WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS AT TROY . . .

- ✓ Mississippi State enters its 101st season of basketball having won two-straight openers and eight out of the last 10.
- ✓ Overall, the Bulldogs are 78-22 in lid-lifters and have won 22 of their last 27 dating back to the 1985-86 campaign.
- as part of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic.
- ▼ The Bulldogs' last true opener on the road came on Nov. 13, 2001, when they lost at California in overtime, 83-76. Overall, MSU is 7-13 in true road game openers.
- average of 24.6 points.
- √ The Bulldogs return just five players from a year ago, while the roster features seven newcomers, including five freshmen.
- √ The Bulldogs have posted 20-plus wins in five of the last six seasons, including last year's campaign that saw MSU go 21-12.
- Friday marks the debut of Rick Ray as MSU's 19th head coach in program history.
- ✓ On Monday, an MRI revealed freshman **DeAndre Applewhite** will miss the year due to a torn ACL and meniscus.
- ✓ Guard Jalen Steele enters his junior season needing 560 points to become the 34th MSU player to reach 1,000 for a career. He also needs 35 more made 3-pointers to move into the Top 10 category in MSU history. He currently has 97, while Tang Hamilton (1998-2001) is 10th with 132

BULLDOGS ARE 68-14 AGAINST SUN BELT FOES

Mississippi State has experienced a wealth of great success against teams that currently comprise the Sun Belt Conference, as it holds a 68-14 advantage.

Friday's matchup against Troy is the first of two Sun Belt foes for MSU this season, as it also plays Florida Atlantic on Tuesday.

The team the Bulldogs have played the most from the league is Louisiana Lafayette, winning 11 of the 15 outings.

Last year, Mississippi State went 5-0 against the league.

NOVEMBER DOMINANCE LAST 25 YEARS

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 78-21 (.788) in December.

SCOUTING TROY

After trailing by five at the half, Troy came back to defeat Alaska-Anchorage 61-57 in exhibition play Monday night at Trojan Arena.

Troy's five second-half three pointers paced the attack. On defense, Don Maestri's squad forced Alaska-Anchorage to shoot 36.4 percent from the field in the second half, down from 44.8 percent in the first.

Hunter Williams led all scorers with 19 on the night. Emil Jones posted a double-double, scoring 12 and grabbing 10 rebounds while blocking two shots. Josh Warren grabbed 10 rebounds of his own, with nine coming offensively.

Troy shot 36.4 percent from the floor (24-66) and knocked down seven shots from beyond the arc. The Trojans also went 6-10 from the free throw line.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MSU . . .

Mississippi State overcame a eight-point deficit in the first half against William Carey to post an 80-74 exhibition win at Humphrey Coliseum.

The Bulldogs trailed 26-18 with 8:44 left in the opening half, but a 3-pointer by Jalen Steele with 2:20 left gave MSU a 35-55 lead, one it never relinquished.

State went into the half up 41-36 and built as much as a 10-point lead in the second frame.

Steele led the Bulldogs with 17 points, while Wendell Lewis, Fred Thomas and Colin Borchert each added 15. Lewis also had 7 rebounds and 2 blocked shots.

BULLDOGS TO OPEN TROY'S NEW ARENA

■ Friday's matchup between Mississippi State and Troy will mark the grand opening of Trojan Arena, Troy's new \$31 million basketball facility.

Historical matchups such as these are not uncommon for MSU.

While they weren't debuts, Mississippi State has been a part of two games that closed out arenas.

The first came in 1976, when the Bulldogs lost 94-93 in overtime to Kentucky in the final game at Memorial Coliseum in Lexington.

Then in 2002, MSU defeated South Carolina 64-47 in the final game at Carolina Coliseum.

MISSISSIPPI/ALABAMA CONNECTIONS

■ Mississippi State's roster currently features three players from the state of Alabama — Wendell Lewis (Selma), Roquez Johnson (Montgomery) and Craig Sword (Montgomery). Sword and Johnson prepped together at G.W. Caver High School.

In addition, assistant coach George Brooks is from Lafayette, while assistant coach Wes Flanigan played at Auburn.

MSU TO MAKE FIRST APPEARANCE IN MAUI INVITIONAL LATER THIS MONTH

■ Thanksgiving week, Mississippi State will be in Hawaii participating in the prestigious Maui Invitational for the first time in school history.

The Bulldogs open play against national powerhouse North Carolina on Nov. 19 and will then play either Marquette or Butler on Nov. 20. They will also play a game on Nov. 21 to conclude action.

MSU last played in Hawaii in 2010, when it went 1-2 in the Diamondhead Classic. The Dawgs lost to Washington State and Hawaii and beat San Diego.

BULLDOGS 2012-13 ROSTER FEATURES A LOT OF NEW FACES

■ When the Bulldogs open the regular season on the road at Troy on Nov. 9, the roster will feature seven new players.

Only five players return from last year's squad that posted 21 wins, a total that includes walk-ons Baxter Price and Tyson Cunningham. The other three returnees are Wendell Lewis, Roquez Johnson and Jalen Steele.

Of the seven newcomers this season, five are freshmen.

INCOMING FRESHMEN APPLEWHITE, DAVIS OUT FOR THE ENTIRE SEASON

■ Incoming freshman point guard Jacoby Davis and DeAndre Applewhite will miss the entire season after tearing their ACLs.

Applewhite's setback, which also includes a torn meniscus, happed this past Friday during practice, while Davis' injury occurred back in July

Davis was Rick Ray's first signee and he came to MSU after averaging 21 points and 5 assists at St. John's Military Academy in Wisconsin. Applewhite came to MSU following a stellar career at Central High School in Memphis.

FIRST YEAR COACHES BODE WELL IN DEBUTS

■ In the modern era, first-time Mississippi State men's basketball coaches have done quite well when making their debuts.

Since 1947 when Paul Gregory took over, eight of the nine first-year coaches won their initial game.

The only coach that failed to do so was Joe Dan Gold in 1965 when MSU dropped a 87-72 overtime decision to Northeast Louisiana in the lidlifter

NBA DRAFT TAKES ARNETT MOULTRIE

■ This past June, Arnett Moultrie became the second MSU player to be drafted in the NBA in the last three years.

Moultrie, an All-SEC standout who played at Mississippi State just one season after transferring from UTEP, was the 27th overall pick by the Miami Heat. However, moments after the selection, the Heat traded the Memphis native to Philadelphia.

Moultrie was the first MSU player taken in the first round since 1996, when Erick Dampier (Indiana, 10th) and Dontae' Jones (New York, 21st) were both drafted.

A WIN AGAINST TROY WOULD . . .

- Give Rick Ray his first victory as a head coach.
- Give the Bulldogs their third-straight win on opening day.
- Be the Bulldogs' first opening day win on the road since in 1966-67, when they won at Northeastern Louisiana, 81-70.
- Snap Mississippi State's two-game losing streak, dating back to last year.
- ▼ Keep the Bulldogs perfect all-time against Troy at 10-0.

MSU COACH RICK RAY

Head Coach Rick Ray

- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament — Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.



- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- While at Purdue, Ray was an assistant with second-year Tennessee coach Cuonzo Martin.
- The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament
- In 2000, the ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger.
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006).
- Ray's first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have a son, Deacon and a daughter, Katriece.

Mississippi State ushered in the Rick Ray era with an 80-74 exhibition win against William Carey Sunday at the Humphrey Coliseum.

The Bulldogs never trailed in the game's final half but were not assured of victory against the NAIA Crusaders until Wendell Lewis sank six free throws in the final 2:05 of regulation time.

MSU placed four players in double figures. Jalen Steele led the way with 17 points, followed by 15 points apiece from Lewis, Fred Thomas and Colin Borchert. MSU played a total of nine players, with each logging a minimum of 11 minutes apiece.

Fresh off a season-opening victory over Blue Mountain College, the Crusaders scored the game's first six points. MSU battled back for a 7-6 lead on a jumper by Colin Borchert. Things stayed nip-and-tuck with Carey eventually sprinting out to an 18-11 advantage.

The Bulldogs would trail by as many as eight before a 14-6 run by MSU tied the game at 32. Fred Thomas scored back-to-back baskets, including a 3-pointer to knot the contest.

MSU shot 43.3 percent from the floor in the first half and eased out to a 41-36 advantage at halftime.

Ray continued to look at different rotations in the game's final half. The Maroon and White scored the second half's first five points to grab a 46-36 lead with 18:11 remaining.

Carey remained patient on offense and eventually fought its way back into the contest. The Crusaders closed within three at 54-51 and later forced a tie at 63. Steele quickly answered with a 3-point basket and the Bulldogs were not headed after that.
