#### WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS OREGON STATE ...

- ✓ Mississippi State is playing in the state of Oregon for the first time since losing in Portland to Washington, 71-58, in the opening round of the 2009 NCAA Tournament.
- ✓ Against the teams that currently comprise the Pac-12, the Bulldogs are 8-11. MSU's last outing against a Pac-12 foe was in the finals of the 2011 2K Sports Classic, where it claimed a 67-57 win against Arizona. Colorado is the only league team Mississippi State hasn't faced.
- → A win would give the Bulldogs their second-straight 6-2 start.
- → MSU is just the fifth SEC team that Oregon State has hosted at Gill Coliseum.
- ▼ The Bulldogs are looking to snap a 18-game road losing streak. Their last road victory came at Georgia in January of 2013.
- doing so in 2012-13 against North Carolina, Marquette and Texas.
- → Mississippi State is currently second in the SEC in rebounding margin (+10.0).
- → The Bulldogs are yielding just 28.7 rebounds an outing, the fewest in the SEC.
- ✓ Gavin Ware is now 13 rebounds shy of 500 for his career. With 105 more rebounds, he'll move into the MSU all-time Top 20 list.
- ✓ After out-rebounding its opponents seven games in a row dating back to last season, MSU has lost the battle of the boards in the last two outings to TCU and Tulane.
- ✓ The Bulldogs have shot 50 percent or better from the floor twice this season. On the year, they are eighth in the SEC overall at .457.
- ✓ In the scoring column, Gavin Ware is 14th in the SEC at 13.4, while Fred Thomas is 16th at 12.6. Ware is also 12th in rebounding at 6.4.
- ✓ Junior Fred Thomas is 40 steals shy of moving into the MSU all-time Top 10 list. He currently has 99. Terry Lewis (1980-83) is 10th with 139. This season, Thomas leads MSU with 12 steals.
- ✓ After draining eight 3-pointers against St. Louis, MSU has just 5 in its last two games.

### **NOTES**

### MORE ASSISTS; FEWER TURNOVERS

After dishing out just 321 assists and committing 545 turnovers two years ago, MSU improved drastically in both departments a year ago.

In 2013-14, MSU had 401 assists compared to just 459 turnovers.

Through seven games this year, however, MSU has 68 assists and 105 turnovers.

### MAN OF STEAL

In just two seasons, Craig Sword has collected 115 steals, including the 60 he had a year ago.

He needs just 24 more to crack the Top 10 in the MSU record books. Ray White (1976-79) is record holder with 217.

Sword missed the first four games of the year due to back surgery but has played in the last two for a total of 22 minutes.

### 1,000 POINT CLUB

Mississippi State has two players that could join the 1,000-point club this year — Craig Sword and Gavin Ware

Sword, who has missed the first four games due to back surgery before returning against St. Louis, needs just 228 more points after he totaled 437 a year ago.

Ware is now 306 points shy after he totaled 11 against Tulane last Saturday. Last year, he scored 330 points.

#### **10 AND COUNTING**

Against Western Carolina, junior forward Gavin Ware recorded his 10th-career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

He's currently tied for 12th in the SEC in rebounding (6.4) and 14th in scoring (13.4).

#### 400th WIN

On Dec. 1, 1975, the doors of Humphrey Coliseum officially opened with an 85-82 win against Indiana State.

Against Western Carolina in the season opener, MSU collected win No. 400 with the 66-56 victory.

### **RARE TYPE OF WIN**

Usually when MSU has fewer assists than its opponent, it loses. But against Western Carolina, the Bulldogs improved to 3-37 when having fewer assists (7/12).

### WIN THE REBOUNDING BATTLE, WIN THE GAME

A big key to MSU's success this season is rebounding. And when the Bulldogs win the battle of the boards, they are 5-0. In in their two losses, they were out-rebounded each time.

#### **BULLDOGS SIGN THREE**

In mid-November, Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period by inking Quinndary Weatherspoon, Tookie Brown and Joe Strugg.

Brown is a 5-11, 170-pound guard out of Morgan County High School in Madison, Ga., while Strugg is a 6-8, 200-pound forward from G.W. Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala.

Weatherspoon, rated as the No. 2 overall player in Mississippi and 78th nationally, is a 6-4, 175-pound guard out of Velma Jackson. Recently, the Clinton, Miss., native was named to the Clarion Ledger's Dandy Dozen team.

Strugg is the fourth MSU signee out of Carver the last four years, along with Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and Demetrius Houston.

#### HOME LOSING SKID SNAPPED

Not only did Mississippi State open the year on a positive note, it snapped a six-game losing skid at Humphrey Coliseum.

Prior to the Bulldogs' 66-56 win against Western Carolina, their last win at the Hump came on Jan. 22, 2014, against Auburn 82-74. MSU now owns a four-game winning streak at the Hump.

### STAFF CONSISTENCY

For the third-consecutive year, Rick Ray's staff remained intact during the offseason.

Back for their third year at Chris Hollender, George Brooks, Wes Flanigan, Adam Gordon and Adam Bauman.

#### **ANOTHER CLEMSON CONNECTION**

In his first year as a graduate assistant is Tanner Smith, a fouryear player at Clemson when Rick Ray was an assistant and Adam Gordon a graduate assistant.

Smith's duties include assisting with on-court workouts, video scouting, academic monitoring and on-campus recruiting.

He comes to MSU after spending the last two years overseas playing professionally.

At Clemson, Smith appeared in 127 games where he scored 986 points, grabbed 459 rebounds, dished out 320 assists and collected 159 steals en route to playing in three NCAA Tournaments.




# **MSU COACH RICK RAY**

### Head Coach Rick Ray

- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team — Gavin Ware and Craig Sword



- Entering his third season, he is 27-41 in the rebuilding process.
- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament — Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2000, ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger.
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006), while his first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.

Mississippi State's fast start carried the Bulldogs to a 72-51 exhibition victory against Delta State.

Gavin Ware led MSU with 19 points on a 9 of 13 night from the field. Demetrius Houston added 12 points in his Maroon and White debut, while Fallou Ndoye added 11 points in his first live action

MSU held its Division II opponent to one field goal the first eight minutes. During that stretch, Ware was already establishing his presence inside and the Bulldogs were quickly building an 18-2 advantage.

MSU shot 48.1 percent from the floor and led 37-16 at the intermission.

For the contest, MSU hit 26 of 59 shots from the field (44.1 percent), 2 of 8 shots from 3-point range (25.0 percent) and 18 of 24 shots from the foul line (75.0 percent). Delta State hit 17 of 46 shots from the field (37.0 percent), 7 of 17 shots from 3-point range (41.2 percent) and 10 of 18 shots from the foul line (55.6 percent).

MSU held a 38-34 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had 15 assists and 12 turnovers, while the Statesmen had nine assists and 25 turnovers.

Delta State received 25 points from Devin Schmidt and 11 points from Jack Magden.

Mississippi State ushered in its 103th season of basketball Friday by knocking off Western Carolina, 66-56. And in the process, the Bulldogs collected their 400th win at Humphrey Coliseum.

Roquez Johnson paced MSU with 16 points, while Fred Thomas added 15. Gavin Ware recorded his 10th-career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

Five players made their MSU debut, including Maurice Dunlap and Demetrius Houston. who totaled 6 points and 7 rebounds, respectively.

Mississippi State went into the break up 31-30 on a putback by Ware at the buzzer.

The Bulldogs jumped out to the quick 4-0 lead, but the Catamounts hit a couple of 3-pointers to take an 18-15 advantage.

MSU responded, however, when Dunlap drained back-to-back treys to put his team up At the half, the Bulldogs led by nine, 35-26.

Mississippi State opened up the second half with an 8-2 run to extend its lead to 39-32. The Catamounts would cut the Bulldogs lead to five, but a pair of free throws by Thomas and a jumper by Travis Daniels put the Bulldogs up seven at the halfway mark.

MSU pushed its lead to double digits for the first time at 57-47 thanks to a pair of free throws from Johnson. WCU would cut it as close as six in the final moments of the game, but clutch free throw shooting by the Bulldogs would seal the contest.

Fred Thomas scored 17 points on 4-of-7 shooting, with three 3-point baskets as MSU rolled past Mississippi Valley State, 89-68.

MSU shot 59.6 percent from the floor and held a plus-22 rebounding advantage against the smaller MVSU lineup.

Travis Daniels hit a 3-point basket and Fred Thomas followed with back-to-back 3's as MSU quickly built an 11-5 advantage. The lead was stretched to 13 at 21-8 when Thomas hit four free throws on one possession after a flagrant foul.

A layup by Trivante Bloodman ran the lead to 25-8 with 14:35 left in the first half.

MSU shot 69.0 percent in the opening half and led 58-34 at halftime.

The Aggies quickly extended the lead to 41-34 on a 3-pointer by Chris Smith, but the Bulldogs slowly chipped away and went up 42-41 on a 3-pointer by Thomas.

A tough night offensively led to the end of Mississippi State's season-opening win streak in a 61-52 loss to TCU in the championship game of the Corpus Christi Coastal Classic.

Fred Thomas led the Bulldogs with 14 points on 5-of-10 shooting, including a 3-of-6 night from 3-point range. Trivante Bloodman and Gavin Ware were also in double figures with 11 points apiece.

MSU started cold, managing one field goal over the first seven minutes of play. Yet, it erased a 7-2 deficit by scoring the game's next six points. The lead went back and forth several times with the Bulldogs going ahead 19-17 on an I.J. Ready layup with 3:30 left in the half.

TCU held a 37-33 rebounding advantage. The Bulldogs had three assists and 12 turnovers, while the Horned Frogs had 12 assists and 15 turnovers.

Mississippi State fought valiantly but could not make enough shots to win its first true road game of the year, losing 59-54 at Tulane.

The contest was nip-and-tuck throughout with six tied scores and 10 lead changes.

MSU built an early two-point lead at 7-5 on a Fred Thomas 3-pointer. The Bulldogs were again on top at 14-12 and 16-14 on layup attempts by Roquez Johnson. The Bulldogs would continue the strong inside play early to stretch the lead to 22-18 on a jumper by I.J. Ready.

Tulane followed with an 8-2 run to end the half for a 28-26 lead at the intermission.

MSU shot 38.5 percent in the opening half but made only 1-of-7 shots from 3-point range. MSU managed only one field goal over the final 5:04 of the opening half. A similar draught took place early in the second frame as Tulane built a 41-34 lead with 14:16 left in the contest. Two baskets by Gavin Ware were the only MSU field goals over the first six minutes of the second half.

Down 45-38, the Bulldogs turned to defensive pressure to get back in the contest. MSU pieced together an 11-3 run to take a 49-48 lead on a Fred Thomas 3-pointer with 6:06 left.

The lead would change hands a couple of times before Tulane took the lead for good on a Louis Dabney basket at 56-54 with 2:06 left in the game. The Bulldogs had only one field goal over the 5:30 of play.

Travis Daniels led MSU with 13 points and nine rebounds.
