BULLDOGS OPEN EXHIBITION PLAY AGAINST MONTEVALLO

Mississippi State officially begins its 11th season of basketball under Rick Stansbury as the Bulldogs welcome Montevallo to Humphrey Coliseum for the first of two exhibition games. After today, Oklahoma City pays a visit on Nov. 8, one week before the season opener against Centenary.

MSU ENJOYS EXHIBITION SUCCESS UNDER RICK STANSBURY

In his previous 10 seasons as MSU's head basketball coach, Rick Stansbury has guided the Bulldogs to a 17-2 ledger in exhibition play. Last year, State was 2-0, defeating the University of the Cumberlands, 71-60, and Oklahoma City, 100-69. On Nov. 8, Oklahoma City returns to the Hump for the second year in a row.

MISSISSIPPI STATE USHERS IN 97TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

The Bulldogs enter their 97th season of basketball and currently own a 1,225-1,1031 ledger, a winning percentage of .543. MSU's history includes six SEC titles, six Western Division crowns and two tournament championships. The Bulldogs have also made nine NCAA Tournament and six NIT appearances, including eight under Rick Stansbury (5 NCAA, 3 NIT). In SEC action, Mississippi State is 516-668 for a winning percentage of .436.

HUMPHREY COLISEUM CELEBRATES 34TH BIRTHDAY

Since moving from McCarthey Gymnasium in 1975, the Bulldogs have enjoyed immense success at Humphrey Coliseum, commonly referred to as "The Hump." Mississippi State is 328-126 and was 12-3 a year ago. In all, nearly \$2.5 million fans have made their way through the turnstiles.

A LOOK BACK AT 2007-08

For the second year in a row, MSU won the Western Division crown, the only league school to win four titles in the last six seasons. State finished 23-11 overall, including a 12-4 mark in league play. And after advancing to the semifinals of the SEC Tournament in Atlanta, the Bulldogs garnered an 8th seed in the NCAA Tournament, beating Oregon in the first fround before losing to eventual runner-up Memphis in the second round behind the play of former standouts Charles Rhodes and Jamont Gordon. The season featured wins against Kentucky and Florida and three victories against Alabama.

BULLDOGS RATE FIRST AMONG WINNINGEST SEC WEST TEAMS SINCE 1998-99

Since 11th-year head coach Rick Stansbury took over Mississippi State's basketball coaching duties from Richard Williams in 1998, the Bulldogs rate as the winningest SEC Western Division team and the third-winningest hoops program overall in the league behind perennial SEC Eastern Division front-runners Florida and Kentucky. Over the last 10 seasons, MSU's composite record of 208-115 (.644) ranks behind only two-time defending NCAA champion Florida [258-83 (.757)] and Kentucky [246-92 (.728)].

In regular-season SEC play, the Bulldogs (87-73) are the winningest SEC West program and rank fourth overall in the league (also behind SEC East foes Kentucky, Florida & Tennessee) since 1998-99.

Additionally, Mississippi State ranks tied for fifth behind Kentucky (17-6), Florida (15-6), Arkansas (13-9) and South Carolina (11-10) in collective SEC Tournament wins dating back to the 1999 postseason. MSU (10-9) is one ahead of LSU (9-9) with 10 victories in SEC Tournament play since 1999, including a league tournament title in 2002 and a school-first second straight appearance in the SEC Tournament championship game the following year.

IN THE LAST TWO YEARS, MSU HAS WON 28 GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. In the last two years alone, the Bulldogs have posted a 28-6 mark for an .824 winning percentage. The Bulldogs have now reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's previous 10 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 122-28 (.813) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 60-20 (.750) SEC mark and a 62-8 (.886) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have now compiled a 32-season composite record of 328-126 (.722) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.
