Setting the Scene

Norfolk State begins a new campaign with a whole host of new players on Friday night when the Spartan men's basketball team travels to the state of Mississippi to take on SEC-member Mississippi State on the opening day of the 2016-17 college basketball season.

Media Coverage

The game will be shown live on the SEC Network+, available through ESPN3 and the WatchESPN app. The host Bulldogs will provide live stats through www.HailState.com.

Series History

This will mark the first ever meeting between Norfolk State and Mississippi State. It will mark the ninth time the Spartans have faced a current member of the SEC, and the fifth of six times they will do so over a three-year period. NSU has lost once each to Alabama, LSU, Georgia, Auburn, Florida, South Carolina and Vanderbilt while defeating Missouri in the NCAA tournament in 2012 when the Tigers were part of the Big 12.

About Mississippi State

The Bulldogs will welcome 12 new players to this year's team while returning just two starters and three letterwinners altogether from last year's squad. Back are Quinndary Weatherspoon (12.0 points, 4.7 rebounds, 1.4 assists) and I.J. Ready (9.2 points, 4.5 assists, 2.6 rebounds), but coach Ben Howland's squad also lost four players who started at least 22 games each and combined for 58 percent of the team's scoring in 2015-16. Among the 12 newcomers are nine freshmen, two sophomores and a junior walk-on Drew Davis. Davis and the senior Ready are the only two upperclassmen for the Bulldogs.

Last Time Out

Elijah Moore made a 3-pointer with 22.3 seconds left in double overtime to lift Virginia State to

an 83-80 win over Norfolk State last Saturday in an exhibition game at VSU. The Trojans held a sizeable edge in rebounds (56-40), and NSU nearly fell in regulation. VSU used a late 9-1 run to tie the game up, including a Richard Granberry layup with 3.8 seconds left. Granberry, though, missed the and-1 free throw to send the game to overtime. Moore had a putback with 29.7 seconds left in the first overtime to again tie it up. NSU could not get a shot off at the end of regulation and the first overtime. After Moore's 3-pointer near the end of the second overtime, the Spartans could only get off a desperation trey with just seconds remaining. Zaynah Robinson added 24 points, what would have been a career high had it been a regulation game, with seven assists, four blocks and two steals. Jonathan Wade (12 points) and Alex Long (10 points) each reached double figures as well. Moore (19 points) and Granberry (15 points, 18 rebounds) led the Trojans.

Postseason History

NSU has made five postseason appearances in its Division I era (1997-Present), and all have come in the last five years. It started with the NCAA tournament in 2012 after the Spartans won their first-ever MEAC title. NSU went to the NIT in 2013 after winning the conference's regular season title at 16-0. NSU also faced Eastern Michigan (2014), Eastern Kentucky (2015) and Columbia (2016).

MEAC Standings

The Spartans have finished no worse than tied for third each of the last five years, the only program in the league to do so. NSU has also finished fourth or better in the MEAC in nine of the last 10 seasons.

MEAC Tournament History

The Spartans advanced to the semifinals last year for the fifth time in the past six years and the seventh time in the last nine seasons. Last year also marked the eighth time in those last nine years that the Spartans entered the tournament as the No. 4 seed or better.

All-Conference

NSU has had a first-team all-conference player in eight of the last nine years, including the last two with departed senior Jeff Short. The Spartans have had at least one all-conference player each of the last 13 years. NSU also had an all-rookie team member (Alex Long) last season for the fourth time in the past six years.

Block Party

NSU ranked No. 23 in the nation with 5.1 blocks per game. They also trailed the 2010-11 team (5.7) for the most blocks per game in school history. The top five seasons in NSU history in terms of total blocks have all come within the last six years, as the program has averaged 163.3 blocks per season during that time.

The Spartans set the school record with 17 blocks against Morgan State on Feb. 13, 2016, surpassing the previous best of 13 set at Savannah State on Jan. 5, 2005. The team's 17 swats was

tied with Houston Baptist for the most in a game in NCAA Division I last year.

Good from the Line

NSU also finished the year third in the nation in field goal percentage (77.5), shattering the previous school record of 72.3 set in 1968-69. NSU hit 80.0 percent in the second half last year as well as 80.9 percent in the last five minutes and overtime.

Good From Long Range

Speaking of school records, Norfolk State tallied 242 3-pointers last year, surpassing the previous best of 198 set in 2011-12. NSU finished with the third-best 3-point field goal percentage in its Division I era (1997-present) with a 34.7 mark last year. NSU had 14 3-pointers against DePaul, South Carolina State and Savannah State last year, breaking the previous school record of 13.

Limit Those Giveaways

The Spartans set yet another school record last year, averaging 12.4 turnovers per contest. The previous low was a 13.1 turnover-per-game mark in 1987-88.

Up That Scoring

NSU averaged 73.4 points per game last year, the most in program history since scoring 76.0 in 1999-2000.

MEAC Rankings

The Spartans led the league last year in free throw percentage (77.5), scoring margin (+0.0) and field goal percentage defense (42.3), while ranking second in scoring offense (73.4), 3-point field goal percentage (34.7), blocks (5.1) and assist-turnover ratio (1.0) and third in turnover margin (+0.76).

Winning Record

NSU has had five straight non-losing seasons. Prior to the start of that streak in 2011-12, NSU had a winning record just twice in 14 seasons since moving to Division I in 1997.

Good from 3

Norfolk State has made a 3-pointer in 215 straight games, dating back to a contest at South Carolina State on Jan. 25, 2010, when NSU finished 0-of-17 from 3-point range.

Ahead at the Half

The Spartans are 80-13 (86.0 winning percentage) since the start of the 2011-12 season when leading or tied at the half.

Conference Streak

NSU secured its 18th straight season last year with a .500 or better record in the MEAC. In fact, in Norfolk State's 61 seasons in a conference, the program has had just one losing conference record (9-10 in the CIAA in 1990-91).

NSU is tied with Wisconsin for eighth in the nation for the longest streak of .500-or-better conference records in a row in Division I (See table page 6). NSU has posted 23 straight .500 or better conference records, dating back to that 1990-91 campaign.

Best in the Conference

Since the start of the 2011-12 season, NSU is 64-16 in regular season conference play (32-8 at home, 32-8 on the road), just ahead of North Carolina Central (63-17) during that time for the best record in the league. Counting MEAC tournament games, the Spartans are 71-19, while the Eagles are 69-21 during that time. NSU also owns a 103-68 overall record since the start of the 2011-12 season, second in the conference to North Carolina Central (105-57).

Winning the State

Since the start of the 2011-12 season, NSU has the third-most wins (103) among the 14 Division I schools in the state of Virginia. The Spar-

tans trail Virginia (134) and VCU (133).

Series Edge

NSU has a winning record against every school in the MEAC, with several of those series covering a lot of ground in the Division II era. The Spartans' closest rival over the years has been S.C. State, in which NSU now leads 19-18. The next closest rivalry is currently North Carolina A&T (24-20).

What Deficit?

NSU has erased a double-digit deficit in a victory nine times in the past two seasons.

Preseason Predictions

NSU was picked to finish fifth in the MEAC this year in the preseason poll of head coaches and sports information directors. Howard and South Carolina State, two teams that arguably return the most talent in the league this year, garnered all but two of the first-place votes and finished 1-2 in the poll. The Spartans also trailed No. 3 Hampton and No. 4 North Carolina Central.

Sitting Out

Guard Steven Whitley will sit out the 2016-17 season after transferring from Robert Morris. He will have three years of eligibility remaining after this year.

O'Quinn's NBA Season

Former Spartan Kyle O'Quinn is now in his fifth year in the NBA and the second with the New York Knicks. He became NSU's first NBA player in 25 years after getting drafted in the second round in 2012 by the Orlando Magic.

NSU Mourns Passing of Spartan Great David Pope

In late October, NSU lost one of its greatest men's basketball players of all-time when David Pope passed away at the age of 55. He played two years in the NBA after leaving school as the career leading scorer. He still ranks second all-time with 2,339 points and holds the school record for field goals (950). Pope was an NABC All-American in 1984 after averaging 23.4 points and 12.1 rebounds.
