WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS ALABAMA STATE . . .

- On Friday, junior guard Quinndary Weatherspoon was named first-team All-SEC by the league coaches after being tabbed second team by the media in mid-October.
- MSU enters its 106th season of basketball having won 12 of its last 15 season openers.
- Overall, the Bulldogs are 82-23 in lid-lifters and have won 25 of their last 32 dating back to the 1985-86 campaign.
- MSU is opening at home for the 11th time in the last 12 years. The last time it opened on the road was 2012-13 at Troy, a 56-53 setback to open the Trojans' new arena.
- The Bulldogs' schedule features four first-time opponents Green Bay, Stephen F. Austin, North Dakota State and North Florida.
- Mississippi State is 26-4 all-time versus the 10 current teams that comprise the SWAC. MSU has played Alcorn State, Jackson State and Mississippi Valley State the most at five games each. The lone team the Bulldogs haven't faced is Grambling.
- The last SWAC team MSU faced was Texas Southern, an 86-73 win on Dec. 2, 2015.
- Quinndary Weatherspoon is 151 points shy of becoming the 37th player in school history to reach 1,000 for a career.
- Junior forward Aric Holman is 9 blocked shots away from tying Marcus Campbell for the 10th most in school history with 87.
- MSU is one of five DI teams without any scholarship seniors, along with Chattanooga, Holy Cross, Kentucky and Robert Morris.
- The Bulldogs' roster features six players looking to make their collegiate debut Abdul Ado, KeyShawn Feazell, and Nick Weatherspoon, along with walk-ons Tate Clayton, T.J. Gray
- The Weatherspoon duo marks the first time MSU has two brothers playing together since Reginald and Richard Delk in 2007. MSU is one of 29 schools with brothers on the roster.
- MSU returns 77 percent of its scoring from a year ago and 77.6 percent of its rebounding.

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. Last year, MSU was 10-7, including a 6-2 mark against non-conference foes.

■ Junior guard **Quinndary Weatherspoon** has been recognized by the SEC in each of his three years with the Bulldogs.

In 2016, he was named to the SEC All-Freshman Team. In 2017, he was named preseason All-SEC and finished the year on the second-team All-SEC team.

Then back in October, he was named second-team All-SEC again.

THE COMEBACK

■ In the SEC opener at home against Alabama, the Bulldogs were out-rebounded 43-27, their largest deficit of the year.

However, when the two met for a second time on Jan. 28, MSU won the battle of the boards, 40-37.

MSU achieved the feat again against Tennessee. The Vols were +14 in the first meeting, while MSU was +10 on Feb. 4.

SEEING DOUBLE

■ Last year, Aric Holman and Schnider Herard recorded four of MSU's five double-doubles.

Holman's first came in the season opener against Norfolk State, where he had 11 points and 11 rebounds. Then at Arkansas, he totaled 13 points and 11 rebounds.

Both of Herard's came against Tennessee with 14 points and 11 rebounds in Knoxville and then 12 points and 15 rebounds on Feb. 4.

In that same game, **Xavian Sta- pleton** had his first with 14 points and 11 rebounds, both career highs

MSU SIGNS 1 SO FAR

■ Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period earlier this week and signed 5-star forward standout Reggie Perry.

The6-foot-8, 240-pound Thomasville, Ga., native is the son of former MSU great Al Perry (1975-78), who ranks third all-time at MSU with 510 steals.

He's rated as the No. 1 prospect out of the state of Georgia and listed as the No. 4 small forward in the country.

ESPN has him as the 16th best player regardless of position.

The Bulldogs are expected to sign more in the coming days.

HOWLAND AIMS FOR FEAT

■ Ben Howland enters his third season at Mississippi State looking to achieve a feat only 12 coaches have ever done, and that's lead four different teams to the NCAA Tournament

Howland has already guided Northern Arizona, Pittsburgh and UCLA to the Big Dance.

The first 12 coaches to do so are Lon Kruger, Steve Alford, John Beilein, Lefty Driesell, Cliff Ellis, Larry Eustachy, Jim Harrick, Fran McCaffery, Tom Penders, Tubby Smith, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.

■ When junior guard **Quinndary Weatherspoon** scores 20 or more points, Mississippi State benefits.

Ben Howland 22nd Season Overall | 3rd Season At Mississippi State 431-239 (30-33 at MSU)

- On March 23, 2015. Ben Howland was named the 20th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In four different stints as a head coach, Howland has a 429-236 record -Northern Arizona (79-59), Pittsburgh (89-40), UCLA (233-107) and Mississippi State (30-30).
- · Led UCLA to three-consecutive Final Fours.
- In 2006, the Bruins played Florida for the national championship.
- In 2008, Howland became one of three coaches in NCAA Division I his-

tory to win at least 30 games in three-straight seasons, joining Adolph Rupp (Kentucky 1947-49) and John Calipari (Memphis, 2006-08).


- During his 10-year tenure at UCLA, the Bruins went to the NCAA Tournament seven times and won four Pac-10 regular-season crowns, while having 18 players drafted by NBA teams.
- His 97 victories from 2006-08 stand as the most by any UCLA head coach in a three-year span.
- Has been a Conference Coach of the Year in the Pac-10, Big East and Big Sky.
- His final two years at Pitt, the Panthers went 57-11 and reached the Sweet 16 both years.
- In 2003, Pittsburgh won the Big East Tournament crown and held the nation's No. 2 ranking for eight weeks in the Associated Press poll before ending the year at No. 4.
- In 2002, Howland guided the Panthers to a school-record 29 wins en route to becoming the school's first coach in 26 years to garner National Coach of the Year honors.
- Howland's first coaching gig was at Northern Arizona, where his last three teams posted 20-plus win seasons, including a school-record 21 victories in 1997 en route to capturing the Big Sky regularseason title and played in the NIT.
- In 1998, Howland guided NAU to its first NCAA Tournament after capturing the Big Sky Tournament championship and second-straight regular-season crown.
- Howland spent one year as a graduate assistant at Gonzaga (1981) before becoming an assistant at California-Santa Barbara from 1982-94.
- Played two years at Santa Barbara College before transferring to Weber State, where he earned his degree in physical education in 1979.
