#### MSU HOSTS MIZZOU TO CLOSE OUT REGULAR-SEASON, NON-SEC HOME SLATE

MSU HOSTS MIZZOU TO CLOSE OUT REGULAR-SEASON, NON-SEC HOME SLATE

Closing out their regular-season, non-conference home slate, the Bulldogs of Mississippi State (7-5) draw the curtains on the 2007 calendar year by playing host to the Missouri Tigers (9-4) in a key SEC-Big 12 match-up Sunday afternoon on the MSU campus. Tip-off for the third all-time series meeting between the two teams is set for 12:30 p.m. CT at Humphrey Coliseum, and the game will be regionally televised live by SportSouth and Metro Sports out of Kansas City.

Looking for their first three-game winning streak of the current campaign, coach Rick Stansbury's Bulldogs are 7-5 on the season after completing a 2-1, week-long road swing with convincing road triumphs over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (95-70 on Dec. 21) and Loyola Marymount (85-54 on Dec. 19) prior to the start of the Christmas break. With Stansbury having surpassed his former mentor Richard Williams as the school's all-time winningest hoops coach last week in Corpus Christi, MState is 4-2 this December. Upon opening the current month with home wins over Murray State (78-61) and Southeastern Louisiana (84-59), the Bulldogs then fell at home to now-No. 19 Miami, Fla. (64-58) and at South Alabama (71-67) prior to their current two-game win string. Individually, MSU continues to be powered by the veteran all-SEC tandem of Jamont Gordon and Charles Rhodes. Ranked as the league's sixth-leading scorer at 17.5 points per game, Gordon has five 20-point outings on the year, including a pair of 25-point efforts. Standing 11th in the SEC in scoring (15.6 ppg) and tied for 10th in rebounding (7.3 rpg), Rhodes owns a current streak of two straight double-doubles with a season-high 26 points and 10 rebounds most recently against Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and a 14-point, 10-rebound outing versus Loyola Marymount.

Guided by second-year head coach Mike Anderson, the Missouri Tigers are 9-4 on the season after claiming a 72-38 home victory over Coppin State this past Thursday. Mizzou's four losses this se

- With a trio of two-game winning streaks and a pair of two-game losing skids thus far on the year, the Bulldogs are looking for their first threegame win string of the 2007-08 campaign.
- Having recorded double-doubles in each of his last two outings, senior all-SEC forward Charles Rhodes is bidding to become the first Bulldog player since Dietric Slater (in 2005-06) to post three consecutive double-doubles.
- In their recent pre-Christmas road wins over Loyola Marymount (85-54) and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (95-70), the Bulldogs shot a collective 54.5 percent from the field (66-121 FGs),
- along with compiling a 90-61 rebounding advantage and a +28.0 ppg scoring margin over LMU and TAMUCC.
- The Bulldogs have been credited with 10 or more steals in four of their last six contests, including a season-most 14 swipes at Loyola Marymount and 13 steals the game prior at South Alabama on Dec. 19 and 15, respectively..
- Five blocks away from reaching the century mark as a team for the season, MState has been credited with 10 or more blocks four times this season, including a season-most dozen rejects against both Loyola Marymount and Miami, Fla.

#### MSTATE LOOKS TO GAIN SPLIT IN HOME AND HOME SERIES WITH MISSOURI

Set for their first-ever basketball appearance in Starkville, the Missouri Tigers have prevailed in both previous hardwood meetings with Mississippi State through the years. With both prior contests having been held in Columbia, Mo., Mizzou most recently claimed an 83-75 home triumph over MState a year ago (Jan. 2, 2007) at Mizzou Arena. With the Tigers maintaining a 42-32 rebounding advantage and MSU hampered by 24 turnovers in the contest, **Stefhon Hannah** and **Matt Lawrence** paced MU with 27 and 17 points, respectively, while the visiting Bulldogs were led in scoring by **Reginald Delk** (16 points) and **Jamont Gordon** (15).

In the initial head-to-head hardwood meeting more than 30 years ago (Dec. 7, 1974 in Columbia, Mo.) at the Hearnes Center, coach **Kermit Davis**' Bulldog club dropped a 102-78 decision to coach **Norm Stewart**'s Tiger team in the championship game of the Missouri-hosted 1974 Show-Me Classic. Having claimed an 89-87 first-round tourney win over Connecticut the day prior, MSU was led by all-tournament team member **Jerry Jenkins**' 17 points in the title game. The Tigers posted an 89-71 opening-round victory over Portland to advance to the championship contest. Mississippi State's contingent concluded the 1974-75 campaign with a 9-17 overall record and 5-13 SEC mark to finish eighth in the league standings, while the 1974-75 Missouri ballclub went 18-9 overall and placed third in the Big Eight Conference with a 9-5 mark.

#### **BULLDOGS OWN 15-10 COMPOSITE MARK VERSUS CURRENT BIG 12 FOES**

Through the years, MSU has compiled a 15-10 composite record against the 12 member institutions that currently comprise the Big 12 Conference. A year ago (Jan. 2, 2007 in Columbia, Mo.), coach **Rick Stansbury**'s Bulldogs dropped an 83-75 decision at Missouri to close out their regular-season, non-conference schedule with a 9-4 non-SEC mark.

Prior to this home and home series with Missouri, Stansbury's then-16th ranked Bulldogs previously earned a 54-45 victory over the then-No. 5 Oklahoma Sooners during the 2002 Nokia Sugar Bowl Classic played at the New Orleans Arena. Also during the Stansbury era, MSU is winless in two attempts versus the Texas Longhorns, falling by a 68-64 tally in the second round of the 2002 NCAA Midwest Regional played in Dallas and also dropping an 81-77 decision to Texas during opening-round action of the 1998 Outrigger Hotels Rainbow Classic held in Honolulu, Hawai'i.

#### STANSBURY'S DOGS BID TO MAINTAIN DECEMBER AND HOME EXCELLENCE

Under **Rick Stansbury**'s guidance, Mississippi State owns an overall record of 60-12 (.833) in games played during the month of December since the 1998-99 campaign, including a 30-2 (.938) mark in December home games. The Bulldogs' previous 23-game winning streak in December home outings was snapped earlier this month (Dec. 13) when the now-No. 19 Miami Hurricanes came away from Humphrey Coliseum with a 64-58 road triumph. Prior to this season, MState's only other previous December home setback since Stansbury took over State's head coaching duties in 1998 was an 83-72 home loss to Richmond on Dec. 2, 2000. Dating back to the 2000-01 season, the Bulldogs own a 50-7 (.877) composite record in overall December contests.

The Bulldogs have now compiled a composite 10-year record of 114-27 (.809) at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 53-19 (.736) SEC mark and 61-8 (.884) home record versus non-SEC competition. Dating back to the start of the 2001-02 campaign, MState is collectively 79-17 (.823) at Humphrey Coliseum, which includes a 37-11 (.771) home mark versus SEC opponents and a 42-6 (.875) home record against non-SEC foes.

The team's 84-82 home loss to now-No. 20 Clemson earlier this season (Nov. 15) snapped MSU's eight-game home winning streak that had dated back to this past February and had included four SEC wins and MasterCard NIT victories over Mississippi Valley State, Bradley and Florida State. Prior to this season's setback to Clemson, MState's last home defeat was a 66-63 loss to South Carolina at Humphrey Coliseum on Jan. 27, 2007. Prior to last month's Clemson contest, the Bulldogs' most recent non-conference home loss came a year ago against NCAA Tournament entry Winthrop (74-63) on Nov. 18.

In addition, the Bulldogs of Mississippi State have compiled an impressive 108-32 (.771) composite record against non-conference opponents during the Stansbury era (since 1998-99), including a 100-25 (.800) regular-season mark versus non-league foes.

#### THE LAST MEETING...

#### MISSOURI 83, MSU 75 Jan. 2, 2007 • COLUMBIA, MO

Concluding a two-game, six-day holiday road trip a year ago, the Bulldogs dropped an 83-75 decision to the Missouri Tigers at Mizzou Arena to complete their non-conference, regular-season schedule.

MSU (9-4) initially ran into a buzz saw, as the homestanding Tigers (11-2) scored the game's first 13 points to race to a 13-0 lead by the 17:14 mark. The visitors weathered the storm and regrouped to score 13 unanswered points of their own to knot the score at 13-13 two minutes later. Following the pair of runs, the two teams settled down to tie four more times before Missouri native Ben Hansbrough's 3-pointer at the 5:43 mark capped a 12-2 MSU run to put the Bulldogs on top, 37-27.

However, State would not score the rest of

However, State would not score the rest of the period, as six turnovers and four missed field goals contributed to Missouri's streak of 16 unanswered points over the final 5:43 of the opening half. Aided by MSU's 16 first-half turnovers, the Tigers held a 43-37 halftime advantage on the strength of 30 combined points by Stefhon Hannah (17) and Matt

Lawrence (13).

Mizzou maintained the lead for the duration of the second stanza, though the Bulldogs cut the deficit to a single point (60-59) following a Reginald Delk 3-pointer at the 9:37 mark. The Tigers responded by scoring nine unanswered points, capped by back-to-back treys by Hannah, to put the home team ahead by 10 points (69-59) with 7:44 remaining in the game. Late in the contest, Hannah's consecutive driving jumpers increased the margin to 13 points (83-70) before MU went on to claim its 18th straight home victory against non-conference opposition with the eight-point win.

With the Tigers also maintaining an advan-

tage on the boards (42-32), Hannah and Matt Lawrence led all scorers with 27 and 17 points, respectively. Victimized by 24 turnovers on the night, State was led by Reginald Delk and Jamont Gordon with 16 and 15 points, respec-

#### **BULLDOG NOTEBOOK**

#### MSTATE POSTS CONVINCING ROAD TRIUMPHS

After letting a 13-point, second-half lead slip away in a 71-67 setback at South Alabama two weeks ago, MSU responded by posting convincing road triumphs over Loyola Marymount (85-54) and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (95-70) prior to the Christmas break... The 31-point victory at LMU marked MState's largest victory margin on an opponent's home floor since 1962-63... The Bulldogs also shot a season-best 58.6 percent from the field against LMU, while scoring a season-high 95 points (50.8% FGs) in their next outing at TAMUCC... In the team's two most recent outings (LMU & TAMUCC) prior to the break, MSU averaged 90 points on collective 54.5 percent (66-121 FGs) fieldgoal shooting, while outscoring the opposition by an average margin of 28 points per game and owning a composite 90-61 rebounding advantage.

#### MSU COMES OFF THREE STRAIGHT ROAD GAMES

The Bulldogs will play at home for the first time since Dec. 13 (64-58 loss to Miami, Fla.) when they play host to Missouri on Sunday... MState is coming off a 2-1, week-long road trip in which coach Rick Stansbury's squad rebounded from a 71-67 setback at South Alabama on Dec. 15 with convincing road triumphs over Loyola Marymount (85-54) and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (95-70) on Dec. 19 and 21, respectively... The last time MState played three straight 'true' road games was last season when the Bulldogs fell at both George Mason and Missouri in non-conference play just after Christmas before dropping a 92-84 decision at Tennessee in their SEC opener... The last time an MSU club played three consecutive 'true' non-conference road games was the 2003-04 campaign when the 'Road Warriors' won at Santa Clara, Tulane and Arkansas-Little Rock during a two-week span around the holidays en route to posting a perfect 12-0 road record (8-0 in SEC play) and claiming the school's first outright SEC regular-season title since 1962-63 with records of 26-4 overall and 14-2 in league play.

#### MSTATE AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN BLOCKS

With 95 blocked shots as a team through the first dozen games of the campaign (7.92 bpg), the Bulldogs rank second in the SEC (behind LSU; 8.18 bpg) in blocks and were ranked fifth nationally through games of Dec. 16 (the NCAA's next official update will be Jan. 4)... MSU has reached double digits in blocks four times this season, including a dozen rejects against both Loyola Marymount and Miami, Fla., along with 10 swats versus both Louisiana Tech and Clemson... A year ago with 222 blocks as a team in 35 games, the Bulldogs topped the SEC and ranked eighth nationally in blocks (6.34 bpg), while also shattering the previous single-season school standard of 175 rejects set by the Erick Dampier-led 1995-96 Final Four squad.

#### MSTATE TOPS SEC WEST IN WINS SINCE 1998-99

Since 10th-year head coach Rick Stansbury took over Mississippi State's basketball coaching duties from Richard Williams in 1998, the Bulldogs rate as the winningest SEC Western Division team and the third-winningest hoops program overall in the league behind perennial SEC Eastern Division front-runners Florida and Kentucky... Over the last 10 seasons, MSU's composite record of 192-109 ranks behind only two-time defending NCAA champion Florida (245-73) and Kentucky (233-84)... In addition during the past seven seasons combined (140-67 composite record), the Bulldogs rank tied for 31st (with Winthrop) nationally (and third among SEC teams behind Florida and Kentucky) among the winningest NCAA Division I men's basketball programs dating back to the 2001-02 season, according to STATS, Inc., out of Chicago.

#### **BULLDOGS HAVING DIFFICULTY CLOSING GAMES**

In four of their five setbacks on the season, the Bulldogs have let late second-half leads slip away... Most recently at South Alabama on Dec. 15, MSU held a nine-point lead (58-49) with 6:45 remaining in the game, as well as owning a 13-point cushion (57-44) midway through the second half, before being outscored, 27-10, over the final 10:25 of the game in dropping a 71-67 road decision to the Jaguars... Earlier this month at home against the now-No. 19 Miami Hurricanes, MState held a five-point lead (56-51) with 3:36 remaining before all-ACC guard Jack McClinton helped ignite UM on a 13-2 run to close the game and come away with a 64-58 road victory... Last month during the third-place game of the inaugural Anaheim Classic, the Bulldogs owned a six-point lead (53-47) with 7:06

left in the contest before being outscored, 20-7, over the final seven minutes in a 67-60 setback to the RedHawks... MSU also held a lead (71-70) over the now-No. 20 Clemson Tigers as late as the 2:23 mark prior to falling by a basket (84-82) during the team's second game of the season (Nov. 15 in Starkville).

#### **BULLDOGS HAVE FOUR SINGLE-DIGIT SETBACKS**

Mississippi State's five losses on the season have come by a combined total of just 33 points or 6.6 points per setback... Four of the team's five losses on the year have been by single digits, including setbacks by two points (Clemson; 84-82), four points (71-67 at South Alabama), six points (64-58 to Miami of Florida), and seven points (67-60 to Miami of Ohio)... Additionally, three of the Bulldogs' five losses have come to opponents that are either ranked currently (No. 20 Clemson & No. 19 Miami, Fla.) or were ranked at the time of the meeting with MSU (then-No. 18 Southern Illinois).

#### STANSBURY SEEKS TO JOIN 200-VICTORY CLUB

Having most recently surpassed his former mentor Richard Williams as Mississippi State's all-time winningest basketball coach with the Bulldogs' 95-70 road win over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 21, 10th-year MSU head coach Rick Stansbury (192-109) now seeks to become the 20th all-time member of the SEC's 200-win club... With 192 career wins to his credit, Stansbury is being closely chased by LSU's John Brady (191 career wins as an SEC head coach) and Mark Gottfried of Alabama (190 wins) in the race to 200 career victories as a head coach of an SEC school.

#### GORDON BOUNCES BACK TO SET SEASON HIGHS

Bouncing back from a season-low, seven-point effort (1-14 FGs & 0-6 treys) at South Alabama on Dec. 15, junior all-America candidate Jamont Gordon matched his season high with 25 points, including a career-most five 3-pointers, and also handed out a season-high seven assists in MSU's 31-point victory at Loyola Marymount on Dec. 19... Tied for third in the SEC with five 20-point efforts on the season (16 for his career), the Nashville native has now scored in double figures in 68 of 77 career MState contests... Currently standing in 19th place on MSU's all-time scoring list with 1,184 career points, Gordon needs 16 points to surpass Mario Austin (1,199 points) and move into 18th place... In addition, Gordon ranks fifth on the school's all-time chart with 368 career assists... The two-time all-SEC standout owns 11 career doubles (23 pts & 12 rebs vs. Clemson this year), including a rare triple-double last year at home against Vanderbilt (15 pts, 12 rebs & 10 asts).

#### RHODES ON CURRENT DOUBLE-DOUBLE STRING

All-SEC senior forward Charles Rhodes ranks tied for second in the SEC with four double-doubles on the season (now has 10 for his career) after posting double-double efforts in each of his last two outings... After totalling 14 points and 10 rebounds at Loyola Marymount, he most recently scored a season-high 26 points and added 10 boards at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi... Rhodes previously recorded consecutive double-doubles during his sophomore season with 21 points and 11 rebounds versus Kentucky followed by 21 points and a career-high 19 boards against Auburn... This season, Rhodes also posted double-doubles against both UC Irvine (11 pts/11 rebs) and Miami, Ohio (25/10) during last month's inaugural Anaheim Classic... He is bidding to become the first Bulldog player since Dietric Slater (in 2005-06) to post three straight double-doubles... The Jackson native currently stands in 26th place on MSU's all-time scoring chart with 1,100 career points and needs 23 points to move up three more notches and into a 23rd-place tie with Greg Carter... Rhodes also presently stands tied for sixth place (with Wiley Peck) on the school's all-time list with 117 career blocks, along with standing 10th in career field-goal percentage (.559).

#### MSU TO PLAY IN JACKSON NEXT SATURDAY

The Bulldogs will close out their regular-season, non-conference hoops slate next Saturday (Jan. 5) by taking on Pennsylvania-based Lafayette College at Jackson's Mississippi Coliseum... This season will mark the fourth consecutive year, and the sixth time since 1998-99, that the Bulldogs will have played a basketball game in Mississippi's capital city during the 10 seasons in which Rick Stansbury has been at the State coaching helm... A year ago (Dec. 21) in Jackson, MState claimed an 89-63 victory over the University of New Orleans.

#### MSU 95, A&M-Corpus Christi 70 Dec. 21, 2007 • Corpus Christi, TX

The Bulldogs concluded their week-long, three-game road swing and closed out their pre-Christmas slate by registering a 95-70 victory over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi at the American Bank Center.

With the visitors coasting to the 25-point road triumph, MSU head coach Rick Stansbury passed his former mentor Richard Williams for sole possession of first place on the school's all-time list with 192 career coaching victories.

A hot-shooting A&M-Corpus Christi club (2-7) bolted to an early six-point lead (15-9) six minutes into the contest, before MState (7-5) went on an 11-2 run over the next four minutes to take a three-point lead (20-17) midway through the opening period. Following a third and fourth tie of the half, MSU's Phil Turner supplied instant offense off the Bulldog bench by scoring 11 straight points for the visitors to give them a six-point advantage (31-25) by the 8:20 mark. Jamont Gordon sank a pair of free throws with no time remaining on the game clock to put the Bulldogs up by 11 points (51-40) at the intermission.

MState maintained its offensive efficiency and picked up its defensive intensity in the second stanza. Hitting 52 percent from the field, while holding the Islanders to just 29 percent shooting during the closing period, the Bulldogs didn't let up in the second half. After stretching the margin to as many as 28 points, MSU headed home for Christmas with the 25-point win.

Charles Rhodes recorded his second straight double-double and fourth of the year with gamehigh totals of 26 points and 10 rebounds for the winners. Barry Stewart added 19 points on 6-of-8 shooting for the Bulldogs. Kevin Perkins led Texas A&M-Corpus Christi with 19 points.

#### GAME #1 RECAP

#### MSU 75, LOUISIANA TECH 45 Nov. 10, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs tipped off their 96th season of collegiate basketball competition by cruising to a 75-45 home triumph over Louisiana Tech at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

With MSU (1-0) trailing by four points (10-6) eight minutes into the contest, Charles Rhodes' back-to-back dunks helped spark the Bulldogs on a 24-4 run over the final nine minutes of the opening half to give the home team a comfortable 30-14 halftime advantage. The sluggish first half of play saw MState shoot just 32 percent from the field, while Louisiana Tech (0-1) struggled at 22 percent field-goal shooting.

The homestanding Bulldogs continued to remain in control during the second stanza, building a 20-point lead (37-17) by the 16:31 mark. With the visitors getting no close than 18 points (49-31 with 12:21 left) the rest of the way, the cushion increased to 30 points (61-31) by the 7:26 mark and ballooned to as many as 36 points (75-39) before MSU settled for the 30-point triumph. Five years ago in the last meeting between the two teams, MState pounded out an equally convincing 78-38 home victory over LTU.

While moving to 9-1 in season home openers during the Rick Stansbury era, the Bulldogs extended their home winning streak to eight consecutive games dating back to this past February. During that stretch, MSU's average margin of victory has been 20.1 points per home triumph.

Jamont Gordon paced four double-figure State scorers with a game-high 21 points. Charles Rhodes followed with 17 points, while Barry Stewart notched his first career double-double with 13 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. Kyle Gibson topped the visitors with his own double-double of 15 points and 15 boards.

#### GAME #2 RECAP

#### CLEMSON 84, MSU 82 Nov. 15, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

The Bulldogs had their eight-game home winning streak snapped by dropping a hard-fought 84-82 home decision to reigning NIT runner-up Clemson at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

The visiting Tigers (2-0) led for most of the opening 20 minutes of play. Following a second tie (13-13) nine minutes into the contest, Clemson scored eight unanswered points to take an eightpoint lead (21-13) with 9:18 remaining in the half. The Bulldogs (1-1) would cut the deficit to two points (23-21) two minutes later, but Clemson responded with a dunk and a 3-pointer to reestablish control of the game and go on to take a 39-32 halftime advantage.

The visitors continued to maintain the lead for the opening 11 minutes of the second stanza, before MSU went on a 9-0 run midway through the half to take a 54-52 lead on a Charles Rhodes dunk at the 8:17 mark. Seven lead changes and two ties ensued over the next four minutes.

Back-to-back dunks by Brian Johnson gave MState its final lead (71-70) with 2:23 left in the contest. A 3-pointer by Clemson's K.C. Rivers at the 1:11 mark was answered by a Barry Stewart trey with 43 seconds left to cut MSU's deficit to two points (78-76). However, Tiger freshman guard Demontez Stitt sealed the two-point Clemson victory with 6-of-6 free-throw shooting over the final 26 seconds.

Though Clemson struggled with 34-percent shooting from the field, State did not help its own cause with just 61-percent accuracy from the line.

Jamont Gordon led all scorers with 23 points and added a dozen rebounds to record his 11th career double-double for the Bulldogs. Rhodes tossed in 17 points despite first-half foul trouble. Rivers and freshman Terrence Oglesby paced the winners with 17 points each, while all-America candidate James Mays totaled 14 points, 11 rebounds and four assists.

MState (2-1) scored the first dozen points of the contest before UT Martin's Lester Hudson gave the visiting Skyhawks (2-3) their first points of the game with a 3-pointer at the 15:34 mark of the opening period. UTM cut the deficit to four points (12-8) soon thereafter and kept the contest to within single digits until the 5:34 mark when Ben Hansbrough connected on a 3-pointer to give MSU an 11-point lead (32-21).

The Bulldogs increased their lead to 16 points (39-23) with 3:03 left in the half before settling for a 41-30 halftime advantage. State's Charles Rhodes tallied 15 first-half points on 7-of-8 shooting to lead the way for the home team.

MSU maintained its double-figure lead throughout the second stanza, stretching the comfortable margin to as many as 27 points over the final minutes before coming away with the 16-point triumph.

The Bulldogs shot 55 percent from the field for the game, including 10-of-22 (46%) treys. In the second half, MSU picked up the pace in shooting 65 percent (17-26 FGs) overall and connecting on 5-of-9 second-half trey attempts. Defensively, MState limited the Skyhawks to just 32-percent field-goal shooting and had nine blocked shots for the contest.

Hansbrough paced four double-digit State scorers with 20 points on 4-of-6 triples. Hudson and Marquis Weddle led the visitors with 27 and 24 points, respectively.

#### MSU 68, UC IRVINE 53 Nov. 22, 2007 • ANAHEIM, CA ANAHEIM CLASSIC • FIRST ROUND

In their first road competition of the season, the Bulldogs opened the inaugural Anaheim Classic with a 68-53 victory over UC Irvine at the Anaheim Convention Center.

Opening the contest hitting eight of their first nine shots from the field, including their first five three-point shot attempts, the Bulldogs (3-1) mounted a double-digit lead (19-9) by the 13:11 mark on a Phil Turner trey. MSU pretty much controlled the opening 20 minutes of play with its continued hot shooting, though UC Irvine (2-2) managed to cut the deficit to five points (39-34) with under a minute left in the half.

Hitting 58 percent (15-26 FGs) from the field, including 6-of-9 treys (67%) in the opening period, the Bulldogs settled for a 41-34 halftime lead.

After the Anteaters pulled to within five points on two occasions during the first four minutes of the second stanza, MSU ran off 10 unanswered points over a three-minute span to take a 15-point advantage (55-40) by the 12:53 mark. The Bulldogs also stepped up their defensive intensity in the closing period to re-establish control of the contest.

Limiting UCI to just six second-half field goals on 24 attempts (25%) and owning a commanding 27-16 rebounding advantage during the final 20 minutes, the Bulldogs went on to claim their 15-point triumph and earn the right to face 18th-ranked Southern Illinois in the semifinals.

As a team, MState held UCI to 35-percent shooting from the field (only 3-17 treys) on the day, while owning a 43-31 lead on the boards.

Barry Stewart paced four double-digit State scorers with 18 points (4-7 treys). Jamont Gordon added 15 points, while Charles Rhodes notched his seventh career double-double with 11 points and 11 rebounds. Patrick Sanders led UC Irvine with 18 points and five rebounds.

The Bulldogs dropped a 63-49 decision to 18th-ranked Southern Illinois in the semifinals of the inaugural Anaheim Classic played at the Anaheim Convention Center.

In a first half that featured five ties and three lead changes, MState (3-2) owned the upper hand for the first 10 minutes of the opening period. Midway through the half, the Salukis (3-0) scored six unanswered points to take a brief 19-15 lead. MSU countered with eight straight points to pull ahead by four points (23-19) with 3:28 remaining in the half. En route to scoring 15 first-half points, Jamont Gordon's third 3-pointer of the half put the Bulldogs on top by five points (26-21) with just under three minutes left before the half.

However, Joshua Bone came off the SIU bench to drill a trio of treys over the final 1:46, including one with time running out in the period, to give the Salukis a 32-28 halftime advantage.

Southern Illinois maintained its momentum by scoring the first half-dozen points of the second stanza to increase the margin to double figures (38-28) two minutes into the half. The Bulldogs went 1-2 in the inaugural Anaheim Classic after dropping a 67-60 decision to Miami University in the tournament's third-place game played at the Anaheim Convention Center.

After MSU's Charles Rhodes scored the game's first two points, the RedHawks (3-1) went on a 14-3 run, keyed by a pair of 3-pointers apiece by Michael Bramos and Alex Moosmann, to take a 14-5 lead by the 15:38 mark of the opening half. Spurred by 5-of-9 three-point shooting during the first 20 minutes of play, Miami maintained control of the contest throughout the first period. The Bulldogs broke a two-game losing streak and successfully tipped off a three-game December homestand by posting a 78-61 home triumph over Murray State at Humphrey Coliseum.

Coming off consecutive losses to No. 18 Southern Illinois and Miami of Ohio during the Anaheim Classic over the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, MState (4-3) built a 39-24 halftime advantage on the strength of 58-percent shooting through the opening 20 minutes of play. The visiting Racers (3-2) were limited to 32-percent first-half accuracy from the field.

After the visitors cut the deficit to single digits (47-38) three minutes into the second stanza, MSU went on a 17-4 run to increase the margin to a game-high 22 points (64-42) midway through the closing period. #### GAME #8 RECAP

#### MSU 84, SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA 59 DEC. 8, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

In the midst of final exams within a threegame homestand, the Bulldogs claimed an 84-59 victory over Southeastern Louisiana at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

Well rested after having a week off from game competition, MState (5-3) built a double-digit lead over the visiting Lions (5-3) by the 11:41 mark of the opening period on a Barry Stewart 3-pointer. In limiting Southeastern to 37-percent shooting and owning a 22-13 advantage on the boards through the first 20 minutes of play, the Bulldogs maintained their double-figure cushion throughout the remainder of the half en route to opening up a comfortable 41-27 halftime lead.

SLU did manage to cut the deficit to single digits (48-39) five minutes into the second stanza, before Charles Rhodes helped MSU reclaim the momentum by scoring four of his 12 second-half points over the next minute to increase the margin back up to 13 points with 14:09 left. The Lions would not get any closer than 11 points the rest of the way, as MState went up by 20 points with 7:11 left and eventually built a 27-point cushion before settling for the 25-point triumph.

For the contest, the Bulldogs benefitted from a 39-24 rebounding advantage, while holding Southeastern Louisiana to just 1-of-11 shooting from beyond the arc. The win marked MSU's 23rd straight December home victory.

MSU's Jamont Gordon registered his fourth 20-point effort of the season with a game-high 25 points, while Rhodes finished with 16 points on 7-of-8 accuracy from the field. Both players also added a game-best seven rebounds apiece. Patrick Sullivan paced the visitors with 16 points on 6-of-8 field goals and 4-of-4 free throws.

#### GAME #9 RECAP

#### MIAMI (FL) 64, MSU 58 DEC. 13, 2007 • STARKVILLE, MS

In closing out a three-game homestand, the Bulldogs had their 23-game winning streak in December home contests snapped by dropping a 64-58 decision to the unbeaten Miami Hurricanes at MSU's Humphrey Coliseum.

The visitors held the upper hand for the better part of the opening 15 minutes of the contest, going on top by as many as seven points on two different occasions. However, MState (5-4) went on a 10-2 run late in the half to take a five-point lead (28-23) with 1:23 remaining. Miami (9-0) responded by scoring the final two baskets of the period to cut the deficit to a single point (28-27) by the break.

Following six lead changes and two ties through the first six minutes of the second stanza, the Bulldogs reclaimed the lead at the 14:29 mark on a Jamont Gordon layup. MSU maintained the advantage for nearly the next dozen minutes and held a five-point lead (56-51) when Barry Stewart nailed his fifth 3-pointer of the night at the 5:29 mark. Despite State's two subsequent turnovers over the next two minutes of scoreless basketball, Charles Rhodes stepped to the line for a one-and-one opportunity with 3:36 left and failed to lengthen MSU's margin.

Instead, UM's Jack McClinton sandwiched his second and third 3-pointers over a two-minute stretch around a pair of Rhodes free throws to give the Hurricanes a two-point lead (60-58) with 1:26 remaining. After Dwayne Collins' two charity tosses gave Miami a four-point lead, Gordon couldn't convert on the front end of his one-and-one with 29 seconds left. Scoring 11 of his gamehigh 29 points (20 in the second half) over the game's final 3:22, McClinton sealed Miami's six-point road victory with a pair of free throws.

McClinton was the only Hurricane in double figures on the night, while Gordon and Stewart paced MSU with 18 points apiece. Gordon also added a game-best nine rebounds and five assists, while State's Jarvis Varnado established a new single-game school standard with 10 blocks.

#### SOUTH ALABAMA 71, MSU 67 DEC. 15, 2007 • MOBILE, AL COORS CLASSIC

The visiting Bulldogs tipped off a week-long, road trip by letting a 13-point, second-half lead evaporate in dropping a 71-67 decision to South Alabama at the Mitchell Center in the nightcap of the ninth annual Coors Classic.

In a tightly contested opening 20 minutes of play, MState (5-5) held the advantage for the better part of the first half. However, South Alabama's Demetric Bennett put on a first-half clinic by scoring his team's first 20 points en route to a 25-point opening period. Despite his tremendous one-man performance, MSU still clung to a precarious two-point halftime lead (32-30).

After the two teams battled to within a three-point game for the opening five minutes of the second stanza, the Bulldogs seemed to take total control of the contest by going on a 17-6 run to build a 13-point advantage (57-44) midway through the half following a Phil Turner trey. However, back-to-back MSU miscues resulted in five quick points by the Jaguars (7-3) to cut the deficit to eight points in less than a minute.

Following a three-minute scoring drought by both teams, South Alabama continued its amazing comeback by going on a 13-0 run which turned a nine-point State lead (58-49) into a four-point USA advantage (62-58) by the 3:59 mark Ben Hansbrough temporarily kept the Bulldogs from completely wilting by scoring MSU's next eight points, including a pair of 3-pointers.

After a Jamont Gordon free throw tied the game at 67-67 with 43 seconds left, the Jaguars' Ronald Douglas tipped in a Bennett miss. Gordon then came down and missed a layup, while Charles Rhodes couldn't convert on either free throw after getting fouled on the offensive rebound. Appropriately enough, Bennett sealed the USA victory with a pair of charity tosses.

Bennett stole the show with his phenomenal 39-point explosion, hitting a sizzling 14-of-17 shots from the field including all six three-point attempts, for the winners. Making his first collegiate start, Turner paced MState with 17 points.

In the midst of a week-long, three-game road swing, the Bulldogs claimed an 85-54 victory over Loyola Marymount at Gersten Pavilion.

After jumping out to a 14-5 lead six minutes into the game and building a double-digit advantage (21-10) by the 11:50 mark, MState (6-5) outscored the Lions (3-9), 12-2, over the final four minutes of the half to take a 40-22 halftime lead. Bouncing back from a season-low, seven-point effort (1-14 FGs) in his previous game at South Alabama, Jamont Gordon scored MSU's last 10 points of the opening period en route to a 15-point first half (5-6 FGs & 3-3 treys).

The MSU cushion reached 22 points (47-25) less than two minutes into the second stanza on another Gordon triple. The margin ballooned to 31 points (60-29) by the 15:21 mark and never dipped below 25 points the rest of the way. The Bulldogs shot 67 percent from the field in the second half en route to a season-best, 59-percent performance (34-58 FGs) for the contest.

In recording the team's largest winning margin on an opponent's home floor since the 1962-63 season (99-64 at LSU), MState also set singlegame season highs for scoring margin (+31), field goals made (34), assists (25), blocks (12-tied) and steals (14). Defensively, MSU limited LMU to just 33-percent field goal shooting for the game and held a 46-32 advantage on the boards.

With four Bulldogs scoring in double figures, Gordon led the way with a game-high 25 points on 9-of-14 field goals and 5-of-7 treys. #### MISSISSIPPI STATE HEAD BASKETBALL COACH RICK STANSBURY

Now in his 10th season as head coach of the Mississippi State Bulldogs, Rick Stansbury surpassed his former mentor Richard Williams to become the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history with MSU's 95-70 road victory over Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on Dec. 21. Stansbury previously spent eight seasons on Williams' State staff prior to being named his successor in 1998.

In his 19th season overall with the MSU hoops program, Stansbury has now been associated with 11 postseason tournament teams (7 NCAA & 4 NIT), two SEC Tournament title clubs and six regular-season league/divisional championship squads. With a 10-year head coaching record of 192-109 (.638), Stansbury presently ranks 18th among the all-time winningest SEC men's basketball coaches by percentage as well as standing 21st all-time in the league by victories.

During his 10 seasons at the Mississippi State helm, Stansbury has doubled the school's all-time postseason tournament appearances from seven to 14 with four consecutive NCAA Tourna-ment berths (2002-05) along with last year's third NIT showing (2007, '01 & '99). With six 20-win seasons under Stansbury's guidance, MSU has also claimed an overall SEC championship (2004), three SEC West crowns (2007, '04 & '03) and an SEC Tournament title (2002) over the past six seasons.

With his 2006-07 MSU team securing the school's seventh postseason tournament appearance (4 NCAA & 3 NIT) in his first nine seasons at the State helm, Stansbury most recently guided the 21-14 Bulldogs to a berth in last year's NIT Semifinals as well as a third SEC West title in the last five years. Three years ago in 2004-05, Stansbury further extended all-time school marks by directing the 23-11 Bulldogs to a fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance as well as a fourth straight 20-win season. Prior to the current decade, the Bulldogs had neither previously reached 20 wins in three straight seasons, made four consecutive postseason tournaments nor earned three straight NCAA Tournament berths in the program's baske

During the 2003-04 season, Stansbury guided State to its first outright SEC title since 1962-63 with a 14-2 league mark en route to posting a 26-4 overall record (12-0 on the road) and earning a school-first third straight NCAA Tournament appearance. In doing so, Stansbury was named The Associated Press SEC Coach of the Year, while earning district coaching honors from both the National Association of Basketball Coaches and United States Basketball Writers Association. He piloted the 21-10 Bulldogs to an NCAA Tournament berth in 2002-03 after advancing to the title

piloted the 21-10 Bulldogs to an NCAA Tournament berth in 2002-03 after advancing to the title game of the SEC Tournament for a second consecutive year.

In his rookie season at the Bulldog helm (1998-99), Stansbury became the school's all-time winningest first-year head basketball coach (20-13). During the 2001-02 season, he directed MSU to a school-record 27 wins, including an SEC Tournament title and NCAA appearance.

Previously as an eight-year assistant/associate head coach on Williams' staff, Stansbury played an integral role in helping guide Mississippi State University to three NCAA Tournaments, including a Final Four berth in 1996 and Sweet 16 showing in 1995, one NIT appearance (1994), one SEC Tournament title (1996), one regular-season SEC overall co-championship (1991), and back-to-back SEC Western Division crowns in 1995 and 1996.

Prior to his move to Starkville, Stansbury served a six year stipt (1985-90) as an assistant coach at

Prior to his move to Starkville, Stansbury served a six-year stint (1985-90) as an assistant coach at Austin Peay State. Born in Louisville, Ky., and raised in Brandenburg, Ky., he is a 1982 graduate of Campbellsville (Ky.) College and was inducted into his alma mater's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2003. Stansbury then went on to earn a master's degree in 1984 from Cumberland (Ky.) College. Stansbury, 48, is married to the former Meo Mellen of Roanoke, Va., and they are the proud parents of three sons - Isaac, 8, Noah, 5, and Luke, 3.
