10 KEY THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING NICHOLLS STATE

- Mississippi State leads the all-time series against Nicholls State, 5-0. The five wins for MSU in this series have been by an average of 24.4 points. The largest defeat came in the 2001-02 season opener, 36 points (95-59).
- √ Tonight's game features two of the nation's Top 10 scorers in MSU's Ravern Johnson (8th, 23.9) and Nicholls' Anatoly Bose (4th, 25.4).
- → Against North Carolina A&T Sunday, the Bulldogs drained 15 3-pointers, the second most in school history. The record of 16 happened twice St. Bonaventure (12-5-09) and Arkansas (2-7-09).

 WESTERN DIVISION
- After going a combined 0-14 in the second half against Florida Atlantic and East Tennessee State, MSU rebounded against NC A&T by going 6-14 in the final 20 minutes.
- With the win against the Aggies, Mississippi State avoided three-straight non-conference losses at home for the first time since December of 1985 (Delta State, 56-53; Kansas State, 63-58; UT-Chattanooga, 48-47).
- After collecting 22 rebounds against ETSU, which tied for the fewest with Rick Stansbury at the helm (Texas, 2002 NCAA Tournament), MSU hauled in a season-high 45 against the Aggies, the most since totaling 46 against Auburn a year ago (2-13-10).
- ✓ 25 of MSU's last 30 games overall have been decided by 10 points or less (14-11 record).
- Mississippi State's streak of seven-straight games decided by 10 points or less dating back to last last season ended with the 16-point win against North Carolina A&T.
- Senior F Kodi Augustus has recorded a double-double in four of the Bulldogs' seven games this season. He and Kentucky's Terrance Jones are tied for the most in the SEC.
- Senior **G Ravern Johnson** sits atop the SEC leaderboard and is 8th nationally with his 23.9 scoring average.

MEET NICHOLLS STATE

◆ Nicholls State comes to Starkville having won three out of its last four games, but lost its last game at Wichita State, 68-50.

MSU is the Colonels' second SEC opponent of the year. Back in November, they won at LSU, 62-53.

Senior forward Anatoly Bose is 4th nationally in scoring at 25.4

ALL-SEC HONORS

♦In the preseason polls that were announced back in October, Mississippi State had two players receive All-SEC honors as voted on by the league coaches.

Junior point guard **Dee Bost** was tabbed first team, while senior **Ravern Johnson** received second-team accolades. Neither made the media selections.

Entering Monday's showdown against Nicholls State, the Bulldogs are a dominant 37-3 against against the 12 teams that currently comprise the Southland Conference.

Of the 12 teams, MSU has not played Lamar, Stephen F. Austin, Texas State, UT-Arlington and UT-San Antonio. The team MSU has faced the most is Southeastern Louisiana (17-1).

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this season's 5-2 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 140-44 (.761) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 130-35 (.788) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 205-33 (3-2) when leading at halftime; 177-33 (2-0) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 218-68 (4-1 this year) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 203-74 (3-1) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 156-30 (2-2) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

DECEMBER DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 8-0 mark, the Bulldogs are 73-16 (.820) in the month of December since Rick Stansbury was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 131-40 (.766) in December.

The Bulldogs had their eight-game winning streak in the month of December snapped with their loss to East Tennessee State.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In just seven games this year, the Bulldogs are ahead of that pace, having drained 63 of their 169 attempts for an 9.0 average.

Last year, **Ravern Johnson** led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 in 2008-09, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

Johnson is aready ahead of his pace from a year ago. Through seven games, he is 29-of-63 beyond the arc. Last year at this time, he was just 18 of 42 from long range.

1,000 POINT CLUB WELCOMES NEWEST MEMBER

It didn't take **Ravern Johnson** long to reach one of the biggest milestones in his career - becoming the 32nd member of the 1,000-point club.

In the season opener against Tennessee State, the senior from Lyon, Miss., scored 32 points to give him exactly 1,000 for his career. Following his 17-point effort against East Tennessee State, he now has 1,135 for his career to rank 26th all-time, as he passed both Tyrone Washington and Greg Carter against North Carolina A&T..

His induction into the 1,000-point club came on two free throws with 18 seconds left in the game against Tennessee State.

Wiley Peck (1976-79) is currently 25th at 1,136 points, while Gary Gooker (1976-78) is 24th with 1,144 points.

BULLDOG BITES SEEING PLENTY OF GAME ACTION

 Logging minutes isn't an issue for the Mississippi State players.

The Bulldogs are the only SEC team where two starters are averaging more than 33.5 minutes an outing. Georgia and Kentucky have two each.

Ravern Johnson leads the SEC with his 35.7 minutes, while **Riley Benock** is second at 34.7.

Georgia has two players averaging 33 minutes or more.

NUMBERS SPEAK FOR THEMSELVES

• From a national standpoint, MSU has a strong presence throughout the various statistics.

The Bulldogs are tied for 88th in scoring (74.3) and are tied for 15th in 3-pointers made (9.0).

BLOCK PARTY CONTINUES

• No. Jarvis Varnado isn't around. However, MSU's ability to block shots didn't leave with the standout.

Through seven games, the Bulldogs are tied for 5th in the SEC with 5.3 blocks an outing and are tied for 31st in the country.

Kodi Augustus leads MSU with 10, which the 11th-most in the SEC.

19 AND COUNTING FOR JOHNSON

 During his career, Ravern Johnson has made four or more 3-pointers in a game 20 times, including the five he made against North Carolina A&T on Sunday.

His best outing was two weeks ago against Troy, when he hit seven to spark a come-from-behind win in OT despite traily by as many as 11 points in the second half.

MEET THE HEAD COACH



onsistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 13-year coaching record of 260-142 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons an another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 13-4 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's first 12 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 153-39 (.797) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 71-25 (.740) SEC mark and a 82-14 (.854) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 359-137 (.724) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

BULLDOGS TAKE ADVANTAGE OF EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Mississippi State's 2010-11 signing class got off to a resounding start with the signing of wings Rodney Hood and D.J. Gardner and point guard Deville Smith.

All three were named to the Clarion Ledger's prestigious Dandy Dozen, and all three are considered Top 100 players overall nationally.

The 6-foot-8, 180-pound Hood, a two-time Mississippi player of the year, averaged 22.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists last year as a junior and scored a record 34 points in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game. He led the Wildcats to a 26-7 record en route to advancing to the Class 6A championship game.

Listed as a five-start recruit, Rivals.com rates him as the 21st best player overall nationally, while ESPN has him at No. 30, followed by Scout.com at No. 49.

Joining Hood is his AAU teammate, Smith, a 5-11, 160-pound guard out of Callaway.

As a junior, Smith led his team to a secondstraight Class 5A crown and averaged 22.4 points, 4.0 steals and 3.5 assists. He hit the game-winning shot against Provine at the buzzer to win the championship, while scoring a career-high 48 points against New Hope in the North 5A finals.

Rated as a 4-star recruit, he's listed as the 40th best overall player in the country by ESPN and 63rd best by Rivals.com.

Rounding out the early signing period class is Okolona's D.J. Gardner, who is noted for his long-range shooting

The 6-7, 195-pound standout totaled 24.2 points, 11.1 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.4 steals a contest as the Chieftains posted a 25-6 ledger and advanced to the North 1A semifinals. His season-high of 40 points came against Ingomar. They finished the season ranked No. 5 in the Class 1A rankings.

Gardner also stood out in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game, where he poured in 16 points.
