Northwestern State Demons (2-3) at Mississippi State Bulldogs (3-2)

Monday, November 28 • 6:00 p.m. Humphrey Coliseum (10,500) • Starkville, Miss.

<u>Series Notes:</u> The Bulldogs lead the 35-year-old series 6-1. They won the last meeting six seasons ago, 82-67, in Jackson on 12/22/11. The Demons won in their last visit to Humphrey Coliseum, rallying from a 21-point halftime deficit to force OT and prevail 76-75 on 11/26/05. That NSU team went on to post 26 wins including an upset of No. 15 Iowa in the NCAA Tournament. All-time, NSU is 13-45, 2-17 under Coach Mike McConathy against SEC foes. The two wins: 2005 in OT at Mississippi State, 2013 by 111-92 at Auburn.

As usual, Demons not ducking away from strong competition

Northwestern State always plays a challenging out-of-conference schedule in November and December. This year's slate began with a demanding weekend swing to 2016 Sweet 16 participant Texas A&M and 2016 Final Four entry Oklahoma.

Now: a 1,559-mile Thanksgiving weekend bus trip to play at Missouri and Mississippi State. On a six-day jaunt, NSU left Thursday, gets home Tuesday. Also on the OOC slate: 2016 postseason participants UTEP and UL Monroe.

A defining stretch should shape NSU's early-season identity

NSU will play for the 3rd time in 6 days Monday night. It's the centerpiece of a hectic 11 days in which the Demons have 5 games, 4 on the road.

Seeking a return to (shooting) form

The Demons return 88% of their scoring from a year ago, and none of the departed seniors were significant scorers. But NSU isn't shooting nearly as well as it did in 2015-16.

From the floor: 37%, a 9% drop from last year's 46%. From 3-point range: 31%, a 5% dip from 36%.

At the FT line: 67%, down 10% from last year's rate that was 10th nationally.

Friends, former Demons in maroon; Demons have an ole 'Dog

New Mississippi State director of athletics John Cohen was baseball coach at NSU from 1998-2001, his first head coaching role. His fundraising created major facility enhancements at bucolic Brown-Stroud Field.

Bulldogs basketball strength coach David Deets was the head strength coach for NSU Athletics until 2003, working a couple of seasons with coach Mike McConathy. They've stayed in contact through the years.

State women's basketball head coach Vic Schaefer was head coach at NSU's Southland Conference rival Sam Houston State for several years.

Former Bulldogs baseball student manager G.T. McCullough is recruiting coordinator and assistant coach for the Demons' baseball program.

Good news, bad news

The Demons have overcome double-digit deficits in the second half of their wins. But they needed to do that against lower-division opponents.

NCAA Division III LeTourneau drained 15 3s in a 56-percent outing behind the arc, had a 15-point first half lead and a 14-point advantage in the second half, 13 with 6:43 to go.

LSU Alexandria is No. 5 nationally in the NAIA Top 25, has two straight national tournament appearances, and at least a half-dozen Division I transfers. The athletic Generals had a 12-point second-half lead.

NSU trailed the lower-division foes for more than half of each game. LeTourneau led for 33:25 and the Demons took the lead for good with 54 seconds remaining. LSUA led for 20:53, but not in the final 3:51.

Demons flash a fierce finishing kick

NSU's wins have a common thread, featuring furious finishes.

The Demons outscored LeTourneau 27-9 in the final seven minutes, triggered by a 15-2 surge in the first four minutes of the run to tie the game at 80. They led for the first time with 1:33 to go, then for good with 0:54 left.

A 29-6 run over nine minutes down the stretch turned a 10-point deficit into a 13-point lead. LSUA didn't make a basket for 5:37, scoring only 2 FTs while fading away in a 15-0 NSU outburst during the final six minutes.

Zeek 23 points from 2nd on school scoring rankings

With 1,851 career points, senior swingman Zeek Woodley is 3rd all-time at NSU. He's 23 shy of second (1,874 by James Wyatt from 1965-69).

Woodley needs 158 points to equal the 40-year-old school career record of 2,009 by Billy Reynolds from 1973-77. Maintaining his 19.3 career average in 94 games, he would top Reynolds in the 13th game of this year. If he gets the 22.2 ppg he's averaged each of the last two seasons, Woodley would take the top spot in the 11th contest.

In his 57th college game, Woodley became the 29th Demon, NSU's youngest player and first sophomore, to score 1,000 career points. Vernon Wilson did it in his second season as a Demon, in 1972-73, and did it faster, posting 1,050 points in 50 games (due to a 1981 fire we can't be sure when he went over 1,000). Wilson was a junior. In those days, freshmen could not play.

Woodley owns 2 of the 7 600-point seasons in Demon history

With 622 points last season, Zeek Woodley joined the injured Jalan West as the only two players in school history to record TWO 600-point seasons. Woodley set the single-season record as a sophomore with 711 points.

He has averaged 22.2 ppg in each of the past two seasons, 11th nationally last year, 2nd in 2014-15.

Woodley is 2nd-leading career scorer in college hoops

Woodley's career 1,851 points ranks 2nd among all active players. James Daniel of Howard leads with 1,899.

His 19.3 career ppg ranks 3rd. Daniel is tops at 21.6 ppg.

One of the country's best shooters

Zeek Woodley's career shooting stats are in rare air. At 56% on FGs, 40% on 3s, his 84% FT aim combines to give him a total shooting score of 180.

As a barometer, only eight players in NBA history (Larry Bird, Steph Curry, Kevin Durant, Steve Nash, Reggie Miller, Mark Price, Dirk Nowitski and Kevin Durant) have posted a combined 180 shooting score over a season.

Zeek closing in on Southland top 10

Along with becoming the top scorer in 104 years of Demon basketball, Zeek Woodley is closing in on a top 10 standing in the 53-yearold Southland Conference.

He is 234 points away from 10th in Southland career scoring.

Woodley on Lou Henson Award Watch List again

For the second straight year, Zeek Woodley has been included by CollegeInsider.com analysts on the Preseason Watch List for the Lou Henson Award presented to the nation's mid-major player of the year. He was among 30 finalists for the award in each of the past two seasons.

Devonte dished prolifically after stepping in for Jalan West

Highlighted by 14 assists at UCA, the 5th highest total in the NCAA last season, Devonte Hall finished 14th nationally and led the Southland with 6.3 assists pg.

The 14 assists missed the 30-year -old NSU single-game school record by 2.

He moved into the first wave as the starting point guard after the loss of Jalan West to a season-ending knee injury in the first game of last season at Ole Miss.

Double jeopardy for Jalan West

It's bad enough to have your senior season stopped after one game, especially when you're an NBA prospect, by a knee injury requiring reconstructive surgery. That happened at the outset of last season to senior point guard Jalan West.

Within three days in May, West graduated, introducing Louisiana Gov. Jon Bel Edwards at the commencement ceremony, then got the fabulous news that the NCAA had approved NSU's waiver for a sixth season of eligibility in 2016-17.

His rehab was perfect until a few days after he was green-lighted seven months later, in late July, to begin basketball activities. Then, making a routine move to the basket in a drill while the Demons prepared for a 4-game August tour of Canada, the same ACL gave way again.

West had surgery in late August. If rehab follows the same timeline, he may be able to begin basketball activities in late February. However, he's already decided to pursue a waiver to get a seventh season, so he can complete work on a second undergraduate degree (in psychology) while playing for the 2017-18 Demons.

He's a student coach until then.

Demons ranked among nation's best on the free throw line

The Demons finished 10th nationally with a 76.6% free throw rate. UConn led the country at 79.3%. A year earlier, the Demons sank 74.9%.

In the last two full seasons combined, NSU hit 75.7% (1,008-1,332) at the line.

The 1981-82 Demons shot 78.4% for the single-season school record.

Scoring depth, an NSU trademark, reached new highs in 2015-16

NSU uses an ensemble approach to putting up points. That's been a staple of the McConathy wave substitution system in 17 seasons.

Last year, nine Demons have scored in double figures, a not-uncommon total under McConathy.

Seven (five returners) posted 20-point performances, a high mark during the McConathy era. The 2013 NCAA Tournament team had six who scored 20+. Only one other McConathy team had 4 players with 20+ outings.

Doing double figures (10 players): Zeek Woodley (27 times), Sabri Thompson (19), Ishmael Lane (17), Devonte Hall (17), Ta'Jon Welcome (5), Bailey Walker (2), Tra'von Joseph (1), Matt Killian (1), Malik Metoyer (1), and Jalan West (1).

20+ games (7 players): Woodley had four 30-point games and 15 20-point games. Hall, Thompson and Lane have each posted 2 20-pointers. West had a 20-point game. Welcome and Walker each have a 20-point game.

A season earlier, nine Demons scored in double digits, and three had 20-point outings.

Sabri Thompson is an academic star, nominee for NABC Good Works Team, Wooden Citizenship Award

Senior guard Sabri Thompson has a 3.71 GPA with a double major, in business administration and accounting, and a 12.6 scoring average last season. He did not make last season's five-man Academic All-District 6 team that included two lowa players and all five members north of Missouri, but did earn Academic All-Southland Conference honors and will be an Academic All-America nominee again later this season.

Thompson is the basketball team's representative on the Student -Athlete Advisory Committee at NSU.

He does extensive community service work and is a nominee for the NABC's Allstate Good Works Team, and the Wooden Citizenship Cup.

Thompson starred as NSU finished 4-0 run on August tour of Toronto

Sabri Thompson poured in 34 points, hitting 12 of 15 shots, including all 7 of his 3-pointers, to lead NSU to an 85-80 exhibition win Aug. 17 at the University of Toronto's Varsity Blues.

A few days before, Toronto had beaten UNLV on a neutral floor.

That game capped a 4-0 sweep by NSU in as many nights in the Toronto area. The Demons whipped Waterloo, grinded by the Guelph Gryphons, and dumped York on the tour.

West's injury set an ominous tone for a miserable 2015-16 season

Losing NBA prospect Jalan West for the year at the end of the season opener rocked the 2015-16 Demons, who never really recovered.

In last year's 8-20 nightmare, NSU won 5 of its last 12, but dropped 3 straight and 5 of its last 6. Two of the late-season losses were decided at the final buzzer by missed 3-pointers, and another at the buzzer on a missed 5-footer. A win in one of those would have gotten the Demons to the eight-team Southland Conference Tournament.

The team was expected to challenge the Southland supremecy of Stephen F. Austin, but instead had NSU's first losing mark in six seasons.

Demons struggled without West, Joseph, Koontz

Last year, Northwestern State was picked to push Stephen F. Austin

for the Southland championship, a consensus second-place pick in polls and preseason magazines. A season-opening, season-ending knee injury to senior point guard Jalan West was the defining event of the 2015-16 campaign. West, an NBA Draft prospect, watched games in street clothes on the bench as the Demons, who scheduled aggressively OOC anticipating opportunities for upsets, struggled to find a new identity.

Complicating matters: one of 2014-15's more productive players, junior swingman Tra'von Joseph, returned from his second knee surgery in nine months and didn't approach his sophomore season's productivity, although he showed flashes since he came back from Dec. 2 arthroscopic surgery.

True freshman center Colby Koontz, expected to form a post tandem with fellow rookie Ishmael Lane, missed the entire season with concussion issues after an Oct. 12 collision in practice. The 6-9, 250-pounder was expected to provide rebounding and interior defense NSU lacked.

Koontz still on the shelf as season begins, may play baseball in 2017

Still seeking solutions to his concussion-related issues, redshirt freshman Colby Koontz has yet to return to full-speed basketball as the 2016-17 season begins. There have been some hopeful developments recently, however. The son of Oklahoma Sooners' women's basketball great (two-time All-Big 8 pick Angi Guffy, 11th in school history with 1,511 points from 1991-95) and Sooners' football center Brent Koontz would have loved to line up at OU, but not this time, sadly. He did dress out and go through warmups.

Academic achievement, an NSU standard in the McConathy era

The Demons have been standouts since the NCAA began its Academic Progress Rate and the Graduation Success Rate 11 years ago.

Twice NSU has earned national recognition from the NCAA for outstanding APR scores in men's basketball, including May 2014.

In last year's Graduation Success Rate report, the Demons topped all public institutions in Louisiana with their 85% score in men's hoops, and ranked 2nd among the 13 Southland Conference programs.

In coach Mike McConathy's first 17 seasons, nearly 90 percent of the seniors who have played for him, including those he inherited in 1999-2000, have graduated.

Community service is second nature

The Demons' program mission statement is "Championship Basketball—With A Purpose."

That is rooted in commitment to academic success and extensive community service.

NSU basketball has been involved in nearly 80 community service organized endeavors during the careers of the 2016-17 senior class, ranging from cleaning projects to school and hospital visits, and assisting with charity fundraisers and events.

NABC Guardians of the Game honor For NSU, Coach Mike in 2012

One of NSU's continuing service initiatives netted Coach McConathy, and by extension, the Demon program, the 2012 National Association of Basketball Coaches' prestigious "Guardians of the Game Pillar Award for Education" during the 2012 Final Four.

McConathy and some Demon players have conducted a reading

incentive program with students at Zwolle Junior High School for several years. It culminates with the qualifying students getting VIP treatment at a February home game.

McConathy has his master's in education, plus 30 hours, both from NSU well before he got hired here.

Demons are homegrown

Throughout the first 17 seasons of the Mike McConathy era, Coach Mike typically increased the amount of players recruited from Louisiana, ranging from 23% of the roster in the 1999 season to a century-high 86% in 2010.

Nine of 16 Demons (56%) this season are Louisiana natives. Two are Californians, and one each is from Delaware, Arkansas, Texas, Florida and Oklahoma.

Last year, the Demons had 10 of their 15 players (67%) from the Pelican State.

The Demons have 11 players on average from Louisiana each season, with the highest amount escalating to 17 of 20 players in 2005, and the lowest number dropping to 3 of 13, a mere 23%, in McConathy's first season before he got to recruit on a broad scale.

3 Demons know championships

NSU has three players whose teams won a combined 6 high school state championships.

Sabri Thompson was part of three state championship teams at Sanford School in Hockessin, Delaware. His team was a state finalist in his senior year.

Zeek Woodley's Pelican-All Saints HS won state in his last two seasons after a semifinal trip in his sophomore year.

Devonte Hall was a freshman starter on a state title-winning team in 2011 at Bossier HS.

Southland success is a continuing saga under Coach Mike

In 17 seasons under coach Mike McConathy, the Demons have won 58% of their games vs. Southland Conference foes. In the last three years, NSU is 50-23 (68%) against league opponents (including conference tournament play) and is 57-32 (64%) in the last four years.

State collegiate coaching wins record owned by McConathy

Demon coach Mike McConathy is both the winningest men's college coach in state history and the career leader for state college coaches including women's basketball, which in Louisiana folds in a stout group. He has 621 victories in his 34th season, 18 seasons at NSU and 16 at Bossier Parish Community College.

Grambling's Fred Hobdy was 572-288 when he retired after 30 years in 1986 and is in the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame.

In women's basketball, Leon Barmore won 576 games at Louisiana Tech on his way to the Basketball Hall of Fame (2003 inductee), as well as the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame.

McConathy is 181-140 (.573) against Southland opponents (163-131 regular season, 18-9 in conference tournament play).

His overall NSU record includes 78 regular-season "guarantee" road games, with four wins (2013 at Auburn, and in 2005 at Oklahoma State, at Mississippi State, vs. Oregon State), making him 263-181 (.595) otherwise — including two NCAA Tournament wins.

McConathy will coach his 1,043rd college game at Mizzou. That includes 511 in 16 seasons at BPCC and 533 in his 18 years with NSU.

McConathy's extended tenure puts him in elite company

Out of 347 Division I basketball programs, Coach McConathy is among only 17 current head coaches that have been in that post at the same school for 17 years or more. Others: Mike Krzyzewski of Duke, Tom Izzo at Michigan State, Steve Fischer at San Diego State, Kevin Stallings at Vanderbilt and Jim Boeheim of Syracuse.

Juco head coaches on NSU bench

Former junior college head coaches Bill Lewit and Jeff Moore provide head coaching experience for the Demons. Lewit won a NJCAA national championship at Cecil College (Md.) in 2006 and was head coach there for 14 seasons from 1995-2009. Moore was head coach at John Wood (III.) from 1997-2002.

Va. Tech's Williams, McNeese's Simmons, UNO's Slessinger, New Mexico State's Weir all came from McConathy's staff

Four Division I head coaches were on Mike McConathy's staff at NSU: Virginia Tech's Buzz Williams (3rd season there, 9th overall), McNeese's Dave Simmons (11th), Mark Slessinger of UNO (6th), and New Mexico State's first-year coach Paul Weir.

Three more former Demon assistants run Division I teams

Two former J.D. Barnett assistants, Steve Payne (Tennessee Tech) and Duggar Baucom (The Citadel) are veteran head coaches after stints at NSU. Another former NSU assistant under Dan Bell in 1988-89, Billy Kennedy, is the Texas A&M coach.

Two former Demon point guards are successful coaches

Southern's Roman Banks is one of the Demons' all-time great players, ranking 9th in career scoring, 3rd in assists and 7th in steals. He's guided the Jaguars to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, including last season, and begins his sixth season with a 99-67 record.

Then there's Mike Brey ...

Notre Dame's Mike Brey made Demons' All-Century team

In his 17th season in South Bend, head coach Mike Brey has elevated Notre Dame among the nation's top programs.

The Rockville, Md.-DeMatha product played guard for the Demons (1977-80) and is 9th in school history with 311 assists (4.3 pg).

In March 2013 he was named to the Demons' All-Century Fab 50 Team for the Modern Era (1976-2012) as NSU played its 100th year of basketball.

Demons potent in Prather

The Northwestern State basketball team begins its 52nd year of playing in Prather Coliseum.

The Demons are 41-14 in Prather Coliseum since the start of the 2012-13 season, 66-20 in the last 5 years, and have won 71% at home (162-66) under coach Mike McConathy.

They're 37-14 at home in Southland games in the last five seasons, including a 26-9 mark since the start of the 2012-13 campaign.

All-time, NSU is 418-224 (.652) in Prather since the 1964-65 season when David Clark hit a layup to score the first points in the building.

NSU either 1st or 2nd nationally in scoring for three seasons

The Demons were the NCAA team scoring champion in 2015 after

finishing second in the previous two seasons. NSU ranked No. 1 nationally in scoring during the regular season all three years Jalan West has been the point guard. Over those three seasons, the Demons averaged 85.1 ppg, with a high of 86.6 in 2013-14.







A "Demon" in the Rough - Mike McConathy 34th season in college coaching, 38th overall • 621-422 career record (.597) • 269-263 (.506), 18th season at NSU

Times have changed with Coach Mike in charge

When he was hired as head coach at his father's alma mater in March 1999. Mike McConathy took the helm of a basketball program that was, to put it kindly, struggling.

Prior to Coach Mike's arrival, NSU had only five winning seasons in 24 years of NCAA Division I competition. The high points of modern-day Demon basketball before McConathy were a stunning upset win on Dec. 7, 1988 at Rupp Arena to hand Kentucky its first home-opening loss in 21 seasons, and a 1994 NCAA team scoring title. Five previous coaches, including a couple who had been highly successful elsewhere (Wayne Yates, J.D. Barnett), had been unable to establish sustained success.

Then, and now:

Then - 5 winning seasons in 24 years, 5 straight losing seasons going into 1999-

- 11 winning seasons in 17 years, including 5 of the last 6

Then - no 20-win seasons in 23 years of Division I membership; only one since

- 3 20-win seasons in the last 11 years, back-to-back 20-win seasons in 2004-06; all-time best 26-8 mark in 2005-06

Then - No postseason tournament appearances

Now - 2-3 record in three NCAA Tournaments (2001, 2006, 2013); 2015 CIT

Then - no conference championship in 13 seasons in the SLC, 3 seasons in the Gulf Star Conference and 3 in the Trans-America Conference

Now - Southland Conference regular-season crowns in 2005,2006; SLC Tournament titles in 2001, 2006, 2013; 2007 SLC East Division championship

Then - no conference tournament championship game appearances

Now - 7 SLC Tournament championship game appearances 2000, 2001, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2013) in 11 tourney appearances with three wins (2001, 2006, 2013). Each of the losses came down to the final minute.

Then - attendance for NSU home games in Prather Coliseum was about 1,200 per

Now - in 14 home games in 2005-06, the Demons set an all-time record with an average of 2,340 fans. Four of the top five crowds in 45 seasons in Prather Coliseum, all exceeding seating capacity (baseline to baseline) of 3,400, have come under Coach Mike. During the 2013-14 season, NSU averaged 1,857 per game at home. Last year, NSU averaged 1,936 in 15 games, and in 9 Southland games, the average was 2,077, including 3,612 vs. SFA.

Then - no national television appearances, 4 regional television appearances

Now - 31 national telecasts (4 on CBS, 10 on ESPN/ESPN2/ESPNU, 2 on Big Ten Network, 11 on ESPN3, 3 SEC Network), 31 more regional telecasts

in 17+ seasons, producing a total of 58 TV games.

Then - Demons had won 62% of their home games in 33 seasons in Prather Coliseum

- Demons have won 71% of their home games (161-66) under Coach Mike, including a 65-19 (77%) record in the last 5+ seasons.

Then - NSU's graduation rate for basketball was below par nationally

- The Demons have graduated nearly 90% of the seniors who have played under Coach Mike. NSU had

a perfect NCAA APR (Academic Progress Rate) score in May 2012 to earn its second "public recognition" among the NCAA's top 10% in that report (also 2006). Received another NCAA public recognition in 2014. Lead state, SLC in Graduation Success Rate scores almost every year.

Noteworthy on Coach Mike

- Four of his former assistant coaches, Dave Simmons (11th year, McNeese State), Mark Slessinger (6th year, New Orleans), Buzz Williams (3rd year, Va. Tech), and Paul Weir (1st year, New Mexico State) have become head coaches of Division I programs. Simmons and Williams were his two primary assistants in his first NCAA Tournament season (2000-01). Simmons, Slessinger and Weir were on the staff when the Demons beat lows in the 2006 NCAA Tournament.
- He was the first Northwestern State head coach in any sport to receive a multipleyear contract, getting a four-year package at a base of \$99,000 per year in spring 2006 and having the package extended and upgraded in 2008 to \$125,000 and extended again and enhanced in 2013. Louisiana law requires one-year contracts for state employees unless guaranteed with private funds (or by elections!).
- His record includes 78 games played at a "power conference" foe, winning at Auburn, Oklahoma State and Mississippi State
- UTEP head coach Tim Floyd and McConathy were suitemates and teammates at Louisiana Tech, where they were recruited by future NBA head coach (Jazz, Bulls, Pistons) Scotty Robertson. Floyd and McConathy stay in contact.
- He is married to his college sweetheart. Connie McConathy, a former HS English teacher, manages the Bossier Parish community College branch located on the NSU campus. They are proud grandparents of Miles and Miller McConathy, sons of former Demon player Logan and former Lady Demon Lyndzee Greene McConathy. Mike is called "Pops" and Connie is "Honey."
- His late father, Johnny, starred for Northwestern in 1947-51 and was the No. 5 pick in the 1951 NBA Draft, going to Syracuse. His dad grew up on a farm in Bienville Parish and heard the roar of gunshots 6 miles away when Bonnie and Clyde were taken out in 1934. Johnny passed away April 19.
- He does a live pregame radio interview courtside on the Demon Sports Network. 15 minutes before tipoff. Pregame, he doesn't seguester himself in the locker room or his office. At home games he goes through the stands and into the booster room, greeting fans. He's also typically out visiting around the court pregame for road games.
- He is on the voting panel for the ESPN/USA Today coaches' Top 25 poll for the 11th straight season.
- A thoroughbred horse named for him, "Coach Mike," won \$300,000 in 3 years. The horse was a filly and just like Coach Mike's teams, loved to run.
