Did You Know . . .

- At LSU on Feb. 6, senior forward Gavin Ware became the 7th player in school history to record 800 rebounds and 1,000 points.
- Quinnndary Weatherspoon's buzzer beater against Vandy was MSU's first since Brian Bryant made a 15-foot jumper at South Carolina on Feb. 29, 2012.

WHAT TO NOTE FROM 2015-16 . . .

- Quinnndary Weatherspoon** was named to the SEC All-Freshman team by the league coaches.
- Gavin Ware** was named honorable mention All-SEC by the Associated Press.
- During the season, **Gavin Ware** was named the SEC Player of the Week.
- Twice during the season, **Quinnndary Weatherspoon** was named the SEC Freshman of the Week.
- Once during the season, **Malik Newman** was tabbed the SEC Freshman of the Week.
- In the preseason, **Malik Newman** and **Craig Sword** were named second-team All-SEC.
- Craig Sword** finished his MSU career with 1,492 points, the 11th most in school history. He also collected 185 steals, the fourth most.
- Gavin Ware** totaled 1,362 points, the 17th most in school history. He also finished 5th with 888 rebounds.
- Fred Thomas** finished with 1,050 points, the 34th most in school history.
- Six of the Bulldogs' 10 SEC losses were by six points or less (combined 19 points, 3.2 average).
- Malik Newman** has drained 61 3-pointers, the second most by an MSU freshman. Barry Stewart holds the record with 68. His 329 points are the 10th most by a freshman.
- Quinnndary Weatherspoon** also made waves in the freshman record books. His 42 steals were 7th, while his 371 points are also 7th.
- Quinnndary Weatherspoon** had two ESPN Top 10 plays, the first in MSU history.
- Gavin Ware** led the SEC with his .614 shooting percentage, which is 16th best in the country.
- Ben Howland** guided MSU to 14 wins, the most in any of his first-year coaching stops — 9 at Northern Arizona, 13 at Pittsburgh and 11 at UCLA.
- Gavin Ware's** ESPN player efficiency rating of 28.22 was 25th nationally and second in the SEC.
- MSU scored 2,323 points, which tied for the 9th most in school history (2000-01).
- The Bulldogs drained 225 3-pointers, the 8th most in school history, while the 674 attempted 3s are the 6th most.
- Mississippi State shot .725 from the charity stripe, the 7th best in school history. That was the best percentage since hitting .724 in 1972-73.
- The Bulldogs' sellout against Eastern Washington was the first since the Kentucky game in 2012.
- MSU used nine different lineups this year.
- Against Ole Miss, **Malik Newman** drained 7 3-pointers, the second most in a single game at MSU.
- Gavin Ware**, **Travis Daniels** and **Johnny Zuppardo** have already earned degrees, while **Craig Sword** and **Fred Thomas** will graduate in May.

MSU KNOWS HOW TO WIN GAMES AT 'THE HUMP'

Over the course of the last decade, Mississippi State's Humphrey Coliseum has become a difficult venue for opposing teams. Last year, MSU was 9-8, including a 6-2 mark against non-conference foes. This year, the MSU finished 10-5.

The Bulldogs have compiled a 41-season composite record of 418-171 (.710) at "The Hump" since Mississippi State's basketball facility opened prior to the 1975-76 campaign.

WARE, WEATHERSPOON ARE HOWELL FINALISTS

■ Both Gavin Ware and Quindary Weatherspoon were named finalists for the C Spire Bailey Howell Trophy, named after former Bulldog great Bailey Howell and given annually to the top collegiate male player in Mississippi.

On March 7, Ole Miss' Stefan Moody was named the 2016 recipient.

NEWMAN, WEATHERSPOON EARN SEC HONORS

■ Even before league play started, Malik Newman and Quindary Weatherspoon were tabbed freshman of the week by the SEC.

Following his 16-point, 3-rebound performance against UT Martin on Nov. 28, Weatherspoon was tabbed the SEC's Freshman of the Week. He won the honor again following his 24- and 15-point performances against Vanderbilt and Alabama, respectively.

He was the first MSU freshman to earn the honor since Gavin Ware and Craig Sword in 2012-13.

Newman won his honor following the 93-69 win against Northern Colorado in Jackson with his 20-point performance on 6-11 shooting.

NEWMAN 1 SHORT OF RECORD

■ Against Ole Miss in an 83-77 victory back in January, freshman guard Malik Newman found his rhythm from long range.

The Jackson, Miss., native was 7-10 from long range, scoring 20 of his 25 points in the second half.

He was one shy of the record 8, set by Winsome Frazier, Marckell Patterson, Antonio Jackson and Darryl Wilson.

WARE TABBED SEC POW

■ After scoring a career-high 26 points and grabbing 13 rebounds in the season opener against Eastern Washington, senior forward Gavin Ware was named the first SEC Player of the Week this season.

It's the second league honor for Ware, who was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Dec. 24, 2013.

He was also the first Bulldog to earn POW honors since Craig Sword on Dec. 2, 2014.

WARE'S FINAL REBOUNDING TAB

■ Senior forward Gavin Ware finished his career with 888 rebounds, the 5th most in school history after grabbing 10 in his last game against Georgia in the SEC Tournament.

MOVING UP MSU SCORING CHARTS

■ Last year, Craig Sword became the 34th player in school history to score 1,000 points for career, while earlier this year Gavin Ware became the latest member.

Sword finished 11th all-time with 1,492 points after he passed Tony Watts in the SEC Tournament. Ware finished 17th with 1,362.

Against Arkansas on Feb. 9, Fred Thomas became the 36th member. He finished 34th with 1,050 points.

WARE JOINS ELITE 1,000/800 CLUB

■ At LSU on Feb. 6, senior forward Gavin Ware became the 7th player in school history to record 800 rebounds and 1,000 points.

The six other players who achieved that feat are Bailey Howell (2,030 pts, 1,277 rbs), Jarvis Varnado (1,403 pts, 1,096 rbs), Rickey Brown (1,838 pts, 1,092 rbs), Wiley Peck (1,136 pts, 964 rbs), Erick Dampier (1,231 pts, 859 rbs) and Tyrone Washington (1,119 pts, 847 rbs).

Ware totaled 1,362 points and 888 boards.

NEWMAN, WEATHERSPOON ONE OF TOP SCORING FRESHMAN DUOS

■ When it comes to freshman duos scoring, few are better than Malik Newman and Quindary Weatherspoon.

The two standouts are combining for 23.3 points, the 11th best in the country. Florida State's Malik Beasley and Dwayne Bacon are first at 31.0.

WEATHERSPOON RECORDS

FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE, THEN 2ND

■ Freshman guard Quindary Weatherspoon had quite the performance at Missouri in the Bulldogs' 76-62 win.

In addition to his 18 points, he hauled in a career-high 14 rebounds to earn his first double-double.

Then against Arkansas, he had his second double-double with 16 points, 10 rebounds.

BULLDOGS OVERCOME DEFICIT

TO BEAT VANDERBILT

■ In MSU's thrilling, 75-74 win against Vanderbilt last week, it rallied from 17 points down, the largest deficit overcome in a win since overcoming a 20-point deficit against Kentucky on Jan. 5, 2002.

The last time MSU rallied from at least 13 down was at Vanderbilt on Jan. 21, 2012, in a 78-77 victory.

ON Q AT THE BUZZER

■ Quindary Weatherspoon totaled a career-high 24 points against the Commodores and made the game-winning 3-pointer at the buzzer.

It was MSU's first buzzer beater since Brian Bryant made a 15-foot jumper at South Carolina on Feb. 29, 2012.

2015-16 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

CLOSE GAMES WITH OLE MISS

■ A close look at the recent history with Ole Miss reveals one common theme — the games have been tightly contested.

Seven of the last 11 outings have been decided by 8 points or less, including this year's games with MSU's 83-77 win and Ole Miss' 86-78 victory in Oxford.

WARE FINISHES IN TOP 10 OF BLOCKS

■ Gavin Ware finished with 100 blocked shots for his career, 8th most in school history.

The senior from Starkville had two blocks against Auburn on March 5 to give him 100 for his career.

BULLDOGS COLLECT IMPRESSIVE ROAD WIN

■ At Missouri on Jan. 30, Mississippi State snapped an 8-game road losing streak with a 76-62 victory in a contest it led from start to finish.

It marked the first road win since MSU won there a year ago.

The 14-point victory was also the largest in SEC road action since MSU defeated Arkansas 70-56 at Bud Walton Arena on Jan. 10, 2009.

READY HAS FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE

■ Junior guard I.J. Ready posted his first double-double against Missouri State in Puerto Rico with 13 points and a career-high 11 assists.

SWORD, WARE LEAD SEC

■ Of all current players in the SEC, Craig Sword leads all scorers with 1,492 points, while Gavin Ware is tops with 888 rebounds. Ware is also third with 1,362 points. In addition, Sword has 185 steals, second only to Texas A&M's Alex Caruso, who has 267.

DOGS, FOE SHOOT 50 PERCENT +

■ Twice this season, both Mississippi State and its opponents have shot 50 percent or better from the floor.

The first time was in the season opener when MSU was .621 (41-66) and Eastern Washington was .508 (33-65).

At Kentucky last month, the Bulldogs were .529 (27-51), while the Wildcats were .509 (28-55).

PRESEASON ALL-SEC & POLL

■ In the preseason polls voted on by the media, freshman Malik Newman was tabbed second-team All-SEC. Last March, senior guard Craig Sword earned second-team honors but didn't make the preseason list this year.

As a team, the Bulldogs were picked to finish 8th under first-year coach Ben Howland.

In the Coaches Poll, both Sword and Newman were named second-team All-SEC.

And of that group, only one had 20 wins, and that was Rick Stansbury in 1999 when the Bulldogs posted a 20-13 ledger en route to advancing to the NIT, where they lost to Colorado State in the opening round, 69-56.

NEWMAN ONE OF 50 NAMED TO WOODEN WATCH LIST

■ Malik Newman has been named to the Men's Preseason Top 50 Wooden Award watch list.

He's in his first season at MSU after a standout prep career that saw him become a McDonald's All-American and ranked the No. 1 shooting guard in the country by ESPN after leading Callaway to four-straight state titles. The Jackson, Miss., native made his Bulldog debut against Southern on Nov. 16, tallying 6 points, 3 assists and 2 rebounds. On the year, he's averaging 11.5 points after totaling 17 points Saturday against Auburn in a 79-66 win.

On the women's side, Victoria Vivians is on the Wooden Award Women's Preseason Top 30 watch list to make MSU one of only nine schools in the nation, including one of just two SEC programs, to boast candidates on each list.

Newman is also one of 50 players on the Naismith Trophy early season watch list.

STALEY NO LONGER ON ROSTER

■ After joining the team in December, Elijah Staley is no longer on the roster.

The freshman from Marietta, Ga., has decided to fully concentrate on football, where last year he was the backup quarterback.

He saw his first basketball action at Florida State, where in 6 minutes of action, he had one rebound and 1 steal and missed his lone field goal attempt.

He scored his first point against North Carolina Central on a free throw late in the second half.

In football, he appeared in two games this past season and rushed for 18 yards. He was also with the team for the 51-28 Belk Bowl win against N.C. State.

A year ago, he briefly practiced with the basketball team once football concluded, but a knee injury sidelined him in January.

HOUSTON, NDOYE ALSO LEAVE TEAM

■ Sophomore forwards Demetrius Houston and Fallou Ndoye are no longer on the team.

Houston appeared in just one game this season, scoring 2 points against Eastern Washington. Ndoye played in six games and had 2 points and 7 rebounds.

STELLAR DEFENSIVE EFFORT

■ In the win against N.C. Central, MSU limited the Eagles to 48 points on 17-72 shooting. The .236 shooting percent was the lowest for an MSU opponent since LSU (.212, 14-66) on 1-9-08 in Baton Rouge and the fewest points the Bulldogs have allowed this season.

The last foe to shoot below 28 percent was Texas-San Antonio (.273, 15-55) on 12-4-12.

MSU YIELDS 105 POINTS TO MIAMI

■ In the opening round of the Puerto Rico Tip-Off, Mississippi State dropped a 105-79 decision to the Miami Hurricanes.

It was the first time the Bulldogs allowed 100-plus points since a 101-96 setback to UMass in overtime on 3-13-12.

It was the 35th time in school history a team has scored 100-plus points against MSU.

ARKANSAS SOLID FROM LONG RANGE

■ In the Bulldogs' 82-78 loss at Arkansas, the Razorbacks were 16-24 beyond the arc, with Dusty Hannahs connecting on 8 of his 13 attempts.

That's the most by a team since Troy drained 17 in 2005-06 and the most by an individual since Ole Miss' Stefan Moody made 8 last year.

But in the rematch last week, it was a different story as the Razorbacks were just 1-10 in MSU's 78-46 win.

MSU SHOOTS LIGHTS OUT VS. EWU

■ Against Eastern Washington in a 106-88 victory, MSU shot 62.1 percent (41-66) from the floor. It was the first time it shot 60 percent or better since hitting 60.4 percent (29-48) against Auburn on Feb. 4, 2012.

It also marked the first time the Bulldogs scored 100 points in a season opener for the first time since opening the 1998-99 campaign with a 105-53 win against Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

All-time, the Bulldogs have eclipsed the 100-point mark 53 times.

2015-16 MISSISSIPPI STATE NOTES

HIGH FREE THROW PERCENTAGE

■ Mississippi State finished second in the SEC and 82nd nationally with its .725 free throw percentage. The school record is 76.9 percent set in 1967-68. This year marked the first time MSU eclipsed .700 since 2011-12 when it was .710.

TENNESSEE FAILS TO COLLECT A STEAL

■ In Tennessee's 80-75 win against MSU on Jan. 16 at Humphrey Coliseum, the Volunteers failed to collect a steal.

The last time an opponent failed to collect a steal was Texas A&M-Corpus Christi on 12-21-07. The Bulldogs won that game in Corpus Christi, 95-70.

SEASON HIGHS IN ASSISTS AND AT FREE THROW LINE

■ Against Northern Colorado in a 91-68 win in Jackson on Dec. 23, the Bulldogs recorded a season-high 21 assists.

I.J. Ready accounted for 11 assists, which tied his career best set against Missouri State in Puerto Rico back in November.

The Bulldogs also had a season high with 21 made free throws.

OVERTIME AFFAIR

■ In the 82-80 loss to Alabama back in February, the game went into overtime.

It was the first overtime outing for MSU since beating Texas A&M at Humphrey Coliseum, 81-72.

MSU is now 60-50 all-time in overtime.

FIVE SENIORS RETURN

■ Mississippi State's roster features five seniors — Travis Daniels, Craig Sword, Fred Thomas, Gavin Ware and Johnny Zuppardo.

In the SEC, only Texas A&M has more seniors with six.

ALABAMA ROSTER FLAVOR

■ A quick glance at Mississippi State's roster reveals one very strong common thread — the state of Alabama.

Player wise, the roster features three players from Alabama — Travis Daniels, Joe Strugg and Craig Sword.

In addition, the coaching staff has one tie in George Brooks, a native of Lafayette, Ala.

BULLDOGS SIGN 6 IN NOVEMBER

■ Mississippi State took advantage of the early signing period on Nov. 11 and signed six players — one 5-star and five 4-stars — to give MSU one of its best classes in school history.

5-star standout Mario Kegler, a Mississippi native and former Callaway teammate with Malik Newman, is in his final year at Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. He is joined by heralded 4-stars Abdul Ado (Chattanooga, Tenn.), Tyson Carter (Starkville, Miss.), Lamar Peters (New Orleans), Eli Wright (Owensboro, Ky.) and Schnider Herard (Plano, Texas).

In the rankings, they are 4th by Rivals, 5th by Scout and 6th by ESPN and 247 Sports. Three signees rank in ESPN's Top 100 — Kegler (32), Herard (62) and Ado (68).

BULLDOGS INVITED TO CHARLESTON

■ Mississippi State will participate in the 2016 Gildan Charleston Classic next November.

The other teams competing are Boise State, College of Charleston, Central Florida, UTEP, Villanova, Wake Forest and Western Michigan.

A HOMECOMING OF SORTS

■ When Mississippi State defeated Northern Colorado 93-69 on Dec. 23, it was a homecoming for five MSU players.

The players are Fred Thomas (Jackson), Carter Holmes (Jackson), Quinndary Weatherspoon (Canton), Xavian Stapleton (Flora) and Malik Newman (Jackson). Newman, Thomas and Weatherspoon combined for 43 points.

THROWBACK UNIFORMS

■ Against Tennessee on Jan. 16, MSU wore throwback uniforms for the first time honoring the 1963 team.

That was the first NCAA Tournament trip in program history, but the Bulldogs had to sneak out of town for the trip to East Lansing, Mich., to play Loyola-Chicago due to an unwritten law in Mississippi preventing colleges to compete against teams with African-American players.

HOWLAND UNDERSTANDS

IMPORTANCE OF RIVALRY GAMES

■ In his three power conference stops, Ben Howland has enjoyed great success against his respective school's biggest rival.

While at Pittsburgh, he was 5-4 against West Virginia. Then at UCLA, he was 14-9 against Southern Cal.

And now at Mississippi State, he's 1-1 against Ole Miss following the 83-77 win at Humphrey Coliseum back in January and the 86-78 setback to the Rebels on Wednesday in Oxford.

Overall, he's now 20-14 in those rival games.

SOUTH CAROLINA DOMINANT ON THE BOARDS

■ South Carolina had a productive day rebounding in its 84-74 win against Mississippi State last month.

The Gamecocks hauled in 51 boards, while the Bulldogs had just 25.

That was the most rebounds MSU has allowed this year, while the 26 differential was the most since Mississippi State was outrebounded by Vanderbilt 51-17 (34) on Feb. 23, 2013, at the Hump.

DOGS IMPRESSIVE AGAINST ARKANSAS

■ In the Bulldogs' 78-46 win against Arkansas on Feb. 9, it was the first time the Bulldogs held a SEC foe below 50 points since Georgia on Jan. 12, 2008, in a 60-49 win.

The Razorbacks 46 points, 16 field goals, one 3-pointer and .222 shooting percentage were the fewest MSU has allowed this year on those respective categories.

TWO DOUBLE-DOUBLES, ONE GAME

■ Also for the first time this year against Arkansas, the Bulldogs had two players record a double-double in the same game.

Gavin Ware had 21 points and 10 rebounds, while Quinndary Weatherspoon totaled 16 points and 10 boards.

ONLY LOSS WHEN UP AT THE HALF

■ At Florida, Mississippi State lost for the first time in seven games when leading at the half.

The Bulldogs led 42-37 at the break.

SEASON-OPENING SELLOUT

■ Mississippi State ushered in the Ben Howland era with a sellout against Eastern Washington.

It was the Bulldogs' first sellout since Feb. 21, 2012, against Kentucky.

MSU's game against the Eagles also featured a double-digit rally from 10 points down. Only once last year did MSU overcome a double-digit deficit to post a win — 12 vs. Vanderbilt.

A CLOSER LOOK AT SEC OPENERS

■ Mississippi State is now 45-38 all-time in SEC openers, with three-straight losses. At home, the Bulldogs are 30-18. On the road, they are 15-19. In neutral site affairs, MSU is 0-1.

MSU has played Auburn the most (21 games), while the Bulldogs have collected 10 wins against Auburn and LSU to lead the way. The most losses have come to Auburn (11).

Last year, MSU opened with Tennessee at the Hump, dropping a 61-47 decision.

In was the first time an opposing player totaled 40-plus since Appalachian State's Donald Sims had 40 on Nov. 19, 2010, and the most since Vanderbilt's Shan Foster had 42 in overtime on March 5, 2008.

PUTTING UP SHOTS

■ Feb. 2 against Alabama, Mississippi State attempted 71 field goal attempts.

That was the most in a single game since also having 71 against Troy on Dec. 10, 2011.

MSU ENDS STREAK AT ALABAMA

■ Mississippi State's win at Alabama on Feb. 20 ended several streaks.

First, the Bulldogs snapped an overall 6-game losing streak to the Crimson Tide.

In addition, MSU ended a six-game slide in Coleman Coliseum, dating back to 2008.

HOWLAND LOOKING TO JOIN ELITE CLUB IN TERMS OF NCAAS

■ Ben Howland enters his first season at Mississippi State looking to achieve a feat only 12 coaches have ever done, and that's lead four different teams to the NCAA Tournament.

Howland has already guided Northern Arizona, Pittsburgh and UCLA to the Big Dance.

The first 12 coaches to do so are Lon Kruger, Steve Alford, John Beilein, Lefty Driesell, Cliff Ellis, Larry Eustachy, Jim Harrick, Fran McCaffery, Tom Penders, Tubby Smith, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.

WARE RECEIVES COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

■ Gavin Ware has been named to the 2016 SEC Men's Basketball Community Service Team.

The Bulldog senior, who ranks in the Top 5 in career rebounds and Top 20 in career points at MSU, has been active all four years throughout his hometown community. 

- In 2008, Howland became one of three coaches in NCAA Division I history to win at least 30 games in three-straight seasons, joining Adolph Rupp (Kentucky 1947-49) and John Calipari (Memphis, 2006-08).
- During his 10-year tenure at UCLA, the Bruins went to the NCAA Tournament seven times and won four Pac-10 regular-season crowns, while having 18 players drafted by NBA teams.
- His 97 victories from 2006-08 stand as the most by any UCLA head coach in a three-year span.
- Has been a Conference Coach of the Year in the Pac-10, Big East and Big Sky.
- His final two years at Pitt, the Panthers went 57-11 and reached the Sweet 16 both years.
- In 2003, Pittsburgh won the Big East Tournament crown and held the nation's No. 2 ranking for eight weeks in the Associated Press poll before ending the year at No. 4.
- In 2002, Howland guided the Panthers to a school-record 29 wins en route to becoming the school's first coach in 26 years to garner National Coach of the Year honors.
- Howland's first coaching gig was at Northern Arizona, where his last three teams posted 20-plus win seasons.
- In 1997, the Lumberjacks had a school-record 21 victories, captured the Big Sky regular-season title and played in the NIT.
- In 1998, Howland guided NAU to its first NCAA Tournament after capturing the Big Sky Tournament championship and second-straight regular-season crown.
- Howland spent one year as a graduate assistant at Gonzaga (1981) before becoming an assistant at California-Santa Barbara from 1982-94.
- Played two years at Santa Barbara College before transferring to Weber State, where he earned his degree in physical education in 1979.
- Howland and his wife, Kim, a former Weber State cheerleader, have two children – Meredith and Adam (Brittney) – and two grandsons, Benjamin Clark Howland II and Elijah Howland.
