9 KEY THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING DETROIT

- ✓ Mississippi State is seeking its sixth 3-0 start with **Rick Stansbury** at the helm. The last time the Bulldogs were 3-0 came in the 2008-09 season, when they started the year 9-0.
- ✓ The best MSU start with **Rick Stansbury** at the helm came in 2003-04 when the Bulldogs were 13-0 out of the blocks. The other seasons Mississippi State started 3-0 were 1998-99, 2001-01 and 2005-06.
- ✓ Senior **F Kodi Augustus** is the first MSU player to post back-to-back double-doubles since Jarvis Varnado achieved the feat last year against Alabama (17 pts, 10 rebs) and at South Carolina (19 pts, 12 rebs) on Feb. 24 and Feb. 27, respectively.
- ✓ Senior **G Ravern Johnson** and **Kodi Augustus** sit atop the SEC leaderboard in scoring and rebounding at 25.5 points and 12.0 boards, respectively.
- ✓ Overcoming late deficits is nothing new for MSU. While rallying from a 9-point deficit against Appalachian State with two minutes to play, last year the Bulldogs trailed Georgia 67-54 with 4 minutes left before posting a 72-69 victory. Later in the year, they trailed Auburn by 14 before winning in overtime.
- ✓ Of the active players in the SEC, **Ravern Johnson** currently ranks 4th with 1,019 points. **Kodi Augustus** is 10th with 307 rebounds, while **Dee Bost** is first with 344 assists.
- ✓ The Bulldogs received six votes in the Associated Press poll and eight votes in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' polls.
- ✓ Due to NCAA suspensions, sophomore **Renardo Sidney** and junior **Dee Bost** won't be eligible until Dec. 18 and Jan. 8, respectively.
- ✓ Dating back to last season, 21 of MSU's last 25 games have been decided by 10 points or less (12-9 in those games).

FINALLY, A FAMILIAR FOE

◆ After starting the year against two teams it's never played before, Mississippi State finally battles a familiar foe Monday against Detroit.

Well, somewhat familiar, at least.

The two have faced twice, with the Titans claiming an 86-62 win on Dec. 27, 1968, in Detroit at the Motor City Classic.

ALL-SEC HONORS

◆ In the preseason polls that were announced back in October, Mississippi State had two players receive All-SEC honors as voted on by the league coaches.

Junior point guard **Dee Bost** was tabbed first team, while senior **Ravern Johnson** received second-team accolades. Neither made the media selections.

MSTATE 2-4 AGAINST HORIZON LEAGUE

Entering Monday's outing against Detroit, the Bulldogs are 2-4 against the 10 teams that currently comprise the Horizon League.

MSU has played six of the 10 league members and no one more than twice.

The last Horizon League team the Bulldogs played was Wright State last year in December, a game MSU won in Starkville, 80-69.

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this season's 2-0 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 137-42 (.765) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 127-33 (.794) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 203-31 (1-0) when leading at halftime; 175-33 when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 216-67 (2-0 this year) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 201-73 (1-0) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 155-28 (1-0) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

NOVEMBER DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 4-2 mark, coupled with this year's 2-0 record, the Bulldogs are 47-16 (.746) in the month of November since Rick Stansbury was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1986-87 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 73-19 (.793) in November.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In just two game this year, the Bulldogs are already ahead of that pace. Against Tennessee State and Appalachian State, MSU drained 18 of its 45 attempts.

Last year, **Ravern Johnson** led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 in 2008-09, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

And like his team, Johnson is ahead of schedule. Against TSU and ASU, he was 58-of-15 beyond the arc.

1,000 POINT CLUB WELCOMES NEWEST MEMBER

It didn't take **Ravern Johnson** long to reach one of the biggest milestones in his career - becoming the 32nd member of the 1,000-point club.

In the season opener against Tennessee State, the senior from Lyon, Miss., scored a career-high 32 points to give him exactly 1,000 for his career. He now has 1,019 for his career.

His induction into the club came on two free throws with 18 seconds left in the game.

BEST IN THE SEC TO START THE YEAR

Opening night in the SEC, only one school could say it had the top scorer and top rebounder. And of course, it was Mississippi State.

While **Ravern Johnson's** 32 points led the league, **Kodi Augustus'** 14 rebounds were tops as well.

Johnson currently leads the SEC in scoring (25.5), and Augustus is tops in rebounding (12.0).

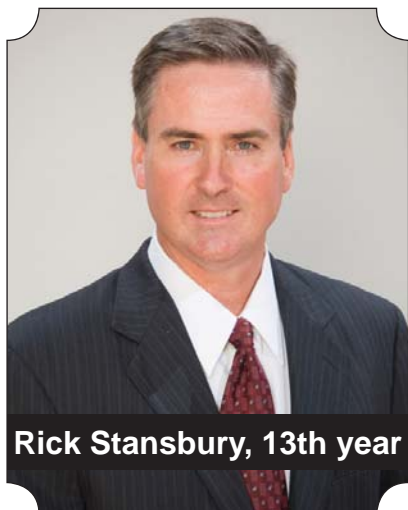

MEET THE HEAD COACH



Rick Stansbury, 13th year

Consistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 13-year coaching record of 257-140 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons and another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 13-4 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's 12 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 150-37 (.802) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 71-25 (.740) SEC mark and a 79-12 (.868) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 356-135 (.725) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

BULLDOGS TAKE ADVANTAGE OF EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Mississippi State's 2010-11 signing class got off to a resounding start with the signing of wings Rodney Hood and D.J. Gardner and point guard Deville Smith.

All three were named to the Clarion Ledger's prestigious Dandy Dozen, and all three are considered Top 100 players overall nationally.

The 6-foot-8, 180-pound Hood, a two-time Mississippi player of the year, averaged 22.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists last year as a junior and scored a record 34 points in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game. He led the Wildcats to a 26-7 record en route to advancing to the Class 6A championship game.

Listed as a five-star recruit, Rivals.com rates him as the 21st best player overall nationally, while ESPN has him at No. 30, followed by Scout.com at No. 49.

Joining Hood is his AAU teammate, Smith, a 5-11, 160-pound guard out of Callaway.

As a junior, Smith led his team to a second-straight Class 5A crown and averaged 22.4 points, 4.0 steals and 3.5 assists. He hit the game-winning shot against Provine at the buzzer to win the championship, while scoring a career-high 48 points against New Hope in the North 5A finals.

Rated as a 4-star recruit, he's listed as the 40th best overall player in the country by ESPN and 63rd best by Rivals.com.

Rounding out the early signing period class is Okolona's D.J. Gardner, who is noted for his long-range shooting.

STARKVILLE, Miss. — A lay-up by Mississippi State's Jalen Steele led the Bulldogs past Appalachian State, 76-74.

The Bulldogs trailed 73-64 before a frantic final 2:00, which saw them close out the win with a 12-1 run.

Brian Bryant sank three free throws to bring the MSU within 74-73. After Donald Sims missed a 3-pointer, the Bulldogs traveled with the rebound. On the inbounds, Twany Beckham got the steal and fed Steele, who streaked uncontested to the basket for the go-ahead points.

The frantic finish seemed highly unlikely after the opening half. The Bulldogs shot 50 percent from the field in the first 20 minutes. MSU scored the first five points of the game and only trailed once in the opening half, at 6-5.

The Bulldogs led by as many as 13 before settling for a 43-32 halftime lead.

The Mountaineers stormed back in the final half, ignited by an 18-6 run was capped by a putback from Sims for a 50-49 lead with 13:36 remaining.

Eventually, foul trouble and the Bulldogs' full-court pressure defense really took its toll. By the time the contest ended, four different ASU starters fouled out. Still the Mountaineers - behind seven straight points from Sims - led 73-64 before a free throw by Augustus and 3-point make by Benock capped off the rally.
