### BULLDOGS OPEN REGULAR SEASON AGAINST CENTENARY

After posting a 2-0 ledger in exhibition play, Mississippi State now turns its attention toward the regular season, where on Saturday the Bulldogs open their 97th year of basketball against Centenary. For MSU, the game will mark the 11th season on the sidelines for coach Rick Stansbury. For the Gents, it will be the debut of first-year coach Greg Gary.

# MSU ENJOYS SEASON-OPENING SUCCESS UNDER RICK STANSBURY

In his first 10 years as MSU's head basketball coach, Rick Stansbury has guided the Bulldogs to an 8-2 mark in season openers, including last year's 75-45 victory against Louisiana Tech. In lid-lifters at Humphrey Coliseum, Stansbury sports a 6-1 ledger, while on the road he's 2-1. All-time, MSU is 75-21. And dating back to the 1986-87 campaign, State has won 19 of its last 22 openers.

#### LOOKING FOR NEW SCORING

With just two starters returning from last year's 23-11 squad that captured its second-straight Western Division crown, the Bulldogs need new scorers to step up. With the departure of Jamont Gordon, Charles Rhodes and Ben Hansbrough, MSU lost 57.7 percent of its scoring from 2007-08 (1,436 of the 2.489 total points). The two starters that return are Barry Stewart and Jarvis Varnado, who accounted for 26.5 percent of the scoring (660 points).

#### **NEW ROSTER FEATURES YOUNG PUPS**

Six new players currently comprise MSU's preseason roster, and of that total, five logged minutes in the two exhibition games - Jacquiese Holcombe, Dee Bost, Romero Osby, Christopher Gay, and Taylor Luczak. The only newcomer that didn't see action was Twany Beckham, who was nursing a leg injury. The roster also features 10 returning lettermen. Of that total, only three started - Barry Stewart (34), Jarvis Varnado (34) and Phil Turner (11).

#### A LOOK BACK AT 2007-08

Mississippi State captured the Western Division crown in 2008 for the second year in a row and the fourth time in the last six years. The Bulldogs posted an overall 23-11 ledger, including a 12-4 mark in SEC play, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, where they lost to eventual runner-up Memphis in a nailbiter, 77-74. Also last year, Rick Stansbury became the school's all-time winningest coach, passing Richard Williams.

#### **BULLDOGS RATE FIRST AMONG WINNINGEST SEC WEST TEAMS SINCE 1998-99**

Since 11th-year head coach Rick Stansbury took over Mississippi State's basketball coaching duties from Richard Williams in 1998, the Bulldogs rate as the winningest SEC Western Division team and the third-winningest hoops program overall in the league behind perennial SEC Eastern Division front-runners Florida and Kentucky. Over the last 10 seasons, MSU's composite record of 208-115 (.644) ranks behind only Florida [258-83 (.757)] and Kentucky [246-92 (.728)].

In regular-season SEC play, the Bulldogs (87-73) are the winningest SEC West program and rank fourth overall in the league (also behind SEC East foes Kentucky, Florida & Tennessee) since 1998-99.

Additionally, Mississippi State ranks tied for fifth behind Kentucky (17-6), Florida (15-6), Arkansas (13-9) and South Carolina (11-10) in collective SEC Tournament wins dating back to the 1999 postseason. MSU (10-9) is one ahead of LSU (9-9) with 10 victories in SEC Tournament play since 1999, including a league tournament title in 2002 and a school-first second straight appearance in the SEC Tournament championship game the following year.

## IN THE LAST TWO YEARS, MSU HAS WON 28 GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. In the last two years alone, the Bulldogs have posted a 28-6 mark for an .824 winning percentage. The Bulldogs have now reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's previous 10 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 122-28 (.813) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 60-20 (.750) SEC mark and a 62-8 (.886) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have now compiled a 32-season composite record of 328-126 (.722) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

In the 2008 Southeastern Conference media poll, Mississippi State, the two-time defending Western Division champions, was picked to finish fourth in the West behind Alabama, LSU and Ole Miss, respectively. From an individual standpoint, Bulldogs junior forward Jarvis Varnado was named first-team All-SEC by the league coaches, while the media voted him second-team back in October. Nationally, true freshman Dee Bost of Concord, N.C., was tabbed honorable mention freshman All-American by CollegeHoops.net.

# **EXHIBITION 1**

# MSU 88, Montevallo 59 Nov. 1, 2008 • Starkville, MS

In the season's first of two exhibition contests, Mississippi State rode a double-double performance from junior Jarvis Varnado to take care of visiting Montevallo 88-59 at Humphrey Coliseum.

Varnado, the reigning National Defensive Player of the Year, recorded 17 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the floor to go along with his game-high 12 rebounds. He also blocked eight shots after leading the nation in blocked shots a year ago with 157. Sophomore Ravern Johnson led all scorers on the night with an 8-of-14 performance from the field for a total of 19 points, while freshman Romero Osby pitched in the team's second double-double with 10 points and 11 boards. Dee Bost scored 13 points and handed out seven assists to just two turnovers in the win.

Junior guards Marcus Lancaster and Freddy Little led Montevallo in scoring with 10 points apiece on a collective 8-of-25 shooting performance, while junior forward Nate Flowers led the squad in rebounding with nine boards.

Ranking second nationally in team field-goal percentage defense last year, the Bulldogs followed suit by holding Montevallo to just 23-of-71 shooting from the floor for a 32.6% mark. Also specializing in blocks as a team by ranking second nationally in that category a year ago, MSU swatted 13 shots on the evening. Leading Montevallo in rebounding at halftime 32-21, State never let up and finished the game with a 62-37 advantage.

# MSU 67, OKLAHOMA CITY 65 Nov. 8, 2008 • STARKVILLE, MS

Mississippi State utilized an 18-5 rally in the final minutes to overcome two-time defending NAIA national champion Oklahoma City 67-65 at Humphrey Coliseum in the season's final exhibition outing.

Junior Jarvis Varnado once again flirted with triple-double status in the contest by scoring 12 points, claiming a game-high 13 rebounds, and swatting eight shots after leading the nation in blocks a year ago. Varnado amassed 29 points, 25 rebounds and 16 blocks in State's two exhibition contests.

Senior Brian Johnson fell just a rebound shy of a double-double performance for the Bulldogs with 10 points on 5-of-7 shooting, while standout freshman Dee Bost tallied 11 points and six assists. Junior Barry Stewart and sophomore Ravern Johnson rounded out State scorers in double digits with 11 and 10 points, respectively.

Forward Jamarcus Ellis led the Stars with a game-high 26 points on 10-of-24 shooting along with five rebounds. Senior Sao Paulo, Brazil native Ricardo De Bem pitched in 11 points and seven rebounds while junior Davell Jackson also contributed 11 points.

The Bulldogs never led until the 1:41 mark of the second half when Ravern Johnson drained a 3-pointer for a 65-63 advantage. However, the Stars answered and evened the score on an Ellis jumper, but with 1:23 left, Varnado gave MSU the lead for good on a dunk.

#### MSTATE OWNS 6-0 RECORD AGAINST SUMMIT LEAGUE

Of the 10 teams that currently comprise the Summit League, the Bulldogs own a perfect record of 6-0. In addition to having a 5-0 mark against Centenary, Mississippi State is 1-0 versus Oral Roberts.

MSU faced the Golden Eagles on Dec. 28, 1978, in Louisville, Ky., for the Louisville Holiday Classic and posted a convincing 91-69 victory.

#### MSU AIMS FOR CONTINUED NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 11-7 ledger against non-conference foes, Mississippi State enters the 2008-09 campaign having compiled a dominant 112-34 (.767) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 102-25 (.803) regular-season mark versus non-league foes.

#### NOVEMBER AND HOME DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 3-3 November record, the Bulldogs are 36-12 (.750) in the month of November since **Rick Stansbury** was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1986-87 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 59-15 (.797) in November.

And entering today's season opener against Centenary, MSU has put together a 122-28 (.813) mark at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's guidance, including a 60-20 (.750) SEC record and 62-8 (.886) ledger at home against non-conference foes.

The Bulldogs currently own a four-game winning streak at the Hump and eight out of the last nine. MSU's last setback on its home floor came on Feb. 2 against Tennessee, 76-71. The Volunteers entered the game ranked No. 7 nationally and sporting an 18-2 record.

#### MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era of Mississippi State hoops, the Bulldogs are: 165-25 when leading at halftime (19-2 last year); 145-30 when shooting 45 percent or better from the field (15-2); 170-53 when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field (21-8); 173-66 when out-rebounding (or tying) the opponent (20-6); and 128-23 when holding the opponent to 65 points or less (13-3).

#### FRESHMAN ROMERO OSBY HAS NUMBER RETIRED

During his prep days at Northeast Lauderdale in Meridian, Miss., freshman forward **Romero Osby** played a major role in the Trojans' success. In early November, the school honored his accomplishments by retiring his No. 24 jersey.

It's only fitting considering he departed there with five major statistical records - points, rebounds, assists, blocks and steals.

He was also named first-team All-Division four times and first-team All-State on two occasions. He was also on the Mississippi Association of Coaches' North All-Star team in addition to representing his state in the Mississippi/Alabama All-Star game.

At Mississippi State, he wears the No. 5 jersey.

#### NOW THAT HAS A FAMILIAR RING

Last year, the Bulldogs led the Southeastern Conference in scoring defense (65.5), field goal percentage defense (.370), rebounding offense (40.7) and blocked shots (7.85).

Compared to their two exhibition games, those same numbers were quite similiar. In the two wins against Montevallo and Oklahoma City, MSU yielded just 62 points, limited the opposing offense to just 37.3 percent shooting, averaged 57.5 rebounds and blocked a total of 24 shots. Jarvis Varnado, who led the nation a year ago with a school-record 157 blocks, totaled 16.

# MISSISSIPPI-LOUISIANA CONNECTIONS

MSU currently has two players on its roster from Louisiana - Elgin Bailey and Kodi Augustus. Centenary, however, doesn't have anyone on its roster from the Magnolia State, although guard Nick Stallings played at Southwest Mississippi Community College in Summit.


