WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS UTAH STATE . . .

- ✓ Mississippi State is 4-4 all-time against teams from the Mountain West Conference.
- ✓ The Bulldogs are looking to start 4-0 for the first time since 2010-11. Since 1993-94, the Bulldogs have been 4-0 six times.
- → Dating back to last season, MSU has now won five-straight home games.
- ✓ MSU has used three different starting lineups so far this season.
- ▼ The 94 points MSU scored against Mississippi Valley State were the second most in the Rick Ray era. Last year, the Bulldogs totaled 97 against New Orleans.
- ✓ Against the Delta Devils, red-shirt freshman Jacoby Davis scored his first-career points after missing all of last year and the season opener with a knee injury.
- ✓ Gavin Ware has grabbed 15, 10 and 11 rebounds in the first three games, respectively, and has now recorded 10-plus rebounds in three-straight games for the first time in his career. His 12.0 boards rank tied for second in the SEC.
- ✓ Defensively, MSU is yielding just 61.0 points an outing, the third fewest in the SEC. The Bulldogs do lead the league with their 11.0 steals, while Trivante Bloodman is tied for 5th with his
- ✓ In two of the three games this season,MSU never trailed.
- → All 13 of Rick Ray's wins have come with MSU either leading or tied at the half.
- → Dating back to last season, MSU is 5-1 when Gavin Ware has 10 or more rebounds.

BULLDOGS .500 AGAINST MWC FOES

Mississippi State travels to Utah State with a 4-4 all-time ledger against teams that currently comprise the Mountain West Conference.

The Aggies are the last MWC team MSU has faced, claiming a 66-64 two years ago at the Hump in the only other matchup between the two schools.

The Bulldogs could face another MWC team in late December against UNLV in the Las Vegas Classic depending on both teams' outcomes.

MSU has also faced Wyoming (1-0), Fresno State (1-0), Colorado State (0-1), UNLV (0-1) and San Jose State (1-1).

NOVEMBER DOMINANCE LAST 26 YEARS

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 82-25 (.766) in November. Under **Rick Ray**, the Bulldogs are 5-4.

NEW TREND AGAINST KSU & MVSU

After losing 16-straight games when the opponent shoots 45 percent or better, Mississippi State has now won two straight under the same circumstances.

Against Kennesaw State, MSU won despite the Owls shooting 45.5 percent from the floor.

Then against Mississippi Valley State, the Bulldogs claimed a 94-72 victory with the Delta Devils shooting 47.5 percent (28-59).

SCOUTING UTAH STATE

Utah State upped its record to 3-0 on Saturday with a 71-64 win at UC Santa Barbara.

Preston Medlin paced the Aggies with 18 points, while Spencer Butterfield added 16.

USU won the battle of the boards, 38-25, while Jarred Shaw hauling in a game-high 9.

The Aggies were dominating beyond the arc, hitting 10 of their 21 attempts. Butterfield was 4 of 6 from long range.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MSU . . .

Mississippi State led from start to finish as it remained perfect on the year with a 94-72 victory against Mississippi Valley State on Tuesday.

Gavin Ware recorded his second double-double of the year and the fourth of his career with a career-high 23 points and 11 rebounds

Also scoring in double-digits for MSU were **Colin Borchert** (14), **Craig Sword** (10) and **Roquez Johnson** (12).

The Bulldogs forced 18 turnovers and turned those miscues into 16 points. The defense also collected 10 steals, led by Trivante Bloodman with 4.

MSU which won the battle of the boards, 41-27, dished out 17 assists, led by **Trivante Bloodman's** 5, and had just 11 turnovers.

A pair of Dee Bost free throws with 34 seconds remaining lifted Mississippi State past Utah State 66-64.

MSU survived a game in which neither team led by more than nine points, there were 11 ties and nine lead changes.

Both teams struggled early as the first media timeout was reached with a 2-2 tie. USU inched out to a 16-5 advantage less than nine minutes into the contest.

Smith entered the contest and did provide his team a much-needed spark. Smith scored his seven points in succession with a defensive rebound, layup, 3-point basket and pair of foul shots.

MSU led 32-29 at the break and had the better of it throughout most of the second half. MSU ran its lead to 43-36 with 13:59 left on a jumper by Hood and 3-point basket by Jalen Steele.

The Aggies battled back with an 18-10 run. A Ben Clifford trey placed the visitors on top 54-53 with 7:08 remaining.

USU still held a 64-62 lead on a jumper by Kyisean Reed with 2:42 remaining.

The Bulldogs answered with a putback by Moultrie with 1:25 left. Defensively, MSU forced a turnover and the Bulldogs scored again when Bost drew contact on a shot attempt with 34 seconds left.

Utah State had one last shot but Danny Berger's 3-point shot attempt bounced off the back iron as regulation time expired.

■ The week of Christmas, Mississippi State will travel to Nevada to participate in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic.

The Bulldogs open with South Florida and will then play either Santa Clara or UNLV.

Head Coach Rick Ray

- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team Gavin Ware and Craig Sword.



- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament — Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- While at Purdue, Ray was an assistant with second-year Tennessee coach Cuonzo Martin.
- The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2000, the ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006).
- Ray's first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.





Colin Borchert scored 23 points and Gavin Ware posted a double-double as Mississippi State defeated Auburn-Montgomery, 86-57.

MSU scored the game's first five points and never trailed in the contest. The Bulldogs shot 51.7 percent from the floor and used its significant height advantage to post plus-11 rebounding advantage against the Division II Warhawks.

In his MSU point guard debut, I.J. Ready had a solid start. In 22 minutes of play, Ready scored only two points but was credited with four assists and two steals, with only one turnover.

For the contest, the Bulldogs shot better than 50 percent each half and hit 42.9 percent from 3-point range. Borchert led the offensive attack with an 8-for-9 night from the field and a 5-of-6 night from the free throw line.

Ware, a sophomore from Starkville, scored 10 points and collected a game-high 12 rebounds for the double-double.
