WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS KENNESAW STATE . . .

- in the season opener against Prairie View.
- ▼ The Bulldogs are looking to start 3-0 for the first time since 2010-11. In the last 10 seasons, the Bulldogs have been 3-0 four times.
- ✓ Dating back to last season, MSU is looking to extend its home-winning streak to five games, which would be the longest under Rick Ray.
- Against Kennesaw State, MSU had 15 steals, the most since having 17 against Florida Atlantic on Nov. 13, 2012.
- ▼ The Bulldogs forced 26 KSU turnovers, the most since forcing 27 last year against Florida Atlantic.
- ✓ In the game against the Owls, MSU had one player to make his Maroon & White debut redshirt freshman Jacoby Davis. Davis missed all of last season and this year's opener with a knee injury. In two minutes, he finished with 1 assist and was 0-of-1 shooting.
- ✓ Gavin Ware has grabbed 12 and 10 rebounds in the first two games, respectively. He's looking to record three-straight 10-plus rebounding games for the first time in his career.
- → All 12 of Rick Ray's wins have come with MSU either leading or tied at the half.
- ✓ On signing day, MSU announced the signing of three new players forwards Demetrius Houston (Montgomery, Ala.) and Oliver Black (Jackson, Miss.) and guard Maurice Dunlap (Greenwood, Miss.).

BULLDOGS OWN 22-3 MARK AGAINST SWAC

Entering Tuesday's showdown against Mississippi Valley State, the Bulldogs are a dominant 22-3 against the 10 teams that currently comprise the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

Mississippi State has played every league foe except Grambling and Southern.

The most common team MSU has played is Alcorn State (2-2), and earlier this year MSU claimed a 71-56 win against Prairie View A&M.

After today, the Bulldogs will play one more team from the SWAC, Jackson State at 1 p.m. on Nov. 27.

NOVEMBER DOMINANCE LAST 26 YEARS

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 81-25 (.764) in November. Under **Rick Ray**, the Bulldogs are 4-4.

NEW TREND AGAINST KSU

Against Kennesaw State, MSU won despite the Owls shooting 45.5 percent from the floor.

It was the first time under Rick Ray the Bulldogs won with an opponent shooting 45 percent or better from the floor.

SCOUTING MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE

Mississippi Valley State enters the game sporting a 1-2 ledger following its 108-48 win against Champion Baptist on Friday.

Five MVSU players scored in double digits, led by DeAngelo Priar with 18 points on 58.7 percent shooting from the field. Daniel Hurtt added 16 points and 8 boards, while Jordan Washington came off the bench to total 14 points.

Defensively, the Delta Devils, who let 60-26 at the break, forced 30 turnovers and limited the Tigers to 32 percent shooting.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MSU . . .

Mississippi State overcame an early four-point deficit to win its fourthstraight game at Humphrey Coliseum dating back to last year, turning back Kennesaw State in the first meeting between the two, 78-55.

Fred Thomas, playing his first game of the year, led all scorers with 17 points, while **Gavin Ware** hauled in 10 rebounds.

Also in double-digits for MSU were **Colin Borchert** (15), **Trivante Bloodman** (11) and **Roquez Johnson** (10).

The Bulldogs forced 26 turnovers and turned those miscues into 27 points. The defense also collected 15 steals.

After opening the season with 21 turnovers against Prairie View, MSU limited that number to 12 against the Owls.

BULLDOGS ANNOUNCE NEW SIGNEES

■ Last Wednesday, Rick Ray announced the signing of three future Bulldogs — Demetrius Houston, Oliver Black, and Maurice Dunlap II.

Houston is a 6-foot-7 forward out of Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala., the same high school that produced current Bulldogs Craig Sword and Roquez Johnson. Black is a power forward from Jackson who is currently at IMG Academy in Florida, while Dunlap is a guard from Amanda Elzy High in Greenwood.

MSU TO MAKE APPEARANCE IN LAS VE-GAS CLASSIC IN DECEMBER

■ The week of Christmas, Mississippi State will travel to Nevada to participate in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic.

The Bulldogs open with South Florida and will then play either Santa Clara or UNLV.

MSU last played in the Classic in 2001, posting a 3-1 mark with wins against UL-Monroe, Richmond and Illinois-Chicago while losing to Cncinnati.

BULLDOGS 2013-14 ROSTER FEATURES FEW NEW FACES

■ The Bulldogs roster features just one new scholarship player eligible for this season - freshman point guard I.J. Ready.

The Bulldogs also signed Fallou Ndoye, but he is redshirting this season.

Back from injury, though, are redshirt freshman Dre Applewhite and Jacoby Davis, who missed all of last year due to injuries.

BULLDOGS IN THE NBA

■ MSU currently has one player on an NBA roster — Arnett Moultriee.

Moultrie is with the Philadelphia 76ers but is out with an ankle injury until January.

Jarvis Varnado, who was with the Miami Heat during their championship run last year, is with the Iowa Energy of the NBADL.

Head Coach Rick Ray

- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team Gavin Ware and Craig Sword



- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament — Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- While at Purdue, Ray was an assistant with second-year Tennessee coach Cuonzo Martin.
- The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament
- In 2000, the ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006).
- Ray's first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.





Colin Borchert scored 23 points and Gavin Ware posted a double-double as Mississippi State Auburn-Montgomery 86-57.

MSU scored the game's first five points and never trailed in the contest. The Bulldogs shot 51.7 percent from the floor and used its significant height advantage to post plus-11 rebounding advantage against the Division II Warhawks.

In his MSU point guard debut, I.J. Ready had a solid start. In 22 minutes of play, Ready scored only two points but was credited with four assists and two steals, with only one turnover

For the contest, the Bulldogs shot better than 50 percent each half and hit 42.9 percent from 3-point range. Borchert led the offensive attack with an 8-for-9 night from the field and a 5-of-6 night from the free throw line.

Ware, a sophomore from Starkville, scored 10 points and collected a game-high 12 rebounds for the double-double.

The Bulldogs used defensive pressure to key a 12-2 run early. A free throw by Ware capped the run and pushed the MSU advantage to 21-10 with 8:49 left in the half. AUM hit a couple of 3-point baskets to fight back within 12.

Leading 33-19, MSU ended the half with an 11-3 run for a 44-22 halftime advantage.

The Bulldogs continued the strong offensive play to start the second half, as the lead was quickly pushed out to 56-24 at the first media timeout of the second half.

MSU held a 42-31 rebounding advantage.

Mississippi State used a dominating inside game to beat Prairie View, 71-56.

Gavin Ware posted his third career double-double (15 points and 15 rebounds).

In his MSU debut, freshman guard I.J. Ready added 14 points, two assists and three steals in 30 minutes of work.

MSU shot 42.2 percent from the floor but was plagued by 21 turnovers. Despite the tighter restrictions on foul calling, the Bulldogs did well there, only being called for 19 personals.

Leading 62-55, the Bulldogs followed a timeout with three straight defensive turnovers and three baskets on the other end for a gameclinching 7-0 run.

MSU scored the game's first five points and held a sizeable lead throughout the contest. A layup by Johnson capped an 11-2 run and extended the lead to 18-9. Prairie View closed within five at 22-17 only to see more full-court pressure lead to a 7-1 run and a 29-18 lead for the Bulldogs.

That last spurt helped push MSU to a 38-28 lead at the intermission.

MSU extended the lead to 45-29 on an old-fashioned 3-point play by Ware. Still, the Panthers had a couple of strong offensive possessions where they beat the Bulldogs back down the court to stay in the contest.

Gavin Ware posted his third career double-double (15 points and 15 rebounds).

In his MSU debut, freshman guard I.J. Ready added 14 points, two assists and three steals in 30 minutes of work.

MSU shot 42.2 percent from the floor but was plagued by 21 turnovers. Despite the tighter restrictions on foul calling, the Bulldogs did well there, only being called for 19 personals.

Leading 62-55, the Bulldogs followed a timeout with three straight defensive turnovers and three baskets on the other end for a gameclinching 7-0 run.

MSU scored the game's first five points and held a sizeable lead throughout the contest. A layup by Johnson capped an 11-2 run and extended the lead to 18-9. Prairie View closed within five at 22-17 only to see more full-court pressure lead to a 7-1 run and a 29-18 lead for the Bulldogs.

That last spurt helped push MSU to a 38-28 lead at the intermission.
