ABOUT MISSISSIPPI VALLEY STATE: The Devilettes have opened the year 0-3 while being outscored, 20-4. MVSU began the year in Starkville, playing at The Snowman (Feb. 21-22) with games against Missouri State, Southern Illinois and Mississippi State. Cailyn Peterson leads the team with a .500 batting average and four hits. Keisha White boasts a 1.000 slugging percentage with a double and a home run on the year. Ashlyn Matthews and A'tajua Wren both pitched in two games. Wren has held opponents to a .188 batting average.

LEADING OFF

PAIGE'S PERFORMANCE: Paige Cook has started every game at second after playing in just six games with no starts as a freshman. She is hitting .313 and leads the team with seven RBIs.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Anna Kate Segars (13 games) and Chloe Malau'ulu (11 games) are both riding career-long reached base

THUNDER AND LIGHTNING: Mia Davidson (54) and Fa Leilua (52) rank sixth and seventh respectively among the NCAA's active career leaders in home runs. The duo is the one of two pairs of teammates in the country to boast 50-plus career homers (Arizona).

ROLLING UNDER RICKETTS: Samantha Ricketts became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins since at least 1989. She is also the first Bulldog head coach to see her squad ranked in her first season, finishing at No. 20 in 2020.

VETERAN CORE: State's roster includes five student-athletes who are entering their fifth or sixth year of college, which is the thirdmost in the SEC behind Alabama (7) and Arkansas (6).

Montana Davidson, Allison Florian, Alyssa Loza and Christian Quinn, are entering their fifth season, while Fa Leilua begins her sixth

CIRCLE SHUTDOWN: Emily Williams posted a 0.00 ERA in 6.0 innings of work during The Snowman (Feb. 21-22) and held opponents to a .048 batting average in her two appearances.

ASPEN ON THE ATTACK: Aspen Wesley threw 5.0 scoreless innings against Missouri State (Feb. 22), striking out a career-high eight batters in her season debut.

SCORCHING THE SNOWMAN: Montana Davidson batted .636 over the four games of The Snowman (7-for-11) with a .909 slugging percentage and four RBIs. She leads the team with a .471 average and is second on the team with a .647 slugging percentage.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Consistent with the SEC's COVID-19 policies, press box capacity will be limited to 50 percent of available seating. MSU PLAYER/COACH AVAILABILITY

Players and coaches will be made available to the media upon request. Those wishing to set up an interview must contact Brian Ogden via phone or e-mail at least 48 hours prior to the desired interview time. On gameday, players and coaches are only available postgame.

In most cases, players will be available for a brief time before and after practices which are typically scheduled for 2:30-5:30 p.m. each weekday. A weekly schedule is available in each set of game notes. Due to COVID-19 protocols, all interviews will be conducted via telephone or Zoom.

FAST FACTS

- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season.

TEAM NOTES

TRIO ON PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCHLIST

- Mia Davidson, Fa Leilua and Emily Williams are all among the 50 student-athletes named to USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year Watchlist.
- MSU's three selections trail only No. 1/1 UCLA (6), No. 2/2 Washington (4) and No. 8/8 Alabama (4)
- The Bulldogs are one of seven schools, and just two SEC programs, with three or more players on the list.
- Davidson and Leilua are repeat selections, while it is Williams' first recognition.
- No Bulldog has won the award, but State has seen three student-athletes named finalists. Most recently, Davidson was among the Top 10 Finalists in 2019.
- Chelsea Bramlett was finished in the Top 25 in 2008 and 2009 before reaching the Top 10 stage in 2010.
- Iyhia McMichael was a Top 10 selection in 2003 and became the only Bulldog to reach the Top Three in 2004.

ROLLING UNDER RICKETTS

- Last year, **Samantha Ricketts** became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25), since at least 1989.
- She is also the fastest coach in State's softball history to reach 20 career wins, doing so in just 23 games.
- Rickett's 9-1 record through 10 games was the best by any active SEC head coach through the first 10 games of their career.
- At their current school, only Auburn's Mickey Dean can top her with a 10-0 start to his tenure on the Plains in 2018.
- Ricketts was also the first Bulldog head coach to see her squad ranked in her first season.

PAIGE'S PERFORMANCE

- Paige Cook made her first career start, playing second base, on Opening Day. She drove in a career-high four runs in the game, including the game-winner.
- The sophomore hit her first career home run, a three-run shot with two outs in the fourth inning.
- She also drew a bases-loaded walk for a walk-off victory in the seventh.
- The second game of the double-header saw Cook reach base in all four plate appearances without a hit.
- She leads the team with seven RBIs and is one of seven SEC players not to have struck out in an at-bat this season.

THE NEW THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

- Dubbed "The New Thunder and Lightning" by MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro, Mia Davidson and Fa Leilua are two of the most dominant hitters in the nation.
- The pair is sixth and seventh on the active career leaderboard for homers. Davidson's 54 are sixth in the nation, and Leilua has 52.
- Davidson is also among the top 25 active career leaders in slugging percentage (.776, 3rd), total bases (361, 16th) and RBIs (137, 24th).
- Leilua lands among the top 25 in RBIs (153, 13th), total bases (362, 15th), walks (92, 14th), slugging percentage (.693, 22nd) and games played (207, 13th).
- Former MLB players, Palmeiro and Will Clark were the original "Thunder and Lightning" at MSU from 1983-85.

TWO OUTS, SO WHAT?

- The Bulldogs have proven dangerous down to their final out this season.
- More than a third of State's RBIs have come with two outs on the hoard (15 of 40)
- Paige Cook has done the most damage with a team-high five of her seven RBIs coming in two-out situations.
- MSU has hit three two-out homers, including a pair of back-toback blasts against Southern Illinois.

LET'S GO STREAKING

- Anna Kate Segars has reached base in a career-high 13 straight games, dating back to Mar. 2, 2020 against UT Martin.
- Chloe Malau'ulu has reached base in a career-high 11 straight games, dating back to Mar. 6, 2020 against MVSU. She has a hit in 10 of those games.
- The Bulldogs set a new school record with a 17-game winning streak from Feb. 22, 2020 to Feb. 21, 2021. That surpassed 16game runs in 2006 and 2017.
- State's streak was the longest active streak in the nation when it was snapped by Southern Illinois, which entered that contest trailing the Bulldogs by two games, having won its last 15.

STATION TO STATION

- State has advance the runner on 47.7 percent of its opportunities, and 10 runners have been advanced with an out.
- Three student-athletes have advanced the runner more than 60 percent of the time (minimum five opportunities).
- Fa Leilua leads the way at 72.7 percent (8-of-11), while Paige Cook (8-of-13) right behind her. Montana Davidson has done so on 9-of-15 opportunities.

SPEED KILLS

- The Bulldogs have stolen 10 bases on 11 tries this year, with their only caught stealing coming on Chloe Malau'ulu's attempt to advance on a ball in the dirt.
- MSU stole six bases against MVSU (Feb. 22), which is the most by the Bulldogs in a single game since swiping six against Illinois on Feb. 13, 2015.
- Malau'ulu leads the team with three stolen bases, which is tied for ninth in the SEC.
- Fa Leilua has already stolen two bags, more than she has in any prior season.
- Aquana Brownlee (2-for-2), Montana Davidson (1-for-1), Brylie St. Clair (1-for-1) and Christian Quinn (1-for-1) have all swiped a bag this year.

TURNING THE LINEUP OVER

- The Bulldogs have gotten major contributions from the bottom half of the lineup.
- State's 6-9 hitters have driven in 20 of MSU's 44 runs.
- Paige Cook and Montana Davidson are a combined 13-for-33 (.394) with 13 RBIs and seven runs scored.
- In the nine hole, Brylie St. Clair went 2-for-3 at the plate against MVSU (Feb. 22) with a stolen base and two RBIs.

STARTING FROM THE TOP

- This year, MSU has scored 29.5 percent its runs in the first two innings (13 of 44).
- The Bulldogs got off to quick starts in 2020, outscoring opponents 62-10 in the first two innings of ballgames.

NON-CONFERENCE NOT A PROBLEM

- MSU posted one of the best non-conference runs in school history in 2020, leading to a No. 20 ranking in the first RPI of the year.
- The Bulldogs have won 107 of 124 regular-season, non-conference games since 2017.
- Since 1997, MSU has won 20 or more regular-season, non-conference games 18 times and made the NCAA tournament in all but three such seasons.

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In five full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019.
- The Bulldogs rank 15th nationally and fourth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 163 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 51.4 percent of its games (167 of 325) and gone 123-44 in such contests. In 2020 alone, MSU hit at least one home run in 67.9 percent of its games, going 18-1 when doing so.
- State set school records with a .335 batting average with runners in scoring position and a .500 average from pinch hitters in 2020.

QUICK HITTERS

- The Bulldogs have won their season-opener in in eight straight years dating back to the 2014 season.
- The Bulldogs scored 10 or more runs in consecutive games for the first time since March 31 and April 3, 2019 (W, 12-9 at No. 4 Alabama; W, 11-3 vs. Jacksonville State).
- Montana Davidson posted three multi-hit games over The Snowman (Feb. 21-22) while driving in four runs.
- **Fa Leilua** is tied for second in the SEC with seven walks.
- Aspen Wesley threw 5.0 scoreless innings against Missouri State (Feb. 21), striking out eight in her season debut.
- **Emily Williams** posted a 0.00 ERA in 6.0 innings of work during The Snowman (Feb. 21-22) and held opponents to a .048 batting average in her two appearances.

TEAM NOTES

LIGHT IT UP

- MSU players, led by Mia Davidson, purchased a toy lightsaber on their 2020 trip to the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, and head coach Samantha Ricketts began using it to celebrate five-run innings when the Bulldogs were "lighting up the scoreboard."
- MSU has scored five or more runs in one inning twice so far this season
- MSU's biggest momentum-swinging inning came with a five-run outburst to take the lead in the bottom of the sixth against Southern Illinois (Feb. 21). State homered three times in the frame

NUMBERS TO KNOW FROM 2020

- When the season was cancelled, MSU was one of two teams in the country to have won 25 games along with No. 1/1 UCLA, and its .893 winning percentage ranked fifth nationally and stands as a school record.
- Mia Davidson led the team among those with at least 15 twoout at-bats, hitting at a .412 clip in such situations (7-for-17). Fa Leilua (.385), Carter Spexarth (.353) and Montana Davidson (.353) also all hit above .350 with two outs.
- Six Bulldogs batted .400 or better with runners in scoring position this year. Anna Kate Segars led the way, batting .438 (7-for-16) in such situations. Meanwhile, Paige Cook was an astonishing .800 (4-for-5) with runners in scoring position.
- Leilua and Chloe Malau'ulu combined to go 5-for-6 with the bases loaded, including a grand slam apiece.
- State had 46 RBIs in 71 opportunities (64.8 percent) with runners on third and less than two outs. That percentage ranked second in the SEC.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS

- State has scored double-digit runs in three of six games this year.
- The Bulldgos scored 10-plus runs in four games in all of the shortened 2020 season, including a season high in a 20-3 victory against MVSU (3/7), tied the second-largest margin of victory in school history.
- The Bulldogs also had two 16-run games against Alabama State (2/12) and IJAB (2/28)

IN A PINCH

- Samantha Ricketts found success off her bench, as pinch hitters were 12-for-24 (.500) in 2020, which led the SEC. The next best team was Georgia at .400.
- State's pinch hitters reached base on 21-of-33 (.636) opportunities when walks, hit by pitches and errors are included.
- Four of the Bulldogs' pinch hits went for extra bases, and MSU's pinch hitters collected 11 RBIs.
- Jackie McKenna was called upon most frequently and went 3-for-6.
- Four of MSU's top six single-season pinch hit totals in program history have come since Ricketts arrived in 2014.

MAKING THE MOST OF MISTAKES

- MSU batters reached base on error an SEC-leading 30 times in 2020. State has already reached on error seven times this spring.
- Mia Davidson led the team in 2020, reaching on seven errors.
- Brylie St. Clair's speed allowed her to reach on errors three times in just nine at-bats a year ago. If those counted as hits, she would have gone 8-for-12 (.667).

A FINE FRESHMAN SEASON

- Multiple freshmen broke out for MSU in the 2020 season.
- Madisyn Kennedy forced her way into the lineup in the middle of the Bulldog infield, starting every game at shortstop.
- The Montgomery, Alabama, batted .333 with three doubles, three home runs and 18 RBIs.
- Brylie St. Clair batted .417 and reached base in 8-of-12 at-bats thanks to three errors. She hit an RBI triple in her first career at-bat and later added a double.
- Kiki Edwards hit .333 with a double and three runs scored. She doubled in her first career at-bat as a pinch hitter.
- Paige Cook's first plate appearance resulted in an RBI single to right field. She finished 4-for-6 on the year with five RBIs.

A CHANGEUP IN THE CIRCLE

- Assistant coach Josh Johnson transformed State's pitching staff in his first year on the job. Johnson's staff finished fourth in the nation with a 1.36 ERA in 2020 after posting a 3.36 ERA that ranked second-to-last in the SEC in 2019.
- The Bulldogs were second in the SEC in strikeouts (245) and opponent's batting average (.158) and led the league in looking strikeouts (61) in 2020.

DUELING ACES

- Annie Willis and Emily Williams were dominant in the circle, giving State a pair of aces in 2020.
- Both pitchers finished among the top 10 in the nation in ERA. Williams' 0.46 ranked third nationally, and Willis' 0.80 was eighth.
- Williams held opponents to an SEC-best .099 batting average while allowing just 2.30 hits per seven innings, which led the nation. Her 11.5 strikeouts per seven innings ranked seventh.
- Williams was also a weapon out of the bullpen. She was second in the nation with five saves, and her 10 career saves are 10th among active players and third in school history.
- Willis set the school record with a 19-strikeout game and finished seventh in the country in strikeout-walk ratio (9.75).

A FULL-STAFF EFFORT

- Eight of MSU's 24 student-athletes are pitchers as the Bulldogs continue to trend more toward using a full pitching staff rather than one standout arm.
- MSU used more pitchers than any other SEC team in 2020. The Bulldogs threw seven different arms in the circle.
- Last year, Missouri was the only SEC program with more pitchers on its roster (8), but the Tigers only used six in game action.

LOOKING BACK AT WILLIS' NO-HITTER

- Annie Willis threw the 22nd no-hitter in program history on March 6, 2020 against Mississippi Valley State. Along the way she struck out a school-record 19 batters.
- That also ranks second in MSU history for the most strikeouts State has ever had as a team in a single game behind a 22-strikeout performance against Lipscomb (Feb. 17, 2013).
- MSU has thrown at least one no-hitter in each of the last six years

LOOK OUT FOR THE LEFTY

- Grace Fagan was one of eight left-handed pitchers in the SEC in 2020. The Bulldogs went 7-2 in her starts last year, and won her first start this season.
- Lefties have proven rare across the diamond as the Bulldogs have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in just 10.9 percent of their games since 1997 (data from 2000 is unavailable).
- State is 89-58 against left-handed starters since 1997.

VETERAN CORE

- MSU roster includes five student-athletes entering their fifth or sixth year of college softball, which is the third-most in the SEC behind Alabama (7) and Arkansas (6).
- Three Bulldogs, Montana Davidson, Allison Florian, Alyssa Loza and Christian Quinn, are entering their fifth season, while Fa Leilua begins her sixth.
- State has nine student-athletes who are in at least their fourth year of college.

MSU'S 30[™] SEASON OF SOFTBALL

- State is playing its 30th season of softball in 2021. MSU holds a 894-681 all-time record.
- Samantha Ricketts is the sixth head coach in program history and is in her second season at the helm.

#NOONEFIGHTSALONE

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout
 the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of
 the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018
 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8
 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female
 student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her
 jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

MAROON AND WHITE

- Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019
- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- Led her team to a 4-0 opening weekend to win the NFCA Leadoff Classic.
- Served as an assistant coach from 2015-18 focusing on hitting and recruiting before being promoted to associate head coach
- Has been a part of one Women's College World Series appearance, six NCAA Regional berths and two NCAA Super Regional appearances during her coaching career
- In 2019, MSÜ was one of two teams in the nation (Arizona) to boast multiple hitters with 20 or more home runs
- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans with Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson earning the honor.
- Leilua closed 2019 with 22 total home runs, setting a new MSU junior record. The total ranked second in single-season history behind only Davidson's record-shattering mark of 26.
- Davidson ranked second nationally and led the SEC in homers in 2019 while breaking the league's single-season record that was once held by Georgia's Alex Hugo (2014) and Alabama's Kelly Kretschman (1998).
- Davidson was the lone player in the SEC to record at least 60 RBI, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional
- During the 2016 season, Ricketts' leadership led senior Kayla Winkfield to a .330 average and an SEC-leading six triples, which finished top 10 in the nation
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416)
- MSU also finished second in the single-season record books for runs scored (326), doubles (84) and hit by pitches (72)
- In 2014 without Ricketts on the MSU staff, just two Bulldogs hit over .300, while in 2015 with the addition of Ricketts, nine Bulldogs hit over .300 (min. five at-bats).

WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY

- Served as assistant coach at Wichita State from 2012-14, working with the team's hitters and consistently improving their production
- Her last spring at WSU saw the Shockers increase their overall win total by 15 from 2013 to 2014 and win the program's first regular-season conference title
- Part of the 2014 MVC Coaching Staff of the Year, helping to improve the Shockers from the ninth place in 2012, to eighth place in 2013, to MVC champs in 2014
- Produced five starters who each hit better than .300 in 2014 after the squad did not have a batter hit over .300 in 2013


