11 KEY THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING TENNESSEE STATE

- ✓ In his first 12 seasons at the helm, Rick Stansbury has led Mississippi State to a 9-3 ledger in season openers, including a 7-2 mark at Humphrey Coliseum.
- ✓ Last season, the Bulldogs had their six-game winning streak in lid-lifters snapped with an 88-74 setback to Rider.
- ✓ All-time, MSU is 76-22 in season openers and has won 20 of its last 25 dating back to the 1985-86 campaign.
- ✓ Mississippi State, under the direction of 13th-year coach Rick Stansbury, is coming off a 24-12 campaign that was highlighted by the school's seventh Western Division crown and seventh NIT appearance that ended with a loss to North Carolina in the second round.
- ▼ The 24 wins were the most since winning 26 in 2004.
- → Senior guard Ravern Johnson enters the 2010-11 campaign 32 points shy of becoming the 32nd player in MSU history to score 1,000 points for a career.

- Dee Bost ranks 9th all-time at MSU with 344 assists, while his 188 last year ranks 8th-best in a single season. Chuck Evans (1993) holds the mark with 235.

Entering Friday's season opener against Tennessee State, the Bulldogs are 26-4 against the nine teams that currently comprise the Ohio Valley Conference.

MSU has played seven of the nine league members and has faced Murray State the most, posting a 7-2 ledger.

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including the 10-6 ledger in 2008-09 coupled with last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, Mississippi State has compiled a 135-42 (.763) record against non-conference opponents during the Rick Stansbury era (since 1998-99), including a 125-33 (.791) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the Rick Stansbury era, the Bulldogs are: 202-31 when leading at halftime; 175-33 when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 214-67 when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 200-73 when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 154-28 when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

BOMBS AWAY...DOGS ECLIPSE RECORD

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers. In the SEC Tournament against Vanderbilt, the Bulldogs passed that mark with the six made treys to give them 300. They finished the year with 329, the third-highest output in SEC history.

The Bulldogs also attempted 22 3-pointers against the Commodores to give them 833 at the time, also a school record that broke the mark of 819 set in 2008-09. They exited the UNC game with 918 attempts.

Ravern Johnson led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 from a year ago, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

THE NEW FACE ON STAFF WAS AN OFF FACE

In August, Rick Stansbury hired longtime Meridian Community College coach George Brooks to replace Robert Kirby. No stranger to MSU, Brooks played for the Bulldogs from 1992-94 and was a teammate with current MSU assistant Marcus Grant.

Brooks was also a student-assistant coach for the 1996 team that advanced to the Final Four.

1,000 POINT CLUB LIKELY TO SWELL AGAIN

Two years ago as a junior, Barry Stewart became the 30th player in school history to score 1,000 points for a year. Then last season, Jarvis Varnado achieved the feat.

This year, a new member is likely to be inducted, as **Ravern Johnson** is just 32 points shy of being the 32nd player to reach the milestone.



MEET THE HEAD COACH



onsistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 12-year coaching record of 255-140 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons an another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. Since the 2006-07 season, the Bulldogs have posted a 51-14 mark for an .785 winning percentage. With the 13-4 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's 12 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 148-37 (.800) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 71-25 (.740) SEC mark and a 77-12 (.865) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 354-135 (.724) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.
