#### **LOOKING TO AVOID 0-2 START**

Mississippi State returns to action on Thursday against Southeastern Louisiana looking to avoid its first 0-2 start since the 1967-68 campaign. Prior to Friday's setback to the Broncs, the Bulldogs had won six-consecutive openers.

MSU is also looking to avoid back-to-back losses at Humphrey Coliseum for the first time since losing to Florida (Jan. 24) and South Carolina (Jan. 27) in 2006-07.

#### INCHING CLOSER TO THE RECORD BOOKS

Senior All-SEC forward **Jarvis Varnado** continued his climb toward to the top of two key records against Rider with seven blocked shots.

As a result, he now has 401 for his career, which leaves him 11 shy of Shaquille O'Neal's SEC mark of 412 and 134 shy of the NCAA record of 535 set by Wojciech Mydra of Louisiana-Monroe (1998-2002). To reach the NCAA mark, Varnado needs to average 4.3 blocks the next 31 games (30 regular season games and at least one SEC Tournament outing).

#### MISSISSIPPI-LOUISIANA CONNECTIONS

Southeastern Louisiana has five players on its roster with Mississippi connections, including two from the Magnolia State. **Gary Dixon** of Pontotoc played at Itawamba Community College, while **Brandon Fortenberry** hails from Picayune. **Jason Marks** of Little Rock also played at Itawamba, while **Trent Hutchin** of Baton Rouge spent two years at Copiah-Lincoln. Then there is **Rodney Jones**, who transferred from Ole Miss.

Mississippi State has two players on its roster from Louisiana — junior fowards **Elgin Bailey** (New Orleans) and **Kodi Augustus** (Baton Rouge).

#### **BULLDOGS IN THE POLLS**

Following the loss to Rider, Mississippi State fell out of both polls. However, in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' poll, the Bulldogs received 16 votes, the same number of votes they received in the Associated Press poll.

#### **MSU BY THE NUMBER**

**6** — Since the 1967-68 campaign, Mississippi State has lost just six season-openers. However, the 14-point setback to Rider last Friday night was the most since losing by 30 (97-67) to Wichita State to open the 1967-68 campaign.

#### **MSTATE 2-0 AGAINST MAAC FOES**

Entering Thursday's showdown against Southeastern Louisiana, the Bulldogs are a dominant 36-3 against against the 12 teams that currently comprise the Southland Conference.

Of the 12 teams, MSU has not played Lamar, Stephen F. Austin, Texas State, UT-Arlington and UT-San Antonio, while the 17 previous meetings against the Lions are most of any team.

In the 16 wins against SELU, the Bulldogs' average margin of victory has been 25.5 points.

#### MSU ENJOYED MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 10-6 ledger against non-conference foes, MSU has compiled a dominant 121-40 (.752) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 113-31 (.785) regular-season mark versus non-league foes.

#### MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 182-27 when leading at halftime; 162-32 when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 190-61 when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 184-68 when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 140-25 when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

#### **NOVEMBER DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY**

Including last year's 5-2 mark, the Bulldogs are 41-15 (.732) in the month of November since **Rick Stansbury** was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1986-87 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a compisite ledger of 64-18 (.780) in November.

#### HITTING HALF OF SHOTS IS GOOD

To say Rider was on fire from the floor last Friday night would be an understatement. The Broncs hit 50.8 percent (30 of 59) of their shots overall and was a sizzling 62.5 percent (10 of 16) from 3-point range.

As a result, Rider became the first team to shoot 50 percent or better from the floor against the Bulldogs since Florida State connected on 52 percent (26 of 50) of its shots on 3-20-07 in the third round of the NIT in Starkville.

As for the 62.5 percent beyond the arc, the previous high an MSU team allowed came on 12-5-07 at South Alabama when the Jaguars had a 58.8 percent (10 of 17) accuracy in a 71-67 victory.

#### MOVING ON UP THE SCORING CHARTS

With 22 points against Rider, **Jarvis Varnado** is now 71 points shy of becoming the 31st MSU player to score 1,000 or more for a career as he now has 729.

Also moving up the record book is senior guard **Barry Stewart**. With his seven points against the Broncs, he now has 1,185 for his career, 14 behind Mario Austin, the 20th most in school history.

#### MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. Since the 2006-07 season, the Bulldogs have posted a 39-12 mark for an .765 winning percentage. With a 13-5 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's first 11 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 135-34 (.799) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 65-23 (.739) SEC mark and a 70-11 (.864) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 341-132 (.722) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

#### THE SENIORS

#### 22 • Barry Stewart • G • 6-3 • 170 • Shelbyville, TN

Barry Stewart became the 30th member of MSU's 1,000-point club last season and is only 54 treys away from becoming the school's all-time 3-point leader. He led MSU in scoring during the SEC tournament title run last year (14.3) en route to earning All-Tournament honors. He was MSU's second-leading scorer a year ago with 12.4 points a game and was second on the team with 66 assists and tied for second with 46 steals.

#### 32 • Jarvis Varnado • F/C • 6-9 • 210 • Brownsville, TN

After leading the nation in blocked shots last year with 170, Jarvis Varnado is only 134 away from tying the NCCA career record mark and 11 shy of the tying the SEC mark. Last year, he was named SEC Tournament MVP, played for Team USA in the World University Games, and won SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors for the second-straight year. Varnado was also awarded the Bailey Howell award, which is given to the state's best player. He also led the team in scoring (12.9) and rebounds (8.8).

#### THE JUNIORS

#### 24 • Kodi Augustus • F • 6-8 • 220 • Baton Rouge, LA

Kodi Augustus is coming off an impressive SEC Tournament run that saw him score a career-high 19 points against Georgia in the opening round, while he finished averaging 9.8 points a game in tournament play. Against Washington in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, Kodi was named Chevrolet Player of the Game. Augustus finished the year averaging 6.2 points and 3.4.

#### 45 • Elgin Bailey • F/C • 6-8 • 254 • New Orleans, LA

Bailey saw action in 27 games last year before dislocating his ankle against Florida. He still managed to finish second on the team in blocked shots with 26. Bailey finished the year averaging 3.9 points and 2.4 rebounds.

#### 15 • Riley Benock • G • 6-4 • 180 • Battletown, KY

Hailing from the same high school as Mississippi State head coach Rick Stansbury, Riley saw action in all 36 games as a reserve. He averaged 2.3 points and 0.9 rebounds per outing. His 16 steals tied for fifth-most on the team. He is returning from foot surgery to repair a stress fracture over the offseason.

#### 2 • Ravern Johnson • G/F • 6-7 • 175 • Lyon, MS

Johnson's 83 treys last year were the third-most in a single season as he led the Bulldogs in 3-pointers made (83) attempted (210) and percentage (.395). He started all 36 games and scored 20-plus points a team-high five times and hit a career best six 3-pointers against Western Kentucky last year. Johnson finished third on the team in scoring with 12.1 points a game.

#### 25 • Phil Turner • G • 6-3 • 170 • Grenada, MS

Started the last 27 games of last season and was third on the team at the foul line with a 78.1 percent effort (57 of 73). Turner scored a career-high 18 points at Rupp Arena against the Wildcats last year. He averaged 8.5 points and hauled in 5.5 rebounds.

#### THE SOPHOMORES

#### 4 • Twany Beckham • G • 6-5 • 190 • Louisville, KY

Beckham played in the last 32 games of last season and was one of MSU'S first players off the bench. He logged a total of 33 minutes in the SEC Tournament and averaged 1.5 points, 2.0 rebounds and dished out three assists. He finished the year averaging 1.6 points and 1.5 boards a game.

#### 3 • Dee Bost • G • 6-2 • 170 • Concord, NC

Bost was named to the All-SEC Freshman team and tabbed Honorable Mention Freshman All-American by CollegeHoops.net after starting all 36 games last season. Bost led the team with 156 assists, the most by any MSU freshman in school history. He also set freshman records with free throws made (122) and free throws attempted (170), while his 52 steals and 161 treys attempted were second all-time. Dee finished fourth on the team in scoring by averaging 10.9 points a game.

#### 5 • Romero Osby • F • 6-8 • 230 • Meridian, MS

Osby played in all 36 games for the Bulldogs as a true freshman last year. He scored a career-high 15 points against North Alabama. He also averaged 4.1 points and 2.6 boards per contest, while scoring in double-digits three times. Osby also finished fourth on the team with 12 blocks.

While earning team MVP honors his senior year, he led the team in points (16.5), rebounds (11.2) and blocks (3).

The final member of the MSU recruiting class, Riek inked his commitment to the Bulldogs in May of 2009. With enhanced shot-blocking and rebounding skills, he made a name for himself at the LeBron Skill Academy where he scored 18 points in 24 minutes. His 7 foot, 8 ½ inch wingspan made him the top-rated center by Rivals.com in the class of 2008.

#### 10 • Shaun Smith • G • 6-6 • 195 • Brooksville, MS

The first member of the 2009 MSU signing class, the heralded All-State member from Noxubee County is known for his athleticism and ball-handling skills. Ranked the 23rd best shooting guard in the country by Scout.com, Smith inked his next four years with Bulldog basketball on his birthday. As a senior, he averaged 25.1 points, 5.8 rebounds and 2.2 steals.

#### 1 • Renardo Sidney • G • 6-10 • 260 • Jackson, MS

One of MSU's most highly touted recruits, Sidney brings numerous accolades including McDonald's All American selection, USA Junior National Select Team inclusion as well as Naismith High School Player of the Year finalist. He was also tabbed Co-MVP at the Jordan Brand Classic at the famous Madison Square Garden in New York City. Sidney made his national impression at the McDonald's All-Star game where he scored 11 points while grabbing 6 rebounds.

Seeing action in 22 career games, Bolen also saw action in the NCAA Tournament his sophomore year against Washington. He had a rebound against LSU and made his SEC debut his freshman year at LSU.

#### BRYANT BECOMES FIRST MSU SIGNEE OF 2009-10 SIGNING CLASS

Mississippi State men's basketball coach Rick Stansbury has announced his first signee of the 2009-10 class, standout guard Brian Bryant.

The 6-foot-3, 165-pound Albany, Ga., native is currently a sophomore at Northwest Florida State College, where he has guided his team to a 5-0 start and is averaging 20 points, 7.6 rebounds and 5.4 assists, while shooting 41 percent from 3-point territory.

Last year as a freshman, he was limited due to a hand injury.

Prior to enrolling at Northwest Florida, previously known as Okaloosa Walton, Bryant prepped four years at Dougherty High School, where he led his team to two regional titles and four playoff appearances.

As a senior, he averaged 29.6 points, 9.3 rebounds, 3.6 steals and 3.6 assists en route to garnering team MVP honors and earning Albany

Herald Play of the Year honors for the second-straight season.

He was also selected to play in the Georgia North-South All-Star Game.

"He is the complete package of talent, athleticism, character and work ethic," 13th-year Raiders coach Bruce Stewart said. "He is a winner."

Bryant chose MSU over Auburn and Southern Miss.

Bryant is the fifth NWF State College men's player to head to the SEC in the last three seasons, following in the footsteps of Auburn's Tay Waller and Johnnie Lett, Alabama's Charvez Davis and South Carolina's Johndre Jefferson.

He's also the second player MSU signed from Northwest Florida, as he joins forward Branden Vincent, who played for the Bulldogs from 2003-04.
