Georgia State vs. Mississippi State

Opening Statement...

"I'm really proud of our team. Georgia State is a really good team, when I watched film on them I saw that they had Purdue down 13 points with 7 minutes to go and Purdue found a way to come back and win. They are a really good team and they are going to win a lot of games in the Sun Belt conference this year. They play a zone defense that makes it very difficult to penetrate and they have a lot of players that are very athletic. To beat a team like that by 22 points makes me feel very good going into final exams week. Lamar Peters played incredible today and really gave us a lift in the first half when we were struggling. I.J. Ready settled down and really played great as our floor general today. I thought Schnider Herard played his best game for us so far and he's still going to get so much better. Mario Kegler played well for us today, especially defensively."

On attacking zone defense...

"I didn't think we got the ball to the high-post as much as we'd like to like we did against Oregon State. When we get Xavian Stapleton back in about 18 days it is really going to help us with our depth and that'll help us in attacking the zone. We need to have guys who can flash to the high-post or can athletically see over it. I thought Mario Kegler did a good job of that today, and he has really improved there. We've got to get Quinndary Weatherspoon in there doing the same thing. He's taking too many three-point shots right now and I told him that while he was on the bench. He's taking a few shots where he needs to penetrate instead of taking the three-point shot."

On Quinndary Weatherspoon...

"We depend on him so much that sometimes we forget that he is only 8 games into his sophomore season. He's so good that sometimes we get spoiled by him and expect more than we should. He listens so well though, and he is very coachable. It is a pleasure to coach him because he listens, tries his hardest and does everything that I ask him to do."

Mississippi State Team Notes

- Mississippi State improved its series lead against Georgia State to 3-0.
- The Bulldogs improved to 61-12 all-time against Sun Belt teams.
- MSU is 6-2 for the first time since 2013-14.
- The 22-point margin of win was the largest this season.
- MSU is now 3-0 this year when leading at the half.
- The 82 points were a season-high.
- MSU made a season-high 13 3-pointers, the most since also making 15 against North Carolina A&T on 12-12-10.
- MSU attempted a season-high 34 3-pointers, the most since taking 31 a year ago since Southern University.
- Ben Howland moved above .500 at 20-19.

Mississippi State Individual Notes.

- Lamar Peters had a career-high 24 points on 9-12 shooting.
- Schnider Herard had a career-high 8 points.
- Mario Kegler had a career high 16 points.
- In his last three games, I.J. Ready has collected 11 steals.
