WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS TCU...

- Mississippi State is 89-77 all-time in mid-season tournaments with 19 titles. The Bulldogs' last crown came at the 2011 2K Sports Classic in New York City.
- MSU and TCU are meeting for the third time, with the Horned Frogs holding a 2-1 advantage after claiming a 71-61 win last year in the SEC/BIg 12 Challenge in Starkville.
- Against the current 10 teams that comprise the Big 12, the Bulldogs are 10-15. Texas is MSU's most common foe with eight meetings (3-5).
- Mississippi State's last win against a Big 12 team came against Texas A&M in the 2011 2K Sports Classic at Madison Square Garden in New York. MSU also beat West Virginia that same year, but the Mountaineers were in the Big East at the time. The last team the Bulldogs beat currently in the Big 12 was December of 2002 in New Orleans when they defeated Oklahoma, 54-45.
- MSU is 5-0 for the first time since 2008-09. In the last 20 years, the Bulldogs have been 5-0 just four times.
- → Roquez Johnson's streak of scoring in double-digits ended at four.
- MSU entered the St. Louis game leading the SEC in free throws made (22.8) and attempted (30.8). However, they were 7-9 against the Billikens.
- After missing the first four games recovering from back surgery, Craig Sword made his 2014-15 debut against St. Louis. In 11 minutes, he had 2 rebounds, 1 assist and 1 blocked shot.
- ▼ Travis Daniels had a career day vs. St. Louis with 21 points on 8-11 shooting, with a 4-if-5 mark from 3-point range.
- ▼ The Bulldogs have out-rebounded their opponents by 12 or more boards in all five games. The
 last time MSU won the rebounding battle five games in a row in the same season was 2007-08.

 Dating back to last year, MSU has out-rebounded its opponents seven-consecutive games.
- → Mississippi State leads the SEC in fewest rebounds allowed at 25.4.
- → The Bulldogs have shot 50 percent or better from the floor twice this season.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

For the third-consecutive year, Rick Ray's staff remained intact during the offseason.

Back for their third year at Chris Hollender, George Brooks, Wes Flanigan, Adam Gordon and Adam Bauman.

ANOTHER CLEMSON CONNECTION

In his first year as a graduate assistant is Tanner Smith, a fouryear player at Clemson when Rick Ray was an assistant and Adam Gordon a graduate assistant.

Smith's duties include assisting with on-court workouts, video scouting, academic monitoring and on-campus recruiting.

He comes to MSU after spending the last two years overseas playing professionally.

At Clemson, Smith appeared in 127 games where he scored 986 points, grabbed 459 rebounds, dished out 320 assists and collected 159 steals en route to playing in three different NCAA Tournaments.

MORE ASSISTS; FEWER TURNOVERS

After dishing out just 321 assists and committing 545 turnovers two years ago, MSU improved drastically in both departments a year ago.

In 2013-14, MSU had 401 assists compared to just 459 turnovers.

Through five games this year, however, MSU has 57 assists and 79 turnovers.

MAN OF STEAL

In just two seasons, Craig Sword has collected 115 steals, including the 60 he had a year ago.

He needs just 24 more to crack the Top 10 in the MSU record books. Ray White (1976-79) is record holder with 217.

1,000 POINT CLUB

Mississippi State has two players that could join the 1,000-point club this year — Craig Sword and Gavin Ware

Sword, who has missed the first four games due to back surgery before returning against St. Louis, needs just 228 more points after he totaled 437 a year ago.

Ware is now 328 points shy after he totaled 16 against St. Louis on Friday. Last year, he scored 330 points.

HOME LOSING SKID SNAPPED

Not only did Mississippi State open the year on a positive note, it snapped a six-game losing skid at Humphrey Coliseum.

Prior to the Bulldogs' 66-56 win agaisnt Western Carolina, their-last win at the Hump came on Jan. 22, 2014, against Auburn 82-74. MSU now owns a four-game winning streak at the Hump.

10 AND COUNTING

Against Western Carolina, junior forward Gavin Ware recorded his 10th-career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

He's currently tied for 6th in the SEC in rebounding (7.6) and T11th in scoring (14.4).

400th WIN

On Dec. 1, 1975, the doors of Humphrey Coliseum officially opened with an 85-82 win against Indiana State.

Against Western Carolina on Friday, MSU collected win No. 400 with the 66-56 victory.

BULLDOGS SIGN THREE

In mid-November, Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period by inking Quinndary Weatherspoon, Tookie Brown and Joe Strugg.

Brown is a 5-11, 170-pound guard out of Morgan County High School in Madison, Ga., while Strugg is a 6-8, 200-pound forward from G.W. Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala.

Weatherspoon, rated as the No. 2 overall player in Mississippi and 78th nationally, is a 6-4, 175-pound guard out of Velma Jackson. Recently, the Clinton, Miss., native was named to the Clarion Ledger's Dandy Dozen team.

Strugg is the fourth MSU signee out of Carver in the last four years, along with Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and Demetrius Houston.

RARE TYPE OF WIN

Usually when MSU has fewer assists than its opponent, it loses. But against Western Carolina, the Bulldogs improved to 3-37 when having fewer assists (7/12).

■ Mississippi State has two of the Top 5 shooters in the SEC in Roquez Johnson and Gavin Ware.

Ware is currently second at .659, while Johnson is third at .630.

D-E-F-E-N-S-E

■ MSU allowed just 46 points versus Clayton State on Monday. It was the fewest points given up since limiting New Orleans to 46 on Jan. 3, 2013.

In the last two games, MSU has allowed just 96 points (50, St. Louis).

HIGH STEAL COUNT

■ Also against Clayton State, the Bulldogs collected a season-high 11 steals.

It was the most steals since also having 11 against Auburn on Feb. 15 last year.

LOW ASSISTS COUNT

■ Assists were hard to come by against the Lakers.

The Bulldogs had just five, with Trivante Bloodman and I.J. Ready each having two.

The last time MSU had five or fewer was last March at Georgia.

But against St. Louis, the Bulldogs had 17.

CLEANING THE GLASS

■ Against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 17, Mississippi State easily won the battle of the boards, 47-25.

It was the largest margin since being plus-20 against LSU on Jan. 25, 2012.

NOT A LOT, BUT MAKING THEM COUNT

■ In the season opener against Western Carolina, Mississippi State attempted just 37 field goals, making 17.

That was the fewest attempts since Feb. 12, 2005, when the Bulldogs shot 39 against Vanderbilt.

20 IS HIS NUMBER

■ Against Mississippi Valley State last week, senior forward Roquez Johnson tied his career high with 20 points.

It was the third time the Montgomery, Ala., totaled 20 points, the last coming against Ole Miss last January in a win at Humphrey Coliseum

Johnson is currently 13th in the SEC with his 14.2 scoring clip.

500 CLUB IN REACH

■ Following a 5-rebound performance against St. Louis on Friday, junior forward Gavin Ware now needs just 28 more to reach 500 for his career.

In the scoring category, he's now just 328 points shy of 1,000.

ALABAMA FLAVOR

■ A quick glance at Mississippi State's roster reveals one very strong common thread — the state of Alabama.

Player wise, the roster features five players from Alabama — Travis Daniels, Demetrius Houston, Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and

De'Runnya Wilson.

In addition, the coaching staff has two ties in Wes Flanigan and George Brooks.

Flanigan was an All-SEC standout at Auburn from 1993-97, while Brooks is a native of Lafayette. Ala.

7 PLAYERS SEE FIRST-TIME ACTION

■ Five Mississippi State players saw their first action as a Bulldog against Western Carolina — Oliver Black, Travis Daniels, Maurice Dunlap, Demetrius Houston and Fallou Ndoye.

That total tied for the second most in the SEC with Tennessee, while Texas A&M had the most with seven.

Then against Mississippi Valley State, Jeffery Johnson and Isaiah Butler made their collegiate debuts.

BULLDOGS INVITED TO PUERTO RICO

■ On Thursday, MSU learned it will be playing in the 2015 Puerto Rico Classic.

The field of eight also features Butler, Miami, Minnesota, Missouri State, Temple, Texas Tech and Utah.

HUTTON NAMED 2015 SEC LEGEND

■ Doug Hutton has been named the 2015 SEC Legend.

Hutton, a native of Clinton, Miss., played for the Bulldogs from 1961-64 and led MSU to the historic 1963 NCAA Tournament against Loyola-Chicago.

The All-SEC standout was voted team captain his senior year and averaged 14.8 points.

He'll be recognized at the SEC Tournament next March in Nashville.





- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State his-
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team -Gavin Ware and Craig



- ▶ Entering his third season, he is 27-41 in the rebuilding process.
- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament -Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- ▶ The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- ► The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tourna-
- In 2000, ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger.
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006), while his first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.

Mississippi State opened up the second half with an 8-2 run to extend its lead to 39-32. The Catamounts would cut the Bulldogs lead to five, but a pair of free throws by Thomas and a jumper by Travis Daniels put the Bulldogs up seven at the halfway mark.

MSU pushed its lead to double digits for the first time at 57-47 thanks to a pair of free throws from Johnson. WCU would cut it as close as six in the final moments of the game, but clutch free throw shooting by the Bulldogs would seal the contest.
