

- ✓ After making 3 of his 5 field goals vs. USC Upstate, Roquez Johnson now leads the SEC in field goal percentage at .600 (48-80).
- ✓ In last two games Roquez Johnson is 11-16 shooting, 13-17 at the foul line and has 16 rebounds.
- the first loss coming last Saturday in Jackson against USC Upstate.
- → MSU's most common Atlantic Sun foe is Jacksonville (3-0).
- ✓ MSU is looking to avoid a six-game losing streak in non-conference play for the first time in school history.
- → The only time MSU dropped five non-conference games in a row was in 1963-64.
- ▼ The Bulldogs are yielding just 30.3 rebounds an outing, the fewest in the SEC.
- ✓ Against USC Upstate, Mississippi State lost for the first time this year when out-rebounding its opponent. It had won all five prior to the setback to the Spartans.
- ✓ Speaking of rebounding, junior forward Gavin Ware is now just two rebounds shy of 500. He sprained his ankle early against USC Upstate and didn't have any rebounds in 5 minutes of play.
- ✓ Mississippi State used the same starting lineup the first eight games of the year but has used different lineups the last two games.
- ✓ Against the Spartans, freshman forward Fallou Ndoye earned his first-career start and responded with a career-best 11 points, while I.J. Ready drew his first start of the season.
- ✓ Senior guard Trivante Bloodman is 15 points shy of 500 for his career. He's also 7th in the SEC with an .846 free throw percentage. As a team, the Bulldogs are fourth in the league at .726.
- Bulldogs are now 16-6 all-time in the venue.

NOTES

SEASON LOW, SEASON HIGH ALL AT SAME TIME

Against Oregon State, Mississippi State managed just 49 points, a season low.

Yet, the Bulldogs attempted a season-high 23 3-pointers, making six. The six made were the second highest this season, with eight versus Utah State being the most.

MAN OF STEAL

In just two seasons, Craig Sword has collected 118 steals, including the 60 he had a year ago.

He needs just 21 more to crack the Top 10 in the MSU record books. Ray White (1976-79) is record holder with 217.

Sword missed the first four games of the year due to back surgery and was limited in the next three before returning to the starting lineup against the Beavers, where he had 8 points, 3 rebounds and a steal. He also had two steals vs. Arkansas State, but none against USC Upstate.

1,000 POINT CLUB

Mississippi State has two players that could join the 1,000-point club this year — Craig Sword and Gavin Ware

Sword, who returned to the starting lineup this past weekend for the first time since back surgery, needs just 217 more points after he totaled 437 a year ago.

Ware is now 296 points shy after he totaled 4 vs. Arkansas St.

10 AND COUNTING

Against Western Carolina, junior forward Gavin Ware recorded his 10th-career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds. He's currently 13th in the SEC in rebounding (6.2).

400th WIN

On Dec. 1, 1975, the doors of Humphrey Coliseum officially opened with an 85-82 win against Indiana State.

Against Western Carolina in the season opener, MSU collected win No. 400 with the 66-56 victory.

RARE TYPE OF WIN

Usually when MSU has fewer assists than its opponent, it loses. But against Western Carolina, the Bulldogs improved to 3-37 under Rick Ray when having fewer assists (7/12).

To date, MSU is 3-42 in that category.

WIN THE REBOUNDING BATTLE, WIN THE GAME

A big key to MSU's success this season is rebounding. And when the Bulldogs win the battle of the boards, they are 5-1, losing for the first time this year against USC Upstate in that category.

In four of the five losses, they were out-rebounded each time.

BULLDOGS SIGN THREE

In mid-November, Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period by inking Quinndary Weatherspoon, Tookie Brown and Joe Strugg.

Brown is a 5-11, 170-pound guard out of Morgan County High School in Madison, Ga., while Strugg is a 6-8, 200-pound forward from G.W. Carver High School in Montgomery, Ala.

Weatherspoon, rated as the No. 2 overall player in Mississippi and 78th nationally, is a 6-4, 175-pound guard out of Velma Jackson. Recently, the Clinton, Miss., native was named to the Clarion Ledger's Dandy Dozen team.

Strugg is the fourth MSU signee out of Carver the last four years, along with Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and Demetrius Houston.

HOME LOSING SKID SNAPPED

Not only did Mississippi State open the year on a positive note, it snapped a six-game losing skid at Humphrey Coliseum.

Prior to the Bulldogs' 66-56 win against Western Carolina, their last win at the Hump came on Jan. 22, 2014, against Auburn 82-74.

Against Arkansas State, it's four-game winning streak was snapped.

STAFF CONSISTENCY

For the third-consecutive year, Rick Ray's staff remained intact during the offseason.

Back for their third year at Chris Hollender, George Brooks, Wes Flanigan, Adam Gordon and Adam Bauman.

ANOTHER CLEMSON CONNECTION

In his first year as a graduate assistant is Tanner Smith, a fouryear player at Clemson when Rick Ray was an assistant...

Smith's duties include assisting with on-court workouts, video scouting, academic monitoring and on-campus recruiting.

He comes to MSU after spending the last two years overseas playing professionally.

At Clemson, Smith appeared in 127 games where he scored 986 points, grabbed 459 rebounds, dished out 320 assists and collected 159 steals en route to playing in three NCAA Tournaments.

SEASON LOW IN FIRST HALF POINTS

■ In the 53-51 loss to USC Upstate in Jackson, Mississippi State managed just 15 points in the first half.

That was the fewest points of any half this season and the least since having 14 vs. Vanderbilt on 2-23-13 in a 72-31 setback.

1 REBOUND SHY OF DOUBLE-DOUBLE

■ Despite the setback to Oregon State, Fred Thomas nearly recorded his first-career double-double against the Beavers.

In 29 minutes, he had 16 points to go along with his career-best 9 rebounds.

Against USC Upstate, Roquez Johnson was also one rebound shy of a double-double as he finished with 15 points and 9 boards.

35 PERCENT TWO IN A ROW

■For the first time this season at Oregon State, Mississippi State shot below 35 percent from the floor

The Bulldogs were 17-49 (.347). The last time they were below 35 percent was last March at Georgia (17-50, .340).

Then against Arkansas State, MSU was 21-65 (.323).

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

■ Although Mississippi State lost in the finals of the Corpus Christi Coastal Classic, Gavin Ware and Fred Thomas were selected to the All-Tournament team.

Thomas averaged 14 points in the two games, while Ware averaged 13.5.

CAREER NIGHT

■ Against St. Louis, Travis Daniels scored a career-high 21 points.

The junior guard drained 8 of his 11 shots and was 4 of 5 beyond the arc.

He also had a career night on the boards at Tulane, hauling in 9.

Only twice this year has he had few than 5 rebounds — Western Carolina (1) and Arkansas State (2).

BLOODMAN ONE OF BEST

■ Senior guard Trivante Bloodman is currently 7th in the SEC at the foul line, making 33 of his 39 attempts (.846).

He's improved his percentage from a year ago at .730. For his career, he's at .741.

D-E-F-E-N-S-E

■ MSU allowed just 46 points versus Clayton State earlier this year. It was the fewest points given up since limiting New Orleans to 46 on Jan. 3, 2013.

On the year, the Bulldogs are fourth in points allowed in the SEC at 58.4.

HIGH STEAL COUNT

■ Also against Clayton State, the Bulldogs collected a season-high 11 steals.

It was the most steals since also having 11 against Auburn on Feb. 15 last year.

LOW ASSISTS COUNT

■ Three times this season, Mississippi State has been credited with fewer 5 or fewer assists.

Against Clayton State, the Bulldogs had just 5. Then against TCU, they were credited with 3. That was the fewest since also having 3 against Missouri on Feb. 13, 2013. Against Arkansas State, they had 4.

CLEANING THE GLASS

■ Against Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 17, Mississippi State easily won the battle of the boards, 47-25.

It was the largest margin since being plus-20 against LSU on Jan. 25, 2012.

NOT A LOT, BUT MAKING THEM COUNT

■ In the season opener against Western Carolina, Mississippi State attempted just 37 field goals, making 17.

That was the fewest attempts since Feb. 12, 2005, when the Bulldogs shot 39 against Vanderbilt.

20 IS HIS NUMBER

■ Against Arkansas State, senior forward Roquez Johnson tied his career high with 20 points.

It was the fourth time the Montgomery, Ala., totaled 20 points, the last coming against Mississippi Valley State in November in a win at Humphrey Coliseum.

ALABAMA FLAVOR

■ A quick glance at Mississippi State's roster reveals one very strong common thread — the state of Alabama.

Player wise, the roster features five players from Alabama — Travis Daniels, Demetrius Houston, Roquez Johnson, Craig Sword and De'Runnya Wilson.

In addition, the coaching staff has two ties in Wes Flanigan and George Brooks.

Flanigan was an All-SEC standout at Auburn from 1993-97, while Brooks is a native of Lafayette. Ala.

7 PLAYERS SEE FIRST-TIME ACTION

■ Five Mississippi State players saw their first action as a Bulldog against Western Carolina — Oliver Black, Travis Daniels, Maurice Dunlap, Demetrius Houston and Fallou Ndoye.

That total tied for the second most in the SEC with Tennessee, while Texas A&M had the most with seven.

Then against Mississippi Valley State, Jeffery Johnson and Isaiah Butler made their collegiate debuts.

BULLDOGS INVITED TO PUERTO RICO

■ On Thursday, MSU learned it will be playing in the 2015 Puerto Rico Classic.

The field of eight also features Butler, Miami, Minnesota, Missouri State, Temple, Texas Tech and Utah.

HUTTON NAMED 2015 SEC LEGEND

■ Doug Hutton has been named the 2015 SEC Legend.

Hutton, a native of Clinton, Miss., played for the Bulldogs from 1961-64 and led MSU to the historic 1963 NCAA Tournament against Loyola-Chicago.

The All-SEC standout was voted team captain his senior year and averaged 14.8 points.

He'll be recognized at the SEC Tournament next March in Nashville.





MSU COACH RICK RAY

Head Coach Rick Ray

- On April 1, 2012, Rick Ray was named the 19th head coach in Mississippi State history.
- In his first season at MSU, produced two players to the SEC All-Freshman team Gavin Ware and Craig



- Entering his third season, he is 29-46 in the rebuilding process.
- On the staff of three different teams that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament — Indiana State, Purdue and Clemson.
- As an assistant at Clemson for two years, the Tigers won 38 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2011.
- During his time at Purdue as an assistant, the Boilermakers won 103 games in four years.
- All four teams at Purdue earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, with the last two advancing to the Sweet 16.
- The 2009 Purdue team won 28 games and the Big 10 Tournament en route to garnering a No. 5 seed.
- The 2007 Purdue recruiting was considered one of the tops in the country, earning national rankings of No. 5 and No. 6 by Scout and Rivals, respectively.
- Ray was an assistant at Indiana State for seven years.
- In 2000 and 2001, the Sycamores won 20plus games and made the NCAA Tournament.
- In 2000, ISU won the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title with a 14-4 ledger.
- In 2001, Indiana State won the MVC Tournament before upsetting Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Ray also spent two seasons at Northern Illinois (2005 and 2006), while his first coaching job was at Nebraska-Omaha.
- Ray and his wife, Breyana, have two sons, Deacon and Mason, and one daughter, Katriece.

Gavin Ware led MSU with 19 points on a 9 of 13 night from the field. Demetrius Houston added 12 points in his Maroon and White debut, while Fallou Ndoye added 11 points in his first live action

MSU held its Division II opponent to one field goal the first eight minutes. During that stretch, Ware was already establishing his presence inside and the Bulldogs were quickly building an 18-2 advantage.

Mississippi State ushered in its 103th season of basketball Friday by knocking off Western Carolina, 66-56. And in the process, the Bulldogs collected their 400th win at Humphrey Coliseum.

Roquez Johnson paced MSU with 16 points, while Fred Thomas added 15. Gavin Ware recorded his 10th-career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

Five players made their MSU debut, including Maurice Dunlap and Demetrius Houston. who totaled 6 points and 7 rebounds, respectively.

Mississippi State went into the break up 31-30 on a putback by Ware at the buzzer.

The Bulldogs jumped out to the quick 4-0 lead, but the Catamounts hit a couple of 3-pointers to take an 18-15 advantage.

MSU responded, however, when Dunlap drained back-to-back treys to put his team up At the half, the Bulldogs led by nine, 35-26.

Mississippi State opened up the second half with an 8-2 run to extend its lead to 39-32. The Catamounts would cut the Bulldogs lead to five, but a pair of free throws by Thomas and a jumper by Travis Daniels put the Bulldogs up seven at the halfway mark.

MSU pushed its lead to double digits for the first time at 57-47 thanks to a pair of free throws from Johnson. WCU would cut it as close as six in the final moments of the game, but clutch free throw shooting by the Bulldogs would seal the contest.
