#### ONE RECORD ECLIPSED, ONE BIG ONE TO GO

With 10:20 remaining in the game against Bethune-Cookman, **Jarvis Varnado** did what he's done hundreds of times. Block a shot.

This time, though, the block was record-setting. His historic swat against the Wildcats was No. 413 in his illustrious career, which broke the SEC record of 412 held by former LSU All-American and current Cleveland Cavalier, Shaquille O'Neal (1990-92).

That's one record. The other that's now in sight is the NCAA mark of 535 set by Wojciech Mydra of Louisiana-Monroe (1998-2002), of which Varnado is now 122 shy of tying. To reach the NCAA mark, Varnado needs to average 4.2 blocks the next 29 games (28 regular season games and at least one SEC Tournament outing). He is currently 17th all-time in the NCAA books.

#### **TOP 5 IN THE SEC**

With a quick glance at the SEC stats, you'll see MSU ranked in the Top 5 in numerous categories. The Dawgs lead the league in blocked shots (9.3), are second in free throw percentage (70.9) and 3-pointers made (9.3), fourth in 3-point percentage (38.9), defensive rebounds (29.3) and rebounding margin (+7.0) and fifth in rebounding defense (33.3) and assist/turnover ratio (1.1).

#### **EIGHT IS ENOUGH**

Against Bethune-Cookman on Saturday, Mississippi State was whistled for just eight fouls, the fewest since Rick Stansbury took over the helm in 1998-99. Three starters didn't have any fouls — **Jarvis Varnado**, **Ravern Johnson** and **Dee Bost**.

#### **MSU BY THE NUMBER**

**1,250** — The win against Bethune-Cookman was MSU's 1,250th in school history. In SEC lore, that total stands as eighth best, one ahead of Georgia.

#### **MSTATE 3-0 AGAINST GWC FOES**

Entering Tuesday's showdown against Texas-Pan American, the Bulldogs own a perfect 3-0 ledger against the seven basketball teams that currently comprise the Great West Conference.

Of the seven teams, MSU has only played Chicago State (1-0), Houston Baptist (1-0) and Texas Pan American (1-0).

In the three wins against the GWC foes, the Bulldogs have outscored their opponents 288-215, while their average margin of victory has been 24.3 points.

#### MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 10-6 ledger against non-conference foes coupled with this year's 2-1 mark, MSU has compiled a dominant 123-40 (.755) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 115-31 (.788) regular-season mark versus non-league foes.

#### MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 184-27 when leading at halftime (2-0 this year); 163-32 (1-0) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 192-61 (2-0) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 186-68 (2-0) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 141-25 (1-0) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

#### **NOVEMBER DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY**

Including last year's 5-2 mark coupled with this year's 2-1 record, the Bulldogs are 43-15 (.741) in the month of November since **Rick Stansbury** was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1986-87 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 66-18 (.786) in November.

#### **DEFENSE STARTING TO GET QUITE STINGY**

After Rider torched the Bulldogs in the season opener by hitting 50.8 percent (30 of 59) of its shots overall, including a sizzling 62.5 percent (10 of 16) from 3-point range, MSU's defense has rebounded nicely.

In the last two games against Southeastern Louisiana and Bethune-Cookman, the Bulldogs have limited their opponents to 37.3 percent (52 of 118) shooting overall and 40 percent (18 of 45) accuracy beyond the arc, while giving up just 59 points.

The Wildcats managed just 51 points. And when MSU has held opponents to 59 points or less the last two years, it's been perfect. During that span, the Bulldogs have held foes to 59 points or fewer on 15 occasions. Each time, Mississippi State has won.

#### MOVING ON UP THE SCORING CHARTS

After scoring 20-plus points in back-to-back games, including a 20-point effort against Southeastern Louisiana on Thursday, and 10 against Bethune-Cookman, **Jarvis Varnado** is now 41 points shy of becoming the 31st MSU player to score 1,000 or more for a career as he now has 959.

Also moving up the record book is senior guard **Barry Stewart**. With his 10 points against the Lions, he now has 1,208 for his career, 20th most in school history.

# AS THE MEN DO, SO DO THE WOMEN While the Mississippi State men led the SEC and was second in the nation in blocked shots (7.5) per outing last year, the Lady Bulldogs (6.2) finished tops in the SEC and fifth nationally. Jarvis Varnado leads the nation with 165 and Lady Bulldog standout Chanel Mokango was ninth with 97. MSU was the only BCS school where the men and the women led their conference in blocked shots.

#### MAKING THE 3S OFF THE COURT

•In the spring, MSU not only excelled on the court, it put up impressive numbers in the classroom, too. The 16 players on the roster posted an overall GPA of 2.68, the second-highest average in two years. Seven players fi nished with a GPA of 3.0 or better, while two had a 4.0.

#### **OVERCOMING MAJOR DEFICITS**

●Three times last year, MSU has rallied from double-digit deficits — Arkansas (15) and South Carolina twice (10 both times) . The most a Rick Stansbury-coached team has battled back from is 20 (Kentucky, 1-5-02).

#### MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. Since the 2006-07 season, the Bulldogs have posted a 41-12 mark for an .774 winning percentage. With a 13-5 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's first 11 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 137-34 (.801) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 65-23 (.739) SEC mark and a 72-11 (.867) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 343-132 (.722) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

#### **BRYANT BECOMES FIRST MSU SIGNEE OF 2009-10 SIGNING CLASS**

Mississippi State men's basketball coach Rick Stansbury has announced his first signee of the 2009-10 class, standout guard Brian Bryant

The 6-foot-3, 165-pound Albany, Ga., native is currently a sophomore at Northwest Florida State College, where he has guided his team to a 5-0 start and is averaging 20 points, 7.6 rebounds and 5.4 assists, while shooting 41 percent from 3-point territory.

Last year as a freshman, he was limited due to a hand injury.

Prior to enrolling at Northwest Florida, previously known as Okaloosa Walton, Bryant prepped four years at Dougherty High School, where he led his team to two regional titles and four playoff appearances.

As a senior, he averaged 29.6 points, 9.3 rebounds, 3.6 steals and 3.6 assists en route to garnering team MVP honors and earning Albany

Herald Play of the Year honors for the second-straight season.

He was also selected to play in the Georgia North-South All-Star Game.


"He is the complete package of talent, athleticism, character and work ethic." 13th-year Raiders coach Bruce Stewart said. "He is a winner."

#### 24 • Kodi Augustus • F • 6-8 • 220 • Baton Rouge, LA

Was suspended the last two games for inappropriate comments made after the Rider games. Will be back in action against Texas-Pan American. Augustus is coming off an impressive SEC Tournament run that saw him score a career-high 19 points against Georgia in the opening round, while he finished averaging 9.8 points a game in tournament play. Against Washington in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, Kodi was named Chevrolet Player of the Game. Augustus finished the year averaging 6.2 points and 3.4.

Osby played in all 36 games for the Bulldogs as a true freshman last year. He scored a career-high 15 points against North Alabama. He also averaged 4.1 points and 2.6 boards per contest, while scoring in double-digits three times. Osby also finished fourth on the team with 12 blocks. Has seen action in all three games and is averaging 5.3 points and 4.3 boards. He's also tied for second with three blocks.

The first member of the 2009 MSU signing class, the heralded All-State member from Noxubee County is known for his athleticism and ball-handling skills. Ranked the 23rd best shooting guard in the country by Scout.com, Smith inked his next four years with Bulldog basketball on his birthday. As a senior, he averaged 25.1 points, 5.8 rebounds and 2.2 steals.

Is waiting to be cleared to play by the NCAA. One of MSU's most highly touted recruits, Sidney brings numerous accolades including McDonald's All American selection, USA Junior National Select Team inclusion as well as Naismith High School Player of the Year finalist. He was also tabbed Co-MVP at the Jordan Brand Classic at the famous Madison Square Garden in New York City. Sidney made his national impression at the McDonald's All-Star game where he scored 11 points while grabbing 6 rebounds.
