12 KEY THINGS TO NOTE PLAYING ST. MARY'S

- ✓ Mississippi State and St. Mary's have met just once, with the Bulldogs claiming a 67-54 win in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic at Madison Square Garden in New York City.
- ✓ MSU is playing its second West Conference foe in less than a week. On Dec. 23, the Bulldogs defeated San Diego 69-52 in the Diamond Head Classic in Honolulu, HI. They are 7-2 all-time against the WCC.
- ✓ With the St. Mary's game, MSU concludes a five-game, 11,701-mile road swing that featured a stop in the Bahamas.
- ✓ Mississippi State is playing in Las Vegas for the first time since the 2001 Las Vegas Classic, when it beat Richmond (74-72), lost to Cincinnati (90-56) and beat Illinois-Chicago (77-74).
- ✓ The Bulldogs are appearing on ESPNU for the third time this season, having lost against Washington State before defeating San Diego.
- ✓ With **Wendell Lewis** drawing the start against Hawaii, Mississippi State has now implemented five different starting lineups.
- ✓ Against the Gaels, MSU will be looking to avoid six losses before January in a single season since 1996-96.
- ✓ 26 of MSU's last 36 games overall have been decided by 10 points or less (15-11 record).
- ✓ **Ravarn Johnson** now stands 22nd all-time in the MSU record books with 1,203 points.
- ✓ Despite scoring just 45 points and draining only six of 27 3-point attempts in the last four games, **Ravarn Johnson** leads the SEC and is 36th nationally with his 19.6 average.
- ✓ Against Hawaii, freshman **Jalen Steele** scored a career-high 14 points.
- ✓ With 18 points and 11 rebounds against Hawaii, senior forward **Kodi Augustus** recorded his SEC-leading sixth double-double of the year and the eighth of his career.

DID YOU KNOW

MSU has played three games in three years against teams from the West Coast Conference, going 2-1. All three games have been against San Diego.

MEET ST. MARY'S

◆ St. Mary's enters Wednesday's Shamrock Shoot-out riding a four-game winning streak after claiming a 73-53 win at New Mexico State on Dec. 23.

The Gaels have four players scoring in double-digits, led by Rob Jones' 13.5 scoring clip.

The Bulldogs are SM's second Mississippi foe this season. In November, the Gaels defeated Mississippi Valley State, 87-52.

MSTATE 7-2 AGAINST THE WCC

Entering Wednesday's showdown against St. Mary's, the Bulldogs are 7-2 against the seven teams that currently comprise the West Coast Conference.

Mississippi State has played five of the league members — Gonzaga, Portland, San Diego, Santa Clara and St. Mary's. The last time MSU battled a West Coast member other than San Diego was during the 2005-06 season when it defeated Santa Clara (82-69, Dec. 3, 2005) in overtime.

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 13-4 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this season's 8-5 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 142-48 (.747) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 132-38 (.776) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 207-34 (5-3) when leading at halftime; 178-33 (3-0) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 221-69 (7-2 this year) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 206-74 (6-1) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 159-30 (6-2) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

DECEMBER DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 8-0 mark, the Bulldogs are 76-19 (.800) in the month of December since **Rick Stansbury** was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 134-43 (.757) in December.

The Bulldogs had their eight-game winning streak in the month of December snapped with their loss to East Tennessee State.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

Last year, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In just 13 games this year, the Bulldogs are nearly on the same pace, having drained 101 of their 298 attempts for an 7.8 average.

Last year, **Ravarn Johnson** led MSU with 87 3-pointers on 214 attempts, exceeding his total of 83 in 2008-09, the third-most in school history. Darryl Wilson currently holds the top two spots with 97 in 1996 and 94 in 1995.

Johnson is already ahead of his pace from a year ago. Through 12 games, he is 40-of-99 beyond the arc. Last year at this time, he was just 38 of 78 from long range.

1,000 POINT CLUB WELCOMES NEWEST MEMBER

It didn't take **Ravarn Johnson** long to reach one of the biggest milestones in his career - becoming the 32nd member of the 1,000-point club.

In the season opener against Tennessee State, the senior from Lyon, Miss., scored 32 points to give him exactly 1,000 for his career. Following his 12-point effort against Hawaii, he now has 1,203 for his career to rank 22nd all-time, as he passed Mario Austin against the Rainbow Warriors on Dec. 25.

Ahead of him in a tie for 21st are Leland Mitch (1961-63) and Dave Williams (1966-68) with 1,219 points.

BULLDOG BITES**MSU'S ALL-SEC SELECTIONS**

● In the preseason All-SEC team selection, Mississippi State had two players receive league honors as voted on by the league coaches.

Junior point guard **Dee Bost** was tabbed first team, while senior **Ravern Johnson** received second-team accolades. Neither made the media selections.

NUMBERS TELL THE STORY FOR JOHNSON

● Two weeks ago, senior guard Ravern Johnson led the SEC with 3-pointers made and percentage.

But after going 6-for-27 shooting in the last four games, he now ranks 4th in made (3.3) and 14th in percentage (40.4).

SEEING PLENTY OF GAME ACTION

● Logging minutes isn't an issue for MSU players.

The Bulldogs are the only SEC team where three starters are averaging more than 31.0 minutes an outing.

Ravern Johnson leads the SEC with his 35.6 minutes, while **Riley Benock** is second at 34.2.

Kodi Augustus ranks 9th at 31.5.

19 AND COUNTING FOR JOHNSON

● During his career, Ravern Johnson has made four or more 3-pointers in a game 21 times, including the five he made against Nicholls State on Dec. 13

His best outing was came last November against Troy, when he hit seven to spark a come-from-behind win in OT despite trail by as many as 11 points in the second half.

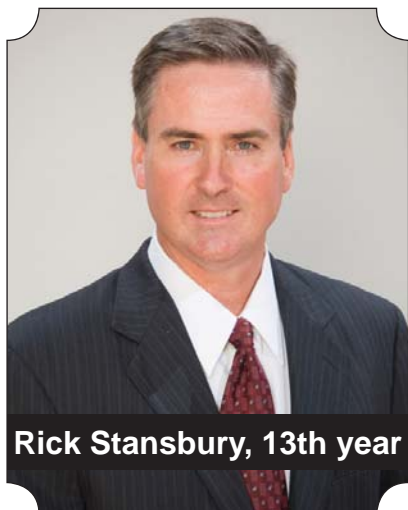

MEET THE HEAD COACH



Rick Stansbury, 13th year

Consistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront three years ago when MSU's 13th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 13-year coaching record of 263-145 at the Bulldog helm, the 14th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2005-10), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons and another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 24-12 State squad to its seventh SEC Western division crown in school history en route to advancing to the NIT, where the Bulldogs lost to North Carolina in the second round. From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 13-4 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's first 12 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 155-39 (.799) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 71-25 (.740) SEC mark and a 84-14 (.857) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 361-137 (.725) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

BULLDOGS TAKE ADVANTAGE OF EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

STARKVILLE, Miss. – Mississippi State's 2010-11 signing class got off to a resounding start with the signing of wings Rodney Hood and D.J. Gardner and point guard Deville Smith.

All three were named to the Clarion Ledger's prestigious Dandy Dozen, and all three are considered Top 100 players overall nationally.

The 6-foot-8, 180-pound Hood, a two-time Mississippi player of the year, averaged 22.1 points, 6.2 rebounds and 4.4 assists last year as a junior and scored a record 34 points in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game. He led the Wildcats to a 26-7 record en route to advancing to the Class 6A championship game.

Listed as a five-star recruit, Rivals.com rates him as the 21st best player overall nationally, while ESPN has him at No. 30, followed by Scout.com at No. 49.

Joining Hood is his AAU teammate, Smith, a 5-11, 160-pound guard out of Callaway.

As a junior, Smith led his team to a second-straight Class 5A crown and averaged 22.4 points, 4.0 steals and 3.5 assists. He hit the game-winning shot against Provine at the buzzer to win the championship, while scoring a career-high 48 points against New Hope in the North 5A finals.

Rated as a 4-star recruit, he's listed as the 40th best overall player in the country by ESPN and 63rd best by Rivals.com.

Rounding out the early signing period class is Okolona's D.J. Gardner, who is noted for his long-range shooting.

The 6-7, 195-pound standout totaled 24.2 points, 11.1 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 2.4 steals a contest as the Chieftains posted a 25-6 ledger and advanced to the North 1A semifinals. His season-high of 40 points came against Ingomar. They finished the season ranked No. 5 in the Class 1A rankings.

Gardner also stood out in the Mississippi High School All-Star Game, where he poured in 16 points.

A 4-star recruit, Rivals.com has him as the 60th player in the country, while ESPN has him at No. 91.
