WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS SOUTH CAROLINA . . .

- ✓ Mississippi State has won five-straight games in this series, currently its longest streak against any SEC team.
- ✓ The Bulldogs have a 65.2 winning percentage against South Carolina, their highest against any SEC team.
- ✓ The only SEC team on the road MSU has a winning record against is South Carolina (6-4). MSU has won the last two at Colonial Life Arena by an average of 9.0 points.
- ✓ USC is one of three SEC teams the Bulldogs have a winning record against. The other two are Ole Miss and Georgia.
- ✓ MSU is aiming for its 17th 20-plus win season in school history. Of the first 16, eight have come under **Rick Stansbury's** watch.
- ✓ In the loss at Alabama, MSU had season lows in points (50), field goals made (18) and attempted (47). The 17-point setback was also the largest margin of defeat this year.
- ✓ In the Bulldogs' current five-game losing skid, they've had the lead or been tied at the half four times.
- ✓ Also during the losing streak, MSU is minus-8.1 in the scoring margin and minus-4.2 in rebounding. The Dogs are also committing 13.5 turnovers and forcing 9.3 turnovers.
- ✓ **Dee Bost** is 4th in the MSU record books with 228 made 3-pointers and 2nd with 661 attempted 3s. He's also 6th with 393 made free throws and 5th with 542 attempts.
- ✓ **Arnett Moultrie** leads the SEC in rebounding (10.7) and double-doubles (16).
- ✓ In the MSU freshman record books, **Rodney Hood** ranks 10th with 307 points, 10th in assists (2.0) and 4th in minutes averaged (34.0). He's also 5th overall with 43 made 3-pointers and 5th with 113 attempted 3s.
- ✓ MSU is looking to avoid a sub-.500 SEC record for the first time since 2006.

MSU LOOKS TO END SEC FIVE-GAME SLIDE

◆ Mississippi State currently finds itself having lost five-straight SEC games for the first time this year and the first time since the 2005-06 campaign when the Bulldogs dropped seven in a row.

MSU finished 15-15 that season, including a 5-11 ledger in SEC play.

The slide started with a loss at Florida on Jan. 11 and ended with a win against Auburn on Feb. 4.

The Dogs actually finished 4-4 down the stretch that year.

FEBRUARY DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 4-4 mark, coupled with this year's 2-5 record, the Bulldogs are 56-49 (.5338) in the month of February since Rick Stansbury was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite February record of 92-90 (.505).

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 8-6 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this year's 13-2 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 154-51 (.751) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 144-41 (.778) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 228-41 (17-3 this year) when leading at halftime; 165-40 (12-3) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 242-76 (13-4) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 227-84 (16-4) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 176-33 (11-2) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

SCOUTING SOUTH CAROLINA

Tennessee led from start to finish as the Vols escaped with the road win at South Carolina, 73-64.

The Gamecocks trailed just 34-32 at intermission, but the Volunteers built as much as a 16-point lead in the second half.

South Carolina was 22-of-68 shooting and lost the battle of the boards, 38-32.

Defensively, the Gamecocks forced 21 turnovers and converted those miscues into 23 points. However, the Vols were 24-of-46 shooting and 7-14 from 3-point range. Bruce Ellington led USC with 19 points.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MSU . . .

Tied 25-apiece at the half, Alabama opened the second frame on a 5-0 run and never looked back en route to a 67-50 win on Saturday.

The setback marked the largest margin of defeat this year for Mississippi State, while the 50 points were the fewest of the year.

The Bulldogs also had season lows in field goals made (18) and attempted (47), along with rebounds (27).

Alabama hit 25 of its 47 shots and were 6 of 11 beyond the arc. The Tide also scored 14 points off of State's 13 turnovers.

MSU was led in scoring by Renardo Sidney and Dee Bost with 14 points each, while Arnett Moultrie had a game-high 8 rebounds.

BOST MOVING UP SEC RECORD BOOKS

Mississippi State senior guard **Dee Bost** currently has a school-record 596 assists, including the career-high 13 he had against Ole Miss.

However, it's not just the MSU record books he finds his name.

In addition, his total is currently 10th-most in SEC history as he passed former Tennessee standout C.J. Watson (577) at LSU.

The record holder is Ole Miss' Sean Tuohy (1979-82) with 830. In second is Kareem Reid of Arkansas with 748.

**Bulldog Hoops Turns 100**

● MSU is celebrating its 100th season of basketball this year. The first year the Bulldogs fielded a team was in 1908-09, when they posted a 5-5 ledger. The first game was against the Columbus Athletic Club on Jan. 1, 1909, with Mississippi State claiming a 35-6 win in Starkville. The coach that year was T.H. Werner. It was Werner's only year at the helm.

● On Feb. 11, the All-Century Starting 5 team was announced, as voted on by the fans. The team features Bailey Howell, Jeff Malone, Darryl Wilson, Erick Dampier and Jarvis Varnado.

PRESEASON HONORS

In October, the media predicted MSU to finish 5th in the overall standings. In addition, senior guard **Dee Bost** was tabbed first-team All-SEC.

Two weeks later, the league coaches voted **Bost** first team All-SEC and junior forward **Renardo Sidney** second-team.

BULLDOGS GRAB TOURNAMENT TITLE IN NEW YORK

Mississippi State knocked off No. 19 Texas A&M and No. 15 Arizona in back-to-back nights in November to win the 2011 2K Sports Classic, benefitting Coaches vs. Cancer.

It was the 18th in-season tournament title the Bulldogs have won, while improving their record to 86-73 following the 67-57 win against Arizona. It was MSU's first tournament crown since the 2000 Bank One Fiesta Bowl Classic, when it also upended Arizona.

1,000-POINT CLUB HAS BOST; MOULTRIE JOINS TOO

On Feb. 9, 2011, against Arkansas at Humphrey Coliseum, junior guard **Dee Bost** became the 33rd MSU player to score 1,000 points for a career. He reached the milestone with 3:34 left in the first half on a 3-pointer that tied the game at 25-apiece.

Arnett Moultrie came to MSU after transferring from UTEP, where he totaled 650 points his first two seasons. Saturday at Alabama, he scored 16 points to give him 1,066 for his career.

He's also grabbed 278 rebounds this year to give him 790 for his career.

BOST MOVING UP SCORING/STEAL RECORD BOOKS

Senior guard **Dee Bost** scored 21 points against Georgia to become the 10th player in school history to reach 1,500. He now ranks 8th all-time with 1,581 points as he passed Jamont Gordon against Kentucky.

He also has 189 steals for his career, the third most in school history. Ray White holds the record with 217. Derrick Zimmerman is second with 205.

MOULTRIE IMPRESSIVE IN DEBUT

Arnett Moultrie became the first Mississippi State player to record a double-double in his Bulldog debut since Lawrence Roberts (26 points, 15 rebounds) in 2002-03 against UT Martin.

Against ECU, Moultrie had 13 points and 10 rebounds.

On the year, he has 16 double-doubles, most in the SEC.

HOOD TURNING HEADS FROM DAY 1

Guard **Rodney Hood** became the first true freshman to score in double-digits his first four games since Rickey Brown in 1976-77 when he opened his career by scoring 10-plus points his first 12 games.

The record is held by Ray White in 1975-76 when he scored in double-digits all 28 games.

Hood currently has 17 double-digit scoring games.

BULLDOGS IN ELITE COMPANY . . .

Mississippi State is one of only two SEC schools to post winning conference records in each of the last three seasons. In the "Super 6" conferences, the Bulldogs find themselves in elite company, as only 18 of the 73 teams who have competed in those leagues the last three years have accomplished the feat.

MORE NEWS & NOTES

REBOUNDING STREAK ENDS

Through the first eight games of the season, MSU had out-rebounded all eight of its opponents.

But against West Virginia, the streak ended when the Mountaineers won the battle of the boards, 36-31. Baylor also won the rebounding war, 40-32, as did Tennessee, Ole Miss, Auburn twice, Georgia, Kentucky and Alabama.

Twice this year, the Bulldogs have hauled in 46 rebounds — vs. Troy and vs. LSU, which they out-rebounded by 20. On the year, MSU has a rebounding margin of +3.0.

GOOD SHOWING AT THE POLLS

After losing to Georgia at home, Mississippi State fell out of the AP Top 25 poll.

The Bulldogs then fell out of the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll following the setback at Auburn.

As a ranked team this season, Mississippi State posted a 15-7 ledger.

It was the longest MSU was ranked since the 2003-04 season when it won the regular-season SEC crown.

3-POINT RECORD TIED AGAIN

Against Troy in a 106-68 victory, Mississippi State tied a school record with 16 made 3-pointers.

The Bulldogs also had 16 treys against Arkansas (2-7-09) and St. Bonaventure (12-5-09).

From an individual standpoint against the Trojans, senior guard **Dee Bost** drained 7 3-pointers, one shy of tying the school record of 8 held by Winsome Frazier, Marckell Patterson, Antonio Jackson and Darryl Wilson.

It was the second time he has made 7 3s, the first coming two years ago against Auburn.

ASSISTS COMING FROM ALL DIRECTIONS

In the win against Troy, MSU dished out a season-high 30 assists, the most since having 31 against La.-Monroe on 12-5-01.

The 30 assists are tied for 7th in school history, while the record of 34 came against Chicago State on 12-4-74.

Dee Bost led the charge with 9, while **Rodney Hood** and **Arnett Moultrie** had career best of 6 and 5, respectively.

BOST'S CAREER NUMBERS STANDOUT

Of the players currently in the SEC, senior guard **Dee Bost** is tops in the last four years with 189 steals and 596 assists.

The Concord, N.C., native is also fourth with 1,581 points. Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor is first with 1,819 points, followed by Florida's Erving Walker (1,690) and Alabama's JaMychal Green (1,584).

HOOD IMPRESSIVE OUT OF THE GATES

Freshman **Rodney Hood** of Meridian, Miss., has garnered not only local attention for his play, but national attention as well.

And stats tell the story as to why.

Overall, he's currently third on the team and 25th in the SEC in scoring (11.0), while his minutes (34.0) are third on the team and in the league.

In the MSU freshman record books, he's making waves, too.

Currently, he's sixth in scoring and fourth in minutes averaged.

BOST ONE OF 20 FINALISTS FOR COUSY

On Jan. 3, Mississippi State senior guard **Dee Bost** was named one of 20 finalist for the 2012 Bob Cousy Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top point guard by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

On Feb. 1, the field was trimmed to 11, and Bost did not make the cut.

The winner of the 2012 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Championship Monday in New Orleans as part of NCAA Final Four weekend. Bost and Florida's Erving Walker were the only SEC players to make the cut of 20.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

In 2009-10, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In 31 games last year, the Bulldogs were nearly on the same pace, having drained 246 of their 680 attempts for an 7.9 average.

Through 29 games this season, the Bulldogs are off that torrid pace somewhat, as they've drained 204, including the 6 at Alabama on Saturday. On Dec. 10 against Troy, MSU tied a school record with 16 made 3-pointers.

BOST IN ELITE COMPANY

In the win against Alabama on Jan. 14, **Dee Bost** joined UNC Asheville's J.P. Primm as the only two active players in the NCAA with 1,550 career points, 590 career assists and 185 career steals.

Bost currently has 1,581 points, 189 steals and 596 assists.

Against Ole Miss, Bost dished out a career-high 13 assists, the most by any player in the SEC this season.

HOME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED

The setback to Georgia kept Mississippi State from tying the Humphrey Coliseum win-streak record of 14.

Instead, it will remain tied for the second longest since the doors first opened on Dec. 1, 1975, with a victory against Indiana State.

Tops is 14 straight, which MSU set from Jan. 22, 2003-Jan. 10, 2004. Prior to this season, the last time the Bulldogs won 13 in a row was from Jan. 23, 1978-Jan. 15, 1979.

MOULTRIE'S NUMBERS SPEAK OF PRODUCTION

Three times this year, junior forward **Arnett Moultrie** has scored 25-plus points and had 10-plus rebounds.

The last MSU player to do that was Charles Rhodes in 2008.

The three games **Moultrie** did this are South Alabama (28 pts, 13 rbs), Alabama (25 pts, 13 rbs) and home versus LSU (28 pts, 12 rbs) — all wins.

LSU'S WIN MARKS BIGGEST COMEBACK VS. MSU

Before falling in overtime 69-67 at LSU last on Feb. 14, Mississippi State held a 17-point lead in the first half at 30-13.

It was the largest lead surrendered this year in a loss.

It was also the largest since Auburn rallied from 19 down with 11 minutes to play last year at Auburn to claim a 65-62 victory.

MSU also had double-digit leads in losses at Auburn and home against Kentucky.



Junior forward Arnett Moultrie leads the SEC in rebounding (10.7), while his 16 double-doubles are also the most.

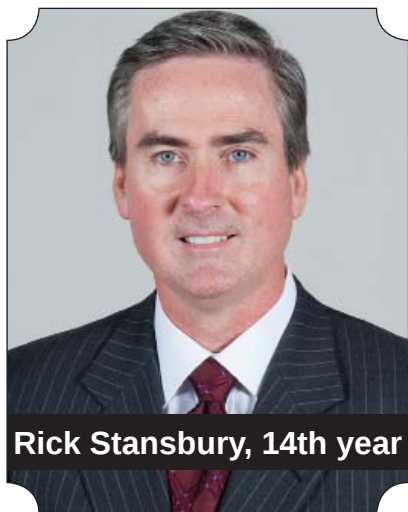


Senior All-SEC guard Dee Bost is 5th in the league in scoring (15.9), second with 62 steals and first with 146 assists.

MEET THE HEAD COACH



Rick Stansbury, 14th year

Consistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront four years ago when MSU's 14th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 14-year coaching record of 291-164 at the Bulldog helm, the 9th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2006-11), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons and another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 17-14 State squad to a second place finish in the Western Division, but missed out on a post-season berth for the first time in five seasons.

From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 12-5 mark last year, coupled with the 14-3 record this year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's 14 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 174-45 (.795) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 81-30 (.730) SEC mark and a 93-15 (.861) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 380-143 (.727) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

In five games, the Bulldogs posted a 5-0 record and averaged 93.6 points while allowing just 71.4 points.

MSU had four players that averaged in double-digits, led by Arnett Moultrie's 16.8 clip. DeVille Smith was next at 15.4, followed by Wendell Lewis and Rodney Hood and 13.4 and 11.0 points, respectively.

From a rebounding standpoint, Moultrie led the way with his 11.2 average, followed by Lewis and Bryant at 6.0 and 4.8 boards, respectively.
