12 THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING IN THE SEC TOURNAMENT

- ✓ Mississippi State is 5-7 against Vanderbilt in the SEC Tournament and 3-2 against LSU. The Bulldogs last played the Commodores last year (won, 63-52) and the Tigers in 2009 (won 67-57), both in the semifinals.
- ✓ In SEC Tournament openers under Rick Stansbury, the Bulldogs are 8-4.
- ✓ The most common foe in the tournament is Vanderbilt 12 games (VU leads, 7-5).
- → MSU has never defeated Arkansas (0-2) but has never lost to Ole Miss (1-0) in the SECT. The most wins against any one team is Vanderbilt (5), while the most losses are eight to both Kentucky and Georgia.
- ✓ In the last two years, MSU has gone 6-1 in the tournament and advanced to the finals, winning in 2009.
- → Rick Stansbury's 16 SEC Tournament wins are the ninth-most in the event's history.
- → Since 1999, MSU's 16 tournament wins are third behind Kentucky (21) and Florida (17).
- ✓ In his last six outings, senior guard Ravern Johnson has made 39 of his 71 shots (.549), while making 26 of his 44 3-pointers (.591).
- → Against South Carolina, Ravern Johnson attempted 14 3-pointers to move into second place in the MSU history books with 648, as he passed Darryl Wilson (645). Barry Stewart sits atop the charts with 779 attempts.
- ✓ Against the Gamecocks, Kodi Augustus grabbed 10 rebounds to become the 32nd player in school history to reach 500 for a career.
- → Dee Bost is now 75 assists shy of tying Derrick Zimmerman's school record of 514 after he dished out eight against South Carolina on Saturday.
- ✓ Only twice with Rick Stansbury at the helm have the Bulldogs entered the SECT with at least a three-game winning streak — 2004 (4) and 2002 (8).

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this season's 8-6 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 142-49 (.744) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 132-39 (.772) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 211-37 (9-6 this year) when leading at halftime; 153-36 (8-3) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 229-72 (15-6) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 211-79 (11-6) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 165-31 (11-3) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

MARCH RECORD UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 3-4 mark, coupled with this year's 2-0 ledger, the Bulldogs are 42-27 (.609) in the month of March since Rick Stansbury was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1988-89 season when Richard Williams was coaching, MSU owns a composite ledger of 56-46 (.549) in March.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In 30 games this year, the Bulldogs are nearly on the same pace, having drained 237 of their 661 attempts for an 7.9 average.

Last year, **Ravern Johnson** led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 in 2008-09, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

Johnson is nearly on the same pace from a year ago. Through his 27 games, he is 80 of 200 beyond the arc.

1,000 POINT CLUB WELCOMES NEWEST MEMBERS

On Feb. 9 against Arkansas at Humphrey Coliseum, junior guard **Dee Bost** became the 33rd MSU player to score 1,000 points for a career. He reached the milestone with 3:34 left in the first half on a 3-pointer that tied the game at 25-apiece.

In the season opener against Tennessee State, senior guard **Ravern Johnson** became the 32nd member of the 1,000-point club.

In that outing, he scored 32 points to give him exactly 1,000 for his career. He now has 1,442 for his career to rank 13th all-time, while Bost has 1,104 to rank 30th.

The first time he made seven was back in November against Troy, when he hit seven to spark a come-frombehind win in OT despite traily by as many as 11 points in the second half.



onsistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 13-year coaching record of 272-153 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons an another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 13-4 mark last year, coupled with this season's 12-5 ledger, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's 13 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 160-42 (.792) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 76-28 (.731) SEC mark and a 84-14 (.857) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 366-139 (.725) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

STARKVILLE, Miss. - Mississippi State's 2010-11 signing class got off to a resounding start with the signing of wings Rodney Hood and D.J. Gardner and point guard Deville Smith.

All three were named to the Clarion Ledger's prestigious Dandy Dozen, and all three are considered Top 100 players overall nationally.

The 6-foot-8, 180-pound Hood, a two-time Mississippi player of the year, averaged 22.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists last year as a junior and scored a record 34 points in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game. He led the Wildcats to a 26-7 record en route to advancing to the Class 6A championship game.

Listed as a five-start recruit, Rivals.com rates him as the 21st best player overall nationally, while ESPN has him at No. 30, followed by Scout.com at No. 49.

Joining Hood is his AAU teammate, Smith, a 5-11, 160-pound guard out of Callaway.

As a junior, Smith led his team to a secondstraight Class 5A crown and averaged 22.4 points, 4.0 steals and 3.5 assists. He hit the game-winning shot against Provine at the buzzer to win the championship, while scoring a career-high 48 points against New Hope in the North 5A finals.

Rated as a 4-star recruit, he's listed as the 40th best overall player in the country by ESPN and 63rd best by Rivals.com.


Rounding out the early signing period class is Okolona's D.J. Gardner, who is noted for his long-range shooting


