BULLDOGS, TIGERS MEET WITH TRIP TO TITLE GAME ON THE LINE

Mississippi State and LSU meet for the third time this season at noon today when the long-time rivals square off in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament in Tampa. After the Tigers roared to an 81-57 win in Baton Rouge back in January, the two battled it out in a thrilling double-overtime affair that resulted in a gut-wrenching 97-94 setback for the Bulldogs. Prior to this season, MSU had won four-straight in this series, one that dates back to 1909. However, the two have only met four times in the tournament, with each squad winning twice. LSU won the first two in 1957 and 1987, but State has won the last two — in 2002 and 2003.

BULLDOGS AND THE SEC TOURNAMENT

Mississippi State advances to Saturday's semifinals sporting a 23-46 record in the SEC Tournament, including their 2-0 mark this year. The Bulldogs' 23 victories are tied for the ninth-most all-time. Kentucky leads the league with 111 wins, followed by Alabama and Tennessee with 57 and 56, respectively. MSU has faced Vanderbilt (7-4) and Georgia (3-8) the most, 11 times. The four wins against Vandy are also the most against any team for MSU. The Bulldogs have never lost to Ole Miss (1-0) but have never defeated Arkansas (2-0). Friday, MState defeated South Carolina for the first time in three tries.

STEWART CONTINUES HIS CLIMB UPWARD

Junior guard Barry Stewart drained 4 of his 6 3-point attempts against South Carolina to give him 68 for the year and 198 for his career. His production against the Gamecocks moved him past Timmy Bowlers (197) for the second-most in school history. He's also second with 541 attempts. Darryl Wilson (1994-96) sits atop both categories with 258 made treys on 645 attempts.

VARNADO INCHING CLOSER TO SETTING LONG-TIME SEC MARK

With six blocked shots against South Carolina, junior forward Jarvis Varnado now has 152 on the year. Last season, he swatted away 157 to tie Shaquille O'Neal's SEC record set in 1992. He has at least two games remaining to surpass O'Neal, who also owns the career mark of 412. Varnado's career total stands at 376. As a team, the Bulldogs have 247 blocks on the year. The SEC team record is 267, set by MSU last season. Now in third is Kentucky with the 240 blocks it collected in 1998.

BULLDOGS FINALLY PLAY A RANKED FOE

It's taken 34 games, but Mississippi State will finally play a ranked opponent this year when it meets LSU today. The Tigers are currently ranked No. 20 by the Associated Press. The last time the Bulldogs played a ranked foe was last year in the second round of the NCAA Tournament when they dropped a 77-74 decision to No. 2 Memphis. Last year, Mississippi State was 1-4 against ranked opponents, with the win coming against No. 15 Ole Miss in Starkville, 88-68.

MSU ENJOYED MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 11-7 ledger against non-conference foes, coupled with this year's 10-5 mark, Mississippi State has compiled a dominant 121-38 (.761) record against non-conference opponents during the Rick Stansbury era (since 1998-99), including a 113-30 (.790) regular-season mark versus non-league foes.

MARCH AND HOME DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 4-3 March record, the Bulldogs are 34-22 (.607) in the month of March since Rick Stansbury was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1988-89 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, MSU owns a composite ledger of 48-41 (.539) in March.

At home, MSU has put together a 135-33 (.804) mark at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's guidance, including a 65-23 (.739) SEC record and 70-10 (.875) ledger at home against non-conference foes.

The Bulldogs, who are 13-5 this year, had their nine-game winning streak at the Hump snapped back in December against Charlotte but have still won 21 out of the last 27. Prior to the setback against the 49ers, MSU's last loss on its home floor came on Feb. 2, 2008, against Tennessee (76-71), which entered the game 18-2 and ranked No. 7.

MARCH AND MSU'S ROAD RECORD UNDER STANSBURY

Last year in March in regular-season play only, the Bulldogs' posted a 1-1 record on the road, defeating Florida and losing in overtime to Vanderbilt. In the last 11 years, Stansbury-coached teams have compiled a 5-4 March mark on the road, including last Saturday's 82-80 win at Ole Miss.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the Rick Stansbury era, the Bulldogs are: 181-27 when leading at halftime (16-2 this year); 162-32 when shooting 45 percent or better from the field (16-2); 188-60 when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field (18-8); 184-68 when out-rebounding or tying opponents (11-2); and 138-25 when holding opponents to 65 points or less (10-2).

NOW THAT HAS A FAMILIAR RING

Last year, the Bulldogs led the Southeastern Conference in scoring defense (65.5), field goal percentage defense (.370), rebounding offense (40.7) and blocked shots (7.85).

Compared to their 33 games this season, the statistical numbers are quite similar. So far, MSU is yielding just 69.4 points on just 39.8 percent shooting from the floor and grabbing 38.2 rebounds to go along with its 247 blocked shots. Jarvis Varnado, who led the nation a year ago with a school-record 157 blocks, has 152.

SECOND IN THE NATION AGAIN IN BLOCKED SHOTS

After finishing second last year in the nation in blocked shots (267) behind Connecticut (285), Mississippi State (7.5) is second again behind the Huskies (8.0) as both teams are now in postseason play. Junior forward Jarvis Varnado is tops individually with 152, followed by the Huskies' Hasheem Thabeet with 142.

MSU held the overall lead until last Saturday, when UConn took over the per game average. MSU has just one less block (247) on the year but has played one more game than the Huskies.

■ With a quick glance at the freshman record books, you'll see Dee Bost's name everywhere:

PERCENTAGE TELLS THE STORY

■ To look at the success, or the lack thereof, Mississippi State is having, just look at shooting percentages. In games the Bulldogs are shooting 45 percent or better, they are 16-2. But when they shoot less than 45 percent, they are 5-10.

SETTING A SCHOOL RECORD

■ Against Alabama, MSU attempted 39 3-pointers, breaking the school-record set against Nicolls State (11-21-04) and Auburn (2-14-09). On the year, MSU has attempted 757. The school record is 775 (2006-07).

KNOCKING DOWN THE 3S

■ If there's one team that's enjoyed success beyond the arc in recent weeks, it's Mississippi State. While MSU set a school record with 16 against Arkansas, it's worth noting the Bulldogs have hit 139 treys (377 attempts, 36.9 percent) in their last 14 games.

VARNADO'S BLOCK PARTY

■ Does junior forward Jarvis Varnado have a shot at the NCAA blocked shots record owned by Wojciech Mydra (535) of Louisiana-Monroe set from 1998-2002? Yes he does. Varnado has 376 for his career, which means he's 159 shy of tying the mark. To reach 535, he needs to average 4.8 blocks an outing based on the notion he'll see action in 33 more games (a minimum of two more this year and 31 next season).

AS THE MEN DO, SO DO THE WOMEN

■ While the Mississippi State men lead the SEC and are second in nation in blocked shots (7.5) per outing, the Lady Bulldogs (6.3) are tops in the SEC and fifth nationally. Jarvis Varnado leads the nation with 146 and Lady Bulldog standout Chanel Mokango is seventh with 95. Currently, Mississippi State is the only BCS school where both the men and the women lead their conference in blocked shots.

MAKING THE 3S OFF THE COURT

■ This past semester, MSU not only excelled on the court, they put up impressive numbers in the classroom, too. The 16 players on the roster posted an overall GPA of 2.68, the second-highest average in two years. Seven players finished with a GPA of 3.0 or better, while two had a 4.0.

OVERCOMING MAJOR DEFICITS

■ Three times this year, MSU has rallied from double-digit deficits – Arkansas (15) and South Carolina twice (10 both times). The most a Rick Stansbury-coached team has battled back from is 20 (Kentucky, 1-5-02).

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. Since the 2006-07 season, the Bulldogs have posted a 39-11 mark for an .780 winning percentage. With a 13-5 mark this year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's 11 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 135-33 (.804) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 65-23 (.739) SEC mark and a 70-10 (.875) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 32-season composite record of 341-131 (.722) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

Entering the 2008-09 campaign, no team in the SEC's Western Division has enjoyed more success on the road in the last 10 years than Mississippi State. In the 106 games away from Humphrey Coliseum, the Bulldogs posted a 46-60 (.434) ledger. LSU is second with 34 wins, followed by Alabama with 27.

Overall in the SEC, MSU ranks fourth overall. Kentucky is tops with 59, followed by Florida (52) and Tennessee (49).

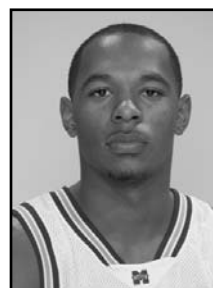

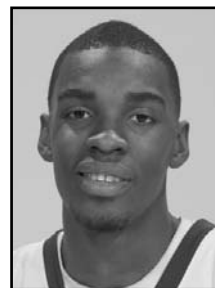
Three other times this season, Varnado flirted with triple-doubles, but came up just short on either points, rebounds or blocks.

MISSISSIPPI STATE 69, ALABAMA 67 (OT)

MARCH 14, 2008 • ATLANTA, GA

Playing their third overtime contest in a six-game span, the top-seeded Bulldogs outlasted the fifth-seeded Alabama 69-67 in overtime, during the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament.

Not only did both teams have to battle an extra five minutes on the hardwood, but they also had to endure an hour-plus delay in the contest due to severe weather that hit the downtown Atlanta area during the overtime period.

The Bulldogs (22-9) jumped out to a quick 10-0 lead by the 17:37 mark of the opening half, before Alabama (17-16) could manage its first basket on a Brandon Hollinger 3-pointer a minute later. The Tide cut the deficit to a single point (17-16) on another Hollinger trey with 10:51 left in the half. Three straight MSU baskets by Charles Rhodes put the Bulldogs back on top by five points (27-22) with 7:09 remaining. However, Alabama outscored State 14-2 the final seven minutes to take a 36-29 halftime lead.

With eight of the Tide's 12 first-half field goals coming on 3-pointers, the Bulldogs managed just two made free throws over the final seven minutes of the opening half.

Alabama maintained its lead for the majority of the second stanza, before State's Ben Hansbrough followed two free throws with a 3-pointer at the 2:37 mark to give the Bulldogs their first lead (54-52) since early in the first half. Following two more deadlocks, MSU's Barry Stewart went to the line with a chance to seal the win with seven ticks left in regulation. After Stewart missed his second charity toss, Bama's Mykal Riley sent the game into overtime tied at 59-59 with a buzzer-beating triple that rolled around the rim and off the backboard and finally in the basket.

Following the weather delay with MSU on top, 64-61, at the 2:11 mark, the Bulldogs went up by five points with less than a minute left. With seven seconds left and MSU ahead by two (69-67) with another chance to ice the game at the line, Hansbrough missed on both free throws to set up a dramatic finish to a strange evening. With less than a second left, Riley missed trey.

GEORGIA 64, MISSISSIPPI STATE 50

MARCH 15, 2008 • ATLANTA, GA

Mississippi State dropped a 64-60 decision to the gritty, sixth-seeded homestate Georgia Bulldogs in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament played at Alexander Memorial Coliseum on the Georgia Tech campus.

Playing its second game of the day due to the postponement of Friday's quarterfinal-round game against Kentucky at the Georgia Dome because of the severe weather, the under-manned Georgia club (16-16) got out to a quick 5-0 start against MSU (22-10). By the 13:30 mark of the opening period, UGA owned a 15-4 lead, as all-SEC senior guard Sundiata Gaines scored 10 quick points.

As the first-half fouls mounted for Georgia, MState scored eight unanswered points to knot the score at 21-21 with 6:38 remaining.

However, back-to-back 3-pointers by Gaines and Corey Butler put UGA back in the lead. Despite being outscored by 10 points at the charity stripe, Georgia's 24-17 first-half rebounding lead helped its cause in earning a 33-33 halftime deadlock.

With neither team owning more than a four-point advantage throughout the final 20 minutes, the homestate Bulldogs held a four-point lead (50-46) with 11:18 remaining. MSU responded with eight unanswered points to reverse the four-point margin to 54-50 by the 6:56 mark. Following a seventh tie at (57-57) at the 2:43 mark, the two teams traded scores until the final minute of play.

Down by one point (61-60), MSU's Charles Rhodes collected a Georgia miss, but missed a close-range jumper on the offensive end. Barry Stewart fouled on the ensuing UGA defensive rebound, and Rhodes compounded the situation by being called for a technical foul. Georgia's Billy Humphrey connected on both technical free throws, but Butler misfired on his 1-and-1 attempt from

In the season's first of two exhibition contests, Mississippi State rode a double-double performance from junior Jarvis Varnado to take care of visiting Montevallo 88-59 at Humphrey Coliseum.

Varnado, the reigning National Defensive Player of the Year, recorded 17 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the floor to go along with his game-high 12 rebounds. He also blocked eight shots after leading the nation in blocked shots a year ago with 157. Sophomore Ravern Johnson led all scorers on the night with an 8-of-14 performance from the field for a total of 19 points, while freshman Romero Osby pitched in the team's second double-double with 10 points and 11 boards. Dee Bost scored 13 points and handed out seven assists to just three turnovers in the win.

Junior guards Marcus Lancaster and Freddy Little led Montevallo in scoring with 10 points apiece on a collective 8-of-25 shooting performance, while junior forward Nate Flowers led the squad in rebounding with nine boards.

Ranking second nationally in team field-goal percentage defense last year, the Bulldogs followed suit by holding Montevallo to just 23-of-71 shooting from the floor for a 32.6% mark. Also specializing in blocks as a team by ranking second nationally in that category a year ago, MSU swatted 13 shots on the evening. Leading Montevallo in rebounding at halftime 32-21, State never let up and finished the game with a 62-37 advantage.

Mississippi State utilized an 18-5 rally in the final minutes to overcome two-time defending NAIA national champion Oklahoma City 67-65 at Humphrey Coliseum in the season's final exhibition outing.

Junior Jarvis Varnado once again flirted with triple-double status in the contest by scoring 12 points, claiming a game-high 13 rebounds, and swatting eight shots after leading the nation in blocks a year ago. Varnado amassed 29 points, 25 rebounds and 16 blocks in State's two exhibition contests.

Senior Brian Johnson fell just a rebound shy of a double-double performance for the Bulldogs with 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting, while standout freshman Dee Bost tallied 11 points and six assists. Junior Barry Stewart and sophomore Ravern Johnson rounded out State scorers in double digits with 11 and 10 points, respectively.

The Bulldogs never led until the 1:41 mark of the second half when Ravern Johnson drained a 3-pointer for a 65-63 advantage. However, the Stars answered and evened the score on an Ellis jumper, but with 1:23 left, Varnado gave MSU the lead for good on a dunk.

Mississippi State's Ravern Johnson hit five 3-point baskets and scored a team-high 15 points as the Bulldogs defeated Centenary College 77-55 in a season-opening men's basketball game at Humphrey Coliseum.

The Bulldogs scored the game's first seven points and never trailed in the contest. MSU improved to 9-2 in season openers under coach Rick Stansbury and 76-21 all-time.

MSU set the tone from 3-point range early. Dee Bost and Johnson hit back-to-back 3-pointers to help the Bulldogs spring from the gates. Those two treys would be the first of 10 for the hosts in the contest. The early lead stretched to double digits at 17-7 on a jumper from Riley Benock.

In the opening half, the Bulldogs used a five-on-five rotation as the search for consistency and set line-ups will continue in non-conference play. Another 7-0 run allowed the Bulldogs to take their largest first-half lead, at 30-15. Still, the deficit was too much to overcome to pick up the win. With the loss, Mississippi State dropped its first home contest in the last 10 outings at Humphrey Coliseum.

State had won 13 of its last 14 at home.

Freshman point guard Dee Bost hit a season-high 6-of-8 free throws to lead MSU in scoring with 15 points, while fellow freshman Romero Osby drained a perfect 4-of-4 free throws to record 10, his second double-digit performance of the season.

Stewart also connected on all four of his free throw attempts for 10 points to round out State scorers in double digits.

Senior forward Lamont Mack notched a game-high 19 points and eight rebounds to lead the 49ers.

State managed just 17 field goals, tied for eighth-least under Stansbury's leadership. Following suit, tonight's 30.1% mark from the field was the Bulldogs' fourth-worst under Stansbury and worst since 2005. Wednesday also marked Charlotte's first-ever win against MSU.

Hot shooting and another powerful performance from star center Jarvis Varnado led Mississippi State to a 79-60 victory against South Alabama at Humphrey Coliseum.

Varnado put up eight points, six blocks and six rebounds by halftime to finish the game just a point shy of his career high of 22 points on 9-of-11 shooting, along with eight rebounds and six blocks.

Following their worst offensive production of the season against Charlotte, MSU hit 29 of its 54 shots for 53.7 percent, its second-best offensive performance of the season.

In his first start of the season, Phil Turner came up with a season-high 10 points on 3-of-6 shooting and a perfect 4 of 4 from the charity stripe, as well as recording four assists. Despite the win, the Bulldogs were out-rebounded 39-33 and are now 2-2 when losing the battle of the boards.

However after that made basket, it was all Bearcats, who closed the half on a 15-0 run. That run included four different 3-point baskets.

In the first overtime session of the season for Mississippi State, the Bulldogs dropped a 64-61 decision at Humphrey Coliseum to the San Diego Toreros.

Tying a season high with 17 points, junior shooting guard Barry Stewart hit 6-of-7 free throws, dished out four assists and registered two steals to lead MSU, while freshman point guard Dee Bost put up 13 points and stole the ball a season-high four times. Sophomore Phil Turner also notched a season-high eight rebounds.

Jarvis Varnado recorded the team's only double-double, his fifth of the year, with 10 points and 13 rebounds. The junior also blocked six shots, placing him as just the fifth player in SEC history to register at least 300 blocks in a career.

Sophomore guard Trumaine Johnson led the Toreros with 17 points on 7-of-17 shooting while senior center Gyno Pomare also pulled down a double-double after scoring 10 points and claiming 15 rebounds.

A pair of Stewart free throws put MSU ahead 53-49 with 1:01 remaining, but Johnson responded with two free throws to pull within two at the 0:49.3 mark. After an MSU turnover, Pomare tipped the ball in to tie the score at 53-all. State had a chance to win in regulation, but missed three shots under the game in the closing seconds.

The two teams traded buckets for the majority of the extra stanza, but a jumper from junior guard DeJon Jackson put the Toreros up by four with just 46 seconds left.

Ranked second in the league in rebounding, junior Jarvis Varnado grabbed 10 boards to help State gain a 32-30 rebounding advantage.

After a few close minutes to begin the game, State then held the Hilltoppers scoreless for over six minutes and put up a 17-0 run while forcing WKU to miss eight consecutive shots from the floor. MSU carried a 47-25 lead into the half.

Western Kentucky refused to let up in the second stanza however, and pulled to within 16 several times.

Mississippi State's 66.6 percent mark from the floor was the best single-game offensive efficiency of any Rick Stansbury squad.

Mississippi State opened up Southeastern Conference play with an impressive 70-56 win against Arkansas.

The Bulldogs again used the long ball - hitting 11 3-point baskets in the contest. A spirited defensive effort and 13-0 run midway through the second half added up to a huge road win as MSU squad that collected its third straight win.

The Bulldogs won their conference opener for the 17th time in the past 19 seasons and won for a fourth time ever in Fayetteville and third time ever in Bud Walton Arena.

A pair of double-double efforts powered the Mississippi State Bulldogs to the team's first second-half comeback victory of the season with an 83-74 win against the visiting Alabama Crimson Tide at Humphrey Coliseum.

The win was the fifth-straight for the Bulldogs against their border rival.

Junior Jarvis Varnado and freshman Dee Bost recorded the double-doubles for MSU. Varnado grabbed 10 boards and scored 11 points while Bost handed out 10 assists – a tie for his season high – and notched 13 points for MSU's first two double-double performance since last year's matchup against Memphis in the NCAA Tournament.

Sophomore Phil Turner led State scorers with a career-high matching 17 points on 6-of-9 shooting, including 3 of 4 from behind the arc. Junior Barry Stewart added 13 points while freshman Romero Osby put up eight points and six rebounds.

For the Tide, junior guard Mikhail Torrance led the game with 20 points on 6-of-9 shooting while senior guard Gee had 15 on a 7-of-17 effort.

The Bulldogs trailed 36-33 at the break after struggling on offense during the first half. State reeled off a 13-5 run out of halftime to regain the lead at the 17:44 mark with a Stewart trey. During the run, the Bulldogs seemed to be pulling away, gaining their largest lead of 13 with a layup from freshman Twany Beckham at the 6:52 mark to put MSU ahead 72-59.

The Tide responded with a 9-0 run, however, to eventually pull within four with just 1:43 remaining. With several free throws and buckets traded back and forth, the play of the game came with 46.8 seconds left. Stewart stole a Hollinger pass and handed it off to Bost, who hurled it downcourt to a wide-open Varnado, and the resulting jam brought the crowd to its feet and put the score at 75-68.

Mississippi State 66, Kentucky 57

Mississippi State matched a school record by hitting 14 3-pointers in a 66-57 at Kentucky.

MSU won at Rupp Arena for the first time since 1995 and for only the second time ever. The Bulldogs have now won five times all-time in Lexington.

The Bulldogs have now won three straight meetings from the Wildcats for the first time in school history. In this contest, there were no ties and the Bulldogs never trailed.

The Bulldogs shot a season-best in conference play 51.9 percent from 3-point range. The Bulldogs hit 14 of 27 shots from behind the arc. MSU has now hit 14 3-point attempts in six different ballgames.

Tuesday's contest started out as a defensive struggle. MSU scored the first eight points of the contest. UK missed its first nine shots before breaking the ice at the 13:59 mark of the first half. The Wildcats then battled back from an 11-2 deficit with eight straight points. Still, MSU never lost the momentum. A Ravenn Johnson 3-point basket gave MSU a 23-16 advantage.

The Bulldogs led 37-24 at halftime. Again Johnson had the hot hand, draining a 3-pointer as the first half ran out.

In the second half, MSU held three different 13-point advantages, including a 43-30 lead with 15:04 remaining. UK then sparked the home crowd with a 10-0 run, cutting the deficit to 43-40 with 11:02 left. From there, the Bulldogs reeled off a stunning 18-5 run to open the game's largest advantage at 61-45 with 3:08 left. After hitting nine 3-point baskets in the opening half, the Bulldogs hit four during the game clinching run.

Despite a 15-point deficit at the half, Mississippi State stormed back in the second frame behind a school-record 16 3-pointers to defeat Arkansas 86-77.

The fifteen-point deficit was the largest overcome by MSU this season, as the win also handed State a season sweep of the Razorbacks, its first since 2005.

Dee Bost set a new season standard with 25 points on 6-of-8 shooting from behind the arc while also dishing out seven assists without any turnovers. Courtney Fortson led the Razorbacks with 19 points. Three other Arkansas players scored in double digits, including junior big-man Michael Washington, who had 14 to go along with his seven rebounds.

The Bulldogs couldn't stop the Razorbacks in the first half, as they hit 62.8 percent of their shots.

A series of huge runs inched State closer in the second half, however, as MSU opened the frame on a 12-2 run. A trey from sophomore Riley Benock sparked an even bigger push for State later in the half, as Benock brought down another three with 8:11 remaining to give the Bulldogs their first lead of the game on their way to a 17-2 run.

From that point, MSU never trailed again.

LSU scored the next seven points to go up 91-85 with 1:47 left. Five free throws from sophomore Elgin Bailey and a three from Bost tied the game again, this time at 93, with 52 seconds remaining. The Tigers scored five of the game's final six points, including three free throws, to put LSU up by three.

That stretch of play allowed MSU to open up a six-point advantage, at 17-11. Minutes later, a trey by Raven Johnson stretched the lead to 25-17.

Over the final 7:13 of the half, the Bulldogs went cold. A layup by UT's Brian Williams gave the Volunteers the lead at 27-2, one they never relinquished. The first half ended with four-straight turnovers by MSU, as the Vols closed the half on a 14-3 run.

In the second frame, the Volunteers held the upper hand most of the way. The Bulldogs got no closer than 37-35 a couple of minutes into the half. UT eventually stretched the lead to 70-59 with 3:03 remaining. The Volunteers missed 4-of-10 free throw attempts to allow the Bulldogs to close back within three points in the final half minute.

For the contest, the Bulldogs hit 25-of-53 shots from the field, 11-of-30 shots from 3-point range and 15-of-19 shots from the foul line.. The Volunteers were 31-of-65 shooting, 6 of 18 from 3-point range and 13 of 18 at the foul line.

Scotty Hopson led all scorers with a career-high 21 points, while Barry Stewart paced MSU with 20 points.

Mississippi State bolted out to a 7-2 lead to open the game, but from that point it was all Auburn, which claimed a 76-58 win at Humphrey Coliseum.

It was the fifth loss in the last six games for the Bulldogs.

Leading MSU was standout junior Jarvis Varnado, who sank 6-of-11 shots from the field for 14 points. He also grabbed a game-high nine rebounds.

Sophomore Phil Turner and freshman Dee Bost each pitched in 12 points and combined for 14 rebounds, while All-SEC junior Barry Stewart claimed 11 points and three steals.

Freshman guard Frankie Sullivan led the Tigers with 14 points on 4-of-5 shooting, while three others scored in double digits for Auburn.

State jumped out to a 7-2 lead to begin the game, but that would be the last time MSU would see the lead as Auburn responded with a 13-0 run and held the Bulldogs without a field goal for the next 8:22.

Taking a 38-21 lead into halftime, Auburn maintained a double-digit advantage throughout the remainder of the second half.

The bright spot for MSU was rebounding, as State out-rebounded Auburn 35-32 to win the battle of the boards for just the third time this season in SEC play. State's 58 points were the second-least for the squad this season in league competition (57 at LSU).

The win for Auburn, which earned the season sweep, at Humphrey Coliseum was its first since 2000.

Mississippi State enjoyed Senior Night by breathing Florida 80-71 at Humphrey Coliseum to snap a three-game slide.

A hot shooting night sparked the Bulldogs to the win, as sophomore Ravern Johnson hit 4-of-7 shots from downtown to finish with a team-high 15 points. Johnson now has 76 made treys on the season and stands third all-time at MSU in that category.

Defensive Player of the Year cadidate Jarvis Varnado finished with 13 points and eight rebounds while sophomore Kodi Augustus contributed nine points on 4-of-5 shooting and three rebounds off the bench.

Mississippi State closed out the regular season with an impressive 82-80 come-from-behind win at Ole Miss.

With the victory, the Bulldogs avoided being swept by their arch-rivals for the first time since 1998 and earned the No. 3 seed heading to the SEC Tournament riding a two-game winning streak.

Barry Stewart rammed home four 3-pointers and scored a team-high 17 points to lead MSU, which snapped its three-game losing skid in Oxford.

There were 13 ties and nine lead changes. Neither team led by more than eight points throughout the entire contest.

Ole Miss started the contest strong, opening an 18-10 lead with 12:50 left before halftime. A 10-3 run by MSU cut the Rebels' lead to 21-20.

A layup by MSU's Twanny Beckham finally tied the teams at 27. Both teams were deadlocked 42-42 at intermission.

The second half also saw five ties before a pair of Kodi Augustus free throws finally allowed the Bulldogs to break on top 57-56. The Rebels then reeled off seven straight points with a Terrico White dunk giving UM a 63-57 lead.

This time, MSU would have the final answer. The teams became tied at 65-65 before Stewart rammed home a 3-point basket for a 68-65 lead. Seconds later, Bulldog Phil Turner hit a 3-pointer of his own to give his squad a 71-66 advantage, capping a 12-2 run by the Bulldogs.

The Rebels then closed within two on two different occasions, including 79-77 in the final half minute. Riley Benock hit a pair of free throws for an 81-77 lead. After Terrico White drained another 3-pointner for the Rebels, Dee Bost answered with one free.
