12 KEY THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING LINDSEY WILSON

- ✓ Mississippi State, under the direction of 13th-year coach **Rick Stansbury**, is coming off a 24-12 campaign that was highlighted by the school's seventh Western Division crown and seventh NIT appearance that ended with a loss to North Carolina in the second round.
- ✓ The 24 wins were the most since winning 26 in 2004.
- ✓ MSU returns three starters from a year ago.
- ✓ Due to NCAA suspensions, sophomore Renardo Sidney and junior Dee Bost won't be eligible until Dec. 18 and Jan. 8, respectively.
- ✓ In exhibition play, **Rick Stansbury** has guided the Bulldogs to a 21-2 ledger, including last year's 2-0 mark against Oklahoma City and Georgetown (Ky.).
- ✓ Senior guard **Ravarn Johnson** enters the 2010-11 campaign 32 points shy of becoming the 32nd player in MSU history to score 1,000 points for a career.
- ✓ The Bulldogs have received seven points in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches' polls.
- ✓ The last two years, MSU has won 13 home games.
- ✓ The Bulldogs return 51.5 percent (1,351/2,622) of their scoring and 39.1 percent (550/1,406) of their rebounding from a year ago.
- ✓ 19 of MSU's last 23 games last season were decided by 10 points or less (10-9 in those games).
- ✓ **Dee Bost** ranks 9th all-time at MSU with 344 assists, while his 188 last year ranks 8th-best in a single season. Chuck Evans (1993) holds the mark with 235.
- ✓ **Rick Stansbury** enters his 13th season at the helm with a school-record 255 victories, the 14th most in SEC history.

BLUEGRASS STATE TIES

◆ Mississippi State has two players from the state of Kentucky on its roster, G **Riley Benock** (Battletown) and G **Twany Beckham** (Louisville).

In addition, **Rick Stansbury** was born in Louisville and reared in Kentucky, while assistant coach **Phil Cunningham** was born in Paducah.

ALL-SEC HONORS

◆ In the preseason polls that were announced back in October, Mississippi State had two players receive All-SEC honors as voted on by the league coaches.

Junior point guard **Dee Bost** was tabbed first team, while senior **Ravarn Johnson** received second-team accolades. Neither made the media selections.

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including the 10-6 ledger in 2008-09 coupled with last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, Mississippi State has compiled a dominant 135-42 (.763) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 125-33 (.791) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 202-31 when leading at halftime; 175-33 when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 214-67 when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 200-73 when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 154-28 when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

BOMBS AWAY . . . DOGS ECLIPSE RECORD

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers. In the SEC Tournament against Vanderbilt, the Bulldogs passed that mark with the six made treys to give them 300. They finished the year 329, the third-highest output in SEC history.

The Bulldogs also attempted 22 3-pointers against the Commodores to give them 833 at the time, also a school record that broke the mark of 819 set in 2008-09. They exited UNC game with 918 attempts.

Ravern Johnson led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 from a year ago, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

MSU led the SEC with an average of 9.1 made 3-pointers, while **Johnson's** 40.7 percent accuracy beyond the arc was fourth. Arkansas' Rotnei Clarke was tops at 42.7 percent. **Johnson's** 87 made 3s tied for the third most in the SEC.

MSU'S STARTERS DOMINATE SCORING

In the Bulldogs' 36 games, the starters scored 2,152 of MSU's 2,622 points. That's a percentage of 82.1.

Against South Carolina, MSU's bench failed to score for the first time this year. Then at Auburn, the bench totaled just two points before hitting 11 against Tennessee.

GETTING TO 75 WAS KEY FOR THE BULLDOGS

Last year when MSU scored 75 points, it was quite successful.

The Bulldogs reached 75 points 15 times and posted a 13-2 record.

THE NEW FACE ON STAFF WAS AN OFF FACE

In his first 12 years at the helm, **Rick Stansbury** has had very little movement when it comes to his staff.

But even with that, when Robert Kirby left in the summer for Georgetown, **Stansbury** knew where to turn.

In August, he hired longtime Meridian Community College coach **George Brooks**, who played for the Bulldogs from 1992-94 and was a teammate with current MSU assistant **Marcus Grant**.

Brooks was also a student-assistant coach for the 1996 team that advanced to the Final Four.

1,000 POINT CLUB LIKELY TO SWELL AGAIN

Two years ago as a junior, Barry Stewart became the 30th player in school history to score 1,000 points for a year. Then last season, Jarvis Varnado achieved the feat.

This year, a new member is likely to be inducted, as **Ravern Johnson** is just 32 points shy of being the 32nd player to reach the milestone.

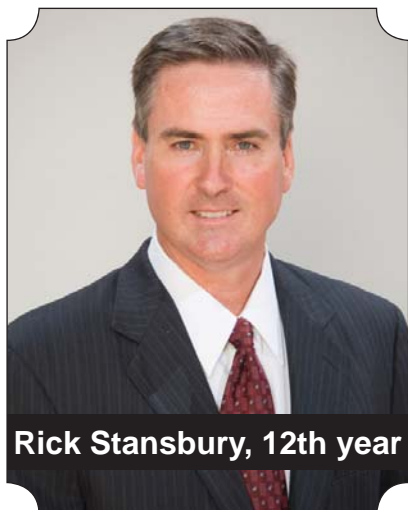

MEET THE HEAD COACH



Rick Stansbury, 12th year

Consistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 12-year coaching record of 255-140 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons and another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. Since the 2006-07 season, the Bulldogs have posted a 51-14 mark for an .785 winning percentage. With the 13-4 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's 12 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 148-37 (.800) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 71-25 (.740) SEC mark and a 77-12 (.865) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 354-135 (.724) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.
