WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS FORT VALLEY STATE. . .

- Mississippi State enters its 104th season of basketball having won 29 of its last 31 exhibition games.
- Mississippi State and Fort Valley State have never played in the regular season.
- In their lone exhibition game a year ago, the Bulldogs defeated Delta State in Starkville, 72-51. **Gavin Ware** and **Demetrius Houston** paced MSU with 19 and 12, respectively, while **Fred Thomas** collected 12 rebounds.
- The Bulldogs return six players from last year's squad, including leading scorer **Craig Sword** (11.3) and leading rebounder **Gavin Ware** (7.1).
- This year's eligible roster features eight players making their Maroon & White debuts.
- Craig Sword** enters his senior season ranked 31st in school history with 1,089 points.
- Also climbing the record books is **Gavin Ware**, whose 654 rebounds are tied for 16th most in school history with Lawrence Roberts.
- Last year, **Craig Sword** became the 34th player in school history to reach 1,000-career points. **Gavin Ware** and **Fred Thomas** are close to joining the club as they are 99 and 120 points shy, respectively.
- Gavin Ware** is also looking to become just the sixth MSU player to have 800-plus rebounds and 1,000-plus points.
- On March 23, 2015, Ben Howland has named the 20th head coach in school history.
- Due to turf toe on his left foot, freshman and McDonald's All-American **Malik Newman** will not play against Fort Valley State.

WARE ON PACE TO JOIN ELITE COMPANY

Currently, only four players in Mississippi State history have totaled 900 rebounds and 1,000 points.

However, senior forward Gavin Ware is on pace to join that group.

The four players who have achieved that feat are hall of famer Bailey Howell (2,030 pts, 1,277 rbs), Jarvis Varnado (1,403 pts, 1,096 rbs), Rickey Brown (1,838 pts, 1,092 rbs) and Wiley Peck (1,136 pts, 964 rbs).

COACHING DEBUTS

Since 1948, Mississippi State has had 10 head coaches. Of the group, only five have had winning seasons in their first year at the helm.

And of that group, only one had 20 wins, and that was Rick Stansbury in 1999 when the Bulldogs posted a 20-13 ledger en route to advancing to the NIT, where they lost to Colorado State in the opening round, 69-56

401-206 (0-0 at MSU)

- On March 23, 2015, Ben Howland was named the 20th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In three different stints as a head coach, Howland has a 401-206 record – Northern Arizona (79-59), Pittsburgh (89-40) and UCLA (233-107).
- Led UCLA to three-consecutive Final Fours.
- In 2006, the Bruins played Florida for the national championship.
- In 2008, Howland became one of three coaches in NCAA Division I history to win at least 30 games in three-straight seasons, joining Adolph Rupp (Kentucky 1947-49) and John Calipari (Memphis, 2006-08).
- During his 10-year tenure at UCLA, the Bruins went to the NCAA Tournament seven times and won four Pac-10 regular-season crowns, while having 18 players drafted by NBA teams.
- His 97 victories from 2006-08 stand as the most by any UCLA head coach in a three-year span.
- Has been a Conference Coach of the Year in the Pac-10, Big East and Big Sky.
- His final two years at Pitt, the Panthers went 57-11 and reached the Sweet 16 both years.
- In 2003, Pittsburgh won the Big East Tournament crown and held the nation's No. 2 ranking for eight weeks in the Associated Press poll before ending the year at No. 4.
- In 2002, Howland guided the Panthers to a school-record 29 wins en route to becoming the school's first coach in 26 years to garner National Coach of the Year honors.
- Howland's first coaching gig was at Northern Arizona, where his last three teams posted 20-plus win seasons.
- In 1997, the Lumberjacks had a school-record 21 victories, captured the Big Sky regular-season title and played in the NIT.
- In 1998, Howland guided NAU to its first NCAA Tournament after capturing the Big Sky Tournament championship and second-straight regular-season crown.
- Howland spent one year as a graduate assistant at Gonzaga (1981) before becoming an assistant at California-Santa Barbara from 1982-94.
- Played two years at Santa Barbara College before transferring to Weber State, where he earned his degree in physical education in 1979.
- Howland and his wife, Kim, a former Weber State cheerleader, have two children – Meredith and Adam (Brittney) – and one grandson, Benjamin Clark Howland II.
