10 KEY THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING NORTH CAROLINA A&T

- ✓ Mississippi State has now lost back-to-back non-conference games at home for the first time since November of 2005-06 (Northwestern State, 76-75; Southeastern Louisiana, 57-46). MSU hasn't dropped three-straight since December of 1985-86 (Delta State, 56-53; Kansas State, 63-58; UT-Chattanooga, 48-47).
- ✓ North Carolina A&T is the fourth first-time opponent for MSU this year.
- ✓ The Bulldogs have failed to make a 3-pointer in the second half of their last two games. They are 0-14 in that stretch.
- ✓ Against East Tennessee State, MSU failed to record a blocked shot for the first time since doing so at LSU (2-17-07) in a 56-50 victory.
- ✓ The 22 rebounds against ETSU tied for the fewest with **Rick Stansbury** at the helm. MSU also had 22 against Texas in the 2002 NCAA Tournament.
- ✓ 25 of MSU's last 29 games overall have been decided by 10 points or less (14-11 record).
- ✓ All six of MSU's games have been decided by 10 points or less. The last time the Bulldogs opened the season with seven games decided by 10 points or less was 1942-43, when their first nine games were decided by that margin.
- ✓ Senior **F Kodi Augustus** has recorded a double-double in four of the Bulldogs' six games this season. He and Kentucky's Terrance Jones are tied for the most in the SEC.
- ✓ Senior **G Ravarn Johnson** sits atop the SEC leaderboard and is tied for sixth nationally in scoring with his 25.0 average, while **Kodi Augustus** is second in rebounding at 10.2 and tied for 24th nationally.
- ✓ With his 23-point performance against ETSU, **Ravarn Johnson** now sits 28th in the MSU scoring charts with 1,118 points, while his 201 made 3-pointers rank third all-time. Sitting in 27th place is Tyrone Washington (1996-99) with 1,119 points.

MEET NORTH CAROLINA A&T

◆ After an eight-day layoff since its 89-81 win against Norfolk State, North Carolina A&T comes to Starkville riding a four-game winning streak.

The Bulldogs are the Aggies' second SEC opponent of the year. Back in November, they dropped a 105-55 decision at Florida.

ALL-SEC HONORS

◆ In the preseason polls that were announced back in October, Mississippi State had two players receive All-SEC honors as voted on by the league coaches.

Junior point guard **Dee Bost** was tabbed first team, while senior **Ravarn Johnson** received second-team accolades. Neither made the media selections.

MSTATE 4-0 AGAINST MEAC

Entering Sunday's showdown against North Carolina A&T, the Bulldogs are 4-0 against the 11 teams that currently comprise the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.

Mississippi State has faced just three of the 11 teams.

MSU has played Florida A&M the most (two games) and holds a 2-0 advantage.

The last MEAC team MSU faced was Bethune-Cookman last year, with the Bulldogs claiming a 67-51 win in Starkville on Nov. 21, 2009.

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this season's 4-2 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 139-44 (.760) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 129-35 (.787) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 204-33 (2-2) when leading at halftime; 177-33 (2-0) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 217-68 (3-1 this year) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 202-74 (2-1) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 155-30 (1-2) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

DECEMBER DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 8-0 mark, the Bulldogs are 72-16 (.818) in the month of December since Rick Stansbury was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 130-40 (.765) in December.

The Bulldogs had their eight-game winning streak in the month of December snapped with their loss to East Tennessee State.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In just six games this year, the Bulldogs are nearly on the same pace, having drained 48 of their 139 attempts for an 8.0 average.

Last year, **Ravarn Johnson** led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 in 2008-09, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

Johnson is already ahead of his pace from a year ago. Through six games, he is 24-of-53 beyond the arc. Last year at this time, he was just 14 of 36 from long range.

1,000 POINT CLUB WELCOMES NEWEST MEMBER

It didn't take **Ravarn Johnson** long to reach one of the biggest milestones in his career - becoming the 32nd member of the 1,000-point club.

In the season opener against Tennessee State, the senior from Lyon, Miss., scored 32 points to give him exactly 1,000 for his career. Following his 23-point effort against East Tennessee State, he now has 1,118 for his career to rank 28th all-time, as he passed W.D. "Red Stroud, who stands at 29th all-time.

His induction into the club came on two free throws with 18 seconds left in the game against Tennessee State.

Tyron Washington (1996-99) is currently 27th at 1,119 points, while Greg Carter (1988-91) is 26th with 1,123 points.

BULLDOG BITES**SEEING PLENTY
OF GAME ACTION**

- Logging minutes isn't an issue for the Mississippi State players.

The Bulldogs are the only SEC team where three starters are averaging more than 32.5 minutes an outing. Georgia and Kentucky have two each.

Ravarn Johnson leads the SEC with his 37.2 minutes, while **Riley Benock** is second at 34.8.

Recording the 5th-most minutes is **Kodi Augustus** at 32.8.

**NUMBERS SPEAK
FOR THEMSELVES**

- From a national standpoint, MSU has a strong presence throughout the various statistics.

The Bulldogs are 89th in scoring (74.3) and are tied for 41st in 3-pointers made (8.0).

**BLOCK PARTY
CONTINUES**

- No. Jarvis Varnado isn't around. However, MSU's ability to block shots didn't leave with the standout.

Through six games, the Bulldogs are seventh in the SEC with 5.0 blocks an outing and are tied for 42nd in the country.

Kodi Augustus leads MSU with 10, which the 9th-most in the SEC.

**19 AND COUNTING
FOR JOHNSON**

- During his career, Ravarn Johnson has made four or more 3-pointers in a game 19 times.

His best outing was two weeks ago against Troy, when he hit seven to spark a come-from-behind win in OT despite trail by as many as 11 points in the second half.

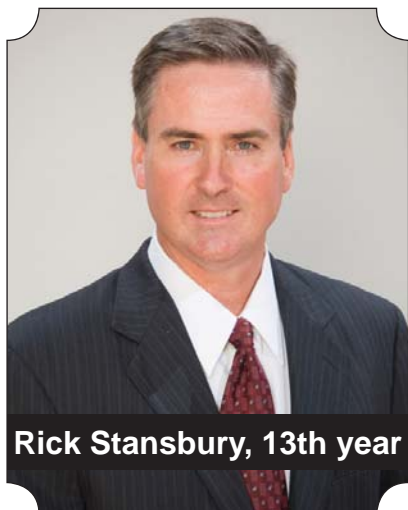

MEET THE HEAD COACH



Rick Stansbury, 13th year

Consistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 13-year coaching record of 259-142 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons and another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 13-4 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's first 12 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 152-39 (.796) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 71-25 (.740) SEC mark and a 81-14 (.853) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 358-137 (.723) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

BULLDOGS TAKE ADVANTAGE OF EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Mississippi State's 2010-11 signing class got off to a resounding start with the signing of wings Rodney Hood and D.J. Gardner and point guard Deville Smith.

All three were named to the Clarion Ledger's prestigious Dandy Dozen, and all three are considered Top 100 players overall nationally.

The 6-foot-8, 180-pound Hood, a two-time Mississippi player of the year, averaged 22.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists last year as a junior and scored a record 34 points in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game. He led the Wildcats to a 26-7 record en route to advancing to the Class 6A championship game.

Listed as a five-star recruit, Rivals.com rates him as the 21st best player overall nationally, while ESPN has him at No. 30, followed by Scout.com at No. 49.

Joining Hood is his AAU teammate, Smith, a 5-11, 160-pound guard out of Callaway.

As a junior, Smith led his team to a second-straight Class 5A crown and averaged 22.4 points, 4.0 steals and 3.5 assists. He hit the game-winning shot against Provine at the buzzer to win the championship, while scoring a career-high 48 points against New Hope in the North 5A finals.

Rated as a 4-star recruit, he's listed as the 40th best overall player in the country by ESPN and 63rd best by Rivals.com.

Rounding out the early signing period class is Okolona's D.J. Gardner, who is noted for his long-range shooting.

The 6-7, 195-pound standout totaled 24.2 points, 11.1 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.4 steals a contest as the Chieftains posted a 25-6 ledger and advanced to the North 1A semifinals. His season-high of 40 points came against Ingomar. They finished the season ranked No. 5 in the Class 1A rankings.

Gardner also stood out in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game, where he poured in 16 points.

A 4-star recruit, Rivals.com has him as the 60th player in the country, while ESPN has him at No. 91.
