WHAT TO NOTE AS MSU PLAYS UTAH STATE . . .

- ✓ The loss to Baylor snapped the Bulldogs' 11-game winning streak, which tied for the 9th longest in school history.
- ✓ Against Baylor, MSU lost for the first time this year when holding an opponent below 45 percent shooting from the field, committing fewer turnovers and holding a team to 65 or fewer points.
- ✓ The last time MSU held an opponent to 54 or fewer points and lost was against Butler in the 2003 NCAA Tournament (47-46) in Birmingham.
- ✓ A win versus Utah State would give MSU 13 non-conference wins in the regular season for the third time under Rick Stansbury (2002 & 2004).
- ✓ After shooting 50 percent or better from the floor 4 times last year, MSU has done that five times already this season.
- ✓ MSU's 13.4 fouls per game are the fifth fewest in the nation (1. Wisconsin, 12.6).
- ✓ **Arnett Moultrie** leads the SEC in rebounding (11.5) and double-doubles (7). He ranks 7th nationally on the boards.
- ✓ **Dee Bost** is now just 3 assists shy of breaking the school record of 514 held by Derrick Zimmerman (2000-03).
- ✓ **Dee Bost** is second in the SEC and tied for 26th nationally in steals per game at 2.4.
- ✓ In just 14 games, the Bulldogs have utilized five different lineups.
- ✓ In the freshman record books, Rodney Hood currently ranks 6th in scoring average (12.0), 10th in assists (2.0) and 4th in minutes average (33.2).
- ✓ MSU has two of the SEC's Top 5 scorers — **Arnett Moultrie** (4th) & **Dee Bost** (5th). **Moultrie** also leads the league in FG% (.561) and FT% (.887), while **Bost** is tops in Minutes played (34.2), followed by **Moultrie** at 33.3.

MSU 2-1 ALL-TIME AGAINST TEAMS FROM UTAH

- ◆ While Mississippi State and Utah State are meeting for the first time, the Aggies are the third team from the state of Utah MSU has played in its 100 years of basketball.

The Bulldogs' first encounter against a school from Utah came in December of 1994 when they lost at BYU in overtime, 74-68. Later in March, MSU beat Utah in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, 78-64, in Boise, ID.

Then in December of 1996 in Starkville, Mississippi State defeated BYU, 79-74.

BULLDOGS HAVE FARED WELL AGAINST WAC FOES

Mississippi State has enjoyed success against Western Athletic Conference foes over the years, posting a 15-9 record.

Saturday's matchup features the only WAC opponent for MSU this season.

The team the Bulldogs have played the most is Louisiana Tech, with MSU holding a 10-4 advantage.

The last WAC team the Bulldogs faced was Hawaii last year in the Diamondhead Classic, with the Rainbow Warriors claiming a 68-57 victory.

Mississippi State has played five of the eight league members.

DECEMBER DOMINANCE UNDER STANSBURY

Including last year's 4-5 mark, coupled with this year's 5-1 ledger, the Bulldogs are 81-21 (.794) in the month of December since Rick Stansbury was named head coach.

Dating back to the 1987-88 season when Richard Williams was overseeing the program, Mississippi State owns a composite ledger of 139-45 (.755) in December.

MSU ENJOYS MORE NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Including last year's 8-6 mark in non-conference action, coupled with this year's 12-2 record, Mississippi State has compiled a 153-51 (.750) record against non-conference opponents during the **Rick Stansbury** era (since 1998-99), including a 143-41 (.777) regular-season mark.

MISSISSIPPI STATE'S RECORD WHEN . . .

During the **Rick Stansbury** era, the Bulldogs are: 223-38 (12-0 this year) when leading at halftime; 163-37 (10-0) when shooting 45 percent or better from the field; 239-73 (10-1) when the opposition shoots less than 45 percent from the field; 222-81 (11-1) when out-rebounding or tying opponents; and 172-32 (7-1) when holding opponents to 65 points or less.

BOMBS AWAY . . . AGAIN AND AGAIN

In 2009-10, Mississippi State set a single-season record with 296 made 3-pointers, an average of 8.2 an outing.

In 31 games last year, the Bulldogs were nearly on the same pace, having drained 246 of their 680 attempts for an 7.9 average.

Early this year, the Bulldogs are off that torrid pace somewhat, as they've drained 93 in 14 games. On Dec. 10 against Troy, MSU tied a school record with 16 made 3-pointers.

SCOUTING UTAH STATE

Utah State improved to 8-8 on Dec. 22 with its 81-62 win against Kent State.

The Aggies were paced by Kyisean Reed's 27 points, while Preston Medlin added 20, followed by Morgan Grim with 14 points and 14 boards.

Utah State was 30 of 53 from the floor and 15 of 13 from 3-point range.

The Aggies also won the battle of the boards, 40-37.

LAST TIME OUT FOR MSU . . .

In a game that featured nine lead changes and eight ties, MSU saw its 11-game winning streak come to an end with a hard-fought, 54-52 loss to No. 6 Baylor on Wednesday in Dallas.

Neither team led by more than six points, and the Bears won on a Pierre Jackson layup with 28 seconds to play as the Bulldogs were held to just one field goal over the final six minutes of action.

Renardo Sidney and Jalen Steele paced Mississippi State with 10 points, while Arnett Moultrie just missed out on his 8th double-double of the year with 8 points and 10 boards.

The Bulldogs hit 22 of its 54 shots, while limiting Baylor to just 19-of-55 shooting. The Bears won the battle of the boards, 40-32.

**Bulldog Hoops Turns 100**

● MSU is celebrating its 100th season of basketball this year. The first year the Bulldogs fielded a team was in 1908-09, when they posted a 5-5 ledger. The first game was against the Columbus Athletic Club on Jan. 1, 1909, with Mississippi State claiming a 35-6 win in Starkville. The coach that year was T.H. Werner. It was Werner's only year at the helm.

● It will be a year-long celebration, as former players and coaches will be recognized. In addition, a "Starting 5" will be announced as will the "5 Greatest Games" in school history, as voted on by the fans.

PRESEASON HONORS

In October, the media predicted MSU to finish 5th in the overall standings. In addition, senior guard **Dee Bost** was tabbed first-team All-SEC.

Two weeks later, the league coaches voted Bost first team All-SEC and junior forward **Renardo Sidney** second-team.

BULLDOGS GRAB TOURNAMENT TITLE IN NEW YORK

Mississippi State knocked off No. 19 Texas A&M and No. 15 Arizona in back-to-back nights last week to win the 2011 2K Sports Classic, benefitting Coaches vs. Cancer.

It was the 18th in-season tournament title the Bulldogs have won, while improving their record to 86-73 following Friday's 67-57 win against Arizona. It was MSU's first tournament crown since the 2000 Bank One Fiesta Bowl Classic, when it also upended Arizona.

1,000-POINT CLUB HAS BOST; MOULTRIE CLOSING

On Feb. 9, 2011, against Arkansas at Humphrey Coliseum, junior guard **Dee Bost** became the 33rd MSU player to score 1,000 points for a career. He reached the milestone with 3:34 left in the first half on a 3-pointer that tied the game at 25-apiece.

Arnett Moultrie came to MSU after transferring from UTEP, where he totaled 650 points his first two seasons. After scoring 186 points in his first 11 games, including a career-best 28 against S. Alabama on Nov. 12, he is on pace to eclipse 1,000 points for his career this season.

He currently has 836 career points and 649 rebounds.

BOST MOVING UP SCORING/STEAL RECORD BOOKS

Senior guard **Dee Bost** scored 9 points against Baylor to give him 1,353 points for his career, the 15th most in school history.

He also had 1 steal to give him 160 for his career for the 6th most in the record books. He needs just one more to crack the Top 5. Timmy Bowers (2001-04) is No. 5 with 161 steals, while Ray White holds the record with 217.

MOULTRIE IMPRESSIVE IN DEBUT

Arnett Moultrie became the first Mississippi State player to record a double-double in his Bulldog debut since Lawrence Roberts (26 points, 15 rebounds) in 2002-03 against UT Martin.

Against ECU, Moultrie had 13 points and 10 rebounds.

HOOD TURNING HEADS FROM DAY 1

Guard **Rodney Hood** became the first true freshman to score in double-digits his first four games since Rickey Brown in 1976-77 when he opened his career by scoring 10-plus points his first 12 games.

The record is held by Ray White in 1975-76 when he scored in double-digits all 28 games.

Hood currently has 10 double-digit scoring games.

BULLDOGS IN ELITE COMPANY . . .

Mississippi State is one of only two SEC schools to post winning conference records in each of the last three seasons. In the "Super 6" conferences, the Bulldogs find themselves in elite company, as only 18 of the 73 teams who have competed in those leagues the last three years have accomplished the feat.

MORE NEWS & NOTES

REBOUNDING STREAK ENDS

Through the first eight games of the season, MSU had out-rebounded all eight of its opponents.

But against West Virginia in Game 9, the streak ended when the Mountaineers won the battle of the boards, 36-31. Baylor also won the rebounding war, 40-32.

And while the Bulldogs' 46 rebounds were the most since they had 47 against Alabama State on 12-14-10, Troy matched the effort with 46 as well.

On the year, MSU has a +4.5 rebound margin (38.5-34.0).

GOOD SHOWING AT THE POLLS

Mississippi State finds itself ranked in both polls for the first time since the 2009-10 preseason rankings.

It's the highest the Bulldogs have been in either poll since the 2003-04 campaign, when it climbed to No. 4 in AP and No. 5 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Polls. That year, MSU won the overall SEC crown.

As a ranked team this season, Mississippi State has posted a 8-1 ledger.

3-POINT RECORD TIED AGAIN

Against Troy in a 106-68 victory, Mississippi State tied a school record with 16 made 3-pointers.

The Bulldogs also had 16 treys against Arkansas (2-7-09) and St. Bonaventure (12-5-09).

From an individual standpoint against the Trojans, senior guard **Dee Bost** drained 7 3-pointers, one shy of tying the school record of 8 held by Winsome Frazier, Marckell Patterson, Antonio Jackson and Darryl Wilson.

It was the second time he has made 7 3s, the first coming two years ago against Auburn.

ASSISTS COMING FROM ALL DIRECTIONS

In the win against Troy, MSU dished out a season-high 30 assists, the most since being credited with 31 against Louisiana-Monroe on 12-5-01.

The 30 ranks tied for 7th in school history, while the record of 34 came against Chicago State on 12-4-74.

Dee Bost led the charge with 9, while **Rodney Hood** and **Arnett Moultrie** had career best of 6 and 5, respectively.

BOST'S CAREER NUMBERS STANDOUT

Of all the players currently in the SEC, MSU senior guard **Dee Bost** is tops in the last four years with 160 steals and 512 assists.

The Concord, N.C., native is also fourth with 1,353 points. Vanderbilt's Jeffery Taylor is first with 1,531 points, followed by Florida's Erving Walker (1,508) and Alabama's JaMychal Green (1,452).

HOOD IMPRESSIVE OUT OF THE GATES

Freshman Rodney Hood of Meridian, Miss., has garnered not only local attention for his play, but national attention as well.

And stats tell the story as to why.

Overall, he's currently third on the team and 21st in the SEC in scoring (12.0), while his minutes (33.1) are third on the team and fourth in the league.

In the MSU freshman record books, Hood is making waves, too.

Currently, he's sixth in scoring, fourth in average minutes played, and 10th in rebounding average (5.4). He's also on pace to move into the Top 10 of field goals made and attempted and 3-pointers made and attempted.

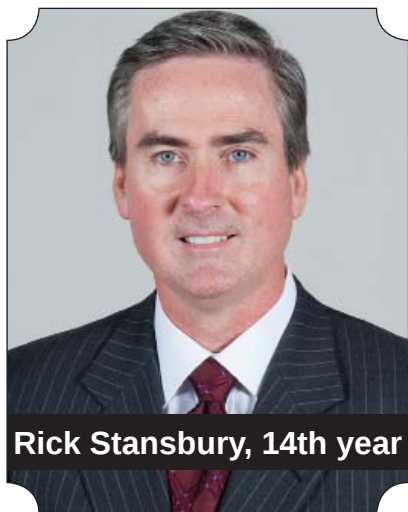

MEET THE HEAD COACH



Rick Stansbury, 14th year

Consistency is a key ingredient to the recent success enjoyed by the Mississippi State University basketball program, one that is stressed in the players' daily activities on and off the basketball floor that has translated into the program's recent run of national prominence gained under head coach Rick Stansbury.

That consistency was brought to the forefront four years ago when MSU's 14th-year head basketball coach became the all-time winningest basketball coach in school history, surpassing Richard Williams' mark of 191. Now with a 14-year coaching record of 284-156 at the Bulldog helm, the 9th-most wins in SEC history, Stansbury has guided 10 State squads (6 NCAA & 4 NIT) to postseason tournament appearances and nine clubs to 20-plus wins campaigns.

MSU has averaged 21.3 wins the last six years (2006-11), including winning an outright SEC overall championship in 2004, along with back-to-back SEC West crowns in the 2003-2004 and 2007-2008 seasons and another in 2010, and SEC Tournament titles in 2002 and 2009.

Most recently, Stansbury piloted last year's 17-14 State squad to a second place finish in the Western Division, but missed out on a post-season berth for the first time in five seasons.

From 2001-05, he guided MSU to five-consecutive postseason tournament appearances for the first time in school history, including a streak of four straight NCAA Tournament berths from 2002 through 2005.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. With the 12-5 mark last year, the Bulldogs have reached twin-digit home wins during each of coach Rick Stansbury's 13 seasons at the MSU helm.

Mississippi State is now 168-43 (.796) overall at Humphrey Coliseum under Stansbury's direction, including a 76-28 (.731) SEC mark and a 92-15 (.860) record against non-conference opponents.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 35-season composite record of 374-141 (.726) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

Mississippi State traveled the world this season, spending time in the Netherlands, Belgium and France playing basketball against pro and club teams.

In five games, the Bulldogs posted a 5-0 record and averaged 93.6 points while allowing just 71.4 points.

MSU had four players that averaged in double-digits, led by Arnett Moultrie's 16.8 clip. DeVille Smith was next at 15.4, followed by Wendell Lewis and Rodney Hood and 13.4 and 11.0 points, respectively.

From a rebounding standpoint, Moultrie led the way with his 11.2 average, followed by Lewis and Bryant at 6.0 and 4.8 boards, respectively.
