- Georgia State will face an SEC opponent for the second-straight season and the second time this year (Lost at Auburn, 83-65, 11/14).
- GSU's last win over an SEC opponent came on 12/22/03 scoring a 77-72 win at Auburn.
- Georgia State has four wins in program history over SEC programs (0-2 vs. Miss. St.).
- Ron Hunter enters play with 107 wins at GSU, tied for most in program history.
- With a win tonight, Hunter will become one of just seven coaches to be the all-time winningest coach at multiple schools.
- Georgia State is 4-2 to start the season for the third-straight year, tied for the best sixgame start in head coach Ron Hunter's six seasons.
- Senior Willie Clayton is currently No. 4 in the Sun Belt averaging 8.3 per game.
- Junior Isaiah Williams is averaging 18.5 points in the last two games, shooting 12-of-16 from the floor and 5-of-6 from 3-point range.
- Georgia State won the Mayan Division of the Cancun Challenge last week.
- Georgia State is 39-4 in the comfy confines of the GSU Sports Arena since the 2013-14 season, including an 18-game winning streak.
- GSU has three players over or approaching 100 career games played. Willie Clayton (102), Jeremy Hollowell (98) and Justin Seymour (96).
- Freshman D'Marcus Simonds was named tournament MVP of the Cancun Challenge after scoring 26 points in the opener against NJIT.
- Senior Justin Seymour was named to the Cancun Challenge All-Tournament Team after knocking down 5-of-6 from 3-point range against EKU.
- Georgia State was picked to finish third in the Sun Belt Preseason Poll behind UT Arlington and defending champion Little Rock.
- Georgia State is 67-29 (.698) since Dec. 14, 2013.

GOING FOR A THIRD

Since joining the Sun Belt three years ago, Georgia State has won two conference regular season titles, advanced to two conference tournament finals, and won one tournament title in New Orleans.

Over the three year stretch, the Panthers are 41-17 in Sun Belt Conference regular season games.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS!

Georgia State won the Mayan Division of the Cancun Challenge over Thanksgiving with a pair of impressive wins. The Panthers knocked off NJIT 73-53 on Nov. 22, before taking the championship with an 82-65 victory over Eastern Kentucky.

Freshman D'Marcus Simonds was named tournament MVP after an impressive 26 point performance against NJIT, while senior Justin Seymour also earned all-tournament honors following a 5-of-6 3-point performance against Eastern Kentucky.

Georgia State opened the tournament with tough losses to Auburn 83-65 on Nov. 14, before nearly upsetting No. 15 Purdue on Nov. 18.

HEAD OF THE CLASS...ALMOST

Head coach Ron Hunter owns the records for the most wins in his first season, first two seasons, first three seasons, first four seasons and first five seasons of any coach in GSU program history. Legendary coach Charles "Lefty" Driesell won 99 games in

his first five seasons at Georgia State, MOST WINS BY COACH only to be surpassed by Hunter who won 103 games in his first four years. With four wins this year, Hunter moved ahead of Driesell and tied Bob Reinhart's school record of 107. Ironically, Reinhart, now a scout for the Miami Heat, was in teh building when Hunter tied the record.

GEORGIA STATE VS. THE SEC

Georgia State will face the second of two SEC opponents this year on Sunday night. The Panthers lost at Auburn 83-65 earlier this year. Last year, the Panthers nearly upset Ole Miss when GSU trailed by two with just 2:18 to play before falling 68-58.

Georgia State's last win over an SEC opponent came with a 77-72 victory over Auburn on Dec. 22, 2003.

The Panthers have four wins over SEC opponents. Head coach Ron Hunter is 0-9 all-time (Georgia State and IUPUI) against the SEC, having faced Vanderbilt three times, Auburn and Ole Miss twice, and Alabama and Kentucky once each.

Georgia State nearly pulled off one of the biggest upsets of the early portion of the season at No. 15 Purdue on Nov. 18. The Panthers led the Boilermakers 56-44 with 7:12 to play before Purdue finished the game on a 20-0 run to earn a 64-56 win.

HOME SWEET HOME

When coach Ron Hunter took over the Panthers, one of the first things he proclaimed was that the GSU Sports Arena would become one of the toughest places in the country. So far, he has been correct. The Panthers are 48-11 in the comfy confines of the Sports Arena since his arrival.

The Panthers have gone 38-4 at home the last three-plus seasons. During that span, Georgia State put together an 18-game winning streak which ranks second-longest in school history. The Panthers have currently won three-straight home games.



Here are the longest home court winning streaks in school history:

CLAYTON RECOGNIZED BY NABC

The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced on Nov. 30 an all-time high of 278 nominees for the 2017 Allstate NABC and WBCA Good Works Teams*. Among the elite group was senior Willie Clayton who is in his first year with the Panthers.

The Thomasville, Ga., native has been extremely involved in the community before even going to college. He is consistently doing service projects with his fraternity and traveled with the Panthers to the Dominican Republic last summer to distribute shoes with Samaritan's Feet.

This esteemed award honors an outstanding group of studentathletes who represent the sport's finest in the areas of community service and leadership among their peers.

Athletic departments and sports information directors across the country nominated the 181 NABC and the 97 WBCA student-athletes for the prestigious honor. The final roster of 20 award recipients will be unveiled in February.

RECORD-SETTING OPENER

Georgia State opened the season with a record-setting 111-69 victory over Thomas. The Panthers scored 100 points or more for the first time in just under two years (Tennessee Temple, Nov. 14, 2014). GSU improved to 27-4 all-time when scoring more than 100 points.

The Panthers also finished the game with 13 blocked shots, just one shy of the school-record of 14 set against FIU on Dec. 1, 2011. The 42-point margin of victory is the sixth-most in school history.

ON TO THE PROS

Under head coach Ron Hunter, the number of former Georgia State players to go on to play professionally has greatly increased.

Two years ago, R.J. Hunter was selected with the 28th pick in the first round of the NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics. He was signed by the Chicago Bulls in late October. Also from two years ago, Ryan Harrow went to play overseas in Greece and is now in Italy. Curtis Washington has already played professionally in Hong Kong before going to Argentina and seeing action in the NBDL.

From last year's team, Markus Crider is currently playing in Portugal while Kevin Ware has gone on to play in Finland.

Eric Buckner (Turkey), Manny Atkins (Luxemborg), Josh Micheaux (Germany), Ousmann Krubally (Kazakhstan) and Curtis Washington (Tunisia) are also playing overseas.

SEEN WORLDWIDE ON THE WORLDWIDE LEADER

For the second-straight year, all Georgia State home games will air live on ESPN3 this season. With the program's rise, nearly every game will be seen worldwide this year. Of the Panthers 30 games, 23 are currently scheduled to air live with more projected to be picked up for TV in the coming weeks.

Sam Crenshaw returns for the second year of calling play-byplay for home games. This year he will be joined by former Panther Rodney "Truck" Turner who will handle color duties.

Among the highlights are the game at Auburn (SEC Network), Purdue (Big Ten Network) and Mississippi State (SEC Network+. Both games of the Cancun Challenge aired on YouTube Live.

GOING BAREFOOT

Coach Ron Hunter once again coached a game barefoot in support of Samaritan's Feet. He went without shoes against Wright State on Nov. 30 as the Panthers earned an 81-74 win. It was the first time that he and the opposing coach were barefoot as Raider head coach Scott Nagy joined the cause in 2009.

The Panthers are 6-0 when Hunter has gone without socks and shoes to raise awareness for the 300 million children around the world without shoes. This marked the 10th straight year Hunter has gone barefoot for a game.

As part of his work with Samaritan's Feet, Georgia State has travelled to South Africa (2012), Costa Rica (2014) and the Dominican Republic (2016) to take part in shoe distributions with the organization.

SIGN ON THE DOTTED LINE

Georgia State head coach Ron Hunter announced the signing of two highly-touted high school stars on Nov. 8 as Josh Linder of Kathleen, Ga., and Kane Williams of Douglasville, Ga., were signed to National Letters of Intent.

Linder earned All-Middle Georgia and all-county honors last season and has been ranked as high as a 3-star with a national rank of No. 45 by Future150.com. The same site has Linder ranked No. 14 in the country at his position and No. 3 in Georgia.

Williams, a four-year starter, earned Paulding County Player of the Year honors last season along with first-team all-region and first-team all-county honors. He also earned all-state first-team honors and was recognized as the top junior player for his classification by Hoopseen.com.

WHAT'S IN A COLOR

Georgia State has three different color jerseys this year, bringing back an alternate black jersey color for the third year in a row. He is the Panthers record in each color jersey and the last game it was worn.



HEAD COACH RON HUNTER

In five seasons, Ron Hunter has changed the national perception of Georgia State; winning 103 games and advancing to the postseason three teams. It was highlighted this past year by winning 25 games for a second year in a row and advancing to the third round of the NCAA tournament following the shocking upset of No. 3-seed Baylor.





With the team's success in 2013-14 and 2014-15, Georgia State entered elite status by winning 25 or more games in each of those two years, an accomplishment only reached by 20 programs in the entire country.

Hunter is now responsible for three of the four winningest seasons in program history and half of the school's postseason appearances.

Last season, Georgia State had its third-straight winning season and garnered a 7-2 non-conference record, the third-best in program history.

After winning the Sun Belt regular season title for the second straight season in 2014-15, the Panthers claimed the tournament title, just the third for the program to advance to the NCAA tournament. In the postgame celebration, Hunter tore his Achilles, a clip that went viral across the nation.

Coaching in the NCAA tournament from a stool, the Panthers trailed by 12 with 2:53 to play, before mounting a furious 13-0 run, capped by a 30-foot 3-pointer from son R.J. that sent Hunter off his stool and became one of the most watched clips of the tournament and a part of 'One Shining Moment.'

Although successful in his first two seasons at the helm, the Panthers started to pile up the wins during the 2013-14 season. Winning 25 games, second most in school history, Georgia State earned a Sun Belt regular season championship and an appearance in the Postseason NIT. During the season, the Panthers won a school-record 14-straight games, including a stretch of 22 of 23, as Hunter was named Sun Belt Coach of the Year and NABC Region 24 Coach of the Year.

During his first season (2011-12), Georgia State won 22 games, the fourth most in school history, advancing to the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

Hunter has won 377 games in 22 seasons, but the accomplishments made by the 2011-12 team will always be special for him. After being named head coach on March 21, 2011, he built a squad that finished in the top 20 in the nation in scoring defense, defensive shooting percentage, steals and blocked shots, as six seniors finished their careers triumphantly.

Following the record-setting season, Hunter was named Atlanta Tip-off Club Georgia Coach of the Year, while his players earned a record number of conference and national awards.

National notoriety is nothing new for Hunter. While at IUPUI, he was lauded for his humanitarian efforts, partnering with Samaritan's Feet, an organization that collects shoes for underprivileged children around the world.

Named Summit League Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2006, Hunter led IUPUI to the conference championship game five times from 2002-10, including the 2003 title game victory over top-seeded Valparaiso.

Hunter, 52, earned his bachelor's degree in education at Miami (Ohio) in 1986 and added a master's in 1987. Hunter and his wife, Amy, have two children, Jasmine (26) and R.J. (23). R.J. was a stand-out for the Panthers and was selected by the Boston Celtics with the 28th pick in the first round of the NBA Draft in 2015. Before the start of the season, he signed a contract to play with the Chicago Bulls.

Led by a double-double from Willie Clayton and 23 points from Jeremy Hollowell, Georgia State cruised to a 111-69 win over Thomas in the regular season opener at the GSU Sports Arena.

Clayton nearly picked up his 18th career double-double in the first half before finishing with 11 points, 13 rebounds and five blocked shots in 26 minutes. He shot 5-of-6 from the floor and added two steals

The Panthers finished the game with 13 blocked shots, just one shy of the school-record of 14 set against FIU on Dec. 1, 2011. The 42-point margin of victory is the sixth-most in school history. Hollowell played 19 minutes, making 11-of-12 free throws and a pair of 3-pointers. He and Clayton were two of five Panthers to finish in double figures as Jeff Thomas came off the bench to score 17, while freshman D'Marcus Simonds added 11 and sophomore Austin Donaldson scored 10.

Georgia State (1-0) improved to 6-0 in regular season openers under head coach Ron Hunter.

The Panthers scored 100 points or more for the first time in just under two years. Georgia State last crossed the century mark with 115 points against Tennessee Temple on Nov. 14, 2014. GSU improved to 27-4 all-time when scoring more than 100 points.

Defensively, the Panthers finished 16 steals, just one shy of the top 10 for a single-game in school history, while forcing Thomas into 25 turnovers which led to 37 points. Donaldson and Simonds each swiped three steals for the Panthers.

After a slow start in which Thomas took an early 13-11 lead as Javoris Cooks knocked down three 3-pointers, Georgia State used a 9-0 run to take a 20-13 lead with 10:51 to play.

Cooks finished the game with 24 points for the Night Hawks, making six 3-pointers. Traevon Graham came off the bench to add 12 points.

Minutes later, the Panthers used a 7-0 run to take a 32-19 lead with 7:17 remaining and never looked back. Georgia State went into the half leading 57-32 after using an 11-0 run with just under two minutes to play.

Making their Georgia State debuts, redshirt-sophomore Devin Mitchell and senior Justin Seymour each scored eight points, while sophomore Malik Benlevi also scored eight.

Despite 20 points from both Jeremy Hollowell and Justin Seymour, Georgia State fell to Auburn 83-65 on Monday evening at Auburn Arena in the opening game of the Cancun Challenge. In uncharacteristic fashion, Georgia State (1-1) was called for 31 fouls and turned the ball over 18 times, including 15 in the first half, as two Panthers fouled out late in the game.

After shooting just 39.3 percent in the first half, Auburn (2-0) made 14-of-25 in the second half and knocked down 16-of-20 from the free throw line to pull away late. Georgia State trailed by just nine with 4:08 to play before the Tigers finished the game on a 13-4 run.

Hollowell scored 10 points in each half, knocking down 8-of-8 from the free throw line while pulling down five rebounds and dishing out four assists.

Seymour, one of four transfers in the starting line-up, scored 15 of his 20 points in the second half, going 8-of-16 from the floor while knocking down three 3-pointers.

After recording a double-double in the opener, senior Willie Clayton finished with just six points and four rebounds in 20 minutes, picking up a pair of fouls early in the first half before heading to the bench.

Danjel Purifoy and Jared Harper led Auburn with 19 points each, while Mustapha Heron just missed a double-double with 10 points and eight rebounds.

Georgia State was looking for its first win over an SEC opponent since a five-point win over Auburn in 2003. The Panthers will get another shot when they face Mississippi State in early December.

Both teams got in foul trouble early as nine fouls were called before the first media timeout and Auburn was in the bonus just over five minutes into the game.

Trailing by two, Auburn used a 6-0 run late in the half to take a 28-24 lead with 3:45 to play and went into the locker room leading 35-30.

After Georgia State cut the deficit to just two, 39-37 just over four minutes into the second half, Auburn responded with an 8-0 run to take a 47-37 lead with 14:29 to play before a Seymour 3-pointer.

NO. 15 PURDUE 64. GEORGIA STATE 56

Mackey Arena • West Lafayette, Ind. Cancun Challenge

Georgia State led for more than 30 minutes, but No. 15 Purdue finished the game on a 20-0 run to give the Boilermakers a 64-56 win over the Panthers at Mackey Arena on Friday night in the Cancun Challenge.

In his return to Indiana, senior Jeremy Hollowell finished with 15 points and five rebounds. Hollowell, who grew up in Indianapolis and attended Lawrence Central High School before playing two seasons at Indiana, opened the game red-hot, scoring nine points on 4-of-5 shooting before the second media timeout.

Georgia State (1-2) led 56-44 with 7:12 to play following a bucket by sophomore Malik Benlevi, quieting a crowd of 14,302. As four Panthers fouled out, Purdue (2-1) was able to take advantage, finishing the game 25-of-37 from the free throw line while Georgia State was just 7-of-11.

Georgia State had been looking to equal the highest-ranked opponent it had ever defeated in program history (St. Joseph's – 2001), but fell to 3-23 all-time against AP Top 25 teams.

Freshman D'Marcus Simonds added 13 points on 6-of-9 shooting for the Panthers.

Purdue was led by Caleb Swanigan who recorded a double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds. Isaac Haas added 11 points, but the 7-2 big man was held without a rebound.

Georgia State held Purdue to just 37.8 percent shooting and 22.7 percent from 3-point range, while outrebounding the bigger Boilermakers 35-26.

As the game opened, Georgia State forced Purdue to miss 11 of its first 14 shots and kept the Boilermakers in check for the entire first half as they shot just 32 percent from the floor and 1-of-10 from 3-point range.

Georgia State went into the half leading 30-27.

The Panthers continued to push the pace in the second half, leading by double-digits on multiple occasions. With the shot clock about to expire with just under 12 minutes to play, Austin Donaldson pushed to the rim to give Georgia State a 51-39 lead.

On nearly three straight possessions, three Panthers followed out the game. Jordan Session was called for his fifth with 10:37 to play, followed by Willie Clayton with 10:24 remaining. Less than a minute later, Isaiah Dennis was called for his fifth with 9:35 to play. Before the game ended, Malik Benlevi also fouled out as Georgia State was called for 31 fouls.

Despite three players fouling out, Georgia State pushed the lead to 13 with 8:13 to play, but from that point were held to just one field goal the rest of the game.

Georgia State closed the first half on an 18-0 run to propel the Panthers to a 74-53 win over NJIT on Tuesday afternoon in the first game of the Cancun Challenge at the Hard Rock Riviera Maya. The Panthers were led by freshman D'Marcus Simonds who scored a career-high 26 points.

Simonds finished 11-of-15 from the floor, sparking the first half run after coming off the bench.

Isaiah Dennis added 10 points on 5-of-6 shooting, while also grabbing five rebounds. Senior Willie Clayton, playing in his 100 th career game, just missed a double-double with eight points and nine rebounds. Senior Jeremy Hollowell also came up just shy, scoring nine points and grabbing seven boards.

The Panthers came out equally hot in the second half. Leading 44-34 just under five minutes into the half, GSU used an 8-0 run with a pair of Simonds' baskets to build a 52-34 lead with 11:05 remaining.

NJIT used a 6-0 run to cut Georgia State's lead to 54-43 with 8:01 to play, but the Panthers responded with a 6-0 as the Highlanders were never able to cut the lead to single digits.

After shooting 52.6 percent in the first half, Georgia State held NJIT to just 22.6 percent shooting in the second half and just 34.0 percent for the game.

Georgia State finished the day shooting 57.1 percent from the floor, dominating the paint 50-12, as well as on the bench which outscored the Highlanders 43-9.

GEORGIA STATE 82, EASTERN KENTUCKY 65

Hard Rock Riviera Maya Hotel • Cancun, Mexico Cancun Challenge

Georgia State won the Mayan Division of the Cancun Challenge at the Hard Rock Riviera Maya Hotel with an impressive 82-65 win over Eastern Kentucky. Senior Justin Seymour, who was named to the all-tournament team, finished with 15 points, knocking down 5-of-6 from 3-point range.

A day after scoring 26 points, freshman D'Marcus Simonds earned all-tournament MVP honors adding eight points and three steals in just 23 minutes for GSU which improved to 3-2.

Junior Isaiah Williams led the Panthers on Wednesday with 18 points on 6-of-8 shooting, knocking down a pair from 3-point range as Georgia State went 9-of-18 from beyond the arc. Despite 21 points from Nick Mayo and 10 points and eight rebounds from Zach Charles. Eastern Kentucky fell to 2-4.

After Georgia State took an early 6-4 lead, Eastern Kentucky responded with a 12-0 run to take a 16-6 with 14:39 to play. It marked the second-straight game the Panthers got down by 10 points early, before the defense stepped up.

Seymour helped spark a 14-0 Georgia State run as the Panthers took a 20-16 lead with just over 10 minutes to play. The Panthers pushed the run to 20-3 and led 26-19 with 7:32 and never looked back, leading for nearly 33 minutes of the game.

Seymour finished the first half with 12 points, going 4-of-4 from 3-point range as the Panthers led 41-33 at the half. Dating back to his days at Murray State, Seymour has knocked down 12-of-16 3-pointers against Eastern Kentucky in his last three match-ups with the Colonels.

Georgia State's bench outscored the Colonels 24-0 in the first 20 minutes, while holding Eastern Kentucky to just 3-of-16 from 3-point range.

Senior Willie Clayton just missed another double-double with nine points and 15 rebounds, including seven on the offensive glass.

On a night when both head coaches went barefoot to raise awareness for Samaritan's Feet, Georgia State earned an 81-74 win over Wright State in the GSU Sports Arena. Senior Jeremy Hollowell knocked down a career-high six 3-pointers and finished with 22 points to lead the Panthers.

Georgia State head coach Ron Hunter improved to 10-0 when coaching without shoes to raise awareness for Samaritan's Feet.

Hollowell, who scored 20 or more for the third time this season, finished 8-of-14 from the floor and 6-of-11 from 3-point range.

Junior Isaiah Williams added 19 points on 6-of-8 shooting and 3-of-4 from 3-point range in just 23 minutes. He and Hollowell combined for nine of Georgia State's 11 3-pointers.

Georgia State (4-2) improved to 39-4 in the GSU Sports Arena since the start of the 2013-14 season. Wright State (6-2) dropped just its second game of the season as Raider head coach Scott Nagy also coached barefoot. He was among the first two follow in Hunter's footsteps will working as the head coach at South Dakota State.

Despite trailing by as many as 24 in the second half, Wright State cut the lead to as few as five with just over a minute to play as Grant Benzinger got hot for the Raiders, finishing with 32 points, going 9-of-18 from the floor and 6-of-12 from 3-point range. He also grabbed eight rebounds and shot 8-of-9 from the free throw line.

The win marked the 107th for Hunter at GSU, tying him with former head coach Bob Reinhart for the most in school history.

S-of-6 early. The Raiders took a 21-15 lead with 11:21 to play in the opening half, before both teams went through a cold stretch. Georgia State missed 8-of-9, while Wright State missed 11-of-13, as neither team could pull away.

However, the Panthers used a 7-0 run, capped by a jumper from Jordan Session to take a 22-21 lead with 7:15 to play. Wright State retook the lead 31-30, before Georgia State used an 8-0 run in the final minutes and then went into the locker room with 41-33 lead following a Hollowell 3-pointer at the buzzer.

Georgia State came out hot in the second half, using an 11-0 run to take a 59-35 lead with 13:01 to play, while the Raiders started the half missing 9-of-10 from the floor. The 24-point margin was the Panthers biggest of the night.

Wright State responded with an 8-0 run to cut the lead to 59-43 with 9:31 to play before a D'Marcus Simonds put-back stopped the streak. Simonds finished with five points and six rebounds.

It took the Raiders until the 2:25 mark of the second half to get the deficit back to single digits and shaved the margin to five with just over a minute to play before a jumper by Williams put the Panthers back up by seven.
