BULLDOGS CLOSE OUT EXHIBITION PLAY AGAINST OKLAHOMA CITY

After opening exhibition play with a commanding 88-59 victory against Montevallo on Nov. 1, Mississippi State now turns its attention toward Oklahama City, the two-time NAIA champions. The Bulldogs and Stars met last year in the preseason, with MSU claiming a 100-69 victory.

MSU ENJOYS EXHIBITION SUCCESS UNDER RICK STANSBURY

In his 11 seasons as MSU's head basketball coach, Rick Stansbury has guided the Bulldogs to an 18-2 ledger in exhibition play. Last year, State was 2-0, defeating the University of the Cumberlands, 71-60, and Oklahoma City, 100-69. This past Saturday, MSU opened play with an 88-59 victory against Montevallo.

BULLDOGS PICK UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF

Last year in the SEC, MSU was first in scoring defense (65.5 points), blocked shots (7.85) and field goal percentage defense (.370) and third in 3-point field goal percentage defense. Against Montevallo last week, the Bulldogs didn't seem to lose their tenacity. After holding the Falcons to just 59 points, State also held them to just 32.4 percent (23-of-71) shooting from the floor, including a 13.3 percent mark beyond the arc (2-of-15). MSU also swatted away 13 shots, led by Jarvis Varnado's 8.

YOUNG PUPS GET FIRST-TIME APPEARANCES

By the time the final horn sounded against Montevallo in the first exhibition game, five MSU players took the floor for the first team wearing Maroon & White. Seeing their first action at MSU were Dee Bost, Jacquiese Holcombe, Romero Osby, Christopher Gay and Taylor Luczak. Bost started for the Bulldogs and totaled 13 points in 32 minutes. Osby totaled 10 points and 11 rebounds for a doubledouble, while Holcombe added two points and three boards. Freshman Twany Beckham didn't play at all due to injuries.

ATTACKING THE BOARDS

Rick Stansbury coached teams have always been known for their rebounding abilities. Last year in the SEC, no one was better than the Bulldogs, who averaged 40.7 boards an outing. That dominance continued against Montevallo, as MSU pulled down 62. Jarvis Varnado had 12, while Romero Osby grabbed 11. In contrast, the Falcons had just 37 rebounds.

BULLDOGS RATE FIRST AMONG WINNINGEST SEC WEST TEAMS SINCE 1998-99

Since 11th-year head coach Rick Stansbury took over Mississippi State's basketball coaching duties from Richard Williams in 1998, the Bulldogs rate as the winningest SEC Western Division team and the third-winningest hoops program overall in the league behind perennial SEC Eastern Division front-runners Florida and Kentucky. Over the last 10 seasons, MSU's composite record of 208-115 (.644) ranks behind only two-time defending NCAA champion Florida [258-83 (.757)] and Kentucky [246-92 (.728)].

In regular-season SEC play, the Bulldogs (87-73) are the winningest SEC West program and rank fourth overall in the league (also behind SEC East foes Kentucky, Florida & Tennessee) since 1998-99.

Additionally, Mississippi State ranks tied for fifth behind Kentucky (17-6), Florida (15-6), Arkansas (13-9) and South Carolina (11-10) in collective SEC Tournament wins dating back to the 1999 postseason. MSU (10-9) is one ahead of LSU (9-9) with 10 victories in SEC Tournament play since 1999, including a league tournament title in 2002 and a school-first second straight appearance in the SEC Tournament championship game the following year.

IN THE LAST TWO YEARS, MSU HAS WON 28 GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. In the last two years alone, the Bulldogs have posted a 28-6 mark for an .824 winning percentage. The Bulldogs have now reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's previous 10 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 122-28 (.813) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 60-20 (.750) SEC mark and a 62-8 (.886) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have now compiled a 32-season composite record of 328-126 (.722) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

In the 2008 Southeastern Conference media poll, Mississippi State, the two-time Western Division champions, was picked to finish fourth in the West behind Alabama, LSU and Ole Miss, respectively. From an individual standpoint, Bulldogs junior forward Jarvis Varnado was named first-team All-SEC by the league coaches, while the media voted him second-team back in October. Nationally, true freshman Dee Bost of Concord, N.C., was tabbed honorable mention freshman All-American by CollegeHoops.net.

LAST TIME OUT

MSU 88, MONTEVALLO 59 Nov. 1, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

In the season's first of two exhibition contests, Mississippi State rode a double-double performance from junior Jarvis Varnado to take care of visiting Montevallo 88-59 at Humphrey Coliseum.

Varnado, the reigning National Defensive Player of the Year, recorded 17 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the floor to go along with his game-high 12 rebounds. He also blocked eight shots after leading the nation in blocked shots a year ago with 157. Sophomore Ravern Johnson led all scorers on the night with an 8-of-14 performance from the field for a total of 19 points, while freshman Romero Osby pitched in the team's second double-double with 10 points and 11 boards. Dee Bost scored 13 points and handed out seven assists to just two turnovers in the win.

Junior guards Marcus Lancaster and Freddy Little led Montevallo in scoring with 10 points apiece on a collective 8-of-25 shooting performance, while junior forward Nate Flowers led the squad in rebounding with nine boards.

Ranking second nationally in team field-goal percentage defense last year, the Bulldogs followed suit by holding Montevallo to just 23-of-71 shooting from the floor for a 32.6% mark. Also specializing in blocks as a team by ranking second nationally in that category a year ago, MSU swatted 13 shots on the evening. Leading Montevallo in rebounding at halftime 32-21, State never let up and finished the game with a 62-37 advantage.

MSU 100, OKLAHOMA CITY 69 DEC. 1, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs closed out their preseason slate with an impressive 100-69 exhibition victory against reigning NAIA champion Oklahoma City at Humphrey Coliseum.

Following three early ties and a couple of lead changes over the first three minutes, MSU opened up an eight-point lead (17-9) by the 13:31 mark. The visiting Stars managed to cut the deficit to a single point on three occasions late in the opening half, but a 10-1 Bulldog run over the final 2:32 gave the home team a 45-34 halftime advantage.

The Bulldogs maintained the momentum after the break, going on a 9-2 run to open the second stanza. The MSU lead ballooned to 25 points (67-42) by the 13:52 mark, and the visitors never got any closer than 21 points the rest of the way. The Bulldogs eclipsed the century mark when walk-on Brandon Bolen scored on a jumper with nine seconds remaining.

Preseason All-America candidate Jamont Gordon paced a quartet of MSU double-digit scorers with 20 points and seven assists. Sophomores Jarvis Varnado (8-8 FGs) and Ben Hansbrough (6-9 FGs & 4-6 treys) added 16 points apiece on combined 14-of-17 field-goal shooting. Willie Irick led Oklahoma City with a game-high 21 points.

As a team, MState shot 52 percent from the field, including 11-of-25 from beyond the three-point arc, while blocking a dozen OCU shots and forcing 23 turnovers for the contest
