## 11 THINGS TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS AKRON

- ✓ With the win against Eastern Kentucky, MSU improved to 78-22 in season openers, including a 11-3 mark under **Rick Stansbury**. With Stansbury at the helm, MSU is yielding just 62.2 points per season opener.
- ✓ **Rick Stansbury** currently ranks 11th in the SEC with 273 wins, five behind Ray Mears (Tennessee) and Roy Skinner (Vanderbilt) for the 9th most.
- ✓ Against the Colonels, **Rodney Hood** became the first true freshman to start on opening day since Dee Bost in 2008.
- ✓ **Rodney Hood's** 12 points were the most by an MSU starting freshman on opening day since Mario Austin's 16 points on Nov. 13, 2000, against California in a 83-76 loss.
- ✓ **Arnett Moultrie** became the first MSU player to record double-double in his Bulldog debut since Lawrence Roberts (26 points, 15 rebounds) in 2002-03 against UT-Martin. Against ECU, Moultrie had 13 points and 10 boards.
- ✓ **Dee Bost**, who was tabbed preseason first-team All-SEC by the media, is now just 59 assists shy of setting the school record of 514 held by Derrick Zimmerman (2000-03).
- ✓ **Dee Bost** scored 23 points against ECU to move into 26th place in the MSU record books with 1,143 points. He moved past Greg Carter (1,123) and Wiley Peck (1,136).
- ✓ Akron returns three starters from last year's 23-13 squad that advanced to the NCAA Tournament, where the Zips lost to Notre Dame in the opening round, 69-56.
- ✓ Akron punched its ticket to the Big Dance after winning the Mid-American Conference Tournament.
- ✓ Akron junior center Zeke Marshall is 15 blocks shy of breaking the school record of 165.
- ✓ Wednesday marks the season opener for the Zips, who are 66-44 all-time in lid-lifters and 4-3 under 8th-year coach Keith Dambrot.

## MSU JUST 3-6 AGAINST MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE

Mississippi State has posted an all-time record of 3-6 against teams that comprise the Mid-American Conference.

The Bulldogs have played five of the 12 members. Four of those teams they have played twice — Bowling Green, Miami (Ohio), Ball State and Eastern Michigan.

The last MAC team MSU faced was Miami in the 2007 Anaheim Classic, where it lost, 67-60.

## NOVEMBER DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 4-1 mark, coupled with this season's 1-0 ledger, the Bulldogs are 50-17 (.746) in the month of November since Rick Stansbury was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1986-87 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 76-20 (.792) in November.

## MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 8-6 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this year's 1-0 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 143-49 (.745) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 133-39 (.773) regular-season mark.

## MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 212-38 (1-0 this year) when leading at halftime; 154-37 (1-0) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 230-72 (1-0) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 212-80 (1-0) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 165-31 when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

## BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

In 2009-10, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In 31 games last year, the Bulldogs were nearly on the same pace, having drained 246 of their 680 attempts for an 7.9 average.

And it appears once again this season the Bulldogs are on pace for another great year behind the arc as they drained 8 treys against Eastern Kentucky.

## 1,000 POINT CLUB WELCOMED NEWEST MEMBERS

On Feb. 9 against Arkansas at Humphrey Coliseum, junior guard **Dee Bost** became the 33rd MSU player to score 1,000 points for a career. He reached the milestone with 3:34 left in the first half on a 3-pointer that tied the game at 25-apiece.

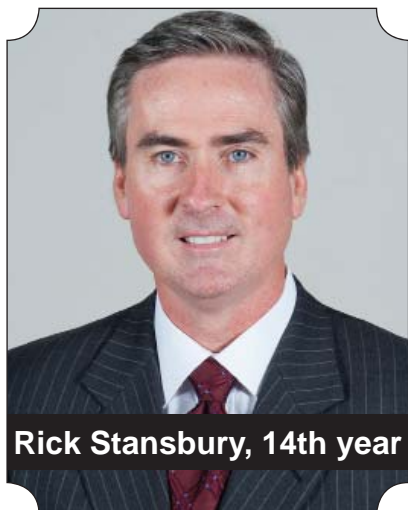
Arnett Moultrie came to MSU after transferring from UTEP after scoring 650 points. After scoring 13 points against ECU on Monday, he is on pace to eclipse 1,000 points for his career this season.

# MEET THE HEAD COACH



**Rick Stansbury, 14th year**

Consistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 14th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 13-year coaching record of 273-154 at the Bulldog helm, the 10th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2006-11), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons and another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 17-14 State squad to a second place finish in the Western Division, but missed out on a post-season berth for the first time in five seasons.

From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

**MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'**

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 12-5 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's 13 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 161-42 (.793) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 76-28 (.731) SEC mark and a 85-14 (.859) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 367-140 (.724) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.
