WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS SOUTH CAROLINA . . .

- South Carolina is one of two SEC teams Mississippi State has a winning record against, with the other being Ole Miss.
- → South Carolina is the only SEC team MSU has a winning record against on the road.
- Mississippi State is looking to win its fourth SEC road game of the year, the most since also winning four in 2011.
- ✓ In five of the seven SEC road games this season, MSU has had the lead at halftime.
- With the setback to Kentucky, the Bulldogs have now lost 10 straight against ranked teams and four in a row to teams ranked No. 1.
- Against Kentucky, junior guard Craig Sword became the 34th player in school history to score 1,000-career points.
- ✓ Craig Sword also collected 2 steals to move into sole possession of 9th place at MSU with 142.
- ✓ Six times this year, the Bulldogs have shot 55 percent or better from the floor. In those games, MSU is 5-1, with the lone setback coming in January at Ole Miss.
- When MSU shoots 45 percent or better from the floor, it's 9-2 on the year with both losses coming against Ole Miss. However, when opponents shoot 45 percent or better, the Bulldogs are 0-7.
- In games decided by 10 or more points, MSU is 8-10. In SEC games decided by 6 or less points, the Bulldogs are 4-6.
- Another key stat for MSU is double-doubles. The Bulldogs have won all three games this season when Gavin Ware has a double-double. For his career, MSU is 9-3.
- On the year, Mississippi State is shooting 69.4 percent from the charity stripe (444-640). But in the final three minutes of all games, the Bulldogs are shooting 79.2 percent (95-120). Leading the way during this stretch are I.J. Ready (20-21), Fred Thomas (14-15) and Gavin Ware (8-9).

NOTES

NEWEST MEMBER OF 1,000-POINT CLUB

Craig Sword's dunk with 18:15 left in the first half against Kentucky put him in Mississippi State's 1,000-point club as the 34th member.

He finished with 10 points in the Bulldogs' 74-56 setback to the Wildcats and now has 1,007 for his career.

Fred Thomas and Gavin Ware are looking to punch their cards for entrance to this elite club, as they need 126 and 136 points, respectively.

HALFTIME LEADS DON'T GUARANTEE WINS

On the year, Mississippi State is 9-4 when leading at the half. However, all four of the setbacks have come in SEC games, including the last two against Arkansas and Ole Miss.

The other two setbacks both came on the road at Texas A&M and at Ole Miss.

ROAD WARRIORS

At Missouri, MSU collected its third SEC road win of the season. That's the most road wins since having four in 2011. It was also MSU's first win at Mizzou in four attempts.

FLIGHT SCARE

Following the win at Missouri, Mississippi State was forced into an emergency landing in St. Louis after the plane lost one of its engines 25 minutes into the flight. As a result, the team spent the night in Festus, Mo., before busing home on Sunday.

20 TIMES TWO X TWO

At Tennessee on Feb. 3, junior guards Fred Thomas and Craig Sword both scored 20-plus points.

Sword finished with 26 against the Vols on 7-of-8 shooting with a 4-5 mark beyond the arc. Thomas had 20 on 5-7 shooting and was also 4-5 from 3-point range.

Then at Missouri, Sword and Roquez Johnson each had 22 points.

The last time MSU had two players score 20-plus points in the same game prior to this season was Jan, 2, 2014, when Colin Borchert and Gavin Ware had 22 and 21, respectively, against Maryland Eastern Shore.

SEASON-LOW 9 POINTS IN A HALF

In the 61-41 setback at Arkansas, Mississippi State managed just 9 first-half points.

The last time the Bulldogs totaled 10 or fewer points in a half was Feb. 13, 2013, in a home loss to Missouri, 78-36.

41 POINTS A SEASON LOW

Against Arkansas, Mississippi State managed to score just 41 points, the fewest this year.

The previous low of 47 points happened three times — McNeese and the first two SEC games against Tennessee and Florida.

On the year, the Bulldogs are averaging 61.9 points, the fewest in the SEC and the 299th fewest in the nation.

WARE DOMINANT ON THE BOARDS

Five times this year, Gavin Ware has collected 10 or more rebounds in a game, including the career-best 17 he had at Auburn back in January.

Against Arkansas on Saturday, he had a game-high 9 to give him 184 on the year.

He's currently 5th in the SEC with his 7.4 average.

OVERCOMING DEFICITS

In its last five wins, Mississippi State has overcome deficits en route to victory.

Against Vanderbilt, the Bulldogs rallied from 12 points before overcoming a 7-point deficit at Auburn, 3 points vs. LSU, 6 at Tennessee and 5 at Missouri.

The 12-point deficit against Vanderbilt was the most since coming from 13 down to beat Vanderbilt in 2012.

LONG-RANGE SUCCESS FOR SWORD

In his first 15 games of the year, junior guard Craig Sword made just five 3-pointers. Then against Ole Miss, he drained five en route to scoring a season-high 27 points.

On the year, he's 19 of 61 beyond the arc after going 0-2 vs. Kentucky.

JOHNSON WITH CAREER NIGHT

Despite the setback to Georgia back in January, senior forward Roquez Johnson had a career night.

He finished with career highs in points (25) and rebounds (11).

After his 22-point performance at Missouri, he's now scored 20-plus points six times in his career, four times this season.

BETTER AT THE FOUL LINE VS. TENNESSEE

After making just 24 of their 44 attempts in the SEC opener against Tennessee, the Bulldogs were 25-35 against the Vols in Knoxville.

In the closing three minutes of the game, MSU was 7-8.

On the year, MSU is 8th in the SEC at .694 (444-640).

MAN OF STEAL

In his three seasons, Craig Sword has collected 142 steals, including the 60 he had a year ago. That's the 9th most all-time at MSU.

He moved into the Top 10 after collecting three against Arkansas.

LARGEST LEAD GIVEN UP IN A LOSS

Entering the Jan. 28 game against Ole Miss, the biggest lead MSU had in a loss was eight points against Georgia.

That changed when the Rebels rallied from a 13-point deficit in the second half en route to a 79-73 victory in Oxford. Ole Miss also rallied from 10 down on Thursday to win in Starkville.

12 AND COUNTING

Against LSU, junior forward Gavin Ware recorded his 12th-career double-double with 12 points and a 10 rebounds.

He's currently 5th in the SEC in rebounding (7.4).

RARE TYPE OF WIN

In his first two seasons at helm, Rick Ray's teams were just 2-37 when having fewer assists than opponents.

This year alone, the Bulldogs have won five games when that stat unfolds — the last time coming Saturday at Missouri. Now, MSU is 7-53 in that category under Ray.

TOUGH DAY ON THE BOARDS

Against Tennessee in the SEC opener, the Bulldogs were out-rebounded 44-28.

That was the most rebounds MSU has allowed this season, while the deficit was also the largest.

LARGEST NON-SEC LOSS AT THE HUMP

Mississippi State's 66-47 loss to McNeese State back in December was the largest margin of defeat to a non-SEC team in Humphrey Coliseum history.

The largest setback ever at the Hump for MSU was in 2013 to Missouri by 42 points, 78-36.

LARGEST MARGIN THIS YEAR

The 23-point win (70-47) against the Dolphins was the largest this year at Humphrey Coliseum for MSU.

Overall, it was the second-largest margin of victory as the Bulldogs beat St. Louis by 25 points (75-50) in Corpus Christi, Texas.

2014-15 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

FEBRUARY SKID SNAPPED

■ The Feb. 3 win at Tennessee not only gave MSU its second SEC road win of the season, it also snapped a 16-game losing streak in the month of February.

Prior to the victory, the last February win was at South Carolina in 2012.

MILESTONES REACHED

■ In the setback at Ole Miss, sophomore guard I.J. Ready surpassed 300 points for his career.

At the same time, senior forward Roquez Johnson surpassed 400 rebounds.

At Arkansas, Johnson reached 800-career points. As a freshman, he scored just 1 point in 45 minutes of action.

SEASON HIGH BEYOND THE ARC

■ Against Oregon State, Mississippi State managed just 49 points.

Yet, the Bulldogs attempted a season-high 23 3-pointers, making six. MSU also attempted 23 at Texas A&M, connecting on 10. On the year, MSU is averaging an SEC low 4.2 made treys (117).

Twice, they failed to make a 3-pointer — Clayton State and at Arkansas.

CAREER NIGHT

■ Against St. Louis, Travis Daniels scored a career-high 21 points.

The junior guard drained 8 of his 11 shots and was 4 of 5 beyond the arc.

He also had a career night on the boards at Tulane, hauling in 9.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

■ Although Mississippi State lost in the finals of the Corpus Christi Coastal Classic, Gavin Ware and Fred Thomas were selected to the All-Tournament team.

Thomas averaged 14 points, Ware 13.5.

D-E-F-E-N-S-E

■ MSU allowed just 46 points versus Clayton State earlier this year. It was the fewest points given up since limiting New Orleans to 46 on Jan. 3. 2013.

On the year, the Bulldogs are seventh in points allowed in the SEC at 63.1.

HIGH STEAL COUNT

■ Against LSU, the Bulldogs collected a seasonhigh 12 steals, the most steals since having 11 vs. Clayton State back in November.

LOW ASSISTS COUNT

■ Five times this season, Mississippi State has been credited with 5 or fewer assists.

Against Clayton State, the Bulldogs had just 5. Then against TCU, they were credited with 3. That was the fewest since also having 3 against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2013. Against both Arkansas State and Tennessee, they had 4, while having 5 at home against Alabama.

CLEANING THE GLASS

■ Against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 17, Mississippi State easily won the battle of the boards, 47-25.

It was the largest margin since being plus-20 against LSU on Jan. 25, 2012.

ALABAMA FLAVOR

■ A quick glance at Mississippi State's roster reveals one very strong common thread — the state of Alabama.

Player wise, the roster features five players from Alabama — Travis Daniels, Demetrius Houston, Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and De'Runnya Wilson.

In addition, the coaching staff has two ties in Wes Flanigan and George Brooks.

Flanigan was an All-SEC standout at Auburn from 1993-97, while Brooks is a native of Lafayette, Ala.

7 PLAYERS SEE FIRST-TIME ACTION

■ This season, Mississippi State has had seven players see action for the first time playing in the Maroon & White.

In the season opener against Western Carolina, Maurice Dunlap, Demetrius Houston, Fallou Ndoye and Oliver Black logged their first min-

Then against Mississippi Valley State, Isaiah Butler and Jeffery Johnson made their debuts.

BULLDOGS INVITED TO PUERTO RICO

■ In November, MSU learned it will be playing in the 2015 Puerto Rico Classic.

The field features Butler, Miami, Minnesota, Missouri State, Temple, Texas Tech and Utah.

BULLDOGS SIGN THREE

■ In mid-November, Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period by inking Quinndary Weatherspoon, Tookie Brown and Joe Strugg.

Brown is a 5-11, 170-pound guard out of Morgan County High School in Madison, Ga., while Strugg is a 6-8, 200-pound forward from G.W. Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala.

Weatherspoon, rated as the No. 2 overall player in Mississippi and 78th nationally, is a 6-4, 175-pound guard out of Velma Jackson. Recently, the Clinton, Miss., native was named to the Clarion Ledger's Dandy Dozen team.

Strugg is the fourth MSU signee out of Carver the last four years, along with Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and Demetrius Houston.

HOME LOSING SKID SNAPPED

■ Not only did Mississippi State open the year on a positive note, it snapped a six-game losing skid at Humphrey Coliseum.

Prior to the Bulldogs' 66-56 win against Western Carolina, their last win at the Hump came on Jan. 22, 2014, against Auburn 82-74.

Against Arkansas State on Dec. 17, it's fourgame winning streak was snapped.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

■ For the third-consecutive year, Rick Ray's staff remained intact during the offseason.

Back for their third year is Chris Hollender, George Brooks, Wes Flanigan, Adam Gordon and Adam Bauman.

ANOTHER CLEMSON CONNECTION

Smith's duties include assisting with on-court workouts, video scouting, academic monitoring and on-campus recruiting.

He comes to MSU after spending the last two years overseas playing professionally.

At Clemson, he scored 986 points, grabbed 459 rebounds, dished out 320 assists and collected 159 steals en route to playing in three NCAA Tournaments.

BUTLER AWARDED SCHOLARSHIP

■ Mississippi State senior guard walk-on Isaiah Butler was awarded a scholarship earlier this month. The first-year player was a member of the practice squad last season.

The Brandon, Miss., native has appeared in five games this year, grabbing 1 rebound and dishing out 1 assists in 14 minutes of action.

STREAK SNAPPED IN JACKSON

■ In the loss to USC Upstate in Jackson back in December, MSU's 12-game winning streak at Mississippi Coliseum was snapped.

The Bulldogs are now 16-6 all-time in the venue, 1-1 under Rick Ray.

THE HUMP'S 400TH WIN

■ On Dec. 1, 1975, the doors of Humphrey Coliseum officially opened with an 85-82 win against Indiana State.

Against Western Carolina in the season opener, MSU collected win No. 400 with the 66-56 victory.

RAY GETS FIRST TECHNICAL

■ In his 76th game as a head coach, Rick Ray was issued his first technical in the win against Jacksonville

The call came with 12:08 to play in the game with the Bulldogs leading 45-33.

HUTTON NAMED 2015 SEC LEGEND

■ Doug Hutton has been named the 2015 SEC Legend.

Hutton, a native of Clinton, Miss., played for the Bulldogs from 1961-64 and led MSU to the historic 1963 NCAA Tournament against Loyola-Chicago.

The All-SEC standout was voted team captain his senior year and averaged 14.8 points.

He'll be recognized at the SEC Tournament next March in Nashville.

SOLID ON DEFENSIVE END

■ Mississippi State is allowing just 63.1 points a game, the 7th fewest in the SEC.

Nationally, that figure ranks 95th.

On Saturday, MSU held the Razorbacks to 65 points. Arkansas entered the contest averaging a league-best 80.0 points.

Earlier this year, the Bulldogs held Arkansas to 61 points, the fewest it has scored all season at Bud Walton Arena.

BEST UNDER RAY

■ Mississippi State currently has five SEC wins under Rick Ray, the most in his rebuilding tenure.

The Bulldogs have also collected three SEC road wins — Auburn, Tennessee and Missouri — which is also the most during his tenure.

LOOKING TO END SKID

■ After losing to Kentucky, Mississippi State has now dropped four-straight at Humphrey Coliseum.

On the year, MSU is now 8-8 at home, including a 2-6 mark at home.

HOLDING FOES BELOW AVERAGE

■ Eight times in SEC play this year, MSU has held its opponents below their scoring average.

In fact, that's been the case the last three games against Kentucky, Arkansas and Ole Miss.

Earlier this month in Fayetteville, MSU held Arkansas, the SEC's top offensive team, to 61 points at Bud Walton Arena, it's fewest output this season at home.

MSU's defense has also limited the Razorbacks to two of their three lowest offensive point totals this season in league play.



Mississippi State battled undefeated Kentucky in a hard-fought SEC game, but the topranked Wildcats had too much offensive fire-power as they pulled away for a 74-56 victory.

Fred Thomas led MSU with 14 points, while Craig Sword added 10 points. With two early field goals, Sword became the 34th Bulldog to score 1,000 career points.

MSU shot 37.3 percent from the field but failed to overcome 11 missed free throws.

Kentucky scored the game's first four points which quickly led to a timeout. MSU recovered and battled back for an 8-8 tie on two free throws by Sword. UK followed with a 12-2 run to take a 20-10 lead with 10:26 left.

The Wildcats stretched the lead to 12 at 33-21. The Bulldogs then got the student body back on its feet with six-straight points.

A 3-pointer by UK's Tyler Ulis as the half expired gave the Cats a 36-27 lead at the half.

MSU pulled within four at 41-37 on a layup by Roquez Johnson with 15:10 left in the game. The Wildcats followed with a 19-3 run to build a 60-40 lead with 8:44 left.

Still, the Bulldogs chipped away at a 24-point deficit in the closing minutes.

Kentucky held a 35-30 rebounding advantage.

Ware led the Bulldogs with nine rebounds, while Houston had a career-high eight points.
