had 13 outings this season with at least five blocks, including a trio of school-record, 10-block efforts (Kentucky, Georgia & Miami, Fla.). Now with a school-record 120 blocks this season, Varnado stands sixth on the SEC's all-time, single-season blocks list and looks to challenge **Shaquille** O'Neal's current league standard of 157 blocks set at LSU in 1991-92. Amazingly with his 120 swats on the year, Varnado has more blocks individually this season than eight SEC teams. Varnado also already ranks third on the school's all-time list with 187 blocks in just 60 career outings (3.12 bpg).

MSU AND HOYAS BATTLE FOR TOP SPOT IN FG PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Having limited seven of their 11 SEC opponents to less than 40 percent shooting from the field, including 21.2 percent by LSU and 24.6 percent by Georgia in back-to-back outings last month, as

including 21.2 percent by LSU and 24.6 percent by Georgia in back-to-back outings last month, as well as holding the opposition to a collective 36.0 percent (341-of-947 FGs) accuracy mark from the field over the last 15 games, the Bulldogs continue to rank second among the nation's team leaders in field-goal percentage defense (.369) behind Georgetown (.360).

This season, the Bulldogs have yet to allow an opponent to shoot 50 percent from the field (South Alabama shot 49.1%). In fact, 15 of MSU's 25 foes have been held under 40 percent field-goal shooting on the year, including four opponents held under 30 percent. The Bulldogs limited their first three opponents of the 2008 calendar year — Georgia (16-65 FGs for 24.6%), LSU (14-66 FGs for 21.2%) and Lafayette (19-72 FGs for 26.4%) — all below the 30-percent mark from the field. MState also held Louisiana Tech to just 27.4 percent accuracy (17-62 FGs) from the field in the season opener. On the season, six MSU foes have been limited to less than 20 made field goals in a game, including Georgia (16), LSU (14) and Lafayette (19), as well as Lovola Marymount (19), UC Irvine (19) and ing Georgia (16), LSU (14) and Lafayette (19), as well as Loyola Marymount (19), UC Irvine (19) and Louisiana Tech (17).

MSU'S JAMONT GORDON TABBED FOR PAIR OF PRESTIGIOUS AWARDS

Mississippi State junior all-America candidate **Jamont Gordon** has been selected as a midseason top 30 candidate for this year's John R. Wooden Award, as well as being named one of 16 national finalists for the 2008 Bob Cousy Award presented by The Hartford, which is annually presented to

Gordon ranks fifth in the SEC in scoring (17.8 ppg), fourth in assists (4.76 apg) and 15th in rebounding (6.4 rpg) for all games. In conference action, he stands fourth in scoring (18.2 ppg), tied for third in assists (5.00 apg), 13th in rebounding (6.3 rpg), tied for 10th in made 3-pointers per game (2.36/gm), 11th in free-throw percentage (.704) and tied for 13th in blocks (0.91 bpg).

A native of Nashville, Gordon ranks 10th on MSU's all-time scoring list with 1,419 career points, A native of Nashville, Gordon ranks 10th on MSU's all-time scoring list with 1,419 career points, fourth with 435 career assists and 15th with 612 career rebounds. During his 90-game MSU playing career (all starts), Gordon is averaging 15.8 points, 6.8 rebounds and 4.8 assists per outing. He has now scored in double figures in 80 of 90 career games with 22 efforts of 20 or more points (11 this season) and 13 career double-doubles, including last year's triple-double against Vanderbilt.

Having surpassed the 1,400-point mark for his career this week, Gordon presently ranks as the nation's lone active non-senior NCAA Division I men's basketball player to have amassed 1,400 career points, 600 career rebounds and 400 career assists. Seniors Mike Green of Butler and Tony

Lee of Robert Morris are the only other active players nationally to meet all three criteria.

STANSBURY BECOMES 20TH MEMBER OF SEC'S ALL-TIME 200-WIN CLUB

Having surpassed his former mentor **Richard Williams** as Mississippi State's all-time winningest basketball coach with the Bulldogs' 95-70 road win over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 21, 10th-year MSU head coach Rick Stansbury most recently became the 20th head basketball coach in Southeastern Conference history to reach the 200-win mark with MSU's 73-66 home triumph over Alabama on Feb. 6. Now with a 10-year head coaching record of 202-112 (.643), Stansbury now trails No. 19 **Eddie Fogler** (204-165 at Vanderbilt & South Carolina) and No. 18 **Don DeVoe** (211-158 at Tennessee & Florida) on the league's all-time wins list.

In addition to recently becoming the 20th all-time member of the SEC's 200-win club, Stansbury is currently ranked 18th in winning percentage (.643) among the SEC's all-time listing of men's basketball coaches with a minimum of 100 wins at a league school. Stansbury presently trails only Florida's 12th-year head coach **Billy Donovan** among the SEC's current head basketball coaches in

both career victories and career winning percentage (with a minimum of 100 wins at an SEC school). In his 10th season at the Mississippi State helm after succeeding Williams as MSU's 18th head basketball coach on March 13, 1998, Stansbury is presently tied with Alabama's **Mark Gottfried** as the second-most tenured current head men's basketball coach in the SEC behind Donovan.

MSTATE HAS THREE TRIPLE-DOUBLES OVER THE LAST FOUR SEASONS

Including Jarvis Varnado's triple-double performance (10 points, 12 rebounds & 10 blocks) against Kentucky during ESPN's Super Tuesday telecast on Jan. 15, Mississippi State has now

recorded three triple-doubles over the past four seasons - all by different players.

A native of Brownsville, Tenn., Varnado (nicknamed 'SWAT' and the benefactor of a 7-foot-4-inch wingspan) is currently the nation's No. 1 shot-blocker at 4.80 rejects per contest. Varnado was credited with seven triple-doubles as an all-state senior at Brownsville's Haywood High School.

Last season (Feb. 21, 2007) during MSU's 83-70 home win over 17th-ranked Vanderbilt, thensophomore Jamont Gordon totalled 15 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists against the Commodores. Four years ago (Nov. 21, 2004), All-American Lawrence Roberts registered the first officially recorded triple-double in Mississippi State men's basketball history with 18 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists in the Bulldogs' 98-69 home triumph over Nicholls State.

According to research providing by STATS out of Chicago, Mississippi State has accounted for three of the five triple-doubles registered by Southeastern Conference members dating back to the 1996-97 campaign (Florida's **Corey Brewer** and **Chuck Eidson** of South Carolina are the others).

MSU EARNS TOP 25 RANKING FOR FIFTH TIME DURING STANSBURY ERA

With their No. 25 ranking three weeks ago in the *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 coaches poll, coach **Rick Stansbury**'s Mississippi State Bulldogs broke a three-year drought (60 weeks in coaches poll and now 61 weeks in AP poll since AP doesn't have a post-tournament poll) of being unranked nationally in either poll. Earlier in the decade, MState had earned national rankings during four con-

secutive seasons en route to making four straight NCAA Tournament appearances (2002-05).

Most recently, the 2004-05 MSU club was ranked in both polls during each of the year's first 12 weeks, peaking at No. 11 in the AP Top 25 (15th in coaches poll) the week of Jan. 10, 2005. However, three weeks later (Jan. 31), the Bulldogs fell out of both polls and were not ranked again over the final eight weeks of the campaign. Prior to this week, MState was last ranked in the Top 25 (No. 24 in AP

The year prior after only receiving votes for the majority of the non-conference portion of the 2003-04 schedule, Mississippi State appeared in the Top 25 for the first time in the Dec. 29 wire service poll (24th), while having to wait a couple of weeks before cracking the coaches poll at No. 24 in

2003-04 schedule, Mississippi State appeared in the Top 25 for the first time in the Dec. 29 Wire service poll (24th), while having to wait a couple of weeks before cracking the coaches poll at No. 24 in the Jan. 12 rankings. In posting a 26-4 overall record (12-0 on the road) and 14-2 conference mark en route to claiming their first outright SEC championship since 1962-63, the 2003-04 Bulldogs (also known as 'The Road Warriors') were ranked in the AP Top 25 for the final 12 weeks of the season. Featured in the top 10 of both national polls during a seven-week stretch beginning in February, MSU's season-best No. 4 ranking in the Associated Press poll during the weeks of March 8 and Feb. 16 marked the school's highest national ranking in the AP poll since finishing the 1961-62 campaign ranked fourth by both the AP and UPI after posting records of 24-1 overall and 13-1 in SEC play.

In 2002-03, MSU was ranked in the Top 25 of the coaches poll for the entire season, but slipped out of the AP Top 25 for just one week (March 10) to narrowly miss becoming the first State team since coach Babe McCarthy's 1958-59 MSU club to remain ranked in the AP poll for an entire season. Ranked as high as No. 7 nationally in the AP's Jan. 6 poll (No. 8 in the coaches poll), the 2002-03 Bulldogs finished the year ranked 20th in the final AP poll.

Stansbury's 2001-02 State squad became the first Bulldog team to earn a Top 25 ranking since coach Richard Williams' 1995-96 Final Four contingent. After claiming a 74-69 overtime home win over then-No. 6 Kentucky on Jan. 5, 2002, MSU earned a No. 22 ranking in the AP poll and a No. 24 rating in the coaches poll. The Bulldogs fell out of the rankings the following week, but jumped back in with a season-best No. 17 national AP ranking (18th in the coaches poll) after claiming the 2002 SEC Tournament title. In setting a new school mark with 27 wins, the 2001-02 Bulldogs were ranked 17th by AP and 21st by the coaches in the final polls. 17th by AP and 21st by the coaches in the final polls.

MSU POSTS EIGHTH WIN STREAK OF EIGHT OR MORE GAMES SINCE 1998-99

Mississippi State's nine-game winning streak earlier this season, which had dated back to the team's 85-54 victory at Loyola Marymount on Dec. 19, 2007, ties for the fourth-longest win string for the Bulldogs during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99). This year's win streak also marks the eighth time since 1998-99 that MState has reeled off eight or more consecutive victories.

Prior to this season, the 2004-05 State squad was the most recent club to put together an eightgame winning streak. That string three years ago was halted at then-No. 11 Tennessee by a single digit (64-63) on Jan. 12, 2005.

The Bulldogs previously registered double-digit win strings during each of three consecutive seasons (2003-04, 2002-03 & 2001-02). En route to posting a 26-4 overall record (12-0 on the road) and claiming the school's first outright SEC championship since 1962-63 with a 14-2 league mark, Mississippi State set a new school record for most consecutive wins to begin a season with 13 straight victories to open the 2003-04 campaign, including going undefeated (11-0) in regular-season, non-conference competition for the first time since 1978-79. Also that season, the Bulldogs prevailed in eight consecutive SEC contests from mid-January to mid-February to mark MSU's longest regular-season conference winning streak since claiming a school-record 13 straight league triumphs span-ning the 1961-62 and 1962-63 seasons. In 2002-03, the Bulldogs rebounded from a 79-76 season-opening home setback to Louisiana-

Lafayette by winning 10 consecutive contests before dropping a 74-66 home decision to then-No. 11 Florida in their SEC opener on Jan. 7, 2003.

During the 2001-02 campaign on the way to setting a new single-season school standard with 27 victories, Mississippi State opened the year with 11 consecutive non-conference wins. Later in the season, the Bulldogs posted nine straight triumphs, which included successive SEC Tournament wins over Florida, LSU and Alabama en route to claiming the school's second league tourney title as well as a first round NCAA Tournament victory over McNees State in Dallas well as a first-round NCAA Tournament victory over McNeese State in Dallas.

In four of their eight setbacks on the season, the Bulldogs have let late second-half leads slip away. At South Alabama (Dec. 15), MSU held a nine-point lead (58-49) with 6:45 remaining in the game, as well as owning a 13-point cushion (57-44) midway through the second half, before being outscored, 27-10, over the final 10:25 of the game in dropping a 71-67 road decision to the Jaguars. At home against Miami [Fla.] (Dec. 13), MState held a five-point lead (56-51) with 3:36 left before Jack McClinton helped ignite UM on a 13-2 run to close the game and come away with a 64-58 road victory. During the third-place game of the inaugural Anaheim Classic, the Bulldogs owned a six-point lead (53-47) over Miami [Ohio] with 7:06 left before being outscored, 20-7, over the final seven minutes in a 67-60 setback to MU. MSU also held a lead (71-70) over Clemson as late as the 2:23 mark prior to falling by a basket (84-82) during the team's second game of the season (Nov. 15 in Starkville).

Even in SEC home victories the Bulldogs have made things interesting for their fans. Most recently in last week's 80-74 home win over Arkansas, the Bulldogs mounted a 15-point, second-half cushion before the Razorbacks took over the lead by virtue of a 19-2 run. MState maintained its poise with timely baskets and crucial 14-of-18 free-throw shooting over the final 7:30 to secure the victory. In MSU's 69-64 home win over Kentucky (Jan. 15), the Bulldogs held an eight-point lead (65-57) with 30 seconds remaining before the Wildcats clawed back to within two points with nine ticks left. With

With the team struggling from the line throughout the game (17-33 FTs for 51.5%), State sophomore **Barry Stewart** hit 3-of-4 clutch free throws over the final five seconds to secure the five-point win for MSU.

STANSBURY BECOMES MSTATE'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST HOOPS COACH

Now in his 10th season at the Mississippi State helm with a career head coaching record of 202-112 (.643), **Rick Stansbury** earlier this season surpassed his former mentor **Richard Williams** (191-

163; 1987-98) to become the school's all-time winningest men's basketball coach with the Bulldogs' 95-70 victory at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 21, 2007.

The Bulldogs have averaged 20.6 wins per season and have participated in postseason tournament play seven times (4 NCAA & 3 NIT) in the nine previous seasons since Stansbury became

ment play seven times (4 NCAA & 3 NI1) in the nine previous seasons since stansbury occaine MSU's head coach in 1998. Prior to Stansbury's hiring as head coach, the Bulldogs had made seven total prior postseason tournament appearances in the school's 86 previous seasons of competition. In addition, Stansbury currently trails only Williams (89) and Babe McCarthy (88) for career Southeastern Conference coaching wins in school history. Having guided the Bulldogs to the 2002 SEC Tournament title, SEC Western Division crowns in 2007, 2004 and 2003, and an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, Stansbury currently sports a career coaching mark of 83-72 (.535) in regular season conference action. regular-season conference action.

MSU RATES FIRST AMONG WINNINGEST SEC WEST TEAMS SINCE 1998-99

Since 10th-year head coach Rick Stansbury took over Mississippi State's basketball coaching duties from Richard Williams in 1998, the Bulldogs rate as the winningest SEC Western Division team and the third-winningest hoops program overall in the league behind perennial SEC Eastern Division front-runners Florida and Kentucky. Over the last 10 seasons, MSU's composite record of 202-112 (.643) ranks behind only two-time defending NCAA champion Florida [254-78 (.765)] and

In regular-season SEC play, the Bulldogs (83-72) hold a four-game lead over Alabama (79-76) to continue to rank as the winningest SEC Western Division program, while ranking fourth overall in the league (also behind SEC East foes Kentucky, Florida & Tennessee), since 1998-99.

Additionally, Mississippi State ranks tied for fifth behind Kentucky (17-5), Florida (15-6), Arkansas (11-8) and South Carolina (10-9) in collective SEC Tournament wins dating back to the 1999 postseason. MSU (9-8) is tied with LSU (9-9) with nine victories each in SEC Tournament play since 1999, including a league tournament title in 2002 and a school-first second straight appearance in the SEC Tournament championship game the following year.

MSTATE SECURES 10TH STRAIGHT DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN SEASON AT HOME

With last Saturday's key 80-74 home triumph over Arkansas, the Bulldogs secured their 10th consecutive season of double-digit home victories under the guidance of 10th-year head coach **Rick** Stansbury. Now 10-3 at home this season, Mississippi State has compiled a 120-28 (.811) overall record at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 58-20 (.744) SEC home

mark and a 62-8 (.886) home record against non-conference opponents.

With a 10-3 home record this season (losses to Tennessee, Clemson & Miami, Fla.), MState had its seven-game SEC home winning streak snapped earlier this month with the team's 76-71 setback to then-No. 7 Tennessee. MSU's home win string in league play had dated back to last February.

Including commanding MasterCard NIT home victories over Mississippi Valley State (82-63), Bradley (101-72) and Florida State (86-71), last year's Mississippi State team established a new single-season standard with 16 home victories. With the Bulldogs having now reached twin-digit home wins during each of Stansbury's 10 seasons at the MSU helm, last year's State squad surpassed the 13-home win seasons posted by Stansbury's 2000-01 (13-4) and 2001-02 (13-1) clubs at Humphrey Coliseum, as well as coach **Babe McCarthy**'s 1961-62 (13-0) and 1957-58 (13-0) teams at the 'New Gym' (later called McCarthy Gym).

The Bulldogs have now compiled a 33-season composite record of 326-126 (.721) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

BULLDOGS SIGN OSBY AND BOST DURING EARLY-SIGNING PERIOD

Mississippi State University signed Romero Osby of Meridian's Northeast Lauderdale High School and Dee Bost of Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia during the early-signing period. A 6-foot-8, 230-pound forward, Osby was named All-State First Team by *The Clarion-Ledger* newspaper a year ago after averaging 24.0 points, 11.3 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 3.0 blocks per game. The consensus top 50 national prospect helped lead coach Lewis Lightsey's 2006-07 Trojans to a 25-10 record and a quarterfinal-round appearance in the North Mississippi 4A tournament. Most recently, Osby was selected as the most valuable defensive player of the 2007 Mississippi Association of Coaches All-Star Game after posting game-high totals of 21 points and 16 rebounds to help lead the North team to a 117-86 victory over the South squad.

Bost, a 6-foot-2, 170-pound guard out of Concord, N.C., currently competes as a post-graduate player for coach Kevin Keatts at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va. A two-sport stand-

player for coach **Kevin Keatts** at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va. A two-sport stand-out at Concord (N.C.) High School, Bost became the first athlete in North Carolina history to col-lect championship-game MVP honors for both basketball and football in the same season. For his collective efforts last season, he was named the *Charlotte Observer*'s NCHSAA Male Athlete of the Year for 2006-07 after leading the Concord Spiders to North Carolina's 3A basketball and football state championships. Bost averaged 17.8 points, five rebounds and four assists per game this past year in leading coach **Andy Poplin**'s CHS team to the 3A state hoops crown.

- With a composite overall record of 150-70 (.682) during the past seven seasons combined, the Mississippi State Bulldogs are tied for 31st nationally with Boston College (and third among SEC teams behind Florida and Kentucky) among the winningest NCAA Division I men's basketball programs dating back to the 2001-02 season (through games of Feb. 21), according to STATS out of Chicago.
- Since inter-divisional league play began in 1991 92, the Bulldogs are 95-80 versus the SEC West (60-23 at home & 30-55 on the road) and 54-65 against the SEC East (32-19 at home & 14-34 on the road)... In SEC Tournaments since 1991-92, MSU is 5-2 versus the SEC West and 8-12 against the SEC East... During the Rick Stansbury era of Bulldog basketball, MState is 61-43 against the SEC West and 31-37 versus the SEC East.
- During the Rick Stansbury era of MSU basketball, the Bulldogs are: 163-25 when leading at half time (17-2 this year); 142-29 when shooting 45% or better from the field (12-1); 164-51 when the opposition shoots less than 45% from the field (15-6), 168-64 when out-rebounding (or tying) the oppo nent (15-4); 126-22 when holding the opposition to 65 points or less (11-2); 41-41 in games decided by five points or less (1-3); 9-7 in overtime games (0-0); and 16-42 vs. ranked opponents (1-2).

SOUTH CAROLINA 66, MSU 63 JAN. 27, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs concluded their three-game homestand by dropping their second three-point decision of the week with a painful 66-63 setback to South Carolina last season at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

Having fallen at home to top-ranked Florida, 70-67, earlier in the week, State (11-8, 2-4) jumped out to an early 12-point lead over the Gamecocks (12-7, 2-4) midway through the opening period. Despite shooting 50 percent from the field and committing but three first-half turnovers through the first 20 minutes of

play, the Bulldogs managed to take only a slight

36-35 halftime lead after being outscored, 8-2,

over the final four minutes.

MState seemed to regain control of the contest early in the second stanza, taking a sevenpoint lead (51-44) six minutes into the period.
However, the Bulldogs could only muster four
free throws over the next nine minutes in being
outscored, 13-4, during that stretch. Following
Vernon Goodridge's basket at the 14:05 mark,
MSU's next made field goal didn't come until
Reginald Delk's lay-up knotted the score at 5757 with 5:15 remaining in the game.

The Gamecocks went on top by four points (61-57) with three minutes left before Dietric Slater's jumper and subsequent free throws forced a sixth and final deadlock (61-61) with 1.30 left. A Tre' Kelley lay-up and 1-of-2 free throws by Dominique Archie put the visitors ahead by three points (64-61) with 26 seconds left. Charles Rhodes' lay-in cut the deficit to a single point, but Archie came through in the clutch by hitting two more charity tosses to give USC a three-point advantage with a dozen ticks remaining. The Bulldogs failed to connect on hurried three-point attempts by Slater and Jamont Gordon during the waning seconds.

In addition to getting outrebounded by a 37-29 margin for the game, MSU shot only 36 percent from the field in the closing period, including only 1-of-12 accuracy from beyond the

three-point arc.

Gordon led State with 16 points, while Kelley totaled a game-high 23 points and six assists for the winners. USC's Brandon Wallace had 10 points and 16 boards in playing all 40 minutes.

2 YEARS AGO AT USC...

SOUTH CAROLINA 83, MSU 61 FEB. 11, 2006 • COLUMBIA, SC

The Bulldogs remained winless in SEC road action and versus Eastern Division teams on the season by dropping an 83-61 decision to South Carolina two years ago at the Colonial Center.

MSU (12-11, 2-8) held the advantage for most of the opening 10 minutes of the first half, going up by as many as seven points (14-7) with 14:42 remaining. With State on top by four points (19-15) midway through the period, the Gamecocks (13-10, 4-6) scored 10 unanswered points during a two-minute span to move ahead by six points (25-19) with 8:02 left in the half.

After the Bulldogs managed to deadlock the contest at 25-25 by the 6:35 mark with six straight points of their own, South Carolina proceeded to take control of the game by scoring 18 of the final 20 points of the period to mount a 43-27 lead by the intermission. USC's Tre' Kelley had 16 first-half points for Carolina, while MSU struggled with 39-percent shooting and was outrebounded, 21-12, through the opening 20 minutes of play.

Maintaining at least a 17-point cushion the rest of the evening, the Gamecocks never allowed State back into the contest. USC shot 57 percent from the field in the second stanza en route to the easy 22-point home win, while MSU misfired on all eight three-point attempts after the half.

The setback marked State's fifth straight league road loss of the season and was the team's fifth defeat in as many decisions versus SEC Eastern Division clubs on the year.

Charles Rhodes again led MSU scorers with 18 points, while Jamont Gordon totaled 13 points, nine assists and eight rebounds for the visitors. Kelley finished with a game-high 22 points on 6-of-9 shooting from the arc, while Tarence Kinsey added 15 points for the winners.

Carolina shot 55 percent from the field for the game, including 11-of-23 three-point accura-

SOUTH CAROLINA 59, MSU 44 MAR. 9, 2006 • NASHVILLE, TN SEC TOURNAMENT - FIRST ROUND

Seeded fourth in the SEC West, the Bulldogs dropped 59-44 decision to No. 5 SEC East seed South Carolina in the opening round of the 2006 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament played at the Gaylord Entertainment Center in Nashville.

Along with remaining winless (0-4) in Nashville-hosted SEC Tournaments through the years, MSU (15-15) completed the season of conference competition without being able to post back-to-back league wins on the year.

On the heels of their impressive 'Senior Day' home win over divisional rival Alabama, the Bulldogs got off to a fast start with a 9-2 lead three minutes into the contest. However, South Carolina (16-14) outscored MSU, 11-4, to knot the score at 13-13 with 9:49 left in the half. Following a second deadlock at 15-15, the Gamecocks scored seven unanswered points to establish control of the contest. After extending its lead to 11 points (31-20) with 2:06 remaining in the opening period, USC settled for a 32-25 halftime margin.

State came out after the break and cut the deficit to five points on a couple of occasions through the first few minutes of the second stanza. Leading by five points (36-31) with 17:30 left, the Gamecocks scored eight unanswered points to extend their advantage to 13 points (44-31) by the 13:28 mark. A Wesley Morgan tipin basket cut the deficit to eight points (46-38) with 8:19 left in the contest, but a subsequent Bryce Sheldon 3-pointer put USC back on top by double figures for good en route to the 15-point final tally.

Slowed by 17 turnovers and managing only nine assists as a team for the game, the Bulldogs were led by Charles Rhodes and Jamont Gordon with 11 points each. In contrast with 16 assists and only four miscues, Carolina was led by Renal-do Balkman's 12 points. Tarence Kinsey and Tre' Kelley added 11 points and five assists apiece.

GAME #1 RECAP

MSU 75, LOUISIANA TECH 45 Nov. 10, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs tipped off their 96th season of collegiate basketball competition by cruising to a 75-45 home triumph over Louisiana Tech at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

With MSU (1-0) trailing by four points (10-6) eight minutes into the contest, Charles Rhodes' back-to-back dunks helped spark the Bulldogs on a 24-4 run over the final nine minutes of the opening half to give the home team a comfortable 30-14 halftime advantage. The sluggish first half of play saw MState shoot just 32 percent from the field, while Louisiana Tech (0-1) struggled at 22 percent field-goal shooting.

The homestanding Bulldogs continued to remain in control during the second stanza, building a 20-point lead (37-17) by the 16:31 mark. With the visitors getting no close than 18 points (49-31 with 12:21 left) the rest of the way, the cushion increased to 30 points (61-31) by the 7:26 mark and ballooned to as many as 36 points (75-39) before MSU settled for the 30-point triumph. Five years ago in the last meeting between the two teams, MState pounded out an equally convincing 78-38 home victory over LTU.

While moving to 9-1 in season home openers during the Rick Stansbury era, the Bulldogs extended their home winning streak to eight consecutive games dating back to this past February. During that stretch, MSU's average margin of victory has been 20.1 points per home triumph.

Jamont Gordon paced four double-figure State scorers with a game-high 21 points. Charles Rhodes followed with 17 points, while Barry Stewart notched his first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. Kyle Gibson topped the visitors with his own double-double of 15 points and 15 boards.

The Bulldogs had their eight-game home winning streak snapped by dropping a hard-fought 84-82 home decision to reigning NIT runner-up Clemson at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

The visiting Tigers (2-0) led for most of the opening 20 minutes of play. Following a second tie (13-13) nine minutes into the contest, Clemson scored eight unanswered points to take an eightpoint lead (21-13) with 9:18 remaining in the half. The Bulldogs (1-1) would cut the deficit to two points (23-21) two minutes later, but Clemson responded with a dunk and a 3-pointer to reestablish control of the game and go on to take a 39-32 halftime advantage.

The visitors continued to maintain the lead for the opening 11 minutes of the second stanza, before MSU went on a 9-0 run midway through the half to take a 54-52 lead on a Charles Rhodes dunk at the 8:17 mark. Seven lead changes and two ties ensued over the next four minutes.

Back-to-back dunks by Brian Johnson gave MState its final lead (71-70) with 2:23 left in the contest. A 3-pointer by Clemson's K.C. Rivers at the 1:11 mark was answered by a Barry Stewart trey with 43 seconds left to cut MSU's deficit to two points (78-76). However, Tiger freshman guard Demontez Stitt sealed the two-point Clemson victory with 6-of-6 free-throw shooting over the final 26 seconds.

Though Clemson struggled with 34-percent shooting from the field, State did not help its own cause with just 61-percent accuracy from the line.

Jamont Gordon led all scorers with 23 points and added a dozen rebounds to record his 11th career double-double for the Bulldogs. Rhodes tossed in 17 points despite first-half foul trouble. Rivers and freshman Terrence Oglesby paced the winners with 17 points each, while all-America candidate James Mays totaled 14 points, 11 rebounds and four assists.

MState (2-1) scored the first dozen points of the contest before UT Martin's Lester Hudson gave the visiting Skyhawks (2-3) their first points of the game with a 3-pointer at the 15:34 mark of the opening period. UTM cut the deficit to four points (12-8) soon thereafter and kept the contest to within single digits until the 5:34 mark when Ben Hansbrough connected on a 3-pointer to give MSU an 11-point lead (32-21).

The Bulldogs increased their lead to 16 points (39-23) with 3:03 left in the half before settling for a 41-30 halftime advantage. State's Charles Rhodes tallied 15 first-half points on 7-of-8 shooting to lead the way for the home team.

MSU 68, UC IRVINE 53 Nov. 22, 2007 • ANAHEIM, CA ANAHEIM CLASSIC • FIRST ROUND

In their first road competition of the season, the Bulldogs opened the inaugural Anaheim Classic with a 68-53 victory over UC Irvine at the Anaheim Convention Center.

Opening the contest hitting eight of their first nine shots from the field, including their first five three-point shot attempts, the Bulldogs (3-1) mounted a double-digit lead (19-9) by the 13:11 mark on a Phil Turner trey. MSU pretty much controlled the opening 20 minutes of play with its continued hot shooting, though UC Irvine (2-2) managed to cut the deficit to five points (39-34) with under a minute left in the half.

Hitting 58 percent (15-26 FGs) from the field, including 6-of-9 treys (67%) in the opening period, the Bulldogs settled for a 41-34 halftime lead.

After the Anteaters pulled to within five points on two occasions during the first four minutes of the second stanza, MSU ran off 10 unanswered points over a three-minute span to take a 15-point advantage (55-40) by the 12:53 mark. The Bulldogs also stepped up their defensive intensity in the closing period to re-establish control of the contest.

Limiting UCI to just six second-half field goals on 24 attempts (25%) and owning a commanding 27-16 rebounding advantage during the final 20 minutes, the Bulldogs went on to claim their 15-point triumph and earn the right to face 18th-ranked Southern Illinois in the semifinals.

As a team, MState held UCI to 35-percent shooting from the field (only 3-17 treys) on the day, while owning a 43-31 lead on the boards.

Barry Stewart paced four double-digit State scorers with 18 points (4-7 treys). Jamont Gordon added 15 points, while Charles Rhodes notched his seventh career double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds. Patrick Sanders led UC Irvine with 18 points and five rebounds.

The Bulldogs dropped a 63-49 decision to 18th-ranked Southern Illinois in the semifinals of the inaugural Anaheim Classic played at the Anaheim Convention Center.

In a first half that featured five ties and three lead changes, MState (3-2) owned the upper hand for the first 10 minutes of the opening period. Midway through the half, the Salukis (3-0) scored six unanswered points to take a brief 19-15 lead. MSU countered with eight straight points to pull ahead by four points (23-19) with 3:28 remaining in the half. En route to scoring 15 first-half points, Jamont Gordon's third 3-pointer of the half put the Bulldogs on top by five points (26-21) with just under three minutes left before the half.

However, Joshua Bone came off the SIU bench to drill a trio of treys over the final 1:46, including one with time running out in the period, to give the Salukis a 32-28 halftime advantage.

Southern Illinois maintained its momentum by scoring the first half-dozen points of the second stanza to increase the margin to double figures (38-28) two minutes into the half. With Randal Falker scoring 13 of SIU's first 15 second-half points, the Salukis again went ahead by twin digits (45-35) with 13:14 remaining.

MSU's Gordon cut the deficit in half (47-42) with another 3-pointer at the 9:44 mark, but SIU's Bone put a damper on the Bulldogs' comeback attempt by nailing back-to-back triples to give the Salukis an 11-point cushion (53-42) with 8:23 left in the contest. MState would get no closer than nine points the rest of the way, as Southern Illinois coasted to the 14-point victory in advancing to the championship contest.

Gordon, held to five second-half points, was MSU's lone double-figure scorer with 20 points. Falker tallied a game-high 23 points on 7-of-9 field goals and 9-of-10 free throws for the winners, while Bone added 15 points off the Saluki bench with his 5-of-6 three-point shooting effort.

The Bulldogs went 1-2 in the inaugural Anaheim Classic after dropping a 67-60 decision to Miami University in the tournament's third-place game played at the Anaheim Convention Center.

After MSU's Charles Rhodes scored the game's first two points, the RedHawks (3-1) went on a 14-3 run, keyed by a pair of 3-pointers apiece by Michael Bramos and Alex Moosmann, to take a 14-5 lead by the 15:38 mark of the opening half. Spurred by 5-of-9 three-point shooting during the first 20 minutes of play, Miami maintained control of the contest throughout the first period. The Bulldogs (3-3) did tighten things up a bit late in the half by outscoring MU, 7-1, over the final three minutes to cut the deficit to just five points (29-24) by the intermission.

Despite coming up empty on their first four offensive possessions of the second stanza, the Bulldogs outscored Miami, 12-6, through the first five minutes of the half and regained a brief 36-35 lead on a Ben Hansbrough 3-pointer at the 14:52 mark. Following a fifth tie in the opening nine minutes of second-half play, MState went on an 8-1 run to take a five-point advantage (48-43) midway through the closing period.

With Rhodes scoring 17 of his team-high 25 points in the second half and going over the 1,000-point mark for his career during a three-minute stretch in which he scored nine straight points for MSU, the Bulldogs seemed to grab the momentum in pulling ahead by a half-dozen points (53-47) with 7:06 remaining in the game. However, MU's Tim Pollitz answered with back-to-back buckets to get the RedHawks to within a basket (53-51) by the 5:46 mark.

Following a seventh deadlock of the half (58-58) with 1:46 left, Miami's Tyler Dierkers tipped in the go-ahead basket with 1:03 left on the clock. MU's Bramos, who finished the contest with a game-high 30 points, then converted on a three-point play and hit four additional free throws over the final 42 seconds to seal the victory.

Jamont Gordon added 18 points for MState, while Miami's Pollitz scored all 15 of his points during the second half of play.

The Bulldogs broke a two-game losing streak and successfully tipped off a three-game December homestand by posting a 78-61 home triumph over Murray State at Humphrey Coliseum.

Coming off consecutive losses to No. 18 Southern Illinois and Miami of Ohio during the Anaheim Classic over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, MState (4-3) built a 39-24 halftime advantage on the strength of 58-percent shooting through the opening 20 minutes of play. The visiting Racers (3-2) were limited to 32-percent first-half accuracy from the field.

After the visitors cut the deficit to single digits (47-38) three minutes into the second stanza, MSU went on a 17-4 run to increase the margin to a game-high 22 points (64-42) midway through the closing period. The Racers never got any closer than 16 points the rest of the way, as the Bulldogs breezed to their 22nd consecutive December home victory dating back to the 2000-01 campaign.

For the contest, MState shot 52 percent overall from the field as a team, while outscoring the Racers, 18-3, from the charity stripe. The Bulldogs connected on 78 percent of their 23 free throw attempts, in contrast to Murray State attempting just four charity tosses the entire game.

State senior Charles Rhodes tallied a gamehigh 22 points on 8-of-14 field goals and 6-of-6 free throws to post his second straight 20-point effort of the season. Jamont Gordon and Barry Stewart followed with 15 and 14 points, respectively, for the winners. Tony Easley paced the visitors with 17 points and seven rebounds.

Well rested after having a week off from game competition, MState (5-3) built a double-digit lead over the visiting Lions (5-3) by the 11:41 mark of the opening period on a Barry Stewart 3-pointer. In limiting Southeastern to 37-percent shooting and owning a 22-13 advantage on the boards through the first 20 minutes of play, the Bulldogs maintained their double-figure cushion throughout the remainder of the half en route to opening up a comfortable 41-27 halftime lead.

In closing out a three-game homestand, the Bulldogs had their 23-game winning streak in December home contests snapped by dropping a 64-58 decision to the unbeaten Miami Hurricanes at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

The visitors held the upper hand for the better part of the opening 15 minutes of the contest, going on top by as many as seven points on two different occasions. However, MState (5-4) went on a 10-2 run late in the half to take a five-point lead (28-23) with 1:23 remaining. Miami (9-0) responded by scoring the final two baskets of the period to cut the deficit to a single point (28-27) by the break.

Following six lead changes and two ties through the first six minutes of the second stanza, the Bulldogs reclaimed the lead at the 14:29 mark on a Jamont Gordon layup. MSU maintained the advantage for nearly the next dozen minutes and held a five-point lead (56-51) when Barry Stewart nailed his fifth 3-pointer of the night at the 5:29 mark. Despite State's two subsequent turnovers over the next two minutes of scoreless basketball, Charles Rhodes stepped to the line for a one-and-one opportunity with 3:36 left and failed to lengthen MSU's margin.

Instead, UM's Jack McClinton sandwiched his second and third 3-pointers over a two-minute stretch around a pair of Rhodes free throws to give the Hurricanes a two-point lead (60-58) with 1:26 remaining. After Dwayne Collins' two charity tosses gave Miami a four-point lead, Gordon couldn't convert on the front end of his one-and-one with 29 seconds left. Scoring 11 of his gamehigh 29 points (20 in the second half) over the game's final 3:22, McClinton sealed Miami's six-point road victory with a pair of free throws.

McClinton was the only Hurricane in double figures on the night, while Gordon and Stewart paced MSU with 18 points apiece. Gordon also added a game-best nine rebounds and five assists, while State's Jarvis Varnado established a new single-game school standard with 10 blocks.

SOUTH ALABAMA 71, MSU 67 DEC. 15, 2007 • MOBILE, AL COORS CLASSIC

The visiting Bulldogs tipped off a week-long, road trip by letting a 13-point, second-half lead evaporate in dropping a 71-67 decision to South Alabama at the Mitchell Center in the nightcap of the ninth annual Coors Classic.

In a tightly contested opening 20 minutes of play, MState (5-5) held the advantage for the better part of the first half. However, South Alabama's Demetric Bennett put on a first-half clinic by scoring his team's first 20 points en route to a 25-point opening period. Despite his tremendous one-man performance, MSU still clung to a precarious two-point halftime lead (32-30).

After the two teams battled to within a three-point game for the opening five minutes of the second stanza, the Bulldogs seemed to take total control of the contest by going on a 17-6 run to build a 13-point advantage (57-44) midway through the half following a Phil Turner trey. However, back-to-back MSU miscues resulted in five quick points by the Jaguars (7-3) to cut the deficit to eight points in less than a minute.

Following a three-minute scoring drought by both teams, South Alabama continued its amazing comeback by going on a 13-0 run which turned a nine-point State lead (58-49) into a four-point USA advantage (62-58) by the 3:59 mark. Ben Hansbrough temporarily kept the Bulldogs from completely wilting by scoring MSU's next eight points, including a pair of 3-pointers.

After a Jamont Gordon free throw tied the game at 67-67 with 43 seconds left, the Jaguars' Ronald Douglas tipped in a Bennett miss. Gordon then came down and missed a layup, while Charles Rhodes couldn't convert on either free throw after getting fouled on the offensive rebound. Appropriately enough, Bennett sealed the USA victory with a pair of charity tosses.

Bennett stole the show with his phenomenal 39-point explosion, hitting a sizzling 14-of-17 shots from the field including all six three-point attempts, for the winners. Making his first collegiate start, Turner paced MState with 17 points.

MSU 85, LOYOLA MARYMOUNT 54 DEC. 19, 2007 • LOS ANGELES, CA

In the midst of a week-long, three-game road swing, the Bulldogs claimed an 85-54 victory over Loyola Marymount at Gersten Pavilion.

After jumping out to a 14-5 lead six minutes into the game and building a double-digit advantage (21-10) by the 11:50 mark, MState (6-5) outscored the Lions (3-9), 12-2, over the final four minutes of the half to take a 40-22 halftime lead. Bouncing back from a season-low, seven-point effort (1-14 FGs) in his previous game at South Alabama, Jamont Gordon scored MSU's last 10 points of the opening period en route to a 15-point first half (5-6 FGs & 3-3 treys).

The MSU cushion reached 22 points (47-25) less than two minutes into the second stanza on another Gordon triple. The margin ballooned to 31 points (60-29) by the 15:21 mark and never dipped below 25 points the rest of the way. The Bulldogs shot 67 percent from the field in the second half en route to a season-best, 59-percent performance (34-58 FGs) for the contest.

In recording the team's largest winning margin on an opponent's home floor since the 1962-63 season (99-64 at LSU), MState also set singlegame season highs for scoring margin (+31), field goals made (34), assists (25), blocks (12-tied) and steals (14). Defensively, MSU limited LMU to just 33-percent field goal shooting for the game and held a 46-32 advantage on the boards.

With four Bulldogs scoring in double figures, Gordon led the way with a game-high 25 points on 9-of-14 field goals and 5-of-7 treys. Charles Rhodes registered his third double-double of the season (14 pts/10 rebs), while Jarvis Varnado totalled a season-high 10 points (4-4 FGs) along with a Gersten Pavilion-record nine blocks. Shawn Deadwiler led LMU with 11 points.

GAME #13 RECAP

MSU 87, MISSOURI 75 DEC. 30, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs wrapped up their regular-season, non-conference home slate by claiming an 87-75 victory over the Big 12's Missouri Tigers at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

Sparked by an impressive first-half shooting performance by Matt Lawrence, Missouri (9-5) opened up a six-point lead (20-14) by the 11:50 mark of the opening period. Playing without all-SEC senior forward Charles Rhodes (sprained left ankle), the Bulldogs (8-5) came to life and went on a 21-5 streak to take a 10-point advantage (35-25) with 4:42 remaining in the half.

Lawrence's fourth 3-pointer of the half (in five attempts) paved the way for nine unanswered Mizzou points to cut the deficit to a point (35-34). However, State's Barry Stewart and Ben Hansbrough connected on consecutive treys to put the Bulldogs back up by seven points (41-34) before settling for a three-point halftime lead (41-38).

After the visiting Tigers knotted up the game at 41-41 within the opening seconds of the second stanza, the Bulldogs went on a 15-3 run to go up by a dozen points (56-44) by the 14:33 mark. However, Missouri fought back and outscored the home team, 16-3, over the next five minutes and claimed a brief one-point lead (60-59) after a second straight 3-pointer by Stefhon Hannah.

A former Mr. Basketball for the state of Missouri during his prep playing days, Hansbrough temporarily stopped the visiting team's momentum with a key 3-pointer with 8:42 left. A Stewart trey and a tip-in by Jamont Gordon later gave the Bulldogs a 73-66 lead at the 3:30 mark. Clutch 10-of-12 free-throw shooting down the stretch sealed MState's third straight victory.

Stewart posted new career highs in points (24) and assists (7), while Gordon added 20 points, eight rebounds and five assists for the winners. MU's Matt Lawrence finished the contest with a game-high 28 points on 10-of-15 field-goal shooting and 6-of-11 accuracy from beyond the arc.

The Bulldogs concluded the non-conference portion of their regular-season slate by posting a -53 victory over Lafayette College at Jackson's Mississippi Coliseum.

The 24-point win extended MState's seasonbest winning streak to four consecutive games and marked the team's eighth straight hoops triumph (6-0 under Rick Stansbury) in Mississippi's capital city dating back to the 1985-86 campaign.

In this year's contest against one of the nation's leading three-point shooting teams, MSU (9-5) built a double-digit lead (17-7) eight minutes into the contest. The Bulldogs' cushion increased to as many as 21 points (34-13) by the 5:29 mark, but the visiting Leopards (8-6) by way of Easton, Pa., managed to cut the deficit to a dozen points (37-25) by halftime.

Lafayette came out of the locker room to score the first seven points of the second stanza and would later narrow the gap to just four points (44-40) on a layup by Bilal Abdullah at the 15:36 mark. However, MState would come alive to tally 10 unanswered points to go back up by 14 points (54-40) midway through the period.

The Leopards would trim the margin to single digits one last time (55-46) at the 7:50 mark, but the Bulldogs responded with 12 straight points this time to mount as much as a 29-point bulge before settling with the 24-point victory

Entering the contest ranked third in the NCAA in made 3-pointers per game (11.2/gm) and sixth in three-point percentage (.426), Lafayette was held to just 6-of-25 shooting (.240) from beyond the arc and only 26.4 percent (19-of-72 FGs) overall from the field in the contest.

Ben Hansbrough paced MSU with 17 points, while Jarvis Varnado had his second career double-double with a career-high 16 points and 12 rebounds. Abdullah led all scorers with 21 points.

GAME #15 RECAP

MSU 61. LSU 39 JAN. 9, 2008 • BATON ROUGE, LA

The Bulldogs opened up conference play with a stout defensive effort by claiming a convincing 61-39 road victory over the short-handed LSU Tigers at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

Following an early 2-2 tie one minute into the game, MState (10-5, 1-0) went on a 13-2 spurt to take an 11-point lead (15-4) by the 13:10 mark of the opening period. Playing without the injured tandem of Tasmin Mitchell and Chris Johnson, the Tigers (7-8, 0-1) managed to cut a 12-point deficit late in the period in half as Marcus Thornton bombed in back-to-back 3-pointers within the final minute to bring the home team back to with-

in a six-point margin (25-19) by the intermission.

After Anthony Randolph's three-point play tipped off second-half play to pull the Tigers to within three points, LSU then went nearly six minutes without scoring. In making another 13-2 run over a seven-minute span, the Bulldogs reclaimed their double-digit lead in which they would never again relinquish.

After being held to just seven first-half field goals on only 23 percent shooting, the Tigers fell off that pace in the closing 20 minutes by again hitting only seven shots in 36 second-half attempts for a frigid 19 percent. With the Bulldogs connecting on 54 percent of their second-half attempts and owning a 27-19 advantage on the boards in the half, MSU would easily secure its third straight series win over LSU.

In addition to winning in Baton Rouge for consecutive years for the first time in a decade, MState allowed the fewest points to an SEC opponent since dropping a 38-36 overtime decision to Auburn during the pre-shot clock era of the 1982 SEC Tournament.

With MSU still without injured all-SEC forward Charles Rhodes, Jarvis Varnado stepped up to record a second straight double-double with 13 points and a career-high 17 rebounds to go along with seven blocks. Held to just 14 total field goals as a team on only 21 percent shooting, LSU was led by Thornton's dozen points.

GAME #16 RECAP

MSU 60, GEORGIA 49 Jan. 12, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

The homestanding Bulldogs notched their sixth consecutive victory of the season by successfully opening up their SEC home slate with a 60-49 win over the Bulldogs of Georgia at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

MState (11-5, 2-0) scored the game's first seven points and later still led by six points (16-10) with 7:12 remaining in the low-scoring first half of play. Georgia (9-5, 0-1) claimed its first lead of the contest at 22-20 with 3:19 left following back-to-back driving layups by Sundiata Gaines and a jumper by Corey Butler. MSU countered with dunks by all-SEC standouts Charles Rhodes and Jamont Gordon to take back a 27-24 advantage heading into halftime.

After Butler opened the second stanza with consecutive jumpers to put UGA back on top by a single point (28-27), MState went on an 18-2 run over the next seven minutes to break out to a 15-point cushion (45-30) by the 11:23 mark. Georgia responded by scoring nine unanswered points within a four-minute span to cut the deficit to a half-dozen points (45-39) with 7:42 remaining.

A Riley Benock 3-pointer at the 5:21 mark ended a six-minute scoring drought by MSU. State would go on to build an 11-point margin (50-39) before Georgia scored five straight points to pull to within six points (50-44) again with 1:55 left. A Terrance Woodbury 3-pointer with 49 seconds remaining would bring UGA to within a half-dozen points (53-47) one last time before the home team connected on 7-of-8 charity tosses over the final 43 seconds to seal the 11-point triumph and give MState its ninth win in 10 SEC home openers during the Rick Stansbury era.

In setting a new school record with 16 blocks on the day (10 by Jarvis Varnado), MSU held its third straight opponent to less than 30 percent shooting as UGA struggled with 16-of-65 (24.6%) from the field and just 3-of-17 (18%) from the arc.

Gordon and Gaines had 15 points apiece to lead the respective teams. Varnado added nine points and nine rebounds for the winners.

GAME #17 RECAP

MSU 69, KENTUCKY 64 Jan. 15, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

The homestanding Bulldogs moved to 3-0 in SEC play for the first time since 1993-94 with a 69-64 home triumph over the Kentucky Wildcats in front of an ESPN viewing audience at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

After battling through five lead changes during the opening seven minutes of play, MState (12-5, 3-0) grabbed a six-point lead (22-16) following a Charles Rhodes dunk at the 9:13 mark of the opening period. The Bulldogs' lead grew to 10 points by the closing minutes of the half, but Kentucky (7-8, 1-1) scored the final five points of the first half to trim the deficit in half (32-27) by the halftime buzzer.

MSU seemingly regained control of the contest during the opening 10 minutes of the second stanza, building as much as a 12-point cushion (45-33) following a 3-pointer by Phil Turner at the 14:58 mark. Aided by some poor second-half free throw shooting by MSU and back-to-back Bulldog turnovers around the 5:00 mark, the Wildcats managed to get to within three points (56-53) after a Ramel Bradley layup with 5:01 left.

The Bulldogs regrouped and kept plugging away at the charity stripe to eventually go back up by eight points (65-57) after a 1-for-2 trip to the line by Rhodes with 30 seconds remaining. However, an MSU miscue sandwiched between four straight free throws by UK's Bradley followed by a Joe Crawford 3-pointer made it a two-point contest with nine seconds left in the game. Though he struggled from the field (2-of-11 FGs & 0-of-5 treys) on the night, State's Barry Stewart came through in the clutch by hitting 3-of-4 free throws over the final five seconds to give the Bulldogs their seventh straight win of the season.

Jarvis Varnado over-shadowed Jamont Gordon's game-high 24 points by recording the third triple-double in school history with 10 points, 12 rebounds and a school record-tying 10 blocks. MSU had 15 blocks to mark the fourth straight game in double digits. UK guards Bradley and Crawford tallied 22 and 20 points, respectively.

GAME #18 RECAP

MSU 66, ALABAMA 56 JAN. 19, 2008 • TUSCALOOSA, AL

The visiting Bulldogs stretched their overall winning streak to eight consecutive games and SEC win string to four straight contests with a 66-56 victory over Alabama at Coleman Coliseum.

During an opening 20 minutes of play which featured five lead changes and four ties, MState (13-5, 4-0) owned the advantage for the majority of the first half. After the visitors led by as many as six points (14-8) four minutes into the game and then later owned a five-point margin (25-20) with 5:37 left, the Crimson Tide (11-8, 0-4) took a brief one-point lead (28-27) on a pair of Alonzo Gee free throws with 1:52 remaining.

However, the Bulldogs capped off a 7-of-14 first-half shooting performance from beyond the three-point arc with back-to-back treys by Riley Benock and Ben Hansbrough over the final minute to give MSU a 33-28 halftime advantage.

Following a made trey by Bama's Mykal Riley to open the second-half scoring, Jamont Gordon answered with a 3-pointer of his own to ignite a 9-0 State run. Midway through the half, the Tide scored seven unanswered points to cut the deficit to four points (52-48) with 8:21 left in the contest. MState's Barry Stewart responded with a clutch 3-pointer from the corner to halt the Bama run.

Four minutes later, Senario Hillman converted a three-point play to once again narrow the gap to four points (59-55) with 3:58 left to play. Back-to-back buckets by Gordon and Jarvis Varnado put the visitors back up by eight points with 2:06 left on the clock. MSU held Alabama to a single point over the game's final four minutes to win in Tuscaloosa for the first time since 2003-04 and prevail by double digits at Coleman Coliseum for the first time since 1989-90.

As a team, the Bulldogs drilled a season-high 12 three-point field goals (in 26 attempts), while the Tide struggled with 2-of-14 shooting from beyond the arc. Gordon hit for a game-high 24 points for the second straight contest en route to earning SEC Player of the Week and national honors by FOX Sports and *The Sporting News*. Stewart followed with 16 points for the winners. Richard Hendrix paced Alabama with 21 points.

GAME #19 RECAP

MSU 88, #15 MISSISSIPPI 68 JAN. 26, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs extended their season winning streaks to nine consecutive games overall and five straight to begin SEC play by claiming an 88-68 home triumph over No. 15 Mississippi with 10,421 fans on hand at Humphrey Coliseum.

After battling through six lead changes and two ties during the opening 10 minutes of play, MState (14-5, 5-0) scored seven unanswered points over a four-minute span to take a 28-21 lead with 6:06 remaining in the first half. The Rebels (15-3, 2-3) would cut the deficit to three points (34-31) with two minutes left, but the Bulldogs scored the final four points of the half to take a 38-31 halftime advantage.

MSU's lead was not seriously challenged the rest of the contest, as they took a trio of 10-point leads during the opening five minutes of the second stanza. After Ole Miss cut the deficit to seven points (49-42) at the 14:42 mark, State's Jamont Gordon converted a three-point play and then followed with a message-sending dunk to give the Bulldogs a 13-point cushion (55-42) with 13:12 left in the contest.

With the home team shooting 69 percent from the field in the second half and fueled by Charles Rhodes' 18 second-half points, the Bulldogs maintained their double-digit cushion over the final 14 minutes of the contest. The 20-point victory marked MSU's 10th consecutive home triumph over Ole Miss during the Rick Stansbury era and gave the Bulldogs their seventh straight SEC home win dating back to last February.

As a team, MSU shot 57 percent from the field for the game, along with holding UM to just 37 percent accuracy. Rhodes paced five doubledigit State scorers with a game-high 26 points on 12-of-14 shooting, while Dwayne Curtis had 18 points and 11 rebounds for the visitors.

GAME #20 RECAP

ARKANSAS 78, #25 MSU 58 JAN. 30, 2008 • FAYETTEVILLE, AR

Ranked in the nation's Top 25 for the first time in three years, the 25th-ranked Bulldogs had their nine-game overall winning streak and five-game SEC win string snapped by dropping a 78-58 decision to the Arkansas Razorbacks at Bud Walton Arena.

Keyed by Jamont Gordon's 10 points through the opening eight minutes of play, MState (14-6, 5-1) held a four-point lead (11-7) at the 12:18 mark. With the Razorbacks (15-5, 4-2) playing without starter and Jackson, Miss., native Charles Thomas because of a suspension, senior forward Sonny Weems sparked a 14-0 Arkansas run by hitting three straight 3-pointers to give the home team a 21-11 advantage midway through the half.

MSU cut the deficit in half within a minute, but the Razorbacks responded by reclaiming a double-digit lead (27-16) with 6:43 left in the half. With Arkansas owning a 22-15 rebounding advantage and the Bulldogs saddled with 13 first-half turnovers, the Hogs owned a comfortable 43-28 halftime cushion.

MSU got off the deck and scored the first eight points of the second stanza to cut the margin to seven points (43-36) following a Phil Turner 3-pointer at the 16:02 mark. However, it was Weems yet again who ignited a spark for the home team by hitting a jumper and a 3-pointer to push the lead back up to double figures. The Razorbacks' cushion stayed at twin digits for the final 15 minutes of the contest, as MState suffered its first 20-point defeat since dropping an 83-61 decision at South Carolina on Feb. 11, 2006.

Though limiting Arkansas to 36 percent shooting for the contest, the Bulldogs were outrebounded, 41-35, and outscored by 13 points at the free throw line. MSU was also credited with 22 turnovers and only five assists on the evening.

Gordon finished with a game-high 24 points, while Charles Rhodes posted a double-double with 11 points and 15 rebounds for the visitors. Weems tallied 22 points, including 5-of-10 accuracy from beyond the three-point arc, and Patrick Beverley registered his own double-double with 19 points and 10 boards for the winners.

#7 Tennessee 76, #25 MSU 71 Feb. 2, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

Despite a valiant second-half comeback, the 25th-ranked Bulldogs dropped a 76-71 home decision to the seventh-ranked Tennessee Volunteers at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

Bidding for their first win over a top 10ranked team since 2002, the homestanding Bulldogs (14-7, 5-2) jumped out to an early 8-2 lead three minutes into the contest. However, a 9-1 Tennessee run over a two-minute span later in the half gave the Volunteers (19-2, 6-1) a fivepoint lead (16-11) at the 10:34 mark.

An 8-2 MState run, capped by a Barry Stewart 3-pointer, put the home team back on top briefly before the visitors scored seven unanswered points to go back up by six points (25-19) with 6:53 left in the half. The Volunteers used 8-of-16 three-point shooting through the opening 20 minutes of play to acquire a 36-27 halftime lead.

Tennessee maintained control of the contest through the first 13 minutes of the second stanza before MSU's perimeter shooting suddenly came alive. The first of three straight Stewart treys coming at the 6:15 mark ignited a 24-9 Bulldog run that would set up some last-minute dramatics. For nearly a six-minute period, Stewart and fellow Tennessee native Jamont Gordon combined for 7-of-8 three-point shooting to pull the Bulldogs from 17 points down (64-47) to within a basket (73-71) on Stewart's career-high sixth trey with 43 seconds remaining in the contest.

After UT's Wayne Chism misfired on the front end of a 1-and-1 with 34 seconds left, MSU committed a turnover to give the ball back. State got another chance when Jordan Howell only made 1-of-2 free throws with 15 seconds left, but Gordon's trey attempt with seven ticks on the clock was off target. Howell sealed the Vols' road victory with two free throws in the final seconds.

Stewart finished with a game-high 21 points on 6-of-8 treys, while Chris Lofton paced the winners with 20 points. The two teams combined for 22 made 3-pointers in the contest, while UT benefitted from a 42-32 rebounding advantage.

sional rival Alabama at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum. Snapping a two-game losing skid with the seven-point home win over the Crimson Tide, MSU (15-7) closed out the first half of the regular-season conference slate with a 6-2 league mark.

During a fairly sluggish first half of play, the Bulldogs built an eight-point lead (16-8) by the 9:19 mark. Alabama (13-10, 2-6) would battle back to tie up the contest two more times late in the half and even take a brief two-point edge (27-25) with 4:23 left. State's Barry Stewart responded with a 3-pointer to help the home team to a four-point lead (33-29) at the intermission.

The Bulldog's maintained their lead throughout the second stanza, opening up as much as an 11-point advantage (56-45) midway through the period. A minute later, MSU's Jarvis Varnado put back a missed Charles Rhodes jumper to give the Bulldogs a four-point lead with 2:27 left. After the two teams traded free throws, MState's Jamont Gordon converted on a pair of charity tosses to lengthen the margin to six points (70-64) with 48 seconds remaining. Following a Mikhail Torrance layup, Gordon missed the second of two free throws. However, Rhodes pulled down the missed second attempt and went to the line, but he failed to connect on either free throw.

With a chance to cut into the deficit, the Tide misfired on two shot attempts on its ensuing possession, which ultimately ended with a turnover. The Bulldogs sealed their first season series sweep of Bama since 1998-99 by hitting two more free throws over the final 22 seconds.

Holding Alabama to just 36 percent shooting for the game, MSU was paced by Gordon and Rhodes with 17 points apiece. Gordon tied his career high with 10 assists to post his second double-double of the season. Gee led a quintet of double-digit Bama scorers with 16 points, but struggled with just 4-of-18 from the field.

The visiting Bulldogs tipped off the second half of their regular-season conference slate in impressive fashion by claiming a convincing 83-64 road victory over the undermanned Auburn Tigers at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum.

Leading comfortably from the opening tip-off to the final buzzer, MState (16-7, 7-2) scored the first 10 points of the contest en route to jumping out to a 19-4 advantage by the 15:43 mark of the first period. The MSU cushion stayed at double figures for the remainder of the half and throughout the second stanza. Auburn (12-10, 2-7) cut the deficit to 10 points (27-17) on a three-point play by Frank Tolbert at the 8:22 mark. However, the Bulldogs scored six unanswered points to push the margin back up to 16 points.

push the margin back up to 16 points.

Despite 12 first-half turnovers, MSU outshot the Tigers 57 percent to 29 percent in addition to owning a commanding 26-8 rebounding advantage en route to posting a 44-29 halftime bulge.

The State lead ballooned to 20 points (52-32) three minutes into the second stanza. The Tigers did muster one last comeback attempt midway through the closing period when a Quantez Robertson layup capped a 7-0 Auburn run to cut the deficit back to 10 points (60-50) with 11:33 remaining. However, a Jamont Gordon 3-pointer put a halt to the momentum, and the Bulldogs went back up by 20 points (72-52) at the 6:57 mark on a Ben Hansbrough layup. The MSU lead grew to as many as 23 points (83-60) after a Hansbrough trey with two minutes left, before the visitors coasted to their third league road triumph in four SEC outings on the season.

For the contest, the Bulldogs shot 52 percent from the field, including 10-of-23 accuracy from beyond the arc, and managed a season-best 89 percent from the charity stripe. Defensively, MSU limited Auburn to just 34 percent shooting for the game and owned a commanding 46-27 rebounding advantage.

Gordon (24 points & 13 rebounds) and Charles Rhodes (17/10) both notched double-doubles for the winners, while Rasheem Barrett led Auburn with 18 points.

GAME #24 RECAP

MSU 80, ARKANSAS 74 Feb. 16, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

The homestanding Bulldogs survived a second-half scare and extended their SEC Western Division lead to two games over second-place Arkansas by claiming an 80-74 victory over the Razorbacks at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

With Charles Rhodes scoring 15 of the team's first 20 points through the opening six minutes of the game, MState (17-7, 8-2) grabbed an early nine-point advantage (22-13) by the 13:35 mark. Arkansas (17-7, 6-4) cut the deficit to four points on a couple of occasions, before the Bulldogs reclaimed a double-digit lead (32-22) on a break-away dunk by Barry Stewart with 8:18 left.

With Rhodes and Stewart hitting for 19 and 12 first-half points, respectively, MSU also benefitted from a 22-11 rebounding margin through the opening 20 minutes of play to claim a 47-34 half-time advantage.

Following a dunk by MSU's Jarvis Varnado to begin the second-half scoring, the Razorbacks went on a 19-2 run over the next five minutes to turn a 15-point deficit into a two-point lead (53-51) by the 13:54 mark. Arkansas went up by as many as four points (60-56) with 11:24 remaining, but the Bulldogs would regroup to force four deadlocks over a critical four-minute span.

Seven unanswered points by the home team put State on top by five points (73-68) with 3:56 left. The Razorbacks managed to cut the deficit to three points a couple of times down the stretch, but the Bulldogs finished off the game at the charity stripe. Hitting 23-of-29 from the line on the day, MSU converted on 14-of-18 free throws over the final 7:30 and went on to claim its eighth straight home victory over Arkansas.

With the Bulldogs outscoring the visitors, 23-8, from the line for the game, Rhodes and Stewart paced the winners with 24 and 19 points, respectively. Varnado notched his fourth double-double of the year with 10 points and 10 rebounds, while Jamont Gordon added nine points, eight boards and eight assists. Former MSU transfer Gary Ervin led a quartet of double-digit Arkansas scorers with 15 points off the bench.

GAME #25 RECAP

MISSISSIPPI 74, MSU 63 Feb. 20, 2008 • Oxford, MS

The Bulldogs had their three-game winning streak snapped by dropping a 74-63 road decision to the rejuvenated Mississippi Rebels at UM's Tad Smith Coliseum.

In what started out as a high-octane offensive slugfest, the two teams combined for 35 points through the opening five minutes of action. State's Jamont Gordon traded 3-pointers with Ole Miss' Chris Warren to give the visitors a 19-16 lead by the 15:02 mark of the opening period. Gordon's trey started a 7-0 MSU run that gave the Bulldogs (17-8, 8-3) a 23-16 lead with 12:19 left.

Midway through the half, the Rebels (18-7, 4-7) responded with seven unanswered points of their own to take back the lead. In a half that featured six ties and three lead changes, Ole Miss secured a 35-30 halftime lead primarily on the strength of a commanding 28-17 rebounding advantage through the opening 20 minutes.

The Rebels maintained control of the contest throughout the second stanza, upping their margin to double digits (51-40) by the 10:55 mark. MState did make one final push by mounting a 9-2 run that cut an 11-point deficit to just four points (61-57) after a Ben Hansbrough 3-pointer with 4:51 remaining. However, the Bulldogs misfired on their next three shot attempts and committed two costly turnovers over the next two minutes to put an end to any final comeback attempt. Meanwhile, UM's lead returned to double figures (67-57) with 2:32 remaining and ultimately resulted in an 11-point Ole Miss victory.

The Bulldogs were limited to just 38 percent shooting from the field for the game, including only 6-of-23 (26%) from beyond the arc, and but 52 percent from the charity stripe. MSU was slowed by 15 turnovers and had only nine assists.

Warren led all scorers with 22 points on the night, while Eniel Polynice added 14 points for the winners. UM senior Dwayne Curtis notched his 13th double-double of the season with 10 points and a game-high 16 rebounds. Gordon paced the Bulldogs with 20 points, but hit only 6-of-17 shots from the field, while senior Charles Rhodes followed with 13 points.

MISSISSIPPI STATE HEAD BASKETBALL COACH RICK STANSBURY

Now in his 10th season as head coach of the Mississippi State Bulldogs, **Rick Stansbury** surpassed his former mentor **Richard Williams** to become the all-time winningest basketball coach in

Now in his 10th Season as flead coach of the Mississippi State buildings, Rick Stansbury surpassed his former mentor Richard Williams to become the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history with MSU's 95-70 road victory over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 21. Stansbury previously spent eight seasons on Williams' State staff prior to being named his successor in 1998. In his 19th season overall with the MSU hoops program, Stansbury has now been associated with 11 postseason tournament teams (7 NCAA & 4 NIT), two SEC Tournament title clubs and six regular-season league/divisional championship squads. With a 10-year head coaching record of 202-112 (.643), Stansbury ranks 18th among the all-time winningest SEC basketball coaches by percentage and earlier this month (Feb. 6 vs. Alabama) became the 20th member of the SEC's 200-win club. During his 10 seasons at the Mississippi State helm, Stansbury has doubled the school's all-time postseason tournament appearances from seven to 14 with four consecutive NCAA Tournament berths (2002-05) along with last year's third NIT showing (2007, '01 & '99). With six 20-win seasons under Stansburry's guidance, MSU has also claimed an overall SEC championship (2004), three SEC West crowns (2007, '04 & '03) and an SEC Tournament title (2002) over the past six seasons.

With his 2006-07 MSU team securing the school's seventh postseason tournament appearance (4 NCAA & 3 NIT) in his first nine seasons at the State helm, Stansbury most recently guided the 21-14 Bulldogs to a berth in last year's NIT Semifinals as well as a third SEC West title in the last five years. Three years ago in 2004-05, Stansbury further extended all-time school marks by directing the 23-11 Bulldogs to a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance as well as a fourth straight 20-win season. Prior to the current decade, the Bulldogs had neither previously reached 20 wins in three straight seasons, made four consecutive postseason tournaments nor earned three straight NCAA Tournament berths in the

During the 2003-04 season, Stansbury guided State to its first outright SEC title since 1962-63 with a 14-2 league mark en route to posting a 26-4 overall record (12-0 on the road) and earning a school-first third straight NCAA Tournament appearance. In doing so, Stansbury was named The Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year, while earning district coaching honors from both the National Association of Basketball Coaches and United States Basketball Writers Association. He piloted the 21-10 Bulldogs to an NCAA Tournament berth in 2002-03 after advancing to the title

game of the SEC Tournament for a second consecutive year.

In his rookie season at the Bulldog helm (1998-99), Stansbury became the school's all-time winningest first-year head basketball coach (20-13). During the 2001-02 season, he directed MSU to a school-record 27 wins, including an SEC Tournament title and NCAA appearance.

Previously as an eight-year assistant/associate head coach on Williams; staff, Stansbury played

an integral role in helping guide Mississippi State University to three NCAA Tournaments, including a Final Four berth in 1996 and Sweet 16 showing in 1995, one NIT appearance (1994), one SEC Tournament title (1996), one regular-season SEC overall co-championship (1991), and back-to-back SEC Western Division crowns in 1995 and 1996.

Prior to his move to Starkville, Stansbury served a six-year stint (1985-90) as an assistant coach at Austin Peay State. Born in Louisville, Ky., and raised in Brandenburg, Ky., he is a 1982 graduate of Campbellsville (Ky.) College and was inducted into his alma mater's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003. Stansbury then went on to earn a master's degree in 1984 from Cumberland (Ky.) College. Stansbury, 48, is married to the former Meo Mellen of Roanoke, Va., and they are the proud parents of three sons - Isaac, 8, Noah, 5, and Luke, 3.


