SWORD GOES FOR 33

Craig Sword scored a career-high 33 points at LSU on Feb. 19, to become the first MSU player to reach 30 since Ravern Johnson totaled 33 against Troy on Nov. 26, 2010.

MSU'S STRUGGLES AGAINST RANKED FOES

Mississippi State dropped a 69-59 decision to No. 18 Kentucky on Feb.8, its 8th-straight setback to a ranked opponent.

This year, the Bulldogs are 0-3, with losses to Florida and the Wildcats twice.

The last win against a ranked foe was versus Arizona in 2011 in New York, 67-57.

STEAL PRODUCTION DOWN

Last month, MSU was first in the SEC and 9th nationally with 9.9 steals an outing.

Since then, though, Mississippi State has fallen in the ranks. The Bulldogs are now third in the league behind LSU and Arkansas at 7.8, while they are tied for 30th nationally.

READY FOR 3

When it comes to freshmen in the SEC, few are better percentage wise beyond the arc than **I.J. Ready**, who has missed seven games due to various ailments.

In fact, he is second among players with 35 or more attempts. From 3-point range, he is 16 of 42 (.381).

Ready was 0-1 beyond the arc against Missouri on Saturday.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMPS

MSU hasn't experienced any sophomore slumps this season. In fact, it's been the sophomores who have carried this team.

To date, second-year players are accounting for 45.8 percent of the scoring. Next is the junior class at 24.8 percent.

LOSING STREAKS

As of March 3, 2014

Mississippi State is currently experiencing a 11-game losing streak, which ties for the third-longest in school history.

Last year, MSU lost 13 in a row. It's the first time in school history MSU has a looking streak of 10-plus games in back-to-back years. In addition, the 11-game losing streak ties for the fourth-longest

in SEC play.

YEAR TWO MORE SMOOTH FOR SWORD

Through the first 28 games, sophomore guard **Craig Sword** has established himself as one of the top players in the SEC.

He's 22nd in the SEC in scoring (13.3) and tied for third in steals (1.9).

He did not play at Missouri due to his grandmother's funeral.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES

On the year, MSU has totaled nine double-doubles, led by **Gavin Ware** with seven. Last year, the Bulldogs had just four. Ware picked up his seventh Wednesday at LSU.

Roquez Johnson and Dre Applewhite have accounted for the other two.

SECOND-HALF SCORING UP

In 20 of Mississippi State's 29 games this season, it has scored more points in the second half.

In the first half, the Dogs are averaging 30.4 points, compared to 37.8 in the second half.

BIG NIGHT FREE THROW LINE

Against Florida A&M earlier this year, Mississippi State drained 33 of its 45 free throw attempts.

The 45 attempts were the most since attempting 45 vs. Arkansas on Feb. 27, 2002, while the 33 made shots were the most since 33 against Arkansas State on Dec. 8, 2001.

Because of the many free throw attempts, MSU made just 20 field goals.

TWO SCORE 20 ... AGAIN

Against Texas A&M, ${f Craig \ Sword}\ {\it scored}\ 23$ points and ${f Gavin\ Ware}\ {\it added}\ 22.$

It was the third time this season MSU had two players score 20-plus points.

Against Maryland Eastern Shore, **Colin Borchert** had 22 points and Ware had 21.

The first time it happened came against Loyola, when Sword had 24 points while **Roquez Johnson** finished with 20.

The last time MSU had two players score 20-plus points in the same game prior to this season was at Vanderbilt on Jan. 21, 2012, when Dee Bost had 24 points and Arnett Moultrie poured in 21 in a 78-77 overtime victory.

The last time MSU had seven players connect on at least one beyond the arc was against Nicholls State on Nov. 11, 2004, in a 98-69 win.

ONE AND DONE

■ Against Florida back in January, Mississippi State made a season-low one free throw.

The last time MSU made just one free throw was against Kentucky on Jan. 13, 2007.

OVERTIME . . . AGAIN

■ For the second-year in a row at Humphrey Coliseum, Mississippi State and Texas A&M went into overtime.

Last year in the first meeting with both teams as SEC members, the Aggies claimed a 55-49 win. Back in January, though, the Bulldogs rallied from 10 down to win, 81-72.

It was the 109th overtime game for MSU, which is 60-49 all-time.

DOGS HAVE RARE SUCCESS VS. TAMU

■ Mississippi State scored 81 points and shot 52.7 percent against Texas A&M, the highest numbers the Aggies had allowed this season at that point.

They entered the game ranked 12th and 11th nationally in those categories, respectively.

SWORD HONORED AGAIN

■ Back in December Craig Sword was the Co-SEC Player of the Week, marking the third time

Johnson and sophomore guard Craig Sword : named the SEC Freshman of the Week twice.

SWORD, JOHNSON REPRESENTING

Now, the two are in the Top 5 at MSU in scoring as Sword is tops with 13.3 points and Johnson third at 9.6.

Houston is a 6-foot-7 forward out of Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala., the same high school that produced current Bulldogs Craig Sword and Roquez Johnson. Black is a power forward from Jackson who is currently at IMG Academy in Florida, while Dunlap is a guard from Amanda Elzy High in Greenwood.

BULLDOGS 2013-14 ROSTER FEATURES FEW NEW FACES

■ The Bulldogs' roster features two new scholarship players eligible for this season freshman point guard I.J. Ready and forward De'Runnya Wilson.

The Bulldogs also signed Fallou Ndoye and Travis Daniels (joined MSU in December) last spring, but both are redshirting this season.

Back from injury, though, is redshirt freshman Jacoby Davis, who missed all of last year due to injuries.

Wilson joined the Bulldogs after spending the fall on the football team as a receiver, where he caught 26 passes for 351 yards and three touchdowns.

- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team — Gavin Ware and Craig Sword.



- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament — Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- While at Purdue, Ray was an assistant with second-year Tennessee coach Cuonzo Martin.
- The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2000, the ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006).
- Ray's first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.





MSU scored the game's first five points and never trailed in the contest. The Bulldogs shot 51.7 percent from the floor and used its significant height advantage to post plus-11 rebounding advantage against the Division II Warhawks.

In his MSU point guard debut, I.J. Ready had a solid start. In 22 minutes of play, Ready scored only two points but was credited with four assists and two steals, with only one turnover

For the contest, the Bulldogs shot better than 50 percent each half and hit 42.9 percent from 3-point range. Borchert led the offensive attack with an 8-for-9 night from the field and a 5-of-6 night from the free throw line.

Ware, a sophomore from Starkville, scored 10 points and collected a game-high 12 rebounds for the double-double.

The Bulldogs used defensive pressure to key a 12-2 run early. A free throw by Ware capped the run and pushed the MSU advantage to 21-10 with 8:49 left in the half. AUM hit a couple of 3-point baskets to fight back within 12.

Leading 33-19, MSU ended the half with an 11-3 run for a 44-22 halftime advantage.

The Bulldogs continued the strong offensive play to start the second half, as the lead was quickly pushed out to 56-24 at the first media timeout of the second half.

MSU held a 42-31 rebounding advantage.

Mississippi State used a dominating inside game to beat Prairie View, 71-56.

Gavin Ware posted his third career double-double (15 points and 15 rebounds).

In his MSU debut, freshman guard I.J. Ready added 14 points, two assists and three steals in 30 minutes of work.

MSU shot 42.2 percent from the floor but was plagued by 21 turnovers. Despite the tighter restrictions on foul calling, the Bulldogs did well there, only being called for 19 personals.

Leading 62-55, the Bulldogs followed a timeout with three straight defensive turnovers and three baskets on the other end for a gameclinching 7-0 run.

MSU scored the game's first five points and held a sizeable lead throughout the contest. A layup by Johnson capped an 11-2 run and extended the lead to 18-9. Prairie View closed within five at 22-17 only to see more full-court pressure lead to a 7-1 run and a 29-18 lead for the Bulldogs.

That last spurt helped push MSU to a 38-28 lead at the intermission.

MSU extended the lead to 45-29 on an old-fashioned 3-point play by Ware. Still, the Panthers had a couple of strong offensive possessions where they beat the Bulldogs back down the court to stay in the contest.

A 3-point basket by Montrael Scott whittled the lead to 62-55 before the game-decisive run. That run included a layup by Trivante Bloodman, a 3-pointer by Ready and a layup by Colin Borchert.

MSU held a 51-27 rebounding advantage.

Mississippi State could not overcome a slow start as it dropped a 92-81 decision to LSU.

Craig Sword led the offensive attack with 33 points, becoming the first Bulldog player to score 30 or more points since Ravern Johnson did it Nov. 26, 2010 against Troy. Sword hit 11-of-16 shots from the field, 10-of-14 shots from the foul line, while also having three assists and three rebounds, before fouling out with less than three minutes remaining.
