SEC WEST CHAMPION BULLDOGS HEAD TO SEC TOURNAMENT IN ATLANTA

BEC WEST CHAMPION BULLDOGS HEAD TO SEC TOURNAMENT IN ATLANTA

Having earned their fourth SEC Western Division title in the last six seasons and posting their seventh 20-win campaign of the past decade, the top-seeded Mississippi State Bulldogs (21-9, 12-4) will begin competition at the 2008 SEC Men's Basketball Tournament in Game 7 Friday evening by taking on the winner of Thursday's first-round contest between Florida and Alabama. Tip-off time for MSU's Friday night contest is set for 7:30 p.m. ET at Atlanta's Georgia Dome. The first three days of the four-day event will be televised regionally by Raycom Sports.

Owners of a league-high six SEC West crowns since the SEC went to divisional play in 1991-92, coach Rick Stansbury's 21-9 Bulldogs posted their second-best conference record (12-4) under his 10-year guidance this season. Most recently, MState rebounded from a gut-wrenching 86-85 overtime road setback at 16th-ranked Vanderbilt by closing out a 12-3 home campaign with an 84-75 triumph over the LSU Tigers on 'Senior Day' this past Saturday in Starkville.

As a team, the Bulldogs enter postseason tournament play ranked second nationally in both field-goal percentage defense (.369) and blocked shots (8.10 bpg) behind Georgetown and Connecticut, respectively. For all games on the year, MSU also tops the SEC in both scoring defense (65.0 ppg) and rebounding (40.9 rpg), while rating second in both three-point field goal percentage defense (.316 behind Tennessee) and rebound margin (+5.1 rpg behind Ole Miss).

Individually, the Bulldogs are powered by the first-team all-SEC tandem of junior Jamont Gordon (17.5 ppg, 6.3 rpg & 4.8 apg) and senior Charles Rhodes (16.8 ppg, 7.7 rpg & 56% FGs), who presently form the No. 3 scoring duo in the SEC for all games and second-best scoring tandem in league play behind LSU's Marcus Thornton and Anthony Randolph. Sophomore guards Barry Stewarf and Ben Hansbrough contribute 11.7 and 10.4 points per outing, respectively, while combining to average 8.4 rebounds and 5.2 assists

- Earning the West's No. 1 seed for the fifth time since the SEC went to divisional play in 1991-92, MSU owns a 6-3 composite record in tournament competition as the division's top seed (1-1 last year; 0-1 in 2004; 2-1 in 2003 & 3-0 in 1996).
- MState owns a 9-8 composite record in SEC Tournament action during the Rick Stansbury era, including a 7-5 mark in tourney games contested at Atlanta's Georgia Dome (MSU won the 2002 title and advanced to the semifinals both lact year and in 1909) last year and in 1999).
- MSU leads all teams with six SEC West titles since the league went to divisional play in 1991-92 (Arkansas & Ole Miss have six titles apiece).
- With all-SEC standouts Jamont Gordon and Charles Rhodes having both scored 20+ points in each of their last two games of the regular season (Vanderbilt & LSU), both players are attempting to become the first MSU player since Lawrence Roberts to post three or more consecutive 20-point contests (Roberts scored 20+points in four straight games in 2004-05).
- Ranked tied for third in the SEC with nine double-doubles on the year, including three occasions with back-to-back double-doubles, senior forward Charles Rhodes enters the SEC Tournament bidding to become the first State player since Dietric Slater (in 2005-06) to register three straight double offorts in a cocon straight double-double efforts in a season.

MSU TIED FOR FIFTH-MOST SEC TOURNEY WINS DATING BACK TO 1998-99

With a composite 9-8 record in SEC Tournament competition under the guidance of 10th-year head coach **Rick Stansbury**, the Mississippi State Bulldogs are tied (with LSU) for the fifth-most SEC Tournament victories dating back to the 1998-99 season. Sporting two title-game appearances, including the 2002 tourney championship, and two other semifinal-round berths in SEC Tournament play under Stansbury's guidance, MSU ranks behind perennial SEC Eastern Division powerhouses Kentucky (17-5) and Florida (15-6) as well as Arkansas (11-8) and South Carolina (10-9). Including claiming the school's second-ever SEC Tournament title in 2002 (Atlanta) and following that with a program-first second consecutive appearance in the league tournament championship game the next year (2003 in New Orleans), Stansbury's Bulldogs also advanced to the semifinals in Atlanta-hosted league tournaments a year ago as well as during his rookie season (1999).

In claiming nine SEC Tournament victories in the nine prior seasons under Stansbury's guidance, the Bulldogs have surpassed the school's collective SEC Tournament win total from the previous 20 years combined. After the SEC Tournament was renewed in 1979, MSU compiled a 7-19 composite SEC Tournament record over the next two decades (1979-1998). With a composite 9-8 record in SEC Tournament competition under the guidance of 10th-year

years combined. After the SEC Tournament was renewed in 1979, MSU compiled a 7-19 composite SEC Tournament record over the next two decades (1979-1998).

Having won SEC Tournament titles both in 2002 and 1996 (en route to a Final Four appearance) within the last 13 years, MSU joins Kentucky (10) and Florida (3) as the only three teams to have claimed more than one SEC Tournament championship dating back to the 1991-92 campaign.

Through the years, Mississippi State has compiled an all-time record of 20-45 (.308) in SEC Tournament competition, including a 16-27 (.372) composite mark since the league tournament was renewed in 1979. Prior to claiming a pair of SEC Tournament championships (2002 & 1996), along with making a title-game appearance in 2003 and earning semifinal-round berths last year and in 1999, within the last 12 seasons with Stansbury either serving as head coach or as an MSU assistant, the Bulldogs had previously managed to earn only three semifinal-round tournament berths (1986, the Bulldogs had previously managed to earn only three semifinal-round tournament berths (1986, 1983 & 1943) and just one championship-game appearance (1933) from 1933 through 1995.

MSU HITS DOUBLE-DIGIT WINS IN SEC PLAY FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2003-04

The 2007-08 Mississippi State Bulldogs (21-9 overall and 12-4 in SEC play) reached double digits in SEC victories for the third time under the guidance of 10th-year head coach **Rick Stansbury** as well

as having registered their fifth winning season in SEC play over the past decade.

Prior to this season, Stansbury's 2003-04 State squad posted a school-record 14 league victories (14-2 overall and 8-0 on the road) en route to claiming the school's first outright overall Southeastern Conference championship since the 1962-63 campaign. Previously under Stansbury's direction, the 2001-02 MSU club went 10-6 in league play along with setting an all-time, single-season school standard with 27 overall victories (27-8 record).

Over the past decade under Stansbury's guidance, the Bulldogs have also registered winning seasons during regular-season conference play with 9-7 SEC marks in both 2004-05 and 2002-03.

MSTATE CLAIMS FOURTH SEC WEST CHAMPIONSHIP IN LAST SIX SEASONS

Finishing the regular season with a three-game advantage over divisional runner-up Arkansas, coach **Rick Stansbury**'s 21-9 Bulldogs recorded their league-high sixth SEC Western Division title since the league split into two divisions in 1991-92, including their fourth SEC West crown in the last six seasons.

Since the Southeastern Conference went to divisional play beginning with the 1991-92 campaign, MSU also previously claimed at least a share of SEC West titles last season as well as in 2003-04, 2002-03, 1995-96 and 1994-95. With Mississippi State currently leading all teams with six SEC Western Division championships since divisional play began in 1991-92, Arkansas and Ole Miss are next with four SEC West titles apiece, followed by LSU with three, Alabama with two, and Auburn with one.

Prior to last year's shared divisional title with rival Ole Miss, the 2003-04 State squad posted a 26-

4 overall record and 14-2 SEC mark (including an 8-0 SEC road record) en route to winning the Western Division and capturing the school's first outright regular-season conference championship since 1962-63. The year prior, MSU's 2002-03 contingent went 21-10 overall and 9-7 in league play to claim the first of two straight SEC West titles and advance to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight season during the program's recent four-year run (2002-2005) of consecutive NCAA

Tournament appearances.

Under **Richard Williams**' guidance, the 1994-95 MSU team claimed a share of the SEC West title en route to advancing to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen with an overall record of 22-8 and a 12-4 conference mark. The following year, the 26-8 State squad won the SEC Western Division race (10-6 record) for a second straight year and captured the school's first SEC Tournament title on the way to earning Mississippi State's first-ever appearance in the NCAA Final Four.

MSU SECURES SEVENTH 20-WIN CAMPAIGN OF RICK STANSBURY ERA

Finishing the regular season sporting a 21-9 overall record and 12-4 SEC mark, coach **Rick Stansbury**'s 2007-08 Bulldogs have secured the 14th 20-win campaign in the 96-season history of Mississippi State basketball. Including this year's 21-win campaign, Stansbury has reached the 20-win mark for the seventh time in his 10-year head coaching career and, in turn, has been the orchestrator of exactly half of the school's all-time, 20-win campaigns.

Previously, last year's State squad went 21-14 en route to advancing to the national semifinals of

the MasterCard NIT played at Madison Square Garden. Prior to the past two years, Stansbury prethe MasterCard NII played at Madison Square Garden. Prior to the past two years, stansbury previously guided the Bulldogs to a school-record four consecutive 20-win campaigns in earning four straight NCAA Tournament appearances in 2001-02 (27-8), 2002-03 (21-10), 2003-04 (26-4) and 2004-05 (23-11). Prior to that stretch earlier this decade, MSU had never previously put together as many as three successive 20-win campaigns until the 2003-04 State squad went 26-4 overall (14-2 in SEC) en route to claiming the program's first outright SEC regular-season championship since 1962-63.

With a seventh 20-win campaign this season, Stansbury now matches the combined total of 20-

win seasons achieved by his predecessor **Richard Williams** (three 20-win seasons) and the late **Babe**

McCarthy (four 20-win seasons).

Prior to the Williams/Stansbury era of Mississippi State basketball, the school's first four 20-win seasons were all orchestrated by McCarthy, who compiled a successful 10-year (1956-65) record of 169-85 and directed MSU to those four 20-win campaigns, along with four SEC titles, during a six-year period spanning 1957-58 through 1962-63.

MSTATE RECORDS 10TH STRAIGHT DOUBLE-DIGIT WIN SEASON AT HOME

Finishing the 2007-08 regular season with a 12-3 home record (7-1 in SEC play & 5-2 in non-SEC action), the Bulldogs have recorded their 10th consecutive season of double-digit home victories under the guidance of 10th-year head coach **Rick Stansbury**. Mississippi State has now compiled a 122-28 (.813) overall record at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 60-20 (.750) SEC home mark and a 62-8 (.886) home record against non-conference foes.

With a 12-3 home record this season (losses to Tennessee, Clemson & Miami, Fla.), MState had its seven-game SEC home winning streak snapped last month with the team's 76-71 setback to then-No. 7 Tennessee. MSLI's home win string in league play had dated back to last February.

Including commanding MasterCard NIT home victories over Mississippi Valley State (82-63), Bradley (101-72) and Florida State (86-71), last year's Mississippi State team established a new single-season standard with 16 home victories. With the Bulldogs having now reached twin-digit home wins during each of Stansbury's 10 seasons at the MSU helm, last year's State squad surpassed the 13-home win seasons posted by Stansbury's 2000-01 (13-4) and 2001-02 (13-1) clubs at Humphrey Coliseum, as well as coach **Babe McCarthy**'s 1961-62 (13-0) and 1957-58 (13-0) teams at the 'New Gym' (later called McCarthy Gym).

The Bulldogs have now compiled a 33-season composite record of 328-126 (.722) at "The Hump"

since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

BULLDOGS HAVE ENJOYED HOOPS SUCCESS IN ATLANTA'S GEORGIA DOME

Returning to the site of their 2002 SEC Tournament championship, the Mississippi State Bulldogs own a break-even 7-7 all-time tourney record at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. Last season at the Georgia Dome, State knocked off Kentucky, 84-82 in overtime, before dropping an 81-72 semifinalround decision to Arkansas. Three years ago, MSU beat Georgia, 76-65, before falling to tournament champ Florida, 80-64, in the quarterfinals of the Atlanta-hosted 2005 SEC Tournament. MSU owns a composite 7-5 mark at the Georgia Dome under the guidance of 10th-year coach Rick Stansbury.

Six years ago after closing out the 2001-02 regular season with five consecutive SEC wins, the Bulldogs carried that momentum to Atlanta by knocking off 11th-ranked Florida, 62-52, in the quarterfinals before getting by a gritty LSU ballclub, 57-51, in the semis and then claiming their second SEC Tournament championship in seven years by posting a hard-fought 61-58 victory over the eighth-ranked and SEC Champion Alabama Crimson Tide in the tourney's title tilt.

In the team's initial successful stint at the Georgia Dome, Stansbury's first Mississippi State contingent defeated Vanderbilt (76-58) and 18th-ranked Tennessee (62-56) at the 1999 SEC Tournament in Atlanta, before falling in overtime, 84-79, to the 22nd-ranked Arkansas Razorbacks during the

tournament semifinals.

In other previous appearances at the Georgia Dome during postseason league competition, the Bulldogs fell in the first round of the SEC Tournament in 2000 (76-53 to Vanderbilt), 1998 (79-76 to Georgia) and 1995 (80-64 to Florida), and lost in the quarterfinals in 2004 (74-70 in OT to Vandy).

2007-08 MISSISSIPPI STATE HOOPS NOTEBOOK

MSTATE SETS NEW ALL-TIME SEC SINGLE-SEASON BLOCKS RECORDS

Having previously established a new all-time, single-season school standard for blocked shots for the second straight season (243 blocks this season after 222 last year), the Bulldogs continue to rank second nationally in blocks as a team (behind NCAA leader Connecticut; 8.87 bpg) with an average of 8.10 blocks per game. On target to also easily eclipse the current SEC all-time, single-season mark for blocks-per-game average (7.03 bpg by the 1989-90 LSU club), this year's State squad most recently broke Kentucky's previous all-time SEC season mark of 240 blocks set in 1997-98.

Having tipped off the 2008 calendar year with four consecutive games with 10 or more blocks,

including 16 and 15 rejects in back-to-back outings against Georgia and Kentucky on Jan. 12 and 15, respectively, the Bulldogs have reached double digits in blocks 10 times this season. Also in SEC play this season, MSU was credited with 10 blocks against Tennessee and LSU (both games). Individually this season, sophomore center **Jarvis Varnado** maintains his position as the nation's

No. 1 shot-blocker (4.80 bpg) ahead of Alabama A&M's **Mickell Gladness** (4.61 bpg). Varnado has had 16 outings this season with at least five blocks, including a trio of school-record, 10-block efforts (Kentucky, Georgia & Miami, Fla.). Now with a school-record 144 blocks this season, Varnado stands third on the SEC's all-time, single-season blocks list and looks to challenge **Shaquille O'Neal**'s current league standard of 157 blocks set at LSU in 1991-92 (which currently ranks 15th on the NCAA's all-time list). Amazingly with his 144 swats on the year, Varnado has more blocks individually this season than nine SEC teams. Varnado also already ranks second on the school's alltime list with 211 blocks in just 65 career outings (3.25 bpg), trailing only current Dallas Mavericks veteran center **Erick Dampier** (249 blks in 93 gms for 2.68 bpg) on MSU's career blocks chart.

MSU AND HOYAS BATTLE FOR TOP SPOT IN FG PERCENTAGE DEFENSE

Having limited 12 of their 16 SEC opponents to less than 40 percent shooting from the field, as well as holding the opposition to a collective 36.3 percent (469-of-1292 FGs) accuracy mark from the field over the last 20 games (since Dec. 19 at Loyola Marymount), the Bulldogs continue to rank second among the nation's leaders in field-goal percentage defense (.369) behind Georgetown (.364). MState is bidding to establish a new modern-day (post-1964), single-season Southeastern Conference record for field-goal percentage defense currently owned by the 1964-65 Tennessee team (.374). This season, the Bulldogs have yet to allow an opponent to shoot 50 percent from the field (South

ence record for field-goal percentage defense currently owned by the 1964-65 Tennessee team (.374). This season, the Bulldogs have yet to allow an opponent to shoot 50 percent from the field (South Alabama shot 49.1%). In fact, 20 of MSU's 30 foes have been held under 40 percent field-goal shooting on the year, including four opponents held under 30 percent. During each of the last five games, MSU has limited LSU (28-72 FGs; 38.9%), Vanderbilt (30-76 FGs; 39.5%), Florida (22-61 FGs; 36.1%), Auburn (28-71 FGs; 39.4%) and South Carolina (20-65 FGs; 30.8%) all under the 40-percent mark. The Bulldogs limited their first three opponents of the 2008 calendar year -- Georgia (16-65 FGs for 24.6%), LSU (14-66 FGs for 21.2%) and Lafayette (19-72 FGs for 26.4%) -- all below the 30-percent mark from the field. MState also held Louisiana Tech to just 27.4 percent accuracy (17-62 FGs) from

mark from the field. MState also held Louisiana Tech to just 27.4 percent accuracy (17-62 FGs) from the field in the season opener. On the season, six MSU foes have been limited to less than 20 made field goals in a game, including Georgia (16), LSU (14) and Lafayette (19), as well as Loyola Marymount (19), UC Irvine (19) and Louisiana Tech (17). Three other MSU opponents this season (Southern Illinois, Alabama-road & South Carolina) have managed just 20 field goals made.

MSU'S JAMONT GORDON RECEIVING PLENTY OF POSTSEASON ACCOLADES

In addition to being selected as one of the top 24 candidates listed on the official ballot for the prestigious John R. Wooden Award and being tabbed one of 16 national finalists for this year's Bob Cousy Award (nation's top collegiate point guard), junior all-America candidate **Jamont Gordon** has been named to the NABC All-District 6 First Team and to *Rivals.com*'s All-SEC First Team.

Gordon ranks fifth in the SEC in scoring (17.5 ppg), third in assists (4.77 apg) and tied for 14th in rebounding (6.3 rpg) for all games. In conference action, he stands seventh in scoring (17.5 ppg), third in assists (4.94 apg), 15th in rebounding (6.3 rpg), 13th in made 3-pointers per game (2.13/gm), 14th in three-point percentage (.343), and 13th in free-throw percentage (.687).

A native of Nashville, Gordon ranks eighth on MSU's all-time scoring list with 1,499 career.

A native of Nashville, Gordon ranks eighth on MSU's all-time scoring list with 1,499 career points, third with 459 career assists and 15th with 643 career rebounds. During his 95-game MSU playing career (all starts), Gordon is averaging 15.8 points, 6.8 rebounds and 4.8 assists per outing. He has now scored in double figures in 83 of 95 career games with 25 efforts of 20 or more points (14 this season) and 13 career double-doubles, including last year's triple-double against Vanderbilt. Gordon presently ranks as the lone active non-senior NCAA Division I men's basketball player to have amassed 1,400 career points, 600 career rebounds and 400 career assists, along with rating

as one of only two D1 men's players to average 17.5 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.5 assists on the year.

BULLDOGS HAVE THREE TRIPLE-DOUBLES OVER LAST FOUR SEASONS

Including Jarvis Varnado's triple-double performance (10 points, 12 rebounds & 10 blocks) against Kentucky during ESPN's Super Tuesday telecast on Jan. 15, Mississippi State has now recorded three triple-doubles over the past four seasons - all by different players.

A native of Brownsville, Tenn., Varnado (nicknamed 'SWAT' and the benefactor of a 7-foot-4-inch

wingspan) is currently the nation's No. 1 shot-blocker at 4.80 rejects per contest. Varnado was credited with seven triple-doubles as an all-state senior at Brownsville's Haywood High School.

Last season (Feb. 21, 2007) during MSU's 83-70 home win over 17th-ranked Vanderbilt, then-sophomore **Jamont Gordon** totalled 15 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists against the Commodores. Four years ago (Nov. 21, 2004), All-American Lawrence Roberts registered the first officially recorded triple-double in Mississippi State men's basketball history with 18 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists in the Bulldogs' 98-69 home triumph over Nicholls State.

According to research providing by STATS out of Chicago, Mississippi State has accounted for three of the five triple-doubles registered by Southeastern Conference members dating back to the 1996-97 campaign (Florida's Corey Brewer and Chuck Eidson of South Carolina are the others).

MSTATE'S FIRST-EVER NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAM TO BE HONORED

Later this month at Detroit's COBO Convention Center in conjunction with the 2008 NCAA men's basketball regional, Mississippi State's first NCAA Tournament basketball team from 1962-63, along with the 1963 national champion Loyola (III.) club, will be honored guests of the NCAA. Slated for Saturday, March 29 in Detroit, a special private reception and reunion featuring both teams will be held in which a special screening of the "Game of Change" documentary will be shown. This past weekend at MSU, State's 1962-63 squad was honored during a private Friday night

Inis past weekend at MSU, State's 1962-63 squad was nonored during a private Friday night reception at McCarthy Gym, followed by a banquet in the Bryce Griffis Boardroom at the Palmeiro Center. The team was then honored at the MSU Tip-Off Club's pre-game meeting at the Griffis room before being recognized on the Humphrey Coliseum court during halftime of Saturday's LSU game. Guided by the late **Babe McCarthy**, the 1962-63 MSU squad dropped a 61-51 first-round decision to eventual NCAA Champion Loyola (Ill.) before claiming a 65-60 consolation win over Bowling Green at the NCAA Mideast Regional played at the Jenison Field House in East Lansing, Mich.

STANSBURY BECOMES MSTATE'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST HOOPS COACH

Now in his 10th season at the Mississippi State helm with a career head coaching record of 206-113 (.646), **Rick Stansbury** earlier this season surpassed his former mentor **Richard Williams** (191-163; 1987-98) to become the school's all-time winningest men's basketball coach with the Bulldogs' 95-70 victory at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 21, 2007.

The Bulldogs have averaged 20.6 wins per season and have participated in postseason tournament play seven times (4 NCAA & 3 NIT) in the nine previous seasons since Stansbury became MSU's head coach in 1998. Prior to Stansbury's hiring as head coach, the Bulldogs had made seven total prior postseason tournament appearances in the school's 86 previous seasons of competition.

total prior postseason tournament appearances in the school's 86 previous seasons of competition. In addition, Stansbury closely trails only Williams (89) and **Babe McCarthy** (88) for career Southeastern Conference coaching wins in school history. Having guided the Bulldogs to the 2002 SEC Tournament title, SEC Western Division crowns in 2008, 2007, 2004 and 2003, and an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, Stansbury currently sports a career coaching mark of 87-73 (.544) in regular-season conference action.

STANSBURY MOVES TO 19TH PLACE ON SEC'S ALL-TIME WINS CHART

Having surpassed his former mentor **Richard Williams** as Mississippi State's all-time winningest basketball coach with the Bulldogs' 95-70 road win over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 21, 10th-year MSU head coach **Rick Stansbury** this season also became the 20th head basketball coach in Southeastern Conference history to reach the 200-win mark with MSU's 73-66 home triumph over Alabama on Feb. 6. Now with a 10-year head coaching record of 206-113 (.646), Stansbury has moved ahead of **Eddie Fogler** (204-165 at Vanderbilt & South Carolina) into 19th place and now trails No. 18 **Don DeVoe** (211-158 at Tennessee & Florida) by five victories on the league's all-time wins list.

In addition to recently becoming the 20th all-time member of the SEC's 200-win club, Stansbury is currently ranked 18th in winning percentage (.646) among the SEC's all-time listing of men's basketball coaches with a minimum of 100 wins at a league school. Stansbury presently trails only Florida's 12th-year head coach **Billy Donovan** among the SEC's current head basketball coaches in both career victories and career winning percentage (with a minimum of 100 wins at an SEC school).

In his 10th season at the Mississippi State helm after succeeding Williams as MSU's 18th head basketball coach on March 13, 1998, Stansbury is presently tied with Alabama's Mark Gottfried as the second-most tenured current head men's basketball coach in the SEC behind Donovan.

MSU RATES FIRST AMONG WINNINGEST SEC WEST TEAMS SINCE 1998-99

Since 10th-year head coach **Rick Stansbury** took over Mississippi State's basketball coaching duties from **Richard Williams** in 1998, the Bulldogs rate as the winningest SEC Western Division team and the third-winningest hoops program overall in the league behind perennial SEC Eastern Division front-runners Florida and Kentucky. Over the last 10 seasons, MSU's composite record of 206-113 (.646) ranks behind only two-time defending NCAA champion Florida [255-81 (.759)] and Kentucky [246-90 (.732)].

In regular-season SEC play, the Bulldogs (87-73) hold a six-game lead over Alabama (81-79) to continue to rank as the winningest SEC Western Division program, while ranking fourth overall in the league (also behind SEC East foes Kentucky, Florida & Tennessee), since 1998-99.

Additionally, Mississippi State ranks tied for fifth behind Kentucky (17-5), Florida (15-6), Arkansas (11-8) and South Carolina (10-9) in collective SEC Tournament wins dating back to the 1999 postseason. MSU (9-8) is tied with LSU (9-9) with nine victories each in SEC Tournament play since 1999, including a league tournament title in 2002 and a school-first second straight appearance in the SEC Tournament championship game the following year.

MSU SHOOTS FOR EIGHTH POSTSEASON BID DURING STANSBURY ERA

Heading into this week's SEC Tournament with a 21-9 overall record, 12-4 SEC mark and a second straight SEC West title to their credit, the Bulldogs appear to be on target to earn their eighth postseason tournament berth under the direction of 10th-year head coach **Rick Stansbury**. Over the past decade, MSU has made four NCAA Tournament appearances and three NIT showings.

past decade, MSU has made four NCAA Tournament appearances and three NIT showings.

Prior to Stansbury's hiring as MSU's head coach in 1998, Mississippi State had made seven total prior postseason tournament appearances (4 NCAA & 3 NIT) in the 86 previous seasons of basket-ball competition. In addition to doubling the school's all-time postseason tournament appearances in just nine seasons at the State helm, the Bulldogs' recent run of four straight NCAA Tournament berths (2002-05) also doubled the prior school record of back-to-back NCAA appearances previously set in 1994-95 (NCAA Sweet 16) and 1995-96 (NCAA Final Four) by **Richard Williams**' MSU clubs.

All total during 95 previous seasons of collegiate basketball competition at Mississippi State, the Bulldogs have now made 14 all-time postseason tournament appearances, including last year's sixth

All total during 95 previous seasons of collegiate basketball competition at Mississippi State, the Bulldogs have now made 14 all-time postseason tournament appearances, including last year's sixth NIT berth in school history. MState has now compiled a 6-5 composite record in six NIT appearances (2007, 2001, 1999, 1994, 1990 & 1979), including last year's national semifinal-round showing in New York City and the team's quarterfinal-round NIT effort in 2001.

MSU has also put together a collective 10-8 record during eight all-time appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including four straight NCAA tourney showings under Stansbury's guidance earlier this decade (2002-05).

2007-08 BULLDOG BASKETBALL NOTEBOOK

- Six of the Bulldogs' nine setbacks on the season have been by single digits... Most recently, MSU dropped a gut-wrenching 86-85 overtime decision at 16th-ranked Vanderbilt on the strength of SEC Player of the Year Shan Foster's phenomenal career-high, 42-point performance, which was highlighted by nine consecutive made 3-pointers in the second half including the game-winner... State has also fallen by two points (84-82) at home to Clemson; at South Alabama by four (71-67); at home to now-No. 4 Tennessee by five (76-71); at home to Miami (FL) by six (64-58); and to Miami (OH) by seven (67-60) at the Anaheim Classic.
- Despite their heartbreaking 86-85 overtime setback at then-No. 16 Vanderbilt last week, the 2007-08 Bulldogs still achieved their second winning season (5-3) in SEC road action during the Rick Stansbury era... MSU's 2003-04 SEC championship club was a perfect 8-0 in league road play (12-0 overall on the road) en route to claiming the school's first outright SEC title since 1962-63.
- MSU currently ranks among the top three team leaders in seven defensive statistical categories both for all games and conference games only:

- With four players (Gordon, Rhodes, Stewart & Hansbrough) currently averaging 10 or more points per game on the season, the Bulldogs have had four players score in double figures in 14 of 30 contests this season (12-2 record in those games)... MSU had four players score in twin digits six times during regular-season league play, including five double-digit scorers in home wins over SEC West foes Auburn and Ole Miss.
- According to research provided by STATS out of Chicago, Mississippi State ranks as one of only five NCAA Division I schools to have three different players record triple-doubles since 1996-97... The other schools are Arizona, Cincinnati, Connecticut and Grambling State... MSU's trio of triple-double achievers over the past four seasons are sophomore Jarvis Varnado (this season vs. Kentucky), now-junior Jamont Gordon (last season as a sophomore vs. Vanderbilt) and Lawrence Roberts (2004-05 vs. Nicholls State).
- With a composite overall record of 154-71 (.684) during the past seven seasons combined, the Bulldogs are ranked tied for 29th nationally with Maryland and Michigan State (and ranked third among SEC teams behind Florida and Kentucky) among the winningest NCAA Division I men's basketball programs dating back to the 2001-02 season, according to STATS out of Chicago.
- Since inter-divisional league play began in 1991-92, the Bulldogs are 97-80 versus the SEC West (62-23 at home & 30-55 on the road) and 56-66 against the SEC East (32-19 at home & 16-35 on the road)... In SEC Tournaments since 1991-92, MSU is 5-2 versus the SEC West and 8-12 against the SEC East... During the Rick Stansbury era of Bulldog basketball, MState is 63-43 against the SEC West and 33-38 versus the SEC East.
- ◆ During the Rick Stansbury era of MSU basketball, the Bulldogs are: 165-25 when leading at half-time (19-2 this year); 144-30 when shooting 45% or better from the field (14-2); 168-52 when the opposition shoots less than 45% from the field (19-7); 171-65 when out-rebounding (or tying) the opponent (18-5); 128-22 when holding the opposition to 65 points or less (13-2); 42-42 in games decided by five points or less (2-4); 10-8 in overtime games (1-1); and 16-43 vs. ranked opponents (1-3).

2007-08 BULLDOG BASKETBALL NOTEBOOK

- As part of the 10th annual "Legends of SEC Basketball" program, sponsored by Chick-fil-A, MSU's former two-time all-SEC performer Wiley Peck will be honored this week in Atlanta during the SEC Tournament... A native of Montgomery Ala., Peck will be recognized on-court during MSU's Friday night tournament contest... Peck presently ranks third on MState's all-time rebounding list with 964 career rebounds, along with standing 23rd in career scoring (1,136 points) and seventh in career field-goal percentage (.578)
- Having already established a new single-seasor school standard for blocked shots for the second year in a row (243 this season after 222 last year), as well as having now eclipsed the previous alltime SEC season mark of 240 blocks set by Kentucky's 1997-98 squad, the 2007-08 Bulldogs now find themselves climbing the all-time NCAA season blocks chart... With 243 blocks on the season heading into postseason play, MSU's total presently ranks 17th on the NCAA's all-time season list... As this year's Connecticut club challenges its own current all-time national record with 275 blocks thus far this season, the top three all-time marks for blocks are 315 by the 2003-04 UConn team, 309 by the 1988-89 Georgetown squad, and 298 by the 2005-06 UConn ballclub.
- Currently bidding to establish a new modernday (post-1964), single-season SEC record for field-goal percentage defense currently owned by the 1964-65 Tennessee team (.374), the 2007-08 Bulldogs have ranked second nationally behind Georgetown nearly all season long in field-goal percentage defense... Entering postseason play having held the opposition to collective 36.9 percent field-goal shooting on the year (Georgetown is at 36.4%), MState's current defensive numbers would approach the all-time top 10 NCAA season marks since 1978... The 1999-2000 Stanford squad presently holds the NCAA single-season standard at 35.2 percent, followed by the 1993-94 Marquette team at 35.8 percent.
- The Bulldogs begin postseason tournament competition with a narrow lead over rival Ole Miss (40.9 to 40.7 rpg) for the 2007-08 SEC team statistical title in rebounding for all games, as well as slightly trailing the Rebels for this year's rebound margin (+5.5 to +5.1 rpg) prize... This year's State squad is bidding to lead the SEC in rebounding (for all games) for the fourth time in the last five years (2007, 2005 & 2004), along with aiming at pacing the conference in rebound margin for the sixth time in the last eight seasons (2005, 2004, 2003, 2002 & 2001).
- With veterans Jamont Gordon and Charles Rhodes both earning All-SEC First Team honors by a vote of the league's head coaches this season, they become the first State tandem to do so in the same season since Lawrence Roberts and Timmy Bowers accomplished the feat during State's 2003-04 championship season.
- Senior Charles Rhodes (17.7 ppg) and junior Jamont Gordon (17.5 ppg) combined to average 35.2 points per SEC contest this regular season to rate as the No. 2 scoring tandem in the league behind LSU's Marcus Thornton and Anthony Randolph (38.3 ppg in SEC play)... For all games on the season, Gordon (17.5 ppg) and Rhodes (16.8 ppg) currently rate as the school's most potent scoring duo (34.3 ppg) since former MSU All-American and NBA standout guard Jeff Malone (26.8 ppg; 2nd in the NCAA) and Terry Lewis (15.2 ppg) combined to average 42.0 points per game for the 1982-83 Bulldogs.
- Mississippi State presently rates as the lone SEC team to have three players ranked among the top 15 individual leaders in rebounding... For all games, Jarvis Varnado (7.9 rpg) and Charles Rhodes (7.7) rank fifth and sixth, respectively, while Jamont Gordon (6.3) is tied for 14th.

MSU EARNS TOP 25 RANKING FOR FIFTH TIME DURING STANSBURY ERA

With their No. 25 ranking last month in the USA Today/ESPN Top 25 coaches poll, coach Rick **Stansbury**'s Bulldogs broke a three-year drought (60 weeks in the coaches' poll) of being unranked in either poll. Following wins over Auburn and Florida two weeks ago, Mississippi State was back at the No. 25 position in the March 3 coaches' poll. However, the Bulldogs have since fallen back out of the Top 25 this week after last week's gut-wrenching overtime setback at 16th-ranked Vanderbilt. MState's continuous streak of being absent from The Associated Press Top 25 poll has now reached 63 weeks. Earlier in the decade, State had earned national rankings during four consecutive seasons en route to making four straight NCAA Tournament appearances (2002-05).

Most recently prior to this season, the 2004-05 MSU club was ranked in both polls during each of

the year's first 12 weeks, peaking at No. 11 in the AP Top 25 (15th in coaches poll) the week of Jan. 10, 2005. However, three weeks later (Jan. 31), the Bulldogs fell out of both polls and were not ranked again over the final eight weeks of the campaign. Prior to this season, MState was last ranked in the

Top 25 (No. 24 in AP & No. 22 in the coaches poll) on Jan. 24, 2005.

The year prior after only receiving votes for the majority of the non-conference portion of the 2003-04 schedule, Mississippi State appeared in the Top 25 for the first time in the Dec. 29 wire service poll (24th), while having to wait a couple of weeks before cracking the coaches poll at No. 24 in the Jan. 12 rankings. In posting a 26-4 overall record (12-0 on the road) and 14-2 conference mark en route to claiming their first outright SEC championship since 1962-63, the 2003-04 Bulldogs (also known as 'The Road Warriors') were ranked in the AP Top 25 for the final 12 weeks of the season. Featured in the top 10 of both national polls during a seven-week stretch beginning in February, MSU's season-best No. 4 ranking in the Associated Press poll during the weeks of March 8 and Feb. 16 marked the school's highest national ranking in the AP poll since finishing the 1961-62 campaign ranked fourth by both the AP and UPI after posting records of 24-1 overall and 13-1 in SEC play. In 2002-03, MSU was ranked in the Top 25 of the coaches poll for the entire season, but slipped

out of the AP Top 25 for just one week (March 10) to narrowly miss becoming the first State team since coach **Babe McCarthy**'s 1958-59 MSU club to remain ranked in the AP poll for an entire season. Ranked as high as No. 7 nationally in the AP's Jan. 6 poll (No. 8 in the coaches poll), the 2002-03

Bulldogs finished the year ranked 20th in the final AP poll.

Stansbury's 2001-02 State squad became the first Bulldog team to earn a Top 25 ranking since coach Richard Williams' 1995-96 Final Four contingent. After claiming a 74-69 overtime home win over then-No. 6 Kentucky on Jan. 5, 2002, MSU earned a No. 22 ranking in the AP poll and a No. 24 rating in the coaches poll. The Bulldogs fell out of the rankings the following week, but jumped back in with a season-best No. 17 national AP ranking (18th in the coaches poll) after claiming the 2002 SEC Tournament title. In setting a new school mark with 27 wins, the 2001-02 Bulldogs were ranked 17th by AP and 21st by the coaches in the final polls.

MISSISSIPPI STATE TO TAKE PART IN 2008 SEC/BIG EAST INVITATIONAL

In an announcement made last month by ESPN Regional Television, in conjunction with the BIG EAST Conference and the Southeastern Conference, the Mississippi State Bulldogs will participate in the second annual SEC/BIG EAST Invitational next basketball season.

The 2008 SEC/BIG EAST Invitational, an ERT owned and operated event that features four games over two nights, will be played Dec. 16, 2008 at Nashville's Sommet Center and Dec. 18 at Cincinnati's U.S. Bank Arena and will be televised by ESPN and ESPN2. The annual event matches four teams from the BIG EAST Conference against four teams from the Southeastern Conference.

On Dec. 18 of this year, MState will take on the University of Cincinnati Bearcats at the U.S. Bank Arena in Cincinnati. In addition, the University of Mississippi will meet the Louisville Cardinals in Cincinnati. On Dec. 16 in Nashville, the Vanderbilt Commodores will face South Florida, while

Marquette squares off with the Tennessee Volunteers.

Earlier this season during the inaugural SEC/BIG EAST Invitational, the then-No. 21 Villanova Wildcats overcame a 21-point deficit and scored 13 points in the final three minutes, including a fourpoint play, to claim a come-from-behind 68-67 victory over the LSU Tigers at the Wachovia Center in Philadelphia. The Gamecocks of South Carolina beat Providence by the same margin (68-67) in the opener in Philadelphia. At the BJCC Arena in Birmingham, Ala., Georgetown knocked off the Alabama Crimson Tide, 70-60, and West Virginia bested Auburn, 88-59.

BULLDOGS SIGN OSBY AND BOST DURING EARLY-SIGNING PERIOD

Mississippi State University signed Romero Osby of Meridian's Northeast Lauderdale High School and Dee Bost of Hargrave Military Academy in Virginia during the early-signing period.

A 6-foot-8, 230-pound forward, Osby was named All-State First Team by The Clarion-Ledger newspaper a year ago after averaging 24.0 points, 11.3 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 3.0 blocks per game. The consensus top 50 national prospect helped lead coach **Lewis Lightsey**'s 2006-07 Trojans to a 25-10 record and a quarterfinal-round appearance in the North Mississippi 4A tournament. Most recently, Osby was selected as the most valuable defensive player of the 2007 Mississippi Association of Coaches All-Star Game after posting game-high totals of 21 points and 16 rebounds to help lead the North team to a 117-86 victory over the South squad.

Bost, a 6-foot-2, 170-pound guard out of Concord, N.C., currently competes as a post-graduate

player for coach **Kevin Keatts** at Hargrave Military Academy in Chatham, Va. A two-sport standout at Concord (N.C.) High School, Bost became the first athlete in North Carolina history to collect championship-game MVP honors for both basketball and football in the same season. For his collective efforts last season, he was named the Charlotte Observer's NCHSAA Male Athlete of the Year for 2006-07 after leading the Concord Spiders to North Carolina's 3A basketball and football state championships. Bost averaged 17.8 points, five rebounds and four assists per game this past year in leading coach Andy Poplin's CHS team to the 3A state hoops crown.

GAME #1 RECAP

MSU 75, LOUISIANA TECH 45 Nov. 10, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs tipped off their 96th season of collegiate basketball competition by cruising to a 75-45 home triumph over Louisiana Tech at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

With MSU (1-0) trailing by four points (10-6) eight minutes into the contest, Charles Rhodes' back-to-back dunks helped spark the Bulldogs on a 24-4 run over the final nine minutes of the opening half to give the home team a comfortable 30-14 halftime advantage. The sluggish first half of play saw MState shoot just 32 percent from the field, while Louisiana Tech (0-1) struggled at 22 percent field-goal shooting.

The homestanding Bulldogs continued to remain in control during the second stanza, building a 20-point lead (37-17) by the 16:31 mark. With the visitors getting no close than 18 points (49-31 with 12:21 left) the rest of the way, the cushion increased to 30 points (61-31) by the 7:26 mark and ballooned to as many as 36 points (75-39) before MSU settled for the 30-point triumph. Five years ago in the last meeting between the two teams, MState pounded out an equally convincing 78-38 home victory over LTU.

While moving to 9-1 in season home openers during the Rick Stansbury era, the Bulldogs extended their home winning streak to eight consecutive games dating back to this past February. During that stretch, MSU's average margin of victory has been 20.1 points per home triumph.

Jamont Gordon paced four double-figure State scorers with a game-high 21 points. Charles Rhodes followed with 17 points, while Barry Stewart notched his first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. Kyle Gibson topped the visitors with his own double-double of 15 points and 15 boards.

GAME #2 RECAP

CLEMSON 84, MSU 82 Nov. 15, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs had their eight-game home winning streak snapped by dropping a hard-fought 84-82 home decision to reigning NIT runner-up Clemson at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

The visiting Tigers (2-0) led for most of the opening 20 minutes of play. Following a second tie (13-13) nine minutes into the contest, Clemson scored eight unanswered points to take an eightpoint lead (21-13) with 9:18 remaining in the half. The Bulldogs (1-1) would cut the deficit to two points (23-21) two minutes later, but Clemson responded with a dunk and a 3-pointer to reestablish control of the game and go on to take a 39-32 halftime advantage.

The visitors continued to maintain the lead for the opening 11 minutes of the second stanza, before MSU went on a 9-0 run midway through the half to take a 54-52 lead on a Charles Rhodes dunk at the 8:17 mark. Seven lead changes and two ties ensued over the next four minutes.

Back-to-back dunks by Brian Johnson gave MState its final lead (71-70) with 2:23 left in the contest. A 3-pointer by Clemson's K.C. Rivers at the 1:11 mark was answered by a Barry Stewart trey with 43 seconds left to cut MSU's deficit to two points (78-76). However, Tiger freshman guard Demontez Stitt sealed the two-point Clemson victory with 6-of-6 free-throw shooting over the final 26 seconds.

Though Clemson struggled with 34-percent shooting from the field, State did not help its own cause with just 61-percent accuracy from the line.

Jamont Gordon led all scorers with 23 points and added a dozen rebounds to record his 11th career double-double for the Bulldogs. Rhodes tossed in 17 points despite first-half foul trouble. Rivers and freshman Terrence Oglesby paced the winners with 17 points each, while all-America candidate James Mays totaled 14 points, 11 rebounds and four assists.

UTM cut the deficit to four points (12-8) soon thereafter and kept the contest to within single digits until the 5:34 mark when Ben Hansbrough connected on a 3-pointer to give MSU an 11-point lead (32-21).

The Bulldogs increased their lead to 16 points (39-23) with 3:03 left in the half before settling for a 41-30 halftime advantage. State's Charles Rhodes tallied 15 first-half points on 7-of-8 shooting to lead the way for the home team.

Hansbrough paced four double-digit State scorers with 20 points on 4-of-6 triples. Hudson and Marquis Weddle led the visitors with 27 and 24 points, respectively.

MSU 68, UC IRVINE 53 Nov. 22, 2007 • ANAHEIM, CA ANAHEIM CLASSIC • FIRST ROUND

In their first road competition of the season, the Bulldogs opened the inaugural Anaheim Classic with a 68-53 victory over UC Irvine at the Anaheim Convention Center.

Opening the contest hitting eight of their first nine shots from the field, including their first five three-point shot attempts, the Bulldogs (3-1) mounted a double-digit lead (19-9) by the 13:11 mark on a Phil Turner trey. MSU pretty much controlled the opening 20 minutes of play with its continued hot shooting, though UC Irvine (2-2) managed to cut the deficit to five points (39-34) with under a minute left in the half.

Hitting 58 percent (15-26 FGs) from the field, including 6-of-9 treys (67%) in the opening period, the Bulldogs settled for a 41-34 halftime lead.

After the Anteaters pulled to within five points on two occasions during the first four minutes of the second stanza, MSU ran off 10 unanswered points over a three-minute span to take a 15-point advantage (55-40) by the 12:53 mark. The Bulldogs also stepped up their defensive intensity in the closing period to re-establish control of the contest.

Limiting UCI to just six second-half field goals on 24 attempts (25%) and owning a commanding 27-16 rebounding advantage during the final 20 minutes, the Bulldogs went on to claim their 15-point triumph and earn the right to face 18th-ranked Southern Illinois in the semifinals.

As a team, MState held UCI to 35-percent shooting from the field (only 3-17 treys) on the day, while owning a 43-31 lead on the boards.

The Bulldogs dropped a 63-49 decision to 18th-ranked Southern Illinois in the semifinals of the inaugural Anaheim Classic played at the Anaheim Convention Center.

In a first half that featured five ties and three lead changes, MState (3-2) owned the upper hand for the first 10 minutes of the opening period. Midway through the half, the Salukis (3-0) scored six unanswered points to take a brief 19-15 lead. MSU countered with eight straight points to pull ahead by four points (23-19) with 3:28 remaining in the half. En route to scoring 15 first-half points, Jamont Gordon's third 3-pointer of the half put the Bulldogs on top by five points (26-21) with just under three minutes left before the half.

However, Joshua Bone came off the SIU bench to drill a trio of treys over the final 1:46, including one with time running out in the period, to give the Salukis a 32-28 halftime advantage.

Southern Illinois maintained its momentum by scoring the first half-dozen points of the second stanza to increase the margin to double figures (38-28) two minutes into the half. With Randal Falker scoring 13 of SIU's first 15 second-half points, the Salukis again went ahead by twin digits (45-35) with 13:14 remaining.

MSU's Gordon cut the deficit in half (47-42) with another 3-pointer at the 9:44 mark, but SIU's Bone put a damper on the Bulldogs' comeback attempt by nailing back-to-back triples to give the Salukis an 11-point cushion (53-42) with 8:23 left in the contest. MState would get no closer than nine points the rest of the way, as Southern Illinois coasted to the 14-point victory in advancing to the championship contest.

Gordon, held to five second-half points, was MSU's lone double-figure scorer with 20 points. Falker tallied a game-high 23 points on 7-of-9 field goals and 9-of-10 free throws for the winners, while Bone added 15 points off the Saluki bench with his 5-of-6 three-point shooting effort.

The Bulldogs went 1-2 in the inaugural Anaheim Classic after dropping a 67-60 decision to Miami University in the tournament's third-place game played at the Anaheim Convention Center.

After MSU's Charles Rhodes scored the game's first two points, the RedHawks (3-1) went on a 14-3 run, keyed by a pair of 3-pointers apiece by Michael Bramos and Alex Moosmann, to take a 14-5 lead by the 15:38 mark of the opening half. Spurred by 5-of-9 three-point shooting during the first 20 minutes of play, Miami maintained control of the contest throughout the first period. The Bulldogs (3-3) did tighten things up a bit late in the half by outscoring MU, 7-1, over the final three minutes to cut the deficit to just five points (29-24) by the intermission.

Despite coming up empty on their first four offensive possessions of the second stanza, the Bulldogs outscored Miami, 12-6, through the first five minutes of the half and regained a brief 36-35 lead on a Ben Hansbrough 3-pointer at the 14:52 mark. Following a fifth tie in the opening nine minutes of second-half play, MState went on an 8-1 run to take a five-point advantage (48-43) midway through the closing period.

With Rhodes scoring 17 of his team-high 25 points in the second half and going over the 1,000-point mark for his career during a three-minute stretch in which he scored nine straight points for MSU, the Bulldogs seemed to grab the momentum in pulling ahead by a half-dozen points (53-47) with 7:06 remaining in the game. However, MU's Tim Pollitz answered with back-to-back buckets to get the RedHawks to within a basket (53-51) by the 5:46 mark.

Following a seventh deadlock of the half (58-58) with 1:46 left, Miami's Tyler Dierkers tipped in the go-ahead basket with 1:03 left on the clock. MU's Bramos, who finished the contest with a game-high 30 points, then converted on a three-point play and hit four additional free throws over the final 42 seconds to seal the victory.

The Bulldogs broke a two-game losing streak and successfully tipped off a three-game December homestand by posting a 78-61 home triumph over Murray State at Humphrey Coliseum.

Coming off consecutive losses to No. 18 Southern Illinois and Miami of Ohio during the Anaheim Classic over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, MState (4-3) built a 39-24 halftime advantage on the strength of 58-percent shooting through the opening 20 minutes of play. The visiting Racers (3-2) were limited to 32-percent first-half accuracy from the field.

After the visitors cut the deficit to single digits (47-38) three minutes into the second stanza, MSU went on a 17-4 run to increase the margin to a game-high 22 points (64-42) midway through the closing period. The Racers never got any closer than 16 points the rest of the way, as the Bulldogs breezed to their 22nd consecutive December home victory dating back to the 2000-01 campaign.

For the contest, MState shot 52 percent overall from the field as a team, while outscoring the Racers, 18-3, from the charity stripe. The Bulldogs connected on 78 percent of their 23 free throw attempts, in contrast to Murray State attempting just four charity tosses the entire game.

State senior Charles Rhodes tallied a gamehigh 22 points on 8-of-14 field goals and 6-of-6 free throws to post his second straight 20-point effort of the season. Jamont Gordon and Barry Stewart followed with 15 and 14 points, respectively, for the winners. Tony Easley paced the visitors with 17 points and seven rebounds.

Well rested after having a week off from game competition, MState (5-3) built a double-digit lead over the visiting Lions (5-3) by the 11:41 mark of the opening period on a Barry Stewart 3-pointer. In limiting Southeastern to 37-percent shooting and owning a 22-13 advantage on the boards through the first 20 minutes of play, the Bulldogs maintained their double-figure cushion throughout the remainder of the half en route to opening up a comfortable 41-27 halftime lead.

In closing out a three-game homestand, the Bulldogs had their 23-game winning streak in December home contests snapped by dropping a 64-58 decision to the unbeaten Miami Hurricanes at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

The visitors held the upper hand for the better part of the opening 15 minutes of the contest, going on top by as many as seven points on two different occasions. Instead, UM's Jack McClinton sandwiched his second and third 3-pointers over a two-minute stretch around a pair of Rhodes free throws to give the Hurricanes a two-point lead (60-58) with 1:26 remaining. After Dwayne Collins' two charity tosses gave Miami a four-point lead, Gordon couldn't convert on the front end of his one-and-one with 29 seconds left. Scoring 11 of his gamehigh 29 points (20 in the second half) over the game's final 3:22, McClinton sealed Miami's six-point road victory with a pair of free throws.

McClinton was the only Hurricane in double figures on the night, while Gordon and Stewart paced MSU with 18 points apiece. Gordon also added a game-best nine rebounds and five assists, while State's Jarvis Varnado established a new single-game school standard with 10 blocks.

SOUTH ALABAMA 71, MSU 67 DEC. 15, 2007 • MOBILE, AL COORS CLASSIC

The visiting Bulldogs tipped off a week-long, road trip by letting a 13-point, second-half lead evaporate in dropping a 71-67 decision to South Alabama at the Mitchell Center in the nightcap of the ninth annual Coors Classic.

In a tightly contested opening 20 minutes of play, MState (5-5) held the advantage for the better part of the first half. However, South Alabama's Demetric Bennett put on a first-half clinic by scoring his team's first 20 points en route to a 25-point opening period. Despite his tremendous one-man performance, MSU still clung to a precarious two-point halftime lead (32-30).

After the two teams battled to within a three-point game for the opening five minutes of the second stanza, the Bulldogs seemed to take total control of the contest by going on a 17-6 run to build a 13-point advantage (57-44) midway through the half following a Phil Turner trey. However, back-to-back MSU miscues resulted in five quick points by the Jaguars (7-3) to cut the deficit to eight points in less than a minute.

Following a three-minute scoring drought by both teams, South Alabama continued its amazing comeback by going on a 13-0 run which turned a nine-point State lead (58-49) into a four-point USA advantage (62-58) by the 3:59 mark. Ben Hansbrough temporarily kept the Bulldogs from completely wilting by scoring MSU's next eight points, including a pair of 3-pointers.

After a Jamont Gordon free throw tied the game at 67-67 with 43 seconds left, the Jaguars' Ronald Douglas tipped in a Bennett miss. Gordon then came down and missed a layup, while Charles Rhodes couldn't convert on either free throw after getting fouled on the offensive rebound. Appropriately enough, Bennett sealed the USA victory with a pair of charity tosses.

Bennett stole the show with his phenomenal 39-point explosion, hitting a sizzling 14-of-17 shots from the field including all six three-point attempts, for the winners. Making his first collegiate start, Turner paced MState with 17 points.

In the midst of a week-long, three-game road swing, the Bulldogs claimed an 85-54 victory over Loyola Marymount at Gersten Pavilion.

After jumping out to a 14-5 lead six minutes into the game and building a double-digit advantage (21-10) by the 11:50 mark, MState (6-5) outscored the Lions (3-9), 12-2, over the final four minutes of the half to take a 40-22 halftime lead. Bouncing back from a season-low, seven-point effort (1-14 FGs) in his previous game at South Alabama, Jamont Gordon scored MSU's last 10 points of the opening period en route to a 15-point first half (5-6 FGs & 3-3 treys).

The MSU cushion reached 22 points (47-25) less than two minutes into the second stanza on another Gordon triple. The margin ballooned to 31 points (60-29) by the 15:21 mark and never dipped below 25 points the rest of the way. The Bulldogs shot 67 percent from the field in the second half en route to a season-best, 59-percent performance (34-58 FGs) for the contest.

In recording the team's largest winning margin on an opponent's home floor since the 1962-63 season (99-64 at LSU), MState also set singlegame season highs for scoring margin (+31), field goals made (34), assists (25), blocks (12-tied) and steals (14). Defensively, MSU limited LMU to just 33-percent field goal shooting for the game and held a 46-32 advantage on the boards.

With four Bulldogs scoring in double figures, Gordon led the way with a game-high 25 points on 9-of-14 field goals and 5-of-7 treys. Charles Rhodes registered his third double-double of the season (14 pts/10 rebs), while Jarvis Varnado totalled a season-high 10 points (4-4 FGs) along with a Gersten Pavilion-record nine blocks. Shawn Deadwiler led LMU with 11 points.

MSU 87, MISSOURI 75 DEC. 30, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs wrapped up their regular-season, non-conference home slate by claiming an 87-75 victory over the Big 12's Missouri Tigers at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

Sparked by an impressive first-half shooting performance by Matt Lawrence, Missouri (9-5) opened up a six-point lead (20-14) by the 11:50 mark of the opening period. Playing without all-SEC senior forward Charles Rhodes (sprained left ankle), the Bulldogs (8-5) came to life and went on a 21-5 streak to take a 10-point advantage (35-25) with 4:42 remaining in the half.

Lawrence's fourth 3-pointer of the half (in five attempts) paved the way for nine unanswered Mizzou points to cut the deficit to a point (35-34). However, State's Barry Stewart and Ben Hansbrough connected on consecutive treys to put the Bulldogs back up by seven points (41-34) before settling for a three-point halftime lead (41-38).

After the visiting Tigers knotted up the game at 41-41 within the opening seconds of the second stanza, the Bulldogs went on a 15-3 run to go up by a dozen points (56-44) by the 14:33 mark. However, Missouri fought back and outscored the home team, 16-3, over the next five minutes and claimed a brief one-point lead (60-59) after a second straight 3-pointer by Stefhon Hannah.

A former Mr. Basketball for the state of Missouri during his prep playing days, Hansbrough temporarily stopped the visiting team's momentum with a key 3-pointer with 8:42 left. A Stewart trey and a tip-in by Jamont Gordon later gave the Bulldogs a 73-66 lead at the 3:30 mark. Clutch 10-of-12 free-throw shooting down the stretch sealed MState's third straight victory.

Stewart posted new career highs in points (24) and assists (7), while Gordon added 20 points, eight rebounds and five assists for the winners. MU's Matt Lawrence finished the contest with a game-high 28 points on 10-of-15 field-goal shooting and 6-of-11 accuracy from beyond the arc.

The Bulldogs concluded the non-conference portion of their regular-season slate by posting a 77-53 victory over Lafayette College at Jackson's Mississippi Coliseum.

The 24-point win extended MState's seasonbest winning streak to four consecutive games and marked the team's eighth straight hoops triumph (6-0 under Rick Stansbury) in Mississippi's capital city dating back to the 1985-86 campaign.

In this year's contest against one of the nation's leading three-point shooting teams, MSU (9-5) built a double-digit lead (17-7) eight minutes into the contest. The Bulldogs' cushion increased to as many as 21 points (34-13) by the 5:29 mark, but the visiting Leopards (8-6) by way of Easton, Pa., managed to cut the deficit to a dozen points (37-25) by halftime.

Lafayette came out of the locker room to score the first seven points of the second stanza and would later narrow the gap to just four points (44-40) on a layup by Bilal Abdullah at the 15:36 mark. However, MState would come alive to tally 10 unanswered points to go back up by 14 points (54-40) midway through the period.

The Leopards would trim the margin to single digits one last time (55-46) at the 7:50 mark, but the Bulldogs responded with 12 straight points this time to mount as much as a 29-point bulge before settling with the 24-point victory.

Entering the contest ranked third in the NCAA in made 3-pointers per game (11.2/gm) and sixth in three-point percentage (.426), Lafayette was held to just 6-of-25 shooting (.240) from beyond the arc and only 26.4 percent (19-of-72 FGs) overall from the field in the contest.

Ben Hansbrough paced MSU with 17 points, while Jarvis Varnado had his second career double-double with a career-high 16 points and 12 rebounds. Abdullah led all scorers with 21 points.

GAME #15 RECAP

MSU 61, LSU 39 Jan. 9, 2008 • Baton Rouge, LA

The Bulldogs opened up conference play with a stout defensive effort by claiming a convincing 61-39 road victory over the short-handed LSU Tigers at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center.

Following an early 2-2 tie one minute into the game, MState (10-5, 1-0) went on a 13-2 spurt to take an 11-point lead (15-4) by the 13:10 mark of the opening period. Playing without the injured tandem of Tasmin Mitchell and Chris Johnson, the Tigers (7-8, 0-1) managed to cut a 12-point deficit late in the period in half as Marcus Thornton bombed in back-to-back 3-pointers within the final minute to bring the home team back to within a six-point margin (25-19) by the intermission.

in a six-point margin (25-19) by the intermission. After Anthony Randolph's three-point play tipped off second-half play to pull the Tigers to within three points, LSU then went nearly six minutes without scoring. In making another 13-2 run over a seven-minute span, the Bulldogs reclaimed their double-digit lead in which they would never again relinquish.

After being held to just seven first-half field goals on only 23 percent shooting, the Tigers fell off that pace in the closing 20 minutes by again hitting only seven shots in 36 second-half attempts for a frigid 19 percent. With the Bulldogs connecting on 54 percent of their second-half attempts and owning a 27-19 advantage on the boards in the half, MSU would easily secure its third straight series win over LSU.

In addition to winning in Baton Rouge for consecutive years for the first time in a decade, MState allowed the fewest points to an SEC opponent since dropping a 38-36 overtime decision to Auburn during the pre-shot clock era of the 1982 SEC Tournament.

With MSU still without injured all-SEC forward Charles Rhodes, Jarvis Varnado stepped up to record a second straight double-double with 13 points and a career-high 17 rebounds to go along with seven blocks. Held to just 14 total field goals as a team on only 21 percent shooting, LSU was led by Thornton's dozen points.

GAME #16 RECAP

MSU 60, GEORGIA 49 Jan. 12, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

The homestanding Bulldogs notched their sixth consecutive victory of the season by successfully opening up their SEC home slate with a 60-49 win over the Bulldogs of Georgia at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

MState (11-5, 2-0) scored the game's first seven points and later still led by six points (16-10) with 7:12 remaining in the low-scoring first half of play. Georgia (9-5, 0-1) claimed its first lead of the contest at 22-20 with 3:19 left following back-to-back driving layups by Sundiata Gaines and a jumper by Corey Butler. MSU countered with dunks by all-SEC standouts Charles Rhodes and Jamont Gordon to take back a 27-24 advantage heading into halftime.

After Butler opened the second stanza with consecutive jumpers to put UGA back on top by a single point (28-27), MState went on an 18-2 run over the next seven minutes to break out to a 15-point cushion (45-30) by the 11:23 mark. Georgia responded by scoring nine unanswered points within a four-minute span to cut the deficit to a half-dozen points (45-39) with 7:42 remaining.

A Riley Benock 3-pointer at the 5:21 mark ended a six-minute scoring drought by MSU. State would go on to build an 11-point margin (50-39) before Georgia scored five straight points to pull to within six points (50-44) again with 1:55 left. A Terrance Woodbury 3-pointer with 49 seconds remaining would bring UGA to within a half-dozen points (53-47) one last time before the home team connected on 7-of-8 charity tosses over the final 43 seconds to seal the 11-point triumph and give MState its ninth win in 10 SEC home openers during the Rick Stansbury era.

In setting a new school record with 16 blocks on the day (10 by Jarvis Varnado), MSU held its third straight opponent to less than 30 percent shooting as UGA struggled with 16-of-65 (24.6%) from the field and just 3-of-17 (18%) from the arc.

Gordon and Gaines had 15 points apiece to lead the respective teams. Varnado added nine points and nine rebounds for the winners.

GAME #17 RECAP

MSU 69, KENTUCKY 64 Jan. 15, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

The homestanding Bulldogs moved to 3-0 in SEC play for the first time since 1993-94 with a 69-64 home triumph over the Kentucky Wildcats in front of an ESPN viewing audience at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

After battling through five lead changes during the opening seven minutes of play, MState (12-5, 3-0) grabbed a six-point lead (22-16) following a Charles Rhodes dunk at the 9:13 mark of the opening period. The Bulldogs' lead grew to 10 points by the closing minutes of the half, but Kentucky (7-8, 1-1) scored the final five points of the first half to trim the deficit in half (32-27) by the halftime buzzer.

MSU seemingly regained control of the contest during the opening 10 minutes of the second stanza, building as much as a 12-point cushion (45-33) following a 3-pointer by Phil Turner at the 14:58 mark. Aided by some poor second-half free throw shooting by MSU and back-to-back Bulldog turnovers around the 5:00 mark, the Wildcats managed to get to within three points (56-53) after a Ramel Bradley layup with 5:01 left.

The Bulldogs regrouped and kept plugging away at the charity stripe to eventually go back up by eight points (65-57) after a 1-for-2 trip to the line by Rhodes with 30 seconds remaining. However, an MSU miscue sandwiched between four straight free throws by UK's Bradley followed by a Joe Crawford 3-pointer made it a two-point contest with nine seconds left in the game. Though he struggled from the field (2-of-11 FGs & 0-of-5 treys) on the night, State's Barry Stewart came through in the clutch by hitting 3-of-4 free throws over the final five seconds to give the Bulldogs their seventh straight win of the season.

Jarvis Varnado over-shadowed Jamont Gordon's game-high 24 points by recording the third triple-double in school history with 10 points, 12 rebounds and a school record-tying 10 blocks. MSU had 15 blocks to mark the fourth straight game in double digits. UK guards Bradley and Crawford tallied 22 and 20 points, respectively.

The visiting Bulldogs stretched their overall winning streak to eight consecutive games and SEC win string to four straight contests with a 66-56 victory over Alabama at Coleman Coliseum.

During an opening 20 minutes of play which featured five lead changes and four ties, MState (13-5, 4-0) owned the advantage for the majority of the first half. After the visitors led by as many as six points (14-8) four minutes into the game and then later owned a five-point margin (25-20) with 5:37 left, the Crimson Tide (11-8, 0-4) took a brief one-point lead (28-27) on a pair of Alonzo Gee free throws with 1:52 remaining.

However, the Bulldogs capped off a 7-of-14 first-half shooting performance from beyond the three-point arc with back-to-back treys by Riley Benock and Ben Hansbrough over the final minute to give MSU a 33-28 halftime advantage.

Following a made trey by Bama's Mykal Riley to open the second-half scoring, Jamont Gordon answered with a 3-pointer of his own to ignite a 9-0 State run. Midway through the half, the Tide scored seven unanswered points to cut the deficit to four points (52-48) with 8:21 left in the contest. MState's Barry Stewart responded with a clutch 3-pointer from the corner to halt the Bama run.

Four minutes later, Senario Hillman converted a three-point play to once again narrow the gap to four points (59-55) with 3:58 left to play. Back-to-back buckets by Gordon and Jarvis Varnado put the visitors back up by eight points with 2:06 left on the clock. MSU held Alabama to a single point over the game's final four minutes to win in Tuscaloosa for the first time since 2003-04 and prevail by double digits at Coleman Coliseum for the first time since 1989-90.

As a team, the Bulldogs drilled a season-high 12 three-point field goals (in 26 attempts), while the Tide struggled with 2-of-14 shooting from beyond the arc. Gordon hit for a game-high 24 points for the second straight contest en route to earning SEC Player of the Week and national honors by FOX Sports and *The Sporting News*. Stewart followed with 16 points for the winners. Richard Hendrix paced Alabama with 21 points.

MSU 88, #15 MISSISSIPPI 68 JAN. 26, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs extended their season winning streaks to nine consecutive games overall and five straight to begin SEC play by claiming an 88-68 home triumph over No. 15 Mississippi with 10,421 fans on hand at Humphrey Coliseum.

After battling through six lead changes and two ties during the opening 10 minutes of play, MState (14-5, 5-0) scored seven unanswered points over a four-minute span to take a 28-21 lead with 6:06 remaining in the first half. The Rebels (15-3, 2-3) would cut the deficit to three points (34-31) with two minutes left, but the Bulldogs scored the final four points of the half to take a 38-31 halftime advantage.

MSU's lead was not seriously challenged the rest of the contest, as they took a trio of 10-point leads during the opening five minutes of the second stanza. After Ole Miss cut the deficit to seven points (49-42) at the 14:42 mark, State's Jamont Gordon converted a three-point play and then followed with a message-sending dunk to give the Bulldogs a 13-point cushion (55-42) with 13:12 left in the contest.

With the home team shooting 69 percent from the field in the second half and fueled by Charles Rhodes' 18 second-half points, the Bulldogs maintained their double-digit cushion over the final 14 minutes of the contest. The 20-point victory marked MSU's 10th consecutive home triumph over Ole Miss during the Rick Stansbury era and gave the Bulldogs their seventh straight SEC home win dating back to last February.

As a team, MSU shot 57 percent from the field for the game, along with holding UM to just 37 percent accuracy. Rhodes paced five doubledigit State scorers with a game-high 26 points on 12-of-14 shooting, while Dwayne Curtis had 18 points and 11 rebounds for the visitors.

GAME #20 RECAP

ARKANSAS 78, #25 MSU 58 JAN. 30, 2008 • FAYETTEVILLE, AR

Ranked in the nation's Top 25 for the first time in three years, the 25th-ranked Bulldogs had their nine-game overall winning streak and five-game SEC win string snapped by dropping a 78-58 decision to the Arkansas Razorbacks at Bud Walton Arena.

Keyed by Jamont Gordon's 10 points through the opening eight minutes of play, MState (14-6, 5-1) held a four-point lead (11-7) at the 12:18 mark. With the Razorbacks (15-5, 4-2) playing without starter and Jackson, Miss., native Charles Thomas because of a suspension, senior forward Sonny Weems sparked a 14-0 Arkansas run by hitting three straight 3-pointers to give the home team a 21-11 advantage midway through the half.

MSU cut the deficit in half within a minute, but the Razorbacks responded by reclaiming a double-digit lead (27-16) with 6:43 left in the half. With Arkansas owning a 22-15 rebounding advantage and the Bulldogs saddled with 13 first-half turnovers, the Hogs owned a comfortable 43-28 halftime cushion.

MSU got off the deck and scored the first eight points of the second stanza to cut the margin to seven points (43-36) following a Phil Turner 3-pointer at the 16:02 mark. However, it was Weems yet again who ignited a spark for the home team by hitting a jumper and a 3-pointer to push the lead back up to double figures. The Razorbacks' cushion stayed at twin digits for the final 15 minutes of the contest, as MState suffered its first 20-point defeat since dropping an 83-61 decision at South Carolina on Feb. 11, 2006.

Though limiting Arkansas to 36 percent shooting for the contest, the Bulldogs were outrebounded, 41-35, and outscored by 13 points at the free throw line. MSU was also credited with 22 turnovers and only five assists on the evening.

Gordon finished with a game-high 24 points, while Charles Rhodes posted a double-double with 11 points and 15 rebounds for the visitors. Weems tallied 22 points, including 5-of-10 accuracy from beyond the three-point arc, and Patrick Beverley registered his own double-double with 19 points and 10 boards for the winners.

#7 Tennessee 76, #25 MSU 71 Feb. 2, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

Despite a valiant second-half comeback, the 25th-ranked Bulldogs dropped a 76-71 home decision to the seventh-ranked Tennessee Volunteers at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

Bidding for their first win over a top 10-ranked team since 2002, the homestanding Bulldogs (14-7, 5-2) jumped out to an early 8-2 lead three minutes into the contest. However, a 9-1 Tennessee run over a two-minute span later in the half gave the Volunteers (19-2, 6-1) a fivepoint lead (16-11) at the 10:34 mark.

An 8-2 MState run, capped by a Barry Stewart 3-pointer, put the home team back on top briefly before the visitors scored seven unanswered points to go back up by six points (25-19) with 6:53 left in the half. The Volunteers used 8-of-16 three-point shooting through the opening 20 minutes of play to acquire a 36-27 halftime lead.

Tennessee maintained control of the contest through the first 13 minutes of the second stanza before MSU's perimeter shooting suddenly came alive. The first of three straight Stewart treys coming at the 6:15 mark ignited a 24-9 Bulldog run that would set up some last-minute dramatics. For nearly a six-minute period, Stewart and fellow Tennessee native Jamont Gordon combined for 7-of-8 three-point shooting to pull the Bulldogs from 17 points down (64-47) to within a basket (73-71) on Stewart's career-high sixth trey with 43 seconds remaining in the contest.

After UT's Wayne Chism misfired on the front end of a 1-and-1 with 34 seconds left, MSU committed a turnover to give the ball back. State got another chance when Jordan Howell only made 1-of-2 free throws with 15 seconds left, but Gordon's trey attempt with seven ticks on the clock was off target. Howell sealed the Vols' road victory with two free throws in the final seconds.

Stewart finished with a game-high 21 points on 6-of-8 treys, while Chris Lofton paced the winners with 20 points. The two teams combined for 22 made 3-pointers in the contest, while UT benefitted from a 42-32 rebounding advantage.

The Bulldogs got back on the winning track by registering a 73-66 home victory over divisional rival Alabama at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

Snapping a two-game losing skid with the seven-point home win over the Crimson Tide, MSU (15-7) closed out the first half of the regular-season conference slate with a 6-2 league mark.

During a fairly sluggish first half of play, the Bulldogs built an eight-point lead (16-8) by the 9:19 mark. Alabama (13-10, 2-6) would battle back to tie up the contest two more times late in the half and even take a brief two-point edge (27-25) with 4:23 left. State's Barry Stewart responded with a 3-pointer to help the home team to a four-point lead (33-29) at the intermission.

The Bulldog's maintained their lead throughout the second stanza, opening up as much as an 11-point advantage (56-45) midway through the period. However, the Tide managed to cut the deficit to just two points (60-58) by the 5:31 mark and was still down by just a basket (65-63) with 3:31 left following an Alonzo Gee 3-pointer. A minute later, MSU's Jarvis Varnado put

A minute later, MSU's Jarvis Varnado put back a missed Charles Rhodes jumper to give the Bulldogs a four-point lead with 2:27 left. After the two teams traded free throws, MState's Jamont Gordon converted on a pair of charity tosses to lengthen the margin to six points (70-64) with 48 seconds remaining. Following a Mikhail Torrance layup, Gordon missed the second of two free throws. However, Rhodes pulled down the missed second attempt and went to the line, but he failed to connect on either free throw.

With a chance to cut into the deficit, the Tide misfired on two shot attempts on its ensuing possession, which ultimately ended with a turnover. The Bulldogs sealed their first season series sweep of Bama since 1998-99 by hitting two more free throws over the final 22 seconds.

Holding Alabama to just 36 percent shooting for the game, MSU was paced by Gordon and Rhodes with 17 points apiece. Gordon tied his career high with 10 assists to post his second double-double of the season. Gee led a quintet of double-digit Bama scorers with 16 points, but struggled with just 4-of-18 from the field.

MSU 83, AUBURN 64 Feb. 9, 2008 • AUBURN, AL

The visiting Bulldogs tipped off the second half of their regular-season conference slate in impressive fashion by claiming a convincing 83-64 road victory over the undermanned Auburn Tigers at Beard-Eaves-Memorial Coliseum.

Leading comfortably from the opening tip-off to the final buzzer, MState (16-7, 7-2) scored the first 10 points of the contest en route to jumping out to a 19-4 advantage by the 15:43 mark of the first period. The MSU cushion stayed at double figures for the remainder of the half and throughout the second stanza. Auburn (12-10, 2-7) cut the deficit to 10 points (27-17) on a three-point play by Frank Tolbert at the 8:22 mark. However, the Bulldogs scored six unanswered points to push the margin back up to 16 points.

Despite 12 first-half turnovers, MSU outshot the Tigers 57 percent to 29 percent in addition to owning a commanding 26-8 rebounding advantage en route to posting a 44-29 halftime bulge.

The State lead ballooned to 20 points (52-32) three minutes into the second stanza. The Tigers did muster one last comeback attempt midway through the closing period when a Quantez Robertson layup capped a 7-0 Auburn run to cut the deficit back to 10 points (60-50) with 11:33 remaining. However, a Jamont Gordon 3-pointer put a halt to the momentum, and the Bulldogs went back up by 20 points (72-52) at the 6:57 mark on a Ben Hansbrough layup. The MSU lead grew to as many as 23 points (83-60) after a Hansbrough trey with two minutes left, before the visitors coasted to their third league road triumph in four SEC outings on the season.

For the contest, the Bulldogs shot 52 percent from the field, including 10-of-23 accuracy from beyond the arc, and managed a season-best 89 percent from the charity stripe. Defensively, MSU limited Auburn to just 34 percent shooting for the game and owned a commanding 46-27 rebounding advantage.

Gordon (24 points & 13 rebounds) and Charles Rhodes (17/10) both notched double-doubles for the winners, while Rasheem Barrett led Auburn with 18 points.

MSU 80, ARKANSAS 74 Feb. 16, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

The homestanding Bulldogs survived a second-half scare and extended their SEC Western Division lead to two games over second-place Arkansas by claiming an 80-74 victory over the Razorbacks at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

With Charles Rhodes scoring 15 of the team's first 20 points through the opening six minutes of the game, MState (17-7, 8-2) grabbed an early nine-point advantage (22-13) by the 13:35 mark. Arkansas (17-7, 6-4) cut the deficit to four points on a couple of occasions, before the Bulldogs reclaimed a double-digit lead (32-22) on a break-away dunk by Barry Stewart with 8:18 left.

With Rhodes and Stewart hitting for 19 and 12 first-half points, respectively, MSU also benefitted from a 22-11 rebounding margin through the opening 20 minutes of play to claim a 47-34 half-time advantage.

Following a dunk by MSU's Jarvis Varnado to begin the second-half scoring, the Razorbacks went on a 19-2 run over the next five minutes to turn a 15-point deficit into a two-point lead (53-51) by the 13:54 mark. Arkansas went up by as many as four points (60-56) with 11:24 remaining, but the Bulldogs would regroup to force four deadlocks over a critical four-minute span.

Seven unanswered points by the home team put State on top by five points (73-68) with 3:56 left. The Razorbacks managed to cut the deficit to three points a couple of times down the stretch, but the Bulldogs finished off the game at the charity stripe. Hitting 23-of-29 from the line on the day, MSU converted on 14-of-18 free throws over the final 7:30 and went on to claim its eighth straight home victory over Arkansas.

With the Bulldogs outscoring the visitors, 23-8, from the line for the game, Rhodes and Stewart paced the winners with 24 and 19 points, respectively. Varnado notched his fourth double-double of the year with 10 points and 10 rebounds, while Jamont Gordon added nine points, eight boards and eight assists. Former MSU transfer Gary Ervin led a quartet of double-digit Arkansas scorers with 15 points off the bench.

The Bulldogs had their three-game winning streak snapped by dropping a 74-63 road decision to the rejuvenated Mississippi Rebels at UM's Tad Smith Coliseum.

In what started out as a high-octane offensive slugfest, the two teams combined for 35 points through the opening five minutes of action. State's Jamont Gordon traded 3-pointers with Ole Miss' Chris Warren to give the visitors a 19-16 lead by the 15:02 mark of the opening period. Gordon's trey started a 7-0 MSU run that gave the Bulldogs (17-8, 8-3) a 23-16 lead with 12:19 left.

Midway through the half, the Rebels (18-7, 4-7) responded with seven unanswered points of their own to take back the lead. In a half that featured six ties and three lead changes, Ole Miss secured a 35-30 halftime lead primarily on the strength of a commanding 28-17 rebounding advantage through the opening 20 minutes.

The Rebels maintained control of the contest throughout the second stanza, upping their margin to double digits (51-40) by the 10:55 mark. MState did make one final push by mounting a 9-2 run that cut an 11-point deficit to just four points (61-57) after a Ben Hansbrough 3-pointer with 4:51 remaining. However, the Bulldogs misfired on their next three shot attempts and committed two costly turnovers over the next two minutes to put an end to any final comeback attempt. Meanwhile, UM's lead returned to double figures (67-57) with 2:32 remaining and ultimately resulted in an 11-point Ole Miss victory.

The Bulldogs were limited to just 38 percent shooting from the field for the game, including only 6-of-23 (26%) from beyond the arc, and but 52 percent from the charity stripe. MSU was slowed by 15 turnovers and had only nine assists.

Warren led all scorers with 22 points on the night, while Eniel Polynice added 14 points for the winners. UM senior Dwayne Curtis notched his 13th double-double of the season with 10 points and a game-high 16 rebounds. Gordon paced the Bulldogs with 20 points, but hit only 6-of-17 shots from the field, while senior Charles Rhodes followed with 13 points.

The visiting Bulldogs pulled out a 61-56 overtime road victory over South Carolina at the Colonial Center to extend their SEC Western Division lead to two full games over Arkansas.

With both teams struggling from the field in the opening half on just 17-of-52 (33%) combined field-goal shooting and only 3-of-23 (13%) three-point accuracy between them, the homestanding Gamecocks (12-14, 4-8) owned a narrow 21-20 halftime advantage.

MState (18-8, 9-3) came out in the second period with a Jarvis Varnado dunk and a Ben Hansbrough 3-pointer to take a four-point lead (25-21) one minute into the half. The Bulldogs pushed the margin up to five points (32-27) with 13:59 left, before USC scored 11 unanswered points to mount a six-point lead (38-32) midway through the half. After hitting 1-of-2 charity tosses to give Carolina a 50-47 lead with seven ticks left on the clock, Evka Baniulis fouled Hansbrough on a trey attempt from the corner with 1.1 seconds left. With all five starters scoring in double figures, the Bulldogs shot a season-high 60 percent from the field en route to claiming an 89-78 home win over Auburn at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

After battling through four ties during the opening eight minutes of play, the Bulldogs (19-8, 10-3) eventually built an eight-point advantage midway through the first half. However, Quan Prowell of the visiting Tigers (14-12, 4-9) scored 11 unanswered points himself in less than two minutes on three 3-pointers and a two-point basket to put Auburn on top, 29-26, by the 7:08 mark.

A Phil Turner trey began a 9-0 MState run that put the home team back in the lead, 35-29, with 3:58 left in the half. After stretching the margin to as many as nine points (40-31), the Bulldogs settled for a 42-35 halftime lead on the strength of 59 percent field-goal shooting, including 7-of-13 accuracy (54%) from beyond the three-point arc.

MSU managed to maintain its lead throughout the second half, though the Tigers cut the deficit to two points four minutes into the period. Leading by only three points (51-48) following a DeWayne Reed 3-pointer at the 13:28 mark, Jamont Gordon and Ben Hansbrough nailed consecutive triples to halt the AU comeback attempt. Another Reed trey midway through the half narrowed the gap to six points (61-55), but State's Charles Rhodes answered in resounding fashion with two of his five dunks on the night to make it a 10-point game (65-55) with 8:59 remaining.

Using only six players in the contest, the Tigers never got any closer than eight points the rest of the way, as the Bulldogs pulled away for the 11-point triumph. The 89-78 victory was MSU's eighth straight home win over Auburn and marked the team's 13th win in the last 15 series meetings with the Tigers.

MState's 60 percent effort from the field marked the second-best shooting performance in SEC play for a Rick Stansbury-coached team. With 10 dunks and 11 made 3-pointers on the night, the efficient Bulldogs were credited with 22 assists on 33 made baskets.

Rhodes countered Prowell's brilliant 31-point performance (7-of-10 treys) with a career-high 30 points of his own on 11-of-14 field goals and 7-of-8 free throws. Gordon followed with 20 points and added six assists for the winners.

With the nine-point win, MSU (20-8, 11-3) captured its fourth SEC West crown in the last six seasons and eclipsed the 20-win mark for the seventh time during the Rick Stansbury era.

After the homestanding Gators (21-8, 8-6) took a brief 4-3 lead two minutes into the contest, the Bulldogs rattled off 11 unanswered points to take a 14-4 advantage by the 13:55 mark. In limiting Florida to only 35 percent first-half shooting, including but 3-of-12 from beyond the arc, MState maintained the upper hand the rest of the way en route to owning a 39-27 halftime lead. The Gators outscored the visitors, 9-2, during

the opening six minutes of the second stanza to cut the deficit to five points (41-36) by the 14:10 mark. After the Bulldogs pushed the margin up to 13 points (52-39) with 8:04 remaining, Florida gradually cut into the State lead. A 1-of-2 effort from the line by UF's Nick Calathes made it a sixpoint game (56-50) with 3:56 left. A minute later after the Gators had pulled to within six points again following a Marreese Speights layup, MSU's Ben Hansbrough hit a clutch 3-pointer at the 2:37 mark that all but sealed the Bulldogs' fifth SEC road win in seven tries on the season.

State hit 5-of-6 free throws over the final 41 seconds to push the margin to 13 points before settling for the nine-point road triumph and breaking a three-game series losing skid to UF.

With Florida entering the game leading the SEC in team field-goal percentage (.494) for all games on the year and averaging 79.1 points per outing coming into the contest, the Bulldogs held their 10th of 14 league opponents under the 40percent mark from the field. The Gators could manage but 22-of-61 (36.1%) field-goal shooting on the day, including just 7-of-25 (28%) treys.

Hansbrough paced four double-figure State scorers with 20 points, while Charles Rhodes added 15 points and eight rebounds for the winners. MSU's Jarvis Varnado accounted for 11 points, 11 boards and seven blocks. Speights led Florida with 20 points and 10 rebounds.

The visiting 25th-ranked Bulldogs could not overcome a brilliant shooting performance from SEC Player of the Year candidate Shan Foster in dropping a gut-wrenching 86-85 overtime decision to 16th-ranked Vanderbilt on 'Senior Night' at VU's historic Memorial Gymnasium.

In limiting the Commodores (25-5, 10-5) to just 32 percent first-half shooting and only 3-of-13 from beyond the arc, MState (20-9, 11-4) held the advantage for nearly the entire first half. Vandy did take a brief 30-28 lead on a Foster dunk with less than a minute left, but MSU all-America candidate and Nashville native Jamont Gordon countered with a driving layup to knot the score at 30-30 at the half.

The Bulldogs maintained control of the contest for much of the opening seven minutes of the second stanza, increasing their lead to as many as eight points (46-38) following a Jarvis Varnado dunk at the 12:33 mark. After missing his first six three-point attempts on the night, Foster caught fire and capped an 11-0 Vandy run with his first two made treys of the evening. However, State

responded with nine unanswered points to take back a six-point lead (55-49) with 8:44 remaining. MSU never again surrended that lead in the second half, though Vanderbilt deadlocked the contest three more times over the final 4:27. Foster accounted for the sixth tie of the game on another 3-pointer with some 14 seconds left in regulation. Gordon's potential game-winning, mid-range jumper rolled off the rim as time expired with the score tied at 74-74 to send the classic contest into an extra five-minute session.

After having gone scoreless during regulation, MSU's Ben Hansbrough opened the overtime scoring with a 3-pointer to stake the visitors to a lead they would hold until the final seconds of the game. Hansbrough hit another triple with 35 seconds left to give State an 84-80 lead, but Foster countered with another long-range bomb to make it a one-point contest. Hansbrough then converted just one of two free throws with some 29 seconds remaining to make it a two-point con-

test (85-83) and set up the climactic finish.

With the game clock winding down, Foster jumped up and nailed his ninth consecutive 3pointer to give the Commodores an unbelievable 86-85 overtime triumph. The last-second victory preserved their perfect 19-0 home record on the year, while Foster finished with a career-high 42 points on spectacular 16-of-25 shooting from the field and 9-of-15 accuracy from the arc. Gordon and Charles Rhodes paced MSU with 24 and 22 points, respectively. Rhodes added 14 rebounds.

MSU's all-SEC tandem of Jamont Gordon and Charles Rhodes combined for 50 points to help lead the Bulldogs to an 84-75 'Senior Day' triumph over LSU at Humphrey Coliseum.

The homestanding Bulldogs (21-9, 12-4) built a 10-point lead six minutes into the contest and maintained control of the game for the better part of the opening 20 minutes of play. Guided by interim head coach and former MSU point guard Butch Pierre, the Tigers (13-17, 6-10) went on an 11-2 run late in the half to turn a five-point deficit into a four-point lead within the final minute. Helped by a 22-14 first-half rebounding advantage, LSU held a slim 43-42 halftime lead.

The visitors stayed in front for nearly the first four minutes of the second stanza. After LSU's Chris Johnson was sent to the bench after picking up his fourth foul at the 16:58 mark, the Bulldogs would later go on a 12-1 run to go back up by double digits (62-52) midway through the period. The MState margin grew to 14 points (68-54) by the 7:21 mark before Marcus Thornton singlehandedly brought the Tigers back into the game.

Thornton hit all five of his second-half 3ointers within a four-minute span to trim the LSU deficit to four points (75-71) with 2:18 remaining. However, the Bulldogs would hit 7of-8 charity tosses over the final 1:13 of the game to cap a 20-of-24 effort from the line en route to claiming the nine-point victory over the Tigers.

MSU held its fifth straight opponent under the 40-percent mark from the field, including limiting the Tigers to just 33 percent field-goal shooting in the second half. The Bulldogs also posted their 10th game of the campaign with double-digit blocked shots with 10 rejects against LSU - seven by NCAA leader Jarvis Varnado.

Rhodes posted his ninth double-double of the season with 27 points and 10 rebounds, including 17 points and all 10 of his boards coming in the second half, while Gordon added 23 points and nine caroms for the winners. Their combined 50point, 19-rebound effort offset a superb 38-point performance (6-12 treys) by LSU's Thornton.

MISSISSIPPI STATE HEAD BASKETBALL COACH RICK STANSBURY

Now in his 10th season as head coach of the Mississippi State Bulldogs, Rick Stansbury surpassed his former mentor Richard Williams to become the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history with MSU's 95-70 road victory over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 21. Stansbury previously spent eight seasons on Williams' State staff prior to being named his successor in 1998. In his 19th season overall with the MSU hoops program, Stansbury has been associated with 11 postseason tournament teams (7 NCAA & 4 NIT), two SEC Tournament title clubs and seven regular-season league/divisional championship squads. With a 10-year head coaching record of 206-113 (.646), Stansbury ranks 18th among the all-time winningest SEC basketball coaches by percentage and last month (Feb. 6 vs. Alabama) became the 20th member of the SEC's 200-win club.

During his 10 seasons at the State helm, Stansbury has doubled the school's all-time postseason tournament appearances from seven to 14 with four consecutive NCAA Tournament berths (2002-

During his 10 seasons at the State helm, Stansbury has doubled the school's all-time postseason tournament appearances from seven to 14 with four consecutive NCAA Tournament berths (2002-05) along with last year's third NIT showing (2007, '01 & '99). With seven 20-win seasons under Stansbury's guidance, MSU has also claimed an overall SEC championship (2004), four SEC West crowns (2008, '07, '04 & '03) and an SEC Tournament title (2002) over the past seven seasons. With his 2006-07 MSU team securing the school's seventh postseason tournament appearance (4 NCAA & 3 NIT) in his first nine seasons at the State helm, Stansbury most recently guided the 21-14 Bulldogs to a berth in last year's MasterCard NIT Semifinals in New York City.

Three years ago in 2004-05, Stansbury further extended all-time school marks by directing the 23-18 Bulldogs to a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance as well as a fourth straight 20-win season. Prior to the current decade, the Bulldogs had neither previously reached 20 wins in three straight seasons, made four consecutive postseason tournaments nor earned three straight NCAA Tournament berths in the program's basketball history.

During the 2003-04 season, Stansbury guided State to its first outright SEC title since 1962-63 with

During the 2003-04 season, Stansbury guided State to its first outright SEC title since 1962-63 with a 14-2 league mark en route to posting a 26-4 overall record (12-0 on the road) and earning a school-first third straight NCAA Tournament appearance. In doing so, Stansbury was named The Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year, while earning district coaching honors from both the National Association of Basketball Coaches and United States Basketball Writers Association. He piloted the 21-10 Bulldogs to an NCAA Tournament berth in 2002-03 after advancing to the title

game of the SEC Tournament for a second consecutive year.

In his rookie season at the Bulldog helm (1998-99), Stansbury became the school's all-time winningest first-year head basketball coach (20-13). During the 2001-02 season, he directed MSU to a school-record 27 wins, including an SEC Tournament title and NCAA appearance.

Previously as an eight-year assistant/associate head coach on Williams; staff, Stansbury played

an integral role in helping guide Mississippi State University to three NCAA Tournaments, including a Final Four berth in 1996 and Sweet 16 showing in 1995, one NIT appearance (1994), one SEC Tournament title (1996), one regular-season SEC overall co-championship (1991), and back-to-back SEC Western Division crowns in 1995 and 1996.

Prior to his move to Starkville, Stansbury served a six-year stint (1985-90) as an assistant coach at Austin Peay State. Born in Louisville, Ky., and raised in Brandenburg, Ky., he is a 1982 graduate of Campbellsville (Ky.) College and was inducted into his alma mater's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003. Stansbury then went on to earn a master's degree in 1984 from Cumberland (Ky.) College. Stansbury, 48, is married to the former Meo Mellen of Roanoke, Va., and they are the proud parents of three sons - Isaac, 8, Noah, 5, and Luke, 3.
