ABOUT SOUTHERN MISS: The Golden Eagles are coming off a seven-day break after losing at Ole Miss last Wednesday, 4-1. Prior to that game they had won six of their last seven. The pitching staff ranks 40th nationally in ERA, and Morgan Leinstock leads the nation as one of five pitchers with four saves. Kaylan Ladner is 8-1 with a 1.32 ERA. USM leads C-USA and is ninth nationally, drawing 104 walks as a team. Destini Brown leads C-USA in runs (29) and is third in triples (3). Meanwhile, Alyssa Davis leads the league in hits (31) and RBIs (22).

LEADING OFF

THROUGH THE GAUNTLET: MSU has played one of the toughest schedules in the country, with its past opponents combining for a .696 winning percentage, which ranks sixth in the NCAA. 11 of MSU's 14 losses came to teams that are ranked or receiving votes in the latest NFCA poll.

THUNDER ROLLING IN: Mia Davidson is tied for eighth in SEC history with 60 career home runs. She is one away from Will Clark's mark (61) and seven away from Rafael Palmeiro (67) in her quest to become MSU's all-time home run queen in baseball and softball.

GOING FOR EXTRA BASES: 16 of Davidson's 20 hits have gone for extra bases. Fa Leilua has gotten extra bases on 13 of her 27 hits.

FAVORITE FRAME: The sixth inning is MSU's best inning, producing its highest batting average (.355) and slugging percentage (.582) and its lowest ERA (0.58) and opponents' average (.195) of any frame.

SOPHOMORE SPARK: Brylie St. Clair (.333) and Paige Cook (.321) are leading the team in batting average over the last 10 games. They also lead the team in SEC play.

SHUFFLING THE SQUAD: Samantha Ricketts has used 19 different batting lineups and 11 different fielding alignments this season. The Bulldogs have repeated three combinations a total of 11 times, but have used a unique lineup in each of their last eight games.

IN THE HIT COLUMN: MSU has out-hit the opponent in 21 of its 29 games, including two of three games in its last series at then-No. 15/15 Arkansas.

WHO'S HOT: Leilua is batting .417 (5-for-12) over the last five games while slugging .667. In the last 10 games, she leads the team with a .484 on-base percentage. Chloe Malau'ulu is batting .417 (5-for-12) with runners on base over the last 10 contests.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Consistent with the SEC's COVID-19 policies, press box capacity will be limited to 50 percent of available seating. Seats will be assigned in a socially distanced manner, and masks covering the nose and mouth are required at all times when not actively eating or drinking. A pregame meal is also served in the press box approximately one hour prior to each game.

Consistent with the SEC's COVID-19 policies, a limited number of photographers and videographers will be permitted to shoot at Nusz Park outside of the established buffer zone. Those wishing to shoot a game must request access at least 24 hours before the game.

FAST FACTS

- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season.

QUICK HITTERS

- **Chloe Malau'ulu** leads the Bulldog regulars with a 1.000 fielding percentage and has thrown out three runners at the plate.
- **Brylie St. Clair** (.333) and **Paige Cook** (.292) lead the team in batting average in conference play.
- **Christian Quinn**'s batting average climbs to .333 (.220 overall) with runners on base and with runners in scoring position.
- Sixteen of **Mia Davidson**'s 20 hits have gone for extra bases. **Fa Leilua** has gotten extra bases on 13 of her 27 hits.

QUICK PITCH

- The Bulldog pitching staff leads the SEC with 60 looking strikeouts this season. **Emily Williams** is tied for ninth in the league with 17, and **Annie Willis** is tied for 11th with 16.
- As a team MSU's pitchers have held opponents to a .190 batting average with two outs.
- **Williams** has held opponents to a .195 average with runners on base and a .167 average with two outs.

WHO'S HOT?

- The youngsters **Brylie St. Clair** (.333) and **Paige Cook** (.321) are leading the team in batting average over the last 10 games.
- **Fa Leilua** has nine walks in the last 10 games for a team-leading .484 on-base percentage despite having just six hits.
- **Chloe Malau'ulu** is one of three Bulldogs with an on-base percentage above .400 in that span thanks to four hit-by-pitches and two walks combined with eight hits.
- **Malau'ulu** is batting .417 (5-for-12) with runners on, and **Leilua** is hitting at a .400 (6-for-15) clip with runners.
- **Mia Davidson** is slugging .538 in that span with three of her seven hits going for extra bases. She has reached base in seven of the 10 innings she has led off.
- **Leilua** is batting .417 (5-for-12) over the last five games while slugging .667 with three walks and three RBIs.

STARTING FROM THE TOP

- Bulldog leadoff batters have reached base on 38.0 percent of their opportunities in 2021.
- Hitting at the top of the order, **Chloe Malau'ulu** has reached on 19-of-41 opportunities (46.3 percent).
- **Mia Davidson** (57.1 percent, 12-of-21) and **Paige Cook** (50.0 percent, 9-of-18) lead the team.
- **Montana Davidson** has reached in seven of the 17 innings she's led off.

STATION TO STATION

- Six Bulldogs have advanced the runner on at least 45 percent of their chances (minimum 25 opportunities).
- **Christian Quinn** leads the way at 54.5 percent (18-of-33), while **Fa Leilua** (52.7, 29-of-55) is right behind her.
- **Mia Davidson** has done so on 25 of 53 opportunities, and **Madi-syn Kennedy** has moved the runner on 13 of her 27 chances.

SEASON STREAKS

- **Carter Spexarth** (8), **Montana Davidson** (7), **Paige Cook** (4), **Christian Quinn** (4) and **Chloe Malau'ulu** (6) have all posted career-long hitting streaks in 2021.
- **Malau'ulu** reached base in 28 straight games to open the season, dating back to 2020, including the first 23 games of the year.
- **Segars** reached base in a career-high 14 straight games to open the year, dating back to Mar. 2, 2020.
- The Bulldogs set a new school record with a 17-game winning streak from Feb. 22, 2020 to Feb. 21, 2021 that surpassed 16-game runs in 2006 and 2017.

THE NEW THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

- Dubbed "The New Thunder and Lightning" by MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro, **Mia Davidson** and **Fa Leilua** are two of the most dominant hitters in the nation.
- **Davidson**'s 60 career homers are seventh among active players nationally, while **Leilua**'s 59 rank ninth.
- **Davidson** is also among the top 25 active career leaders in slugging percentage (.774, 10th), total bases (414, 15th) and hit-by-pitches (33, 21st).
- **Leilua** lands among the top 25 in RBIs (171, 18th), total bases (407, 20th), walks (110, 11th) and games played (230, 10th).
- Former MLB players, **Palmeiro** and **Will Clark** were the original "Thunder and Lightning" at MSU from 1983-85.

WE'RE GOING BACK-TO-BACK

- **Mia Davidson** and **Fa Leilua** have already hit back-to-back home runs three times in 2021. Prior to this season, however, State's dominating duo had only done so one time.
- On March 8, 2019, the pair did so against Mississippi Valley State in the third inning of a 15-0 victory.
- **Davidson** and **Leilua** have homered in the same game 12 times (8 in 2019, 1 in 2020, 3 in 2021).
- MSU is 3-1 when Thunder and Lightning hit back-to-back homers.

PAIGE'S PERFORMANCE

- After recording just six at-bats in 10 games in 2020, **Paige Cook** has become the Bulldogs' everyday second baseman.
- **Cook** is batting .306 with a .372 on-base percentage and is among the team's top five in hits, runs, RBIs, triples, hit-by-pitches and total bases.
- She has also provided run-saving defense, throwing two runners out at the plate and snagging a liner on a diving catch with the bases loaded against No. 5/5 Florida (3/19-21).
- She has reached safely in nine of the 18 innings she's led off.
- **Cook** is tied for the team lead with five two-out RBIs.

BETTER THAN THEY LEFT IT

- **Mia Davidson** and **Montana Davidson** have outperformed many of their 2020 numbers in a similar sample size this year.

WE DON'T MOVE

- MSU is No. 5 in the NCAA in hit-by-pitches (36) and No. 4 in the SEC behind Ole Miss (46), South Carolina (42) and Arkansas (39).
- **Chloe Malau'ulu** is tied for fifth in the nation and is second in the SEC with 11 hit-by-pitches. **Anna Kate Segars** is tied for fifth in the conference, taking nine offerings.
- The Bulldogs have been hit by at least one pitch in 21 games this year. MSU was hit a season-high four times at Alabama State (3/9) and three times by Florida (3/20).

THUNDER ROLLING IN...

CHASING PALMEIRO: MSU baseball legend Rafael Palmeiro holds the Diamond Dawgs' career home run record. Davidson is chasing him for the title of all-time MSU home run king or queen.

MILESTONE WATCH

- **Mia Davidson** is tied for eighth in SEC history with 60 career home runs. She needs one to move into a tie for sixth (61, Abbey Cheek, Kentucky; Francesca Enea, Florida).
- She needs seven runs to move into a tie for fifth in school history (160, Courtney Bures, 2005-08) and six RBIs to move into a tie for fifth (159, Michelle Gates, 1997-00).
- **Davidson** is also eight hits shy of 200 for her career and would become the 12th Bulldog to reach the mark.
- With one more runner caught stealing, **Davidson** will move into a tie for fifth in school history (31, Katie Anne Bailey, 2014-17).
- **Fa Leilua** needs three hits to reach 200 for her career at both MSU and Arizona State.
- **Leilua** is four home runs away from second in school history behind **Davidson**'s school-record 60. **Leilua** boasts 40 home runs as a Bulldog, while **Kellie Wilkerson** hit 44 from 1999-2002.
- **Emily Williams** has tied **Alison Owen**'s (2013-14) career record with 102 looking strikeouts.
- **Williams** needs two saves to tie with **Sara Hickerson** (12, 2004-07) for second in program history.

BREAKING DOWN THE BENCH

- **Allison Florian** has been the Bulldogs' most-used substitute, coming on as a pinch runner 17 times and pinch hitting once. She has scored six runs.
- **Brylie St. Clair** has come off the bench 11 times and made eight starts in the outfield. She has scored four times in seven pinch running appearances and has three stolen bases this year.
- **Addison Purvis** is 2-for-5 as a pinch hitter with a double and an RBI. She's also pitched out of the bullpen, tossing a three-up-three-down inning at Alabama State (3/9).
- **Aquana Brownlee** is recovering from an injury, but has pinch run in six games since returning to the field, scoring twice.
- **Kiki Edwards** is 1-for-3 as a pinch hitter with two RBIs.

STEALING BAGS

- MSU stole a season-high seven bases against MVSU (Feb. 24), its highest total in a single game since swiping seven at Georgia Southern on Apr. 25, 2015. The last time MSU stole eight bags came on Apr. 1, 2014 against the Devilettes.
- **Chloe Malau'ulu** and **Christian Quinn** lead the team with five stolen bases each.
- State has seen some surprising swipes as well. **Fa Leilua** has already stolen three bags, matching her career total entering the season, and **Montana Davidson** stole home against MVSU.



TEAM NOTES

OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS

- MSU has scored double-digit runs in seven of 29 games this year.
- The Bulldogs scored 10-plus runs in four games in all of the shortened 2020 season (28 games) and eight times in 2019.
- State's largest margin of victory and highest scoring output of the year came in a 16-0 victory against Alcorn State (3/5).
- Last year's season high came in a 20-3 victory against MVSU (3/7), the second-largest margin of victory in school history.
- The Bulldogs also had two 16-run games last year against Alabama State (2/12) and UAB (2/28).

LIGHT IT UP

- MSU players, led by **Mia Davidson**, purchased a toy lightsaber on their 2020 trip to the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, and head coach **Samantha Ricketts** began using it to celebrate five-run innings when the Bulldogs were "lighting up the scoreboard."
- MSU has scored five or more runs in one inning six times so far this season and produced two three-homer innings at Texas State (Feb. 26) and against Southern Illinois (Feb. 21).
- MSU's biggest inning came in an eight-run outburst in the second inning against Western Kentucky (Mar. 6).

NEVER COUNT OUT THE DAWGS

- The Bulldogs have four comeback victories this season, and have made up as large as a five-run deficit. Three of those victories came when trailing after the fifth.
- In the sixth inning, MSU has outscored opponents, 24-2.
- The sixth inning is MSU's best inning, producing its highest batting average (.355) and slugging percentage (.582) and its lowest ERA (0.58) and opponents' average (.195) of any frame.
- The Bulldogs are 12-1 when leading after four innings and 8-0 when leading after five.

CONSISTENT CHLOE

- Chloe Malau'ulu** reached base in a career-high 28 straight games from Mar. 6, 2020 - Mar. 15, 2021. She had a hit in 22 of those games and was walked or hit by a pitch 19 times.
- Malau'ulu's is one of just three Bulldogs to reach base in 23 straight to open a season along with Iyhia McMichael (2004) and Brittany Bell (2012).
- McMichael holds the two longest streaks in school history at 41 and 35 games.
- McMichael went 27 games over the 2003 and 2004 seasons before failing to reach base in just one contest in 2004.

GOING THROUGH THE GAUNTLET

- MSU has played one of the toughest schedules in the country, with its past opponents combining for a .696 winning percentage, which ranks sixth in the NCAA.
- Against NFCA-ranked opposition, **Paige Cook** and **Fa Leilua** are a team-best 7-for-24 (.292).
- In those same games, **Brylie St. Clair** is batting .300 (3-for-10), and **Mia Davidson** is slugging a team-high .808 with six RBIs.
- The Bulldogs faced an NFCA-ranked opponent in three of four straight road games earlier this year.

NON-CONFERENCE NOT A PROBLEM

- MSU posted one of the best non-conference runs in school history in 2020, leading to a No. 20 ranking in the first RPI of the year.
- The Bulldogs have won 116 of 137 regular-season, non-conference games since 2017.
- Since 1997, MSU has won 20 or more regular-season, non-conference games 18 times and made the NCAA tournament in all but three such seasons.

THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In five full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019.
- The Bulldogs rank 17th nationally and fifth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 189 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 51.3 percent of its games (179 of 347) and gone 131-48 in such contests. In 2021, MSU has homered in 75.0 percent of its games, going 12-3 when doing so.

E-DUB'S SCORELESS STREAK

- Emily Williams** went six outings, including two starts, without allowing a run, running her scoreless innings streak to 24.1 frames, 1.0 shy of her career high.
- From Feb. 27 at No. 7/7 Texas through March 10 against Memphis, she struck out 29 while walking eight and holding opponents to a .129 batting average.

A FULL-STAFF EFFORT

- Eight of MSU's 24 student-athletes are pitchers as the Bulldogs continue to trend more toward using a full pitching staff rather than one standout arm.
- MSU used more pitchers than any other SEC team in 2020. The Bulldogs threw seven different arms in the circle.
- Last year, Missouri was the only SEC program with more pitchers on its roster (8), but the Tigers only used six in game action.

LOOK OUT FOR THE LEFTY

- Lefties have proven rare across the diamond as the Bulldogs have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in just 10.7 percent of their games since 1997 (data from 2000 is unavailable).
- State is 89-59 against left-handed starters since 1997.
- Grace Fagan** and **Kylie Taylor** are two of 14 left-handed pitchers in the SEC.

TRIO ON PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCHLIST

- Mia Davidson**, **Fa Leilua** and **Emily Williams** are all among the 50 student-athletes named to USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year Watchlist.
- MSU's three selections trail only No. 1/1 UCLA (6), No. 2/2 Washington (4) and No. 8/8 Alabama (4)
- The Bulldogs were one of seven schools, and just two SEC programs, with three or more players on the list.
- Davidson and Leilua are repeat selections, while it is Williams' first recognition.
- No Bulldog has won the award, but State has seen three student-athletes named finalists. Most recently, Davidson was among the Top 10 Finalists in 2019.

VETERAN CORE

- MSU roster includes five student-athletes entering their fifth or sixth year of college softball, which is the third-most in the SEC behind Alabama (7) and Arkansas (6).
- Three Bulldogs, **Montana Davidson**, **Allison Florian**, **Alyssa Loza** and **Christian Quinn**, are entering their fifth season, while **Fa Leilua** begins her sixth.
- State has nine student-athletes who are in at least their fourth year of college.

#NOONEFIGHTSALONE

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8 jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

ROLLING UNDER RICKETTS

- Last year, **Samantha Ricketts** became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25), since at least 1989.
- She is also the fastest coach in State's softball history to reach 20 career wins, doing so in just 23 games.
- Ricketts' 9-1 record through 10 games was the best by any active SEC head coach through the first 10 games of their career.
- At their current school, only Auburn's Mickey Dean can top her with a 10-0 start to his tenure on the Plains in 2018.
- Ricketts was also the first Bulldog head coach to see her squad ranked in her first season.

FINE FRESHMAN SEASONS

- Multiple freshmen broke out for MSU in the 2020 season.
- Madisyn Kennedy** started every game at shortstop while batting .333 with three doubles, three home runs and 18 RBIs.
- Brylie St. Clair** batted .417 and reached base in 8-of-12 at-bats thanks to three errors. She hit an RBI triple in her first career at-bat and later added a double.
- Kiki Edwards** hit .333 with a double and three runs scored. She doubled in her first career at-bat as a pinch hitter.
- Paige Cook**'s first plate appearance resulted in an RBI single to right field. She finished 4-for-6 on the year with five RBIs.

- Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019
- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10-game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- Led her team to a 4-0 opening weekend to win the NFCA Leadoff Classic.

- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans with Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson earning the honor.
- Leilua closed 2019 with 22 total home runs, setting a new MSU junior record. The total ranked second in single-season history behind only Davidson's record-shattering mark of 26.
- Davidson ranked second nationally and led the SEC in homers in 2019 while breaking the league's single-season record that was once held by Georgia's Alex Hugo (2014) and Alabama's Kelly Kretschman (1998).
- Davidson was the lone player in the SEC to record at least 60 RBI, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional
- During the 2016 season, Ricketts' leadership led senior Kayla Winkfield to a .330 average and an SEC-leading six triples, which finished top 10 in the nation
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416)
- MSU also finished second in the single-season record books for runs scored (326), doubles (84) and hit by pitches (72)
- In 2014 without Ricketts on the MSU staff, just two Bulldogs hit over .300, while in 2015 with the addition of Ricketts, nine Bulldogs hit over .300 (min. five at-bats).
