## **SERIES HISTORY**

ABOUT CENTRAL ARKANSAS: The Bears are on a tour of Mississippi this week, playing at Ole Miss on Tuesday before meeting the Bulldogs. UCA is 0-5 against SEC teams this year having already played Texas A&M, LSU and Arkansas. Kayla Beaver was named the Southland Conference Pitcher of the Week after posting two wins without surrendering an earned run. Jenna Wildeman leads the team in batting average (.442), runs (29) and stolen bases (29). Mary Kate Brown is second on the team with a .420 batting average and leads the team in doubles (9).

#### LEADING OFF

A TOUGH GO: MSU's past opponents have a combined .678 winning percentage, which ranks fourth in the NCAA. The Bulldogs boast the No. 11 strength of schedule in the latest NCAA RPI calculations and all but two of State's losses have come to teams ranked or receiving votes in the latest NFCA poll.

SEC SLUGGERS: Mia Davidson is tied for sixth in SEC softball history with 61 career home runs. She has tied Will Clark and six away from Rafael Palmeiro (67) in her quest to become MSU's alltime home run queen in baseball and softball.

TAKE TWO: MSU ranks 14th nationally in doubles (48) and fourth in the SEC. Davidson and Chloe Malau'ulu have each hit eight.

MAKING THEM MISS: The Bulldog pitching staff ranks third in the SEC with 252 strikeouts and leads the league in looking strikeouts (68). State has struck out 61 batters over nine SEC games.

SOPHOMORE SPARK: Madisyn Kennedy batted .357 in four games last week with two home runs and six RBIs. She posted a .786 slugging percentage which ranked second on the team and was 3-for-4 with two outs.

ON A ROLL: Fa Leilua has hit safely in a season-best seven straight games and reached base in a season-high 10 straight. Malau'ulu is on a career-long seven game hitting streak, and **Jackie** McKenna has tied her career-long streak at four games.

IN THE HIT COLUMN: MSU has outhit the opponent in 24 of its 33 games, including four of its last seven games.

WHO'S HOT: Leilua is riding a season-long seven-game hitting streak and 10-game reached base streak. She leads the team in batting average (.444) and slugging percentage (.815) with 11 RBIs over the last 10 games.

#### **FAST FACTS**

- Opening game at the MSU Softball Field came on Feb. 26, 1997, with the Bulldogs sweeping Samford in a doubleheader with back-to-back 4-0 scores.
- Nusz Park, a \$6 million project, includes 1,000 maroon chairback seats, in addition to an expanded concourse that includes new restrooms and concession stands.
- The Bulldogs' first action in the new digs came against Georgia Southern, a 6-0 victory on Feb. 11, 2016.
- MSU opened play at Nusz Park with six-straight victories, including a sweep of the Bulldog Kickoff.
- State captured its first SEC win at Nusz with a 6-3 win against eventual WCWS finalists and third-ranked Auburn on March 19.
- Nusz hosted the 2016 SEC Softball Tournament. The four-day event hosted 12 teams and a total of 11 games and drew praise from coaches across the league to ESPN and SEC Network officials.
- Over the 2018 season, Mississippi State posted a 24-10 record at Nusz Park, tying the program record for most home wins over a single season.

TOTAL BASES: Madisyn Kennedy and Paige Cook combined for 20 total bases in the doubleheader at North Alabama (4/3). They totaled eight RBIs and combined to slug 1.333.

#### **TEAM NOTES**

#### **QUICK HITTERS**

- Chloe Malau'ulu leads the Bulldog regulars with a 1.000 fielding percentage and has thrown out three runners at the plate.
- Christian Quinn's batting average climbs to .355 (.233 overall) with runners on base and .368 with runners in scoring position.
- Eighteen of Mia Davidson's 33 hits have gone for extra bases. Fa Leilua has gotten extra bases on 16 of her 33 hits.
- Brylie St. Clair (.333) and Paige Cook (.292) lead the team in batting average in conference play.

#### **QUICK PITCH**

- The Bulldog pitching staff leads the SEC with 68 looking strikeouts this season. Emily Williams is tied for eighth in the league with 20, and Annie Willis is tied for 13th with 18.
- Williams has broken the MSU career record for looking strikeouts and is now up to 105 in her career.
- Williams is currently averaging 9.05 strikeouts per seven innings, which would rank second in MSU single-season history behind Willis' 10.37 from 2020.

#### WHO'S HOT?

- Fa Leilua is riding a season-long seven-game hitting streak and 10-game reached base streak.
- She leads the team in batting average (.444) and slugging percentage (.815) with 11 RBIs over the last 10 games.
- Five of **Mia Davidson**'s last six hits have gone for extra bases with three leaving the ballpark.
- In her last seven outings, Annie Willis has collected 44 total strikeouts (10.3 strikeouts per 7 innings).
- Madisyn Kennedy is slugging .519 with seven RBIs on seven hits with a double and two home runs.
- Chloe Malau'ulu has tied her career-long hitting streak at seven games. Jackie McKenna has tied her career-long hitting (4 gm) and reached base (5 gm) streaks.

## **SEVEN SATURDAY LONG BALLS**

- The Bulldogs hit a season-high four home runs in Game 1 at North Alabama (4/3), which was tied for the second-most in a single game in program history.
- State added three more in Game 2 for seven on the day.
- Paige Cook hit a pair in Game 1, sparking a five-run sixth inning and tying the game in the seventh.
- Madisyn Kennedy hit a pair in Game 2 to put a combined four runs on the board in her first two at-bats.
- Fa Leilua hit her third career grand slam in Game 1 to tie Morgan Bell and Jessica Cooley for the MSU career record.
- Mia Davidson and Carter Spexarth also homered.

#### PAIGE'S PERFORMANCE

- After recording just six at-bats in 10 games in 2020, Paige Cook has become the Bulldogs' everyday second baseman.
- Cook is among the team's top five in batting average, hits, runs, RBIs, extra-base hits and total bases.
- At North Alabama (4/3) she went 3-for-7 in the doubleheader with 10 total bases and a pair of homers for her eighth multi-hit game.
- She has also provided run-saving defense, throwing two runners out at the plate and snagging a liner on a diving catch with the bases loaded against No. 5/5 Florida (3/19-21).
- She has reached safely in 12 of the 22 innings she's led off.

#### **OFFENSIVE OUTBURSTS**

- MSU has scored double-digit runs in seven of 29 games this year.
- The Bulldogs scored 10-plus runs in four games in all of the shortened 2020 season (28 games) and eight times in 2019.
- State's largest margin of victory and highest scoring output of the year came in a 16-0 victory against Alcorn State (3/5).

#### STARTING FROM THE TOP

- Bulldog leadoff batters have reached base on 40.7 percent of their opportunities in 2021.
- Hitting at the top of the order, Chloe Malau'ulu has reached on 22-of-49 opportunities (44.9 percent).
- Mia Davidson (60.0 percent, 15-of-25) and Paige Cook (54.5 percent, 12-of-22) lead the team.
- Fa Leilua has reached in seven of the 16 innings she's led off.

#### STATION TO STATION

- Six Bulldogs have advanced the runner on at least 45 percent of their chances (minimum 25 opportunities).
- Christian Quinn leads the way at 55.9 percent (19-of-34), while Fa Leilua (51.5, 34-of-66) is right behind her.
- Mia Davidson has done so on 28 of 62 opportunities, and Madisyn Kennedy has moved the runner on 17 of her 36 chances.
- Chloe Malau'ulu and Anna Kate Segars have also moved the runner more than 45 percent of the time.

#### **SEASON STREAKS**

- Carter Spexarth (8), Montana Davidson (7), Chloe Malau'ulu
   [7), Paige Cook (4), Christian Quinn (4) and Jackie McKenna
   [4) have all posted career-long hitting streaks in 2021.
- Malau'ulu reached base in 28 straight games to open the season, dating back to 2020, including the first 23 games of the year.
- Segars reached base in a career-high 14 straight games to open the year, dating back to Mar. 2, 2020.
- The Bulldogs set a new school record with a 17-game winning streak from Feb. 22, 2020 to Feb. 21, 2021 that surpassed 16game runs in 2006 and 2017.

#### THE NEW THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

- Dubbed "The New Thunder and Lightning" by MSU legend Rafael Palmeiro, Mia Davidson and Fa Leilua are two of the most dominant hitters in the nation.
- The pair's 61 career homers rank seventh among active players nationally.
- Davidson is also among the top 25 active career leaders in slugging percentage (.768, 13th), total bases (421, 16th) and hit-by-pitches (33, 23rd).
- Leilua lands among the top 25 in RBIs (179, 12th), total bases (420, 17th), walks (115, 11th) and games played (235, 9th).
- Former MLB players, Palmeiro and Will Clark were the original "Thunder and Lightning" at MSU from 1983-85.

#### **WE'RE GOING BACK-TO-BACK**

- Mia Davidson and Fa Leilua have already hit back-to-back home runs three times in 2021. Prior to this season, however, State's dominating duo had only done so one time.
- On March 8, 2019, the pair did so against Mississippi Valley State in the third inning of a 15-0 victory.
- Davidson and Leilua have homered in the same game 13 times (8 in 2019, 1 in 2020, 4 in 2021).
- MSU is 3-1 when Thunder and Lightning hit back-to-back homers.

#### **WE DON'T MOVE**

- MSU is No. 6 in the NCAA in hit-by-pitches (39) and No. 4 in the SEC behind Ole Miss (53), South Carolina (47) and Arkansas (43).
- Chloe Malau'ulu is tied for seventh in the nation and tied for third in the SEC with 12 hit-by-pitches. Anna Kate Segars is tied for sixth in the conference, taking nine offerings.
- The Bulldogs have been hit by at least one pitch in 21 games this year. MSU was hit a season-high four times at Alabama State (3/9) and three times by Florida (3/20).

#### MILESTONE WATCH

- Mia Davidson needs three runs to move into a tie for fifth in school history (160, Courtney Bures, 2005-08) and four RBIs to move into a tie for fifth (159, Michelle Gates, 1997-00).
- Davidson is also five hits shy of 200 for her career and would become the 12th Bulldog to reach the mark.
- Davidson is now fifth in school history with 32 runners caught stealing. She needs seven to move into a tie for third.
- Fa Leilua is two home runs away from second in school history behind Davidson's school-record 61. Leilua boasts 42 home runs as a Bulldog, while Kellie Wilkerson hit 44 from 1999-2002.
- Emily Williams needs two saves to tie with Sara Hickerson (12, 2004-07) for second in program history.

#### **SOUTHEASTERN SLUGGERS**

- Mia Davidson is tied for sixth in SEC softball history with 61 career home runs (Abbey Cheek, Kentucky; Francesca Enea, Florida). She needs four to enter the all-time top five.
- She is one of 16 baseball and softball players in the history of the conference to have hit 60 home runs in her career.
- MSU boasts three of the sluggers (Will Clark and Rafael Palmeiro), second only to Florida (4).
- Davidson's 0.344 homers per game ranks fourth among the 16 hitters. Palmeiro is first at 0.369, and Clark is second at 0.349.

#### **BREAKING DOWN THE BENCH**

- Allison Florian has been the Bulldogs' most-used substitute, coming on as a pinch runner 19 times and pinch hitting once. She has scored six runs and stolen one base.
- Addison Purivs is 2-for-6 as a pinch hitter with a double and an RBI. She's also pitched out of the bullpen, tossing a three-upthree-down inning at Alabama State (3/9).
- Aquana Browntee was injured on Opening Day, but returned to pinch run in seven games and pinch hit once.
- Kiki Edwards is 1-for-3 as a pinch hitter with two RBIs.

## **TEAM NOTES**

#### LIGHT IT UP

- MSU players, led by Mia Davidson, purchased a toy lightsaber on their 2020 trip to the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic, and head coach Samantha Ricketts began using it to celebrate five-run innings when the Bulldogs were "lighting up the scoreboard."
- MSU has scored five or more runs in one inning eight times so far this season and produced two three-homer innings at Texas State (Feb. 26) and against Southern Illinois (Feb. 21).
- MSU's biggest inning came in an eight-run outburst in the second inning against Western Kentucky (Mar. 6).

#### **NEVER COUNT OUT THE DAWGS**

- The Bulldogs have five comeback victories this season, and have made up as large as a six-run deficit. Four of those victories came when trailing after the fifth.
- In Game 1 at North Alabama (4/3), State recorded its largest comeback victory since erasing a six-run deficit against Alabama in an 8-6 victory on April 9, 2004. MSU hit two home runs and scored five runs in the sixth inning to spark the comeback.
- In the sixth inning, MSU has outscored opponents, 29-2.
- The sixth inning is MSU's best inning, producing its highest batting average (.365) and slugging percentage (.611) and its lowest ERA (0.52) and opponents' average (.177) of any frame.
- The Bulldogs are 14-1 when leading after four innings and 8-0 when leading after five.

#### STEALING BAGS

- MSU stole a season-high seven bases against MVSU (Feb. 24), its highest total in a single game since swiping seven at Georgia Southern on Apr. 25, 2015. The last time MSU stole eight bags came on Apr. 1. 2014 against the Devilettes.
- Chloe Malau'ulu (6) and Christian Quinn (5) lead the team in stolen bases.
- State has seen some surprising swipes as well. Fa Leilua has already stolen four bags, surpassing her career total entering the season, and Montana Davidson stole home against MVSU.

## THE #RICKETTSEFFECT

- In five full seasons since Ricketts arrived (2015), the Bulldogs have broken the school record for home runs three times.
- The mark now stands at 72 home runs, set in 2019.
- The Bulldogs rank 14th nationally and fourth in the SEC since the start of the 2018 season with 197 home runs.
- Under Ricketts, State has homered in 51.9 percent of its games (182 of 351) and gone 133-48 in such contests. In 2021, MSU has homered in 60.6 percent of its games, going 14-6 when doing so.

#### **GOING THROUGH THE GAUNTLET**

- MSU has played one of the toughest schedules in the country, with its past opponents combining for a .678 winning percentage, which ranks fourth in the NCAA.
- The Bulldogs boast the No. 11 strength of schedule in the latest NCAA RPI calculations and are third among SEC teams.
- 13 of State's 15 losses have come to teams ranked or receiving votes in the latest NFCA poll, with eight losses coming against top-10 teams.
- The Bulldogs faced an NFCA-ranked opponent in three of four straight road games earlier this year.

## **NON-CONFERENCE NOT A PROBLEM**

- MSU posted one of the best non-conference runs in school history in 2020, leading to a No. 20 ranking in the first RPI of the year.
- The Bulldogs have won 119 of 141 regular-season, non-conference games since 2017.
- Since 1997, MSU has won 20 or more regular-season, non-conference games 18 times and made the NCAA tournament in all but three such seasons.

#### **CONSISTENT CHLOE**

- Chloe Malau'ulu reached base in a career-high 28 straight games from Mar. 6, 2020 Mar. 15, 2021. She had a hit in 22 of those games and was walked or hit by a pitch 19 times.
- Malau'ulu's is one of just three Bulldogs to reach base in 23 straight to open a season along with lyhia McMichael (2004) and Brittany Bell (2012).
- McMichael holds the two longest streaks in school history at 41 and 35 games.
- McMichael went 27 games over the 2003 and 2004 seasons before failing to reach base in just one contest in 2004.

#### **E-DUB'S SCORELESS STREAK**

- Emily Williams went six outings, including two starts, without allowing a run, running her scoreless innings streak to 24.1 frames, 1.0 shy of her career high.
- From Feb. 27 at No. 7/7 Texas through March 10 against Memphis, she struck out 29 while walking eight and holding opponents to a .129 batting average.

#### A FULL-STAFF EFFORT

- Eight of MSU's 24 student-athletes are pitchers as the Bulldogs continue to trend more toward using a full pitching staff rather than one standout arm.
- MSU used more pitchers than any other SEC team in 2020. The Bulldogs threw seven different arms in the circle.
- Last year, Missouri was the only SEC program with more pitchers on its roster (8), but the Tigers only used six in game action.

## **LOOK OUT FOR THE LEFTY**

- Lefties have proven rare across the diamond as the Bulldogs have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in just 10.8 percent of their games since 1997 (data from 2000 is unavailable).
- State is 90-60 against left-handed starters since 1997.
- Grace Fagan and Kylie Taylor are two of 14 left-handed pitchers in the SEC.

## **VETERAN CORE**

- MSU roster includes five student-athletes entering their fifth or sixth year of college softball, which is the third-most in the SEC behind Alabama (7) and Arkansas (6).
- Three Bulldogs, Montana Davidson, Allison Florian, Alyssa Loza and Christian Quinn, are entering their fifth season, while Fa Leilua begins her sixth.
- State has nine student-athletes who are in at least their fourth year of college.

### **ROLLING UNDER RICKETTS**

- Last year, Samantha Ricketts became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25), since at least 1989.
- She is also the fastest coach in State's softball history to reach 20 career wins, doing so in just 23 games.
- Ricketts was also the first Bulldog head coach to see her squad ranked in her first season.

## **#NOONEFIGHTSALONE**

- Honoring the legendary spirit of the late Alex Wilcox, Mississippi State will continue its "No One Fights Alone" campaign throughout the 2021 softball season.
- The Bulldogs will continue to wear teal uniforms throughout the season to raise awareness for ovarian cancer in honor of the former softball student-athlete who passed away in 2018 at the age of 18 after a courageous fight with the disease.
- MSU immortalized Wilcox last fall by retiring her No. 8
  jersey on Sept. 15, 2018, making Wilcox the first female
  student-athlete in Mississippi State history to have her
  jersey retired.
- A permanent graphical fixture on the right field wall at Nusz Park was installed to commemorate Wilcox. The Bulldogs also re-branded the annual February Freezer tournament and now host the The Snowman: Alex Wilcox Memorial tournament in February.

#### MAROON AND WHITE

- Named the sixth head softball coach in program history on July 22, 2019
- Became the fastest head coach in program history to reach 20 wins, doing so in 23 games. Started 9-1, marking the best 10game start by a head coach in program history.
- Became the first first-year head coach to lead the nation in wins (25 in 2020) since at least 1989.
- Is the only coach in program history to have her team nationally ranked at some point during her first year and led MSU to its highest final ranking in program history (No. 20).
- Earned first career coaching victory in first career game on Feb. 7, 2020, against Missouri State (5-0).
- Led her team to a 4-0 opening weekend to win the NFCA Leadoff Classic.

- The Bulldogs shattered the school record for home runs (72) and posted the second-highest slugging percentage in school history (.484) in 2019
- For the first time since 2008, State produced multiple NFCA All-Americans with Fa Leilua and Mia Davidson earning the honor.
- Leitua closed 2019 with 22 total home runs, setting a new MSU junior record. The total ranked second in single-season history behind only Davidson's record-shattering mark of 26.
- Davidson ranked second nationally and led the SEC in homers in 2019 while breaking the league's single-season record that was once held by Georgia's Alex Hugo (2014) and Alabama's Kelly Kretschman (1998).
- Davidson was the lone player in the SEC to record at least 60 RBI, 60 hits and 50 runs scored in 2019
- In 2017, Ricketts produced five starters that hit .300 or better to help lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional
- During the 2016 season, Ricketts' leadership led senior Kayla Winkfield to a .330 average and an SEC-leading six triples, which finished top 10 in the nation
- In her first season of 2015, the Bulldogs set new single-season records for home runs (54), batting average (.312), slugging percentage (.495), RBI (294) and on-base percentage (.416)
- MSU also finished second in the single-season record books for runs scored (326), doubles (84) and hit by pitches (72)
- In 2014 without Ricketts on the MSU staff, just two Bulldogs hit over .300, while in 2015 with the addition of Ricketts, nine Bulldogs hit over .300 (min. five at-bats).
